Moving? Give us a call! Change-of-address hits the phone lines



Moving can be a headache. The Postal Service is offering relief with expanded options for filing changes of address to ensure prompt, uninterrupted mail delivery.

Specifically, customers now can change their addresses by

telephone. Like the online option at usps.com, the new method helps reduce the number of illegible and incomplete hardcopy forms filled out at Post Offices.

More than 45 million Americans move each year. And, more than 7 million have changed their addresses online. The telephone option may prove as popular since it's so easy.

Customers simply call 800-ASK-USPS (800-275-8777) for interactive voice response assistance. Or they can speak with a customer service agent. Customers must have a valid credit card for identity verification and security, and there is a nominal fee for the service.

As always, USPS validates and confirms the address changes to protect customers' privacy and security.

Stuck on sticky notes: Fingerhut tests RPNs on catalog mailing



The first national customer to test repositionable notes (RPNs) in the new USPS "sticky notes" pilot program is stuck on the new product. In a national 750,000-piece mailing, Fingerhut used RPNs to increase catalog orders.

"We expect repositionable notes to stick with

the customer long after the mailpiece is gone," said Mike Sidders of Fingerhut's direct marketing group.

RPNs were attached to 200,000 catalogs, half of them urging customers to "Order Today! Don't Let This Be Your Last Catalog," while the other half were personalized with

the recipient's name and offered a free gift with any order. Results are being gathered now.

The USPS pilot test will run until April 2006. The cost for mailers to use RPNs is one-half cent for First-Class Mail® letters and 1.5 cents for Periodicals or Standard Mail® mailpieces.

Carolina cash: Three carriers combine for \$1 million in sales

Letter carriers in the Mid-Carolinas Performance Cluster are making the most of Customer Connect, with a North Carolina trio generating \$1 million in new business.

Charlotte Letter Carrier Ted Benjamin brought in more than \$500,000 in annual revenue from one business customer. In Fayetteville, Bruce Frias convinced the Games and Hobbies company to switch shippers and brought in more than \$250,000. And In Asheville, Gerald Brown generated a lead worth \$150,000 in new business from Digitech.

"There are still customers who don't realize that our products and services are directly competing with other shippers," Mid-Carolinas Small Business Specialist Elizabeth Thompson said. "Once we point that out and explain the free packaging, Delivery Confirmation and Click-N-Ship®, that USPS provides, as well as our competitive pricing, they're really impressed."

And of course there's added revenue potential with Business Connect™, which involves postmasters, station and branch managers and supervisors, who are introducing more customers to USPS products and services.

DMM REVISION

Parcel Return Service — Revised Format for Return Delivery Unit Labels

Effective June 9, 2005, Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 709.5.1.9 is revised to clarify the required frequency of pickup for Parcel Return Services (PRS) mail. In addition, new PRS label elements are described in DMM 709.5.4.4, and new PRS label examples are displayed in DMM 709.5.4.5. Minor text changes are made to other sections as listed below.

This revision clarifies the terms under which the Postal Service ™ will enter a service agreement with PRS customers, and the label format changes provide a consistent standard for label design. PRS pieces will no longer be addressed for delivery at specific return delivery units (RDUs), but will instead contain a unique ZIP Code ™ assigned to the agent that will allow local units to determine the proper handling of the mailpieces.

5.1.9 Pickup Schedule

[Revise 5.1.9 to read as follows:]

Parcels must be retrieved on a regular schedule: from RBMCs, at a minimum of every 48 hours excluding Sundays and USPS holidays; and from RDUs, at a minimum of once every 7 days unless more frequent pickups are deemed necessary by the Postal Service. Permit holders or their agents will be required to set up a recurring or standing appointment to retrieve PRS parcels. If the permit holder (or agent) already has existing appointments to deliver Parcel Select parcels to a destination bulk mail center or destination delivery unit that meet these standards, those same appointments can be used for retrieving PRS parcels.

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5.4 Label Formats

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5.4.3 Instructions

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[Revise item d to read as follows:]

d. "Once repackaged and labeled, you can mail the parcel at a post office near the original delivery address, deposit it in a collection box, or leave it with your letter carrier at the original delivery address."

5.4.4 Label Format Elements

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[Revise items e and f to read as follows:]

- e. Address for return delivery unit (RDU) labels. The address must contain the unique PRS ZIP Code (569 prefix) assigned by the USPS for the particular customer or agent. The address must consist of at least three lines in all capital letters, as specified below. The ZIP Code must be printed in at least 12-point type and may appear left-justified on a line directly below the Parcel Return Service line.
 - 1. Line 1: PRS AGENT'S OR MERCHANT'S NAME.
 - 2. Line 2: "PARCEL RETURN SERVICE" (or "PARCEL RETURN SVC").
 - 3. Line 3: The unique PRS 569## ZIP Code assigned by the USPS in the service agreement.
- f. Address for return bulk mail center (RBMC) labels. The address must contain the unique PRS ZIP Code (569 prefix) assigned by the USPS for the particular customer or agent. The address must consist of at least three lines in all capital

letters, as specified below. The ZIP Code must be printed in at least 12-point type and may appear left-justified on a line directly below the Parcel Return Service line.

- 1. Line 1: PRS AGENT'S OR MERCHANT'S NAME.
- 2. Line 2: "PARCEL RETURN SERVICE" (or "PARCEL RETURN SVC").
- 3. Line 3: The unique PRS 569## ZIP Code assigned by the USPS in the service agreement.

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[Revise item g2 to read as follows:]

2. The service type code (STC) contained in the barcode must identify the rate associated with the label designation. RDU labels will include STC 58 and RBMC labels will include STC 57.

Destination Sectional Center Facility Discounts for Nonletter-Size Periodicals Entered at a Destination Delivery Unit

Effective June 9, 2005, the Postal Service is revising Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 707.28.3.2 to specify when publishers may claim destination sectional center facility (DSCF) discounts for nonletter-size Periodicals mail in 5-digit bundles that they are depositing at a destination delivery unit (DDU). This revision addresses situations where publishers deposit 5-digit bundles at the DDU and the Postal Service generally is not sorting that mail to carrier routes on automated flat-sorting equipment.

Unsacked Bundles of Flat-Size Mail Entered at Destination Delivery Units

The Postal Service ™ is finding ways to make it easier for customers to enter mail. One way is by offering optional entry of unsacked bundles for specified flat-size mail. This will help reduce dependency on sacks and also help us increase efficiency and reduce costs.

Effective June 9, 2005, the Postal Service is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual* (DMM®) 343 and 345 to allow mailers to enter unsacked bundles of Standard Mail Enhanced Carrier Route (ECR) flats at destination delivery units (DDUs). Under these revised standards, there may be no more than one bundle for every 10 pounds (or increment) of mail per carrier route, a requirement we have included to minimize the number of bundles handled at DDUs. We also

are revising DMM 346.2.8.9 to add standards for maintaining separation of mail when unloading unsacked mailings at DDU facilities. We have reworded portions of DMM 346.5.2, 365, 366, 465, 466, 707.13.2.1, 707.23, and 707.28.4.6 regarding unsacked bundles of Bound Printed Matter flats, irregular parcels, and Periodicals nonletters for clarity and consistency.

When entering mail at DDUs facilities, mailers (or their drivers) must unload the mail within 1 hour of arrival and place the mail into containers that entry facility employees specify. DDU facility employees also may require drivers to keep bundles separated by individual 5-digit ZIP Codes™ or by 5-digit schemes.

a. The maximum weight for a single bundle is 40 pounds; the maximum number of bundles per carrier

route is one bundle for each 10 pounds (or increment) of mail for that route, as listed below:

- 1. Mailers must make the fewest number of bundles possible, up to the 40-pound maximum, while maintaining bundle integrity. To determine the maximum number of bundles allowable for a route, divide the total weight of mail for that route by 10 and round up to the next whole number. For example, if there are 34 pounds of mail for a carrier route, the maximum number of bundles for that route is four $(34 \div 10 = 3.4 = 4 \text{ bundles})$.
- 2. Mailers may balance the weight of the bundles across the maximum number of allowable bundles for a route. For example, if there are 36 pounds of mail for a carrier route, the maximum number of bundles for that route is four $(36 \div 10 = 3.6 = 4)$ bundles), which may be in four 9-pound bundles.
- b. Mailers must prepare bundles to comply with standards in 2.1 through 2.4 and 2.7 through 2.13.
- c. Mailers must enter bundles at DDUs according to standards in 346.5.0.

6.0 Preparation for Enhanced Carrier Route Flats

6.1 Basic Standards

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[Revise item c2 to read as follows:]

 Generally, flat-size pieces must be in sacks or in bundles on pallets. Certain flat-size pieces may be in letter trays under 3.4. When entering flat-size pieces at DDUs, mailers may prepare and transport unsacked, nonpalletized bundles according to standards in 2.6. [M620.1.1]

6.6 Required Sack Minimums

[Revise introductory text in 6.6 to read as follows:]

When sacking is required, mailers must prepare a sack when the quantity of mail for a required presort destination reaches either 125 pieces or 15 pounds of pieces, whichever occurs first. The following conditions apply: [M620.4.1]

Unloading of destination entry mailings is subject to these conditions:

 - When mail is not containerized or on pallets, drivers must place the mail into containers as delivery unit employees specify. Delivery unit employees may require drivers to place mail into containers to separate mail by 5-digit ZIP Codes or 5-digit schemes.
 - At facilities that cannot handle pallets, drivers must unload any palletized mail from the pallets and place it into containers as delivery unit employees specify. [E650.3.9c]

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5.0 Destination Delivery Unit (DDU) Entry * * * * * *

5.2 Eligibility

[Revise 5.2 to read as follows:]

Properly prepared Enhanced Carrier Route (ECR) flat-size pieces entered according to standards in 2.0 and 5.0 are eligible for the DDU rate when deposited at a DDU and addressed for delivery within that facility's service area. Mailers must unload mail at DDUs according to standards in 2.8.9. Only pieces eligible for and claimed at ECR rates are eligible for the DDU discount. No other rates or discounts are available for pieces receiving the DDU discount. When mailings contain pieces claimed at more than one destination entry rate, mailers must separate mail according to standards in 2.7.2. [E650.7.2]

[Revise introductory text in 5.3.1 to read as follows:]

Mailers may prepare flats as unsacked bundles under 2.6 or in bundles on pallets. Otherwise, mailers must prepare a sack when the quantity of mail for a required presort destination reaches either 20 addressed pieces or 20 pounds, whichever occurs first. Only mixed ADC sacks may contain smaller volumes. Optional SCF sacks are subject to the same minimum piece or pound provision as required sacks. Sacking also is subject to these conditions: [M722.2.3]

6.0 Preparation for Carrier Route Flats

6.3 Sacking

6.3.1 Required Sacking

[Revise introductory text in 6.3.1 to read as follows:]

Mailers may prepare flats as unsacked bundles under 2.6 or in bundles on pallets. Otherwise, mailers must prepare a direct carrier route sack when the quantity of mail for an individual carrier route reaches either 20 addressed pieces or 20 pounds, whichever occurs first; smaller volumes are not permitted. To determine the maximum number of bundles allowable for a route, divide the total weight of mail for that route by 10 and round up to the next whole number. For example, if there are 34 pounds of mail for a carrier route, the maximum number of bundles for that route is four $(34 \div 10 = 3.4 = 4 \text{ bundles})$.
 - 2. Mailers may balance the weight of the bundles across the maximum number of allowable bundles for a route. For example, if there are 36 pounds of mail for a carrier route, the maximum number of bundles for that route is four $(36 \div 10 = 3.6 = 4 \text{ bundles})$, which may be in four 9-pound bundles.
- b. Mailers must prepare 5-digit bundles for entry at DDUs according to standards in 6.2.1.
- c. Mailers must prepare bundles to comply with other applicable standards in 2.0.
- d. Mailers must enter bundles at DDUs according to standards in 466.5.0.

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6.2.2 Required Sacking

Otherwise, mailers must prepare a direct carrier route sack when the quantity of mail for an individual carrier route reaches either 10 addressed pieces or 20 pounds, whichever occurs first; smaller volumes are not permitted. Mailers then must place remaining bundles in 5-digit scheme carrier routes sacks or 5-digit carrier routes sacks, which have no minimum sack size. Carrier route sacks also are subject to these conditions: [M723.3.2]

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[Delete 6.2.5.]

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6.3 Preparation for Irregular Parcels Weighing 10 Pounds or More

[Revise introductory text of 6.3 to read as follows:]

Mailers may prepare irregular parcels as unsacked bundles under 2.6 or in bundles on pallets. When preparing irregular parcels in sacks, place parcels only in direct carrier route sacks. Each carrier route sack must contain a minimum of 20 pounds. Required preparation: [M723.4.0]

[Revise title and text of 2.7 to read as follows:]

2.7 Mailings of Unsacked Bundles

Mailers may present unsacked, nonpalletized bundles of BPM irregular parcels that are properly prepared for and entered at DDU rates and unloaded according to standards in 2.9.9. Pieces in these bundles are not eligible for barcoded discounts. [E752.1.7]

5.0 Destination Delivery Unit (DDU) Entry

5.3 Presorted Irregular Parcels

[Revise 5.3 to read as follows:]

Presorted irregular parcels in 5-digit scheme sacks and 5-digit sacks, on 5-digit scheme or 5-digit pallets, or prepared as unsacked 5-digit bundles may claim DDU rates. Mailers must enter mail at the appropriate facility under 5.1.

[E752.4.4]

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5.5 Carrier Route Irregular Parcels

[Revise 5.5 to read as follows:]

Carrier Route irregular parcels in sacks, on 5-digit scheme and 5-digit pallets, or prepared as unsacked carrier route bundles may claim DDU rates. Mailers must enter mail at the appropriate facility under 5.1. [E752.4.7]

13.2 Sortation

13.2.1 Sequencing

Preparation to qualify eligible pieces for carrier route rates is optional and need not be performed for all carrier routes in a 5-digit area. Carrier route rates apply to copies that are prepared in carrier route bundles of six or more addressed pieces each, subject to these standards:

[Revise item b to read as follows:]

- b. Nonletter-size mailings. Carrier route rates apply to carrier route bundles that are sorted in one of the following ways:
 - 1. Bundles sorted onto pallets prepared under 705.8.0, 705.10.0, 705.12.0, or 705.13.0, as appropriate.
 - 2. Bundles in carrier route, 5-digit scheme carrier routes, or 5-digit carrier routes sacks under 23.0. Sacks may be palletized under 705.8.0.
 - 3. Unsacked bundles entered at a destination delivery unit according to preparation standards in 23.4.2 and entry standards in 28.4.6.

23.0 Preparation of Carrier Route Periodicals

23.1 Basic Information

23.1.1 General Preparation Standards

[Revise introductory text to read as follows:]

Mailers must meet the following standards for carrier route mailings:

[Revise item d to read as follows:]

- d. Except as noted in 23.4.2, mailers must sack or palletize bundles of nonletter-size pieces according to one of the following:
 - Sack under 23.4, or under 705.10.1 if eligible to be cosacked with automation rate and presorted rate Periodicals pieces.
 - Palletized under 705.8.0, 705.10.0, 705.12.0, or 705.13.0. [M220.1.1]

23.4 Preparation—Flat-Size Pieces and Irregular Parcels

23.4.2 Exception to Sacking

[Revise 23.4.2 to read as follows:]

Sacking is not required for bundles prepared for and entered at a DDU, when the mailer unloads bundles under standards in 28.4.6. Mailers must prepare unsacked bundles as follows:

- a. The maximum weight for a single bundle is 40 pounds; the maximum number of bundles per carrier route is one bundle for each 10 pounds (or increment) of mail for that route, as follows:
 - Mailers must make the fewest number of bundles possible, up to the 40-pound maximum, while maintaining bundle integrity. To determine the maximum number of bundles allowable for a route, divide the total weight of mail for that route by 10 and round up to the next whole number. For example, if there are 34 pounds of mail for a carrier route, the maximum number of bundles for that route is four (34 ÷ 10 = 3.4 = 4 bundles).
 - 2. Mailers may balance the weight of the bundles across the maximum number of allowable bundles for a route. For example, if there are 36 pounds of mail for a carrier route, the maximum number of bundles for that route is four $(36 \div 10 = 3.6 = 4 \text{ bundles})$, which may be in four 9-pound bundles.
- b. Mailers must clearly label carrier route bundles using optional endorsement lines under 708.7.0 or facing slips under 19.15. [M220.4.2]

23.5 Firm Bundles

[Revise 23.5 to read as follows:]

A *firm bundle* is two or more copies for the same address placed in one bundle. If each copy has a delivery address, each may be claimed as a separate piece for presort and on the postage statement or the firm bundle may be claimed as one piece. The Postal Service considers a firm bundle that is sorted and claimed as one piece to be one addressed piece for rate eligibility purposes, regardless of the number of copies in the bundle. Mailers must clearly label firm bundles using facing slips or barcoded pressuresensitive labels under 19.0, or optional endorsement lines under 708.7.0. [M220.1.4]

28.0 Destination Entry Rate Eligibility

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28.4 Destination Delivery Unit (DDU)

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28.4.6 Vehicle Unloading

[Revise 28.4.6 to read as follows:]

At delivery units, drivers must unload all mail within 1 hour of arrival. Unloading procedures are as follows:

a. If pallets or pallet boxes are stacked, drivers must unload, unstrap, and unstack them.

- When drivers unload containerized mail, delivery unit employees may require drivers to place the containers together by 5-digit ZIP Codes or 5-digit schemes.
- c. When mail is not containerized or on pallets, drivers must place the mail into containers as delivery unit employees specify. Delivery unit employees may require drivers to place mail into containers to separate mail by 5-digit ZIP Codes or 5-digit schemes.
- d. At facilities that cannot handle pallets, drivers must unload any palletized mail from the pallets and place it into containers as delivery unit employees specify.
- e. For scheduled arrivals at DDUs when USPS employees are not present, drivers must place the mail in a secure location protected from the weather. [E250.4.6]

ELM REVISION

Changes in Processing Dues Withholding

Effective June 9, 2005, Employee and Labor Relations Manual (ELM) 922, Dues Collection Schedule, 924.421, Postmasters, and 925.122, Special Circumstances, are revised to reflect a change in how dues withholding is processed. On November 1, 2004, the National Association of Postmasters of the United States (NAPUS) began processing SF 1187, Request for Voluntary Allotment of Compensation for Payment of Employee Organization Dues, and PS Form 1188, Cancellation of Organization Dues from Payroll Withholdings. Personnel offices no longer process SF 1187 or PS Form 1188 for Union Code P (NAPUS). Distributed Data Entry and Distributed Reporting (DDE/DR) no longer allows personnel staff access to add or cancel dues for Union Code P.

Payroll Accounting, Finance, has notified personnel offices of this change. NAPUS has advised its members and has revised SF 1187 to reflect the changes in processing cancellation of dues withholding requests.

Additional conforming revisions as summarized below reflect current practices relevant to dues withholding.

SAFETY TALK

Schools Are Out — Defensive Driving Is No Accident

A defensive driver is one who commits no driving errors and makes allowances for the lack of skill or improper practices of others. A defensive driver compensates for unusual weather, road, and traffic conditions and isn't tricked by others' failure to do so. Alert to accident-inducing situations, a defensive driver recognizes in advance the need for preventive action and knows when it is necessary to slow down, stop, or yield right-of-way to avoid an accident.

School bells are now silent and once again millions of youngsters will be in the neighborhoods during the time we deliver mail. As Postal Service™ drivers, you must expect more unwary young pedestrians wandering into roadways or darting from between cars or hidden places. This is a true test of anyone's defensive driving skills!

In spite of all the training children receive at school, and in spite of parental instruction and admonition, some children do play in the street. Most dangerous, perhaps, are those who play merely *near* the street, leaping out suddenly after a ball or chasing a dog.

We are all familiar with the necessity of caution near playgrounds, but we should take care also while driving in residential areas or anywhere else. Remember the following things:

- Whenever you see a ball rolling in the street, you are likely to see a child following it. Slow down and prepare to stop quickly.
- When the ice cream vendor starts into the neighborhood, watch for children coming from all directions.
- Pay attention to the lone child walking along the street. You are much more likely to overlook a single youngster than several together.
- Children and others on roller skates, skateboards, or roller blades can roll into the street. They require your extreme alertness.

- Bicyclists, especially young or novice riders, should be watched carefully and provided plenty of room.
- Never back up to redeliver a missed box when mail is out of sequence. Get out of the vehicle, secure it properly, and walk back if you can do so safely.
- Never give mail to children from the vehicle. If children approach the vehicle, get out of the vehicle and ask them to move away. Double-check around the entire vehicle before proceeding.

Be Alert So That Children Don't Get Hurt

And while we're on the subject, this is a good time to talk about pedestrians in general. Here's a fact every driver and pedestrian should know — while less than three out of every one hundred accidents involve a pedestrian, approximately three out of every ten fatalities are pedestrians. In other words, the severity ratio of these accidents is ten times the frequency ratio. This emphasizes the pedestrian's disadvantage when matched against a moving mass of steel.

I urge all of you to be extra cautious now that school is closed. Let's protect our most precious commodity — our children. Drive defensively at all times and remember that you represent the Postal Service when you get behind the wheel.

Note: The purpose of this safety talk is to generate child safety awareness with Postal Service drivers.

HANDBOOK F-1 REVISION

PS Form 1096, Receipt

Effective June 9, 2005, Handbook F-1, *Post Office Accounting Procedures*, is revised with new procedures for making temporary cash payments. Manual Post Offices™ and retail postal units [i.e., offices that do not have POS ONE systems or integrated retail terminals (IRTs)] must use PS Form 1096, *Receipt*, for customers who require receipts for purchases.

Post Offices and retail postal units with POS ONE or IRT equipment must not keep copies of PS Form 1096 at the window nor use them as a customer receipt for purchases.

The retail associate must provide each customer with a system-generated receipt for all purchases (see Handbook F-1, section 482.2). In the event of power outages or POS ONE or IRT system failures, the office may use PS Form 1096 as part of its contingency plan for manual operations.

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621.1 Making Temporary Cash Payments

When it is determined that a local cash purchase is required, the following procedures apply:

- 1> The postmaster, manager, supervisor, or designated employee must complete and issue PS Form 1096, Receipt, for temporary cash advances to the requesting party. The requesting party then presents the PS Form 1096 to a retail associate to issue the cash advance.
- 2> Upon issuance of the cash advance, the retail associate must maintain the original PS Form 1096 with his or her credit.
- 3> When the original sales receipt for items purchased is presented to the retail associate, the original PS Form 1096 must be returned to the requesting party. The office must maintain the original sales receipt, with the approved eBuy requisition, as supporting documentation.
- 4> This temporary cash advance transaction for cash purchases must be completed and settled by close of business the same day.

NOTICE

Ordering Field Banking Supplies

The Postal Service ™ has entered into a national contract with Harland, Inc., for all bank deposit tickets, endorsement stamps, and bank address stamps. All offices must order these supplies through the national contract. The eBuy purchasing program is the preferred method for placing orders through this contract, and all offices must use eBuy if they have access to it. Offices that order these supplies via Harland's toll-free number will be charged a \$2.50 surcharge per item ordered. The only offices authorized to order supplies through the toll-free number are those without eBuy access.

Order Placement

Offices With eBuy Access

Before placing an order, an office must have a valid Federal Standard Requisitioning and Issue Procedures (FEDSTRIP) number and ensure that locally established buying procedures have been followed including obtaining prior funding approval for ALL ORDERS. *If orders are*

through eBuy, management and funding approvals are automated. For questions regarding the use of the eBuy system, contact the district Finance office.

The following steps outline how to order field depository banking supplies through eBuy:

- Type http://ebuy.usps.gov/ into the Web browser address field. The eBuy logon page displays.
- 2. Type your eBuy logon identification and password, then press Enter. The eBuy Web page displays.
- Click on the Requisition tab, and create a new requisition. Select the Harland catalog to order field depository banking supplies.
- 4. Use the following required information to order deposit ticket and/or endorsement stamps:
 - The FEDSTRIP number.
 - The 10-digit unit ID number, which consists of the office's 6-digit Finance number and the Standard Field Accounting Procedure (SFAP) 4-digit

identification number. *Note:* The unit identification number is not the office phone number.

- The Post Office[™] name.
- 5. Use the following additional information to order a bank address stamp:
 - The bank name.
 - The vault address, including the city, state, and ZIP+4[®] code. This information may be obtained from the district Finance office.
- Most shipping information is pre-populated based on the FEDSTRIP number; the ordering office, however, must verify the information to ensure that the shipping address is accurate.
- 7. If the order is to be shipped to a different address, change the shipping data by going to the default address option within eBuy. This will allow the shipping address to be changed while retaining the original FEDSTRIP number address for billing purposes.
- 8. After completing the required information, submit the eBuy order.

All charges will be allocated to the FEDSTRIP number in the order.

Offices Without eBuy Access

All bank deposit tickets and self-inking bank endorsement/address stamps must be ordered through eBuy. Postal Service facilities that do not have access to eBuy may place orders by the following method:

- 1. Call the deposit ticket supplier, Harland, at 1-800-552-2902. All orders placed via the toll-free number will be shipped to the address that corresponds to the FEDSTRIP number; alternate addresses are not allowed for these orders. If alternate shipping is required, the district Finance office may place the order via eBuy.
- Use the following required information to order deposit ticket and/or endorsement stamps via the tollfree number:
 - The FEDSTRIP number.
 - The 10-digit unit ID number, which consists of the office Finance six-digit number and SFAP 4-digit identification number. Note: The unit identification number is not the office telephone number.
 - Post Office[™] name.
- 3. Use the following additional information to order a bank address stamp:
 - The bank name.

The vault address, including the city, state, and ZIP+4 code. This information is available from the district Finance office.

A \$2.50 offline processing fee will be charged for each item that is ordered via the toll-free number. All charges will be allocated to the FEDSTRIP number in the order.

Contract Postal Units

The host Post Office will order deposit slips for the contract postal unit (CPU) through one of the two methods described above based on the host Post Office's access to the eBuy system. All orders will be mailed to the host Post Office.

New Post Office or Contract Station

The district Finance office must place the initial deposit service supply order for a newly opened Post Office or contract station. The following steps must be followed:

- The district Finance office must call the deposit ticket supplier, Harland, at 1-800-552-2902, to set up a new location.
- Use the following required information to order deposit ticket and/or endorsement stamps via the tollfree number:
 - The FEDSTRIP number.
 - The 10-digit unit ID number, which consists of the office's 6-digit Finance number and the SFAP 4-digit identification number. *Note:* The unit identification number is not the office phone number.
 - The Post Office name.
- Use the following additional information to order a bank address stamp:
 - The bank name.
 - The vault address, including the city, state, and ZIP+4 code. This information is available from the district Finance office.
- Provide the district contact name and phone number to allow Harland to confirm the details of the order, if necessary.

Order Rejection Notification Process

Harland will update the USPS Rejected Orders Report daily. Offices may view the report on the Finance Web site on the Postal Service Intranet:

- Under "Financial Reports & Presentations", click on Harland / eBuy Deposit Ticket Rejection Report.

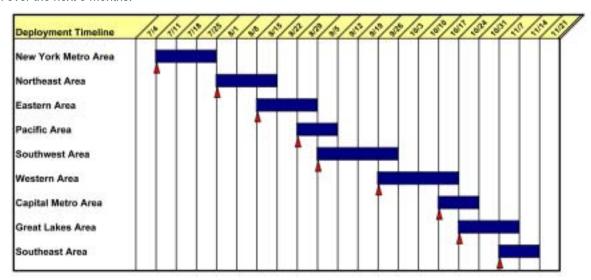

FAST National Deployment Begins in July

The Facility Access and Shipment Tracking (FAST) system national deployment to replace the Drop Shipment Appointment System (DSAS) will begin in July. The phased deployment begins with the New York Metro Area, with all areas phased in over the next 5 months.

Customer Registration in PostalOne!

DSAS Logon IDs will not work with FAST. All drop shippers, including those who make appointments by telephone, MUST register for a FAST ID through *PostalOne!* at *www.usps.com/postalone*. Customers who already have a *PostalOne!* account and also need access to FAST must register by calling the *PostalOne!* Customer Care Center at 1-800-522-9085.

Recurring Appointment Submission

All drop shippers who currently have recurring appointments MUST reapply using PS Form 6241, *Recurring Appointment Request*, available at *http://www.usps.com/forms/welcome.htm;* click *All Online PDF Forms in Numeric Order*, then *PS Form 6241 (PDF)*. Recurring appointment requests should be submitted to the Postal Service[™] 3 weeks before the facility's scheduled start date, for example June 20 for facilities in the NY Metro Area. Once a recurring appointment is scheduled in FAST, it will no longer be necessary to renew the request every 6 months.

FASTforward MLC to Be Retired

Effective September 30, 2005, FAST*forward* Mailing List Correction (MLC)® will be retired and replaced with NCOA^{Link}. In continuing its commitment to provide mailers with cost-effective and secure technology, the National Customer Support Center (NCSC) is accepting and processing applications from current FAST*forward* MLC licensees for the new NCOA^{Link} technology.

Since full implementation in October 2004, NCOA^{Link} has been successfully providing increased data security, protection of customer information privacy, and ease of use for its licensees. Its data security enables it to be used by more mailers, more often, and more conveniently. Its innovative design also protects customer information privacy by limiting what can be seen. With the increased data security and customer information privacy available with NCOA^{Link}, the use of this important tool by mailers is growing rapidly.

FASTforward MLC licensees must complete the application process to become licensed for the new NCOA^{Link}

technology. Many licensees have already taken advantage of the opportunity and applied for the NCOA^{Link} license. New NCOA^{Link} licensees will benefit from now having 18 months of change-of-address data available, a valuable increase over the 13 months of data previously provided under *FASTforward*. In addition, licensees will enjoy ownership of all hardware and the discontinuation of the *FASTforward* MLC "black box," which has been rendered obsolete with the conversion to NCOA^{Link}.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
 - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.
- E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM C024.2.0 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.
- F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

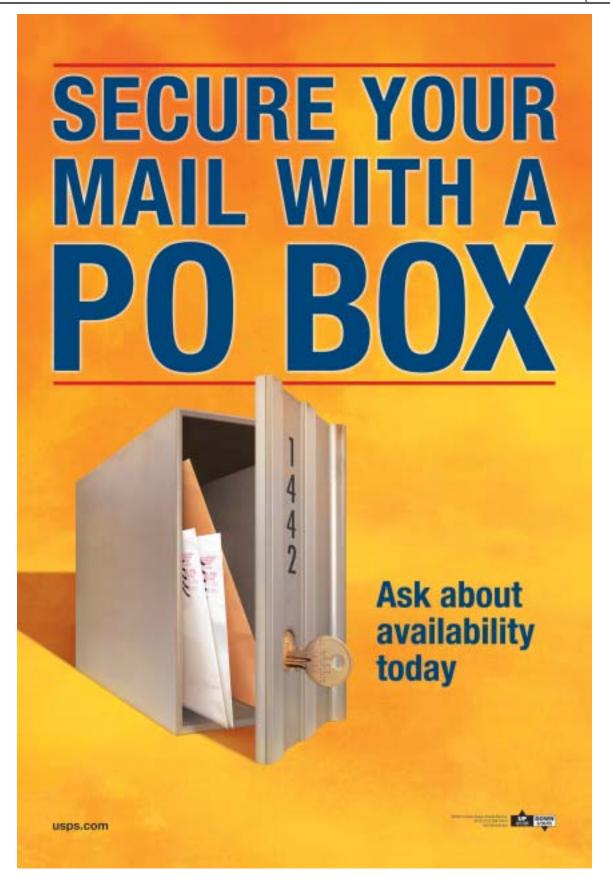

Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Please display this poster prominently on bulletin boards in retail lobbies of main Post Offices™, classified stations, and branches. Operators of contract postal units may display this poster at their option.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

This poster is published in cooperation with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, the United States Department of Justice, and the National Association of Letter Carriers. Information appearing on this poster is selected solely by the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children (NCMEC).

In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information via broadcast fax. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators at fax numbers provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of a facsimile Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all Postal Service™ facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed for 30 days in Post Office lobbies, workroom floor areas, and other Postal Service facilities, unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The broadcast fax network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing and exploited children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service® only as described above. If Postal Service employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 800-843-5678.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those postmarks that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the postmark, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POST-MARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

Chief Marketing Officer's Growth Award — Updated Guidelines

As the Marketing department continues to introduce new programs and strategies aimed at generating revenue, promoting products and services, and keeping customers informed about Quick, Easy, Convenient™ solutions offered by the United States Postal Service®, Chief Marketing Officer (CMO) and Executive Vice President Anita Bizzotto continues her commitment to ensure that postmasters, managers, and supervisors have the right tools at the right time to achieve success.

Both she and Deputy Postmaster General and Chief Operating Officer (COO) Patrick Donahoe are committed to recognizing postmasters, managers, and supervisors who have contributed the most toward growing the business. That recognition comes in the form of Marketing's highest honor — the CMO's Growth Award, which was introduced at the beginning of fiscal year 2003.

These updated guidelines include a new opportunity to earn points. Points earned through Business Connect™ activities now qualify as points toward the CMO's Growth Award (see the "Marketing Outreach" section for details).

Guidelines

What: The Growth Award, sponsored by the CMO, is nonmonetary recognition in the form of a specially designed trophy to honor outstanding marketing efforts. It is the highest marketing honor for postmasters, managers, and supervisors who are most successful in marketing and growth activities.

Who: The program is open to postmasters and executive and administrative schedule (EAS) managers/supervisors (nonpostmasters) in performance clusters. Account representatives, customer relations coordinators (CRCs), and Marketing staff members, either in the field or at Headquarters, are not eligible. Exceptions are those who are officially detailed into postmaster or customer service assignments, such as an officer-in-charge or an acting station manager. A postmaster who employs a CRC may, by marking the submission form, submit the CRC as a Growth Partner.

When: The calendar year for the Growth Award begins the first day of the fiscal year and ends the last day of the fiscal year. To compete for a Growth Award, participants must send a copy of the submission form, qualifying activities, and supporting documentation — such as published outreach articles and seminar participation — within 3 weeks of their occurrence to Headquarters Marketing at the address noted on the submission form. Headquarters Marketing collects and combines each participant's submissions throughout the fiscal year to form a complete entry package. At the end of the fiscal year, participants must send

that year's revenue numbers as well as the revenue numbers from the previous fiscal year and a submission form to Headquarters Marketing. Participants must obtain revenue numbers from official financial records.

Where: Marketing announces the Growth Award winners at the legislative conferences sponsored by the National Association of Postmasters of the United States (NAPUS) and the National League of Postmasters of the United States (League). Postmasters attending the legislative meetings receive their awards at those events. For postmasters not attending those events and for EAS managers/ supervisors who win in their categories, local managers arrange appropriate ceremonies.

Why: The Postal Service ™ is committed to building on current efforts to achieve growth through customer value, improved service, improved operational efficiency, and an enhanced customer-focused and performance-based culture. Postmasters, managers, and supervisors in the field are leaders in the Postal Service's efforts to connect with the Preferred segment (millions of small businesses around the nation) and the Household segment. The efforts of postmasters, managers, and supervisors are vital to the Postal Service's success, and this award recognizes their outstanding results.

How: There are six levels of competition within each area, and Headquarters Marketing determines winners using a cumulative point system within three growth categories revenue generation, marketing initiatives, and marketing outreach. Participants receive points for documented activities important to the Postal Service's growth strategies. Headquarters Marketing describes additional marketing initiatives throughout the year in official Postal Service and Marketing publications, and provides participation ideas and instructions on how to document activities. Headquarters Marketing outlines the rules of the program and monitors and verifies documented points. To qualify for consideration, participants must meet minimum point requirements and have at least one point in each growth category and must then complete and submit a copy of the Growth Award submission form, which is available on page 72 in this issue of the Postal Bulletin. After the program ends each year, Headquarters Marketing tallies all points for all participants and informs area vice presidents and district managers of the participants with the highest number of points. After district managers approve individual winners, Headquarters Marketing notifies those winners. Headquarters Marketing evaluates the program each year and outlines any updates or changes to the program in the Postal Bulletin.

Growth Categories

The three growth categories are revenue generation, marketing initiatives, and marketing outreach. To be eligible, participants must have at least one point in each of these three broad categories.

Revenue Generation

- Maintain revenue level of the previous fiscal year = 1 point.
- Percentage of increased revenue each percent of increase = 1 point.
- Increase in walk-in revenue (WIR) over same period last year (SPLY) — WIR per transaction, each percent of increase over last year's total = 1 point.
- WIR divided by LDC45 workhours improvement over previous year:
 - If base is 74% or below, each percentage of improvement = 1/2 point.
 - If performance to goal is 75%–85%, each percentage of improvement = 1 point.
 - If performance to goal is 86%–99%, each 1/2 percentage of improvement = 1 point.
 - If performance to goal is 100%, total points awarded = 10 points.
- Sale of Express Mail Corporate Account (Express Mail® and Global Express Mail®) — each account = 1 point.
- Participation in other revenue generation activities throughout the year, as described in *Grow!*, *Postal Bulletin*, or other official Postal Service publications each activity = 1 point minimum, with bonus points possible.

Revenue points are based on numbers shown on the FY printout. Participants must send a copy of the previous year's printout (i.e., FY04) and the current year's printout (i.e., FY05) together with one submission sheet.

Marketing Initiatives

- Promotion of Stamps by Phone[™] service and Stamps by Mail[®] service — each percentage of increase in revenue through these channels = 1 point.
- Increase in sales of packaging materials each percentage of increase over previous year = 1 point.
- Revenue generated through the Inside Sales program:
 - For levels 21 and below and for the nonpostmaster category, each \$100 of revenue generated = 1 point.
 - For levels 22 and above, each \$500 of revenue generated = 1 point.
- Promotion of Click-N-Ship® service:
 - For levels 20 and below and for the nonpostmaster category, each \$100 over previous year's revenue = 1 point.
 - For levels 21 and above, each \$500 over previous year's revenue = 1 point.
- Maintaining at least the national average in Mystery Shopper = 1 point.
- Participation in other marketing initiatives throughout the year as described in *Grow!*, *Postal Bulletin*, or other official Postal Service publications — each activity = 1 point minimum, with bonus points possible.

Marketing Outreach

- Newspaper articles (these articles are generated through the Marketing Outreach articles published by Headquarters Marketing for local use; along with the submission form, participants must send a copy of each article and must include the publication's name, location, and date) each published article = 1 point.
- Headquarters Marketing—approved presentations made to the local business community — each presentation = 1 point.
- Results from promoting participation by local businesses in larger Marketing seminars or events, such as Small Business seminars, Direct Mail seminars, Postal Customer Council[®] (PCC[®]) meetings, and National Postal Forum each customer participating in each event = 1 point.
- Participation in PCC meetings each meeting attended = 1 point.

- Tip of the Month published in *Grow!* each tip published = 1 point.
- Participation in other marketing outreach activities throughout the year, as described in *Growl, Postal Bulletin,* or other official Postal Service publications each activity = 1 point minimum, with bonus points possible.
- Postmasters and managers of customer services in stations and branches who are registered for

Business Connect™ automatically receive matching Growth Award points for each presentation they make and document through the Business Connect Web site. Note: This is the only instance in which participants do not need to submit supporting documentation for activities.

Field Advertising Guidelines and Policy

These Field Advertising Guidelines provide Postal Service™ policy and procedures for preparing advertising to Postal Service customers.

Policy

Postmasters and managers who wish to advertise information to Postal Service customers via postcards, letters, fliers, and signs as well as mass media elements (TV, radio, and print) must use authorized Field Advertising materials.

Local, district, or area levels may not design and produce (or have others design and produce) cards, letters, and fliers intended for distribution to customers, as well as interior or exterior signs that may be viewed by customers, without prior approval by the Headquarters manager of Field Advertising.

These guidelines are designed to protect corporate logos, copyrighted or trademarked products and services, and the overall accuracy, integrity, and image of Postal Service communications.

Definition

"Field Advertising-Authorized Materials" — A collection of postcards, letters, fliers, and signs as well as mass media elements bearing approved images, logos, and messaging in support of a wide range of Postal Service products, services, and issues. Some of these standard advertising documents may be customized using a "multiple choice" menu of tailored messages, images, and office locations and hours of operation.

Process

Funding — The Headquarters Marketing Department has designated funds for the purpose of field advertising. The Headquarters Marketing Department allocates these funds through the area to support district advertising efforts. The area or district, at its discretion, may allocate additional funds for such use. The Headquarters manager

of Field Advertising must approve the Area Advertising Plan for any advertising expenditures. Local promotional initiatives cannot compromise or contradict national campaigns or corporate messaging. The Headquarters manager of Field Advertising provides direction and works with the areas to develop their plans so they are in concert with the Postal Service Corporate Advertising Plan. Local funds that are planned, allocated, and used for advertising and promotional work are carried on Line 39.

Menu of Available Messaging Materials — Postmasters and managers can view the menu of available correspondence and signage tools on the corporate Intranet at http://blue.usps.gov/wps/portal; at the top-center of the page, click on Inside USPS; under the "Marketing" section, click on Advertising; under "Advertising Reference" and under "Column 1: Media," click on Field Advertising. Here in the Field Advertising section, all creative material available on MessageMaker is provided for viewing. In MessageMaker, authorized users can select from an array of messaging materials promoting many items, such as an Automated Postal Center® (APC®) and passports, or announcing "Grand Openings" and "Extended Service Hours." Postmasters and managers should make note of the pieces they wish to order and the quantity they need.

Access and Customization — Postmasters and managers can contact their district marketing manager to request these materials. The district marketing manager or designee works with the postmaster or manager to select and customize the materials when customization is available.

The district marketing manager or designee completes PS Form 1357, *Request for Computer Access*, and submits it for approval to the area. The area office completes PS Form 1357 and forwards it to the Headquarters manager of Field Advertising for final authorization and processing. Once ordered, the materials are produced for the requestor in 2–5 business days.

For other material needed for local messaging, advertising, or promotions that are not available on MessageMaker, requesters must work through their area advertising coordinator and the Headquarters manager of Field Advertising for the development, production, and media placement of any material.

To facilitate the use of Field Advertising—authorized materials, the area advertising coordinator may work with the Headquarters manager of Field Advertising to schedule

training sessions for district and area requestors. The training is 1 hour and is offered in a "Webinar" format.

Remind your customers they can apply for passports at the Post Office, and encourage them to pick up a Global FIRSTCLASS PHONECARD® (FCPC) before they travel. All offices that offer passports received a Global FCPC counter card in their Spring Drive Period POP kit. Keep this counter card on display near the passport window through Oct. 31. In addition, locations offering passports received a blue and white passport banner to display outside the office.

Know the Security Features of Postal Money Orders



The security features of Postal Money Orders are crucial to safeguarding our customers' investment. Take some time to familiarize yourself with the security features of Postal Money Orders, and make sure you check for these security features before you accept or cash a Postal Money Order:

- When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
- When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with "USPS" repeated.
- There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts which might indicate that the amounts were changed.
- The maximum value of a domestic Postal Money Order is \$1,000, and the maximum value of an international Postal Money Order is \$700.

Notice 299 take-ones (highlighting money order security features) are available from the Topeka Material Distribution Center (1-800-332-0317). You may provide these to customers so they can recognize a valid U.S. Postal Services Money Order.

Raise Passport Revenue During the Busy Travel Season

The most popular season for travel is beginning this month, so take the following steps to maximize the revenue-building opportunity that passport service can bring to your Post Office:



- Remind customers that they can apply for a passport at the Post Office and that many locations also offer passport photos.
- If your Post Office has received a blue and white passport banner, be sure that it is clean and visible to customers.
- For customers who wish to receive their passports sooner, recommend that they pay the fee for Department of State expedited processing and use Express Mail® service to send and receive applications.
- Direct customers to usps.com/passport if they prefer to download application forms in PDF format.

What's Your PO Box IQ?

Improving PO Box occupancy is one of our biggest ongoing revenue goals, so make sure you're well versed in PO Box services so you can educate customers about the benefits and advantages of having a PO Box.

Here are a few things to help you generate PO Box revenue:

- Make sure you know sizes, availability, and prices of PO Boxes in your Post Office.
- Know the benefits of PO Boxes: they're secure, convenient, and they can help customers keep business and personal mail separate. Share this information with customers!
- Be courteous, enthusiastic, and tuned-in to your customers' particular needs.
