United States Postal Service Policy on Diversity

Ongoing Political Campaign Mailings

Postal Service managers and employees: Please ensure that you successfully prepare, accept, document, process, and deliver those important mailings.

CORRECTION

Transportation of Live Animals

Please disregard the article titled "Notice: Transportation of Live Animals" in Postal Bulletin 22060 (10-4-01, pages 24–25). That article listed the incorrect AMC/AMF contact names and phone number for Los Angles, CA. The correct name and phone number appear in bold in the table shown on page 9.

In response to new Federal Aviation Administration restrictions, the Postal Service is required to adjust the service it provides for the transportation of live animals.

The Postal Service will continue to accept live animals that do not require delivery within a 72-hour period, such as earthworms, lizards, snails, crickets, grasshoppers, and bees, which can move on ground transportation.

In addition, the Postal Service will continue to accept live animals for which the postage is \$3.50 or less for shipment via air transportation.

The Postal Service will provide limited service for live animals for which the postage is more than \$3.50 and that require air transportation, such as day old poultry, adult poultry, and queen honeybees. This service will be available to and from the airports listed in the table below. The customer must present the mail to the applicable AMC/AMF no later than the cut-off time listed below (all times are local). Service will be available from Monday through Friday from the airports listed below.

Mail containing live animals for which the postage is more than \$3.50 should only be accepted at an AMC/AMF, or a retail unit or P&DC as authorized by the AMC/AMF manager. Employees accepting live animals that must be moved on air transportation must contact the appropriate AMC/AMF personnel to ensure that adequate space will be available and that the animals will reach their destination within the required time frame (see DMM C022.3.0). Mailers tendering live animals are also encouraged to contact the appropriate AMC/AMF personnel to facilitate the delivery of service. The list of AMC/AMF contacts in each city is listed below.

Electronic Option Confirmation Services — Acceptance and Delivery

Acceptance

Several versions of electronic option labels exist for Delivery Confirmation™ service and Signature Confirmation™ service items. The majority of electronic option mailings are entered at a business mail entry unit (BMEU). However, customers mailing electronic option Confirmation Services items may also bring them to the retail counter for mailing. Those items generally would include postage-affixed mailings.

Use the following instructions when handling electronic option Confirmation Services items that are entered as single-piece mailings at a retail counter.

- Look for an "e" indicator on the following electronic option Confirmation Services labels:
 - Label 314, Delivery Confirmation.
 - Label 315, Signature Confirmation.
 - Customer-printed labels.
- **Do not** scan these labels at the time of acceptance. (Electronic option Delivery Confirmation service and Signature Confirmation service fees are **not** programmed into POS ONE and Integrated Retail Terminals (IRTs) at this time.)
- Electronic option Confirmation Services items presented at the retail counter may have sufficient stamps, meter strips, or PC Postage[™] but the customer may need to purchase stamps or a postage validation imprinter (PVI) label to cover additional fees and/or postage.
- Collect the appropriate electronic option Delivery Confirmation service or Signature Confirmation service fees, as listed below:

Electronic Option Fees	Priority Mail® Service	Package Services
Delivery Confirmation service	No charge	\$0.12
Signature Confirmation service	\$1.25	\$1.25

Procedures for customers purchasing retail option Delivery Confirmation service (PS Form 152, *Delivery Confirmation*) and Signature Confirmation service (PS Form 153, *Signature Confirmation*) have not changed. Scan the Confirmation Services barcode and charge the appropriate retail fee.

If a customer presents PS Form 3152, *Confirmation Services Certification*, with a mailing, scan it with a handheld scanner (mobile data collection device).

Follow current procedures for acceptance of Confirmation Services presort and/or manifest imprint mailings at retail counters that process bulk mailings, at BMEUs, and at detached mail units (DMUs).


Delivery

When preparing Priority Mail "e" or "e/" label items for delivery, do not charge postage due for the Delivery Confirmation service fee, or return Priority Mail "e" label items to the sender marked "Postage Due" for payment of the Delivery Confirmation service fee. There is no Delivery Confirmation fee when the service is with Priority Mail service. Follow current scanning procedures when delivering the item.

Note: Electronic option items that contain a permit imprint do not require an "e" or "e/" on the label.

The table below outlines these conditions by APO/FPO ZIP Codes through the use of footnoted mailing restrictions codes, which appear on the page following the table.

Acceptance clerks should use this table with the Integrated Retail Terminal (IRT) or POS ONE terminal to

determine whether an APO/FPO ZIP Code is active and which conditions of mailing apply.

For Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) availability, all acceptance clerks must refer to the local hardcopy EMMS directory.

The complete table appears in the last *Postal Bulletin* of each month. Changes from the previous month's listing are in bold type.

- **A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.
- **B.** Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on non-dutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:
 - Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
 - All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
 - Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."
- **B1.** Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.
- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
 - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- **E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.
- **E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and hand-held transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.
- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

- **G.** Only First-Class letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail (A) are authorized.
- H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.
 - H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
- I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

 - J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.
- **K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
 - L. All official mail is prohibited.
 - M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
 - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail (A), and Standard Mail (B) (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

INFORMATION AND PROCEDURES

New International Reply Coupons, Item Number 330660

Effective January 1, 2002, a new version of the International Reply Coupon (IRC) will be available for sale to customers. The new version will have a printed expiration date. The price of the new IRC will be \$1.75 per coupon. All prior versions of U.S.-issued IRCs in inventories as of the close of business December 31, 2001, will be obsolete and will no longer be available for sale to customers.

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and stamp service centers (SSCs) will receive automatic distribution quantities of the new IRCs from the New York accountable paper depository (APD) by November 1, 2001.

Initial Supply to Post Offices

Post Offices must requisition initial quantities of the new IRCs, Item Number 330600, by submitting PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*, to their SDOs or SSCs after November 1, 2001.

Retail Units

Retail units must withdraw all obsolete IRCs from sales inventories and return them to the unit reserve at standard field accounting procedures (SFAP) units or the main stock at non-SFAP offices by the close of accounting period (AP) 5 ending January 25, 2002. Instructions for disposing of those obsolete IRCs from unit reserves/main stocks at Post Offices will be published in a future Postal Bulletin.

SDOs and SSCs

SDOs and SSCs must send all obsolete IRCs in inventory to the Eagan accounting service center (ASC) with the statement of account for AP 4, which ends on December 28, 2001. A memorandum, in duplicate, containing the following information must be included with the obsolete IRCs:

- Total number and value of obsolete U.S.-issued IRCs.
- Signatures of the employee and a witness verifying the count and dispatch.

The SDO supervisor must submit the obsolete IRCs with supporting documentation to the district accounting office (DAO). The DAO will record the amount of the obsolete IRCs to AIC 625, International Reply Coupons Exchanged, on the statement of account for AP 4.

The SSC manager must record the amount of the obsolete IRCs to AIC 625, International Reply Coupons Exchanged, on the statement of account for AP 4.

IMM REVISION

International Mail — Global Express Mail

Effective November 1, 2001, the *International Mail Manual* (IMM) is revised. Pursuant to its authority under 39 U.S.C. 407, the Postal Service will offer a 5 percent discount off of regular postage for all Global Express Mail ™ shipments paid through the shipping site at *www.usps.com*. The discount will apply only to the basic portion of Global Express Mail published rates. It will not apply to pick-up service charges, additional merchandise insurance coverage fees, or shipments made under an International Customized Mail agreement.

The Postal Service is proposing changes in conditions for certain mailing categories to automatically reduce every payment transaction by 5 percent for all Global Express Mail purchased at basic published prices and paid on the shipping site at www.usps.com. The discount will be deducted from each piece paid for through the Web site. The discount will be offered on postage only; it will not apply to pickup fees, any special fees, or postage for shipments made under an International Customized Mail agreement.

The Postal Service established the shipping site at www.usps.com to offer an online capability for customers to be able to prepare, ship, and pay for service shipments. Payment will be made using an online postage capability. Global Express Mail will be included in the services that are offered through this Web site. The discount is similar to the ones that are offered for Global Express Guaranteed shipments that are made through the same Web site and for Global Express Mail shipments that are paid for through an Express Mail corporate account.

As required under the Postal Reorganization Act, these changes will result in conditions of mailing that do not apportion the costs of the service, so the overall value of the service to users is fair and reasonable, and not unduly or unreasonably discriminatory or preferential.

We will incorporate these revisions into the printed version of IMM Issue 26 and the online version of the IMM, which can be accessed via Postal Explorer at http://pe.usps.gov.

222.132 Online Discounts

Global Express Mail published rates will be reduced by 5 percent for all payments made through the shipping site at www.usps.com. The discount applies only to the postage portion of Global Express Mail rates. It does not apply to the pickup service charge, additional merchandise insurance coverage fees, or shipments made under an International Customized Mail agreement.

ICM UPDATE

International Customized Mail

On April 30, 2001, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a qualifying mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 297.4, the Postal Service now makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. Term: May 1, 2001, through April 30, 2003.
- b. Type of mail: Global Express Mail Service (EMS) and Airmail Parcel Post (APP). Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for Qualifying Mail.
- c. Destination country: Japan.
- **d. Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to:
 - 1. Furnish Mailer with the equipment and supplies necessary for the use of Qualifying Mail.
 - 2. Furnish Mailer with tracking reports and delivery performance reports on a regular basis.
 - Provide Mailer with the preparation requirements for Qualifying Mail and any training necessary to prepare Qualifying Mail in conformity with Postal Service requirements.
 - Provide Mailer with technical assistance necessary to prepare the necessary information linkages, electronic data files, and data exchanges.
 - 5. Transport Qualifying Mail to international destinations for delivery by the appropriate authority.
- e. Minimum volume commitments: The Mailer has agreed to meet an annualized minimum volume of 5,000 packages for Qualifying Mail.
- f. Worksharing: The Mailer has agreed to:
 - Provide the Postal Service with notification of new permit numbers used for Qualifying Mail, one week in advance of using the new permit numbers.

- Provide the appropriate Postal Service acceptance sites a schedule of mailings, including the intended date of tender, weight, volume, and location where mail will originate, in accordance with instructions the Postal Service provides.
- Exchange electronic information with the Postal Service according to the specifications and instructions the Postal Service provides.
- Establish the necessary linkages with the Postal Service.
- g. Rates: The Mailer has agreed to pay postage and return service fees for Qualifying Mail according to the rate chart in Exhibit 1.

ICM UPDATE

International Customized Mail

On September 11, 2001, the Postal Service amended an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement dated November 16, 1999. The Agreement was published in *Postal Bulletin* 22014 (12-30-99, page 29). The Amendment modifies the Agreement to include new rates for International Priority Mail to Mexico. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 297.4, the Postal Service previously announced entering into an International Customized Mail Service Agreement with this qualifying mailer and now makes public the following information regarding this Amendment:

- **a. Term:** Other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.
- b. Type of mail: International Priority Mail.
- **c. Destination countries:** Other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.
- **d. Service provided by the Postal Service:** Other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.

- **e. Minimum volume commitments:** Other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.
- **f. Worksharing:** Other provisions of the Agreement shall remain in force.
- g. Rates: The Mailer will pay postage for all Qualifying Mail in accordance with Exhibit 1.

- **a. Term:** September 19, 2001, through September 30, 2002.
- **b. Type of mail:** *Global Express Mail* Service (EMS). Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for Qualifying Mail.
- c. Destination country: Japan.
- d. Service provided by the Postal Service: The Postal Service has agreed to:
 - 1. Furnish Mailer with the equipment and supplies required for the use of Qualifying Mail.
 - Provide Mailer with the preparation requirements for Qualifying Mail and any training to prepare Qualifying Mail in conformity with Postal Service requirements.
 - 3. Transport Qualifying Mail to international destinations for delivery by the appropriate authority.
 - 4. Return EMS items refused by an addressee and undeliverable items to the Mailer via Express Mail service at no charge provided that the return rate is no more than four (4) percent of total volume.

- e. Minimum volume commitments: The Mailer has agreed to meet an annualized volume of 50,000 packages or an annualized minimum of \$1,000,000 in international postage for Qualifying Mail.
- f. Worksharing: The Mailer has agreed to:
 - Pay postage to the Postal Service, either directly or through a mailing agent, for all Qualifying Mail by use of an Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA).
 - Present the mailings to the Postal Service designated location.
- g. Rates: The Mailer has agreed to pay postage at a rate of fourteen (14) percent off on nondiscounted published rate for Qualifying Mail.

The Postal Service will issue a 57-cent Love Letters (Item Number 565700) stamp in Washington, DC, on November 19, 2001, which will go on sale nationwide November 20, 2001. The stamp, designed by Lisa Catalone of Washington, DC, will be issued in a self-adhesive pane of 20; the pane may be split and the stamps may be sold individually.

The Love Letters stamp celebrates the art of letter writing and the centuries-old tradition of expressing love in letters, and it is intended for use on Valentine's Day correspondence, as well as on wedding invitations, announcements, and RSVPs. The stamp has the same design as the 55-cent Love Letters stamp issued in February 2001, with a change in denomination.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Postmark

Customers have 30 days to obtain the first day of issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office, by telephone at 1 800 STAMP-24, and at the Postal Store Web site at www.usps.com. The Postal Service will issue a 34-cent *United We Stand* definitive stamp on October 24, 2001, in Washington, DC. The stamp may be purchased via telephone at 1 800 STAMPS-24, through mail order from Stamp Fulfillment Services, and via the Postal Store Web site at *www.usps.gov.* It will also be on sale on October 24, 2001, in Post Offices only in the Washington, DC, metropolitan area and statewide in New York, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania, by order of Postmaster General John E. Potter. Designed by Terrence W. McCaffrey, U.S. Postal Service, **the stamp will go on sale nationwide November 5, 2001**. The stamp will be issued in a self-adhesive convertible booklet of 20 (Item Number 661200) and a self-adhesive coil of 100 (Item Number 779100).

Anticipating unprecedented demand, the Postal Service is intentionally holding off the nationwide sale date of this stamp until November 5 to allow sufficient time for initial shipments to reach most Post Offices. Production and distribution of the stamp will be ongoing to ensure replenished stock and continued sales throughout the next year.

Consequently, postmasters should not become alarmed if their initial shipments become depleted due to heavy customer demand, because new shipments will be arriving and reorders will be replenished. This stamp is expected to stay on sale until a new rate is implemented.

The United States flag is one of the most recognized symbols of freedom in the world. The *United We Stand* stamp features a stirring image of "Old Glory" with the words "United We Stand" across the bottom. The stamp is a fitting tribute to the invigorated patriotic spirit of our nation to unite together in purpose, pride, and determination following the tragic events on September 11, 2001.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Postmark

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps by telephone at 1 800 STAMP-24, via the Postal Store Web site at www.usps.gov, and via mail order through the Kansas City, Missouri, Stamp Fulfillment Center. They should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

This announcement will be updated every 2 to 3 months, as changes warrant.

How to Order First Day of Issue Cancellations and Covers

Customers may purchase new stamps or postal stationery items at their Post Office, from the *USA Philatelic* catalog, by calling 1 800 STAMP-24, or online at *www.usps.com* by clicking on *Buy Stamps & More.* Then they should prepare their own covers by affixing new stamps to the upper right corner of envelopes or postcards of their choice, and

address those envelopes, postcards, or postal stationery items to themselves or others. (Postage must equal the current First-Class Mail rate.) For sturdiness, include a card of postcard thickness in each cover (envelopes only) submitted, and tuck in the flap. Place the cover in a larger envelope addressed to: NAME OF ISSUE, POSTMASTER, CITY, STATE, and ZIP CODE (followed by -9991). Covers submitted for first day of issue cancellations may include additional uncancelled stamps only if the uncancelled stamps were issued before the first day of issue of the new stamps or postal stationery items. All orders must be postmarked on or before the deadline indicated below.

The U.S. Postal Service offers uncacheted first day covers for new stamp issues and postal stationery items post-marked with the official first day of issue cancellation. Each item has its own catalog number in *USA Philatelic*, issued quarterly. The new 28th edition of *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps*, Item Number 890100, is available for sale at all Post Offices, philatelic centers, and by mail, telephone, and internet order from Stamp Fulfillment Services.

To obtain the initial supply for your Post Office, immediately order Item Number 890100 from your designated stamp distribution office (SDO) using a separate PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition*.

All locations may place the new edition of the guide on sale as soon as initial quantities are received. You should promote the new edition of the guide during National Stamp Collecting Month in October.

The new 28th edition features over 30 additional pages, more than 100 new illustrations, hundreds of new listings and prices, plus new features and stamp-related facts. Priced at \$17.95, the 612-page guide includes lists of market-based values for all U.S. used and unused stamps and for many valuable stamp errors. In addition, the guide contains more than 2,000 full-color stamp illustrations; extensive lists of philatelic organizations, publications, and

resources; and a wealth of basic stamp collecting information. These features make it a valuable tool for beginning, intermediate, and advanced collectors, and it is still one of the best bargains in the hobby.

The printing contractor for the guide will ship the books (which are accountable items) in cartons of 20 to SDOs and Stamp Service Centers (SSCs). You must verify that you received the quantities of the guide recorded on the *Advice of Shipment*. Installations should report any discrepancies between the quantities shown on the *Advice of Shipment* and those actually received by using the procedure outlined in Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, sections 436 or 446, Handling Discrepancies in Stock Received.

Promotional copies of the guide *will not* be distributed. You can now display the guide in your Post Office by simply removing a copy from your inventory for promotional use. Follow the procedures outlined in Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, section 428.8, Obtaining Stock for Promotions or Presentations.

Offices must report all sales of Item Number 890100, 28th Edition, *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps,* in AIC 092, Philatelic Product Sales.

For the second year, in partnership with HarperCollins Publishers, this book as well as the 2001 Commemorative Stamp Yearbook will be available in bookstores and other retail outlets where books are purchased.

The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps, 27th Edition

As the 28th edition of *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps* becomes available, you must withhold all remaining copies of the 27th edition (Item Number 890000) from sale and take the following actions:

- Retail Outlets. Collect any copies of the 27th edition of the guide from stamp credits. Immediately return them to main stock using PS Form 17, Stamp Requisition. Post Offices. Consolidate all remaining copies of the 27th edition of the guide, if any, into the unit reserve stock. Prepare all 27th editions of the guide in accordance with procedures established for disposing of obsolete and redeemed stock, and submit according to local district quarterly stamp destruction or return schedules.
- Local Office Philatelic Programs. Submit PS Form 17 or PS Form 17-S, Stamp Distribution Network Stamp Requisition, to the local SDO and SSC for the number of 27th editions of the guide (Item Number 890000) needed for philatelic/promotional programs. You may give one or more copies to local schools, libraries, student groups, stamp clubs, retirement homes, and so on.

3. Stamp Distribution Offices. Stamp all copies of the guide used in promoting philatelic programs "NOT FOR RESALE." The SDO custodian of accountable paper must attest that each item is so stamped and prepare PS Form 3238, Stamps and Stamped Paper Destruction Certificate, endorsed "PHILATELIC PRODUCTS GIVEN TO PHILATELIC PROGRAMS." Program coordinators must acknowledge having received Item Number 890000 and be responsible for its control.

Note: The instructions for providing obsolete editions of the guide for philatelic and promotional purposes are an exception to general guidelines for destroying accountable items, especially regarding obsolete (withdrawn from sale) items. In this instance, it is Postal Service policy not to destroy copies of the previous year's edition of the guide when they can be used for valid promotional and/or educational purposes.

Disposing of Excess Guides

Dispose of all remaining copies of the 27th edition of *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps* (Item Number 890000) in accordance with Handbook F-1, section 450, Destroying Stamp Stock. Because disposition instructions are issued annually for past issues of the guide, **your Post Office should have only the 28th edition in inventory after you complete the above procedures**. If previous editions are on hand, dispose of them immediately, in accordance with Handbook F-1, section 450.

2001 Commemorative Stamp Yearbook

The 2001 Commemorative Stamp Yearbook, Item Number 990100, will soon be available for sale at all Post Offices, philatelic centers, and by mail, telephone, and internet order from Stamp Fulfillment Services.

The yearbook is a 64-page hardbound book that includes 76 commemorative stamps, with mounts, and sells for \$49.95. The beautifully illustrated book contains colorful pictures and text featuring celebrated subjects on stamps such as *Honoring Veterans, Diabetes, Baseballs Legendary Playing Fields, Lucille Ball, Peanuts, American Illustrators, Roy Wilkins,* and 17 other 2001 commemorative stamps. The 76 commemorative stamps have a combined postage value of \$31.25.

The yearbooks and stamp packets are being shipped to stamp distribution offices (SDOs) separately from different suppliers.

The printing contractor for the yearbook has already completed its shipments to SDOs. Shipments are in master cartons of 15 books.

The stamp packets will be banded in bundles of 15 and shipped to SDOs in master cartons of 150 packets. Partial cartons will be used for shipments not in multiples of 150.

Minnesota Diversified Industries (MDI) will ship the stamp packets to SDOs in two waves. Wave 1, consisting of one-half the SDO's designated quantity, is scheduled to begin shipment on October 17, and complete shipment on November 1, 2001. The remaining stamp packets will ship in Wave 2 beginning on November 2, and completing on November 16, 2001. All SDOs must verify receipt of the quantities of stamp packets, as recorded on their PS Form 3309, Advice of Shipment/Stamp Invoice, and verify the number actually received. SDOs should also verify that they have received equal quantities of books and stamp packets.

To obtain an initial supply of the 2001 Commemorative Stamp Yearbook, all Post Offices must submit a separate PS Form 17, Stamp Requisition, to their designated SDO. SDOs must not distribute the yearbook to Post Offices before October 18, 2001. All locations may place the yearbook on sale as soon as initial quantities are received.

Offices must report all sales of Item Number 990100, 2001 Commemorative Stamp Yearbook, in AIC 092, Philatelic Product Sales.

For the second year, in partnership with HarperCollins Publishers, the yearbook as well as the 28th edition of *The Postal Service Guide to U.S. Stamps* will be available in bookstores and other retail outlets where books are purchased.

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary post office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail postage. Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CAN-CELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for cancellation, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

The date of the following pictorial cancellation has been changed from October 12, 2001, to October 16, 2001:

Purchasing and Materials

PM. ASM. AND AS-709 REVISIONS

Purchasing Manual, Administrative Support Manual, and Handbook AS-709, Credit Card Policies and Procedures for Local Buying

Effective October 18, 2001, the Postal Service *Purchasing Manual* (PM), *Administrative Support Manual* (ASM), and Handbook AS-709, *Credit Card Policies and Procedures for Local Buying,* are revised to provide new or revised policies regarding contracts with former employees and the use of personal services contracts. A new solicitation provision and a new contract clause accompany these revisions.

We will incorporate these revisions into the next printed version of the ASM, as well as into the online versions of the PM, ASM, and AS-709 on the Policies and Procedures page on the Postal Service Intranet at https://blue.usps.gov/cpim and the Postal Service Internet at www.usps.com.

PM Revisions

In PM chapter 1:

- Retitled and revised section 1.7.13 to address contracts with former employees and to create a review and approval procedure for those contracts.
- Added Provision 1-7, Proposed Use of Former Employees, to Appendix A.
- Added Clause 1-14, Use of Former Postal Service Employees, to Appendix B.

In PM subchapter 4.6:

- Retitled and revised section 4.6.3 to discuss when contracting for professional/technical and consulting services is appropriate and to provide new definitions for these services.
- Retitled and revised section 4.6.4 to define and to discuss the uses for personal services contracts.

ASM Revisions

Revised subparagraph 722.31 to add professional/technical, consultant, personal services, and the services of former Postal Service employees to the list of purchases that may not be made using local buying procedures.

Handbook AS-709 Revisions

Revised paragraph 332.21 and Exhibit 3-4 in accordance with these policy changes.

The Postal Service contracts with former officers, executives, and employees when their expertise is deemed important to furthering the business and competitive interests of the Postal Service. Whether these individuals are the subject of personal services contracts, or are key personnel, experts, or consultants employed by a supplier, the following restrictions apply and these procedures must be followed.

1.7.13.b Contracts with Former Officers and Executives

1. Policy. It is Postal Service policy not to contract with former officers or Postal Career Executive Service (PCES) executives or entities with which such individuals have a substantial interest for five years after the date of their separation from the Postal Service (whether by retirement or otherwise) if the contract calls for substantially the same duties as they performed during their career with the Postal Service as determined by the vice president of Human Resources. Purchase teams must enforce this policy when purchasing professional/technical or consulting services (see 4.6.3 for definitions of these types of services), and include Provision 1-6, Prohibition Against Contracting with Former Postal Service Executives or Officers, in relevant solicitations, and Clause 1-11, Prohibition Against Contracting with Former Postal Service Officers or Executives, in resulting contracts.

2. Exceptions. The vice president of Human Resources may grant exceptions to this policy when he or she determines that doing so is in the best interest of the Postal Service. All such exceptions must be documented and included in the contract file.

1.7.13.c Contracts with Other Former Employees

1. Policy. The Postal Service may contract with former employees (other than former officers or executives) or with suppliers proposing the use of former employees during contract performance when the former employee's expertise will further the success of the purchase and the business and competitive interests of the Postal Service. Contracts with former employees or with suppliers offering the services of former employees should not be confused with the employment of annuitants (see 1.7.13.c.2).

2. Reviews and Approvals

- (a) All requests for contracts with former employees (non-officer or executive) must be forwarded by the purchasing organization to the manager of Corporate Personnel Management (CPM), for review and approval. The manager of CPM will decide whether the former employee should be hired as a retired annuitant (see *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* 323.33) or should be contracted with by the purchasing organization. When appropriate, the purchasing organization may award a personal services contract to the former employee (see 4.6.4).
- (b) When a supplier proposes using a former employee, the manager of CPM will review the former employee's employment history and advise the purchase team as to whether the substitution of another individual is in the best interest of the Postal Service. If such substitution is the case, the contracting officer must advise the supplier to propose another individual to perform the duties called for. If following contract award, the supplier proposes the use of a former employee, the same review and approval process is required before the former employee may begin
- 3. Provision and Clause. Purchase teams must consider this policy in light of the particular purchase, and the potential need for reviews and approvals, and as necessary, include Provision 1-7, Proposed Use of Former Postal Service Employees, in relevant solicitations, and Clause 1-14, Use of Former Postal Service Employees, in resulting contracts.

4 Purchasing

4.6 Special Categories of Purchases

[Revise the headings and text of 4.6.3 and 4.6.4 to read as follows:]

4.6.3 Professional/Technical and Consultant Services

- 4.6.3.a Policy. It is the policy of the Postal Service to contract for professional/technical and consultant services when doing so makes good business sense in light of available personnel resources. For example, short-term expertise may be necessary to assist in the development of new customer service programs or to manage spikes in operational workload. In other cases, long-term contracts for these services may prove more fiscally and technically beneficial than the use of employees. When contemplating contracting for these services, and for personal services (see 4.6.4), purchase teams must consider the financial commitment and potential return on investment. For certain requirements, such as those affecting craft positions and duties, additional reviews and approvals are required; these include meeting legal and labor agreement obligations set forth in Federal regulations and labor union agreements. In these cases, purchase teams must consult with Strategic Initiatives at Headquarters. In addition, reviews and approvals are required for contracts with former Postal Service officers, executives, and employees, regardless of whether these individuals are contracted with directly or are employed or proposed to be employed by a supplier (see 1.7.13).
- 4.6.3.b Conflicts of Interest. When purchasing professional/technical or consultant services, purchase teams must pay particular attention to the potential for organizational conflicts of interest and consider using Clause 1-8, Organizational Conflicts of Interest, or a similar clause in the contract (see 1.7.7).

4.6.3.c Professional and Technical Services

1. Definitions. Generally, professional services are those performed by individuals or firms of recognized status, in fields such as accounting, engineering, law, and the sciences. Technical services are provided by individuals or firms who are expert in a given field, such as information technology, training, writing and editing, purchasing, marketing and demographics,

- and other such areas. These services may be used to: (1) provide needed expertise on an individual or group basis; (2) to supplement the career workforce as required by workload; and (3) to provide turn-key services in support of postal operations.
- 2. Licenses. When prequalifying or purchasing professional services for which individuals are normally required to be licensed (such as medical, legal, accounting, and architecture), licenses must be required as a prerequisite to prequalification or contract award. Acceptable licenses may be limited to those issued by a particular state or entity, but only when local expertise is necessary to successful performance.
- Required Clauses. All contracts for professional/ technical services must include the following clauses:
 - (a) Clause 4-4, Nondisclosure (Professional Services). This clause may be modified with the approval of the policy-originating official designated in Exhibit 4.6.2 and assigned counsel.
 - (b) Clause 4-5, Inspection of Professional Services. This clause provides for inspection of the supplier's work product and acceptance of only those products that meet reasonable professional standards. The clause is to be used in lieu of, and not in addition to, the standard inspection and acceptance clauses prescribed in 2.2.
 - (c) Clause 4-7, Records Ownership. This clause gives the Postal Service ownership of contract files, including copies of all supplier work papers. While this clause is mandatory for professional service contracts, purchase teams have to decide whether to include it or not in technical service contracts, depending on the nature of the service.
- **4. Other Clauses.** Depending on the particular purchase, the following clauses should be included in contracts for professional/technical services:
 - (a) Clause 4-6, Invoices (Professional Services). This clause is included in all non-fixed price contracts for professional/technical services. The clause requires presentation of invoices showing who performed the services, the hours and partial hours of service provided each day, and the services provided each hour or partial hour. Suppliers may be allowed to set minimum charges for partial hours or days.
 - (b) Clause 4-8, Key Personnel. This clause requires use of the key personnel identified in the supplier's proposal, unless the purchase team approves substitution, and provides for contract termination for failure to comply.

4.6.3.d Consultant Services

- 1. Definition. Consultant services are services provided by expert individuals or firms possessing exceptional qualifications in a particular technical or professional field. They are used to enhance the understanding of complex issues and to provide new insights into alternate solutions to, or recommendations on, business or decision-making functions of a postal organization. Consultants neither involve themselves in the day-to-day operations of Postal Service organizations except for study purposes, nor work under the immediate direction and control of Postal Service employees. Usually, consultant service suppliers provide reports or analyses as the deliverable upon completion of their contractual duties.
- 2. Use. Consultant services are used to enhance the understanding of complex issues and to provide new insights into alternate solutions to, or recommendations on, business or decision-making functions of a postal organization.

4.6.4 Personal Services Contracts

- 4.6.4.a Definition. A personal services contract is a contract with an individual under the terms of which the individual will: (1) work under the direct supervision of postal personnel; (2) work on postal premises and use postal equipment; and (3) perform duties similar in nature to those of postal employees. A personal services contract may create the appearance of an employee—employer relationship, and may result in additional costs, such as tax withholding. For this reason, purchase teams should strive to use contracting vehicles other than personal services contracts, but, when deemed appropriate and effective, they may be used, subject to the reviews and approvals described in 1.7.13.
- **4.6.4.b Use.** Personal services contracts may be awarded for professional/technical services but may not be awarded for consultant services.
- 4.6.4.c Contracts. All personal services contracts should be written to ensure that the Postal Service does not incur unnecessary costs or liabilities. Purchase teams should work with assigned counsel to ensure that the interests of the Postal Service are protected in areas such as taxes, unemployment liability, etc.

Postal Products Unlimited, Inc., Catalog Now on eBuy

On August 31, 2001, Postal Products Unlimited, Inc.'s full-line supply and equipment catalog was converted to eBuy (see *Postal Bulletin* 22057, 8-23-01, page 102, for the introductory eBuy article). Postal Products Unlimited has supplied its Postal Service—specific products for over 15 years, and those products can now all be purchased using the Postal Service Intranet.

National Ordering Agreement

All of the supplies and equipment offered on eBuy are included in National Ordering Agreement (NOA) 412735-97-H-1512. When using eBuy, remember that Administrative Support Manual (ASM) 722, Local Buying Authority, does not apply to orders placed under contracts or ordering agreements that are listed on eBuy (http://ebuy.usps.gov).

Credit Card Payments

Effective November 1, Postal Products Unlimited will no longer accept credit cards as a form of payment for items in its eBuy catalog. eBuy will certify Postal Products Unlimited electronic invoices and send them to San Mateo accounts payable for processing. Typically, San Mateo accounts payable holds payment of invoices for approximately 28 days before sending the electronic funds transfer to Postal Products Unlimited as payment. Postal Products Unlimited charges will appear on the eBuy accounting period (AP) summary invoice report that is mailed to the "ship to" Federal Standard Requisitioning and Issue Procedures (FED-STRIP) address for reconciliation.

Postal Service to Receive Rebate

The Postal Service will save money on the purchase price of every line item ordered from Postal Products Unlimited. For example, the Postal Service will receive deep discounts on all eBuy orders, regardless of quantity, with savings up to 70 percent off the catalog unit price. Additionally, the Postal Service receives a periodic rebate from Postal Products Unlimited based on the total nationwide value of Postal Products Unlimited orders placed through eBuy.

eBuy Required

Employees having access to the Postal Service Intranet *must* use eBuy whenever the supply or service is listed on eBuy. The only exception to this requirement is for users who do not have access to the Postal Service Intranet. Those individuals without this access may continue to place telephone orders with suppliers using their FEDSTRIP number. When placing telephone orders with

Postal Products Unlimited, users must have both product number(s) and their FEDSTRIP number ready. The finance number associated with each user's FEDSTRIP number will be charged for items ordered via telephone.

Shipping

All items will be shipped by Standard Mail from Postal Products Unlimited. For items too large to ship via the mail-stream, a Government Bill of Lading (GBL) will be issued. Postal Products Unlimited has been authorized to use the Postal Service Web-based Freight Traffic Management System (FTMS) to prepare all GBLs.

Orders for in-stock, high-usage items will ship within 24 to 48 hours, and orders shipping directly from off-site distribution centers will ship within 5 to 7 business days. The lead time for custom and/or made-to-order items will vary. Please refer to the catalog or call Postal Products Unlimited Customer Service Department at 1-800-229-4500 for more specific product lead times.

Returns

To return an item, please contact the Postal Products Unlimited Customer Service Department and request a Return Authorization (RA) Number and specific return instructions. Postal Products Unlimited will submit an electronic credit request to eBuy, and the original order will be credited.

Javits-Wagner-O'Day

Postal Products Unlimited has been an approved Javits-Wagner-O'Day (JWOD) Act distributor since 1999 and has included JWOD manufactured items (excluding office supplies) in its eBuy catalog.

Retail

ALL IRT AND DEBIT/CREDIT CARD OFFICES

Setting Clocks for Standard Time

Managers must ensure that before opening for business on Monday, October 29, 2001, the clocks in all integrated retail terminals (IRTs) and debit/credit card terminals under their control are set *back* (in most locations) 1 hour to reflect the change to Standard Time. Facilities with Saturday night operations should reset the time as soon as possible after the 2 a.m. start time, Sunday, October 28, 2001.

The correct system time in integrated retail terminals (IRTs) is critical since their internal clocks are used to verify Express Mail[®] and Global Express Guaranteed ™ acceptance times and service commitments. The IRT system time is also printed on customer receipts and employee reports. It is very important that the debit/credit card terminal clocks be set to the correct day, date, and time as this will help reduce the possibility of accepting an expired card.

Integrated Retail Terminals (IRTs)

On the UNISYS III Supervisor Disk, select item 11, Set System Date and Time, from the Control Menu, and perform the following steps:

- 1. Observe that the date appears.
- 2. Press ENTER key to accept the current date. The time appears.
- 3. Press CE key to clear the time.
- 4. Enter correct Standard Time in military format (examples: 8 AM = 0800, 1:30 PM = 1330).
- 5. Press ENTER key to save the corrected time. The Control Menu appears.
- Observe that the corrected time is displayed in the upper right hand corner of the screen.

On the MOS IRT Control Disk, select item 5, Change Fees and Tables, from the Main Menu; then select item 5, Set Unit Date and Time, from the Change Fees and Tables Menu.

Debit and Credit Card Terminals

For Debit and Credit Card Terminals, follow these steps:

The time for the RCU/VAX will be updated automatically by the Raleigh Information Systems FSCS VAX Support Group. However, all RCU operators should validate the correct time and date when they log on to the RCU on Monday, October 29, 2001, and notify Raleigh if the time and date are incorrect.

Mobile Data Collection Devices (MDCDs)

The Delivery Confirmation handheld scanners will automatically change to Standard Time. No manual changes are necessary.

IBM and NCR POS ONE Terminals

The IBM and NCR POS ONE terminals will automatically change to Standard Time. No manual changes are necessary.


