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## Administrative Services

#### 1997 Publication 65, National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory

Again this year, the Postal Service has published Publication 65, *National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory*, in two volumes. The soft-cover edition is for sale to customers and for use by employees, federal government agencies, and customers in postal lobbies. The price of the soft-cover edition is \$21. A limited quantity of hard-cover directories are available for purchase by mail order only from the National Customer Support Center. The hard-cover Publication 65 is available to customers for \$27.50 per copy and may be ordered using Form 4243, *National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory Order Form for Mail Order Use* (October 1996). This form is not yet stocked in the material distribution centers (MDCs); the form on page 5 should be reproduced locally as needed. All obsolete versions of Form 4243 should be recycled or destroyed.

#### Description

Soft-cover Publication 65, *National Five-Digit ZIP Code* and Post Office Directory, is the full-color cover version for external sale as well as internal use. Publication 65 is individually packaged in a mailable container for ease of handling and is shipped in cartons of four. CAG A–G post offices may sell the soft-cover edition of the directory over the counter, but CAG H–L post offices must use Form 4326, *National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory Order*, to order copies from their district for each customer. District offices will fulfill Form 4326 orders from their supply of directories.

#### **Discount Sales**

Postal customers who turn in the coupon from the 1996 edition of Publication 65 will receive a \$1 discount toward the purchase of the new directory. They may use only one coupon for each book purchased.

#### Distribution

Publication 65 is being shipped on pallets from the contractor's printing plant directly to the district offices. These directories are not addressed individually for shipment to post offices. The district ZIP Code coordinator and the accountable paper unit must distribute Publication 65 to CAG A–G post offices within the district. Base the quantities to be shipped on the distribution quantities of last year's sales reports from these offices.

The district's accountable paper unit maintains the remaining copies of Publication 65 to fill orders from CAG H–L post offices, which must use Form 4326 to place customer orders. Not distributing directories directly to CAG H–L offices should allow better control of Publication 65 inventory.

Success of the sales program depends on managing distribution. Form 4326 (NSN 7530-02-000-9217, quick pick number 319, unit of issue = SE) is stocked at both MDCs. Accountable paper units at each district must order quantities of Form 4326 for their use and distribution to CAG H–L post offices.

#### Sales

The Postal Service maintains a computerized file of the names and addresses of all customers who purchase Publication 65. This file is used to solicit future directory orders and provide information to customers regarding other address information systems products, such as Carrier Route Information System (CRIS) and ZIP+4 files.

District managers and postmasters must ensure strict compliance with procedures in Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, by accounting for all sales, as required by Handbook F-1 instructions for retail products and any guidelines issued by district offices. In particular, inventory records must be maintained (see Handbook F-1, section 77). Clerks must report revenue on Form 1412-A or 1412-B, *Daily Financial Report* (in AIC 093, Packaging Product Sales), and use Form 3317-A, *Retail and Philatelic Products* — *Clerks Daily Sales Record*, to identify revenue (see Handbook F-1, section 771). Form 3317-A (NSN 7530-01-000-9916, quick pick number 169, unit of issue = SH) is stocked at both MDCs.

To ensure accountability when selling Publication 65 over the counter, clerks in CAG A–G post offices, stations, and branches must provide each customer with Form 4326 (or a photocopy) and ask the customer to complete and return the form before leaving the retail service counter. Each post office forwards completed Forms 4326 to the district's accountable paper unit on a daily basis.

#### **CAG H-L Post Offices**

Each single directory and bundle (four directories) order must have one Form 4326 and a mailing label. The clerk must endorse bundle orders "Bundle Quantity — 4 Directories." Clerks should instruct customers to complete and return the Form 4326 with the appropriate payment. The customer receives the top copy of the form as a receipt. This top copy has a place for the unit's all-purpose stamp and the clerk's initials. Advise customers that the district will ship directories to the mailing address on the label. If customers do not want to order a directory in this manner, clerks should give them directions to the nearest facility that sells directories over the counter. The clerk accounts for directory sales

on Form 1412-A or 1412-B, and AIC 093, in accordance with Handbook F-1. At close of business, the clerk dispatches directory orders for that day to the district's accountable paper unit.

#### **District Accountable Paper Unit Instructions**

- After receiving directory orders from CAG H–L post offices, remove the district receipt (copy 2 of Form 4326), place the mailing label on a prepackaged, single Publication 65, and enter it into the mailstream for delivery to the customer. Although most orders are for single directories, check for orders marked "Bundle Quantity 4 Directories." For these orders, apply the label to a carton of four directories.
- Make copies of district receipts received during the week from CAG H–L post offices, stations, and branches and forward them to the National Customer Support Center at the address below.
- At the close of business each Friday, forward all Forms 4326 received during the week from CAG A–G post offices, stations, and branches to:

#### Requisitions

Offices that anticipate insufficient supplies of Publication 65 for customer demand must obtain additional supplies from the accountable paper unit at the district. If the district

coordinator anticipates that customer demand will exceed available quantities for the entire district, the coordinator makes a written request indicating the number of publications needed. Orders must be in pallet lots (one pallet contains 160 publications). Send this request to the National ZIP Code Directory Coordinator at the address below.

#### **Obsolete Copies**

After receiving the 1997 edition, offices must dispose of any copies of the previous edition of Publication 65, 1996 National Five-Digit ZIP Code and Post Office Directory, in stock or in use, or present them locally for recycled paper.

#### 1997 Publications 66 and 66-A, ZIP+4 State Directory

Post offices and other postal units will receive one copy of the 1997 edition of Publication 66-A, *ZIP+4 State Directory* (for internal and lobby use), for their respective states in late March. There are 37 Publications 66-A, numbered 66-01A through 66-37A. Each directory covers a specific state or combination of states and may consist of more than one volume. Texas, for example, has three volumes because of its many address records. Washington, DC, is included in directories for the neighboring states of Maryland and Virginia.

This directory is not intended for use by bulk mailers or their agents to qualify a mailing for ZIP+4 or prebarcoded discount rates. If post offices need additional copies of Publication 66-A, account representatives (ARs) and postmasters may order them by completing Form 4242, ZIP+4 Code State Directory Order Form for Mail Order Use, according to ordering instructions previously supplied to all ARs. Form 4242 should include the post office finance number and be mailed to the National Customer Support Center:

Form 4242 includes the two-letter state abbreviation for each state. Offices should normally display only home state ZIP+4 directories. However, if postmasters determine that a demand exists, they may order and display neighboring state directories.

#### Sale of ZIP+4 State Directories

Publication 66, *ZIP+4 State Directory* (for external use), is also available to customers by mail order purchase only. Publication 66 is not sold at postal retail units. The price is \$21 per state directory, whether it is a single or multivolume directory. Customers purchasing Publication 66 may submit the coupon from the inside cover of the 1996 edition of Publication 66 to receive a \$1 discount.

Offices should supply interested customers with Form 4242 (October 1996). This form is not yet stocked in the material distribution centers (MDCs); the form on page 7 should be reproduced locally as needed. All obsolete versions of Form 4242 should be recycled or destroyed.

#### Media Configuration

The ZONE Chart program is available in various media configurations. The following codes are available to each format.

#### **Periodicals Documentation**

Effective July 1, 1997, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) E230.7.4, E250.1.4, E250.2.6, P012.2.2, P012.2.3, P012.2.4, P012.2.5, and P200.1.5 are amended; DMM P012.3.0 is redesignated as P012.4.0 and amended; and DMM E230.1.5 and new P012.3.0 are added, to reflect the standards for use of Presort Accuracy Validation and Evaluation (PAVE)-certified software or standardized documentation for Periodicals. These amendments will appear in DMM Issue 52 (scheduled for release on July 1, 1997).

Required standardized documentation elements will describe presort and rate eligibility based on presort. Standardized documentation for Periodicals includes the following basic elements:

- Cumulative line item totals for piece counts.
- A zone column reporting the zone, in-county discounts, and entry discounts (per addressed piece claimed in the pound rate portion).
- Mail listed by entry point.
- Same column headings and rate abbreviations used for Standard Mail and First-Class Mail, with some additions to identify unique 3-digit sorts and firm packages.
- A copy column when firm packages are included in a mailing.

  - (1) For First-Class Mail and Standard Mail, the name of the mailer and the mailing, a mailing identification code corresponding to the postage statement, the date (e.g., the date when the list was processed or the documentation was produced), the class of mail, and either the DMM standard under which the mail was prepared (e.g., M610 or M800) or the type of rates claimed.
  - (2) For Periodicals, each publication title and publication number corresponding to the postage statement and entry office, the date (e.g., the date when the list was processed or the documentation was produced), the class of mail, and either the DMM standard under which the mail was prepared (e.g.,

M200 or M800) or the type of rates claimed. For publications that are combined or copalletized and represented on the same documentation, all publication titles and publication numbers are required to be listed in the header only on the first page.

c. For mail in trays or sacks, the body of the listing reporting these required elements:

If copies for a package destination or pieces for a tray destination (automation letters only) are for multiple zones, show all zones included (e.g., "3/4/6") or show "Mixed" (or the authorized abbreviation "M") in the "Zone" column. #### 3.0 DETAILED ZONE LISTING FOR PERIODICALS

#### 3.1 Definition and Retention

The publisher must be able to present documentation to support the actual number of copies of each edition of an issue, by entry point, mailed to each zone, at DDU rates, at DSCF rates, and at In-County rates. This listing is separate from the standardized documentation required under 2.0 to support presort. This listing may be submitted with each mailing, or, as an alternative, a publisher may keep records supporting zone and destination entry information reported on the postage statement for each mailing. Records must be kept for 2 months after the mailing date. A publisher must be able to submit detailed zone listings for specific mailings when requested in advance by the USPS.

#### 3.2 Characteristics

Report the number of copies mailed to each 3-digit ZIP Code at applicable zone rates using one of the following formats:

- a. Report copies by 3-digit ZIP Code, listed in ascending numeric order, for all ZIP Codes in the mailing. The listing must include the following columns: 3-digit ZIP Code, zone, and number of copies (for the zone). Include a summary of the number of copies at each zone rate at the end of the report. A 3-digit ZIP Code may appear more than once if there are copies at different zone rates for that ZIP Code (e.g., In-County and outside-county rate copies within the same 3-digit ZIP Code area).
- b. Report copies by zone (and In-County DDU, In-County others, outside-county DDU, and outside-county DSCF, as applicable) and by 3-digit ZIP Code, listed in ascending numeric order, for each zone. For each zone, the listing must include the following columns: 3-digit ZIP Code and number of copies (for each zone) in the mailing. Include a summary of the total number of copies for each zone at the end of each zone listing. A 3-digit ZIP Code may appear under more than one zone if there are copies at different zone rates for that ZIP Code (e.g., In-County and outside-county rate copies within the same 3-digit ZIP Code area).

#### 4.0 POSTAGE STATEMENT

#### 4.1 Reporting Mailings

Each group of pieces prepared as a separate mailing must be presented with a postage statement using the correct USPS form for the particular class, rate, or postage payment method. A mailer may report more than one mailing from a single job (e.g., an Enhanced Carrier Route Standard Mail rate mailing, an automation rate mailing, and a nonautomation rate mailing) on the same postage statement if the mailings are presented at the same time for verification, the pieces are in the same processing category, each mailing separately meets all applicable eligibility standards, and the number of pieces in each mailing is separately reported on the postage statement.

#### 4.2 Completing Postage Statements

The postage statement must be completed in ink, by typewriter, or computer printer (in duplicate if the mailer wants a receipted copy) and signed by the mailer. The mailer may submit a computer-generated facsimile of the USPS form if it is in the same format as, and includes all information required by, the USPS form. A facsimile postage statement produced by software certified by the USPS Presort Accuracy Validation and Evaluation (PAVE) or Manifest Analysis and Certification (MAC) program, appropriate for the accompanying class of mail and rate claimed, is considered a USPS-approved form for these standards. A facsimile or facsimile-generating software for which general (nationwide) approval has not been granted under the PAVE or MAC program may be approved by the entry office postmaster. Data fields may be omitted on facsimiles if they pertain to rates not claimed for the mailing.

#### Polywrapped Automation Flats — New Certification Procedures

#### **General Information**

Effective March 21, 1997, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) C820.3.1 is revised to allow mailers who wish to claim automation rates for flat-size polywrapped (plastic-covered) barcoded pieces to have their pieces evaluated and certified by their local USPS mailpiece design analyst (MDA). From March 21 to September 30, 1997, Postal Engineering will review the new evaluation process and determine whether the new procedures should be permanently adopted.

For the past 4 years, evaluations of polywrapped barcoded flat-size pieces were conducted by engineers at the Postal Engineering Center in Merrifield, VA. The evaluations were conducted on a semiannual basis and required mailers to submit several thousand copies of sample pieces to this central location for in-depth testing and evaluations — a process that took several weeks to complete. Postal Engineering tested, evaluated, and certified the polywrap films and a mailer's ability to consistently prepare polywrapped pieces according to applicable mailing standards.

This notice provides the following information:

- 1. Changes in the polywrap certification process.
- 2. Instructions to mailers who wish authorization to claim automation rates for polywrapped flats.
- A list of the physical properties and wrapping configurations required for automation-compatible polywrapped flats.

Under the new procedures, a mailer is no longer required to submit sample pieces to Postal Engineering for testing. The mailer may submit a sample set of at least 30 pieces directly to the local MDA for approval to mail polywrapped pieces at automation rates for flats. This new certification process will greatly reduce mailer and postal costs associated with approval to claim automation rates for polywrapped flats.

In addition to reducing the costs of producing these sample pieces and transporting them to the Postal Engineering Center for review and certification, the new process will improve the Postal Service's response time in providing test results to mailers participating in this process. Although the Postal Service has decentralized the certification procedures, each participant must meet the minimum requirements for authorization as described in this notice before submitting samples to the MDA for evaluation.

#### **Background**

The centralized evaluation process provided Postal Engineering with a significant volume of polywrapped barcoded pieces covering a wide range of trim sizes and weights and utilizing a variety of polywrap film materials. Postal Engineering evaluated the pieces and collected data that identified the characteristics and physical properties of various polywrap materials.

The data identified certain polywrap materials, plastic formulas, and product design specifications that make some plastic films compatible for processing on postal automated flat sorting machines. Postal Engineering has taken these identified physical properties and developed specifications for polywrap films to be used in the new certification process. Additionally, postal engineers have identified mailpiece design characteristics and wrapping configurations that mailers must follow to prepare automation-compatible flats.

#### **Overview of New Certification Process**

The new polywrap certification program requires:

- Plastics manufacturers to obtain and provide an official certification of conformance that their polywrap material meets the USPS Polywrapped Flats Mailing Specifications described in Tables 1 and 2 on page 25.
- Mailers to submit for evaluation barcoded sample pieces that meet all applicable DMM mailing standards for automated flats and the minimum standards for polywrapped flats outlined in this notice.
- MDAs to authorize a mailer to claim the automation rates for flats for any flat-size barcoded piece prepared in a polywrap film that has been independently certified if the prepared piece meets all other mail preparation standards for polywrapped flats (such as overhang, seam, static, and barcode readability).
- Local business mail entry units to notify the MDA of any barcoded polywrapped mailing submitted claiming automation rates for flats that does not meet the wrapping requirements for polywrapped pieces.

#### **ASTM Testing Methodology**

In past certifications, Postal Engineering conducted a series of engineering tests and performance evaluations for each of the polywrap films submitted by mailers to ensure that each film met certain physical properties and provided an acceptable level of performance on postal automated equipment. Because these tests are similar to standard in-

dustry tests that plastics manufacturers conduct on their products as part of their internal production and quality control processes, the Postal Service will allow plastics manufacturers to use the results of their American Standard Testing Methods (ASTM) product tests to certify that the polywrap films meet or exceed the minimum requirements for the physical properties outlined in this notice.

Once the film has been certified as acceptable according to Postal Service physical properties testing requirements, the mailer must produce 30 sample copies of each piece for which approval is requested. Postal Engineering and MDAs will work together reviewing polywrapped pieces submitted under the new certification process.

Each accounting period, from March 21 to June 30, the MDA may, at his or her discretion, send Postal Engineering 10 sample copies from a set of polywrapped pieces submitted for evaluation (four sample sets maximum).

Postal Engineering will continue conducting further studies at its facility to determine whether the new polywrap specification process is feasible and practical, and whether it produces the required results sought with the new process. Affected postal departments will reevaluate the process to ensure that it provides the most effective and efficient means of evaluating the automation compatibility of polywrapped pieces.

#### **Submitting Samples for Evaluation**

A mailer who wishes to have sample pieces reviewed for authorization must submit samples to the MDA for review according to the acceptance guidelines established by the local post office. Each sample submitted must consist of at least 30 polywrapped barcoded sample pieces with a certification of compliance that the polywrap material meets the physical specifications in Table 1 on page 25.

Mailers should contact their local MDA for specific instructions regarding how and when to submit sample copies to individual post offices for evaluation and certification.

## **Transition Period for Currently Approved Mailers** and Polywrap Materials

Any mailer already approved to claim automation rates for polywrapped flats may continue to participate in the polywrap flats automation program under previous authorizations. Upon expiration of any current authorization(s), the mailer must comply with the certification procedures established by the local MDA and in effect at the time of the renewal.

A mailer currently authorized to claim automation rates for polywrapped flats may expand current authorizations to include other polywrap films or additional trim sizes and weight ranges by submitting additional polywrapped sample pieces to the MDA for evaluation under the new certification procedures.

#### **New Approval Process**

After March 1, Postal Engineering will not evaluate or certify either polywrap materials or mailers of polywrapped flat-size pieces. Mailers must not send samples of polywrapped pieces directly to the Postal Engineering Center for evaluation. All samples submitted for certification must be provided to the MDA through the certification process established by the local post office. Only the MDA may submit sample pieces to the Postal Engineering Center that may require additional testing or evaluation before certification.

All polywrap films and mailpiece samples submitted to the MDA for review and certification must be polywrap films meeting the physical properties described in this notice. At the time of submission, the mailer, at a minimum, must provide the following:

- A sample set of 30 actual copies of the barcoded polywrapped product to be evaluated.
- 2. A copy of the product data specification sheet for the polywrap film to be evaluated.
- A certificate of conformance from the polywrap manufacturer that the polywrap film has been tested and has successfully passed each of the required physical property tests.

Samples submitted with missing or incomplete supporting documentation will not be evaluated. The MDA will not contact polywrap film manufacturers to obtain the supporting documentation. It is the responsibility of the mailer to ensure that the sample and supporting documentation are submitted correctly and completely.

All evaluations will be made by the local MDA responsible for the service area where the plant that produces the pieces is located. Authorization is granted to the producer of the pieces, not to the owner of the pieces. If the owner of the pieces chooses to change from an approved polywrap mail producer to another mailing firm, the new mailing firm must be authorized by the postal MDA responsible for that new company's service area. A mailer may not submit samples for review and authorization to an MDA outside the mailing firm's local service area unless authorized by the MDA of the local service area.

A mailer with more than one physical mailing plant location must seek separate authorizations for each plant based on the preparation capability of each individual site. Each facility that produces polywrapped flats is responsible for en-

suring that its mailings meet all prescribed mailing standards. Any mailing found to be nonmachinable or not meeting polywrapped flats standards will not be accepted at the automation rates for flats. Repeated submission of unacceptable mailings is cause for exclusion from the polywrap flats automation program.

#### **Appeals and Modifications to Approval Process**

A mailer may appeal the decision of the local MDA through the local postmaster to the area manager, In-Plant Support. No exceptions will be made by any postal facility or postal employee for polywrapped pieces or polywrap film materials that do not meet all applicable DMM mailing standards and that cannot be successfully processed on postal automated equipment.

Local post offices may request additional sample copies for problematic pieces. A mailer approved to claim the automation rates for polywrapped flats must adhere to the terms of participation in the mailer's authorization letter. In addition, the flats must meet all applicable DMM standards for machinability, mail preparation, and rate eligibility.

After a polywrap material has received postal approval for use in preparing automation rate flats, it is the responsibility of the mailer using the product to prepare each mailing according to the standards prescribed by the Postal Service. Failure to comply with these standards can result in forfeiture of authorization to mail polywrapped pieces at the automation rate for flats and will result in assessment of postage at the higher presort or single-piece rates, as applicable.

Once approved, standards for participation may not be changed or modified by the mailer or other postal personnel other than the responsible MDA or Postal Engineering. Participation in this polywrap program does not exempt participants from any other applicable DMM standards.

#### **Mailpiece Identification**

Once approved for entry at the automation rates for flats, a mailpiece must be endorsed to show that it is an automation-compatible polywrapped flat-size piece. The mailer may meet this requirement by adding "USPS/[company name] Automatable Poly" on the address side of the piece, preferably below the postage area, or in another visible location on the outside of the mailpiece. The polywrap endorsement may also be printed directly on the polywrap material. Other locations for the endorsement and abbreviations for the company name are acceptable if approved in advance by the MDA.

#### Suspension of Approval

The MDA will conduct periodic reviews of authorized polywrapped automation rate mailings at Postal Service processing and distribution centers/facilities. Any mailing found to be improperly prepared at the business mail entry unit or detached mail unit will not be accepted at the automation rates for flats. The repeated submission of nonmachinable mailings is cause for exclusion from the polywrap flats automation program.

**Note:** Use of an approved polywrap material does not guarantee the automation rates for flats. Pieces improperly prepared with any approved polywrap film will not be accepted at automation rates.

#### Renewal

Polywrap approval remains in effect for a period not to exceed 1 year. Before expiration of the approval, the mailer may be required to submit a sample of 30 pieces for testing and recertification. A mailer may be exempted from annual recertification at the MDA's discretion.

#### 3.0 PROHIBITIONS

Polywrap, shrinkwrap, or polybag material is not acceptable for enclosing mailpieces in automation rate mailings unless tested and approved by a USPS mailpiece design analyst (MDA). All other polywrap-enclosed flats are nonmachinable and ineligible for the automation rates for flats. The application procedures both for approval of polywrap films and for specific mailer use of an approved polywrap film may be obtained by contacting the MDA through the manager of the postal business center within the mailer's service area (see G041 for addresses of the postal business centers). The use of an approved polywrap film does not guarantee the automation rates for flats. Pieces improperly prepared with polywrap film are not accepted at automation rates.

## Table 2 — Configuration Requirement Wrap Instruction

- The polywrapped flat must be machinable according to USPS-STD-28A and as outlined in DMM C820. Shrinkwrapped mailpieces must be approved if they conform to the machinable flat requirements according to USPS-STD-28A and as outlined in DMM C820.
- 2.1 Wrap direction must be specified as around the shorter axis of the mailpiece so that the seam is along the addressed side of the mailpiece, oriented from top to bottom. This seam must not cover any part of the address and barcode read areas.
- 2.2 Overhang of not more than 1.5 inches is allowed at the top of the mailpiece when the contents are shaken down to the bottom of the package. Overhang on the sides must not be more than 0.25 inch; however, the piece must not be wrapped so tightly as to deform the product.

**DMMT REVISION** 

#### Issuance of Handbook DM-701

Effective January 1, 1997, *Domestic Mail Manual Transition Book* (DMMT) 445 is superseded by standards in *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) M045 and M200. The procedures in DMMT 143, 145, 423, 424, 425, 426, 427, 461, 463, 464, 465, 665, and 785 are amended, updated, combined, and transferred to the January 1997 edition of Handbook DM-701, *Procedures for Mailer Applications* (Postal Service Number (PSN) 7610-03-000-8945). This new handbook provides postal employees with policy guidance in mail classification, revenue assurance, and application procedures.

Business Mail Acceptance at Headquarters mailed copies of that handbook to postal business centers, business mail entry units, rates and classification service centers, and CAG A through D post offices. A future *Postal Bulletin* will an-

nounce when stock becomes available for ordering from the two material distribution centers (MDCs).

Table I shows the DMMT sections rescinded (deleted) or transferred to certain Postal Service documents. Several minor corrections have been made to this table since its publication in *Postal Bulletin* 21937 (1-16-97). These corrections show a finer level of the disposition of material into the *Postal Operations Manual* (POM) and material consolidated into sections of the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) for DMM Issue 51 (January 1, 1997). Postal Service internal procedures have been removed from any such consolidated material.

Table II shows the DMMT sections still in force until further notice. These remaining sections contain certain internal procedures for handling Express Mail and postage meters.

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Exhibit 1.0a, Barcoded Tray Labels (not actual size)

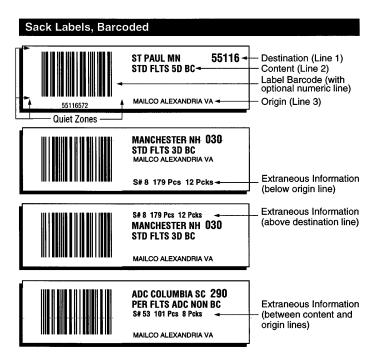


Exhibit 1.0b, Barcoded Sack Labels (not actual size)

- **A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.
- B. Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more. Exceptions: Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organizations for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use-Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or exemption endorsement. Known Mailers may use either Form 2976-A on each item or Form 2976 (or facsimile) with a mail manifest in conjunction with a packing list. Form 2976 must state "packing list enclosed." The packing list must include a description of the items, the dollar values of the items, and the complete address including the PSC box number and APO/FPO ZIP Code of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item over \$15 in value. The packing list should be enclosed in the parcel or attached to the outside of the parcel. The mail manifest which itemizes all parcels that a Known Mailer deposits will be given to Postal Official at Business Mail Acceptance Unit. Form 2976 may be used if the mailer does not wish to list the contents on the wrapper or in any case if the value exceeds \$400. Affix only the upper portion of the label on the package. A completed Form 2976-A (listing the contents and value in US dollars) must be enclosed in the package. Mail addressed to/from all 094XX ZIP Codes must use Form 2976-A only.
- **B1.** Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** Mail addressed to/from all 094XX ZIP Codes must use only Form 2976-A. All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.
  - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
  - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- **E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.
- **E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.
- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

- G. Only First-Class letters, second- and third-class mail are authorized.
- **H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.
  - H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

  - L. All official mail is prohibited.
  - M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
  - N. Registered mail is prohibited.

Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All second-class, third-class, and fourth-class mail (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
  - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
  - **Z1.** Tin band seal required on all pouches.

# **Finance**

## **Privacy Act Report for Calendar Year 1996**

The Postal Service must report its Privacy Act (PA) activities on a calendar year basis in a biennial report to the Office of Management and Budget. Each records custodian must report Privacy Act data for calendar year 1996 even if the report is negative; that is, even if no Privacy Act requests were received or denied.

**Note:** Do not confuse this Privacy Act reporting requirement with the Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) reporting requirement published in *Postal Bulletin* (PB) 21935 (12-19-96). Two separate reports (FOIA and PA) must be prepared and submitted using the formats specified.

### Which Privacy Act Requests to Report

Report only requests that meet all the following criteria:

- The request must be in writing.
- The requester must ask for access to or amendment of records about himself or herself.
- The request must specifically cite the Privacy Act.

#### Do Not Include:

- A request that does not cite the Privacy Act, even if it is of a Privacy Act nature and granted or denied under the Act. (Note: Requests from current employees must be counted *only* if they are in writing and specifically cite the Privacy Act.)
- A request for address information, e.g., change of address or boxholder information.

### Who Must Submit a Report?

All records custodians must submit a report for calendar year 1996. A records custodian is the head of a postal facility

such as an area, district, post office, or other postal installation that maintains Postal Service records and information. Vice presidents are the custodians of records and information maintained at Headquarters. (Headquarters field units should submit reports through their Headquarters offices.) Senior medical personnel are the custodians of restricted medical records maintained within postal facilities. The custodian of employee assistance program (EAP) records is either the USPS counselor, contractor, or Public Health Service, whoever provided the services. The EAP coordinator is the custodian of records prior to March 1993.

## **How to Submit Reports**

Records custodians must send reports to their records office coordinator *on or before* March 14, 1997. The report must be clearly marked "*Privacy Act Report for CY 1996*." A records office coordinator is located in the Finance office of each district and Area Customer Service and Sales office. See *Administrative Support Manual* 351.134.

### **How to Format Reports**

Custodians must submit the required information in the format shown on page 50.

## How to Maintain Records During Calendar Year 1997

Records custodians must start a centralized file containing the information required by this report. This procedure will enable custodians to have information readily available when it must submit a report this time next year.

## **Submission Requirements for Form 3236**

Effective Accounting Period 7, Fiscal Year 1997, Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, and Handbook F-4, *Examination of Postmasters Accounting Transactions*, have been revised to change the requirement for submitting Form 3236, *Uniform Allowance Cap Disbursements*, to the MNASC. Statement of account post offices are no longer required to submit Form 3236 as support to the statement of account to the MNASC. Stations and branches of post offices are still required to submit Form 3236 to the accountbook office. The accountbook office must maintain Forms 3236 locally as support to the statement of account. The retention period for Form 3236 is 4 years.

## New Billing Procedures for the Center for Leadership Development

As stated in *Postal Bulletin* 21930 (10-10-96), the Corporate American Express card issued to U.S. Postal Service (USPS) employees is no longer valid as a method of payment for expenses incurred at the Center for Leadership Development. To replace card charges, the Center will now use the Journal Voucher Transfer System (JVTS) as the only method of payment for all USPS employees who are on official business at the Center. Since the costs incurred by employees at the Center are exclusively internal to our organization, this change in policy will result in a major cost savings to the USPS.

The JVTS will be used to charge back all internally incurred expenses at the Center either to the finance number of the sponsoring organization or to the finance number of the attending employee. The two specific procedures for payment by means of JVTS are outlined below:

## **Master Billing**

Any organization that sponsors a meeting or training and intends to pay the costs for all attendees must provide the Center with a list of attendees and a Form 7381, *Requisition for Supplies, Services, or Equipment.* No additional documentation will be required from the attending employee; the

Form 7381 with the list of attendees attached is now the only required preregistration form. This is a change from previous procedure.

### **Individual Billing**

When an employee attends a meeting or training that is sponsored by his or her home or other office (not master billed), the employee must have appropriate documentation available upon registration at the Center. The Center will charge back costs to the home or other appropriate finance number. Upon registration, the employee must present a copy of one of the following forms: Form 7381, Form 1782, Training Request and Authorization, or Form 1011, Travel Advance Request and Itinerary Schedule. If the employee does not have a copy of one of these documents, the Center will accept a written statement listing all charge-back information.

Employees who are on official business may pay for personal expenses incurred at the Center with a personal credit card, cash, or check.

## Deadlines for Calendar Year 1997 1099 Processing

# International Mail

## International Express Mail Service to French Polynesia

Effective immediately, On Demand and Custom Designed Express Mail Services are available on a reciprocal basis with French Polynesia. Issue 18 of the *International Mail Manual* and the next edition of Publication 273, *Express Mail International Service Guide*, will include the changes listed below.

The basic features of Express Mail International Service (EMS) to French Polynesia are:

**Service available:** On Demand and Custom Designed Services.

Reciprocal name: Chronopost.

Weight limit: 44 pounds.

**Size limit:** Maximum length is 36 inches; maximum length and girth combined is 79 inches.

**Areas served:** Arue, Faa, Mahina, Papeete, Pirae, Punaaiua.

**Delivery:** Items are delivered Monday through Saturday. There is no delivery on national holidays.

**Service guarantee:** Postal employees must tell customers that there is no service guarantee on any EMS item.

**Acceptable items:** All items admissible in international mail to French Polynesia, including correspondence, business papers, and merchandise, are accepted in EMS. See the Country Conditions of Mailing for French Polynesia in the *International Mail Manual* (IMM) for specific prohibitions and restrictions.

Customs declaration/endorsements: Use Form 2976, Customs Sender's Declaration CN22 (green label), for correspondence and business papers. Next to mailing label, clearly endorse item BUSINESS PAPERS. Use Form 2976, Customs Sender's Declaration CN22 (green label), for merchandise samples without commercial value and not subject to customs duty. Use Form 2976-A, Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note CP72, for merchandise and all articles subject to customs duty. Include commercial invoice in each item.

**Prohibited Items:** Coins; bank notes; currency notes (paper money); securities of any kind payable to bearer; traveler's checks; platinum, gold, and silver (manufactured or not); precious stones; jewelry; and other valuable articles are prohibited in EMS shipments to French Polynesia. All items prohibited in regular international mail are also prohibited in international EMS to French Polynesia.

## **Pictorial Cancellations Announcement 97-5**

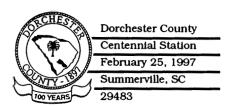
As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of upcoming events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

## New "Linerless" Self-Adhesive Flag Over Porch and Juke Box Coil Stamps

The Postal Service will issue a 32-cent Flag Over Porch stamp and a nondenominated First-Class letter presort rate Juke Box stamp (value: 25 cents) in a new "linerless" self-adhesive coil format on March 14, 1997, in New York, New York, in conjunction with the Postage Stamp Mega-Event.

These are the first stamps that the U.S. Postal Service has issued with the new "linerless" self-adhesive format, which is similar to adhesive tape. This issuance will introduce the U.S. Postal Service's test of linerless self-adhesive coil stamps. The purpose of the test is to determine how well these stamps perform when our customers actually use them and to receive feedback concerning any necessary improvements.

Both stamps have the same design as the ones currently in use. The Flag Over Porch stamp will be issued in a coil of 100 stamps, which will also be available with a plastic dispenser for an additional 25 cents. The Juke Box stamp will be issued in coils of 10,000 stamps and a new format of 30,000 stamps. The Juke Box stamp will also be sold to collectors in strips of 7 (including a plate number), mounted on a special release liner for collection and/or storage.

The coils of 100 stamps may be purchased at 17 selected post offices located in Northern Virginia from March 15 to April 30, 1997, or until quantities are extinguished. The coils of 100, 10,000, 30,000, and strips of 7 stamps may be purchased by mail order, while supplies last, from the Philatelic Fulfillment Service Center at the address below:

## Last Day of Sale Program

The purpose of this program is to provide a more consistent and efficient method for customers to purchase selected commemorative stamps and related stamp products before they are removed from sale. To commemorate this occasion, the Postal Service will offer a "last day of sale" cancellation for these selected stamps only. The cancellation will read "Last Day of Sale" and will show the city, state, ZIP Code, and date of the last day of sale. Only events authorized by Stamp Services will have the last day of sale cancellations available. These events will be held in conjunction with nationally recognized stamp shows, which are held at least four times a year. Field offices may conduct events associated with the removal of stamps from sale; however, they may not use the words "Last Day of Sale" in postmarks or other material relating to their event.

### Withdrawal of Stamp Stock for Destruction

In line with the introduction of this new program, effective close of business on March 16, 1997, all post offices, stations, branches, postal stores, vending outlets, and authorized philatelic centers will withdraw the stamp stock items listed below from sale and prepare them for destruction. The

stamp stock should be submitted to destruction sites according to the guidelines in Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, Section 45, Destroying Stamp Stock, and appropriate locally established procedures.

Absolutely no sales of the stamp stock listed below are permitted after March 16, 1997. These stamp stock items are also being removed from sale at the Philatelic Fulfillment Service Center (PFSC).

# Postal Employees

## Information Systems Sensitivity and Privacy Act Reminder

Records has become aware of an increasing number of new or changed automated systems that collect and maintain information about individuals or other information of a sensitive nature. An example is information collection related to electronic retail initiatives. While the Privacy Act and information sensitivity and security issues must be addressed whether information collection is paper or automated, increased automation poses increased privacy and security concerns. These issues must be addressed in the planning stage of system development.

It is critical that offices planning the development of new or changed information systems or issuing a solicitation that calls for the design, development, or operation of such a system do the following: (1) determine the sensitivity of information within the system; (2) ensure that system design includes the appropriate security controls commensurate with sensitivity of the information; and (3) comply with the Privacy Act when personally identifying information is collected. See *Administrative Support Manual* (ASM) 353 and Handbook AS-805, *Information Systems Security*.

Information is sensitive if it has restrictions on its internal or external access or disclosure or if it is critical to the functioning of the Postal Service. Information may be subject to the Privacy Act if it concerns an individual and is retrieved by a personal identifier such as a name or social security number. This includes information about financial transactions. An automated system must be secured at a level appropriate to its sensitivity to comply with the Privacy Act and other applicable statutes. The office responsible for the information is responsible for consulting with Records on determining information sensitivity and Privacy Act applicability and requirements, and with Information Systems Security on applying appropriate computer security controls. The Privacy Act provides criminal penalties for knowing and willful violations (see ASM 353.13). Direct questions concerning Privacy Act applicability to Records at 202-268-2608.

The C Fund is invested in the Barclays Equity Index Fund, which tracks the S&P 500 stock index. The F Fund is invested in the Barclays U.S. Debt Index Fund, which tracks the Lehman Brothers Aggregate Bond index. Because of expenses and changing balances in the C and F Funds, their returns vary from Barclays' returns. The G Fund is invested in special issues of U.S. Treasury securities.

Future performance of the three funds will vary and may differ significantly from the returns shown above. See the "Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan" for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks.

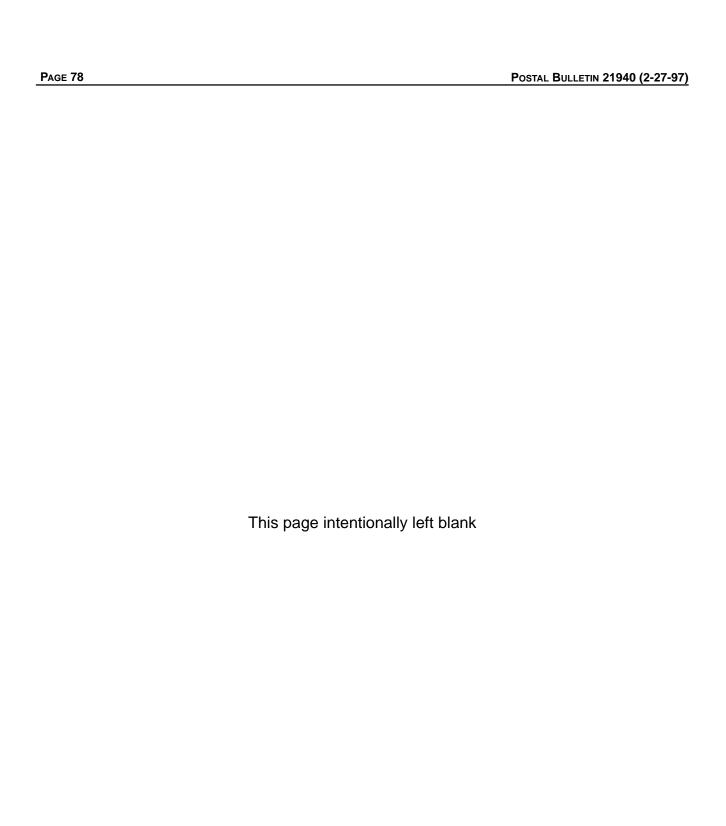
The monthly C, F, and G Fund returns represent net earnings after deduction of accrued administrative expenses. The C and F Fund returns also reflect the deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees.

The C, F, and G Fund monthly returns are dollar-weighted: they reflect net earnings on the changing balances invested during the month. The C, F, and G Fund returns for the last 12 months assume, except for the crediting of earnings, unchanging balances (time-weighting) from month to month and that earnings are compounded on a monthly basis.
