100 Years of Rural Free Delivery

Rural Free Delivery — one of the great traditions of the Postal Service — began 100 years ago on October 1, 1896, at Charles Town, Halltown, and Uvilla, West Virginia. Historians recognize the fact that Rural Free Delivery (RFD) was partially responsible for the development of our nation's roads and highways, and that the delivery of mail service to rural Americans was a contributing factor to our country's growing economy.

To honor this historic anniversary, the Postal Service will issue a stamp on August 7 (see *Postal Bulletin* 21923 (7-4-96)). The first day of issue ceremony is scheduled to

take place in Charleston, West Virginia, in conjunction with the 92nd National Convention of the National Rural Letter Carriers' Association.

Postmasters are encouraged to use the contents of this information kit throughout the summer and fall to help increase recognition of this valuable community service, which is the epitome of our "everyone, everywhere, every day" theme.

Rural Free Delivery Fact Sheet

Rural Carriers serve 25.2 million customers throughout the United States; 500,000 of those customers are businesses.

Rural Carriers deliver mail on nearly 57,000 routes out of 15,000 post offices.

On any given day, rural carriers travel 2.8 million miles:

The longest rural route is Route 1 in George West, Texas: 180 miles.

The shortest rural route is Route 38 in Fort Worth, Texas: 3 miles.

The average rural route is slightly more than 50 miles in length.

There are approximately 100,000 rural letter carriers nationwide:

50% are part-time.

50% are male; 50% female.

Rural Carriers walk 4,172 miles per day, or 1.26 million miles per year, at an average rate of four miles per hour.

Rural Carriers serve as "Post Offices on Wheels." They:

Accept Priority Mail and Express Mail;

Sell stamps, money orders, and stamped envelopes; and

Collect and deliver certified, registered mail, and packages.

First Day of Issue Ceremony for the Rural Free Delivery Stamp:

August 7, 1996, at the National Rural Letter Carriers' Association convention, Charleston, West Virginia. The stamp design is based on a photograph of an early rural carrier alongside his horse-drawn wagon.

Background Information

A Brief History of Rural Free Delivery in America

In the late 1800s, some 30 million Americans lived in rural communities. For the most part, these pioneers had very little interaction with the outside world. Communication was dependent on visits with neighbors or trips into town, which meant spending valuable time away from the farm and its related chores.

Most of the time, letters would simply wait at the post office to be collected by their owners. Word that a letter had arrived could be received through friends, or through newspaper columns that listed the names of people who recently received mail.

Until 1863, even city residents were required to pick up their mail from post offices. Then President Abraham Lincoln signed a new postal bill stipulating that letter carriers were to be employed at post offices in cities with a population greater than 20,000.

Rural residents became aware of this change, and, through a number of powerful and influential farming organizations, they lobbied Congress requesting similar service for the countryside. In the 1890s, Congress authorized the Postmaster General to conduct an experiment to determine if this service would be affordable and possible for rural Americans. On October 1, 1896, Postmaster General William L. Wilson tested this new concept in his home state of West Virginia, establishing routes in Charles Town, Halltown, and Uvilla.

Within one year the service was extended to 29 other states. By June 30, 1900, there were 1,214 routes serving an estimated 879,127 people in nearly every state. Six months later those figures escalated to nearly 2,551 routes and to nearly two million Americans. Within ten years of the onset of this "experiment," some 30,000 routes were in operation nationwide.

Historians, anthropologists, and academicians of American culture point to universal mail delivery as a turning point in American history, culture and life. For the first time, farmers were able to receive the daily newspaper and make business decisions based on market forces.

In general, the birth of America's highway system also can be attributed to Rural Free Delivery. Spurred by the need to get the mail through, some \$72 million was spent on improving and building this country's roadways between 1897 and 1908.

Rural Free Delivery Centennial

Messages

"Universal service at uniform cost" is one of the continuing benefits of Rural Free Delivery. Today, we serve postal customers nationwide providing services that are affordable and consistent, no matter where they choose to live.

Rural Free Delivery exemplifies our mission to bind the nation together with a reliable and accessible system of delivery for everyone, everywhere, every day.

Rural carriers serve as "Post Offices on Wheels" and provide a valuable service to millions of Americans daily, just as they have for 100 years. Rural carriers sell stamps and money orders, collect and deliver parcels, and deliver special kinds of mail such as certified, insured, and expedited mail.

Rural Free Delivery is a cornerstone of today's Postal Service and a fixture of American life. It stimulated the development of America's roads and highways and opened up new avenues of communication and commerce.

Rural carriers deliver nearly 25% of America's mail. They continue the tradition of being the communication link to Americans living on farms and in the countryside. And rural carriers today also deliver mail to people living in the suburbs, to suburban businesses and even to residents of high-rise buildings.

Planning A Local Publicity Program

Consider the following special event ideas when celebrating the centennial of Rural Free Delivery:

- 1. Open House. Host an open house. Invite customers to meet their rural carrier and invite retired rural carriers from your office to be a part of the festivities.
- Rural Carrier Anecdote Contest. Collect interesting stories and tales from your rural carriers. Share their memories at an open house or print a flyer, poster, or small book of their collective experiences.
- Proclamations. Obtain local proclamations from the mayor, the city or county council chairperson, or other appropriate political groups to recognize rural carriers in your community.
- 4. Ceremonies. Select from the list provided (see page 8) the first city or town in your state that offered RFD and host a recognition ceremony, secondday stamp ceremony, or other special event featuring the evolution of rural delivery from its horse-drawn cart days to the present.
- **5. Certificates.** Present certificates of appreciation to exemplary rural carriers in your office.

Photographic Display. Decorate your lobby with photographs and other historic memorabilia depicting RFD.

7. Direct Mail Piece. Prepare a promotional letter for your customers to be signed and delivered by your rural carriers outlining the services available by the "Post Office on Wheels."

Media Opportunities

- 1. Invite the news media in your area to follow a rural carrier for a day.
- Sponsor an "interesting and unusual mailbox" contest. Work with your area newspaper to publish information about the contest and to publish winning mailbox entry photographs.
- Spend some time talking to your rural carriers or retired rural carriers about interesting experiences they have had on the job. Share their tales with the press.
- 4. Select one rural route in your office and deliver part of the route for a day the "old-fashioned" way with either a buggy, horse-drawn cart, or antique vehicle.
- 5. Identify carriers in your office whose relatives were also rural carriers. Juxtapose "then" and "now."
- Distribute small American flags to rural carriers and affix flags to the front of rural delivery vehicle. Explain to local media that in days gone by this was a standard way of identifying rural carriers throughout the country.

Sample Proclamation Honoring Centennial of Rural Free Delivery

WHEREAS, every community in the United States is linked to other communities in the nation and the world by the U.S. Postal Service, and the welfare of every citizen is dependent upon this vast communication network available to all the people the year round; and

WHEREAS, the citizens of the United States have the opportunity to reflect upon the 100-year history of Rural Free Delivery with the issuance of a new stamp recognizing the special contributions of rural carriers, who are committed to meeting the communication needs of their customers as the Postal Service prepares itself for the 21st Century.

Sample Media Letter

The U.S. Postal Service is celebrating 100 years of Rural Free Delivery this year.

As you may know, Rural Free Delivery opened up new avenues of communication and commerce nationwide, and has become a cornerstone of today's Postal Service. Prior to Rural Free Delivery, residents had to collect their mail at the post office. This presented many problems to our largely agrarian society at the turn of the century. By successfully influencing Congress, rural residents succeeded in obtaining a commitment for Rural Free Delivery on an experimental basis in West Virginia. Within one year, the service was provided to 29 states in the Union.

Rural Free Delivery changed life on the farm, and many historians note that it, in large part, was responsible for opening new avenues of trade and commerce, and for stimulating the development of America's roads and highway system. Today, rural carriers deliver the mail to more than 25 million customers a day on nearly 57,000 rural routes.

Rural Free Delivery began on an experimental basis on October 1, 1896, at Charles Town, Halltown, and Uvilla, West Virginia. Prior to Rural Free Delivery, farmers had to leave their farms and travel to the nearest post office to collect their mail. (Many years earlier, in 1863, the Post Office Department implemented home delivery for city residents. The service was so popular that rural residents began making the same request of Congress.)

Within one year, Rural Free Delivery was extended to 29 other states. By June 30, 1900, Rural Free Delivery was firmly in place serving 879,127 customers on 1,214 routes. Six months later, the number of RFD customers doubled to two million Americans. In time, historians would credit Rural Free Delivery with developing our nation's commerce because of the millions of dollars spent on building roads and highways.

Today, the nation's rural carriers handle the postal needs of more than 25 million customers across nearly 57,000 routes located throughout the country.

Sample Rural Free Delivery Outreach Article

Rural Customers Get "Post Office On Wheels"

Rural delivery service has grown continually since it first began in Charles Town, Halltown, and Uvilla, West Virginia, in 1896. In fact, more than 25 million addresses in locations across America are served by rural routes. Rural routes no longer serve only isolated homesteads across barren wasteland. Indeed, rural routes may include deliveries to homes, farms, apartments, and shopping malls.

By these "Post Offices on Wheels," customers on these routes are afforded access to most of the postal services available at local post offices. Rural letter carriers not only sell stamps and money orders, but also accept and deliver registered, certified and insured mail, along with COD (cash on delivery) items, parcel post, Priority Mail, and Express Mail.

Ask your rural carrier or post office for a Stamp Purchase Order, a handy envelope for ordering stamps, post cards, and stamped envelopes. Follow the form's instructions and your order will be promptly filled by return mail.

Postal money orders can be purchased by preparing a Rural Money Order Transaction. If you supply a self-addressed, stamped envelope along with the form, the money order will be prepared and sent for you from the post office. You'll also get a receipt in the mail.

When leaving for vacation or other extended absences, prepare Form 8076, *Authorization to Hold Mail*, and we'll do so until your return. Then you can either pick up your mail or have it delivered. Here are some additional tips for making the most of your service:

- File a written order with your carrier if you'd prefer that oversized parcels be left at your mailbox or other location, weather permitting.
- If you receive notice to pick up a package requiring a signature at the post office, you may call and make arrangements for redelivery by your rural carrier.
- Use your complete address, including route number, box number (or street number and name), city, state, and ZIP Code to ensure no delays.
- Contact your rural carrier or postmaster before installing a new mailbox.
- Apply rural box or house numbers at least 1" high.
- Maintain a safe and clear approach to your mailbox at all times. Keep the mailbox free of insects and other hazards.

Let your carrier know the names of everyone receiving mail at your box.

History of Mail Boxes

Postmaster's Note: The news media may be interested in featuring unusual mailboxes in conjunction with the anniversary of Rural Free Delivery. This background information is a brief history of the mailbox, which came about because of the need to have mail receptacles in our rural areas.

The Postmaster General's Report of 1897 noted that mailboxes came in many different shapes and sizes: "One man has a lard pail hung out on a fence post; three or four have nailed up empty coal oil cans, and a few have utilized syrup cans...Old apple boxes, soapboxes, cigar boxes, and in one instance a wagon box, adorn the entrances to farms over the valley."

With the rapid development of Rural Free Delivery and the increased number of odd-shaped receptacles along-side the road, Congress requested the Postmaster General in 1902 to "investigate the advisability of purchasing and adopting a uniform metal local box at a price not to exceed fifty cents, for the purpose of selling the same to patrons on rural free delivery routes at cost."

On July 9, 1902, the Postmaster General issued the first order approving boxes for Rural Free Delivery. The order contained complete construction specifications, and authorized manufacturers to stencil now familiar words onto the boxes: "Approved by the Postmaster General." Boxes so marked then became subject to federal laws. The following is an excerpt from the Daily Bulletin of Orders Affecting the Postal Service (July 14, 1902):

"Whoever shall hereafter willfully or maliciously injure, tear down or destroy any letter box or other receptacle established by order of the Postmaster General or approved or designated by him for the receipt or delivery of mail matter on any rural free-delivery route, or shall break open the same, or willfully or maliciously injure,

deface or destroy any mail matter deposited therein, or shall willfully take or steal such matter from or out of such letter box or other receptacle or shall willfully aid or assist in any of the aforementioned offenses, shall for every such offense be punished by a fine of not more than one thousand dollars, or by imprisonment for not more than three years."

Poem Honoring Rural Free Delivery

The following poem was written by Ralph Littick, editor of the Ohio Rural Carrier, in honor of the 50th anniversary of Rural Free Delivery. The poem's sentiment of "Service with a Smile" is still applicable today. Feel free to incorporate the poem at various Open Houses or other special events.

DMM NOTICE

Labeling List Module Changes

Effective immediately, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) L002, L003, L004, L005, L102, L801, L802, and L803 are revised to reflect changes in mail processing operations.

Although mailers are encouraged to label according to these revised lists immediately, they must comply with these changes no later than October 6, 1996. DMM Issue 51 will contain these revisions.

Mailers are reminded that, when labeling mixed originating mail according to DMM L004, the proper label prefix is "MXD," not "MXD ADC." The label prefix "ADC" is used only for destinating mail.

DMM REVISION

Periodicals — Additional Entry Change

Effective immediately, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) D210, D230, P200, and P750 are amended as shown below to revise the standards for additional entry of Periodicals (formerly second-class mail). Current standards for Periodicals require any publisher to be authorized an original entry office where the publisher's known office of publication is maintained and an additional entry office at each post office where the Periodicals publication is deposited for mailing.

Plant-verified drop shipment (PVDS) procedures took effect February 3, 1991. Since then, demand for additional entry has increased significantly for PVDS mailers, and Periodicals publishers and their mailing agents who use PVDS have experienced a growing task in maintaining upto-date authorizations for additional entry at PVDS entry points. This activity has also increased the administrative work for the Postal Service in processing Forms 3510, Application for Additional Entry, Reentry, or Special Rate Request for Second-Class Publication, that request numerous additional entries for PVDS destination entry points.

To reduce these administrative tasks for publishers and the Postal Service, the standards for Periodicals additional entry authorization are being amended as follows. Periodicals publishers are required to have an authorized additional entry office only at each post office where their Periodicals matter is presented for postal verification. Additional entry will no longer be required at post offices where Periodicals mail is deposited solely as PVDS.

Although this change affects additional entry standards for all Periodicals publishers, it impacts only publishers using PVDS. Affected publishers with many authorized additional entries that are used solely for PVDS destination entry mail may close those entries by filing Form 3510 and paying the appropriate fee.

Publishers are reminded that all requests to establish, modify, and/or cancel additional entries can be filed on a single Form 3510 with the payment of a single fee, provided that the effective dates for the requested actions do not span more than 30 calendar days.

These revisions will be included in DMM Issue 51.

2.2 Where to Mail

A publisher or registered news agent may present copies at the Periodicals rates only at post offices where original entry, additional entry, or exceptional dispatch has been authorized.

[Revise 4.0 to read as follows:]

4.0 **DEPOSIT AT AMF**

4.1 General

A publisher who airfreights copies of a Periodicals publication to an airport mail facility (AMF) must be authorized additional entry at the verifying office (i.e., the post office where those copies are presented for postal verification). Postage must be paid at that office unless an alternative postage payment method is authorized. Copies of Periodicals publications presented at an AMF may be eligible for delivery unit or SCF rates, subject to the applicable standards.

4.2 Application

Authorization to enter airfreighted copies of a Periodicals publication at an AMF is obtained by filing an additional entry application. The distribution plan on Form 3510 must show the AMF as the entry point rather than the administering office (i.e., the post office responsible for the AMF). A publisher using plant-verified drop shipment must submit a copy of the distribution plan for the airfreighted copies to the administering office postmaster.

4.3 Reentry Fee

The required reentry fee is not due if:

- a. Form 3510 is submitted with either an initial application for Periodicals mailing privileges or an application for reentry at a new original entry office, and the AMF is under the jurisdiction of that original entry of-
- b. The verifying office is already an authorized original or additional entry for the publication.

4.4 Publisher Responsibilities

For each mailing to be presented at the AMF, the publisher or agent is required:

- a. To provide the administering office postmaster with a delivery schedule (including the publication title, volume, air carrier, flight number, and arrival schedule) before the first mailing under the authorization. A revised schedule must be provided when there are changes.
- To arrange for delivery of the airfreighted copies of the publication to the AMF dock or other area specified by the postmaster.
- c. To arrange for payment of postage and submission of required postage statements and documentation with the copies of the publication to the verifying post office.
- d. To notify the designated AMF contact person when there are deviations from established transportation and delivery schedules.

D230 Additional Entry

[Revise 1.0 to read as follows:]

1.0 BASIC INFORMATION

1.1 Definition

The term additional entry office refers to a post office where a publisher is authorized by the USPS to present copies of a Periodicals publication for postal verification. The publisher must deposit money and file postage statements for copies presented at an additional entry office unless the USPS authorizes an alternative postage payment method. An additional entry authorization must be in effect for each post office where copies of the Periodicals publications are presented for postal verification.

1.2 Eligibility

The additional entry office must be a post office. Publication 65, *National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory,* shows whether a particular postal facility is a post office.

1.3 Restrictions

An additional entry may be authorized only at a post office where transportation and mail processing resources are adequate. The USPS does not authorize an additional entry if the publisher's requested effective date would cause the USPS additional transportation costs in serving the affected entry office.

1.4 Same County

Additional entries may be authorized in the same county as the office of original entry. If the publication is eligible for incounty rates, the publisher must provide the original entry office postmaster with a duplicate of all postage statements on which those rates are claimed.

[Revise 2.0 to read as follows:]

2.0 DISTRIBUTION PLAN

2.1 Basic Standard

The publisher must establish a distribution plan for each additional entry to detail the volume and ZIP Code ranges to be presented. Revisions to a distribution plan must account for copies for any additional entry being modified or canceled. When applicable, the publisher must specify how the distribution plan is to vary during the year (e.g., periodic fluctuations or transfers of volume or mailing activity). Separate distribution plans are required if there are differences in the distribution of regular issues, special issues, or back issues.

2.2 Contingency Entries

The publisher may designate certain entry post offices in the distribution plan for use only in a contingency (emergency) when conditions beyond the publisher's control prevent use of other authorized entries. Contingency entries must not be established or used instead of permanent alterations to authorized distribution plans.

[Revise the heading of 3.0 to read as follows:]

3.0 AUTHORIZATION

* * * * *

3.2 Method

To establish or cancel an additional entry for the scheduled presentation of regular, special, or back issues or for unscheduled contingency use, the publisher must submit two copies of Form 3510 marked "Pending" to the postmaster of the original entry post office. A publisher authorized to mail under the Centralized Postage Payment (CPP) System has additional filing requirements.

* * * *

3.5 Nonuse

If an additional entry authorization is revoked for nonuse (under 6.0), mail that had been authorized entry at that office may not be presented elsewhere until the publisher submits and pays the required fee for a Form 3510 to cancel the unused additional entry and modify the distribution plan accordingly.

[Revise the heading of 4.0 to read as follows:]

4.0 USE OF ENTRY

* * * * * *

4.2 Unauthorized

An additional entry may not be used until authorized by the USPS. A publisher may not pay postage at another rate to present copies at an unauthorized additional entry.

4.3 Annual Use

Copies of a Periodicals publication must be presented at each additional entry (including contingency entries) at least once each calendar year.

4.4 Following Plan

Once an entry and its distribution plan are authorized, the publisher must ensure that copies are presented accordingly or as provided in 5.0 for limited temporary changes. Additional entry offices may not accept copies not included in the publisher's authorized distribution plan.

Postage must be prepaid and available for all copies presented for verification at an additional entry office before their release.

The publisher must be authorized original or additional entry at each post office where Periodicals PVDS matter is presented for postal verification.

POM REVISION

Political Campaign Mail

Effective immediately, *Postal Operations Manual* (POM) 454, Political Campaign Mail, is revised to reflect changes in terminology and procedure resulting from Classification Reform. In particular, the procedure in 454.37 for use of Tag 57, *Political Campaign Mailing*, has been changed to conform to the new traying requirement for letter-size mail.

Prior to the general election on November 5, 1996, a large number of political campaign mailings will enter the mailstream. Field managers must understand their responsibilities in connection with political campaign mailings originating and destinating within their jurisdiction and take the actions described in this revision.

454 Political Campaign Mail

454.1 Introduction

454.11 General

The American electorate votes on numerous political offices and issues. Citizens cast ballots every 4 years for president, every 2 years for one-third of the U.S. senators and all members of the House of Representatives, and at varying frequencies for governorships and other state, county, and local offices and referenda measures. During the period preceding local, state, and national primaries, special elections, and general elections, the Postal Service accepts and delivers many political campaign mailings, frequently in large quantities. These mailings are made up by individual candidates and their campaign organizations, as well as by local, state, and national committees of political parties.

454.12 Postal Service Responsibility

The Postal Service is responsible for providing information to assist in the knowledgeable preparation and deposit of political campaign mailings, as well as for the proper acceptance, processing, delivery, and recording of these mailings.

454.13 Nonprofit Standard Mail Rates

Section 3626(e) of Title 39, U.S. Code, as enacted by Public Law 95-593, permits bulk Standard Mail (A) matter to be mailed by a "qualified political committee" at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates prescribed for qualified nonprofit organizations (see DMM E670). Also see 454.23 for a definition of "qualified political committee" and 454.73 for the rules on what mail may be sent at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates by qualified political committees.

454.2 Definitions

454.21 Political Campaign Mailings

Any material accepted for mailing at First-Class or Standard Mail (A) postage rates that is mailed for political campaign purposes by a registered political candidate, campaign committee, or committee of a political party is

classified as a political campaign mailing. This type of mailing normally uses the address of a candidate's campaign committee or the committee of a political party as the return address. Do not confuse political campaign mailings with official mailings by members of Congress under congressional franking privileges. See 453 for a discussion of congressional mail.

454.22 Registered Political Candidate or Party

An individual or organization recognized as such by the appropriate governmental election control authority is considered to be a registered political candidate or party.

454.23 Qualified Political Committee

Section 3626(e)(2) of Title 39, U.S.C., defines a qualified political committee for the purpose of eligibility for Nonprofit Standard Mail rates as follows:

- a. The term *qualified political committee* means:
 - (1) A national committee of a political party.
 - (2) A state committee of a political party.
 - (3) The Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee.
 - (4) The Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee.
 - (5) The National Republican Congressional Committee.
 - (6) The National Republican Senatorial Committee.
- b. The term national committee means the organization that, by virtue of the bylaws of a political party, is responsible for the day-to-day operation of that political party at the national level.
- c. The term state committee means the organization that, by virtue of the bylaws of a political party, is responsible for the day-to-day operation of that political party at the state level.

454.3 Premailing Assistance

454.31 General

Experience has shown that there will be no cause for criticism if all mailers of political campaign material are fully informed of postal requirements for prompt delivery and are assured of proper and equal handling of their mailings.

454.32 Responsibilities

Managers, Customer Service Support, Customer Service and Sales districts, are responsible for ensuring proper premailing assistance to all committees of political parties, candidates for political office, and/or the candidates' campaign committees within their jurisdictions. Individuals designated by managers, Customer Service Support, as directly responsible for contacting the commit-

tees of political parties, political candidates, and campaign organizations must follow the requirements in 454.36.

454.33 Identification of Candidates

Managers, Customer Service Support, Customer Service and Sales districts, or their designees, must identify all candidates for election to political office who will be campaigning within their district's jurisdiction, as follows:

- a. Presidential Candidates. Contact state campaign headquarters. Determine locations of mailings and notify appropriate Postal Service personnel for necessary follow-up.
- b. Congressional Candidates. Identify all candidates for election to the Senate and House of Representatives and their principal campaign offices and notify appropriate Postal Service personnel for necessary follow-up.
- c. State Candidates. In statewide elections, identify gubernatorial and other candidates and their principal campaign offices and notify appropriate Postal Service personnel for necessary follow-up.
- d. Local Candidates. Coordinate efforts with postmasters to identify all candidates and/or campaign organizations in those areas holding local elections for county, city, township, borough, parish, and other local offices, and ensure necessary follow-up.

454.34 Political Campaign Information Sources

State and local boards of election and offices of secretaries of state and county clerks generally can provide information on the names and headquarters of committees of political parties, candidates for federal, state, and local offices, and their campaign organizations.

454.35 Equal Assistance

Equal assistance must be provided to all committees of political parties, candidates, and candidates' campaign committees, including those that do not represent major parties.

454.36 Premailing Contact Requirements

Make contact with the committees of political parties, candidates, and the candidates' campaign organizations at the earliest opportunity to provide information on mail preparation requirements, mail handling procedures, and other matters discussed in 454.37. On-site assistance can be helpful, particularly with campaign volunteers, to identify problems in mail preparation and sack or tray labeling before deposit of the mailings. Emphasize the need to deposit the mailings at the earliest possible date before election day, particularly to candidates or organizations planning to avail themselves of the destination bulk mail center drop shipment rates. Keep records of all contacts, including a

general summary statement covering the information provided to the candidates and campaign organizations.

454.37 Mail Preparation and Handling Information

At a minimum, provide committees of political parties, candidates, and the candidates' campaign organizations with information on the following:

- a. Rates, including automation and destination entry drop shipment rates, and fees.
- b. Mailing permits and authorizations. See applicable sections of the DMM for instructions on obtaining permits and authorizations for mailing at various rates. National and state political committees may be given instructions on filing for Nonprofit Standard Mail rates as a qualified political committee, as found in DMM E670. Instructions on obtaining authorization to mail at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates at additional offices are also found in DMM E670.
- c. Restrictions on what may be mailed at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates for state and national political committees (see 454.73). See also 5-4, Political Committee Mailings, in Publication 417.
- d. Preparation, makeup, and handling of mailings, including an explanation of endorsements, such as "Return Postage Guaranteed" and "Address Correction Requested," and address information products and services.
- e. Availability and use of mailing supplies and equipment.

Note: Tag 57, *Political Campaign Mailing*, identifies campaign mailings during processing and distribution. Tag 57 is available from the material distribution centers and is reusable. If mail is trayed and strapped, mailers should affix Tag 57 to the strap on the end of the tray near the tray label with a wire twist tie. If local postal instructions permit trays to be tendered without strapping, then Tag 57 should be affixed to the tray with a rubber band double looped through the handhold of the tray on the end near the tray label. Care should be taken to remove the tags from the trays after the campaign mail has been processed.

- f. Business reply mail.
- g. Disposition of undeliverable pieces.
- h. Time frames for depositing mailings.

454.4 Processing and Delivery

454.41 General

All managers involved in processing and delivering political campaign mailings must ensure that each mailing is handled promptly and with equal care and attention.

454.42 Late Deposit

Inform mailers attempting to deposit political campaign mailings that may be too late for delivery by the election date under USPS service objectives of this potential.

454.43 Reports of Delays

Give immediate attention to any reported delay in processing or delivering political campaign mailings and fully document inquiries made and subsequent action taken (see 492.53).

454.5 Recordkeeping

454.51 General

Detailed records provide the basis for a documented and factual explanation of any complaints alleging improper handling of political campaign mailings. Maintain premailing assistance and processing and delivery records for a period of 6 months.

454.52 Premailing Assistance Records

Individuals designated to provide premailing assistance to committees of political parties, candidates, and the candidates' campaign organizations must keep records of all contacts, including a summary statement concerning the information provided to such mailers.

454.53 Processing and Delivery Records

Managers, Business Mail Entry, and postmasters must keep documented records of all political campaign mailings that are deposited or received at their offices, with particular attention to those deposited or received too late for timely delivery. At a minimum, these documented records must include the following:

- a. The name of the mailer.
- b. A sample, photocopy, or description of the mailing.
- The date and time the mailing was received for dispatch or delivery.
- d. The election day deadline and, if applicable, the date of requested delivery.
- e. If applicable, the approximate number of pieces not delivered before the election day deadline and/or the date of requested delivery and the reasons why delivery was not timely.
- f. The approximate volume of any Standard Mail (A) consigned to waste upon instruction by the mailer.

454.6 Answering Requests for Information

454.61 General

Answer requests for information concerning political campaign mailings as provided in regulations implementing the Freedom of Information Act (see ASM 352). Do not compile information not regularly compiled for Postal Service use to respond to requests.

454.62 Chief Field Counsel Assistance

If uncertain regarding the disclosure of information concerning political campaign mailings, consult the Chief Field Counsel.

454.63 Questionable Requests

Promptly report to the Postal Inspection Service any questionable attempts to obtain information concerning political campaign mailings not properly subject to disclosure.

454.7 Revenue Protection

454.71 Nonprofit Standard Mail Rates

Qualified political committees may mail at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates of postage. See 454.23 for definitions of qualified political committees. See also DMM E670 for general information on eligibility for these rates.

454.72 Mailings Ineligible for Nonprofit Standard Mail Rates

Individual candidates and their campaign committees do not qualify to mail at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates. Also, qualified political committees may mail only their own matter at these rates. Qualified political committees may not make cooperative mailings at the nonprofit rates involving matter on behalf of, or produced for, individual candidates or political organizations that do not qualify for Nonprofit Standard Mail rates. Such cooperative mailings must be paid at the applicable Regular or Enhanced Carrier Route Standard Mail rates. See Form 3602-N, Form 3602-PN, and Form 3602-PVN for the certifications required of Nonprofit Standard Mail mailers. Also see 5-4, Political Committee Mailings, in Publication 417.

454.73 Application of the Cooperative Mail Rules

454.731 General

Qualified political committees are subject to the cooperative mailing requirements. However, unlike cases involving cooperative mailings between an authorized nonprofit organization and a commercial organization, there is often an ongoing relationship between the qualified political committee and the committee's candidate. A political candidate may be connected to the authorized political committee mailer by being a member of and/or financial contributor to the political party represented by the commit-

tee. The committee is, of course, interested in promoting, encouraging, and supporting the candidate's election. Postal laws and regulations do not prohibit the candidate from contributing to the committee or the committee from supporting the candidate. The concern under postal laws and regulations is whether the political candidate's financial contribution to the authorized political committee is in return for the mailing or mailings that support the candidate.

Example — Proper use of contributed funds

Politician A is a member of the qualified political committee. The qualified political committee plans to include in a mailpiece information supporting politician A's candidacy for office and has asked the candidate for a biographical sketch. The candidate provides the information and makes a contribution to the qualified political committee. The qualified political committee will retain authority to accept or reject information provided by the candidate, and the contribution by the candidate is not a contribution to pay for the mailing. This is not considered to be a cooperative mailing since the qualified political committee retained discretion over the decision to mail and the contents of the mailing.

454.732 Maintaining Committee Control

The following rules must be followed to ensure that the authorized political committee maintains control:

a. Mailings. An authorized political committee may mail election-related materials, including but not limited to candidate endorsements and sample ballots, at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if the materials are exclusively those of the authorized political committee. An authorized political committee may make political mailings in support of its candidates, provided that no monies contributed by the candidate to the qualified committee shall be specifically earmarked for use in making the political mailing or in return for the political mailing.

Example — Committee discretion retained

Politician B, a candidate for a statewide political office, mails a check to authorized political committee C, the state committee for his party. Politician B encloses a note with the check that says: "This check is for my pro rata share of a sample ballot." Committee C has mailed a sample ballot to state residents for the past five elections. However, committee C makes the decision on whether to send sample ballots on an election-by-election basis. Committee C has not had any discussions with politician B on this subject, nor has it reached an understanding with politician B that sample ballots will be produced and mailed. Committee C deposits politician B's check into its general fund to be used

for committee expenses. Committee C will not return the check even if it decides not to mail sample ballots. Committee C later decides to mail sample ballots for the election in which politician B is a candidate. Notwithstanding politician B's contribution, this is not considered to be a cooperative mailing because committee C retained discretion whether or not to mail the sample ballots.

- b. Contributions. A candidate may make or solicit contributions to a qualified political committee, provided that the committee retains absolute discretion over how the funds are spent. If the candidate or other nonqualified entity pays the preparation, printing, or postage costs for the mailing in return for the qualified political committee's agreement to make the mailing, that mail matter is not eligible for the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates.
- c. Mailing Support. A political candidate may provide suggested copy, pictures, biographical information, or similar assistance requested by a qualified political committee that is preparing a mailing in support of the candidate. The qualified political committee may also ask a candidate to review a proposed mailpiece for accuracy. However, the qualified political committee must have final authority over the decision to mail the political matter and the contents of that matter.

Example — Improper candidate funding

Authorized political committee D announces the cre-

ation of a "Candidate's Coordinated Mailing Fund." Contributions to the fund will be used exclusively for mailings supporting candidates. Candidates E, F, G, and H contribute to the fund, and committee D makes a multicandidate endorsement for candidates E, F, G, H, and I. This would be considered a cooperative mailing. It would not be a cooperative mailing if (a) the fund created is not announced as one that will be used exclusively for mailings, and (b) committee D retained absolute discretion about whether to make the mailings at all.

454.733 Endorsements on Mail

Mailings by qualified political committees often bear endorsements such as "Paid for by [committee] and authorized by [candidate]." These endorsements are often required by federal or state law. The presence of these endorsements alone does not disqualify the mailing from being sent at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates. The presence of factors discussed in the preceding sections of this chapter is required to find the mailing ineligible for the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates.

454.74 Identification

The name and return address of the qualifying organization must appear either on the outside of the mailpiece or in a prominent location on the material being mailed at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates.

ALL OFFICES WITH RURAL DELIVERY HANDBOOK PO-603 REVISION

National Count of Mail on Rural Routes

In accordance with Article 9.2.C.3.a(1) of the 1995 National Agreement between the Postal Service and the National Rural Letter Carriers' Association (NRLCA), a 12-day National Count of Mail will be conducted September 17–30, 1996. The count will be conducted on all auxiliary and vacant regular rural routes, and on encumbered regular rural routes where either the employer or regular rural carrier opted for a count by June 28, 1996. Additionally, where mutually agreed to by management and the regular rural carrier, the carrier may conduct the count, as provided by the May 14, 1996, USPS/NRLCA Memorandum of Understanding on the national count and inspection.

Mail Count Procedures

Mail count procedures for all 12 days of the count must be in accordance with Chapter 5 of Handbook PO-603, *Rural Delivery Carrier Duties and Responsibilities*, except 535.12.s, which is revised as follows:

Handbook PO-603, Rural Delivery Carrier Duties and Responsibilities

5 Inspection, Count, and Adjustment of Rural Routes

530 Rural Route Mail Counts

* * * * *

535.12 Completion

* * * * *

s. Column S — Purchasing Stamp Stock.

All rural routes will be automatically credited with 20 minutes per week for purchasing and checking stamp stock. Note: The Minneapolis ISSC will credit the 20 minutes per week and record the proper allowance on Form 4241-A, *Rural Route Evaluation*.

* * * * *

This revision is to be included as part of the count procedures to be used beginning with this national count. The 20-minute stamp stock allowance for all rural routes, whether or not the route is counted in September 1996, will become effective at the beginning of the guarantee year, October 26, 1996. Postmasters must hold joint conferences to discuss mail count procedures and instructions with supervisors and rural carriers involved in the count no later than close of business on Saturday, August 31, 1996.

Completion of Form 4239

Form 4239, Rural Route Count of Mail, was revised in March 1994 to accommodate changes related to the introduction of delivery point sequence letters. Form 4239 (March 1994) (PSN 7530-02-000-9205) is in stock and may be ordered from the material distribution centers (MDCs) using Form 7380, MDC Supply Requisition. At least 12 forms are required for each rural route being counted. Completion instructions for this form are in Postal Bulletin 21872 (7-21-94).

Completion of Form 4241

Form 4241, *Rural Delivery Statistics Report*, was revised in May 1994 to accommodate the changes made to Form 4239. Because this is a two-week national count, only one Form 4241 is required for each rural route being counted. Form 4241 (May 1994) (PSN 7530-02-000-9207) is in stock and may be ordered from the MDCs using Form 7380, *MDC Supply Requisition*. Transfer data daily from Form 4239 and total Form 4241 at the end of the two-week period. Completion instructions for this form are unchanged.

Completion Requirements and Dates

In addition to completing Form 4239 and transferring the information daily to Form 4241, individual postmasters and supervisors are responsible for completing and reviewing Forms 4241 for accuracy by October 3, 1996.

In accordance with Handbook PO-603, give individual rural carriers two days to review Form 4241 before requesting them to sign it. Rural carrier reviews must be completed by October 5, 1996, so that all forms are submitted and received by the district no later than October 7, 1996.

Individuals responsible for input of mail count data through the Distributed Data Entry/Data Reporting (DDE/DR) application also must be familiar with the entry screen to ensure data is properly entered and recorded in the correct column. Data entry may begin on October 7, 1996. All DDE/DR data entry must be completed by *close of business on October 19, 1996. Do not* submit Forms 4241 to the Minneapolis Information Systems Service Center (ISSC).

Form 4241-A, Rural Route Evaluation

Form 4241-A, Rural Route Evaluation (July 1994) (PSN 7530-03-000-0935), is a laser-printed form generated by the DDE/DR systems. This form is not available from the MDC. Minneapolis will process all counts on October 21,

1996, and complete and mail this form to each district for receipt by October 25, 1996.

National Mail Count Training

Districts conducting national mail count training should notify rural letter carrier association state stewards of the date, time, and location of all training sessions. Administrative leave to attend one of these sessions should be approved for each state steward. State stewards may use annual leave or request leave without pay to attend other district authorized mail count training sessions.

Option Election for Rural Routes Not Being Counted

Regular rural carriers who qualify for a high or low option

and who do not count in September are eligible to elect a high option (see Article 9.2.C.8 of the USPS-NRLCA Agreement) for the new guarantee year by completing Form 4015-A, Rural Carrier Agreement to Use Annual Leave Pursuant to Election of Higher Route Classification. Option changes are entered by processing Form 4003, Official Rural Route Description, and are effective with the beginning of the new guarantee period, October 26, 1996 (PP 23-96).

Inspection of Rural Routes

A 12-day National Count of Mail will be conducted September 17–30, 1996, on those routes where either the employer or regular rural carrier opted for a count by June 28, 1996. Additionally, all vacant and auxiliary routes will be counted during this period. In conjunction with or just prior to this national mail count, *all* rural routes being counted must be inspected. For routes not being counted, an inspection will be performed only where requested by the carrier or required by management, in accordance with the May 14, 1996, Memorandum of Understanding between the Postal Service and the National Rural Letter Carriers' Association.

For those routes being inspected, Chapter 5 of Handbook PO-603, *Rural Carrier Duties and Responsibilities*, explains the definition and purpose of the inspection. Postal personnel at offices that have rural routes must complete

Form 4248, *Rural Route Inspection Report*, for each route being inspected. Follow previously issued instructions for the completion of this form.

Send copy 1 and copy 2 of each completed Form 4248 to the appropriate district operations support manager. Each district must ensure the proper and accurate completion of one Form 4248 for each rural route. Upon verification, districts must consolidate all forms into one package and submit it, by October 25, 1996, to:

Travel — Standard Mileage Rate Changes

Effective immediately, the standard mileage rates have been changed. These new rates apply to all Postal employees.

The following rates replace Appendix B.I (A and B) in Handbook F-10, *Travel Policy*.

I. Mileage Rates

A. Standard Mileage Rates

Vehicle	Cents per mile (Including Alaska)
1. Privately owned automobile	31.0
2. Privately owned motorcycle	25.0
3. Privately owned airplane	85.0

B. Reimbursement for Postal Supervisors.

Postal supervisors (as described in Chapter 5) will be reimbursed at the rate of \$6.00 per day or 31 cents per mile, whichever is greater, when a privately owned vehicle is used.

Odometer readings are not required on the respective claim forms; the integrity of the claim is the responsibility of the traveler. However, should the approving official have reason to question the claim, the claimant must provide evidence that supports the claim of distance traveled.

The following rates replace Appendix B.I (A and B) in Handbook F-12, *Relocation Policy*.

I. Mileage Rates

A. Standard Mileage Rates

Privately owned automobile	31.0
2. Privately owned motorcycle	25.0

B. Relocation-Related Advance Round-Trip and/or en Route to New Duty Station.

The allowable rate is 31 cents per mile.

Odometer readings are not required on the respective claim forms; the integrity of the claim is the responsibility of the traveler. However, should the approving official have reason to question the claim, the claimant must provide evidence that supports the claim of distance traveled.

Accountbooks and Statements of Account for Fiscal Year 1997

The accountbooks and statements of account have been revised for FY 1997. A universal accountbook and statement of account with edition dates of August 1996 replace all previous editions. Offices should not begin using these universal forms until September 14, 1996. All offices must use forms with the August 1996 edition date. All previous editions are obsolete and must be destroyed.

The distinction of maintaining and reporting financial data on different forms by CAG will be eliminated with implementation of the universal accountbook and statement of account. All offices, regardless of CAG, will use Form 1551, *Accountbook for CAGs A–L* (NSN 7530-03-000-7731), and Form 1555, *Statement of Account (CAGs A–L)* (NSN 7530-01-000-9354). The revised accountbook replaces Forms 1551-AE (CAGs A–J) and 1552-AF (CAGs K & L). The revised statement of account replaces Forms 1553 (CAGs K & L), 1554 (CAGs H & J), 1555 (CAGs A–G) and 1555-A (continuation sheet).

The material distribution centers (MDCs) will be performing an automatic distribution of the new accountbooks

and statements of account for postal fiscal year (PFY) 97. These forms will be distributed to *district offices only* and should be distributed to the field no later than August 30, 1996. If an office does not receive its forms by this date, contact the servicing district accounting office, *not* the MDCs.

An accountbook consists of Form 1551 banded or shrinkwrapped as a set. Each CAG office that maintains the accountbook will receive one set. The statement of account, Form 1555, will be shrinkwrapped in sets of 16. All CAG A through G offices that prepare a statement of account for each accounting period will receive three sets to accommodate their reporting for the year. All CAG H through L offices that prepare a statement of account quarterly will receive one set. The MDCs will determine the quantity to ship based on shipping requirements established in PFY 96. They will take into consideration the forms

consolidated and the packaging for the statements of account during the shipping process.

Dinero Seguro

The Postal Service has expanded its international money order service to include an electronic transfer system for sending money to Mexico. The service, called Dinero Seguro, is currently available at select post offices in California and Texas. Dinero Seguro, which means "safe money," gets funds to recipients just as safely as money orders, but in a matter of minutes rather than days.

Dinero Seguro involves a partnership between the Postal Service and Bancomer, the second largest bank in Mexico. Bancomer has more than 900 branches throughout Mexico at which the beneficiaries of money sent via Dinero Seguro can pick up cash immediately following the transaction. The system relies on direct money transfers between the Postal Service and Bancomer branch offices. Exchange rates for Dinero Seguro transactions are set by the bank and the exact conversion rate is given to the sender when the purchase is made. Customers are able to send any amount less than \$3,000 with each Dinero Seguro transaction.

The service currently is offered in these Texas cities: Brownfield, Corpus Christi, Edinburg, Floydada, Houston (select locations), Kingsville, Laredo, Littlefield, Lubbock, Midland, Odessa, Pasadina, Plainview, Post, San Angelo, and Slaton. It is currently offered in these California cities: El Monte, Indio, Cathedral City, Coachella, Desert Hot

Springs, La Quinta, Mecca, Palm City, Palm Desert, Thermal, Thousand Palms, Ventura (select locations), Huron, Salinas (select locations), Chualar, Gonzales, Greenfield, King City, San Lucas, Seaside, Soledad, Madera, Castroville, Freedom, Gilroy, Hollister, Morgan Hill, Mendota, San Juan Bautista, Santa Cruz (select locations), Lamont, Watsonville, and Modesto (select locations).

How It Works

The customer brings the cash they want to transfer to the local Post Office. They fill out the application form, and give it and the payment for the transaction fee to a postal employee. They then call the beneficiary and provide the folio number printed on their receipt. (Every time a customer uses Dinero Seguro, they get a three-minute prepaid phone call to Mexico.) The beneficiary goes to any Bancomer branch and collects the money. Customers may call 1-888-ENVIOMX (1-888-368-4669) for specific locations that provide Dinero Seguro.

Window Clerks and Postmasters

If you are in an office that does not provide Dinero Seguro, instruct customers to call 1-888-ENVIOMX (1-888-368-4669) for the location nearest them.

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 96-16

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail

postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.



Free Stamp Catalogs Available Soon

The new Publication 9, Free Stamp Catalogs, will be available from the material distribution centers (MDCs) on or about August 12, 1996. This new "take-one" brochure is designed to be used in place of catalogs at most post office windows and lobbies (see Postal Bulletin 21918 (4-25-96)). It provides customers with a business reply card with which to order either Stamps etc. or USA Philatelic, the two current catalogs of stamps and stamp products.

Coupled with the 800-STAMP-24 telephone number, this brochure allows postal customers to order any stamp or philatelic product not available locally, and send for a catalog to receive regular information.

Publication 9 has been assigned quick pick number 458 and PSN 7610-03-000-4604. The unit of issue is a shrink-wrapped package containing 100 brochures each. Offices requiring quantities of Publication 9 must place orders directly with their MDC. Each requesting office must have a FEDSTRIP number; all supplies are mailed to the address assigned to the FEDSTRIP number. Offices needing to obtain a FEDSTRIP number or needing to change the address assigned to the FEDSTRIP number must contact their district material management specialist.

CAGs A through L automatically will receive a package of 100 brochures as well as a counter card for their display. However, these might not be shipped until late August. Smaller offices with available display space for a counter

card may request one from the Grand Rapids, Minnesota, address at the end of this article (one per request).

The next edition of *Stamps etc.* will appear in mid-August. Most copies will be mailed directly to catalog customers.

Post offices may have occasional needs for catalogs. Limited additional supplies will be produced and made available for purposes such as stamp shows and temporary stations. In most instances, however, the *Free Stamp Catalogs* brochure will be just as efficient and far more cost-effective. Post offices may request limited quantities of catalogs (and/or a counter card for the display of Publication 9) from:

Be certain to include a complete shipping address, finance number, and quantity required for each requesting location. Catalog requests for quantities over 100 for special events or promotions must be submitted to the same address at least 3 months in advance, to allow time for additional quantities to be printed.
