Requests for Change of Address Information in Post Offices

The Administrative Support Manual (ASM) is being revised to conform with the new rule discussed below. The Postal Service has traditionally provided permanent change of address information of individuals upon request by anyone in possession of the individual's former address if such information was on file. On December 29, 1994, in a final rule published in the Federal Register (59 FR 67223), this policy was officially curtailed so that the information is no longer generally available to individual "walk-ins" or "write-ins" such as private individuals, lawyers, and representatives of debt collection companies, except when performing as process servers. (See exception (2)). This policy change does not affect any address correction services that are typically related to mailing activities.

At present, anyone may still obtain a change of address of a business or private institution that has moved

within 18 months, for the \$3 fee, if the information is on file.

No one may obtain a change of address of an individual or family except: (1) a federal, state, or local government agency for official purposes (these include government agencies, courts, and law enforcement agencies such as police departments and sheriff offices); (2) an authorized person for the purpose of service of legal process (process servers); (3) when necessary to comply with a court order; or (4) a criminal law enforcement agency when an oral request is made through the Inspection Service. However, the change of address information of court order protected individuals who have made proper request to their postmaster will not be disclosed to process servers unless they first obtain a specific court order for such disclosure.

The policy is summarized below. Questions should be referred to field counsel.

^{*}The \$3 charge applies only to business COA requests from individuals and representatives of businesses and private institutions unless they are performing as authorized process servers. No requester is charged for business boxholder information.

Administrative Support Manual (ASM) 352.44a, 352.44f(2), 352.44f(3), 352.44j, and 353.321c and Exhibit 352.44a are revised below to conform to the described rule changes. Sections 352.44b and 352.44d are deleted and sections 352.44c through 352.44j are redesignated as sections 352.44b through 352.44h. Section 353.321d is deleted and section 353.321e is redesignated as section 353.321d. In addition to the changes shown below, the reference to "352.44f(1) through 352.44f(4)" in redesignated section 352.44c(2) is changed to read "352.44d(1) through 352.44d(4)." The reference to "352.44f(1), 352.44f(3), or 352.44f(4)" in redesignated section 352.44c(3) is changed to read "352.44d(1), 352.44d(3), or 352.44d(4)." The reference to "352.44f(1)" in redesignated section 352.44d(4) is changed to read "352.44d(1)." The reference to "352.44f(2)" in sections 352.775b and 353.323j is changed to read "352.44d(2)." The reference to section "352.44f(4)" in section 352.775d is changed to read "352.44d(4)." These changes will be published in issue 11 of the ASM.

352.44 Disclosure of Customer Names and **Addresses**

On request, the addresses of specifically identified postal customers are made available only as follows:

- a. Change of address. The new address of any specific customer who has filed a permanent or temporary Change of Address Order (Form 3575, handwritten order or electronically communicated order) will be furnished to any person upon payment of the fee prescribed in 352.753, 352.775, and 353.321c, except that the new address of a specific customer who has indicated on the order that the address change is for an individual or an entire family will be furnished only in those circumstances stated in sections 352.44d(1) through 352.44d(4). Disclosure will be limited to the address of the specifically identified individual about whom the information is requested (not other family members or individuals whose names may also appear on the change of address order.) The Postal Service reserves the right not to disclose the address of an individual for the protection of the individual's personal safety. Other information on Form 3575 or copies of the form will not be furnished except in those circumstances stated in sections 352.44d(1), 352.44d(3) and 352.44d(4). The fee is waived for providing information under the circumstances listed in sections 352.44d(1) through 352.44d(4). See section 352.775.
- b. Permit Holders.

c. Post Office Boxholders.

d. Exceptions. Except as otherwise provided in these regulations, names or addresses of postal customers will be furnished only as follows:

- (2) To a person empowered by law to serve legal process, or the attorney for a party on whose behalf service is to be made, or a party who is acting pro se who submits the information reguired below. (The term pro se means that a party is not represented by an attorney but is self-represented.) By submitting this information, the requester certifies that it is true. The address of an individual who files with the postmaster a copy of a protective court order will not be disclosed except as provided under sections 352.44d(1), 352.44d(3) 352.44d(4). The Postal Service suggests using the standard format in Exhibit 352.44a when requesting information under this section. When using the standard format on the submitter's own letterhead, the standard format must be used in its entirety. The warning statement and certification must be included immediately before the signature block. If the request lacks any of the required information or a proper signature, the postmaster shall return it to the requester specifying the deficiency. The written request must specify all of the following information:
 - (a) A certification that the name or address is needed and will be used solely for service of legal process in connection with actual or prospective litigation;
 - (b) A citation to the statute or regulation that empowers the requester to serve process, if the requester is anyone other than the attorney for a party in whose behalf service will be made, or a party who is acting *pro se*:
 - (c) The names of all known parties to the liti-
 - (d) The court in which the case has been or will be commenced;
 - (e) The docket or other identifying number, if one has been issued; and
 - The capacity in which the boxholder is to be served, e.g., defendant or witness.

(3) In compliance with a subpoena or court order,

DMM Notice

Publication of Form 3526; Use of Permit Imprints; Key Rates

Effective June 2, 1995, except where noted below, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) E216, P040, and P200 are revised following *Federal Register* rulemaking just concluded. The final rule for these revisions was published on April 18, 1995, in the *Federal Register* (60 FR 19355-19359). These revisions, which will appear in DMM Issue 49, are as follows:

- Change the publishing requirements for Form 3526, Statement of Ownership, Management, and Circulation, to allow greater flexibility in selecting the issue in which the required information will appear.
- 2. Relax the conditions under which a company permit imprint may be used while strengthening the ability of the Postal Service to identify the place of mailing of company permit imprint mail and to obtain information about such mailings. Generally, mailers will be allowed to use a company-style imprint without having to obtain permits at two or more post offices, but these mailers will be required to show a point of contact to obtain records of the mailing. Penalties for failure to provide records are also established.
- 3. Relax the design restrictions on permit imprint indicia. Generally, the new standards allow for more creativity while retaining restrictions that ensure that the indicia content is readable and clearly identifiable as postage payment. A minor revision to DMM P040.1.9 is made to clarify that permit imprints may be printed on *permanently affixed* adhesive labels.
- 4. Set a sunset date of November 1, 1995, for the use of second-class key rates.

One part of the proposal originally published for comment is not adopted but is noted here to avoid confusion. DMM E110.6.1, E312.2.6, and E411.4.0 were to be revised to standardize the assessment of bulk or presort mailing fees on First-, third- and special fourth-class mail. On further consideration, however, the Postal Service has determined to retain the current provisions for the present time. The distinctions among these fees are based on historical differences and on assumptions about the amount of revenue that will be produced by those fees. Absent strong mailer desire for change (no supporting comments were received), the Postal Service will retain the current standards.

E216 Publisher Records

4.0 STATEMENT OF OWNERSHIP, MANAGE-MENT, AND CIRCULATION

* * * * *

4.3 Publication

The publisher of each publication authorized second-class mail privileges as a general or requester publication must publish a complete statement of ownership, containing all information required by Form 3526, in an issue of the publication to which that statement relates; other publications are not required to publish this statement. A reproduction of the Form 3526 submitted to the USPS may be used. The required information must appear in an issue whose primary mailed distribution begins not later than October 10 for publications issued more frequently than weekly, or not later than October 31 for publications issued weekly or less frequently but more frequently than monthly; or in the first issue whose primary mailed distribution begins after October 1 for all other publications.

P040 Permit Imprints

1.0 BASIC INFORMATION

[Renumber current 1.6 and 1.7 as 1.8 and 1.9; add new 1.6 and 1.7 as shown and revise renumbered 1.8 and 1.9 as follows:]

1.6 Information

Upon request by the USPS, a permit holder (and its agent, if applicable) must provide in a timely manner complete information (as specified in 3.5) about mailings or mailpieces for which postage was paid using its company permit imprint.

1.7 Suspension

The USPS may immediately suspend the authorization to use a permit imprint if the permit holder or its agent refuses or fails to provide information as specified in 1.6.

1.8 Revocation

A permit may be revoked for use in operating any unlawful scheme or enterprise, for nonuse for any 12-month period, for refusal to provide information about permit imprint use or mailings, or for any noncompliance with the standards applicable to using permit imprints. The permit

holder may appeal a revocation in writing to the postmaster within 10 days of receipt of the notice. If revocation is initiated for nonuse and the permit holder states in writing that it plans to resume mailings within a 90-day period, the permit will be continued for 90 days. Further appeal may be made through the postmaster to the district manager, customer service and sales, if the initial decision was made by the postmaster; or to the RCSC if the initial decision was made at the district level.

1.9 Use

2.0

[Revise the first sentence of renumbered 1.9 as follows:]

Permit imprints may be printed directly on mailpieces, on labels (including address labels) permanently affixed to mailpieces, or on mailpiece wrappers, envelopes, and other containers.

PREPARING PERMIT IMPRINTS

2.4 Placement

The entire permit imprint indicium must be aligned parallel with the address of the mailpiece and placed in the upper right corner of the address side, of the address area, or of the address label, subject to these conditions:

- a. The indicium must not encroach on reserved space on the mailpiece (e.g., the OCR read area) if such a standard applies.
- b. The position (but not the format) of the indicium may be varied so that data processing equipment can simultaneously print the address, imprint, and other postal information.

3.5 Company Permit Imprint

A company permit imprint is one in which the exact name of the company or individual holding the permit is shown in the permit imprint indicium in place of the city, state, and permit number. A customer may use a company permit imprint indicium if:

a. For 1 year from the date of mailing, the permit holder or its agent keeps records for each mailing paid by company permit imprint and makes these available for USPS review on request. These records include (for each version of what was mailed, if applicable) the weight of a single piece; the total number of pieces mailed; the total postage; the date(s) and post office(s) of mailing, and other records required by the rate of postage claimed or the method of

payment used. A complete sample mailpiece must be included for each identical-weight mailing, or each commingled or combined version in a nonidentical-weight mailing. Sample mailpieces are not required for nonidentical piece third- or fourthclass machinable or irregular parcel mailings (e.g., merchandise and other fulfillment mailings).

- b. Each mailpiece bears a complete domestic return address. The return address on official mail is subject to the corresponding standards. On other unendorsed bulk third-class mail, the return address may be below the permit imprint. Except for official mail, if the return address is *not* the physical location at which the USPS may review the records listed in 3.5a (i.e., where they are either retained *or* can be made available) or is *not* a point of contact from which such a physical location can be readily determined, the mailer must:
 - (1) Include in the indicia the 5-digit ZIP Code of the physical location at which the records listed in 3.5a are either retained or can be made available for USPS review; and
 - (2) Provide the postmaster of that post office with a complete sample mailpiece (except as noted above); the date(s) and post office(s) of mailing; and the name and local address of the party from whom the records listed in 3.5a may be obtained.

4.0 FORMATS

[Renumber current 4.0 as 4.1, and renumber Exhibits 4.0a-c as 4.1a-c; amend and add new 4.2 as follows:]

4.1 Basic Standard

Unless prepared under the option in 4.2, permit imprint indicia for ordinary mail, official mail, and Mailgrams must be prepared in one of the formats shown in Exhibit 4.1a, Exhibit 4.1b, and Exhibit 4.1c, as applicable to the rate claimed or type of mail.

4.2 Optional Format

Permit imprint indicia may be prepared in a format other than the basic format described in 4.1 subject to these conditions:

- a. The rule that forms a box around the content of the indicium may be omitted if the content remains as specified in 3.0 and Exhibits 4.1a-c.
- b. Unless printed directly on an address label, the indicium content specified in 3.0 is placed within a clear area no smaller than 1/2 inch high and 1/2 inch wide, no more than 1-1/2 inches below or left from the upper right corner of the mailpiece or of the address area when oriented to read the address,

regardless of the processing category or the postage rate claimed. If printed on an address label (including paper, adhesive, and multilayer sandwich labels), the space allowed for the indicium content in 3.0 must be rectangular, large enough to ensure legibility of that content from a normal reading distance and to clearly separate it from other information on the label, and located in the upper right corner of the label when oriented to read the address.

- c. No printing appears in the indicium area other than that required or allowed under 3.0.
- d. Except as required to enclose the permit information, no printing appears either on the mailpiece above or to the right of the permit information when the indicium is printed directly on the mailpiece, or within the address area or on the address label above or to the right of the permit information when the indicium appears there.
- e. Except for indicia printed on address labels, the permit information is printed in no smaller than 4-point type. In indicia printed on address labels under 4.2b, the permit information must be legible from a normal reading distance.
- f. Except as required to enclose the permit information, any decorative designs intended to be part of the permit imprint indicium design appear below or to the left of the permit information in an area extending no farther than 4-1/2 inches to the left of the right edge, and 1-1/2 inches below the top edge of the mailpiece, address area, or address label, as applicable. Such designs must not resemble or imitate a postage meter imprint, postage stamp, postcard postage, or other method of postage payment; and must not include words, symbols, or designs used by the USPS to identify a class of mail, rate of postage, or level of service, unless such elements are correctly used under the applicable standards for the mailpiece on which they appear and the corresponding postage and fees have been paid.
- g. All other applicable standards in 1.0 through 5.0 are met.

5.0 MAILINGS

5.3 Preparation of Mailing

All pieces in a permit imprint mailing must be faced (i.e., have the address facing in the same direction, unless counterstacked under the applicable standards) and meet the preparation standards applicable to the rate claimed. Mail claimed at a rate where postage varies by zone must be separated by zone when mailed unless authorized by the USPS.

5.4 Place of Mailing

Mail must be deposited and accepted at the post office that issued the permit, at a time and place designated by the postmaster, except as otherwise provided for plant-verified drop shipments.

* * * * *

5.6 Prepayment

Payment must be made for each mailing, either in cash or through an advance deposit account, before the mailing can be released for processing. Funds to pay postage must be deposited as prescribed by the USPS. If the funds paid or on deposit are less than that necessary to pay for a mailing, the difference must be paid or deposited before it or other permit imprint mailings can be accepted. Credit for postage is not allowed. Postage may not be paid partly in money and partly by postage stamps unless permitted by standard.

3.0 KEY RATE

3.5 Termination of Key Rate Option

New authorizations to use key rates will not be granted after April 30, 1995. Publications already authorized key rates may continue to use them until October 31, 1995. Effective November 1, 1995, use of key rates is eliminated. [Delete 3.0 as of November 1, 1995.]

DMM REVISION

Hazardous Matter

Effective immediately, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) C023 is revised with only editorial changes as shown below to reorganize the standards for hazardous matter; no substantive changes are intended. Except for renumbering and standardization of symbology for temperature, no changes (including format and editorial changes) were made to current C023.8.1 through 8.9 (renumbered as C023.10.1 through 10.9). The revised text will appear in DMM Issue 49.

C023 Hazardous Matter

1.0 CHEMICALS

The acceptability of chemicals for mailing generally depends on container fluid/vapor capacities, the ability of the complete package to contain the product, and the method of absorbing and containing the product in case of accidental leakage of the primary container. The USPS does not publish a comprehensive list of mailable/nonmailable chemicals. To determine mailability of a specific product, submit this information to Business Mail Acceptance, USPS Headquarters:

- a. Name of material.
- b. Chemical composition by percentage of ingredient.
- c. Flashpoint.
- d. Toxic properties.
- e. Irritant action to eyes and skin.
- f. Special precautions necessary to permit handling without harm to USPS employees or damage to property or other mail.
- g. Explanation of warning labels required by state or federal regulations.
- h. Proposed packaging method.

2.0 EXPLOSIVES

All explosives are nonmailable, except toy propellant devices and some safety fuses in the domestic surface mail specifically approved by the appropriate RCSC.

3.0 FLAMMABLE MATERIALS

3.1 Flammable Liquid

Flammable liquid or semiliquid is nonmailable if its flash-point is 20° F (-6.7° C) (closed-cup) or below. Other flammable liquid or semiliquid is not acceptable for air transportation or international mail but may be mailable as domestic surface mail if:

a. Its flashpoint is above 20° F (–6.7° C) but no more than 73° F (23° C) (closed-cup); it is in metal containers not exceeding 1 quart or in other containers

- not exceeding 1 pint, each packed in a strong outside container; and packages are plainly and durably marked on at least one side with the proper shipping name of the flammable liquid.
- b. Its flashpoint is above 73° F (23° C) but less than 100° F (37.8° C) (closed-cup); it is in metal containers not exceeding 1 gallon, each packed in another sealed container within the outside container; and the flashpoint is listed on the outside of the parcel.

3.2 Combustible Liquid

Combustible liquid is not acceptable in international mail but may be mailed domestically:

- a. For surface transportation if its flashpoint is 100° F (37.8° C) but no more than 141° F (60.5° C) (closed-cup); and it is in metal containers not exceeding 1 gallon, each packed in a strong outside container.
- b. For surface or air transportation if its flashpoint is above 141° F (60.5° C) but no more than 200° F (93.3° C) (closed-cup); it is in containers not exceeding 1 gallon, each packed in a strong outside container. For air transportation, each outside container must have enough cushioning within to absorb all leakage; the cushioning and primary container must be enclosed within another sealed container within the outside container; and the flashpoint must be listed on the outside of the parcel
- For air or surface transportation without restriction if its flashpoint is above 200° F (93.3° C) (closedcup).

3.3 Flammable Solids

A flammable solid is any solid material other than one classed as an explosive that, under conditions normally incident to transportation, is liable to cause fires through friction or retained heat from manufacturing or processing, or that can be ignited readily and, when ignited, burns so vigorously and persistently as to create a serious transportation hazard. A flammable solid is not acceptable for air transportation or international mail but may be acceptable for domestic surface transportation if it is enclosed within inside containers, each with a net weight of contents of 1 pound or less, and packed in strong outside containers with a net weight of 25 pounds or less. Packages must be plainly and durably marked on at least one side with the proper shipping name of the flammable solid.

3.4 Oxidizers

An oxidizer (e.g., chlorate, permanganate, inorganic peroxide, or nitrate) is a substance that yields oxygen readily to stimulate the combustion of organic matter. An oxidizer is not acceptable in international mail but may be acceptable for domestic air or surface transportation if it is enclosed within inside containers that have a rated capacity of 1 pint or less for liquids or a net weight of 1 pound or less for solids; and packed in strong outside containers with a net weight of 25 pounds or less. Outside containers must be plainly and durably marked on at least one side with the proper shipping name of the oxidizer. When permitted in domestic air transportation, packages of oxidizers must also be accompanied by a shipper's declaration for dangerous goods, with the designation "ORM-D AIR."

3.5 Matches

Strike-anywhere matches are not mailable. Safety matches (book, card, or strike-on-box) are not acceptable in international mail but may be acceptable for domestic air or surface transportation if:

- a. They do not ignite spontaneously under conditions normally incident to transportation or when subjected for 8 consecutive hours to a temperature of 220° F (93.3° C).
- b. They cannot be readily ignited by friction unless struck on their own or a similar box, card, or book.
- c. The gross weight of each parcel containing matches is not more than 50 pounds.
- d. They are packed tightly to prevent movement within the container or ignition by rubbing against adjoining items.
- e. When packed in the same outside container with nonflammable items, they are packed in outside fiberboard or wooden boxes and packed in tightly closed inside containers or securely wrapped to prevent accidental ignition; and the outside container is marked "Book Matches," "Strike-on-Card Matches," or "Card Matches" (and for air transportation, bears a shipper's declaration for dangerous goods). (If *not* packed with other items, no marking, labeling, or certification is required.)

3.6 Cigarette Lighters

A lighter equipped with an ignition element and containing fuel is mailable only if:

a. The design of the lighter and its packaging are approved by the associate administrator for Hazardous Material Safety, Research and Special Programs Administration, U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT), subject to DOT regulations

- (49 CFR 173.21(i)), and a DOT Approval Number (T-Number) is issued.
- b. The prospective mailer of the lighter submits to the appropriate RCSC manager a written request for authorization to mail the lighter, accompanied by a legible photocopy of the official notice conveying the DOT approval described in 3.6a, and a specimen of the actual lighter and the packaging in which it is to be mailed; and the mailer received from the RCSC manager a letter approving the requested authorization.
- c. When presented for acceptance in the mail, the shipping package containing the lighter prominently displays the T-Number and the shipping name "LIGHTER[S] FOR CIGARETTES," as appropriate, meets all preparation and packaging requirements in the RCSC manager's letter, and is accompanied by a legible photocopy of that letter.

4.0 CORROSIVES

A corrosive material is a liquid or solid that causes visible destruction or irreversible alterations in human skin tissue at the site of contact or a liquid that has a severe corrosion rate on steel. A corrosive is not acceptable in international mail but is acceptable for domestic air or surface transportation as specified below for Consumer Commodity, ORM-D material. Packages must be plainly and durably marked on at least one side with the proper shipping name of the corrosive and, for air transportation, bear a shipper's declaration for dangerous goods with the designation "ORM-D AIR." To be acceptable:

- a. A liquid mixture must be 1 pint or less and must contain 15% or less corrosive material with the remainder of the mixture not being a hazardous material, unless otherwise specified for a specific corrosive liquid. Containers must be compatible glass bottles enclosed within metal or plastic containers, each packed within an outside container.
- b. A solid mixture must be 10 pounds or less in inside containers and must contain 10% or less corrosive material with the remainder of the mixture not being a hazardous material, unless otherwise specified for a specific corrosive solid. Containers must be compatible siftproof containers, packed in strong outside siftproof containers, not to exceed 25 pounds.

5.0 COMPRESSED GASES

5.1 Definitions

A compressed gas is any material or mixture within a container that has an absolute pressure exceeding 40 psi at 70° F (20.9° C); an absolute pressure exceeding 104 psi at 130° F (54.2° C) regardless of the pressure at 70° F (20.9° C); or any flammable liquid that has an absolute

vapor pressure exceeding 40 psi at 100° F (37.6° C). Flammable compressed gas is any material defined above that forms a flammable vapor at a 13% mixture with air; projects flame more than 18 inches beyond the ignition source with the valve opened fully or that flashes back and burns at the valve with any degree of valve opening; or significantly propagates flame away from the ignition source when subjected to Bureau of Explosives test.

5.2 Mailability

Compressed gases are not acceptable in international mail but may be generally acceptable for domestic air or surface transportation subject to the requirements of 49 CFR for Consumer Commodity, ORM-D material, and the standards in 5.3 and 5.4.

5.3 Containers

An other-than-metal container of compressed gases may be acceptable if the water capacity of the container is 4 fluid ounces (7.22 cubic inches) or less. Both nonflammable and flammable compressed gases are acceptable in containers that have a water capacity up to 27.7 fluid ounces (50 cubic inches) per inside metal container, depending on their internal pressure. A U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) 2P container must be used if the internal pressure is from 140 psi to 160 psi at 130° F (55° C), and a DOT 2Q container must be used if the pressure is from 160 psi to 180 psi at 130° F (55° C). Internal pressures over 180 psi are not acceptable. As a general rule, flammable compressed gases are restricted to 27.7 fluid ounces per parcel and are acceptable only in domestic surface mail. Nonflammable compressed gases are acceptable in individual 27.7-fluid-ounce containers up to USPS weight limits.

5.4 Marking

Packages must be marked on at least one side or end with the proper shipping name of the gas and, for air transportation, bear a shipper's declaration for dangerous goods with the designation "ORM-D AIR."

6.0 POISONS AND TOXIC MATERIALS

6.1 Poisons Generally

For these standards, a poison is a toxic substance that may kill or injure. Poisons are not acceptable in international mail and are nonmailable domestically except under 6.3 and 6.5.

6.2 Class A Poisons

Class A poisons (e.g., phosgene) are extremely dangerous gases or liquids of such a nature that a very small amount (oral lethal dose (LD) less than 5 milligrams (mg) to kilogram (kg) of body weight of test animals) is fatal within 14 days to half the test animals. Class A poisons are nonmailable.

6.3 Class B Poisons

Class B poisons (e.g., ferric arsenate) are highly dangerous substances, liquids, or solids of such a nature that a small amount (oral lethal dose (LD) less than 50 milligrams (mg) to kilogram (kg) of body weight of test animals) is fatal within 14 days to half the test animals. Class B poisons are mailable under these conditions:

- a. Poisons for scientific use (not outwardly or of their own force dangerous or injurious to life, health, or property) may be shipped only to and from manufacturers; dealers; bona fide research or experimental scientific laboratories; and employees of federal, state, or local governments who have official use for such poisons and are designated by the agency head to receive or send such poisons.
- Poisonous drugs and medicines may be shipped only from the manufacturer thereof or dealer therein to licensed physicians, surgeons, dentists, pharmacists, druggists, cosmetologists, barbers, and veterinarians (18 USC 1716).
- c. Poisons mailable between persons authorized in 6.3a and 6.3b are restricted to 8 ounces and must be mailed in containers marked with the proper shipping name of the poison (and, for air transportation, bear a shipper's declaration for dangerous goods with the designation "ORM-D AIR").

6.4 Irritants

Irritants (e.g., tear gas) are liquid or solid substances that give off intensely irritating fumes that impair a person's ability to function. Irritants are nonmailable.

6.5 Other Toxic Materials

Other toxic materials (e.g., pesticides, herbicides) that are not classified as poisons are restricted in their quantity, depending on their toxicities (lethal dose (LD) in milligrams (mg) per kilogram (kg) of test animals).

7.0 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

7.1 Definition

A controlled substance is any anabolic steroid, narcotic, hallucinogenic, stimulant, or depressant drug in Schedules I through V of the Controlled Substances Act, 21 USC 801, et seq., and 21 CFR 1300, et seq. If distribution of a controlled substance is unlawful under 21 USC 801, et seq., and any implementing regulations in 21 CFR 1300, et seq., then distribution of such matter by mail is also unlawful under 18 USC 1716.

7.2 Mailing Requirements

If distribution of a controlled substance is lawful under 21 USC 801, et seq., and any implementing regulations in 21 CFR 1300, et seq., the USPS considers such distribution by mail to constitute the mailing of matter not outwardly or of its own force dangerous or injurious to a person's life or health and accordingly mailable, subject to these standards:

- a. The inner container of any parcel containing controlled substances is marked and sealed under the applicable provisions of the Controlled Substances Act (21 USC 801, et seq., and any implementing regulations in 21 CFR 1300, et seq.) and placed in a plain outer container or securely overwrapped in plain paper.
- b. If the mailing includes prescription drugs containing controlled substances, the inner container is also labeled to show the prescription number and the name and address of the pharmacy, practitioner, or other person dispensing the prescription.
- The outer wrapper or container is free of markings that would indicate the nature of the contents.

8.0 DRUG PARAPHERNALIA

8.1 Definition and Examples

It is unlawful to use the mails to transport drug paraphernalia. Drug paraphernalia is any equipment, product, or material of any kind primarily intended or designed for use in manufacturing, compounding, converting, concealing, producing, processing, preparing, injecting, ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing into the human body a controlled substance, possession of which is unlawful under the Controlled Substances Act. Examples of drug paraphernalia are items primarily intended or designed for use in ingesting, inhaling, or otherwise introducing marijuana, cocaine, hashish, hashish oil, PCP, or amphetamines into the human body, such as metal, wooden, acrylic, glass, stone, plastic, or ceramic pipes with or without screens, permanent screens, hashish heads, or punctured metal bowls; water pipes, chamber pipes, carburetor pipes, electric pipes, ice pipes or chillers, and air-driven pipes; carburetion tubes and devices; smoking and carburetion masks; roach clips (i.e., objects used to hold burning material that is too small or short to be held in the hand); miniature spoons with level capacities of 1/10 cubic centimeter or less; chillums; bongs; wired cigarette papers; and cocaine freebase kits.

8.2 Determination

In determining whether an item constitutes drug paraphernalia, in addition to all other logically relevant factors, these factors may be considered:

- a. Oral or written instructions or other descriptive materials provided with the item that explain or depict its use.
- b. National and local advertising on its use.
- c. The manner in which the item is displayed for sale.
- d. Whether the owner, or anyone in control of the item, is a legitimate supplier of like or related items to the community, such as a licensed distributor or dealer of tobacco products.
- e. Direct or circumstantial evidence of the ratio of sales of the items to the total sales of the business enterprise.
- The existence and scope of legitimate uses of the item in the community.
- g. Expert testimony on its use.

8.3 Exceptions

The standards in 8.1 and 8.2 do not apply to any person authorized by local, state, or federal law to manufacture, possess, or distribute items described in 8.1 or 8.2; nor to any item that, in the normal lawful course of business, is sold through the mail and traditionally intended for use with tobacco products, including any pipe, paper, or accessory.

9.0 RADIOACTIVE MATERIALS

Any package containing radioactive materials is non-mailable if required to bear the U.S. Department of Transportation's Radioactive White-I, Radioactive Yellow-II, or Radioactive Yellow-III label (49 CFR 172.436, 172.438, or 172.440) or if it contains quantities of radioactive material in excess of those authorized in Publication 6, *Radioactive Materials*.

10.0 ETIOLOGIC AGENT PREPARATIONS, CLINI-CAL SPECIMENS, AND BIOLOGICAL PROD-LICTS

11.0 OTHER REGULATED MATERIALS

11.1 Magnetized Material

Magnetized material with a magnetic field strength of 0.002 gauss or more at a distance of 7 feet from any point on the surface of the package, or that is of such mass that it could affect aircraft instruments (e.g., the compasses) is nonmailable unless properly prepared and marked for air shipment. Any package that has a measurable magnetic field strength greater than 0.00525 gauss at 15 feet is

nonmailable under any condition. Magnetized material that may be transported by air must be marked with the proper shipping name and bear the appropriate U.S. Department of Transportation magnetized material warning label and shipper's declaration for dangerous goods.

11.2 Dry Ice

Dry ice (carbon dioxide solid) is not acceptable in international mail. In domestic mail, parcels eligible for air transportation that contain 5 pounds or less of dry ice used as a refrigerant for the contents of the parcel must be marked with the name of the contents being cooled, the words "Carbon Dioxide Solid" or "Dry Ice," and the weight of dry ice contained; no shipper's declaration is required for the dry ice. Except under 10.10, parcels eligible for domestic air transportation that contain more than a net weight of 5 pounds of dry ice must have a shipper's declaration for dangerous goods attached in triplicate and must be marked on the package with the net weight of the dry ice and the words "DRY ICE, UN 1845." Parcels containing dry ice must be packed in containers that permit the release of carbon dioxide gas (see 49 CFR 173.217 and 175.10(a)(13)).

11.3 Household Substances

A household substance (39 USC 3001(f)), i.e., any matter unsolicited by the addressee, that contains a household substance as defined by section 2 of the Poison Prevention

Packaging Act of 1970 (15 USC 1471(2)) is mailable only if it complies with the requirements for special child-resistant packaging established for that substance by the Consumer Product Safety Commission (16 CFR 1700).

11.4 Pesticides

A pesticide (18 USC 1716), i.e., any matter that contains a pesticide as defined by section 2 of the Federal Insecticide, Fungicide, and Rodenticide Act (7 USC 136(u)) is mailable only if it complies with child-resistant packaging standards established by the Environmental Protection Agency applicable to that particular matter (40 CFR 157).

11.5 Fragrance Advertising Sample

11.6 Compliance Certificates

Customers offering matter for deposit in the mail that would be nonmailable under 11.3, 11.4, and 11.5 but for compliance with the specified packaging and preparation requirements may submit an accompanying written statement certifying that the matter is packaged or prepared under the applicable standards. The certifying statement may be made on the customer's letterhead, on a bulk mailing statement, or as a notice on the exterior of each item presented for mailing.

IMM REVISION

International Money Order Service—Senegal

The postal administration of Senegal has lowered the limit on the dollar value of money orders it will accept. Effective May 1, 1995, the maximum value of a money order purchased in the United States for payment in Senegal is \$500.

Although the U.S. Postal Service issues international money orders in denominations up to a maximum of \$700 per money order, some foreign postal administrations place a lower limit on the dollar value of money orders they accept. Postmasters, supervisors, and window clerks must know those administrations and the maximum values that follow:

Country	Maximum Limit of a Money Order
El Salvador	\$500
Great Britain	200
Guyana	500
Mexico	500
Nigeria	500
Norway	400
Senegal	500

Window clerks should refer to the appropriate pages of the *International Mail Manual* when issuing money orders for payments in those countries.

Individual money order authorizations sent to the St. Louis Accounting Service Center in excess of those limits are returned to the customer. A notification that the authorization exceeds the limit set by the destination country accompanies each returned authorization.

Customers wishing to purchase money orders for amounts in excess of the maximum amount allowed per money order may purchase multiple money orders. These customers must pay the appropriate fee for each money order purchased.

The total value of money orders purchased by an individual postal customer on any one day may not exceed the limit in the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) section S020.1.3 currently set at \$10,000. If an individual postal customer

purchases money orders with a total face value of between \$3,000 and \$10,000 on any one day, clerks must require Form 8105, *Money Order Transaction Report.* (See DMM, section S020.)

Therefore, effective immediately, the *International Mail Manual* (IMM) section 391.12 is revised to reflect the current limits.

391 International Postal Money Orders

* * * * *

391.12 Maximum Amount

The maximum amount for a single international postal money order is \$700.

Exceptions: Money orders may not exceed \$200 when payable in Great Britain, \$400 when payable in Norway, and \$500 when payable in El Salvador, Guyana, Mexico, Nigeria, and Senegal. There is no limit on the number of money orders that may be sent to a payee during any time period. There is a limit on the total face value of money orders an individual customer may purchase on any one day. See DMM \$020.

Issue 15 of the IMM will include this revision.

International Money Order Service

The U.S. Postal Service currently has international postal money order service with 106 countries. Twenty-nine countries accept the International Postal Money Order form MP1; seventy-four countries accept the authorization to issue an International Money Order form set; and three countries accept the U.S. Postal Service domestic money order form. To avoid confusion in the receiving country, clerks must sell the correct money order form to customers.

On page 27 is a chart of all countries that accept international postal money orders from the United States as of April 27, 1995. Please post the chart to aid window clerks and postal customers.

ALL OFFICES WITH CITY MOTORIZED, RURAL, OR HIGHWAY CONTRACT BOX DELIVERY ROUTES

Mailbox Improvement Week, May 15–20

Each year the Postal Service designates a week during May to encourage customers on city motorized, rural, or highway contract box delivery routes to examine and, where necessary, improve the appearance of their mailboxes. Mailbox Improvement Week, May 15–20, calls attention to the need for providing mail receptacles that are:

- 1. Designed to protect the mail from weather.
- 2. Safe to use.
- 3. Conveniently located.
- 4. Neat in appearance.

Neat, attractive mailboxes make a significant contribution to the appearance of the countryside and to streets in suburban areas.

Mailboxes that meet these four important requirements contribute to a more customer-oriented, efficient delivery and collection operation, and improved service to the entire route. There are two approved styles of boxes: (1) traditional design in three standard sizes (see Exhibit A) and (2) contemporary design, also in three sizes (see Exhibit B).

Notice 209

Notice 209, Mailbox Improvement Week, is available by submitting Form 7380, MDC Supply Requisition, to a material distribution center. Postmasters should send the notice to all rural and highway contract box delivery route customers the week before Mailbox Improvement Week to alert them of the event.

City Motorized, Rural, and Highway Contract Box Delivery Routes

Customers must use only approved traditional or contemporary curbside mailboxes for new installations or to replace an unsuitable receptacle. However, customers may use custom-built curbside mailboxes if the local postmaster gives prior approval and the box conforms generally to the same requirements as approved manufactured boxes, relative to the flag, size, strength, and quality of construction. Carriers on city motorized routes may continue to serve boxes designed primarily for use by customers receiving door delivery, which have been erected and served under previous regulations (see Exhibit C). However, they should advise customers they may use only approved curbside boxes when replacing these receptacles. A list of approved manufacturers of traditional curbside boxes appears in Domestic Mail Manual Transition Book (DMMT) 151.518.

For city motorized routes, and where the use of street names and house numbers are authorized on rural and highway contract box delivery routes, the box must display that number on the side, or on the door if the box is in a group of boxes. If the box is on a street other than the one on which the customer resides, the street name and house number must be on the box. When rural and highway contract box delivery route customers have assigned box numbers, the numbers must appear on the side of single boxes or on the door of grouped boxes, visible to the approaching carrier. The street number, box number, and/or any other address information must be inscribed in contrasting color in neat letters and numerals not less than 1-inch high. In all instances, placing the owner's name on the box is optional.

City motorized, rural, and highway contract box delivery route customers should be encouraged to group boxes whenever practical, especially where many boxes are located at or near crossroads, service turnouts, or similar locations. Customers should also paint boxes and supports/posts and keep them rust-free. Advertising on boxes and supports/posts is prohibited.

In areas where snow removal is a problem, the Postal Service suggests using a semiarch or extended arm-type support (see Exhibit D), which allows snowplows to sweep near or under boxes without damaging supports and provides easy access to the boxes by carriers and customers.

Generally, customers should install boxes with the bottom of the box at a vertical height of between 3 to 4 feet from the road surface. However, because of varying road and curb conditions and other factors, the Postal Service recommends that customers contact the postmaster or carrier before erecting or replacing mailboxes and supports.

Location

Customers must place boxes on city motorized, rural, and highway contract routes so a carrier can safely and conveniently serve them without leaving their vehicle. The boxes must be on the right-hand side of the road in the carrier's travel direction in all cases where traffic conditions make it dangerous for the carrier to drive to the left to reach the boxes, or where doing so would constitute a violation of traffic laws and regulations (*DMMT* 155.6 exempts apartment houses or other multiple dwellings from this rule).

On new rural and highway contract box delivery routes, all boxes must be on the right-hand side of the road in the direction of the route line of travel. Box placement must

conform with state laws and highway regulations. City motorized, rural, and highway contract box delivery route carriers are subject to the same traffic laws and regulations as other motorists. Customers must remove obstructions, including vehicles, trash cans, and snow, that impede efficient delivery. Except when a box is temporarily blocked, carriers must have access to the box without leaving the vehicle unless authorized to dismount.

Mailbox Supports

Posts and other supports for curbside boxes are owned and controlled by customers, who are responsible for seeing that posts are neat and of adequate strength and size. Customers are encouraged to avoid using massive mailbox supports that, when struck, could damage vehicles and cause injury. Heavy metal posts, concrete posts, and miscellaneous farm equipment, such as milk cans filled with concrete, are examples of potentially dangerous supports. The ideal support is an assembly that bends or falls away when struck by a vehicle. Post or support designs may not represent effigies or caricatures that disparage or ridicule any person. Customers may attach the box to a fixed or movable arm. DMMT 151.5 specifies postal regulations regarding construction and placement of mailboxes and supports on city motorized, rural, and highway contract box delivery routes.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has determined that mailbox supports no larger than 4 inches by 4 inches, or a 2-inch diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe, buried no more than 24 inches, should safely break away if struck by a vehicle. The mailbox must also be securely attached to its post to prevent separation if struck. See Exhibits E and F for examples of mailbox mountings and supports suggested by the FHWA.

CBUs and All-Weather Parcel Lockers

During Mailbox Improvement Week, postmasters, managers, or their designees must also review cluster box units (CBUs) and all-weather parcel lockers in their delivery areas to identify any hazards or irregularities. They must record the results of the review. Exhibit G, which should be reproduced locally, is a suggested format to use in conducting and recording the reviews. Employees conducting the reviews must complete Form 1624, *Delivery and Collection Equipment Work Request*, for any equipment that poses a safety hazard to postal customers or employees. Use Form 7380, *MDC Supply Requisition*, to request Form 1624 from the material distribution centers.

Equipment Review Procedure

Employees should use the CBU and parcel locker equipment checklist and follow-up review procedure when

examining the condition of CBUs and parcel lockers. They should:

- List the unit location, type, and manufacturer in the left-hand column (list serial number where available).
- Assign each checklist item one of the following ratings:
 - OK Equipment does not need attention for this item.
 - X Equipment needs attention for this item.
 - NA Item does not apply to this particular piece of equipment.
- 3. When examining the equipment, use the instructions below to complete Exhibit G:
 - a. Check equipment. It should be straight, vertical, and firmly mounted. Attempt to shake the unit; it should hardly move. If equipment is not firmly mounted, note whether it is the connection at ground level that is loose or the connection between the pedestal and customer compartments that needs attention.
 - b. Check visible welds. Make note of cracked, broken, or rusted welds. Tap the pedestal with a plastic hammer, especially along the seams, to check for corrosion from the inside out or perforated corrosion.
 - c. Observe whether the carrier access door is locked and secure. Open it and observe whether it is bowed or warped and if the door and locking bar operate smoothly. With the carrier access door open, check whether restraining devices prevent the door from blowing closed. These devices, which may have to be set manually, should be serviceable.
 - d. Ensure that the Arrow lock operates smoothly and that the mounting screws are tight. The cover that protects the Arrow lock from customer tampering must be serviceable and firmly attached.
 - Ensure that all customer access doors are present, closed, and locked with no visible damage or signs of forced entry. Check that customer door numbers are readable.
 - f. Ensure that the exterior surface of the unit is free from rust and graffiti.
 - g. Examine the unit. Check for defects or damage and whether it reflects a proper postal image.

- h. Check whether the unit and/or any protecting structure appear watertight and in good repair. Check to see if there are any noticeable watermarks inside the unit or any wet mail.
- i. Note any other conditions important to report.
- Record the results of the inspection on the checklist.
- Submit the completed Form 1624 for each unit reviewed to the maintenance office responsible for CBU installation and/or repair in the area.

Carriers must note equipment deficiencies and report them to the postmaster, supervisor, or designee. The postmaster or designee must then submit Form 1624 reporting the equipment defects. In addition, carriers should complete Form 1767, *Report of Hazard, Unsafe Condition, or Practice*, for items that pose an immediate threat to safety, such as an improperly secured or leaning CBU. The postmaster or supervisor must immediately notify by telephone the office responsible for repair of reported hazards. The postmaster or supervisor must follow up to ensure that the work is satisfactorily completed and documented. The office responsible for repair should use its local contracting authority to accomplish the repairs.

Publicity

Postmasters should give these guidelines and suggestions maximum local publicity. City motorized, rural, and highway contract box delivery route carriers must cooperate to ensure the success of this endeavor and later report the results to the postmaster. Also, they should use the most upto-date list of approved manufacturers and mailbox suppliers when providing city motorized, rural, or highway contract box delivery route customers with information about what type of box to install.

News Release

The following news release on page 35 is provided for postmasters to use in promoting Mailbox Improvement Week for daily or weekly newspapers or broadcast stations in their delivery area. Postmasters should retype the release and include their name. It may also be helpful to alert the media to locations of particularly interesting mailboxes in your delivery area. 




Exhibit E Cantilever Mailbox Supports




Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 95-9

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

The Postal Service honors Marilyn Monroe with the issuance of a 32-cent commemorative stamp on June 1, at Universal Studios Hollywood, in Universal City, CA. The stamp goes on sale nationwide on the same day.

Designed by award-winning artist Michael Deas of New Orleans, LA, the Marilyn Monroe stamp is the first in a new series entitled Legends of Hollywood. The Legends of Hollywood series will commemorate film personalities who have made an indelible mark on the American motion picture industry.

In addition to the official first day of issue ceremony at Universal Studios Hollywood, the Postal Service will join in Marilyn Monroe birthday celebrations at 23 Planet Hollywood locations. Also, several local post offices nationwide will host or participate in Marilyn Monroe stamp events.

Marilyn Monroe was born Norma Jeane Mortensen on June 1, 1926, in Los Angeles, CA. After spending most of her childhood in orphanages and foster homes, Monroe became a photographer's model. Her photograph on a calendar led to her film debut in *Scudda-Hoo! Scudda-Hay!* (1948), followed by other minor roles until she was recognized for small parts in *The Asphalt Jungle* (1950) and *All About Eve* (1950). Monroe's talent as a comedienne became apparent in such classics as *Gentlemen Prefer Blondes* (1953), *How to Marry a Millionaire* (1953), and *The Seven Year Itch* (1955).

Eager to hone her acting skills, Monroe studied at the Actor's Studio in New York, under Lee Strasberg. Later,

she returned to Hollywood to star in more serious films, such as *Bus Stop* (1956), *The Prince and the Showgirl* (1957), *Some Like It Hot* (1959), and *The Misfits* (1961).

Prior to her death on August 5, 1962, Marilyn Monroe completed a legacy of 29 films.

Thrift Savings Plan Open Season

The next Thrift Savings Plan (TSP) open season is May 15, 1995, through July 31, 1995. TSP BK08, *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan for Federal Employees* (September 1990), provides a good overview of TSP. The following information should assist personnel services offices in conducting this open season.

Direct Mailing to Employees

Career employees receive a direct mailing from the national level of TSP-0595, *Open Season Update: May 15, 1995—July 31, 1995,* at their mailing addresses of record. Newly eligible career employees also receive a direct mailing from the national level of an enrollment package that contains a cover letter; TSP BK08, *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan for Federal Employees* (September 1990); and TSP-1, *Election Form* (February 1991). Career employees should receive these materials no later than the end of May.

Undeliverable enrollment packages for newly eligible employees are returned to the employing office of record. While the disposition of returned enrollment packages is at the discretion of the Customer Services district office or other administering office, giving a returned enrollment package to an employee offers the employee an opportunity to submit a correct Form 1216, *Employee's Current Mailing Address*.

Eligibility

Career employees hired before January 1, 1995, are eligible to participate in this open season. Also, career employees hired before July 1, 1995, previously eligible to participate in a TSP open season during a prior appointment are eligible.

All employees who participated in TSP and stopped their TSP contributions after January 31, 1995, are not eligible to participate in this TSP open season. They must wait for the TSP open season beginning November 15, 1995.

Effective Dates

The effective dates for TSP open season elections are as follows:

Any TSP-1 processed so that the effective date is later than it should be based upon the above chart, whether due to a belated election or an administrative error, requires personnel services staff to initiate the completion of Form 6886, *Thrift Savings Plan Request for Retroactive Contributions*. The election must be processed retroactively, with an effective date of July 8, 1995, or July 22, 1995, depending on the date the employee initially filed his or her election form with the personnel services office.

Open Season Materials

In addition to the direct mailing of TSP information to employees, the material distribution centers (MDCs) automatically distribute residual supplies of the TSP update and election form to Human Resources personnel at Customer Services district offices, area offices, processing and distribution centers, bulk mail centers, airport mail centers, remote encoding centers, Headquarters, and selected Headquarters field units. (The September 1990 version of the TSP-1 is still valid and may be used if the February 1991 version is unavailable. All prior versions are obsolete and must be destroyed.) There is no automatic distribution of the TSP summary. Offices that do not have a sufficient stock of the TSP summary on hand should order a supply from the appropriate MDC at once using Form 7380, MDC Supply Requisition.

Participant Statements

Employees with a TSP account will receive a participant statement from the TSP Service Office in May 1995. The participant statement will no longer show the participant personal identification number (PIN) used for access to the ThriftLine, the automated information line available to TSP participants. To learn their PINs, participants must either refer to an earlier participant statement or contact the TSP Service Office.

Publicity

Customer Services district offices, area offices, processing and distribution centers, bulk mail centers, airport mail centers, Headquarters, and selected Headquarters field units will receive a supply of posters this open season from TSP. Installations that receive the posters must widely distribute and post them through July 31, 1995.

To assist in publicizing the TSP open season, post the open season notice found on page 61 on all bulletin boards through July 31, 1995. Also post the current TSP fact sheet on all bulletin boards.
