HIGH MARKS: Trade magazine praises PMG's leadership

There's nothing like a good report card. Postmaster General (PMG) Jack Potter just got one from the *Journal of Communication Distribution*.

The publication gives the PMG "high marks" for managing the Postal Service™ the last two years. Potter has "steadied" the agency during a time marked by a sluggish economy, terrorist attacks and decreasing mail volume. How? By driving through new service and rate initiatives, cutting overhead and staffing and steering postal initiatives through Congress, said the article.

"Potter's experience in postal operations . . . has shown itself in service initiatives such as Confirm®, the automated package processing system and negotiated service agreements," said the *Journal*.

Those achievements are part of a comprehensive *Transformation Plan* that Potter has championed as a "21st century blueprint" for the Postal Service, said the *Journal*. Potter has used the plan to "earmark cost reductions of roughly \$5 billion by 2006, improve mail delivery and lay the groundwork for many of the President's Commission's recommendations," said the article.

Leading the Postal Service into the 21st century, the PMG faces some tough challenges. "First and foremost on his 'to-do' list is finding ways to grow mail volume," said the *Journal*. But the Postal Service will be able to forge ahead with this "strong leader managing the team," said the article.

PERFORMANCE: Central Plains employees lead the nation in service

Happy to be No. 1, Central Plains employees scored highest of 85 PCs — 11.78 on a scale of 15. Los Angeles Performance Cluster finished at a close second with a score of 11.58.

CARRIER PICKUP: USPS extends Post Office to customer's doorstep

Customers who like snuggling up to a computer have a new reason to cuddle. It's Carrier Pickup, the service that lets customers notify their delivery office through a pilot Web site that packages will be ready for pick-up the next delivery day.

Here's how it works: Customers request pickup online via a unique URL. The local Post Office ™ retrieves that information from the My Post Office ™ system. Letter carriers are notified of any pickup requests before they hit the streets.

And since the packages are picked up as part of the carrier's normal delivery route, there's no pickup fee. Good for business . . . great for our customers.

The program includes Post Offices with My Post Office access in the Long Island, Los Angeles, San Diego, Van Nuys, Santa Ana and Arizona Districts. National rollout could begin as early as January 2004.

DMM REVISION

DSF² and eLOT — Carrier Route Products

Effective December 11, 2003, *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) A950.1.3, M050.2.2, M050.2.4, and M050.3.1 are revised to update information for the following two Address Information System (AIS) products: Delivery Sequence File, Second Generation (DSF²) and enhanced Line-of-Travel (eLOT).

An earlier revision to DMM A930.7.0 and A930.8.0, published in the article "Address Quality" in *Postal Bulletin* 22104 (6-12-03, pages 26–29), updated the descriptions and information on the availability of these two AIS products but did not amend related sections in the DMM.

DSF²

DSF² is a licensed address hygiene product that contains information on all addresses — except general delivery addresses — served by the Postal Service $^{\mathbb{M}}$. DSF² includes the ZIP Code $^{\mathbb{M}}$, ZIP+4 $^{\mathbb{G}}$ code, carrier route code, walk-sequence information, and all other delivery attributes related to each specific address.

DSF² is one of the approved methods under DMM M050.2.2 for preparing mail to meet the walk-sequence criteria required for carrier route Periodicals mailpieces and Enhanced Carrier Route Standard Mail pieces mailed at high density and saturation rates.

Walk sequence is the exact order in which a carrier delivers mail from one delivery point to the next. As provided in DMM M050.2.4, walk sequence may also be used, at the mailer's option, to satisfy the LOT sequencing criteria required for carrier route Periodicals mailpieces and Enhanced Carrier Route Standard Mail pieces mailed at basic rates.

The DSF² product is updated monthly and is available through Postal Service—approved licensees. A current list of these licensees is maintained at *www.ribbs.gov* and can also be obtained from:

eLOT

The eLOT product is a computerized file that contains address information that allows a mailer to arrange mail in a carrier's line of delivery travel. This LOT is not the exact walk sequence from one delivery point to the next, but rath-

er a series of ZIP+4 codes arranged in the order that the carrier serves the route. Before address lists can be processed using eLOT, they must first be processed through CASS-certified ZIP+4 address-matching software.

The eLOT product is a method under DMM M050.2.4 to meet the LOT sequence criteria required for carrier route Periodicals pieces and Enhanced Carrier Route Standard Mail pieces mailed at basic rates. Mailers also have the option to prepare such mail in walk sequence, using the various available walk-sequence methods.

The eLot product is updated monthly and is available for purchase directly from the National Customer Support Center.

We will incorporate these revisions into the printed version of DMM 59 and into the monthly update of the online DMM available via Postal Explorer at http://pe.usps.gov.

REMINDER

Customized MarketMail Service — Sample Mailpieces

Effective August 10, 2003, the Postal Service™ introduced Customized MarketMail™ (CMM) service, a new rate category for Regular Standard Mail mailpieces and Nonprofit Standard Mail mailpieces. CMM service represents a significant innovation for advertisers, marketers, and organizations wanting to reach targeted market segments with highly individualized mailpieces that use non-rectangular shapes and multidimensional formats.

Postal Service employees — as well as mailers interested in using this new service — should review the standards for CMM mailpieces, including the standards requiring the submission of sample CMM mailpieces at the time of mailing and the use of standardized documentation for mailings with more than three different types of containers. Questions about all CMM mailing standards should be directed to the appropriate manager of business mail entry.

Sample Mailpieces

As provided under *Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM) M660.1.3, each CMM mailing presented to the Postal Service must include not only a signed and completed postage statement, but also an extra copy of the postage statement and a sample of the CMM mailpiece. If a consolidated postage statement is used for plant-verified drop shipment (PVDS) mailings, a copy of that consolidated postage statement with a single CMM mailpiece is sufficient. If available, documentation supporting the use of Priority Mail® or Express Mail® drop shipment should also be provided.

Sample mailpieces submitted with the extra copy of the postage statements should be similar to the "live" mailpieces and show proper markings and addressing formats. The submission of CMM mailpiece samples applies to each CMM mailing, even if the same mailpiece design is used in subsequent mailings. If a CMM mailing includes more than one physical mailpiece design or contains nonidentical-weight pieces, a sample of each unique CMM mailpiece is required.

Collection of Samples

Employees collecting the sample CMM mailpieces and postage statement copies must send these items within 2 weeks after the date of mailing to the manager of the New York Rates and Classification Service Center at the following address:

Mailing Standards

DMM E660 and M660 contain the specific standards for CMM eligibility and mail preparation, including postage payment methods, rate markings, packaging, labeling, and documentation.

In addition to the appropriate Standard Mail™ postage statement designated for mailpieces subject to the residual shape surcharge, standardized documentation meeting the standards in DMM P012 is required for CMM mailings containing nonidentical-weight pieces or mailings using more than three different types of containers.

Thirty Days To Go — End of Transitional Period

January 10, 2004, officially marks the end of a transitional period that the Postal Service[™] provided for enabling parcel mailers to comply with the barcode symbology requirements. At that time, all machinable parcels qualifying for and claiming the 3-cent parcel barcode discount must be printed with the UCC/EAN Code 128 barcode symbology.

Holiday HAZMAT

'Tis the season. . . to make this the safest and most successful holiday season ever for the Postal Service $^{\text{\tiny M}}$.

With the busy holiday season upon us, it is important to take a moment to reinforce some important points regarding hazardous material (or HAZMAT) that can be found in the mail, especially at this time.

Customers rely heavily on the Postal Service to safely and efficiently deliver their gifts to friends, business associates, and loved ones during this season and also to return packages after the holidays. It is important that every Postal Service employee take steps to ensure that holiday parcels known to or suspected to contain hazardous material (Holiday HAZMAT) are properly handled.

Acceptance employees are required to ask the question "Does your parcel contain anything liquid, fragile, perishable, or potentially hazardous?"

During this festive and giving period the Postal Service handles an additional 20 billion pieces of parcels. While the vast majority of these packages contain nondangerous items, some of them may contain a material that can cause harm to employees and disrupt operations. When a parcel contains hazardous material that is unacceptable for mailing or is improperly packaged, it is a concern to everyone.

At this time of year it is important to remember that hazardous materials can be found in a wide variety of common household and consumer products. Holiday HAZMAT can be found in:

- Shipments of liquor/wine/beer (nonmailable).
- Electronic equipment containing batteries.
- Cosmetics (perfumes, hair products, body and bath oils, etc.).
- Consumer products containing petroleum products such as, but not limited to, chain saws and string trimmers.
- Parcels bearing an ORM-D/ORM-D-Air marking. See the examples in the right-hand column.
- Food shipments preserved with dry ice.
- Parcels bearing a DOT hazard class 9 label. See the example in the right-hand column.
- Fireworks and sparklers (nonmailable).

Some items are not outwardly hazardous, but when packaged improperly can be mistaken for a dangerous item. Electronic toys/games, for instance, when shipped with the batteries in place can create an electromagnetic hazard that may interfere with airplane navigation equipment.







It is also common to encounter parcels that have been mailed in reused packaging that formerly contained hazard-ous materials. Postal Service employees are required to assume that markings or labels present on parcels indicate the actual contents of the parcel. It is acceptable to reuse boxes for mail shipments provided that the mailer has removed or completely obliterated all former HAZMAT package markings and labels. Merely crossing out a label or marking or writing the current contents on a box is insufficient to allow mailing. If any evidence of the former contents is visible, do not accept the parcel. The former markings and labels must be blotted out even if the parcel will be wrapped in paper for mailing, because if the wrapping becomes damaged during shipment, these markings will cause the package to be returned.

While it is not possible to list every type of hazardous material that could be reasonably expected to be found in the mail, recognizing those parcels that are known to or suspected to contain Holiday HAZMAT is crucial to safe operations.

If you suspect a parcel contains an identified/undeclared Holiday HAZMAT, immediately notify your supervisor. Under no circumstances should a parcel containing undeclared HAZMAT be allowed to continue through processing. Process for delivery only Holiday HAZMAT parcels that meet the packaging and labeling requirements of the Domestic Mail Manual and Publication 52, Hazardous, Restricted, and Perishable Mail.

Responsibility for properly packaging and labeling Holiday HAZMAT ultimately rests with the mailer. However,

by being alert and able to recognize HAZMAT parcels, we can all do our part to make this a successful holiday season for the Postal Service.

GUIDELINES

Gifts to Postal Service Employees

The Standards of Ethical Conduct for Employees of the Executive Branch ("Standards"), which are codified in Title 5, Code of Federal Regulations, Section 2635, cover all Postal Service ™ employees, including letter carriers. The "gifts from outside sources" portion of the Standards specifies that Postal Service employees may not accept gifts from outside sources (including Postal Service customers) or gifts given to them because of their official positions. Postal Service employees are also prohibited from soliciting gifts from outside sources.

There are a number of exceptions and exclusions to the general gifts rule. Postal Service employees may accept the following items:

- Snacks and beverages that are not offered as part of a meal.
- Items with little intrinsic value (i.e., greeting cards, plaques, pens, coffee mugs, etc.).
- Perishable items (i.e., flowers, chocolates, cookies, etc.); if the items are clearly worth more than \$20, employees should share them with others in the Postal Service workplace.
- Items with a market (retail) value of \$20 or less.

- Gifts motivated solely because of a personal relationship.
- Gifts for which the employee has paid market (retail)
- Gifts paid for by the Postal Service.

Postal Service employees may not accept cash — in any amount or form (bills, change, checks, money orders) — from an outside source in connection with doing their job. This prohibition is referenced in Title 5, Code of Federal Regulations, Section 2635.202(c)(4)(ii). It is derived from a criminal statute (18 U.S.C. § 209) that prohibits an employee from receiving — for services provided as a government employee — any contribution to or supplementation of his or her salary from any source other than the government. While many Postal Service customers have traditionally thanked their letter carriers with gifts of cash during the holiday season, this practice puts our employees at risk of violating federal law.

Household Diary Study

The Postal Service's™ Household Diary Study (HDS), conducted since 1987, provides information about the contents of the mail sent and received by U.S. households. The Postal Service uses this information to help understand why and how customers use the mail. The results are used to:

- Forecast mail volume.
- Plan marketing strategies.
- Provide information for rate-setting purposes.

The HDS is administered at Headquarters by the Office of Demand Forecasting and Economic Analysis, Finance. NuStats, the HDS survey research firm contractor since July 1999, conducts the interviews and collects and analyzes the HDS data throughout the year.

HDS is a two-stage survey. Stage 1 is the *Household Interview*. NuStats sends an advance letter, signed by the postmaster general, to a representative sample of U.S. households. This letter emphasizes the importance of the HDS and asks for participation. These sample households are contacted either by telephone or in person and asked about the mail they send and receive, their adoption and use of various communications' technologies, their attitudes about mail service in general, and information relating to their household and personal demographics. Those respondent households are recruited to participate in HDS Stage 2.

Stage 2 is the *Mail Diary*. NuStats asks households that agree to participate in Stage 2 to record information about the mail they send and receive for a 7-day period from Monday to Sunday. Information recorded includes: number of mailpieces received and sent, industry mail source, mail characteristics, and attitudes regarding mail received. As an incentive for HDS Stage 2 participation, households are offered the options of receiving: \$30, \$30 to donate to the Lance Armstrong Foundation, or a roll of 100 First-Class Mail® stamps.

Data gathered in both HDS stages is available in a final report, "The Household Diary Study — Mail Use and Attitudes." The report is published in hard copy and as a free electronic file. facilities toward the purchase of postage stamps and embossed stamped envelopes (including aerogrammes) at the rate of \$0.80 per coupon, irrespective of the country where they were purchased.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

- **A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.
- **A1.** Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.
- **B.** PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:
 - Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
 - All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
 - Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."
- **B1.** PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.
- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
 - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- **E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.
- E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM C024.2.0 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.
- G. Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.
- **H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.
 - **H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
- $\mbox{\bf I.}$ Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:



- **K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
 - L. All official mail is prohibited.
 - M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
 - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- ${\bf R.}\,$ All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.
- R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
- **T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
- **U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."
- **U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.
- $\mbox{\bf U2.}$ Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to $\mbox{\bf Box}\,\mbox{\bf R}.$
- **U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
 - V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.
- W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Please display this poster prominently on bulletin boards in retail lobbies of main Post Offices $^{\text{\tiny{M}}}$, classified stations, and branches. Operators of contract postal units may display this poster at their option.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information via broadcast fax. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators at fax numbers provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of a facsimile Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all Postal Service ™ facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed for 30 days in Post Office lobbies, workroom floor areas, and other Postal Service facilities, unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The broadcast fax network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing and exploited children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service® only as described above. If Postal Service employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 1-800-843-5678.





Pacific Coral Reef Stamps

The Postal Service ™ will issue a souvenir sheet of the 37-cent *Pacific Coral Reef* stamps (Item 457100) on January 2, 2004, in Honolulu, Hawaii. The stamps, designed by Ethel Kessler, Bethesda, Maryland, and illustrated by John D. Dawson, Hilo, Hawaii, go on sale nationwide January 3, 2004. The souvenir sheet may not be split and the stamps may not be sold individually.

The Pacific Coral Reef stamps are the sixth in an educational series designed to promote appreciation of North America's major plant and animal communities. The previous issuances in the Nature of America series were the Sonoran Desert (1999), Pacific Coast Rain Forest (2000),

Great Plains Prairie (2001), Longleaf Pine Forest (2002), and Arctic Tundra (2003). This new issue portrays a typical coral reef near the U.S. territory of Guam.

Coral reefs and their surrounding waters are complex ecosystems supporting thousands of different life forms. But like the biologically rich rain forests of the tropics, they are also fragile realms, sensitive to temperature changes and highly vulnerable to human activities that exploit their resources. Reefs can stretch for miles in the clear, shallow waters of the tropics and subtropics. Built up primarily by coral polyps, tiny organisms that secrete calcium carbonate, these massive structures protect the shores of nearby

landmasses from wave-induced erosion while providing food and shelter for countless creatures. In Guam alone, scientists have documented approximately 6,000 marine species, including some 250 coral species.

To illustrate the diversity of species associated with a coral reef, artist John D. Dawson portrayed more than 30 different kinds of marine animals in his colorful painting. Although the scene itself is imaginary, all species and interactions are appropriate and were recommended by scientists.

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) will receive approximately two-thirds of their standard automatic distribution quantities for a PSA sheet stamp. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size (2,000 souvenir sheets/20,000 stamps).

Initial Supply to Post Offices

SDOs will make a subsequent automatic distribution to Post Offices for one-half of their standard automatic distribution quantities using PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return*. SDOs must not distribute this souvenir sheet to Post Offices before December 26, 2003.

Philatelic Requirement

SDOs will *not* receive a separate quantity of this souvenir sheet for their authorized philatelic centers. Philatelic centers must be supplied their quantities from the initial automatic distribution made to SDOs.

Additional Supply

Post Offices requiring additional souvenir sheet must requisition Item 457100 from their designated SDO using PS Form 17. SDOs requiring additional souvenir sheets must order them from the appropriate accountable paper depository (APD) using PS Form 17.

For fulfilling supplemental orders from SDOs, the San Francisco APD will receive 216,000 additional souvenir sheets; the Memphis, Chicago, and New York APDs will each receive 144,000 additional souvenir sheets; and the Denver APD will receive 72,000 additional souvenir sheets.

Sales Policy

All Post Offices must acquire and maintain a supply of each new commemorative stamp as long as customer demand exists, until inventory is depleted, or until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. If supplies run low, Post Offices must reorder additional quantities using their normal ordering procedures. The *Pacific Coral Reef* souvenir sheet may not be split and the stamps may not be sold individually.

PS Form 5454, Highway Contract Route Enroute Box Change

PS Form 5454, *Highway Contract Route Enroute Box Change*, was recently developed for postmasters and administrative officials to keep track of enroute boxes added to box contracts. When the supplier obtains 14 additional enroute boxes, the administrative official or postmaster sends this sheet to the contracting officer for processing and pay increase. The administrative official or postmaster usually attaches the form to the side of the supplier's mail case.

Signage will feature alternate access, Click-N-Ship™ service, the three Priority Mail® bundles that were introduced during the Holiday drive period, and an additional fourth bundle — Priority Mail service with Signature Confirmation[™] service.

And here's something else that's new for 2004 — Retail drive periods will go monthly. The Spring drive period, for example, will begin April 1 and run through June 30. That means changing POP materials midweek, instead of Saturdays under previous drive period schedules.

Welcome to the December Corner!

This month's edition has information on the balloon rate.

'Tis the Season to Collect the Balloon Rate

The holiday season is upon us and customers are rushing to our Post Offices and other access channels to mail holiday packages to their loved ones and friends. Undoubtedly, retail acceptance employees will encounter packages that will qualify for the balloon rate.

Forgetting to collect the balloon rate costs the Postal Service [™] approximately \$13 million a year on Priority Mail[®] packages alone. Similar revenue losses also exist for Parcel Post[®] balloon rate parcels as well as parcels subject to oversized and nonmachinable rates. We need your help in ensuring that we collect sufficient revenue to cover the additional transportation costs incurred for these packages.

How can you help the Postal Service recoup this lost revenue?

■ The balloon rate applies to Priority Mail and Parcel Post packages that measure more than 84 inches up to 108 inches in length + girth and weigh less than 15 pounds.

Note: For parcels, length is the measurement of the longest dimension and girth is the distance around the thickest part (perpendicular to the length).

- Watch the training video, "The Balloon Rate: A \$13 million Opportunity" (Course Number 18201-06) to understand how the balloon rate is applied and how to handle negative customer reactions. (Contact your local retail manager or training manager if you did not receive the video.)
- Be on the lookout for packages that are bulky and relatively lightweight.
- For Parcel Post balloon rate packages, check to see whether the package is machinable or nonmachinable. Remember, for Parcel Post, there is an additional surcharge for parcels that are nonmachinable. In those instances both the balloon rate and nonmachinable surcharge must be collected.
- Make sure your unit has a measuring tape. Parcel measuring tapes can be ordered through the Postal Products Unlimited catalog on eBuy at http://ebuy.usps.gov/jsp/co/Login.jsp. (Item 65873, Model Number N1025156, \$1.94 + shipping)

POM REVISION

Air, Highway, and Water Route Mail Transportation Service Contracts

Effective December 11, 2003, *Postal Operations Manual* (POM), Chapter 5, is revised to reflect current practices in the administration of mail transportation contracts.

Most of the changes involve simply replacing the terms contractor and contractors with the terms supplier and suppliers, respectively, throughout Subchapters 52 (Air Transportation Service), 53 (Highway Contract Service), and 55 (Water Route Service). The more substantial revisions are shown below.

We will incorporate these revisions into the printed version of POM 10 and also into the online version of the POM, which is accessible at the Postal Service $^{\text{M}}$ PolicyNet Web site; go to http://blue.usps.gov; click on $More\ References$, then Manuals.

Generally, *Regular* highway transportation contracts are competitively awarded. Contracts are normally awarded for a term of 4 years and are renewable by mutual agreement. An indemnity clause makes the Postal Service liable for the indemnity payment in the event the contract is terminated (for other than default) by the Postal Service before its scheduled expiration date.

Highway Contract Route Transportation Pay Cycle

Effective December 11, 2003, Handbook P-5, *Highway Contract Routes* — *Box Delivery Service*, is revised to allow Supply Management to continue to pay Transportation Highway Contracts every 28 days, but the term for the 28-day cycle will now be *highway contract route transportation pay cycle* (HCR-TPC) instead of *accounting period* (AP).

Total Cost of Ownership (TCO)

Have you ever wondered why Supply Management suggests that you make eBuy purchases, paying a seemingly higher price for an item that is available at a local store? You probably ask yourself, "Why would management want me to pay a higher price for something and at the same time tell me to do all I can to hold costs down?" The frustration of this situation seems quite valid, but if you take a closer look at all the costs involved in making a purchase from a local supplier and compare them to how little it costs to make an eBuy purchase, you will come away with a different conclusion. This closer examination is often referred to as an "all-in-cost" or "true cost," or "total cost of ownership" (TCO) analysis.

Hidden Costs

A TCO analysis is routinely performed for items that Supply Management purchases from all of the Postal Service's [™] national strategic contracts (e.g., office supplies, custodial products, furniture, etc.). All purchasing decisions

take item price into consideration, as this is usually the major component of the total cost. However, Supply Management professionals also take into account "all-in-cost" components — the hidden costs associated with requisition preparation and approval, invoicing, and payment — before awarding a contract.

An example of an "all-in-cost" consideration in a TCO analysis is the shipping and handling (S&H) cost. When you order items from eBuy, the item price almost always includes S&H. Even if you pick up the item yourself to avoid the S&H costs, you still have to factor in the cost of your time and — if you use a Postal Service vehicle to pick up the item — the cost of gas and maintenance.

Other less obvious costs are those associated with requisition preparation and approval, invoicing, and payment. The least expensive way to make and pay for a Postal Service purchase is by using eBuy. With eBuy, requisition preparation and approval, invoicing, and payment are

made electronically. If you purchase an item locally and pay for it using miscellaneous disbursement, no-fee money orders, or cash, the administrative costs to process the associated paperwork are significant, often costing more than the price paid for the item. Of course, using a Postal Service credit card helps to lower these costs, but when you consider the credit card reconciliation process, eBuy is still by far the least expensive method for anyone in the Postal Service to purchase and pay for an item.

You may often spend several hours searching for better prices for items you want to purchase. If you look hard enough, you may find the item you are looking for on sale. But considering the time and effort you spend to hunt out this "bargain," when you do find it, that bargain may, in fact, not be a bargain at all. Also, do not make the mistake of comparing the price of an item in one of our supplier's commercial catalogs with that of a competitor. Commercial catalogs do not show the Postal Service's negotiated prices. To obtain these prices, you must look the item up in eBuy or call the supplier and ask for the special Postal Service price. You will be pleasantly surprised at the discount.

All of these less obvious transaction costs are real and must be taken into consideration. The "hidden" costs of time spent tracking down the correct order information, shopping for the lowest price, placing and receiving the order, processing and paying the invoice, and all of the associated material costs for these necessary steps are significant. However, when you use eBuy, you can be assured of receiving a quality product, timely delivery, and a fair price at the absolute lowest transaction costs to the Postal Service. eBuy incorporates the latest technological advances to ensure our transaction costs are always kept to a minimum.

Product Quality Costs

Costs associated with product quality (warranties and returns) are also often overlooked. When you purchase an item through eBuy from one of our national strategic suppliers, warranty issues and returns are not a problem. Each of these suppliers has agreed to total customer satisfaction. Warranty issues and returns are accepted without added costs, such as restocking charges. Additionally, Supply

Management professionals are available to assist if you have a problem with a purchase from these suppliers. Our purchasing power with these suppliers is significant and suppliers do not want to lose Postal Service business due to unsatisfied customers.

There are also important organization-wide strategic benefits to consider when making a purchasing decision. The Postal Service takes its corporate goals toward environmental stewardship, supplier diversity, and small-business development very seriously. Each strategic partner is committed to search out and offer environmentally friendly products and services, manufactured by small minority- or woman-owned businesses. Similarly, there are important legal requirements that must be met throughout the purchasing process such as compliance with the Javits-Wagner-O'Day Act. This act mandates that certain items must be purchased from workshops that provide employment opportunities for blind and severely disabled persons.

Additionally, knowing how much the Postal Service spends for products and services is invaluable for Supply Management when making future strategic sourcing decisions. If we can accurately identify and consolidate similar purchases, we can leverage the organization's total spending to negotiate larger discounts from our suppliers. This "cheaper by the dozen" principle can amount to huge savings when applied to a \$66 billion organization. All of these strategic nonprice issues are automatically addressed when making purchases from our suppliers.

In short, TCO analysis is an important step that Supply Management professionals always consider when selecting a national supplier. So the next time you see an item "on sale" at a local business and wonder why you are asked to pay a slightly higher price through a Postal Service national contract, remember that a whole team of Supply Management professionals worked to ensure that you get the absolute best value (a combination of quality, delivery, and price) at the absolute lowest total cost of ownership.
