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Federal Tax Withholding Exemption

Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations permit employees who anticipate no federal tax liability for 1995 to claim total exemption from federal tax withholding provided they owe no federal income tax for 1994. To renew the exempt status or to claim allowances consistent with the expected tax liability for 1995, employees must submit a new form W-4 for 1995.

If the employee does not submit a new form W-4 (claiming exempt status), the status automatically converts to taxable status effective Pay Period (PP) 04-95. Federal tax in this instance is withheld at the rate applicable to a single employee with no dependent allowances. Employees with a current exempt status (as of PP 26-94) will receive messages on their earnings statement for PPs 03-95 and 04-95 telling them a new form W-4 is required.

Both first-time exemptions and renewals of form W-4 for 1995 are processed when employees submit forms W-4. Submit your W-4 form as soon as possible to avoid processing delays.

Outstanding Travel Advances

The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requires that all travel advances that are not repaid within 120 days of the conclusion of the event for which they were issued be reported as compensation to the recipient. To avoid reporting outstanding advances to the IRS, the Postal Service is initiating the following policy. Effective immediately, for an employee who has outstanding travel advances and files Form 1012, *Travel Voucher*, the advances will be automatically deducted from his or her reimbursement. This process will continue until the balance of the outstanding travel advance is liquidated.

REMINDER

Form W-5 Renewal

Form W-5, *Earned Income Credit Advance Payment Certificate*, which is furnished by employees to their employers to receive advance payment of the earned income credit, must be renewed for 1995. The certificate currently in effect expired December 31, 1994, and must be renewed by submitting form W-5 to the personnel office as soon as possible.

Freedom of Information Act Report for Calendar Year 1994

Each calendar year the Postal Service must report to Congress its activities with regard to Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) requests for information. There are two changes this year in reporting requirements:

1. Negative reports are required.
2. Reports must be sent to records office coordinators rather than to Records.

Do not confuse this Freedom of Information Act reporting requirement with the Privacy Act reporting requirement published in *Postal Bulletin* (PB) 21865, 4-14-94 (page 28), titled "Privacy Act Report for Calendar Year 1993." A future *Postal Bulletin* article will require Privacy Act reporting for calendar year 1994.

Who Must Submit a Report?

All records custodians must submit a report for calendar year 1994, even if the report is negative; that is, even if no FOIA requests were received or if there were no denials of FOIA requests received. A records custodian is the head of a postal facility such as an area, district, post office, or other postal installation that maintains Postal Service records and information. Vice presidents are the custodians of records and information maintained at Headquarters. (Headquarters field units should submit reports through their Headquarters offices.) Senior medical personnel are the custodians of restricted medical records maintained within postal facilities. Employee assistance counselors are the custodians of records pertaining to program participants.

How to Submit Reports

Records custodians must submit a report on or before March 6, 1995, clearly marked Freedom of Information Act Report for Calendar Year 1994 to their records office coordinator as shown below. A records office coordinator is located in the Finance office of each district and area Customer Service office. See PB 21862, 3-3-94 (page 26), for the article titled "Freedom of Information and Privacy Act—Records Office Coordinators."

How to Format Reports

Each records custodian must submit a report to their records office coordinator, even if it is negative. If no FOIA requests were received or there were no denials of FOIA requests received, a records custodian report should just indicate "Negative." If a records custodian has declined to release information requested in writing citing the FOIA, the report must contain the following information in the format below:

1. Reason for denial, referencing a specific section(s) of the regulations in *Administrative Support Manual* (ASM) 352.42 through 352.47.
2. Name and title or position of the USPS records custodian responsible for the denial.
3. Number of determinations not to comply with FOIA requests that were made during calendar year 1994.

Note: Do not include denials of requests for change-of-address information.

1995 Advance Earned Income Credit Payments

What Is EIC? EIC is earned income credit, which is a special credit available to eligible (low income) workers with and without a qualifying child living with them. An employee with one qualifying child can collect a maximum of \$2,094 for EIC (34 percent of the first \$6,160). An employee with two or more qualifying children can collect a maximum of \$3,110 for EIC (36 percent of the first \$8,640). Workers without qualifying children can collect a maximum of \$314 for EIC. Although an employee can receive credit on their income tax for EIC, they cannot collect advance EIC payments unless they have a qualifying child.

Who is eligible? Eligible postal employees may apply for advance payment of EIC if they have all of the following:

1. At least one qualifying child (detailed explanation later).
2. An expected 1995 earned and adjusted gross income of less than \$24,396 (including spouse's income if filing a joint return).
3. An expected ability to claim EIC for 1995.

Who is a qualifying child? Any child who meets all three of the following conditions is a qualifying child:

1. A son, daughter, adopted child, stepchild, foster child, or descendant (for example, grandchild of a son, daughter, or adopted child; see form W-5 instructions for details on an adopted child of an employee).
2. Under age 19, or a full-time student under age 24 at the end of 1995, or permanently and totally disabled.
3. Lives with an employee in the United States for more than half of 1995 (all of 1995 for foster children). If the child was born or died in 1995, the child's home was the employee's home in the United States while the child was alive. Temporary absences for education, vacation, or illness are disregarded.

How do I get advance EIC payments? Eligible employees who want to receive the credit in advance must submit form W-5, *Earned Income Credit Advance Payment Certificate*, to their personnel office.

How do I get additional credit? An employer is permitted to give an employee only \$1,257 of the EIC in advance with their pay. Employees may be able to claim a larger credit, but they must file their 1995 tax return to claim additional credit.

What if my situation changes? If an employee's situation changes after he or she submits form W-5 to the personnel office, filing a new form W-5 will probably be necessary. Filing a new form W-5 is necessary if any of the following applies for the employee for 1995:

1. No longer has a qualifying child.
2. Expects to file as married filing separately; expects to be a qualifying child of another person; or expects earned income or adjusted gross income to be \$24,396 or more.
3. No longer wants advance payments.
4. Spouse files form W-5 with his/her employer.

What if an employee receives EIC and finds that he or she is not eligible? Monies received in error for EIC must be repaid on the 1995 federal income tax return.

What if I don't file a form W-5? Employees who do not file form W-5 receive no advance payments, but they are still eligible to receive the full benefit of the EIC on their annual tax return.

Length of effective period? Form W-5 remains in effect for the calendar year in which it is filed. Eligible employees must file a new certificate each year. If a renewal form is not received, the allowance is discontinued.

How is the advance EIC payment computed? Payments are based on gross salary (salary before normal deductions), and whether or not a spouse has a form W-5 in effect with his or her employer. The EIC payment is included in the paycheck with the regular wages.

How will this be shown on my statement? The EIC amount paid to an employee is shown on the employee's earnings statement as a separate line entry identified as EIC. The total amount of advance EIC payments made during the year appears on the employee's form W-2, *Wage and Tax Statements*.

Additional information? The advance EIC payments do not change the amount of income tax or FICA taxes withheld from an employee's wages. Payment to an employee who files a W-5 begins in the pay period following the one in which the form is received by the Minneapolis Ac-

counting Service Center (MNASC). Employees may have only one certificate in effect with a current employer at one time. If both spouses are employed, each spouse should file a separate form W-5. Form W-5 is invalid if it is incomplete, unsigned, or has an alteration or unauthorized addition.

Obtain form W-5 from your personnel office. Obtain detailed instructions on earned income tax credit from the Internal Revenue Service.

Federal Income Tax Withholding

Effective Pay Period (PP) 01-95, the routines for calculating federal tax for lump sum payments and pay adjustments will be modified as follows:

1. Divide the year-to-date federal tax withheld by the year-to-date gross amount.
2. Use this percentage in lieu of the standard 28 percent.
3. Use the standard default of 28 percent if there are no year-to-date amounts (i.e., an adjustment processed for a new employee will default to 28 percent for federal taxes because there is no year-to-date gross amount).

Effective PP 01-95, payroll checks reflect changes in federal tax withholding and the exemption value increase to \$96.15 from \$94.23.

The following table is based on a biweekly payroll period:

Flexible Spending Account (FSA) deductions and Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) contributions are treated as pretax monies. The Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) premium is also a pretax benefit that applies automatically for all nonbargaining unit employees and to certain bargaining unit employees unless a waiver has been submitted. When calculating taxes, remember to include those items as pretax if applicable.

To determine the amount of withholding, follow the steps listed below:

1. Determine normal biweekly gross wages from earnings statement.
2. Determine normal biweekly Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) deductions from earnings statement.
3. Determine normal biweekly Flexible Spending Account (FSA) deductions from earnings statement. Add both Flexible Spending Account Dependent Child (FSADC) and Flexible Spending Account Health Care (FSAHC) if applicable.
4. Determine normal biweekly health benefit (FEHB) deductions from earnings statement if eligible.
5. Multiply the number of exemptions claimed by the new biweekly exemption value of \$96.15 (withholding allowance). The federal tax line on the earnings statement shows the number of exemptions claimed (i.e., S1=single with one exemption, M3=married with three exemptions).
6. Minus the amounts in step 2 (TSP), step 3 (FSA), step 4 (health benefits) and step 5 (exemptions) if applicable from step 1 (gross biweekly wages). This is the new amount of wages that is subject to withholding.

Determine where this new amount falls in the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table in the "Over, But not over" range and follow instructions listed in the table.

Listed below is an example of how to compute federal income taxes for a FERS employee who claims three exemptions, has TSP contributions, FSA contributions, FEHB deductions, and refers to the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table.

Example

A FERS employee with a 10-percent TSP contribution is paid \$2,553.28 gross biweekly wages. The employee contributes \$30.00 per pay period to FSADC and \$25.00 per period to FSAHC. She also has \$42.08 deducted to cover health benefits (FEHB). The employee claims three exemptions, and the earnings statement shows M3 (married, 3 exemptions) on the federal tax line. Using the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table, she can verify amount withheld for federal tax as follows:

1. Total biweekly gross wages	\$2,553.28
2. Amount of TSP contributions	255.33

3. Add amount of FSADC	\$30.00
Add amount of FSAHC	<u>25.00</u>
	\$55.00
Total amount to be deducted for FSAs	55.00
4. FEHB deductions	42.08
5. Exemptions (three times the new value, \$96.15)	\$288.45

Computation is as follows:

Gross	\$2,553.28
Minus TSP contributions	-255.33
Minus FSA deductions	-55.00
Minus health benefit	-42.08
Minus exemptions	-288.45
New amount of wages subject to withholding	\$1,912.42

To complete the computation, refer to the married section of the Federal Income Tax Withholding Table. The

new amount of wages subject to withholding, \$1,912.42, falls within the "Over \$1,656.00 But not over \$3,329.00" range.

Final computation is as follows:

New amount subject to withholding	\$1,912.42
Subtract \$1,656.00 from \$1,912.42	256.42
Multiply \$256.42 by 28 percent	71.80
Add from the table	211.50
Total federal income tax withheld from each biweekly payroll check	\$283.30*

ASM REVISION

Contract Security

The *Administrative Support Manual* (ASM) is revised immediately to include the following policy and procedures concerning security contractors. ASM Issue 11 will contain these revisions.

272 Personal Security Clearances

272.33 Contract Security

272.331 Policy

The chief inspector or designee, in the capacity of security officer for the Postal Service, is responsible for approving all requests for security contractors.

272.332 Procedures

Procedures vary as follows:

- a. Normally facility managers submit all proposals for the use of security contractors to the local inspector in charge with a detailed justification. The inspector in charge reviews, evaluates, and submits proposals to the chief inspector for consideration. The chief inspector notifies the inspector in charge of the decision. The inspector in charge will notify the facility manager of the decision.
- b. In an emergency, facility managers may obtain contract security without prior approval, but must notify the local inspector in charge as soon as

possible. The inspector in charge must immediately report the emergency hiring of contract security to the chief inspector.

272.333 Union Notification

In accordance with the USPS-FOP Agreement, the national FOP-NLC-USPS No. 2 must be notified within 30 days of the decision to place contract security at any postal facility, unless Postal Police officers are deployed at that postal facility. If a decision is made to contract security work at a postal facility where Postal Police officers are deployed, the national FOP-NLC-USPS No. 2 should be notified before the deployment of the contract personnel whenever practical. Notice to the national FOP-NLC-USPS No. 2 will be given at the Headquarters level.

273.14 Security Force

The Inspection Service may authorize a security force to provide security at selected postal installations. Where assigned, security force personnel, as members of the Inspection Service, are responsible for perimeter and building security. Appropriate liaison between installation heads, Postal Police officers in charge, and inspectors in charge should be maintained to ensure full coverage of all proper areas of access control and security.

New Ordering Procedures

Follow the procedures below for ordering ring dies and die hubs:

1. Complete all information requested on Form 4636, *Postmarking Dies and Engraved Station Die Hubs Requisition*, and submit one copy. If you cannot determine your needs, please call your local maintenance department for assistance. Also, it is important to include your 10-digit telephone number (which should be inserted by the signature block) so that you can be contacted if further information is required. A separate Form 4636 is required for each vendor used.
2. Attach to Form 4636 a typed, preaddressed Label 101-V (do not send Label 41, envelopes, or padded bags) containing the complete delivery address (including room number and attention line) of the facility to where the part should be sent. A separate label is required for each Form 4636 used.
3. Prepare a check or money order payable to the vendor for the total amount of the order. Attach the check or money order to Form 4636 or enter your USPS credit card number and expiration date above the signature block in the lower right corner of the Form 4636 as the method of payment for each vendor used.

The Minneapolis Purchasing and Materials Service Center (PMSC) will review requisitions to ensure completion and forward them to the vendor. Incomplete requisitions will be returned to the requester for proper preparation. Delivery can be expected approximately 90 days from the receipt of the order at PMSC. If you have questions on these instructions, please call the Minneapolis PMSC at 1-800-880-4636.

Special die hubs have nonmail-related messages such as: "Any Town Bicentennial, 1794-1994," "Give Blood—Play Hockey," etc. Authorization for these special die hubs must be obtained from USPS Headquarters, Washington, DC, as outlined in the *Domestic Mail Manual*. Contact Andrea McAdams, USPS Headquarters at 202-268-5300 for questions, information, or approval of special die hubs. Additional set-up fees will be incurred for these dies. Usually, the contractor will assist you in this process. The PMSC cannot order special die hubs without USPS authorization.

NOTE: To order Form 4636, Label 101-V, year dates, or type sets, you must submit a request on Form 7380 to either the Somerville, NJ, or Topeka, KS, Material Distribution Center (MDC), whichever services your area.

HANDBOOK AS-709 REVISION

USPS/GSA Credit Card Policies and Procedures

Handbook AS-709, *Credit Card Policies and Procedures*, is changed to reflect the new capital equipment threshold of \$2,000; new merchant activity codes; increased local buying delegation to \$10,000 for PCES postmasters and inspectors-in-charge; addition of cardholder statement of account closing date on buying logs; and naming of the National Industries for the Blind and National Industries for the Severely Handicapped as required sources of supply. Make pen-and-ink changes as follows:

1. Page 2, 140f (*Capital Property*), replace \$1,000 with \$2,000.
2. Page 3, 140l (*Merchant Activity Type Code*), replace code 00 with 000 and code 79 with 079.
3. Page 3, 140p (*Single Transaction Limit*), replace \$5,000 local buying authority for inspectors-in-charge and PCES postmasters with \$10,000.
4. Exhibits, following page 37, USPS/GSA Credit Card Program Buying Log (Expense and Capital), to document reconciliation of each purchase, add

a column to each form for the *statement closing date* as found on the monthly cardholder statement of account. (The closing date may be incorporated as part of an existing column.)

5. Page 5, 231, after the first bullet (Existing Postal Service assets), add the following bullet:

- The Javits-Wagner-O'Day Act (41 U.S.C. 46-48) requires that federal agencies, including the Postal Service, purchase certain supplies and services from qualified workshops employing people who are blind or severely disabled. Supplies manufactured by the National Industries for the Blind must be ordered through the General Services Administration (GSA). See 233. Copies of the NIB catalog can be obtained by calling 1-800-433-2304, or writing NIB at 524 Hamburg Turnpike, P.O. Box 969, Wayne, NJ 07474-9837.

The next revision of Handbook AS-709 will reflect these changes.

Procedure to Update FEDSTRIP Address Information

To order from General Services Administration (GSA), Defense Logistics Agency (DLA), Department of Defense (DOD), or the Postal Service material distribution centers (MDCs), you must have a six-character activity address code called a FEDSTRIP. The first two characters of every Postal Service FEDSTRIP are "18."

To request a new FEDSTRIP or update address information associated with your FEDSTRIP, contact your district material management specialist (DMMS). The DMMS will notify the Topeka MDC by mail, fax, or cc:Mail. Within 5 days after receipt, Topeka processes the request, updates the MDC files, and electronically passes the FEDSTRIP information to GSA, DLA, DOD, and the Postal Service's St. Louis Accounts Payable (for allocation

of GSA charges every accounting period). The DMMS will not receive any verification by mail from Topeka or GSA. Instead, the DMMS can access BUNDL, an on-line report, and verify that the requested action has been processed or retrieve newly assigned FEDSTRIP codes.

This simplified procedure has reduced from weeks to days the time it takes to make a correction or assign new FEDSTRIP codes. This procedure also eliminates duplication of effort and the need for distributing copies of updated FEDSTRIP information to St. Louis, GSA, or the GSA Customer Service Centers. All questions should be directed to your DMMS or purchasing and materials service center material management specialist.

DMM REVISION

Stamped Envelopes

Effective immediately, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) R000.1.0 and 2.0 are revised as shown below to amend the listing of stamped envelopes offered for sale and the selling price for nonprofit rate stamped envelopes. Bulk rate envelopes are intended for use in third-class bulk rate mailings; all are nondenominated.

The selling price for bulk and nonprofit rate plain and printed stamped envelopes represents the value of the corresponding nondenominated stamps plus the fee for the envelopes themselves. This change enables consistent postage rate values for nondenominated stamps and stamped envelopes and makes it easier for mailers who use these items to do business with the Postal Service.

Because all nondenominated stamps and stamped envelopes have a value lower than the lowest available rate, mailers using them must pay the difference between the postage value of the nondenominated stamps or nondenominated envelopes and the postage for the mailing at the rate for which it qualifies when the mailing is presented to the Postal Service. The revised text will appear in DMM Issue 49.

In Issue 49, P022 will also be revised to remove current Exhibit 2.1, which depicts nondenominated postage. The content of that exhibit, amended to include new nondenominated stamps and stationery issued for the recent rate increase, will be a new addition to the *DMM Utilities* that are published with each issue of the DMM.

DMM REVISION

Verified Delivery Receipt

Effective immediately, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) S912.1.4 is revised as shown below to add explanatory language concerning verified delivery receipts. Prior to its general revision in 1992, the DMM (in former DMM 912.8) referred to a verified delivery receipt for certified mail, basically a copy of the delivery record retained at the delivery post office, as an alternative to a return receipt requested after mailing; comparable fees were set for each.

When revised and renumbered as S912 in DMM Issue 46, the standards for certified mail (the only service referring to verified delivery receipts) no longer mentioned these receipts, even though the term was retained in DMM R900.5.0 in prescribing the applicable fee. This revision does not alter or extend the use or availability of verified delivery receipts beyond that described in the former DMM regulations. The revised text will appear in DMM Issue 49.

**Documentation Requirements for
Second-Class Presort Levels
B, C, H, I, and K**

Business mail entry employees and mailers are reminded that mailers of authorized second-class publications who mail at the level B, C, H, I, or K rates must provide support for the information reported on mailing statements (see *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) E216.3.0).

The mailer must follow one of the following procedures to meet this obligation unless the rates and classification service center serving the original entry post office approves or prescribes another method:

- (1) The publisher may separate each mailing into groups of sacks based on the appropriate presort level (levels A/G/J, levels B/H, and levels C/I/K). The eligibility of mailings containing pieces claimed at an automation rate, a destination entry, a zoned rate, or a walk-sequence rate must be supported by documentation as described in DMM P012.
- (2) The publisher may submit documentation at the time of mailing that describes the number of copies claimed at each presort level for each sack destination. The format and content of the documentation must meet the standard in DMM P012.
- (3) The publisher may be authorized to maintain records at the known office of publication to substantiate the number of copies claimed on mailing statements by presort level. Use of this alternative must be approved by the original entry postmaster under the standard in DMM E216.3.4.

Acceptance personnel must verify that the mailer has fulfilled the documentation requirement and that the entries on the mailing statement are accurate.

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 95-4

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail post-

age (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Form 2966-A is required. Prepaid mail from a contractor addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or an exemption endorsement.

B1. Form 2966-B is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents.

B2. Form 2966-A is required except on official mail, which does not require customs declaration or exemption endorsement. The AAFES will furnish a computer listing of all items mailed from its activities to Philippine APOs. Other mail order companies must either use Form 2966-A on each item or provide computer lists. Computer listings must include a description of the items, the dollar values of the items, and complete address including the PSC box number and APO of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item with a plug over \$15 in value.

B3. Form 2966-A is required for mailing between MPOs. Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use—Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or exemption endorsement.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotape, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.

E3. Radio transceivers or cordless telephones are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only First-Class letters, second- and third-class mail are authorized.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

Length

42" 72" length and girth combined
over 42" to 44" 24" girth
over 44" to 46" 20" girth
over 46" to 48" 16" girth
Maximum length 48"

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM part C021, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 12 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All second-class, third-class, and fourth-class mail (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

INTERNATIONAL MAIL

IMM NOTICE

International Money Order Service

Effective March 1, 1995, *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 391 is revised to reflect a change in the international postal money order system. Effective March 1, 1995, the domestic postal money order form will no longer be sold for payments outside the United States, its territories and possessions, and the Freely Associated States. (See *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) G011.2.1.) Those countries that accepted the domestic postal money order form will accept the international postal money order form (MP1).

For convenience, a complete list of countries that will accept the pink international postal money order form (MP1) for the direct exchange of international money orders is printed below. This list is effective March 1, 1995.

391 International Postal Money Orders

391.1 Description

391.11 General

International postal money order service is available to transfer funds to individuals or firms in countries that have entered into agreements with the United States Postal Service for the exchange of postal money orders. International postal money orders sent by Direct Service may be sent by letter mail or Express Mail International Service (EMS).

* * * * *

391.2 Availability

Postal money orders are exchanged with countries in one of two ways:

- Standard international postal money orders. This method uses the Authorization to Issue an International Money Order form set. See Individual Country Listings.

- Direct international postal money orders. This method uses the pink international postal money order form (MP1). The following countries accept this form: Anguilla, Antigua and Barbuda, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Bolivia, British Virgin Islands, Canada, Cape Verde, Costa Rica, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Grenada, Guyana, Honduras, Jamaica, Japan, Mali, Mexico, Montserrat, Nigeria, Panama, St. Christopher and Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Sierra Leone, and Trinidad and Tobago. Money orders issued by these countries in U.S. dollars, with the exception of Jamaica and Trinidad and Tobago, are negotiable in the United States. There will be no money orders issued in Bolivia, Cape Verde, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Honduras, Mexico, Nigeria, Panama, and Sierra Leone for payment in the United States. The MP1 cards issued in Japan for payment in the United States *must* be shown in U.S. dollars preceded by the capital letters "USD." Money orders issued in Mali for payment in the United States will be the standard international postal money order.

391.3 Fees

There are two separate fees for international money orders:

- The fee for money orders payable in countries that accept the pink international postal money order form (MP1) is \$3 per money order. These countries are:

391.41 Forms Required

391.411 Authorization to Issue an International Money Order

For countries to which standard international money orders are issued, application must be made via the Authorization to Issue an International Money Order form set. International money orders are generally issued in U.S. dollars and are converted into foreign currency in the country where payable. For assistance in determining foreign currency equivalents, call the International Money Order Section, St. Louis Accounting Service Center (ASC), at 314-436-5099. The ASC is able to provide approximations of foreign currency equivalents only.

391.412 International Postal Money Order Form (MP1)

Use the pink international money order form (MP1) for money orders payable in Anguilla, Antigua and Barbuda, Bahamas, Barbados, Belize, Bolivia, British Virgin Islands, Canada, Cape Verde, Costa Rica, Dominica, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, El Salvador, Grenada, Guyana, Honduras, Jamaica, Japan, Mali, Mexico, Montserrat, Nigeria, Panama, St. Christopher and Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent and the Grenadines, Sierra Leone, and Trinidad and Tobago. Follow the issuance procedures in DMM S020.

Note: For money orders payable in Canada, the amount of the money order must be expressed in U.S. currency only. Issuing clerks must use the money order imprinter in the usual manner, printing the amount re-

ceived in U.S. currency. Clerks must *not* write the word "Canadian," followed by the equivalent amount in Canadian currency, on the money order.

391.42 Preparation by Purchaser

391.421 Purchaser's Responsibility

When the international postal money order form (MP1) is used to send funds, the purchaser should complete the information requested on both the money order and the customer's receipt. The Postal Service is not liable for money orders that are lost before the purchaser completes this information. Money orders may be made payable to the purchaser, a person or a firm, or a payee by official title. (Example: Director of Publications, Canada.)

Pay Changes—Bargaining Unit COLA Roll-In

This article provides personnel offices with the cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) roll-in information necessary to administer personnel actions for career bargaining unit employees covered by the 1990–1994 U.S. Postal Service-American Postal Workers Union/National Association of Letter Carriers (USPS-APWU/NALC) National Agreement and paid under the Postal Service (PS) schedule (RSC P).

The new salary schedules appear on pages 00. This COLA roll-in results in both the regular and retiree eligible (RES) versions of these schedules being identical. It is necessary to maintain both schedules in the system pending future determinations on the disposition of current COLA.

COLA Roll-in

Effective February 4, 1995, Pay Period (PP) 4-95, eligible employees in the regular (or non-RES) version of the PS schedule (i.e., those employees who did not elect option to roll in COLA) will have rolled in to basic salary the \$2,517 per year (\$1.21 per hour) COLA amount accumulated under the 1987 national agreement.

Also receiving a COLA roll-in effective February 5, 1995, are employees covered by the regular version of the following salary schedules: Mail Equipment Shops and Material Distribution Centers (MEDC), and Operating Services Division/Facilities Services Section (OSD/FSC). Schedules for these nonnational agreements are not pub-

lished in this Bulletin but are distributed directly to affected facilities.

Exclusions

The following employees are not eligible for the COLA roll-ins discussed in this Bulletin and will continue at their current rates of pay:

1. Employees in the Retiree Eligible (RES) versions of the schedules listed above.
2. Casual employees.
3. Transitional employees (Note: The schedule included in this Bulletin is for reference only; it is identical to the September 3, 1994, transitional employee schedule).

Impact on Net Pay

Although there will be no change in the annual *base* salary, the employee's *basic* salary will increase by the amount of the COLA roll-in. This will result in a slight decrease in net pay for those employees who receive the COLA roll-in. This decrease in net pay is due to mandatory deductions from basic salary for retirement, life insurance, and, if the employee is enrolled and elected a percentage deduction, the Thrift Savings Plan.

Implementation

The COLA roll-ins discussed in this notice are effective on February 4, 1995 (PP 4-95), and will appear in paychecks distributed on February 24, 1995.

Pay Changes—Nonbargaining Unit COLA Roll-In

This article provides personnel offices with the pay schedules and information necessary to administer personnel actions for career nonbargaining unit employees covered by the regular (i.e., nonoptional COLA roll-in) version of the following salary schedules:

1. Executive and Administrative Schedule (EAS)—RSC E.
2. EAS Postmaster Schedule (EPM)—RSC F.

The new salary schedules appear on pages 00. This COLA roll-in results in both the regular and optional COLA roll-in versions of these schedules being identical. It is necessary to maintain both schedules in the system pending future determinations on the disposition of current COLA.

COLA Roll-in

Employees covered by EAS or EPM who did not exercise the option to roll in the 1987–1990 cost-of-living adjustment (COLA) of \$2,517 effective December 1, 1990, or January 25, 1992, will have their individual COLA amounts of up to \$2,517 per year (\$1.21 per hour) rolled in to their basic salaries effective February 4, 1995 (PP 4-95).

Exclusions

Temporary and casual employees do not receive COLA and are therefore not eligible for this COLA roll-in; such employees continue at their current rates of pay. Employees in the optional COLA roll-in version of the EAS and EPM schedules are not eligible for the COLA roll-in discussed in this notice and continue at their current rates of pay.

Impact on Net Pay

Although there will be no change in the annual *base* salary, the employee's *basic* salary will increase by the amount of the COLA roll-in. This will result in a slight decrease in net pay for those employees who receive the COLA roll-in. This decrease in net pay is due to mandatory deductions from basic salary for retirement, life insurance, and, if the employee is enrolled and elected a percentage deduction, the Thrift Savings Plan.

Implementation

The COLA roll-in discussed in this notice is effective February 4, 1995 (PP 4-95), and will appear in pay checks distributed on February 24, 1995.
