
#### **Reused Packaging**

One of the greatest challenges facing the Postal Service is the control of hazardous materials (HAZMAT), both declared and undeclared, in the mailstream. In order to protect the health and safety of our employees and the general public, the Postal Service restricts the type and quantity of HAZMAT that is permitted and places specific packaging, marking, labeling, and documentation requirements on shipments. Many of these potentially hazardous materials regulated in the mailstream are common household items, including cosmetics, cleaning supplies, alcoholic beverages, and aerosols. Postal Service employees are instructed to prevent packages containing HAZMAT from entering the mailstream unless these packages meet Postal Service requirements for mailing. If a package that does not meet postal requirements is discovered in the mailstream after acceptance, employees are instructed to isolate and remove the package from the mailstream and return it to the mailer.


Many items mailed in reused boxes are returned to the mailer because of outside package labels and markings that indicate HAZMAT. When the actual contents are identified it is usually found that the contents were mailable and no disruption or inconvenience would have occurred if these materials were properly packaged.

Many of these returned items were packaged in boxes that were obtained at grocery, hardware, and liquor stores and formerly contained everyday household items. Because of safety concerns, compliance with all federal and state laws governing the transport of HAZMAT, and privacy statutes, the Postal Service must assume that all markings and labels on a package identify the actual contents. Packages of this nature should be isolated and removed from the mailstream and customer notification and disposition of the parcel should be determined. The package may be forwarded on surface transportation or returned to the mailer.

Examples of reused boxes that are considered unacceptable are shown below.



It is acceptable to reuse boxes for mail shipments if all former package markings and labels have been removed or completely obliterated by the mailer. Merely crossing out a label or marking or writing the current contents on a box is insufficient to allow mailing. If any evidence of former HAZMAT contents is visible, the parcel cannot be accepted. The former markings and labels must be marked out even if the parcel will be wrapped in paper for mailing because if the wrapping becomes damaged during shipment, these markings will cause the package to be returned. Examples of acceptable and unacceptable reused boxes are shown below.



The Postal Service accepts reused boxes in the mailstream when these guidelines are followed. Questions regarding the mailablilty of reused boxes should be directed to your local post office or rates and classification service center (RCSC).

#### 2000 Combined Federal Campaign Guidelines

#### Schedule and Responsibilities

Each fall, the Postal Service joins other federal agencies in the Combined Federal Campaign drive. In accordance with Office of Personnel Management (OPM) regulations, the campaign runs for a six-week period between September 1 and December 15, as established by the Local Federal Coordinating Committee.

Vice presidents of Area Operations have campaign responsibility. Area offices must ensure that campaign information is disseminated to all offices under their jurisdiction.

#### **Guidelines Online**

Publication 530, *U.S. Postal Service Combined Federal Campaign Operational Guidelines*, May 1994, is a reference source for guidelines on running a successful campaign. The electronic version of Publication 530 was updated effective November 1998 and is available on the corporate intranet. Revisions include updated position titles, facility locations, and dates of campaign. Additional information on the Combined Federal Campaign, including geographic boundaries, may be found at the OPM Web site, *http://www.opm.gov.* 

#### **Pledge Form Management Instructions**

- 1. Ensure that pledge forms are checked for completeness at local campaign sites.
- 2. Distribute copies of the pledge forms as follows:
  - a. Central Receipt and Accounting copy submit to the appropriate CFC official.
  - b. Employee copy return to the employee.
  - c. Payroll Office copy —

3. Submit corrections to the local DDE/DR site, not to the Eagan ISC.

**Note:** All cards that are illegible or incomplete will be returned to the local CFC coordinator for local processing in pay period 03-01 or later.

Local DDE/DR sites will be notified by broadcast message of their ability to access D20M, SDI-09 in pay period 03-01 for local entry, changes, or corrections. DDE/DR sites will not be able to access D20M for CFC charity entries before that time.

#### **Final Report**

At the conclusion of each campaign, a report of CFC contributions through payroll deduction (as of pay period 03-01) is prepared from the Postal Payroll System and is used for annual reporting of national CFC contributions. A copy of this report is distributed to each performance cluster manager.

The chief operating officer and executive vice president is appointed by the postmaster general and directs all processing, distribution, and customer service functions.

#### 111.541 Reporting Directly to the Postmaster General

Nine of the corporate officers report directly to the postmaster general. These are the deputy postmaster general, the chief operating officer and executive vice president, the vice president of Strategic Planning, the general counsel and vice president, the senior vice president of Human Resources, the chief inspector, the senior vice president of Government Relations and Public Policy, the chief financial officer and executive vice president of Finance, and the president of Expedited/Package Services, who is overseen by a management committee of officers.

#### 111.542 Reporting to the Deputy Postmaster General

Five of the corporate officers report directly to the deputy postmaster general. These are the senior vice president of Corporate Business Development, the vice president of E-Commerce, the judicial officer, the chief technology officer and senior vice president of Technology, and the chief marketing officer and senior vice president of Marketing.

## 111.543 Reporting to the Chief Operating Officer and Executive Vice President

Twelve of the corporate officers report directly to the chief operating officer and executive vice president. These are the 10 area vice presidents, senior vice president of Operations, and senior vice president of Sales.

#### 111.544 Reporting to the Senior Vice President of Government Relations and Public Policy

The vice president of Public Affairs and Communications, and the Consumer Advocate and vice president report directly to the senior vice president of Government Relations and Public Policy.

## 111.545 Reporting to the Chief Financial Officer and Executive Vice President of Finance

The controller and vice president of Finance, the vice president of Purchasing and Materials, and the Treasurer and E-Payments vice president report directly to the chief financial officer and executive vice president of Finance.

#### 111.546 Reporting to the Senior Vice President of Human Resources

The vice presidents of Employee Resource Management, Labor Relations, and Diversity Development report directly to the senior vice president of Human Resources.

## 111.547 Reporting to the Senior Vice President of Operations

Six vice presidents report directly to the senior vice president of Operations. These are the vice presidents of Delivery, Network Operations Management, Engineering, Facilities, Operations Planning and Processing, and Quality.

## 111.548 Reporting to the Chief Marketing Officer and Senior Vice President of Marketing

Five vice presidents report directly to the chief marketing officer and senior vice president of Marketing. These are the vice presidents of Strategic Marketing; Pricing and Product Design; Retail, Consumers and Small Business; Core Business Marketing; and International Business.

#### 111.549 Reporting to the Chief Technology Officer and Senior Vice President of Technology

Two vice presidents report directly to the chief technology officer and senior vice president of Technology. These are the vice presidents of Information Technologies and Information Platform.

#### 113.213 Procedures

Regulations, instructions, and implementation guidelines are issued over the signatures of vice presidents of functional organizations or their accountable functional unit manager and used to implement programs and business activities. Whether published on paper or online, such

procedures must be coordinated with other appropriate organizations before issuance and reviewed, published, and managed by Public Affairs and Communications.

## Back to School: **Safety Tips**

Chool bus transportation is safe. In fact, buses are safer than cars! Even so, last year, approximately 26 students Were killed and another 9,000 were injured in incidents involving school buses. More often than not, these deaths and injuries didn't occur in a crash, but as children were entering and exiting the bus. Remember these safety tips:

- Have a safe place to wait for your bus, away from traffic and the street.
- Stay away from the bus until it comes to a complete stop. and the driver signals you to enter.
- When being dropped off, exit the bus and walk 10 giant steps away from the bus. Keep a safe distance between you and the bus. Also, remember that the bus driver can see you best when you are back away from the bus.

 Stay away from the bus until the driver gives his or her signal that it's okay to approach.

Be aware of the street traffic around you. Drivers are required to follow certain rules of the road concerning school buses. However, not all do. Protect yourself and watch out!

## Riding in a car

You might have heard that most traffic accidents occur I close to home...they do. Safety belts are the best form of protection passengers have in the event of a crash. They can lower your risk of injury by 45%. You are four times more likely to be seriously injured or killed if ejected from the vehicle in a crash. Everyone needs to be buckled up properly. That means older kids in seat belts, younger kids in booster seats, and little kids in child safety seats.

## **A Checklist for Parents**

- Be sure your child knows his or her home phone number (including area code) and address, your work number, the number of another trusted adult, and how to use 911 for emergencies. Make sure your child has enough change to make a phone call or carries a telephone calling card.
- Plan a walking route to school or the bus stop. Choose the most direct way with the fewest street crossings and use intersections with crossing guards. Test the route with your child. Tell him or her to stay away from parks, vacant lots, fields, and other places where there aren't many people around.
- Teach your child whether walking, biking, or riding the bus to school - to obey all traffic signals, signs, traffic officers, and safety patrols. Remind them to be extra careful in rainy, foggy, or snowy weather.
- Make sure they walk to and from school with others a friend, neighbor, brother, sister.
- When car pooling, drop off and pick up children as close to school as possible. Don't leave until they have entered the school yard or building.
- Teach your child never to talk to strangers or accept rides or gifts. from strangers. Remember, a stranger is anyone you or your child don't know well or don't trust.

If your child is home alone for a few hours after school:

 Set up rules for locking doors and windows, answering the door or telephone.

 Make sure he or she checks in with you or a neighbor immediately after school.

 Agree on rules for inviting friends over and for going to a friend's house when no adult is home.


 Take time to listen carefully to children's fears and feelings about people or places that scare them or make them feel uneasy. Tell them to trust their instincts. Take complaints about bullies and other concerns seriously.

DMM REVISION

#### **Queen Honeybees**

Domestic Mail Manual (DMM) C022.3.7 states that live queen honeybees are mailable via air transportation, but other bees (i.e., worker bees) may be sent only via surface transportation. However, when queen honeybees are shipped, it is critical that each queen be accompanied by a few attendant honeybees. The attendant honeybees feed and groom the queen during shipment, reducing the stress of transport and ensuring the viability of the queen honeybee when it is introduced into a new honeybee colony after delivery.

For these reasons, effective October 5, 2000, DMM C022.3.7 is clarified to allow a limited number of attendant honeybees to accompany each queen honeybee when air transportation is used. This revision will appear in the printed version of DMM 56 and in the online version available via Postal Explorer (http://pe.usps.gov).

#### **Domestic Mail Manual (DMM)**

[Amend 3.7 to read as follows:]

#### 3.7 Bees

Bees are acceptable in the continental surface mail when shipped under federal and state regulations to ensure they are free of disease. Packages of honeybees must bear special handling postage, except when sent as First-Class Mail. Only queen honeybees may be shipped via air transportation. Each queen honeybee shipped via air transportation may be accompanied by up to eight attendant honeybees.

#### **Integrated Barcodes**

Until now, mailers have been required to apply individual labels and/or barcodes for each special service requested. This can cause size and spacing issues on their shipping labels and packages, and can add labor costs to manually apply multiple labels to their packages.

To meet customers needs, the Postal Service developed an integrated barcoding solution to allow mailers to combine multiple services into a single barcode. This makes it possible for mailers to print the barcode directly on the shipping label and eliminates the need to apply additional labels for other desired special services.


The integrated barcoding option is designed to easily merge with Delivery Confirmation software/systems. With a few simple modifications, mailers' and vendors' software/systems can be transformed to allow users to request multiple special services on Priority Mail or Standard Mail (B) shipments.

The modifications include the following:

- 1. Change the text above the barcode to identify the service requested.
- 2. Change the service type code in the barcode.

The two special service combinations available at this time are:

- Delivery Confirmation With Insured
  - Text will read "USPS DELIVERY CONFIRMA-TION" if value is equal to or less than \$50.00.
  - Text will read "USPS INSURED" if value is greater than \$50.00.
- 2. Signature Confirmation With Insured (test customers only)
  - Text will read "USPS INSURED" for all values.



The service type codes are designated within the barcode to identify the type of special service(s) included on the mailpiece. They are listed in *Preparing for Signature Confirmation and Integrated Barcoded Standards Developers Guide.* 

Delivery employees should be aware that the handheld scanners and POS ONE terminals will recognize integrated barcodes when scanned and will lead them down the proper path. When a mailpiece has Signature Confirmation combined with insurance (test customers only), the label will say "USPS INSURED" and will require manual entry of the recipient's name, just as with all Signature Confirmation test pieces.

HANDBOOKS F-15 AND F-12 CORRECTION

#### **Meal Reductions**

Postal Bulletin 22033 (9-21-00) published per diem rate changes to Handbook F-15, *Travel and Relocation*, section A-2.6, and Handbook F-12, *Relocation Policy*, Appendix B.II.C. In those changes, meal reductions for the \$46 per diem rate for breakfast, lunch, and dinner were omitted. Section A-2.6 of the F-15, shown below, has been modified to include reduction rates for meals applicable to the \$46 per diem rate. These reduction rates are \$9 for breakfast, \$11 for lunch, and \$24 for dinner. In addition, effective 10-1-00, the meal reduction rates for international travel change to 15% for breakfast, 25% for lunch, and 40% for dinner. A new section D under Appendix B.II of Handbook F-12 has been added to include the meal reduction amounts. The addition to F-12 is shown at the end of this article. SDOs will receive three-quarters of their standard quantity for convertible self-adhesive booklets, rounded up to the nearest master carton size (4,000 booklets).

#### **Supply to Post Offices**

MNISSC will *not* use PS Form 3309, *Advice of Shipment/Stamps Invoice*, to automatically distribute these booklets to post offices. To obtain a supply, post offices must immediately submit PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, to their designated SDOs.

#### **Additional Supply**

For filling supplemental orders, the New York, Washington, Chicago, and San Francisco APDs will receive 4,200,000 additional booklets; the Memphis APD will receive 3,388,000 additional booklets; and the Denver APD will receive 1,136,000 additional booklets.

#### **Pictorial Cancellations Announcement**

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage (33 cents per envelope or 20 cents per postcard). Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for cancellation, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

#### Retrieval of Plastic Label Holders

Mail Transport Equipment has been notified that postal facility opening units (LDC 010) are not saving the plastic label holders used to close and address plastic sacks destinating at their locations. It has also been noted that the national inventory of plastic label holders has fallen *far* below the inventory levels of sacks on which they are used.

Plastic label holders are reusable — do not throw them away. They should also never be intentionally removed from the draw tapes of the sacks on which they are attached. After each plastic sack is emptied, the label must be removed from the label holder, and the sack/label holder combination must be prepared for return to the serving mail transport equipment service center.

Consolidate label holders found to be separated from their sacks for return to the mail transport equipment service center, along with the sacks. Contact your serving area mail transport equipment specialist for site-specific shipping information.

# **Equipment Maintenance Allowance Schedule for Rural Routes Rural Carriers**

In accordance with provisions of Article 9, Section 2.J.3 of the Rural Carrier National Agreement, effective October 7, 2000 (pay period 22-00), the equipment maintenance allowance (EMA) will decrease from 39.0 cents per mile to 38.5 cents per mile.

The EMA is now the greater amount of 38.5 cents per mile or a minimum of \$15.40 per day.

### Auxiliary Rural Carriers, Rural Carrier Reliefs, **Rural Carrier Associates, Rural Carrier Part-Time** Flexibles, and Auxiliary Assistance

Employees providing auxiliary assistance or serving auxiliary routes under provisions of Article 9, Section 2.J.5, receive an EMA of 38.5 cents per mile or \$4.45 per hour, whichever is greater, not to exceed the amount provided in the special equipment maintenance for the route stops and miles.

#### **EMA Rate Schedule**

The EMA rate schedule on pages 56-57 supersedes all previously published EMA schedules for employees receiving EMA.

#### **Optional EMA Rate**

The optional EMA rate, effective November 7, 1998, remains at \$0.55 cents per mile.

#### Cleaning Agreements and the Debarred, Suspended, Ineligible Lists

Before entering into a cleaning agreement using PS Form 7355, Cleaning Agreement, a postmaster must ensure that the individual under consideration to clean the post office is not on either the USPS List of Debarred, Suspended, and Ineligible Contractors or the GSA List of Parties Excluded From Federal Procurement and Non-procurement Programs.

Use one of the following methods to verify whether an individual is on these lists:

- Access the Postal Service Intranet (http://blue.usps. gov/purchase/purchase.htm) and click on the links to these lists.
- Call your purchasing and materials service center (PMSC) if you are unable to obtain the needed information via the Intranet.

Postage Meters

## **Meter Resetting Keys**

The success of the decertification program has significantly reduced the number of manually set meters that need to be reset at local post offices. This means that a smaller inventory of meter setting keys needs to be available at local post offices. However, we are continuing our exposure to revenue losses through the continuing loss or misplacement of meter setting keys. Postage Technology Management (PTM) is taking the following actions to track the distribution of meter keys and also control the inventory:

■ Postmasters may require new resetting keys when a key is lost or when a new office is opened that will have the responsibility to reset meters. However, they must not contact the meter manufacturers to obtain keys. Postmasters must request keys directly from the manager of Postage Technology Management (PTM) at Headquarters. Each request must be approved by the manager of PTM before the manufacturer will be allowed to issue the key to a postmaster.

Postmasters must request meter resetting keys using PS Form 4010, Request for Postage Meter Keys, included on page 59 of this Postal Bulletin. The form may be reproduced as needed. In addition to identifying information, the form requires the postmaster to indicate the reason each key is needed. A separate PS Form 4010 with detailed responses is required for each location needing keys.

Postmasters must take all necessary steps to ensure proper controls are in place to stop the continued loss of these keys.

## **Manually Set Electronic Meters**

Postal Bulletin 22020 (3-23-00) updated field activities on the status of new placements of manually set electronic postage meters, their resetting, and their eventual removal from the marketplace. Subsequently, a proposed retirement plan for these meters was published in the May 1, 2000, Federal Register for public review and comment.

The Postal Service has become aware of misinformation that has been disseminated by manufacturers regarding the retirement plan. These misleading communications to customers have been verbal as well as in the form of altered USPS correspondence. Customers are increasingly asking postal representatives for clarification on specific issues and the current status of the proposed retirement plan. The following information is provided for responding to customer inquiries:

- New placements of manually reset electronic meters were prohibited effective February 1, 2000. Existing customers can receive meters to replace defective meters, or when the customer moves from one licensing post office to another.
- The proposed plan is part of an overall long-term USPS strategy for secure postage evidencing. The proposal is to have customers remove manually set electronic meters from service when their current rental or lease expires, unless it expires in 2000. If a lease expires in 2000, the replacement deadline may be extended for up to one year from the 2000 expiration date. This extension should provide sufficient time for customers to obtain more modern, convenient, and secure replacement meters.
- The all-encompassing plan to remove all letterpress remote set postage meters will not be officially adopted until the public comments have been reviewed and any changes are made and approved by Postal Service management. Once the plan is finalized it will be printed in the Federal Register as a final rule. Subsequent notification will be made through the Postal Bulletin, Memo to Mailers, letters to customers, and other communication vehicles, as appropriate.

- Post offices will continue to set a customer's manually reset electronic meter until such time that the customer is notified that settings for that meter are to cease (when their lease expires). This is dependent upon the meter rental agreement expiration date as provided by the meter manufacturer.
- Each affected customer will be officially notified in writing directly by the Manager, Postage Technology Management.
- If the customer continues to present a manually set meter for resetting after it should have been replaced with a remote set meter, the affected district will be notified individually to refuse additional requests for resetting of that meter.
- Each manufacturer has been supplied with a letter prepared by Postage Technology Management that they may distribute to customers who may have received misleading information. The letter essentially provides the key information that is reiterated in this notice.
- Although customers are encouraged to explore digital meter technology, there is no mandatory requirement to convert to such meters at this time.
