

Year of Firsts: 2003 Stamp lineup promises something for everyone

The 2003 Commemorative Stamp lineup promises to be an exciting one. Appropriately dubbed "Year of Firsts," the program boasts 23 colorful new designs that highlight history-making events in geography, cosmology, literature, filmmaking, sports, music, aviation, maritime, amphibians and birds.

- There's something for every USPS customer, mailer and stamp collector. From the Lunar New Year: Year of the Ram, to the American treasure Old Glory; from the Wright Brothers' First Flight to the Korean War Veterans Memorial and from the legal dexterity of Thurgood Marshall to the on-screen artistry of Audrey Hepburn.
- And since the Postal Service and the holidays go hand in hand (or is it stamp in hand?), USPS expects to deliver 20 billion cards, letters and packages this season. That's a lot of stamped holiday cheer.
- To handle the large holiday volumes, USPS has printed 2.85 billion holiday stamps, including *Hanuk-kah*, *Kwanzaa*, *Eid* and *Madonna and Child*. Stamps are available almost everywhere, including the nation's 38,000 Post Offices, and 60,000 drug stores and supermarkets.
- These locations are identified by a "Buy Stamps Here" decal. Stamps also can be purchased at 17,000 ATMs, 800-STAMP-24 and *The Postal Store* at www.usps.com.

Preventive medicine: USPS is offering potassium pills to all employees

The Postal Service is continuing to develop and update its emergency management plans to ensure, as much as possible, the health and safety of employees.

- USPS is taking a proactive approach to the possibility of a radiation emergency by offering employees potassium iodide tablets. Participation is voluntary and each employee will be offered two pills.
- The approach came about after a recommendation from the Postal Service's Mail Security Task Force. The Task Force, formed after 9/11 and the anthrax mailings, consists of representatives from Postal Service unions and management associations, and USPS management.
- Earlier this year, the Nuclear Regulatory Commission revised a section of its emergency preparedness regulations requiring that states having people within a

- specific radius of a nuclear reactor consider using potassium iodide as a protective measure to supplement evacuation and sheltering in a radiation emergency.
- Employee stand-up talks began in early November and will continue until all 750,000 employees have received the information they need to make an educated decision about whether to take the tablets in the event of a radiation emergency.
- Employees who want to participate will sign a form, and the pills will be held at their work location. Distribution will be made only if notification of a radiation emergency is received from government officials.

Holiday mail: Celebrating the joy

USPS's newest television ad campaign now airing celebrates the joy of sending and receiving mail.

- "Home" features a young mother sending photos of her son via Priority Mail service to her husband in the military who won't be home for the holidays.
- "Jingle" features a woman meeting her carrier at the door and handing over a stack of holiday cards. In return, the carrier delivers cards from her family and friends.
- "Winter Wonderland" features a grandmother packing holiday gifts to her grandson at a cold-weather Post Office. When the boy opens the gift at his warmweather home, he tosses up the white packing "peanuts," making it snow.

"Suite" solution: *PostalOne!* makes it easier for mailers to do business with USPS

Think of it as "info central." *PostalOne!* provides an electronic link between USPS and its business mailers, allowing an exchange of information that benefits everyone involved with this type of mail.

- PostalOne! is a new workflow management tool for the mailing industry. Although development will continue over the next three years, the basic electronic link with USPS is already developed and being used by mailers to automate and streamline many of the manual and hardcopy documentation processes used in the business mail production cycle.
- The new system links the customer's mailing information with the Postal Service's acceptance, verification and payment systems.

- "The basic principle of PostalOne! is simple we want to make it easier for business mailers to do business with us," says Larry Goodman, manager of Business Customer Support Systems.
- The fundamental design will provide customers a one-stop shopping experience for payment and other mailing information by offering them an electronic suite of services that dramatically impacts the mailing process.
- Nationwide deployment of PostalOne! will be completed by May 2005. Dozens of current users include many of the nation's largest business mailers. For more information about PostalOne!, visit www.uspspostalone.com.

Open late: Post offices extend hours to weather blizzard of mail

Many Post Offices will stay open late and on Sundays to handle the blizzard of mail this holiday season. Customers are expected to mail 20 billion cards, letters and packages.

- Even though this year's holiday shopping window between Thanksgiving and Christmas is six days shorter than last year, Chief Operating Officer Pat Donahoe said this year's volume is expected to remain about the same.
- The year's busiest mailing day is projected to be Monday, Dec. 16, with 850 million of pieces of mail entering the system. Two days later, Wednesday, Dec. 18, will be the busiest delivery day.
- During the two weeks prior to Christmas, the National and Area Operations Center network operates around the clock. The network shares information on operations and mail flow between mail processing and distribution centers and with major mailing customers.
- To move mail by air, USPS uses FedEx's air cargo network, along with 15,000 commercial passenger flights daily. USPS also moves the mail by rail and road, using more than 6,000 trucking firms, in addition to our own fleet the nation's largest of 210,000 vehicles.

In a gift-giving mood? Know the ethics rules

'Tis the season to be jolly . . . and ethical. During the holidays, employees may be offered gifts from fellow employees, customers, vendors and other people outside USPS.

- Unless an exception applies, employees can't accept gifts from those outside USPS. And there are limits on permissible gift-giving between employees, too, especially those in reporting relationships.
- To make sure you don't accept something you shouldn't (or decline something you could keep!), check out the Law Department's intranet site at http://blue.usps.gov/uspslaw.

Sales success: Expertise boosts customer response rates

Customer service means going the extra distance. That's what a Southeast Area Sales team did when it worked with the Life Extension Foundation (LEF). Result: the customer created more effective mailings and USPS generated additional revenue.

- LEF is the world's largest organization dedicated to the science of preventing and treating disease and aging. While seeking ways to prolong life, the foundation often uncovered potential therapies to treat degenerative diseases of aging. LEF used direct mail to promote its products, but its mailings received extremely low response rates.
- A USPS sales team came to the rescue. Southeast Area Account Manager Sharon Schmaus and Sales Specialist Ray Floyd introduced LEF to direct marketing vendors, brainstormed with the company's marketing staff and management, and discussed its mailing lists, offers, direct mail copy and creative approaches. The USPS team came up with its own proposals and suggestions.
- As a result, the first of many test mailings began in June. Response rates have risen significantly, with the percentage increase depending on the different test strategies.
- For USPS, the projected new revenue is \$3.5 million, including about \$3 million in First-Class Mail service and more than \$500,000 in Standard Mail service. With the right strategies in place, the customer saw the real value of direct mail. Chalk up another win for sell, sell, sell!

Public Affairs and Communications Vice President Azeezaly Jaffer continues to set the record straight regarding media misperceptions about USPS payments into the Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS).

- Responding to a misleading editorial in the Binghamton (NY) Press, Jaffer writes, "The Office of Personnel Management had never conducted a breakout of the amount the Postal Service had paid into the CSRS fund by itself.
- When this was done, it was found that USPS's unfunded amount was closer to \$5 billion instead of the \$32 billion that had been estimated."

Confused about addressing? Wondering about money orders? A new publication is available in Post Offices to answer common questions about postal services. A Customer's Guide to Mailing (DMM 100) is based on the ways that people use the mail, and focuses on the key decisions customers make in doing business with us. It is the first installment in a complete redesign of the Domestic Mail Manual (DMM).

Using charts, illustrations, tips, and real-life examples to explain our products and services, *A Customer's Guide to Mailing* clarifies alternatives for different mailing situations. Customers who order stamps or other merchandise from the online Postal Store will receive a free copy with their order.

Our Postal Service employees and customers completed a survey conducted by the Gallup Organization. Of the over 10,000 respondents, 82 percent thought the new

guide contained just the right amount of information and 95 percent thought it was "somewhat helpful" or "very helpful" in choosing a service for mailing.

We encourage everyone to get a copy and keep it handy. It contains information you need every time you mail, plus special tips like how to pack a parcel so the contents don't break. It can help you choose a service for mailing, calculate postage, and address your mail correctly. Be sure to have one on hand before you begin mailing your holiday gifts and packages.

— Mail Preparation and Standards, Pricing and Classification, 12-12-02 U.S. ARMED FORCES/REMINDER

"Any Service Member" Mail — Prohibited

This is a reminder that the "Any Service Member" program was suspended indefinitely by the Department of Defense since October 2001. Therefore, retail associates must not accept mail that is presented at the retail counter and addressed to "Any Service Member" in lieu of the addressee by name. Inform mailers that such mail is prohibited and that the Department of Defense cancelled the Any Service Member program because of the concerns and risk of mail being introduced into the military mail system from sources unknown to the recipients.

While the Postal Service and the Department of Defense recognize the interest in supporting active members of the armed services during the holiday period, any efforts to organize mailing should be discontinued.

Furthermore, addressing of mail to the men and women of the armed forces in foreign locations (APO/FPO) must comply with the *Domestic Mail Manual*, Section A010, Subsection 6.1, Overseas Address. The delivery line (i.e., the second line from the bottom in the address) must show one of the following: ship name, unit number, CMR or PSC number, and box number if assigned. The last line must

contain the APO and FPO designation and the appropriate two-letter "state" abbreviation (AA, AE, or AP), followed by the 5-digit ZIP Code or ZIP + 4. In addition, addresses must include the name of the addressee as follows:

- Mail addressed to Army personnel must show grade; full name, including first name and middle name or initial; and unit number.
- b. Mail addressed to Air Force personnel must show grade; full name, including first name and middle name or initial; and PSC or unit number.
- c. Mail addressed to Navy and Marine Corps personnel must show rank or rating; full name, including first name and middle name or initial; and PSC number for shore-based units, or ship name.
- d. Mail sent to dependents residing in overseas areas must be addressed in care of the sponsor.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured

- A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.
- A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.
- **B.** PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:
 - Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
 - All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
 - Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."
- **B1.** PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.
- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
 - **C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.
- **E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM C024.2.0 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.
- **G.** Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.
- **H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.
 - **H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
- $\mbox{\bf I.}$ Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

 - J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.
- **K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
 - L. All official mail is prohibited.
 - M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
 - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- ${\bf R.}\,$ All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.
- R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
- **T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
- **U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."
- **U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.
- $\mbox{\bf U2.}$ Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.
- **U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
 - V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.
- W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Clear Access to Mailbox Avoids Delays

Dec. 5

The Postal Service delivers six days a week to 138 million homes and businesses. "However, unsafe conditions such as unshoveled snow, icy sidewalks, or even snow plowed against mailboxes can slow or delay delivery," said Vice President, Delivery and Retail, Henry Pankey.

Postal Service letter carriers are instructed to refrain from delivering to locations they deem hazardous, and the Postal Service is reminding customers to keep access to the mailbox clear.

"Our carriers are already battling freezing temperatures, arctic wind-chills, and deep snow drifts in many parts of the nation," he explained. "We urge customers to do the right thing, not just for our letter carriers, but for everyone."

Pankey said customers who receive door delivery should make sure their sidewalks and steps are clear. Customers receiving curbside delivery should pay special attention to keeping mailboxes clear of snow piles left by snow plows.

Many Post Offices Offer Expanded Hours

Dec. 2

Many Post Offices will stay open late and on Sundays to handle the blizzard of mail this holiday season. Postal Service customers are expected to mail 20 billion cards, letters and packages.

Even though this year's holiday shopping window between Thanksgiving and Christmas is six days shorter than last year, Chief Operating Officer Pat Donahoe said this year's volume is expected to remain about the same.

The year's busiest mailing day is projected to be Monday, Dec. 16, with 850 million pieces of mail entering the system. Two days later, Wednesday, Dec. 18, will be the busiest delivery day.

To move mail by air, USPS uses FedEx's air cargo network, along with 15,000 commercial passenger flights daily. USPS also moves the mail by rail and road, using more than 6,000 trucking firms, in addition to our own fleet — the nation's largest — of 210,000 vehicles.

'Tis the Season to Be Careful

Nov. 25

The holidays are often a time of increased charitable giving. And just as Santa returns at this time each year, so do some unwelcome people such as swindlers and con artists.

"Swindlers know that people tend to be in a more giving mood during the holidays," said Chief Postal Inspector Lee Heath. "So among the solicitations you receive this year from legitimate charities, expect to find some that are misrepresentations, or outright fraud."

To guard against falling prey to a phony charity, Heath offered this advice: If you are unfamiliar with the charity asking for donations, request its annual report and financial statement. Check out unfamiliar organizations by contacting the Better Business Bureau. Make checks payable to an organization, not an individual. Be suspicious about requests for assistance that accept cash donations only.

311.1 Redemption of Foreign Coins

Retail units redeem foreign coins as follows:

1> Deposit foreign coins no more than twice a year: at the end of Accounting Period (AP) 5 and/or the end of AP 11, whenever \$50 or more is accumulated. Include foreign coins in the regular bank deposit.

- 2> At the time of deposit, prepare foreign coins by both country and denomination amount accepted. Separate the coins in different packs by denomination and country.
- 3> Record the amount of foreign coins deposited on the bank deposit slip.

The relationship bank may accept the full or partial value of the foreign coins deposited. If the relationship bank accepts partial value of the foreign coins, the bank debits the Postal Service bank account for the difference. The difference amount debited is recognized as a bank discrepancy shortage, which will be processed as follows:

Standard Field Accounting Procedures (SFAP) Offices

- The district Finance office (DFO) creates a suspense amount, as bank discrepancy shortage, in the Standard Field Accounting System for the Post Office.
- The DFO resolves the suspense amount either by using the tolerance guidelines or by processing a claim for loss with the Post Office finance number.

Standard Accounting for Retail (SAFR) Offices

■ Shared Services/Accounting (SS/A) records the amount as an adjustment into AIC 647, Financial Differences — Shortage, debiting the Post Office expense account by finance number and unit ID.

EZ Pass and Toll Collection Payment Process

Effective Accounting Period 4 in fiscal year 2003, the district Finance office will no longer process payment of billing statements for EZ Pass badges and stickers or toll collections for official use vehicles for offices that have migrated to Shared Services/Accounting. The guardian of the official use vehicle will be responsible for the billing statement for automated toll collection. District Administrative Services will manage accounts for maintenance and administrative vehicles. Transportation Networks will manage accounts for mail delivery/pick-up vehicles. Transportation Network and Administrative Services managers (or their respective designees) will be responsible for analyzing the benefits of using the automated toll collection system in their jurisdiction.

When deemed beneficial, Administrative Services and Transportation Network managers will do the following:

- Open an advance deposit account with the local state or city transportation commission for EZ Pass, no greater than an estimated quarterly use.
- Review account balances every quarter to determine if the quarterly use estimate should be adjusted.
- Maintain a control of the account numbers assigned to the badges and stickers with the identified vehicle.

- Secure unused badges and stickers to prevent unauthorized use.
- Review monthly statements for verification of authorized usage.
- Ensure that payments to the account are paid by one of the following means:
 - International Merchant Purchase Authorization
 Card (I.M.P.A.C.) credit card (preferred method).
 - Standard Field Accounting Procedure offices submit the invoice to the district Finance office for payment through the Accounts Payable Accounting and Reporting System.
 - Standard Accounting for Retail offices submit completed PS Form 8230-X, Authorization for Payment, to Shared Services/Accounting for payment at the following address:

Christmas Pay Procedures for Rural Carriers

The article "Christmas Pay Procedures for Rural Carriers" in *Postal Bulletin* 22089 (11-14-02, pages 72–88), incorrectly stated on page 73 the time period for which auxiliary route carriers are compensated at the hourly rate. The corrected information appears in bold below.

Auxiliary Route Carriers

Carriers serving any auxiliary route are compensated at the hourly rate for actual hours worked during Week 2 of PP 26-02 and both weeks of PP 01-03. During this period, carriers are not paid the evaluation of the route. Overtime is paid only when the carrier exceeds 40 hours for the week.

2002 IRS Tax Packages

On December 26, 2002, contract mailers for the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) will begin mailing 71 million tax-related items for tax year 2002. The total includes 40 million individual tax packages and 31 million promotional pamphlets. All mailpieces will likely be entered into the mail stream by mid-January 2003. Tax packages for Alaska, Hawaii, and Puerto Rico will be air shipped. Postage will be paid with IRS permit imprint number G-48.

Acceptance Offices

Contract mailers for the IRS will prepare tax packages for mailing at the Standard Mail Enhanced Carrier Route rates.

Acceptance office employees must verify that mailings meet all preparation and mark-up requirements in the *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM). Acceptance office employees must verify that tax package mailings are prepared according to the presort requirements for Enhanced Carrier Route Standard Mail.

Mailing agents will deliver the mail to plants according to scheduled appointment dates recorded in the Drop Shipment Appointment System (DSAS). The mailings will be accompanied by PS Form 8125, *Plant-Verified Drop Shipment (PVDS) Verification and Clearance*. The plant is to verify trailer contents with mailer information recorded on PS Form 8125. The acceptance office must weigh and verify mailings unless the Rates and Classification Service Center (RCSC) serving the Post Office of mailing authorizes an optional procedure for that contract mailer. Supporting paperwork for the optional procedure must be provided at the time of mailing. That verification ensures that the rates and piece counts reported on the postage statements are accurate and that the IRS has paid the correct postage.

Destination Offices

Crossdock Pallets — Bulk Mail Centers (BMCs) and Processing & Distribution Centers (P&DCs) will receive pallets labeled to 5-digit, 3-digit, and sectional center facility (SCF) destinations. Keep those pallets intact and dispatch them to the appropriate destination.

BMC Working Pallets — Upon receipt of working pallets, Operations employees will break open the pallets for distribution of the contents. The destination for each package, sack, or tray is on the label. Dispatch to the destination facilities for distribution to the delivery units.

Delivery

Deliver tax packages upon receipt.

Errors and Irregularities

Delivery office personnel should be alert to errors in makeup. When carrier route presort errors exceed the 5 percent allowance, deliver the mail and use established reporting procedures to report errors to the following address:

Undeliverable Tax Packages

Carriers and markup clerks must pay particular attention to Packages 1040 and 1040A-2 with ancillary service endorsements. Those two packages are the *only* ones eligible for forwarding or return services. Send such pieces, if undeliverable as addressed, to the CFS unit (normal procedure), where they will be handled as specified in DMM F010.5.0 and DMM Exhibit F010.5.3.

The CFS Unit will return those packages to the IRS at the return address printed on the package.

Treat all other undeliverable forms as waste and do not place them in Postal Service lobbies for any reason.

Form W-4 Completion for Calendar Year 2003

Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations permit employees who anticipate no federal tax liability for 2003 to continue to claim total exemption from federal tax withholding provided they owed no federal taxes for 2002. These regulations also require that a new Form W-4, *Employee's Withholding Allowance Certificate*, be submitted every calendar year. Because of *PostalEase*, employees no longer need to file a hard copy Form W-4.

IRS filing requirements concerning Form W-4s are met by calling the *PostalEase* toll-free number at 877-477-3273. Follow the Form W-4 instructions provided by *PostalEase*, and your form will be updated for calendar year 2003.

Any employee currently in an exempt status who does not use *PostalEase* to submit a new Form W-4 to claim a continuation of his or her exempt status will be converted to a taxable status, effective Pay Period (PP) 05-03. For exempt information on a Form W-4 to remain effective into the next year, the IRS requires completion, submission, and acceptance of the form no later than February 15, 2003. Since February 15 falls within PP 05, the new information

on the Form W-4s must be entered into *PostalEase* by no later than Friday, February 7, 2003. Any employee who claimed exempt status for 2002 who does not update in *PostalEase* will have federal taxes withheld at the rate that would normally be applicable to a single employee with no dependent allowances. Employees with a current exempt status (as of PP 26-02) will receive printed messages on their earnings statement during PP 02-03 and 03-03 reminding them that a new Form W-4 is required.

Reminder: Personnel Offices should not provide tax advice to employees about completing Form W-4s. Additionally, since all employees must now use *PostalEase* to update their Form W-4s, effective December 12, 2002, personnel offices will no longer send certain hard copies of the forms to the Eagan Accounting Service Center. The IRS will be notified electronically of all employees who claim more than 10 withholding allowances and/or total exemption from withholding.

- **a. Term:** November 19, 2002, through November 18, 2003.
- b. Type of mail: Global Express Mail™ (EMS). Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for EMS.
- c. Destination countries: Worldwide.
- d. Service provided by the Postal Service: The Postal Service has agreed to transport EMS to international destinations for delivery by the appropriate authorities.
- e. Minimum volume commitments: The Mailer has agreed to meet an annualized minimum commitment of 600 pieces of EMS or \$12,000 in postage for EMS.

- f. Worksharing: The Mailer has agreed to:
 - Comply with the terms and conditions for mailing EMS as set forth in the IMM.
 - Pay postage for EMS by means of a dedicated Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA) in accordance with the EMCA requirements set forth in the Domestic Mail Manual (DMM).
- g. Rates: The Mailer has agreed to pay postage at a rate discounted at eight (8) percent off nondiscounted published rates in effect on the date of mailing in accordance with Exhibit 1.







The Postal Service will issue a 37-cent *Thurgood Marshall* commemorative stamp (Item 453800) in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 on January 7, 2003, in Washington, DC. The stamp, designed by Richard Sheaff, Scottsdale, Arizona, and photographed by the late Abdon Daoud Ackad, Sr., Bethesda, Maryland, goes on sale nationwide January 8, 2003.

This 26th stamp in the *Black Heritage* series commemorates Thurgood Marshall, who was a civil rights lawyer for many years before becoming the first African American to serve as solicitor general of the United States. In 1967, Marshall was sworn in as the first African American of the U.S. Supreme Court and continued in that capacity until he retired in January 1993. On November 30, 1993, our country's highest civilian honor, the Presidential Medal of Freedom, was awarded to Thurgood Marshall.

Also, the cost for a stamped envelope is the value of the postage plus 8 cents, and the cost for a stamped card is the value of the postage plus 2 cents.

2003 Requisition Schedule — Postage Stamps and Stamped Cards

All Stamp Distribution Offices (SDOs) and authorized CAG A–G Post Offices that order postage stamps and stamped cards should refer to the 2002 Requisition Schedule appearing with this article.

When you order postage stamps from the Bureau of Engraving and Printing (BEP), submit PS Form 3356, Stamp Requisition — Bulk Quantities (note: Use PS Form 3356 to order only those postage stamps manufactured by the BEP). When you order stamped cards from the Government Printing Office (GPO), submit PS Form 3216, Requisition for Postal Cards — Bulk Quantities.

Until further notice, do not mail your stamp or post card requisitions to BEP or GPO, but follow the procedures as outlined below:

- Complete a PS Form 3356 (for stamps from BEP), or a PS Form 3216 (for cards from GPO).
- 2. Print clearly all required information.
- 3. Enter the appropriate "item number." (Reminder: accountable paper depositories (APDs) are the primary source of supply for stamp items not available for bulk requisitioning from suppliers).
- 4. Enter "quantity requisitioned." Do not exceed the maximum quantity per requisition, or the order will be edited down to that prescribed amount.
- 5. Signatures are required. Requisitions must contain a signature.
- 6. Photocopy the completed forms three to a sheet if possible, but *do not* combine BEP and GPO requisitions on the same sheet. Please keep requisitions to BEP and GPO separate.
- 7. Fax to Headquarters Stamp Distribution at 202-268-5978.
- 8. Retain the original PS Forms 3356 and 3216 at your SDO or accounting office. Do not mail.
- 9. Before faxing, examine photocopies for clarity. Leave a space of approx one-half inch at the top of the photocopy to allow for the fax transmission's "informational header."

You must fax requisitions at least 1 week before the date assigned on the schedule. Shipments will begin approximately 7 to 10 days after that date. Strict compliance with this schedule equalizes the workload and maximizes transportation efficiency.

Requisitions to the BEP that are received after their assigned date are processed and shipped as time permits, but no later than the next designated ordering cycle. Requisitions to the GPO that are received after their assigned date are deferred until the next designated ordering cycle.

This schedule does not apply to orders for precanceled stamps or to *properly identified and documented* emergency orders. Such orders are processed immediately upon receipt. Nevertheless, it takes 7 to 10 days from the date of submission before the requisitioning office receives the stock. Offices must identify emergency orders by faxing a separate memorandum with the requisition. The memorandum must list the reason for "out-of-schedule" ordering, and include the requisition number, item number, manager's signature, city, state, and ZIP+4 Code. Unless such a memorandum is received, the BEP and GPO will follow normal processing procedures. Processing orders "out-of-schedule" increases shipping and handling costs; consequently, avoid this practice when possible.

Complete instructions for ordering stock in bulk quantities may be found in the current edition of the Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, Section 423.4. The current edition of Handbook F-1 is accessible on the Postal Service PolicyNet Web site at http://blue.usps.gov/cpim; click on HBKs.

Plain Stamped Envelope Ordering Information

Follow these procedures to ensure the timely receipt of plain stamped envelope orders. Current and new accountable paper custodians should retain this document for reference and review it frequently. For complete information, refer to Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures,* section 423.43. The current edition of Handbook F-1 is accessible on the Postal Service PolicyNet Web site at http://blue.usps.gov/cpim; click on HBKs.

Ordering Plain Stamped Envelopes

All stamp distribution offices (SDOs) and authorized CAG A-G Post Offices may submit requisitions to Stamp Fulfillment Services (SFS) for stamped envelopes. Plain stamped envelopes can be ordered once every accounting period according to the requisition schedule shown in Figure 1. Submit requests to SFS using PS Form 3205, Requisition for Plain Stamped Envelopes, which is shown in Figure 2. Submit all requisitions to arrive at least 7 days before the due date indicated on the schedule in Figure 1. Shipments are made in the second week following the scheduled submission week. Please maintain an 8-week inventory of stamped envelopes. Note: The submission week for stamped envelopes is not the same as those for stamps and stamped cards (see Handbook F1, 423.43-5). They are issued in ascending numerical sequence in lots of 100 cards to SDOs and 50 cards to authorized CAG A-G Post Offices (see Handbook F-1, 423.43-2). When your current supply of PS Forms 3205 is depleted, order a new supply by submitting PS Form 3206, Order for Form 3205, which is shown in Figure 3.

Please note the packing requirements. To facilitate the processing of your requisition, order only in the carton sizes shown on PS Form 3205 (Figure 2) and/or the chart of carton sizes shown in Figure 4. You must circle a specific packing size on PS Form 3205 or you will receive the 2,500-size carton for the #10 and #9 envelopes, and the 5,000-size carton for the #6-3/4 envelopes, for quantities in those amounts or greater. When ordering full pallets of envelopes, refer to Figure 5 for the standard palletized quantities used to meet new Postal Service shipping and stacking requirements.

The EP-10E envelope, preaddressed to SFS, can be ordered as follows:

■ Touch Tone Order Entry: Call 800-332-0317, option 1, then option 2.

Note: You must be registered to use TTOE. To register, call 800-332-0317, choose option 8, extension 2925, and follow the prompts to leave a message (wait 48 hours after registering before placing your first order).

- E-Mail: Complete PS Form 7380, MDC Supply Requisition (manually or using F3Fill), and send it as an attachment to MDC Customer Service or to mcustome @email.usps.gov.
- Mail: Send a completed PS Form 7380 to the MDC at the following address:

If you have not already done so, please order this envelope immediately, and destroy all previous issues of EP-10E envelope. Using the new envelope will speed up the delivery and processing of your requisition.

Emergency Requisitions

If you need stamped envelopes urgently to fulfill customer demand outside the normal requisitioning cycle, you may submit an emergency requisition. Submit a memorandum with the requisition listing the reason for the out-of-cycle order, the date the envelopes are required, the requisition number, the quantity and item, the signature of the local manager, and the Post Office telephone number, city, state, and ZIP Code. If this information is not included on the memo, the requisition will be processed as a normal requisition. Processing orders out-of-cycle increases shipping and handling cost, so please submit emergency requisitions only if you are unable to get stock from your SDO or accountable paper depository (APD).

Receipt of Stock

Examine each shipping carton to ascertain that all cartons are addressed to your office, that the seals are not broken, and that the cartons are not damaged. If there are any signs of tampering, report to the inspector in charge immediately (see Handbook F-1, 423.6-3).

Always enter the total value of the stock as noted on PS Form 3309, Advice of Shipment/Stamp Invoice, even if physical quantity is not the same. This amount has been charged to your finance number as of the date of shipment. If you enter a figure other than the total from PS Form 3309, you will receive a statement of difference from the postal data center (PDC). Allow 3 weeks from date of shipment before reporting full-carton nonreceipts to SFS. If you ordered the incorrect item, contact your SDO for permission to return or exchange the stock. If the contractor furnished you the incorrect item, contact SFS for information on how to receive a PS Form 3309 for stock received (Treat-As-Filled) or how to return stock to SFS for replacement if it cannot be used. To report nonreceipt of a carton or cartons, send a memo to SFS. Do not use PS Form 8144, Stamp Discrepancy Report, to report nonreceipts of full cartons or for incorrect items.

Shortages in Sealed Cartons

Report by telephone to Stamp Acquisition, Quality Assurance (202-268-6542), if one or more boxes of 500 are missing in a sealed carton. Follow up by reporting shortage on PS Form 8144 to the address on the form. Total all PS Forms 8144 at the end of the accounting period and file a claim for loss (see Handbook F-1, 423.72-2).

Include the "PLAIN PACKED BY" numbers shown on the preprinted panel on each inside box on the PS Form 8144 so that the contractor can be appropriately notified.

Shortages in Open/Damaged Cartons

If there are any signs of tampering and stock is missing from a carton, report it to the inspector in charge immediately (see Handbook F-1, 423.6-3).

Damaged Cartons

Handle stamped envelopes that are damaged according to Handbook F-1, Part 452.

Overages in Sealed Cartons

Report overages on PS Form 8144 immediately and send a *copy* to the address on the form. Send the overage stock with the *original* PS Form 8144 by registered mail to the following address:

Include on the PS Form 8144 the "PLAIN PACKED BY" numbers shown on the preprinted panel on each inside box so that the contractor can be appropriately notified.

Defective Stock

Defective stock is not saleable and must remain the property of the Postal Service. It must be returned immediately to main stock and then to the SDO, if applicable. Follow the procedures for shortages as noted previously (report on PS Form 8144 and file a claim for loss).

Include the "PLAIN PACKED BY" numbers shown on the preprinted panel on each inside box on the PS Form 8144 so that the contractor can be appropriately notified.

Stamped Envelope Discount

Full boxes of stamped envelopes may be sold to customers using the rates shown in *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) P020, which results in making sales at a discount. Your office was charged the individual price when the envelopes were shipped to you. Use PS Form 3220, *Claim for Stamped Envelope Discount*, to account for all full boxes of envelopes sold to customers at a discount (see Handbook F-1, 426.82).

Pictorial Cancellations Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary Post Office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CAN-CELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for cancellation, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

Retrieval of Plastic Label Holders

We have been notified that postal facility opening units (LDC 010) are not saving the plastic label holders used to close and address plastic sacks destinating at their locations. We have also noted that the national inventory of plastic label holders has fallen far below the inventory levels of sacks on which they are used.

Plastic label holders are reusable and must not be thrown away. Do not intentionally remove them from the draw tapes of sacks on which they are attached. After emptying each plastic sack, remove the label from the label holder, and prepare the sack/label holder combination for return to the serving Mail Transport Equipment (MTE) service center.

Consolidate separated label holders from their sacks for return to the MTE service center, along with the sacks. Please contact your serving area mail transport equipment specialist (AMTES) for more site-specific shipping information.


