REMINDER

Only You Can Prevent Revenue Loss

In a Message from the Postmaster General, published in Postal Bulletin 21906 (11-9-95), Marvin Runyon announced the beginning of a new revenue assurance awareness campaign.

The PMG's message, "Working Together to Prevent Revenue Loss," served to remind all postal employees that uncollected revenue is more than a Finance problem or a management problem — it is a business problem and we need every employee's help to solve it. No business, including ours, can afford to lose thousands of dollars in uncollected revenue daily and expect to remain fiscally healthy.

The Postal Service is particularly vulnerable because we are an independent federal organization that does not receive taxpayer money to fund our operations. We generate revenue by selling our products and services to our customers, and to remain financially self-sufficient, it is critical that we receive the proper and timely payment of every dollar that we earn from these sales.

Our three goals — improving customer satisfaction, strengthening employee/USPS effectiveness, and improving financial performance — set the direction of our business. And getting the best business results means that we must accept revenue assurance as a responsibility that belongs to all of us. Every functional area must play a role as we work together to improve financial performance.

In addition, the Revenue Assurance Program helps to increase Economic Value Added (EVA), a

measure by which the Postal Service evaluates its financial standing. EVA is based on sound economic theory and measures the costs and benefits of both capital and expense spending. Conducting audits, setting goals, increasing personal accountability, and rewarding results are the types of business-oriented incentives that comprise EVA.

Because revenue assurance is inexpensive to implement and does not require capital dollar investments, it is an easy way for you to contribute to increasing EVA.

Finance is making a significant contribution to EVA by creating increased employee awareness—sharing information, suggestions, and ideas on how we can better manage revenue collection and reduce potential losses, and then disseminating it to the field "as the Voice of the Business" to increase employee involvement. Now it is up to you.

The message that's conveyed on the poster in this *Postal Bulletin*, "Only You Can Prevent Revenue Loss" (see pull-out insert), serves as a reminder that regardless of whether you work at the retail window, in the Business Mail Entry Unit, or on the workroom floor, "we all need to work together to prevent revenue loss."

Postmasters' Kit for Classification Reform

Message From the Vice President

Now that the Board of Governors has approved the first phase of mail classification reform, I want to tell you briefly how it will affect what we do.

Classification reform is an important part of the Postal Service's "Agenda for Change." It is the most dramatic and sweeping change of the Domestic Mail Classification Schedule and mail preparation standards in over 100 years. It is a big step toward modernizing the way we classify and price our products, so that customers can easily choose the services that fit their needs and we can justify the pricing of those services. It is part of our overall effort to make it easier for customers to do business with us. Working with customer experts, we are overhauling the process to make it simpler and more clear cut.

For example, if customers properly address and prepare their mail for rapid processing and smooth delivery, we can offer attractive pricing for what we call efficient mail. This first step can lead to increased postal efficiency, reduced costs, and more rate stability. It will strengthen our competitiveness and enable us to give customers the service they want and need. Ultimately all customers benefit because it will help the Postal Service to continue to provide universal mail service at affordable prices.

I want to encourage you to learn more about the new **First-Class**, **Standard** (formerly third-class and fourth-class) and **Periodicals** (formerly second-class) mail products. Some of you will become intimately involved with the new processes. There will be intensive training for employees and customers to prepare them for implementation on July 1, 1996.

Although many of you will not need an in-depth understanding of the technical aspects of these changes, your continued dedication to customer service will ensure that the changes are implemented smoothly and have the desired impact.

We want you all to be proud of what we are doing and continue to help our customers, any way you can, so that we can continue to be their carrier of choice.

BACKGROUND

Postal Service Simplifies Mail Classification

In a bid to be more customer-responsive, the Postal Service has reviewed and simplified the way mail is classified.

The initiative to reform the classification schedule began more than five years ago, when the Postal Service launched a process of self-examination to determine whether its classification structure met its own and its customers' needs and capabilities. The Postal Service began by asking mailers to assist in evaluating the existing mail classification structure and developing a classification reform proposal. The results of this collaborative process were set forth in the proposals and voluminous supporting materials in the Postal Service's filing with the Postal Rate Commission (PRC). In cooperation with scores of mailers, association representatives, and consultants, and after dozens of meetings with the industry, the Postal Service developed ambitious recommendations for new subclass structure, rate design, and mail makeup and other requirements.

The Postal Service then filed a Classification Reform case with the Postal Rate Commission in March 1995. In January 1996, the PRC recommended a majority of the USPS proposals in a 700-page decision. The Postal Service Board of Governors then studied those recommendations and approved virtually all the Commission's recommendations at a March 5, 1996, meeting. The Governors set an implementation date of July 1, 1996, to allow sufficient time for training postal employees and major mailers.

The current system is a collection of designations that date back to the Civil War era. In 1863, mail matter was first classified and letters were designated as the "first" class. Newspapers and magazines became "second" class, and other printed matter became "third" class.

Third-class was originally a catch-all category, but in 1879, a fourth class was introduced. Printed matter other than regular newspapers and periodicals remained third-class, while merchandise and other mailable matter became fourth-class.

This year, the Postal Service has taken a historic first step in simplifying this patchwork quilt of class designations that have developed over the past 130 years.

In the future, mail classes will not be referred to as second-, third-, or fourth-class. New categories have been created that are more descriptive of the type of communication, the speed of delivery, and the degree to which the mail can be sorted by computer.

The designation second-class will become "Periodicals," and third-class and fourth-class will become "Standard" Mail, although this reform package does not affect current fourth-class mail except for the name change. Letter correspondence will remain First-Class Mail, which is a registered servicemark.

The changes affect primarily business mailings. Businesses that provide mail that is already prepared for processing on automated equipment requires less handling by the Postal Service. The new rate categories will allow for work-sharing by these higher volume mailers.

Overall, the classification proposals are not intended to increase postal revenues. The contribution from each class to overall postal revenues will be about the same as projected in the most recent rate case.

The cost of mailing a single one-ounce First-Class letter will remain unchanged at 32 cents. Other Classification Reform filings, including nonprofit mail, special services, expedited mail, and parcels, are expected later this year.

Key Questions and Answers on Classification Reform

Q: Why are you making these changes?

A: The old classification system for First-, second-, and third-class mail was too complicated, not "user-friendly," and often related to practices and procedures now outmoded by the advance of technology. Consequently, if the Postal Service had stayed with the old classification system, it could have experienced a loss in business and its ability to serve its customers well.

Q: How will Classification Reform improve service?

A: Classification Reform emphasizes preparation of efficient mail and includes preparation standards that harmonize with internal postal processing systems. With these features, the postreform mailstream should run more smoothly, with less crossflow of inefficient mail or preparation formats, thus facilitating the achievement of established service standards in a more consistent manner. Additionally, the improved address quality standards should reduce the amount of undeliverable-as-addressed mail to ensure that more mail is delivered on the first attempt.

Q: Why was July 1, 1996, chosen as the implementation date?

A: July 1 was selected because it is a realistic date that will give the Postal Service and our customers time to prepare for the changes. During the Classification Reform process, the Postal Service for the first time pursued a "parallel track approach" in writing the rules that will translate

the reform principles into everyday practice. It did so at the same time that its reform case was before the Postal Rate Commission. This involved publishing three separate major notices of proposed rulemaking in the *Federal Register* and soliciting mailer reaction to each. Dozens of mailers responded, and their comments have helped shape a set of rules that should be highly workable.

Q: Will local Postal Service personnel be up to speed on the new rules and able to advise me on changes I'll need to make?

A: Yes. We've launched the most intensive field training effort ever for both postal employees and customers. Reform is just too important for us to do otherwise. Information will be provided through special training conferences, newsletters, publications, videos, and slide presentations.

Having expressed this confidence, we also have to be realistic. Knowing the new standards and applying them are different processes, and unique situations will likely arise that call into question how a certain rule applies to a particular set of circumstances.

Further, since the new classification system is simpler than the old, we're confident that interpretations of the rules will be more consistent.

Q: The reform seems to involve only bulk mailers. What's in it for the average, nonbusiness mailer?

A: You're right: The changes apply only to bulk mailers. First-Class single piece first ounce rate and conditions remain unchanged. However, while individual consumers do not have to do anything differently, they will benefit. Since all the elements of the postal system are inseparably tied together, Classification Reform will help ensure that overall postage rates stay lower longer and that high delivery standards continue to be met. These efforts will build on the \$4.5 billion in savings that have already accrued from the postal automation program. Further, consumers will benefit from the reduced cost of mailing that many companies (for example, utilities) will experience, and address-quality improvements will ensure more accurate delivery.

Q: What do you say to the charge that Classification Reform favors large mailers over small ones?

A: This is simply not true. The minimum mailing size for First-Class or Standard Mail remains unchanged. Classification Reform rewards efficiency. It gives lower rates to mailers who prepare automation-compatible mail or mail that bypasses postal operations, regardless of mailing size.

Having said this, we recognize that some mailers (large and small) may not be able to qualify their mail for high-efficiency rates right away. The Postal Service will do everything it can, working with individual mailers and trade groups, to help these mailers become more efficient, so they can qualify for lower rates.

Q: I'm primarily a parcel shipper. Why weren't corresponding reforms made in fourth-class mail?

A: There will be additional reform proposals put forward for four other categories: nonprofit mail; special services, including post office box fees, certified, and registered mail; Express Mail; and parcels.

These were not included in the initial Postal Rate Commission filing for a very practical reason: we simply could not produce all the data, the studies, and supporting documentation that would have been necessary to seek changes in every category of mail all at the same time.

Q: I'm confused by the new rule regarding business and courtesy reply cards and envelopes in automation mailings. Can you clarify?

A: The new requirement states that letter-size courtesy reply mail (CRM) and business reply mail (BRM) envelopes or cards included as enclosures in a First-Class, Periodicals, or Standard Mail automation mailing must be automation-compatible and bear a FIM and a correct barcode for the address to which the piece is to be returned.

Your confusion may arise from the fact that this requirement will have a different, and later, date for implementation than the rest of the reform package. Instead of taking effect on July 1, 1996, the requirements for enclosed CRM and BRM will be implemented on January 1, 1997.

Business Talk (Stand-Up) for Managers/Postmasters

The Postal Service has announced new and more efficient standards for mailers to use in preparing their mail. These standards are called Classification Reform and they will be implemented this coming July 1.

Today, I would like to tell you what it is all about. Classification Reform will be a strong move forward for the Postal Service and our customers. It will make it easier for them to do business with us.

Classification Reform streamlines and simplifies mailing preparation standards. The Postal Service wants mailers to do more barcoding and presorting. To encourage them to do so, we are offering additional new incentives like lower postage rates. Classification Reform means: "the more a mailer prepares, the less the mailer pays."

Some employees have asked, why did we have to make these changes? The answer is we had to make changes to keep up with technology. We have to reward our customers who automate the mail, and we had to become more user-friendly with our mail preparation rules.

In today's world, we must receive more mail that is barcoded. It enables us to process the mail in the most efficient way. And if a mailer is willing to put barcodes on the mail for us or to presort it for us, we're willing to share the savings with that mailer.

And, with better rates, we anticipate that we will get more volume. That will help ensure the stability of the Postal Service, and everyone will benefit even the consumer because we plan to go longer periods of time without raising First-Class mailing rates.

Many of our major customers and the mailing industry have told us that they are looking forward to the implementation of Classification Reform. Thousands of postal employees who know about it are also optimistic. It has been reviewed thoroughly by the independent Postal Rate Commission and the final authority, the Postal Service Board of Governors.

The changes will greatly benefit both the Postal Service and our customers. The benefits are numerous. It will make mail easier, less costly, and more efficient to process. It will simplify mailing for many of our customers. It will result in increased efficiency, reduced costs, and more rate stability. The Postal Service will be able to continue providing universal mail service at some of the world's lowest prices.

It's important to note that classification reform will not affect the regular, residential customer. The 32-cent single ounce price of mailing a letter, one of the lowest postage rates in the world, is unaffected by the present Classification Reform initiative.

There will be many other advantages to Classification Reform. It will eliminate many of our outdated administrative procedures. The changes will encourage automation, which will help keep postage costs lower for longer periods.

Automation is the key to keeping pace with America's mailing needs. Automated products are an attractive alternative in the new electronic market.

The Postal Service has a solid plan to communicate and implement Classification Reform with our employees and customers. For those who play a critical role, business customers and employees such as bulk mail technicians and account representatives, there will be extensive training and education sessions.

Each district has its own implementation coordinator. The coordinator will work with the manager of Business Mail Entry, the Postal Business Center manager, account representatives, local postmasters, and managers. These are the people you and your customers can count on to answer any questions you may have. Every post office will receive information noting the key contacts and whom customers may call.

Classification Reform represents a major step forward in the Postal Service becoming more efficient and competitive. It is the most comprehensive proposal for changing and improving mailing standards in history. It is the product of years of hard work and research by many knowledgeable mailers, mailing consultants, and postal employees.

With your support, Classification Reform will help ensure our continued success.

Postmaster's Speech (external audience) Classification Reform

Good (afternoon or evening), ladies and gentlemen. It's a pleasure to be here with you today to discuss what Classification Reform means to you and your mail service.

During the summer of 1995, Postmaster General Marvin Runyon made the following statement at the National Postal Forum in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania:

"If it costs less for the Postal Service to process and deliver, it should cost less for you to mail." In a nutshell, that is what Classification Reform is all about.

Classification Reform is the most dramatic and sweeping change of mailing rules in Postal Service history. The foundation for today's classification system was laid over 100 years ago and that classification system has remained largely untouched for nearly two decades. Until now.

The decision by the Board of Governors of the Postal Service to implement these new standards is an important first step in modernizing the mail system.

We're even changing the definitions of major categories of mail to better reflect the way mail is prepared and processed.

The new rates provide strong economic signals to promote automation. We expect to generate over 19 billion, that's with a B, 19 billion more customer barcodes with Classification Reform. And millions less in bundles and rubber bands. These modernized mailing practices will streamline our operations and acceptance, and, therefore, we expect greater volume growth and more contribution to the overall organization's growth in the future.

Ultimately, all consumers will benefit because we plan to hold postage rates lower for a longer period of time.

Some of the benefits that are now a reality include:

 A simpler, more consistent, and user-friendly classification system in place for all customers to use without feeling overwhelmed.

- Rewards for mailers who prepare the lowest cost mail, that is, mail that is barcoded and presorted.
- Customer incentives for improved mail makeup and addressing.
- Strengthened competitiveness and increased customer service. It also allows us to continue to provide universal mail service at some of the world's lowest prices.

Classification Reform benefits small business mailers as well as large ones. The mailing industry is responding with new software and hardware to help smaller mailers barcode their mail. This change could save some mailers as much as 10 percent on their postage costs.

Rather than tell you about each classification change, and how much money it will save you, I have brought some literature with me today. (OPTIONAL)

Also, joining me here today are some of our Customer Service Classification and Implementation experts who can answer your specific questions. Let me introduce them to you (INTRODUCE STAFF THAT ACCOMPANIED YOU TO SPEAKING ENGAGEMENT).

Classification Reform, along with our new Customer Perfect! program, which is being implemented and tested in 10 different areas of the nation this year, are both part of a serious commitment to make the Postal Service work for you.

Automation has been an integral part of the Postal Service for almost a decade. It's the key to our remaining a vital communications entity. Classification Reform is a "win-win" situation. It's quite simple: our customers receive economic incentives and lower mailing costs and we receive a more fully automated mailstream.

You may have heard the following statistics before, but it is good to repeat them because they really spell out what we're talking about.

It costs \$40 for the Postal Service to process 1,000 letters by hand, and about \$22 to process those same 1,000 letters by our mechanized letter sorting machines. But with automation, it costs the Postal

Service just \$4 to process those same 1,000 letters. That's quite a difference.

The Postal Service needs your support of Classification Reform. The business mailer is the key ingredient in this money-saving equation. Just remember these five simple reasons why you should join us on the Classification Reform bandwagon:

- 1. You can reduce your postage and mail preparation costs.
- The Classification Reform proposal wasn't just our idea. It sprang from years of cooperation and discussion with major mailers and consultants, and it's endorsed by Gene Del Polito, President of the Advertising Mail Marketing Association and many other mailers and associations.
- It will be easier to enter your mail into the Postal Service's mailstream, saving everyone needless paperwork and administrative burdens.
- We're doing everything we can to make the transition as painless as possible, thanks to the information that's been prepared and dissemi-

- nated, and the active and ongoing education and training of our workforce.
- Classification Reform will ensure that the Postal Service will give you the world's best bargain when it comes to mailing your products.

We know that the difference between just being "good" and being "great" is customer service. We know that anticipating customer needs is the key to your satisfaction level.

Finally, let me say that every employee in the (name of Post Office) epitomizes the following two ideals. The customer is our purpose for being who we are and what we are, and no one, I repeat no one, is more important than you, our postal customer.

USPS National Sponsorship — Dollars for Scholars

The Postal Service is a national sponsor of an educational scholarship program called Dollars for Scholars. The theme of this year's scholarship program is "1996 — Year of the Scholar." The sponsorship recognizes the Postal Service as the exclusive "official carrier" for Year of the Scholar. The Postal Service sponsorship was initially announced at a kick-off ceremony at the University of Southern California, Los Angeles, in January. The master of ceremonies was actor John Ritter. Dollars for Scholars was selected for sponsorship as part of the Postal Service Marketing Department's educational outreach program. The Postal Service's educational outreach efforts are intended to support education at the local level.

Dollars for Scholars consists of over 750 chapters nationwide. The chapters are community-based, volunteer-directed scholarship foundations affiliated with Citizens' Scholarship Foundation of America, Inc., headquartered in Minnesota. Established in 1958, Dollars for Scholars chapters have awarded over \$250 million to students throughout the country. In recent years, chapters

have been established in neighborhoods and communities traditionally underrepresented when securing opportunities for post-secondary education. In many communities, volunteers begin preparing students at the elementary school level.

This year, Dollars for Scholars chapters have set a goal to raise \$20 million for sponsorships. They hope to reach that goal by working with the Postal Service. A list of chapters has been provided to each area office. Anyone interested in volunteering should contact the Sales Office (Advertising and Promotion) or Corporate Relations Center at the area office. Participation is voluntary and should be off-the-clock. Local chapters raise money for scholarships through a variety of means including direct mail, phone-a-thons, sports tournaments, auctions, and bake sales. The next planned national event is the 35th Anniversary Celebration on May 16 in Boston.

Label Contract for Passport Label System

An indefinite delivery, indefinite quantity contract (162745-96-B-C002) has been awarded to Intermec Media Products for labels used in the Passport Label System on the Monarch Model 9425 thermal printer.

Per contract 162745-96-B-C002, Intermec is the mandatory source of supply for these delivery barcode sorter labels. The Engineering Center has tested and approved Intermec's labels for field use. Labels from other suppliers have not been tested and often fail to perform properly in our mail sorting operations.

Beginning April 15, 1996, processing and distribution centers should use the VISA IMPAC credit card to order labels directly from Intermec Media Products by telephone. They may also order by mail or fax using the order form in Material Logistics Bulletin MLB-CO-96-007.

The ordering unit is a box of 8 rolls containing 2,790 labels per roll, for a total of 22,320 labels per box. Orders must be for full boxes. The price of a box is \$66.78 plus

postage. Orders will be sent within 2 weeks after the date the order is received by Intermec.

Orders of less than 24 boxes are shipped via U.S. Mail directly to the requiring facility. Because Postal Service suppliers can no longer use USPS G-10 permit labels, Intermec will pay regular postage rates to ship labels and will add the postage to the cost of the labels. Before ordering, compute the postage and supply this information to Intermec. Intermec will ship these labels in one of the following three ways: Express Mail for emergencies, First-Class Mail (Priority Mail) for expedited service, and parcel post for regular mail service. Please specify the shipping option when placing your order.

Shipments of 24 boxes or more are shipped to the ordering facility on skids via a motor freight carrier. Boxes are packed no more than 24 to a skid and stretchwrapped. The Chicago Purchasing and Materials Service Center will provide Intermec with a block of Government Bills of Lading to be used for large orders.

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 96-8

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail

postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 Code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

The Postal Service will issue a 32-cent Paralympic Games stamped envelope (Item 2115) on May 9, 1996, in Atlanta, Georgia. The envelope is available in size No. 10, regular only, and will go on sale nationwide May 10.

Designed by Brad Copeland of Atlanta, Georgia, the envelope features the Paralympic Games StarFire logo in blue, gold, and red with the words "1996 Atlanta Paralympic Games" in black and "USA 32" in red printed adjacent to the indicia. The star represents the athlete, and the fire represents the passion that burns in the heart of each Paralympian.

The 1996 Paralympic Games, the zenith of competition for elite athletes with physical disabilities, will be held August 15 through 25 in Atlanta, Georgia. These games were first held in Rome in 1960 and have been held every Olympic year since then, usually in the city or country that hosts the Olympic Games. Each athlete must meet strict qualifying standards in order to be selected to his or her national team. Roughly one-third the size of the Olympics, the 1996 Paralympic Games will have 3,500 athletes, 1,000 coaches, 1,500 officials, and 12,000 volunteers and will host over 120 nations and 17 sports.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Postmark

Because of expenses and changing balances in the C and F Funds, their returns vary from Barclays' returns.
