After a month off, the USPS began the introduction of new stamps with the 61¢ Richard Wright (Literary Arts Series) on 9 April in Chicago IL.

Richard Wright (1908 – 1960) was an African-American author of powerful, sometimes controversial novels, short stories and non-fiction.

Wright worked as postal clerk in Chicago from 1927 and until the job was eliminated by the Great Depression. He was forced to go on relief in 1931, became a member Communist Party in late 1933 (which he left in 1944) and began writing.

His most noted works include: Uncle Tom's Children (1938), Native Son (1940) and The Outsider (1953).



**The American Philatelic Society** - The largest national society holding conventions in various cities each year. Publish a monthly magazine circulated to members. The society also operates a major library and an online stamp store for member wishing to sell extras. The Lake County Philatelic Society has been an affiliate member of the APS for over 50 years. United Postal Stationery Society - The United States Stamp Society (USSS) is the preeminent organization devoted to the study of United States stamps. It is, "a non-profit, volunteer-run association of collectors to promote the study of the philatelic output of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing and of postage and revenue stamped paper produced by others for use in the United States and U.S. administered areas." Once concerned exclusively with the production of the Bureau of Engraving and Printing, the USSS has expanded its coverage to include all United States issues, both classic and modern, regardless of printer. American Airmail Society - The AAMS was founded in 1923, and is the second oldest aerophilatelic society in the world with over 1,500 members worldwide. The AAMS publishes the monthly magazine The Airpost Journal & the Jack Knight Air Log, as well as the American Air Mail Catalogue, and many other aerophilatelic books.
