

ASM REVISION

Temporary Services Companies

Effective immediately, Administrative Support Manual (ASM) 272.313 is added to clarify security clearance requirements for contract employees from temporary service companies. This revision will be incorporated in an incremental update of the ASM found via the Policies and Procedures page of the Intranet, located at http://blue.usps.gov. It will also be included in ASM 12, published in tandem with the release of the Postal Explorer 7.0.

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272.3 Clearances for Individuals Under Service Contracts

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272.313 Temporary Services Companies

Temporary service company contractors (e.g., Manpower, Kelly) are intended to provide short-term support services (e.g., custodial, secretarial, and administrative services). When emergent support services are required, the contractor must provide certification to the contracting officer, COR, or a designee, that the contractor's employee has met the basic security clearance requirements. If the contractor's employee requires a higher-level security clearance, the contractor's employee may work for 2 weeks under the basic clearance, pending approval of the higher clearance.

ALL OFFICES WITH CITY MOTORIZED, RURAL, OR HIGHWAY CONTRACT BOX DELIVERY ROUTES

Mailbox Improvement Week, May 18-23

Each year, the Postal Service designates the third full week of May to encourage customers on city motorized, rural, or highway contract box delivery routes to examine and, where necessary, improve the appearance of their mailboxes. Neat, attractive mailboxes make a significant contribution to the appearance of the countryside and to streets in suburban areas. Mailbox Improvement Week, May 18–23, calls attention to the need for providing mailboxes that are:

- 1. Designed to protect the mail from weather.
- 2. Safe to use.
- 3. Conveniently located.
- 4. Neat in appearance.

Mailboxes that meet these four important requirements help delivery and collection operations, and improve service to the entire route. There are two approved styles of curbside mailboxes: (1) traditional design in three standard sizes (see Exhibit A); and (2) contemporary design, also in three sizes (see Exhibit B).

Notice 209

Notice 209, *Mailbox Improvement Week* (August 1994)(NSN 7610-03-000-9145), can be requisitioned from the material distribution center by submitting Form 7380, *MDC Supply Requisition*. Postmasters should send the notice to all rural and highway contract box delivery route customers the week before Mailbox Improvement Week to alert them of the event.

City Motorized, Rural, and Highway Contract Box Delivery Routes

Customers must use only approved traditional or contemporary curbside mailboxes for new installations or replacements. However, customers may use custom-built curbside mailboxes if the local postmaster gives prior approval and the mailbox conforms generally to the same requirements as approved manufactured curbside mailboxes, relative to the flag, size, strength, and quality of construction. Carriers on motorized city routes may continue to serve mailboxes designed primarily for use by customers receiving door delivery, which have been erected and served under previous regulations (see Exhibit C). However, carriers should advise customers they may use only approved curbside mailboxes when replacing these types of mailboxes. A list of approved manufacturers of traditional curbside mailboxes appears in Postal Bulletin 21918 (4-25-97) and is updated in this Postal Bulletin.




For motorized city routes, and where the use of street names and house numbers are authorized on rural and highway contract box delivery routes, the mailbox must display the number on the side of single mailboxes or on the door of grouped mailboxes. If the mailbox is on a street other than the one on which the customer resides, the street name and house number must be on the mailbox. When rural and highway contract box delivery route customers have assigned box numbers, the numbers must appear on the side of single mailboxes or on the door of grouped mailboxes, visible to the approaching carrier. The street number, box number, and/or any other address information must be inscribed in contrasting color in neat letters and numerals not less than one inch in height. In all instances, placing the owner's name on the box is optional.

Motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery route customers should be encouraged to group mailboxes whenever practical, especially where many mailboxes are located at or near crossroads, service turnouts, or similar locations. Customers should also paint mailboxes and supports/posts and keep them rust-free. Advertising on mailboxes and supports/posts is prohibited.

In areas where snow removal is a problem, the Postal Service suggests using a semi-arch or extended arm-type support (see Exhibit D), which allows snowplows to sweep near or under mailboxes without damaging supports and easy access to the mailboxes by carriers and customers.

Generally, customers should install mailboxes with the bottom of the mailbox at a vertical height of between 3 1/2 to 4 feet from the road surface. However, because of varying road and curb conditions and other factors, the Postal Service recommends that customers contact the postmaster or carrier before erecting or replacing mailboxes and supports.

Exhibit D



Location

Customers must place mailboxes on motorized city, rural, and highway contract routes so a carrier can safely and conveniently serve them without leaving his or her vehicle. The mailboxes must be on the right-hand side of the road in the carrier's travel direction in all cases where traffic conditions make it dangerous for the carrier to drive to the left to reach the mailboxes, or where doing so would constitute a violation of traffic laws and regulations (Postal Operations Manual 632.6 exempts apartment houses or other multiple dwellings from this rule). On new rural and highway contract box delivery routes, all mailboxes must be on the right hand side of the road in the direction of the route line of travel. Mailbox placement must conform with state laws and highway regulations. City motorized, rural, and highway contract box delivery route carriers are subject to the same traffic laws and regulations as other motorists. Customers must remove obstructions, including vehicles, trash cans, and snow, that impede efficient delivery. Except when a mailbox is temporarily blocked, carriers must have access to the mailbox without leaving the vehicle unless authorized to dismount.

Mailbox Supports

Posts and other supports for curbside mailboxes are owned and controlled by customers who are responsible for seeing that posts are neat and adequate in strength and size. Customers should be discouraged from using massive mailbox supports that, when struck, could damage vehicles and cause injury. Heavy metal posts, concrete posts, and miscellaneous items of farm equipment, such as milk cans filled with concrete, are examples of potentially dangerous supports. The ideal support is an assembly that bends or falls away when struck by a vehicle. Post or support designs may not represent effigies or caricatures that disparage or ridicule any person. Customers may attach the box to a fixed or movable arm. ROM 632.5 specifies postal regulations regarding construction and placement of mailboxes and supports on motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery routes.

The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) has determined that mailbox supports no larger than 4 inches by 4 inches, or a 2-inch diameter standard steel or aluminum pipe, buried no more than 24 inches, should safely break away if struck by a vehicle. The mailbox must also be securely attached to its post to prevent separation if struck. See Exhibits E and F (on page 15) for examples of mailbox mountings and supports suggested by the FHWA.

Cantilever Mailbox Supports




CBUs and All-Weather Parcel Lockers

During Mailbox Improvement Week, postmasters, managers, or their designees must also review cluster box units (CBUs) and all-weather parcel lockers in their delivery areas to identify any hazards or irregularities and record the results of the review. Form 8143, *Equipment Checklist and Followup Review* (see Exhibit G on page 19), is the suggested format to use in conducting and recording the reviews. Form 8143 is only available in this bulletin and must be reproduced locally. Employees conducting the reviews must complete Form 1624, *Delivery/Collection Equipment Work Request* (NSN 7530-01-000-9392), for any equipment that poses a safety hazard to postal customers or employees. Use Form 7380, *Supply Center Requisition*, to requisition Form 1624 from the material distribution centers.

Equipment Review Procedure

Employees should use the CBU and parcel locker equipment checklist and follow-up review procedure when examining the condition of CBUs and parcel lockers. They should:

- 1. List the unit location, type, and manufacturer in the left-hand column (list serial number where available).
- 2. Assign each checklist item one of the following ratings:
 - OK Equipment does not need attention for this item.
 - X Equipment needs attention for this item.
 - NA Item does not apply to this particular piece of equipment.
- 3. When examining the equipment, use the instructions below to complete Form 8143:
 - a. Check equipment. It should be straight, vertical, and firmly mounted. Attempt to shake the unit; it should hardly move. If equipment is not firmly mounted, note whether it is the connection at ground level that is loose or the connection between the pedestal and customer compartment that needs attention.
 - b. Check visible welds. Make note of cracked, broken, or rusted welds. Tap the pedestal with a plastic hammer, especially along the seams, to check for corrosion from the inside out or perforated corrosion.

- c. Observe whether the carrier access door is locked and secure. Open it and observe whether it is bowed or warped and that the door and locking bar operate smoothly. With the carrier access door open, check whether restraining devices prevent the door from blowing closed. These devices, which may have to be set manually, should be serviceable.
- d. Ensure that the arrow lock operates smoothly and that the mounting screws are tight. The cover that protects the arrow lock from customer tampering must be serviceable and firmly attached.
- Ensure that all customer access doors are present, closed, and locked with no visible damage or signs of forced entry. Check that customer door numbers are readable.
- Ensure that the exterior surface of the unit is free from rust and graffiti.
- g. Examine the unit. Check it for defects or damage and whether it reflects a proper Postal Service image.
- h. Check whether the unit and/or any protecting structure appear watertight and in good repair. Check to see if there are any noticeable watermarks inside the unit or any wet mail.
- i. Note any other conditions that require attention.
- 4. Record the results of the inspection on the checklist.
- Submit the completed Form 1624 for each unit reviewed to the maintenance office responsible for CBU installation and/or repair in the area.

Carriers must note equipment deficiencies and report them to the postmaster, supervisor, or designee. The postmaster or designee must then submit Form 1624 reporting the equipment defects. In addition, carriers should complete Form 1767, *Report of Hazard, Unsafe Condition, or Practice* (NSN 7530-01-000-9422), for items that pose an immediate threat to safety, such as an improperly secured or leaning CBU. The postmaster or supervisor must immediately notify by telephone the office responsible for repair of reported hazards. The postmaster or supervisor must follow up to ensure that the work is satisfactorily completed and documented. The office responsible for repair should use its local buying authority to accomplish the repairs.



State and Local Regulations

Some states have enacted laws that are more stringent and specific about the type of mailbox that may be used, the post or support that must be used to mount the mailbox, and the location of the delivery equipment. Regulations and recommendations published in this notice may not reflect appropriate requirements for your area. When providing guidance to the general public concerning mailbox placement and replacement, in addition to postal regulations, advise them of any mailbox regulations known to you that have been enacted by state or local authorities.

Publicity

Postmasters should give these guidelines and suggestions maximum local publicity. Consult your area Corporate Relations Center for further guidance and assistance in publicizing Mailbox Improvement Week. The following news release is provided for postmasters to use in promoting Mailbox Improvement Week for daily or weekly newspapers or broadcast stations in their delivery area. Postmasters should retype the release double-spaced on Postal Service letterhead. It may also be helpful to alert the media to locations of particularly interesting mailboxes in your delivery area.

Responsibility

Motorized city, rural, and highway contract box delivery route carriers must cooperate to ensure the success of this endeavor and later report the results to the postmaster. also, postmasters should use the most up-to-date list of approved manufacturers and mailbox suppliers when providing motorized city, rural, or highway contract box delivery route customers with information about what type of box to install.

MAILBOX IMPROVEMENT WEEK ARRIVES IN TIME FOR SPRING CLEANING

The U.S. Postal Service is asking all (<u>city name</u>) homeowners to inspect and repair their mailboxes during Mailbox Improvement Week, May 18-23, says Postmaster (<u>full name</u>).

"Repairing suburban and rural mailboxes improves the appearance of our community and makes delivering and receiving mail safer for our carriers and customers," (last name) says.

The Postal Service makes this yearly request because of the wear and tear that occur to mailboxes every year. (<u>If applicable</u>) This is especially important after the effects of last winter, (<u>he/she adds</u>).

Some of the typical activities that may need to be taken include:

- Replacing loose hinges on mailbox door.
- Repainting a mailbox that may have rusted or started peeling.
- Remounting a mailbox post if loosened.
- Replacing or adding house numbers.

If a homeowner plans to install a new mailbox or replace a worn one, he or she must use only USPS-approved traditional or contemporary mailboxes, said (<u>last name</u>). Customers should be careful when purchasing curbside mail receptacles as use of unapproved boxes is prohibited. Customers may use a custom-built mailbox, but they must consult with my office to ensure it conforms to guidelines applying to flag, size, strength, and quality of construction.

- c. Sharps Wastes. Packages containing sharps waste mailable under 8.5 must be marked on the address side with the proper shipping name (i.e., "Medical Waste-Sharps" or "Regulated Medical Waste-Sharps") and the correct UN number. The universal biohazard symbol shown in Exhibit 8.5c(3) must appear on the outside of the mailpiece.
- d. Other Used Medical Devices. Packages containing other used medical devices mailable under 8.6 must be marked on the address side with the proper shipping name (i.e., "Medical Waste" or "Regulated Medical Waste") and the correct UN number. The universal biohazard symbol shown in Exhibit 8.5c(3) must appear on the outside of the mailpiece.

DMM REVISION

Experimental First-Class and Priority Mail Small Parcel Test

Effective April 28, 1998, Domestic Mail Manual G091 is deleted as a result of the expiration of the Experimental First-Class and Priority Mail Small Parcel Test on April 28, 1998. This is in accordance with terms of the test established by the Postal Rate Commission and approved by the Governors of the Postal Service and the decision of the Postal Service not to file a request with the Postal Rate Commission to establish permanent rate classifications and discounts. The four-cent per piece discount available to participants of the test will not be offered after April 28, 1998. The prescribed piece marking of "EX AUTO" used to identify experimental prebarcoded First-Class and Priority Mail parcels and test postage statements (PS Forms 3600-SPX, 3600-SRX, 3605-SPX, and 3605-SRX) will also be discontinued effective April 28, 1998. This revision will appear in DMM Issue 54 (scheduled for release on July 1, 1998).

Mechanical Postage Meter Decertification

The Postal Service began the gradual process of removing all mechanical, manually set postage meters from service on June 1, 1996. This action generated a demand for information from our customers as well as Postal employees as to why this action was necessary, which meters were affected, and what the withdrawal schedule would be. In October 1997, a complete informational package that provided answers to each of these questions was sent by the U.S. Postal Service to all known mechanical meter customers. However, as more customers were affected by the withdrawal schedule, more questions were raised. It is extremely important that all affected customers have the correct answers to all of their questions so that they can make responsible, informed decisions regarding the replacement of their mechanical, manually set meters.

The items in the package sent included a multi-colored, tri-fold brochure that identified the affected meter model families by manufacturer, the critical dates for the phase-out process, a letter of explanation to the customer from Metering Technology Management, and a "critical facts" sheet. The items are included here for you to distribute to all of your known mechanical meter customers as well as Postal employees. Please reproduce and distribute at all relevant customer contact opportunities and post on your employee information bulletin boards.

Dear Postage Meter User:

You are a valued customer of the United States Postal Service, and we would like to thank you for your business. As you may have read, there are some significant changes coming that will affect many postage meter users. So in order to keep you informed, we urge you to take a moment to read this important message.

The Postal Service announced on May 1, 1996 that mechanical meters must be phased out of use and replaced with electronic postage meters. The technology and security features of mechanical meters is obsolete when compared to the latest in available postage metering devices. Just as the office equipment industry has evolved over the past decade, postage metering technology has advanced with the availability of electronic and digital meters. The new electronic and digital metering systems available today are far more secure than mechanical meters, and this new level of security enhances protection of postal revenues.

We regret any inconvenience to our meter customers using mechanical meters; however, there is a lot of good news associated with a conversion to newer meter models. Electronic meters provide mailers with significantly enhanced features and benefits like postage accounting, interfaces with electronic scales, remote meter resetting and much more. New meter technology is more reliable, simplifies the payment and collection of postage, and supports our efforts for ensuring security of postage. With advances in technology and the security features that new technology affords, the Postal Service has no choice but to take this initiative because of the continued loss of revenue through postage meters, and the susceptibility of mechanical meters to tampering and fraudulent misuse.

While our motivations are driven by the necessity to protect revenue, we are committed to implementing the change in the least disruptive way we can. We have been working with the meter manufacturers to develop a schedule that will work for everyone. The gradual phase-out process began June 1, 1996 when we required meter manufacturers to stop all new placements of mechanical meters. The conversion schedule for the mechanical meters in service is as follows:

Meter/Mailer Type

Conversion Date

 Mechanical meters used to process mail for a fee, or provide metering and mailing services to others March 31, 1997*

- * If you are a "for fee" mailer and have missed this date, contact your meter manufacturer immediately
- All other high-speed capable mechanical meters (systems meters that operate on a mailing machine base)

December 31, 1998

All low speed mechanical meters must be converted

March 31, 1999

Please refer to the enclosed brochure for more information about the affected postage meter models and schedule for withdrawal. We suggest you contact your existing meter manufacturer to begin exploring the options best suited to your needs. Other meter manufacturers servicing your local area can be found in your yellow pages under "Office Equipment" or "Mailing Equipment Services".

The Postal Service requests your assistance in this program by replacing your mechanical postage meter with an electronic or digital meter now, rather than later. Postage meter users who delay in converting may face further delays due to high demand at the end of the conversion period. We would also like to especially thank those of you that have already made the conversion. Over 62% of postage meter licensees are using electronic meters. Your prompt action is greatly appreciated! The meter manufacturers also wish to make this a smooth transition, so it benefits you to contact your supplier as soon as possible.

What This Means to You...



A mechanical postage meter is distinguished from an electronic system by the type of meter register. Mechanical meters have mechanical register displays, that is, the ascending and descending dials move by mechanical means. Electronic meters have registers with digital displays controlled by computer chips or microprocessors. Although the Postal Service encourages customers upgrading

their equipment to select a meter that can be remotely set (CMRS), this is not a distinguishing characteristic. Some mechanical meters can be remotely set, while some electronic are manually

set. The model numbers listed here are the meters that must be converted. The conversion dates are based on the type of meter or meter use, and the associated schedule for withdrawal is shown on the next page.

Mechanical Meter Phase Out Program...

On May 17, 1996, the USPS officially announced the need to have all postage meter manufacturers upgrade the level of technology offered to postal customers. This may affect you because it means that all mechanical postage meters will be removed from use over a scheduled period of time. This move is intended to reduce postage revenue losses because it has been determined that mechanical meters are more susceptible to misuse than electronic and digital postage meters.

All mechanical meters are subject to removal by the end of March 1999. This removal process, called decertification, will be phased dependent on the application, mail volume, and postage meter model. The affected postage meter models and the schedule for their removal are identified herein.

- **A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.
- B. Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more. Exceptions: Prepaid mail from contractors addressed to a military organization for official use need not bear a customs declaration, but must be endorsed "Contents for Official Use-Exempt from Customs Requirement." Official mail from government agencies does not require a customs declaration or exemption endorsement. Known Mailers may use either Form 2976-A on each item or Form 2976 (or facsimile) with a mail manifest in conjunction with a packing list. Form 2976 must state "packing list enclosed." The packing list must include a description of the items, the dollar values of the items, and the complete address including the PSC box number and APO/FPO ZIP Code of the addressee, the date of mailing, the insurance registry number, if applicable, and the serial number of any item over \$25 in value and any electrical item over \$15 in value. The packing list should be enclosed in the parcel or attached to the outside of the parcel. The mail manifest which itemizes all parcels that a Known Mailer deposits will be given to Postal Official at Business Mail Acceptance Unit. Form 2976 may be used if the mailer does not wish to list the contents on the wrapper or in any case if the value exceeds \$400. Affix only the upper portion of the label on the package. A completed Form 2976-A (listing the contents and value in US dollars) must be enclosed in the package.
- **B1.** Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.
 - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.
- **E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C022.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.
- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

- G. Only First-Class letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) are authorized.
- **H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.
 - H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
- $\mbox{\bf I.}$ Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
 - L. All official mail is prohibited.
 - M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
 - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- ${\bf R.}\;$ All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.
- $\mbox{\bf R1.}$ Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

- **W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 11 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail (A), and Standard Mail (B) (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

District accounting offices will now have until 2 p.m. local time Wednesday, May 27, to enter statement of account data via DDE/DR for offices reporting on an accounting period basis, and until noon local time Wednesday, May 27, to transmit statements of account via the SFAS. The deadline for statements of account submission for offices reporting on a quarterly basis remains noon central daylight time, Wednesday, June 3. Post offices that send statements of account to the district accounting office for processing must submit forms by close of business Tuesday, May 26, or sooner, if possible.

The mailer must also be capable of tendering all of its ICM mail to the Postal Service.

The Postal Service commemorates the 150th anniversary of the admission of Wisconsin into the Union with the issuance of a 32-cent Wisconsin Statehood commemorative stamp, in a pane of 20 (Item 4454), on May 29, 1998, in Madison, Wisconsin. The stamp goes on sale nationwide May 30, 1998, only at authorized Philatelic Centers and through Stamp Fulfillment Services.

Designed by Phil Jordan of Falls Church, Virginia, the stamp features a photograph of a rural Wisconsin setting taken by photographer Zane Williams of Madison, Wisconsin.

Wisconsin became the 30th state admitted to the Union on May 29, 1848. Wisconsin is an eastern north central state bounded on the north by Lake Superior and Upper Michigan, on the east by Lake Michigan, and on the south by Illinois; on the west, it is separated from Iowa and Minnesota by the Mississippi River and one of its tributaries, the St. Croix. 
As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (32 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the envelope or postcard through the mail. Customers who want their serviced item returned under protected cover should include a larger, stamped, self-addressed envelope.

Safe Driver Awards

The National Safety Council (NSC) Safe Driver Award Rules, revised in March 1994, streamlined the procedures for Safe Driver Award Review Committees and for record-keeping and provided a simplified ordering process. District and area offices received copies of the booklet. Additional copies may be obtained from the NSC.

The most significant change involved the elimination of an NSC form (V 11-P) previously used to submit the names and records of drivers eligible for awards to the NSC for award processing. Under the current rules, participating offices maintain a roster sheet to track award eligibility.

The procedures are the same as specified in the March 1994 revision. Place orders for the Safe Driver Award pins and wallet cards either by telephone or by submitting an order form to the NSC. The Postal Service has an exclusive toll-free number, 1-800-SAFE-643. Place orders Monday through Friday between 8 a.m. and 5:45 p.m., Central time.

Postal drivers achieving 20, 25, 30, 35, 40, or 45 years of safe driving are eligible to receive the NSC's personalized

Expert Driver Award. Postal drivers who attain 30 years, or 1 million miles, of safe driving may be nominated for the Million Mile Club Award. To ensure correct spelling of personalized awards, submit written order forms to:



It is important to return **all** of these old FIRSTCLASS PHONECARDs, and to separate the active from the inactive cards. The Postal Service will receive a credit for the cost of all activated cards that are unsold.

Retail units and vending locations must perform the following actions concerning phonecards:

SMARTALK Teleservices, Inc., Cards

- Upon receipt of the new cards, begin to sell them immediately. Vending sites must remember to activate batch cards and insert new display facsimiles prior to sale in PCM-1625B machines.
- Immediately upon receipt, put up new FIRSTCLASS PHONECARD Point of Purchase material.

American Express Telecom, Inc., Cards

- Remove all existing FIRSTCLASS PHONECARDs with the American Express Telecom, Inc. logo (blue box) from retail drawers, vending machines, and storage.
- Separate any activated (batch or otherwise) from inactive cards.
- Complete the appropriate Certification of Inventory Return sheets which were enclosed with new card shipments or which are on pages 83–85 for either activated or Inactive cards.
