U.S. Postal Service responds to GAO's "high-risk" update

"We welcome the General Accounting Office's recent review of the challenges facing the Postal Service," said Chief Financial Officer Richard Strasser in response to the GAO's "high-risk" update released today.

- "The report helps to keep the focus on finding solutions to those challenges," he said.
- "Since GAO's initial report in 2001, the Postal Service drafted a Transformation Plan to outline a strategy to meet the challenges reported by GAO. We welcome GAO's recognition that we have made substantial progress implementing that plan, within the boundaries of what is possible under current law, as outlined below:"
- Operational Efficiency: During fiscal year 2002, our output per workhour grew by 2.2% and Total Factor Productivity improved by 1.1%. The Total Factor Productivity increase is equivalent to \$700 million in expense reductions and marks our third straight year of positive Total Factor Productivity growth. During the same period, we reduced career employment by 23,000 positions, for a total reduction of 45,000 positions over three years.
- Cost Control: By better aligning resources against workload, we were able to reduce a projected net loss of \$1.35 billion by half to \$676 million during fiscal year 2002, despite the fact that the addresses we serve grew by 1.8 million. And, for the first time in 31 years, operating expenses were reduced below the previous year's. We are well on our way to taking \$5 billion in costs out of our system by the end of 2006.
- **Debt Reduction:** In fiscal year 2002, we decreased our outstanding debt by \$200 million, reversing a five-year trend of increasing debt each year. Our plan calls for additional debt reduction of at least \$800 million this year.
- Maintaining Service: Despite the financial challenges we are facing, driven primarily by declining mail volume growth and expansion of the number of homes and businesses we serve, overall service performance was at record levels in fiscal year 2002. So far this year, service is even exceeding last year's levels.
- "Each of these achievements represents progress against specific elements of our Transformation Plan.

- We will continue our focused efforts to implement the Plan, both today and over the coming years.
- "We are also working closely with the President's Commission on the U.S. Postal Service as it identifies the operational, structural, and financial challenges facing the Postal Service; examines potential solutions; and recommends legislative and administrative steps to ensure the long-term viability of postal service in the United States."

GAO validates OPM's position on CSRS retirement overfunding — and then some

They agree. The General Accounting Office, in a report issued today, came to a conclusion similar to that of the Office of Personnel Management (OPM). As OPM said, based on the current level of contributions, the Postal Service would significantly overfund the amount needed in the future to cover Civil Service Retirement System (CSRS) obligations.

- But GAO took it one step further, "We found that the amount of overfunding is considerably greater than OPM initially calculated."
- GAO said that USPS has actually overfunded its CSRS obligation by \$4 billion. OPM had earlier calculated that without a legislative change in the funding schedule, USPS's potential overfunding could reach \$71 billion. GAO's analysis says overfunding could reach \$103 billion.
- Why the difference? OPM included costs for military service for CSRS Postal Service employees who are not required to be paid by USPS under current law. In doing this, OPM commented that it used the funding methodology modeled after the Federal Employees Retirement System (FERS) that replaces CSRS for employees hired after 1983.
- Bottom line? If legislation is enacted changing how the Postal Service funds CSRS, based on either analysis, postage rates can be held steady until at least 2006.
- While the news from GAO was generally positive, Strasser expressed his disappointment that GAO called on Congress to decide if potential CSRS overfunding should be used for other purposes, such as debt reduction or retiree health benefit payments.

"This is the type of financial decision that we believe properly belongs to postal management and the Board of Governors, consistent with the law that created the Postal Service," he said.

Subcommittee seats filled, Commission on the U.S. Postal Service gets down to business

The President's Commission on the U.S. Postal Service has named the members of four subcommittees that will collect stakeholder input to help develop the commission's final report to the president, due July 31.

- The Business Model Subcommittee, chaired by Richard Levin, includes Don Cogman, Carolyn Gallagher, Norman Seabrook and Robert Walker. The group will assess the current Postal Service business model, universal service, infrastructure, rate regulation and pricing flexibility.
- The Private Sector Partnership Subcommittee consists of Chairman Joseph Wright, Cogman and Seabrook. It will analyze the private sector's role in mail delivery.
- The Technology Challenges and Opportunities Subcommittee, with Chairman Walker, Dionel Aviles and Wright, will assess the effect of online bill payment and presentment, e-mail, electronic funds transfer and other technology to determine whether they will continue to erode Postal Service market share.
- Workforce Subcommittee chairwoman Gallagher, along with Aviles and Levin, will examine the USPS collective bargaining and dispute resolution process and review alternative models.
- And, commission co-chairs James Johnson and Harry Pearce will serve as ex-officio members of each subcommittee. The commission is collecting comments through Feb. 12.
- The commission will hold its next open meeting Feb. 20 in Washington, DC. *USPS-TV* will be there.

Identity theft: Protecting yourself against the fastest growing crime in America

Life in the information age isn't without problems. Many of today's most common transactions, such as charging a gas purchase or accessing your bank account, require a wealth of personal information. The Postal Inspection

Service (USPIS) says it's that level of disclosure that leaves many of us vulnerable.

- "Identity theft is the fastest growing crime in America," says Chief Postal Inspector Lee Heath. How you use your personal information is a major factor in whether or not you become a victim. "Make sure that when providing financial and personal information, you know how it will be used," Heath said.
- Other ways to protect yourself: Avoid giving out your Social Security Number. Like the key to your front door, this single piece of information can allow identity snatchers access to your personal finances, health records and more, costing you time and money to repair the damage.
- Vice President and Consumer Advocate Francia Smith says the impact of identity theft can go beyond ruining credit to more serious damage. "There is an emotional factor of dealing with a credit history that isn't yours, but that you have to reconstruct in order to clear your own," Smith said.
- Both recommend annual credit report checks. Report any inconsistencies, newly opened accounts you didn't authorize and unfamiliar transactions to a credit bureau such as Equifax, Experian or TransUnion.

Handbook AS-805-C, Information Security for General Users

Handbook AS-805-C, *Information Security for General Users*, is a new handbook written specifically for users of computer-based services and systems throughout the Postal Service.

The Postal Service relies extensively on computerized systems and electronic data to support its mission. These systems and data must remain secure to avoid disruptions in critical operations, data tampering, fraud, and inappropriate disclosure of sensitive information. The handbook explains how the use of computer-based resources can affect the security of Postal Service information resources and provides requirements for the acceptable use of such resources.

The requirements in the handbook apply to all users who are authorized to access Postal Service information resources.

The handbook was distributed to computer users and will also be available at the Material Distribution Center

(MDC) and on the Postal Service PolicyNet Web site at http://blue.usps.gov/cpim; click on HBKs.

HANDBOOK AS-802 REVISION

Standard Sources for Time

Effective February 6, 2003, Handbook AS-802, *Postal Computing Operations Standards*, is revised to add part 3-5, Standard Sources for Time.

This revision establishes the requirements for standard time sources to enable all Netware, NT, Windows 2000, VAX, and UNIX server time clocks to be synchronized to Coordinated Universal Time (UTC).

We will incorporate this revision into the next printed edition of Handbook AS-802 and into the online version available on the Postal Service PolicyNet Web site at http://blue.usps.gov/cpim; click on HBKs.

3 Enterprise-wide Mandatory Standards and Procedures

* * * * * *

[Add new part 3-5 as follows:]

3-5 Standard Sources for Time

3-5.1 For Netware, NT, Windows 2000, VAX, UNIX

Many business applications require an accurate source of time for use in time-stamping transactions and log entries. The Postal Service has established standard time sources to enable all Netware, NT, Windows 2000, VAX, and UNIX server time clocks to be synchronized to Coordinated Universal Time (UTC). A standard time source will ensure that all Postal Service distributed business applications share a single time reference, obviate the need for development of alternative approaches to acquire and synchronize time

clocks, and lower operating costs by reducing the complexity of the infrastructure.

3-5.2 Applicability

This requirement applies immediately to the following applications:

- All Netware, NT, Windows 2000, VAX, and UNIX server time clocks in the current infrastructure.
- All new applications.
- Legacy applications, which must be upgraded to use these standard time sources if there is an opportunity to do it at low cost in conjunction with another functional upgrade or maintenance release.

Over time, it will apply to all applications.

3-5.3 Requirements

3-5.31 Application design

- Server-based applications must be designed to use the local system time clock via host operating system API calls as a time reference, because this clock is already synchronized with UTC.
- Applications or stored procedures running within Oracle must use the SYSDATE function to obtain accurate time. Oracle uses the local host system time clock as a time reference for these functions, which will be synchronized to UTC via established time synchronization networks.
- Client-based applications must be designed to use the local system time clock via Windows time API calls as a time reference. Client-side applications must neither access the hardware time clock directly nor include internal code to replicate the function of

the local system clock or clock synchronization with upstream time servers.

3-5.32 Infrastructure

- Time reference servers for all network operating system types (NetWare, Windows NT/2000, VAX, and UNIX) must be synchronized to UTC.
- Time reference servers must be monitored to ensure that their clocks are synchronized with UTC and with each other within an acceptable margin or error.
- Distributed or midrange servers that host applications requiring accurate time must be configured to synchronize their local system time clocks to UTC via the time synchronization network appropriate to the server's operating system. Ultimately, all application server time clocks must be synchronized to UTC through the established hierarchy of network time servers. The frequency of server time clock updates must be carefully configured to achieve the best balance between clock accuracy and network overhead.
- Clients hosting local applications requiring accurate time must be configured to synchronize their local system time clocks via the nearest time reference

server when available. The frequency of time clock updates must be carefully configured to achieve the best balance between clock accuracy and network overhead. For example, client time clocks need to be updated only once per user login.

Note: Software components needed to use these services are included as part of the off-the-shelf operating system client licenses. Application developers and infrastructure service managers need only ensure that their application servers are correctly configured to synchronize with the appropriate standard time server. Spay Day USA 2003 Is Tuesday, February 25

The Doris Day Animal Foundation has adopted the *Neuter or Spay* commemorative stamps as their theme for the eighth annual Spay Day USA, part of the American Partnership for Pets' (APP) annual effort to promote responsible pet care. Spay Day USA is the APP's premier national day of action to promote the spaying and neutering of companion animals. Each year the effort is organized to:

- Raise public awareness that of the estimated 8–10 million animals taken in by our nation's animal shelters annually, approximately 4–5 million are euthanized.
- Promote spaying/neutering as a part of the solution to this problem for health and behavioral reasons and to prevent the births of accidental and unwanted litters.
- Inspire every American to take personal responsibility for preventing the births of accidental and unwanted litters by sponsoring the spaying or neutering of at least one animal.

On September 20, 2002, the U.S. Postal Service issued the *Neuter or Spay* stamps, and 200 million of them were printed. The issuance of these stamps was the culmination of a grassroots campaign by thousands of citizens, community leaders, animal health and welfare organizations, veterinarians, and celebrities. The primary goal of the stamps is to raise awareness of the importance of

neutering and spaying pets — a goal whose message can be relayed through this year's Spay Day USA event.

Stage a Kick-off Event

Host an unveiling or special dedication of the Neuter or Spay stamps with the participation of local animal welfare organizations and veterinarians. Involve communities and build local partnerships. Remember: When planning events, make sure sufficient stamps are available. Additionally, the Postal Service is pleased to have the tremendous support of the APP for these events. The partnership is an unprecedented coalition of leading animal health and welfare organizations that have united to stand behind the Neuter or Spay stamps. The APP has distributed 8,000 action kits inviting community veterinarians and animal welfare organizations to contact you to help publicize the Neuter or Spay stamps. You are also invited to post your events on the www.pets911.com Web site. If you need help, send them an e-mail message at postmaster@pets911.com. You can learn about the APP program and how it can benefit you at www.americanpartnershipforpets.org.

Other Event Ideas

- Distribute flyers with information about spay/neuter issues.
- Set up a Neuter or Spay stamps display in your lobby.
- Hold a raffle in which anyone who spays/neuters an animal for Spay Day USA is eligible to win Neuter or Spay stamps merchandise.

- Sponsor an essay-writing contest with local schools on "The Importance of Neutering and Spaying Your Pets." Ask the postmaster, a local veterinarian, the director of the local animal shelter, and a teacher to be the judges. Award a framed sheet of stamps or a blow-up of the stamps to the winner.
- Sponsor an essay-writing and picture-drawing contest with local grade schools on "What My Pet Means to Me." Hang some of the best essays and cutest drawings in Post Offices, local veterinarians' offices, and local animal shelters.
- Present framed enlargements of the new stamps to local animal shelters and veterinarians. Encourage local political officials to attend presentations to raise awareness of the issue within your community.
- Coordinate groups of children children of Postal Service employees, Boy Scout and Girl Scout troops, 4-H Clubs, etc. — to write letters to shelter animals to be displayed on the Post Office bulletin board and published in the local newspaper, giving the animals a better opportunity to be adopted by loving families.
- Arrange for a pet health fun fair where local veterinarians can host booths promoting the importance of neutering and spaying pets, pet dental health, pet vaccination, etc. The local shelter can display adoptable pets; and pet supply stores can sell or display pet foods, pet toys, and other cat- and dogrelated items.
- Sponsor a pet show with local 4-H Clubs, Boy and Girl Scouts, etc. with a special category and special prize for neutered and spayed pets.
- Sell Neuter or Spay stamps merchandise in your lobbies or at special events to help raise awareness of pet overpopulation.

Liven up your Spay Day USA event with official licensed spay or neuter products — now available for resale or promotional giveaways. Merchandise includes: lapel pins, tote bags, insulated travel mugs, t-shirts, ceramic mugs, stationery, magnetic notepads, and postcards.

Offering products featuring the *Neuter or Spay* commemorative stamps images at your event provides a perfect way to promote the spay/neuter message and support the APP. In addition, a generous portion of sales is donated to the APP to support their effort to end the

DMM REVISION

Products Mailable at Nonprofit Standard Mail Rates

Effective January 1, 2003, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) E670.5.11 is revised to reflect an increase from \$7.90 to \$8.00 for low-cost products mailable at the Non-profit Standard Mail rates. Under the statutory restrictions in DMM E670, products may not be mailed at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates unless the products meet at least one of three exceptions. Under the Internal Revenue Code, a *low-cost item* is one of these exceptions.

The value of a low-cost item — the actual cost to the authorized nonprofit organization — is determined each year by the Internal Revenue Service, based on the cost of living. For 2003, the maximum limit for the value of a low-cost item has been adjusted to \$8.00.

We will incorporate this revision into the printed version of DMM Issue 58 and into the monthly update of the online DMM available via Postal Explorer at http://pe.usps.gov.

DMM REVISION

Standard Mail Flats in Letter Trays — Double Rows Permitted

Effective February 6, 2003, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) M033.2.2c is revised to extend the standard published in an article in *Postal Bulletin* 22089 (11-14-02, pages 35–40) titled "DMM Revision: Standard Mail Flats in Letter Trays" to the placement of smaller size pieces in two rows in a single tray, provided that the two rows run parallel to each other, with the address side of the pieces all faced toward the end (short dimension) of the tray and perpendicular to the entire length (long dimension) of the tray. This option is added in response to requests from the mailing industry to improve operational efficiencies and, in many cases, to optimize tray use by reducing the number of prepared trays.

Mailers placing flat-size pieces in letter trays are reminded that:

- Only Standard Mail flats may be mailed under the traying option in DMM M033.2.2.
- All Standard Mail flats prepared under the traying option in DMM M033.2.2 must also be palletized.
- Trays used for this traying option must bear labels meeting the standards in DMM M032.2.0 for tray labels, including a tray label barcode containing the three elements specified in DMM M032.2.4.
- Appropriate minimum volumes based on the corresponding sacking standards must be met, whether Presorted (under DMM M610.4.5), Enhanced Carrier Route (under DMM M620.4.1), or automation rate (under DMM M820.5.2).

Meeting the minimum volumes for trays is extremely important to ensure that no additional handling costs are incurred from the creation of more trays than there would be sacks if the sacking preparation standards were used. For example, most Standard Mail sort levels for flat-size mail require a minimum of either 125 pieces in a sack or 15 pounds in a sack. These same standards apply to the corresponding level of letter trays prepared under the traying option in DMM M033.2.2.

As a consequence, if a sort level requires a minimum of 125 pieces or 15 pounds in a sack, then a single tray prepared under this traying option must likewise contain a minimum of 125 pieces or 15 pounds of pieces. Two trays, for example, may not be used to meet the sacking minimum of 125 pieces by placing 75 pieces in one tray and 50 pieces in the second tray to the same presort destination.

If a large number of pieces leads to one less-than-full tray after filling several other trays, the pieces in that less-than-full tray generally become part of the next lower sort level. There are no "overflow" trays (as defined in DMM M011.1.3) under this traying option. As a general rule, all trays must contain at least 125 pieces or 15 pounds of pieces except for mixed ADC sort levels for Presorted and automation rate pieces, 3-digit origin or optional entry sort levels for Presorted and automation rate pieces, and 5-digit carrier routes trays for Enhanced Carrier Route pieces. Enhanced Carrier Route flat-size pieces may not be placed in 3-digit carrier routes trays.

Flat-size pieces that are both thick and lightweight are generally ineligible for this traying option because a single letter tray would not be able to hold the minimum number of 125 pieces and the weight of the full tray would be less than 15 pounds. On the other hand, with heavier weight pieces (e.g., one weighing 5 ounces), the minimum volume for the tray might be met by weight. In the example of the 5-ounce pieces, only 48 such pieces would be needed to meet the 15-pound minimum per tray.

DMM REVISION

Five-Digit Scheme Preparation for Flats — PAVE-Certified Software

Effective February 6, 2003, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) 910.1.1h, 910.2.1g, 910.3.1h, 920.2.1m, and 940.2.1l are revised to remove references to Manifest Analysis and Certification (MAC) software. Presort Accuracy Verification and Evaluation (PAVE) software, not MAC-certified software, is required for mailings under DMM M920, M930, and M940. Mailings palletized under DMM M045 do not require PAVE-certified software unless package reallocation is utilized.

Mail preparation standards for 5-digit scheme packages were issued as a DMM revision in an article in *Postal Bulletin* 22092 (12-26-02, pages 26–41) titled "DMM Revision: Five-Digit Scheme Package Preparation for Periodicals, Standard Mail, and Bound Printed Matter Flats, and Limitations to Optional 3-Digit Pallet and 3-Digit Sack Preparation." These new standards, which took effect on January 9, 2003, should reduce the number of presort destination packages that mailers must prepare in mailings of automation rate flat-size pieces and promote greater use of pallets.

Effective February 6, 2003, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) M920.2.5i and j, M930.2.4i and j, and M940.2.4i and j are revised to extend the standard published in an article in *Postal Bulletin* 22086 (10-3-02, pages 21–27) titled "DMM Revision: Mixed ADC Packages, Sacks, and Trays on ASF and BMC Pallets" to the advanced preparation options for flat-size mail. This revision corrects an omission made at the time the initial article was published by allowing mailers using the advanced preparation options for flat-size mail to place certain mixed area distribution center (ADC) packages on administrative support facility (ASF) or bulk mail center (BMC) pallets.

Under this optional preparation, mixed ADC packages placed on ASF and BMC pallets are labeled to the ADC destination shown in DMM L802 that serves the location of the destination ASF or BMC. - **A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.
- A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.
- **B.** PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:
 - Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
 - All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
 - Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."
- **B1.** PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.
- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
 - **C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- **E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter containing religious materials contrary to Islamic faith or depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited.
- E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM C024.2.0 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.
- **G.** Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.
- **H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.
 - **H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
- $\mbox{\bf I.}$ Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- **K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
 - L. All official mail is prohibited.
 - M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
 - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- ${\bf R.}\,$ All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.

- **U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."
- **U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.
- $\mbox{\bf U2.}$ Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to $\mbox{\rm Box}\,\mbox{\rm R}.$
- **U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces. When addressed to Box R.
 - V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.
- **W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O818-A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

ELM REVISION

Light Duty Assignments

Part 355 of the *Employee and Labor Relations Manual*, (ELM) was mistakenly omitted from Issue 17, dated July 2002. Effective July 2002, the ELM is revised to add Part 355.

We will incorporate Part 355 into the online version of ELM 17 and into the printed version of ELM 18.

Assignment, Reassignment, and Promotion

[Add Part 355 to read as follows:]

355 Light Duty Assignments

355.1 Voluntary Requests

355.11 Circumstances

Any full-time regular or part-time flexible employee recuperating from a serious illness or injury and temporarily unable to perform the assigned duties may voluntarily submit a written request to the installation head for temporary assignment to a light duty assignment.

Any ill or injured full-time regular or part-time flexible employee having a minimum of 5 years of postal service, or

any full-time regular or part-time flexible employee who sustained injury on duty while performing the assigned duties, regardless of years of service, can submit a voluntary request to the installation head for permanent reassignment to a light duty assignment.

355.12 Method

Voluntary requests are made in accordance with the applicable collective bargaining agreement.

355.13 Response

The light duty provisions of the various collective bargaining agreements between the Postal Service and the postal unions require that installation heads show the greatest consideration for full-time regular or part-time flexible employees requiring light duty or other assignments, giving each request careful attention, and reassign such employees to the extent possible in the employee's office.

355.14 No Guarantee

The light duty provisions of the various collective bargaining agreements between the U.S. Postal Service and the postal unions do not guarantee any employee who is on a light duty assignment any number of hours of work per day or per week.



- Your path could be slick, so watch the ground.

Reissue of Travel Cards That Expire February 2003

During the first 2 weeks of February, Citibank will mail replacement travel cards to employees with cards that expire February 2003. Employees may continue to use their cards through the end of the month (February 28).

Employees who do not receive a new card by February 21 should (1) call Citibank customer service (at the telephone number listed on the back of their card) to confirm that their mailing address is correct and, if necessary, (2) request that a replacement card be sent.

Trip Manager Users

When the new card is activated, **employees who use Trip Manager must update the expiration date** to ensure that charges to the account may be authorized.

To update the expiration date in Trip Manager, follow the steps below:

- 1. Log on to Trip Manager.
- 2. Click on Profiles.
- 3. Under Traveler Information, select Credit Card.
- 4. Highlight the card record to be updated.
- 5. Select Edit Card.
- 6. Type the new expiration date.
- 7. Click the Submit button.

ICM UPDATES

International Customized Mail

On January 7, 2003, the Postal Service entered into an International Customized Mail (ICM) Service Agreement with a Qualifying Mailer. In accordance with *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 297.4, the Postal Service now makes public the following information concerning the Agreement:

- a. Term: January 1, 2003, through December 31, 2003.
- b. Type of mail: Global Express Mail™ (EMS). Every item must conform to the mailing requirements set forth in the IMM for Qualifying Mail.
- c. Destination countries: Australia and Japan.
- **d. Service provided by the Postal Service:** The Postal Service has agreed to:
 - Furnish the Mailer with the postal equipment and postal supplies required for the use of Qualifying Mail.
 - Provide the Mailer with any training necessary to prepare mail shipments in conformity with the requirements of Qualifying Mail.
 - 3. Perform on-call and scheduled pick up service.
 - Arrange with carriers to transport Qualifying Mail to international destinations for delivery by the appropriate authority.

- Provide a system which includes a computer workstation, in-line scale, printers, and manifesting software.
- Provide the mailer with an Express Mail Corporate Account Mailing Statement at the end of each Postal Accounting Period.
- **e. Minimum revenue commitment:** The Mailer has agreed to meet a minimum volume commitment of at least 1,000 pieces of Qualifying Mail.
- f. Worksharing: The Mailer has agreed to:
 - Pay postage to the Postal Service, either directly or through a mailing agent(s), for Global Express Mail (EMS), through an Express Mail Corporate Account (EMCA) accounting to the terms of DMM P500.2.
 - 2. Include a manifest with each mailing.
 - 3. Properly label and apply a Customs form to each mail piece.
 - Tender qualifying mail at the Mailer's plant in accordance with instructions the Postal Service provides.

- Provide the Postal Service with a schedule of mailings, including the date of tender, weight, volume, and location where mail will originate in accordance with Postal Service instructions.
- g. Rates: The Mailer will receive a ten (10) percent discount off non-discounted published rates in effect on the date of mailing for EMS Qualifying Mail. In the event that the costs the Postal Service incurs in the fulfillment of this Agreement increase in excess of five (5) percent the Postal Service shall modify the discount upon giving the Mailer a sixty (60) day notification.

REMINDER

International Mail — Inquiry Process for Global Express Mail

This article is a reminder about how to properly initiate an inquiry and file a claim for Global Express Mail™ (EMS).

Only the sender may submit an inquiry regarding an EMS item. To request the status of an EMS item, the sender *must* call the Postal Service's EMS Inquiry Center at 800-222-1811 and must provide the relevant mailing information. The EMS Inquiry Center will then contact the delivery agent in the country of destination to request information on the disposition of the item. Upon receiving a response, the EMS Inquiry Center will call and advise the sender of the results of the inquiry. If the item is lost, damaged, or rifled, the EMS Inquiry Center will mail to the sender a claim packet that includes the following:

- PS Form 2861, Express Mail International Service Inquiry, which the EMS Inquiry Center generates and completes and which contains the relevant information about the disposition of the inquiry.
- PS Form 2855, Claim for Indemnity International Registered, Insured, and Express Mail.
- A letter of instruction regarding the claim process. In order to file a claim, the sender must complete PS Form 2855 and submit it along with PS Form 2861 to the New York International Claims and Inquiries Office (ICIO).

Note: Only the EMS Inquiry Center can generate PS Form 2861. Facilities that have copies of PS Form 2861 with an edition date of 1989 (or any edition date prior to 2002) must recycle/discard those forms because they are obsolete.

For more information regarding EMS inquiries, see the applicable passages in *International Mail Manual* (IMM) 921 through 924, including the following:

■ Who Can Inquire: As noted in IMM 921.22 and 924.2, only the sender (not the addressee) can initiate inquiries pertaining to the disposition of an EMS item.

- How to Inquire: As noted in IMM 921.22 and 922.31, the sender must call the EMS Inquiry Center at 800-222-1811 to initiate an inquiry about an EMS item and must provide the agent with the relevant mailing information.
- When to Inquire: As noted in IMM 922.1 and 922.31, the sender must initiate an inquiry about an EMS item within 90 days from the date of mailing. (But as noted in IMM 922.2, the sender must wait at least 3 days from the date of mailing before initiating an inquiry.)
- Hearing Results: As noted in IMM 922.32, the EMS Inquiry Center will advise the sender of the results of the inquiry and, if necessary, will mail to the sender a claim packet.
- Initiating a Claim: As noted in IMM 924.2, a sender cannot file a claim until after the EMS Inquiry Center has completed an inquiry. If the inquiry determines that a claim is warranted, the sender must complete PS Form 2855 (which the EMS Inquiry Center includes in the claim packet it mails to senders), and must submit both PS Form 2855 and PS Form 2861 (which the EMS Inquiry Center generates, completes, and includes in the claim packet) to the ICIO.
- Foreign Origin EMS: As noted in IMM 922.33, a person who sent an EMS item to the United States from a foreign country must initiate an inquiry through the country of origin.





Post Offices requiring quantities of Item 781500 must order them from their designated SDO using a separate PS Form 17. SDOs must not distribute these coils to Post Offices before February 24, 2003.

Philatelic Requirement

SDOs with authorized philatelic centers requiring the *Tiffany Lamp* coil of 3,000 must order Item 781500 from their designated SDO using PS Form 17.

Additional Supply

Post Offices requiring additional coils must requisition them from their designated SDO using PS Form 17. SDOs requiring additional coils must order them from the appropriate APD using PS Form 17.

For fulfilling supplemental orders from SDOs, the San Francisco, Chicago, Memphis, and New York APDs will each receive 5,120 additional coils; and the Denver APD will receive 2,560 additional coils. For fulfilling supplemental orders from APDs, the Kansas City Stamp Services Center will receive 38,400 additional coils.

Ohio Statehood Commemorative Stamp

The Postal Service will issue a 37-cent *Ohio Statehood* commemorative stamp (Item 453900) in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 on March 1, 2003, in Chillicothe, Ohio. The stamp, designed by Phil Jordan, Falls Church, Virginia, and photographed by Ian Adams, Cuyahoga Falls, Ohio, goes on sale nationwide March 2, 2003.

Comprising land ceded to the United States after the Revolutionary War, the Northwest Territory included present-day Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Ohio, and Wisconsin. In 1787 Congress enacted a plan to organize and govern this large area. The following year its first permanent settlement was established in Marietta, Ohio. On February 19, 1803, President Thomas Jefferson approved Ohio's constitution, and in March 1803, Ohio became the first state carved from the territory and the 17th admitted to the Union. Due to a

legislative oversight, Ohio's constitution was formally ratified by Congress 150 years later on August 7, 1953.

Distribution: Item 453900, 37-cent *Ohio* Statehood Commemorative Stamp

The 37-cent Ohio Statehood stamp (Item 453900) is to be sold only in the first day city of Chillicothe, Ohio; at regular Post Office retail counters within the state of Ohio; through Stamp Fulfillment Services (SFS) in Kansas City, Missouri; and at retail stores and philatelic centers nationwide. There will be no standard distribution to stamp distribution offices (SDOs); only SDOs serving the state of Ohio will receive this 20-stamp PSA pane for subsequent distribution to Post Offices.

Initial Supply to Post Offices

The Minnesota Information System Service Center (MNISSC) will not use PS Form 3309, Advice of Shipment/ Stamp Invoice, to automatically distribute this commemorative stamp to Ohio Post Offices. To obtain an initial supply of the Ohio Statehood stamps, all Ohio Post Offices must immediately submit PS Form 17, Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return, to their designated SDO. SDOs must not distribute stamps to Post Offices before February 24, 2003.

Philatelic Requirement

Although sale of the *Ohio Statehood* stamps is restricted to Post Offices in the state of Ohio, philatelic centers nationwide will receive stamps in 6 positions for philatelic sale.

Additional Supply

Post Offices within the state of Ohio requiring additional stamps must requisition them from their designated SDO using PS Form 17. For fulfilling supplemental orders from SDOs within the state of Ohio, the Cleveland and Columbus, Ohio, SDOs will each receive 3,000,000 additional stamps.

Philatelic centers nationwide requiring additional *Ohio Statehood* stamps must requisition them from their designated SDO using PS Form 17. SDOs requiring additional stamps to meet philatelic center demand must order them from the appropriate accountable paper depository (APD) using PS Form 17.

For fulfilling supplemental orders from SDOs for additional philatelic center stock, the Chicago APD will receive 160,000 additional stamps; the San Francisco, Memphis, and New York APDs will each receive 120,000 additional stamps; and the Denver APD will receive 80,000 additional stamps.

Sales Policy

All Post Offices in the state of Ohio and authorized philatelic centers nationwide must acquire and maintain a supply of each new commemorative until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. Pictorial Cancellations Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service offers pictorial cancellations to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial cancellations are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial cancellation appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those cancellations that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the cancellation in person at the temporary Post Office station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the cancellation, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial cancellations are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial cancellation date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for cancellation may not include postage issued after the date of the requested cancellation. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a cancellation should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL CANCELLATIONS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP + 4 CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP + 4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for cancellation, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial cancellation, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

Excess Item Catalog Now on eBuy

National Supply Management Programs would like to announce the deployment of the new Excess Item Catalog on eBuy. The primary purpose of this catalog is to promote the redistribution of excess assets, which will defer the cost of buying them new. To comply with U.S. Postal Service policy, all eBuy users should use excess as their first source of supply when requirements occur.

The catalog is available to 38,000 eBuy users and district material management specialists (DMMS) who can list and use excess assets as needed. All items listed in this catalog are free; however, transportation costs may be incurred.

DMMSs will play a key role by coordinating the listing and redistributing of all district excess assets. In order to have the skills necessary to effectively manage local excess, all DMMSs are required to take the online Web-based training course (specific to Postal Service excess items) through eBuy. Access the Web-based training as follows:

 From Internet Explorer (V.50 or higher), go to the blue page at http://blue.usps.qov and type "ebuy" in the address line and then hit the Retun key. (The direct URL is http://ebuy.usps/jsp/co/Login.jsp; note that this URL is case sensitive.)

- 2. At the top of the eBuy logon page, click Training.
- 3. When the "Welcome to eBuy Training" page becomes available, click USPS Excess Items Course.
- Once you have completed the course, you are encouraged to begin listing excess equipment into the system.

Course participants may obtain VOE credit after completing the course. For more information, please contact Richard Quintero, Windsor Material Service Center, at 860-285-7332.

Copiers for CFS Units

The Postal Service has an ongoing strategic partnership with Ricoh Corp. The following copiers are now available from the mandatory Ricoh contract for use in Centralized Forwarding System (CFS) units:

- Aficio 1085 appropriate for up to 149,999 copies a month at a cost of \$18,706
- Aficio 1105 appropriate for 150,000 or more copies a month at a cost of \$22,993

The recommended copiers are rated to process either the 90-pound or 110-pound index card stock. The 90-pound index card stock may be stored in any drawer or the large capacity tray in either copier. The 110-pound index card stock may be stored in drawers 4 or 5, or the large capacity tray in the Aficio 1085; or any drawer or large capacity tray in the Aficio 1105.

All requests for the CFS copiers must be first approved at the district and area levels and then by the Capital Review Committee at Finance in Headquarters. For more information on the Committee, you can visit their Web site at http://blue.usps.gov/finance/capital/capital.htm. Please

note that employees who have Web access must use eBuy for all requisitions in lieu of a hardcopy PS Form 7381, Requisition for Supplies, Services, or Equipment. The eBuy Web site can be accessed at http://ebuy.usps.gov. To obtain an eBuy log-on, go to the eBuy Web site, click Support and then click Account Request and complete PS Form 1357, Request for Computer Access.

Detailed ordering instructions can be found in *Material Logistics Bulletin* No. MLB-CO-01-001 found on the Office Products and Utilities CMC Web site at http://blue.usps.gov/purchase/material/pmsc/windsor/ricoh.htm. Go to the site and click *More Links* and then click *Material Logistics Bulletins*. If you do not have access to a computer, you can obtain the material logistics bulletin by calling Topeka Operations and Materials Customer Service at 800-332-0317; select the option for "Operations and Materials Customer Service."

If you require a slitter, the Martin Yale Model 3800 FC forms cutter is the external, stand-alone slitter that you should use with these Ricoh copiers. Because the slitter is

less than \$3,000, each CFS unit is to use its IMPAC Visa expense credit card to purchase its slitter. Each slitter is to be purchased from Office Zone by calling Shawn Hammond at 800-543-5454, extension 143, or Adam Cheney, extension 134. State that you are using the primary Postal Service customer number that is assigned to contract 1AOSEQ-03-P-2242 (number US7342) when placing an order. The cost for the slitter will be \$2,432.00

plus shipping costs, which will vary depending on the distance the slitter is shipped.

522.1 Description

PPAS is an automated system used by the accounting service center (ASC) at San Mateo, California. It is designed to record capital personal property transactions and maintain a national inventory of capital personal property. The system tracks each item of capital personal property through the acquisition, use, and disposal stages. The PPAS inventory record is related to the finance number of the installation to which the property is assigned. It can provide accountability information within the finance number. A primary function of the PPAS is to calculate, allocate, and record depreciation expense against the finance number of the holding organization. See Handbook F-26, *Personal Property Accounting*, for a more complete description of PPAS.

Written requests for external relocation or transfer (containing the capital IOD number and the name and title of the requestor) are submitted to the installation head/MAO for forwarding to the DMMS. The DMMS will electronically transfer form 7340 through the San Mateo Personnel Property Accounting System (PPAS) (function 3), thereby transferring accountability, from the shipper finance number to the consignee finance number (see exhibit 552.1c and refer to PPAS Field User Guide, pages 2 and 3).

Note: Shipping office will maintain electronic copy of Form 7340 along with Forms 961-A in the pending verification [capital] file awaiting processing at the San Mateo ASC (see 554).

565.1 Normal Process

Disposal of Postal Service capital property follows the normal disposal process described in chapter 6, Asset Recovery: Redistribution, Recycling, and Disposal. Additionally, a copy of the Form 969 is sent by the MAO to the finance or accounting office, showing the undepreciated balance. Any undepreciated value on a disposal item is immediately charged to the installation's expense budget as soon as the San Mateo ASC processes the Form 969.

566.4 Changes

571 General

San Mateo ASC provides three tools on a routine basis to assist in the verification of the PPAS records with the field records. PPAS is the Postal Service master file that maintains accountability of capital property to a finance number. The verification tools from the San Mateo ASC are the accounting period change list (APCL), the Form 961-A, Post Office Property Record (see Exhibit 571), the annual capital property listing (ACPL), and the ID label. Through the use of these tools, the organization maintains accuracy between San Mateo ASC and local records, and avoids the costs in time and money necessary to correct errors during the physical inventory.

573 Form 961-A, Post Office Property Record

573.1 Use for Capital Property

[Replace words "St. Louis" with "San Mateo," and replace the term "six-digit" with "seven-digit" as follows:]

Form 961-A is a two-sided card issued to a facility by the San Mateo ASC. A single card is issued with the APCL for each new item of capital property entering the Postal Service. That card tracks the equipment from the date of acquisition through the date the equipment leaves the Postal Service, staying with the equipment if it moves from facility to facility. The card shows a unique seven-digit ID number that matches the bar-coded label affixed to the equipment. Space is provided for serial number, make/ model, equipment location, repair, and maintenance data. If one ID number is issued for an entire system, list the components of the system in this space.

573.2 Use for Capital Modifications

[Replace the words "St. Louis" with "San Mateo" as follows:]

Forms 961-A are also issued by the San Mateo ASC for certain equipment modification expenditures. ***

573.3 Retention

[Replace the words "St. Louis" with "San Mateo" as follows:]

Form 961-A is the primary document for the accountability of capital property.

The accountable facility must retain this card as long as the capital property is under its accountability. When the equipment is transferred or disposed of, the following steps must be followed:

Step 1 Transferred. Shipping office will maintain electronic copy of Form 7340 along with Form 961-A (and any Forms 961-A for modification costs) in the Pending Verification (Capital) file awaiting processing at the San Mateo ASC. ***

Step 2 Disposed of. Form 961-A (and any Forms 961-A for modification costs) must be returned to the San Mateo ASC along with the Form 969. The ASC will then verify and destroy the old form.

573.4 Additions from Reclassifications and Physical Inventories

When the documentation is processed by San Mateo ASC, an ID number will be assigned and an ID label will be forwarded with the APCL.

573.5 900000 Series ID Numbers for Installation Costs

Interim ID numbers in the 900000 series are issued for site preparation costs incurred in installing capital fixed and nonfixed mechanization as well as automated data processing equipment. No label is issued. Once the capital property is installed and accepted and the ID number for the equipment is received, annotate and return the APCL to San Mateo ASC requesting that all costs be rolled into the record.

573.6 Verifying and Affixing ID Labels

Each ID label received must be checked against the APCL with which it was mailed to verify that the ID numbers match. Notify the San Mateo ASC of any discrepancy.***

When the documentation is processed by San Mateo ASC, an ID number will be assigned and an ID label and Form 961-A will be forwarded with the APCL.

574.5 900000 Series ID numbers for Installation Costs

***Once the capital property is installed and accepted and the ID number for the equipment is received, annotate andreturn the APCL to San Mateo ASC requesting that all costs be rolled into the record pertaining to ID number assigned to original equipment.

574.6 Verifying and Affixing ID Labels

Each ID label received must be checked against the Form 961-A and the APCL with which it was mailed to verify that the ID numbers match. Notify the San Mateo ASC of any discrepancy. ***

575 APCL Procedures

575.1 General

For each accounting period in which San Mateo ASC posts any changes to an installation's records, the ASC will issue an APCL showing the deletions, additions and adjustments mage to the property records in PPAS. *** Discrepancies that have not been resolved should be noted on both copies, with one copy returned to the San Mateo ASC.

575.2 Verification of Entries

576 ACPL Procedures

576.1 General

Once a year, the San Mateo ASC issues the annual capital property listing. It is in two parts, the first in PCN sequence and the second in ID number sequence. It provides generic and extended equipment descriptions.

576.2 Verification Procedures

Verify the ACPL with subcustody records and resolve any discrepancies. All information on the ACPL should be identical to the local records and that shown on the Forms 961-A, *Post Office Property Record*. Research and resolve so that both the San Mateo ASC and the property records are the same. *** This information must be provided to the finance or accounting office prior to processing the Form 2880 (see exhibit 576.2). All Forms 2880 must be signed by the installation head prior to submission to the San Mateo ASC.

Note: The August 1994 version of Form 2880 is the only version accepted for processing by the San Mateo ASC.***

591 Frequency

A complete physical inventory of all capital property is conducted every 5 years. Finance will determine the scope of the physical inventory.

592 Procedures

* * * * *

Step 8 Review and approval — Upon completion of the physical inventory process, including research, a Form 2880 (see exhibit 576.2) will be completed. Physical inventory results, as noted on the Form 2880, will be reviewed by the appropriate functional manager or MAA who signed the subcustody record, and the installation head. A copy is provided to the finance office. Form 2880 without changes will be forwarded directly to the San Mateo ASC. Completed Forms 2880 with changes and any supporting documents are forwarded to the DMMS for review and other necessary documentation.

Step 9 Additions and Deletions are made via Form 2880. If additions or deletions for a finance number total \$100,000 or more, forward Form 2880 with appropriate documentation to the manager of National Accounting, Finance, for review. After review and approval, send signed copy to the San Mateo ASC. For additions or deletions of less than \$100,000 the installation head must approve, sign, and send Form 2880 directly to the San Mateo ASC. Enter supporting comments for actions in the Remarks section.
