### Mail connects: Be part of the moment.

A study of the mail's importance to consumers, sponsored by the U.S. Postal Service  $^{\mathsf{TM}}$ , found that mail creates a moment most people don't want to miss.

Each day, Americans open their mail with anticipation and give it their undivided attention. That ritual has a name: the Mail Moment. An understanding of that moment is helping marketers tailor their mailings to consumers who set aside time to focus solely on what they have to say.


The study revealed these powerful insights for mailers:

- Consumers are eager to see what's in their mail.
   About 98 percent bring in their mail the day it's delivered.
- Mail takes you to the person in charge. It's usually sorted by the person who manages the household and makes financial decisions.
- Mail has a loyal readership. Consumers spend an average 30 minutes reading their mail, making it possible to grab their complete attention for up to a half hour.
- Consumers like mail that helps them perform tasks such as managing the home, overseeing finances and shopping.

Beyond that, the mail evokes emotion — 56 percent say receiving mail is a "real pleasure," 55 percent "look forward" to the mail they receive, and 67 percent feel mail is more personal than the Internet.

The point? Mail connects in ways no other media can match. People welcome it into their lives. And because they do, mailers have an opportunity to create an emotional connection with consumers through their mailings. Now that's effective communication. The Mail Moment — there's nothing else like it.

### Mail works! Potter keynote speaker at direct marketing conference



Direct Mail comprises a large portion of USPS® business, so it should come as no surprise that when the Direct Marketing Association gathers, the Postal Service™ is there. Thousands of direct marketers converged on New York City for the Direct Marketing Days New York conference, June 28–30.

Keynote speaker Post-

master General Jack Potter discussed the importance of USPS to marketers and how the Postal Service has evolved into a customer-driven organization. He also spoke of Americans' confidence in mail delivery. "In simple terms, mail works," said Potter.

To illustrate his point, Potter cited a Customized MarketMail® campaign by Melbourne, FL, Wuesthoff Medical Center. The center designed a unique mailpiece to promote its emergency room facilities — a life-sized card depicting a cast of a broken ankle, with the ad message handwritten on the mailpiece as if it were literally a cast signed by friends and family. It even included a wallet card with the emergency room phone number and the message "From head to toe, we've got your health care covered."

Not only did the mailing get the attention of the 14,000 people who received it, but the word-of-mouth and media coverage it generated further boosted the return on investment.

"Mail works because it's read, it has credibility and it has value to the recipient," said Potter. "Those who use mail will ultimately make a competitive advantage for themselves, their firm and their clients."

### Cleaning up 11 million packages: Connecticut business on the soap box for Carrier Pickup

"The mail remains the best way to share joyous news and invite friends and family to come together for a special



Ten stamps commemorating the historic events of the Civil Rights Movement were unveiled in Washington, DC, at a performance of If This Hat Could Talk, a musical stage play that recounts the experiences of civil rights activist Dr. Dorothy Height.



Height was a major leader of the 1960s Civil

Rights Movement. She marched with Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., sat in sessions with Stokely Carmichael, rode with Rosa Parks and participated in meetings with President Kennedy.

"The United States Postal Service has to be commended for issuing the *To Form A More Perfect Union* stamps," said Dr. Height, Chair/President Emerita, National Council of Negro Women. "They herald the struggle of men, women and children in the quest for equality." The stamps go on sale nationwide Aug. 30.

## USPS, APWU reach tentative contract extension agreement: Covers period from Nov. 20, 2005, to Nov. 20, 2006

The Postal Service and the American Postal Workers Union (APWU) have announced a tentative 1-year contract extension. Upon ratification by union members, the agreement will affect approximately 287,000 employees represented by the APWU.

The tentative agreement provides for a 1.6 percent wage increase effective March 18, 2006, continuation of the cost-of-living allowance and covers the period from Nov. 20, 2005, and continues through Nov. 20, 2006.

## Will the real identity theft source please stand up? Credit card ad incorrectly suggests mailbox is cause

A recent ad sponsored by several credit card companies can leave consumers with the mistaken idea that their mailbox is a big source of identity theft in this country. The full page ad appeared in *Time, Newsweek, U.S.* News and World Report and Business Week showing an open mailbox labeled "Database" and the tagline "Most identity thieves don't gather their data from a computer." If you're looking at the picture, it's easy to conclude that mail is the source of most identity theft.

But it isn't.

A Federal Trade Commission (FTC) report shows that 53 percent of identity theft stems from online activities. Offline activities, such as lost and stolen wallets, misplaced, forgotten or discarded transaction receipts or "shoulder surfing" when you're using an ATM are some of the other ways identity thieves can get your personal and financial information.

And mail? Well, an earlier FTC report shows that stolen mail accounts for only 4 percent of identity theft in the United States. Just 4 percent! Mail is one of the safest, most secure ways to communicate. And the Postal Inspection Service is on the job 24/7 to keep it that way.

The Postal Service is working with the credit card companies involved to educate them on the misperceptions the ad raises and ask that they accurately portray the security of the mail in future identity theft ads.

*To Form A More Perfect Union*™ commemorative stamps recognize the courage and achievements of the men and women who, during the years of the Civil Rights Movement, struggled to bring the vision of our founding fathers closer to reality.

At eight first-day-of-issue ceremonies on August 30, 2005, the United States Postal Service® will dedicate the *To Form A More Perfect Union* commemorative postage stamps. These new stamps are part of the Postal Service's™ 2005 stamp program celebrating the people and events that have shaped the history of our nation. The *To Form A More Perfect Union* stamps commemorate 10 important milestones of the Civil Rights Movement — *Brown v. Board of Education* (Topeka, KS); Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Memphis, TN); Freedom Riders (Jackson, MS); Little Rock Nine (Little Rock, AR); Lunch Counter Sit-Ins (Greensboro, NC); Montgomery Bus Boycott (Montgomery, AL); Selma March (Selma, AL); Executive Order 9981; March on Washington; and Voting Rights Act of 1965 (Washington, DC).

The *To Form A More Perfect Union* commemorative stamps will be available in Post Offices™ nationwide on August 30.

Several stamp unveilings have already taken place surrounding the announcement of the *To Form A More Perfect Union* commemorative stamps. Throughout the coming year, there will be opportunities in every community across the nation to trace the history of our nation's civil rights movement. We urge you to plan your own local events, to showcase these stamps and to educate employees and customers about the historic events that inspired these 10 stamps.

This field publicity kit will help you implement the *To Form A More Perfect Union* stamps events in your community by providing you with planning ideas, African-American Political Organizations, History Museums and Greek Letter Organizations contacts, talking points, news releases, and Public Affairs and Communications, Employee Development and Diversity, and Government Relations contacts. 

#### Overview

Use the *To Form A More Perfect Union* postage stamps to trace the history of our nation's civil rights movement through vivid illustrations of key events, people, and decisions that changed the course of this nation, to educate employees and customers about historical events relating to these 10 stamps, to celebrate the milestones of the Civil Rights Movement, to make these historic achievements relevant today, and to differentiate the Postal Service™

from our competitors through the opportunity our stamp program provides us.

To Form A More Perfect Union stamps recognize the courage and achievement of the men and women who, during the years of the Civil Rights Movement, struggled to bring the vision of our founding fathers closer to reality. Ten important milestones of the Civil Rights Movement are commemorated with the To Form A More Perfect Union stamps: Executive Order 9981, issued by President Harry S. Truman and implemented over several ensuing years, abolishing segregation in the United States armed forces; Brown v. Board of Education; Montgomery Bus Boycott; Little Rock Nine; Lunch Counter Sit-Ins; Freedom Riders; March on Washington; Civil Rights Act of 1964; Selma March, and Voting Rights Act of 1965.

### Stamps and First-Day Issuances

The U.S. Postal Service will issue the 10 *To Form A More Perfect Union* commemorative postage stamps nationwide on August 30, 2005, in Greensboro, NC; Montgomery, AL; Memphis, TN; Selma, AL; Topeka, KS; Jackson, MS; Little Rock, AR; and Washington, DC. For this nationwide issuance, 70 million stamps have been printed.

### **Publicity Ideas to Interest the Media**

The *To Form A More Perfect Union* stamps sheet is a nationwide issue and stamps will be available at Post Offices throughout the country on August 30. You may hold a "second-day" event for the *To Form A More Perfect Union* stamps throughout the rest of the year.

Local and national publicity will help promote awareness about historical events relating to these 10 stamps. This is an opportunity to celebrate the milestones of the Civil Rights Movement and to make these historic achievements relevant today.

Here are some methods to capture media attention:

### Copy the First-Day Event Theme

The first-day-of-issue events will take place August 30. Senior Postal Service participants will include governors, officers, and employees. Events will also include congressional leaders and representatives from the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), Congressional Black Caucus Foundation (CBCF), National Urban League, Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC), International Civil Rights Center & Museum in Greensboro, NC, Central High School National Historic Site director in Little Rock, AR, National Civil Rights Museum in Memphis, TN, the Davis Theatre for the Performing Arts in Montgomery, AL, *Brown v. Board of Education* National Historic Site in Topeka, KS, and other dignitaries.

Because these stamps have significant national importance, it is a good idea to contact your Postal Service Government Relations representative for guidance to involve public officials when planning your event (see page 37 for the list of Government Relations contacts).

Members of Congress, civil rights activists, and the African-American community will be interested in these stamps and the events surrounding them.

Your area Public Affairs and Communications representatives are available and ready to assist you in generating publicity for your events. (See page 36 for the list of Area Public Affairs and Communications managers.)

#### Other Event Ideas

- Look for opportunities to sponsor events with local community groups, schools, and civil rights organizations.
- Contact the local chapter of one of the nationally recognized African-American organizations to host an event.
- Host an event at your local African-American History Museum.
- Partner with nationally recognized Greek letter organizations in your area to host an event.
- Set up displays at local libraries where customers can learn the history behind the significant events centered around these stamps.
- Set up displays in front of Post Offices.
- Partner with local colleges and universities (especially historically Black colleges and universities).
- Partner with local churches in African-American communities (especially African Methodist Episcopal churches).
- Generate publicity for the *To Form A More Perfect Union* commemorative stamps with a simple stamp dedication ceremony in your Post Office lobby. The Postal Service continuously issues new stamps to help raise awareness about a variety of events, persons, and themes of widespread national appeal and significance, and stamps that are both interesting and educational.
- Check with local cable television stations that may regularly air civil rights documentaries to see if they are interested in covering your event or if they would consider inviting event participants on their program.

Implement any of these ideas, combine them, or brainstorm with your employees and come up with ideas of your own. Using the publicity materials in this kit, be sure to publicize each and every event through your local newspaper and radio and television stations via press releases, media advisories, and letters to the media. And don't forget to make follow-up phone calls.

### **Event Planning Checklist**

When planning *To Form A More Perfect Union* commemorative stamp events, keep the following suggestions in mind:

- Set a date.
- Begin planning immediately.
- Contact your local NAACP, the Urban League, sororities and fraternities, historically Black colleges, and other African-American organizations to see if they can participate in the *To Form A More Perfect Union* stamp event in your city.
- Secure participants.
- Order enlargements of the stamp images, flyers, and other supplies for the event.
- Prepare a special pictorial postmark, if applicable. (See announcement form on page 15.)
- Secure staging and sound equipment, if applicable.
- Plan signage, including a podium sign and banners.
- Launch a local publicity campaign using the materials in this kit.
- Draft a sequence-of-events agenda and speaker remarks.
- Plan retail opportunities (booth, bag stuffers, etc.).
- Prepare ceremony programs and invitations.

### **Pictorial Postmarks**

Pictorial postmarks have not been produced on a national level, but Post Offices planning second-day events may design their own special pictorial postmark. As a reminder, the Postal Service must endeavor to make all unusual postmarking services widely known to collectors through advance publicity to avoid limiting the availability of these postmarks. Therefore, all pictorial postmarks must be reported to Stamp Development 3 weeks prior to local events. Please use the announcement form on the following page to report your use of a postmark.

### Guidelines for Finalizing *To Form A More Perfect Union* Commemorative Stamps Pictorial Postmark Art

To finalize the *To Form A More Perfect Union* commemorative stamps pictorial postmark art, insert the date, city, state, and ZIP Code<sup>™</sup> of the physical location of your event adjacent to the stamp image. Overall dimensions of the pictorial postmark must not exceed 4 inches horizontally by 2 inches vertically. Collectors prefer the dimensions 3 1/2 inches by 1 inch.

### **Second-Day Postmarks**

Second-day postmarks are pictorial postmarks and follow the same guidelines as above. The word "Station" or the abbreviation "STA" is required somewhere in the design, since it will be a temporary station.

### **Executive Order 9981**

On July 26, 1948, President Harry S. Truman issued Executive Order 9981 mandating full integration in all branches of the U.S. military. By the time the Korean conflict ended in the following decade, this had largely been achieved. William H. Johnson's *Training for War*, a silk-screen print made circa 1941, recalls President Harry S. Truman's Executive Order.



### **Lunch Counter Sit-Ins**

When four African-American college students placed an order at a "whites only" lunch counter in Greensboro, NC, in 1960, they sparked acts of civil disobedience in many other cities. The sit-in movement to integrate "whites-only" lunch counters is recalled by an exhibit created for the National Civil Rights Museum by StudioEIS, a design and fabrication firm in New York.



### **Montgomery Bus Boycott**

After Rosa Parks was arrested on Dec. 1, 1955, for refusing to let a white passenger take her seat on a Montgomery, AL, bus, African Americans began a prolonged boycott of the bus company by walking or carpooling for more than a year. On Dec. 21, 1956, black passengers once again rode Montgomery City Lines. The Boycott is represented by a detail from *Walking*, a 1958 painting by Charles Alston.



### **Civil Rights Act of 1964**

Designed to provide broad protections against discrimination on the basis of race, the Civil Rights Act of 1964 was signed into law by President Lyndon B. Johnson. Among its other provisions, the law prohibited discrimination in public accommodations such as hotels, restaurants and theaters. The Civil Rights Act of 1964 is suggested by *Dixie Café*, a 1948 brush-and-ink drawing by Jacob Lawrence.



### **March on Washington**

More than 250,000 people marched in Washington, DC, for racial justice in 1963, and Martin Luther King, Jr., delivered his historic "I Have a Dream" speech from the steps of the Lincoln Memorial. *March on Washington,* painted in 1964 by Alma Thomas, commemorates the great demonstration.



### Selma March

In the spring of 1965, demonstrators demanding an end to discrimination gathered in Selma, AL, to march to the state capital 50 miles away. This is represented by *Selma March*, a 1991 acrylic painting by Bernice Sims.



### Brown v. Board of Education

A unanimous ruling of the United States Supreme Court in the case of *Brown v. Board of Education* (1954) declared that separate educational facilities for black and white children are inherently unequal. The landmark ruling is suggested by Romare Bearden's lithograph, *The Lamp* (1984).



#### Freedom Riders

To test a ruling that outlawed segregation of bus stations and terminals serving interstate travelers, biracial groups of men and women volunteered to take bus rides through the South, using the "wrong" facilities at stops. Several Freedom Riders were injured because of mob violence instigated by segregationists, eliciting an outpouring of support and concern. A gouache by May Stevens called *Freedom Riders* (1963) honors the Freedom Riders.



### **Little Rock Nine**

After the Supreme Court declared segregated schools unconstitutional in *Brown v. Board of Education,* many public school systems were slow to adapt to the new legal reality. In 1957, nine courageous students became the first African Americans to attend Central High School in Little Rock, AR, where they endured virulent harassment and received the protection of federal troops. George Hunt's painting, *America Cares* (1997), remembers the nine courageous students.



### **Voting Rights Act of 1965**

With leaders of the Civil Rights Movement standing by, President Johnson signed the Voting Rights Act into law, strengthening the federal government's ability to prevent state and local governments from denying citizens the right to vote because of their race. The Voting Rights Act of 1965 is suggested by Bruce Davidson's photograph *Youths on the Selma March* (1965).

### **Executive Order 9981**

On July 26, 1948, President Harry S. Truman issued Executive Order 9981 mandating full integration in all branches of the U.S. military. By the time the Korean conflict ended in the following decade, this had largely been achieved. William H. Johnson's *Training for War*, a silk-screen print made circa 1941, recalls President Harry S. Truman's Executive Order.



### **Lunch Counter Sit-Ins**

When four African-American college students placed an order at a "whites only" lunch counter in Greensboro, NC, in 1960, they sparked acts of civil disobedience in many other cities. The sit-in movement to integrate "whites-only" lunch counters is recalled by an exhibit created for the National Civil Rights Museum by StudioEIS, a design and fabrication firm in New York.



### **Montgomery Bus Boycott**

After Rosa Parks was arrested on Dec. 1, 1955, for refusing to let a white passenger take her seat on a Montgomery, AL, bus, African Americans began a prolonged boycott of the bus company by walking or carpooling for more than a year. On Dec. 21, 1956, black passengers once again rode Montgomery City Lines. The Boycott is represented by a detail from *Walking*, a 1958 painting by Charles Alston.



### **Civil Rights Act of 1964**

Designed to provide broad protections against discrimination on the basis of race, the Civil Rights Act of 1964 was signed into law by President Lyndon B. Johnson. Among its other provisions, the law prohibited discrimination in public accommodations such as hotels, restaurants and theaters. The Civil Rights Act of 1964 is suggested by *Dixie Café*, a 1948 brush-and-ink drawing by Jacob Lawrence.



### **March on Washington**

More than 250,000 people marched in Washington, DC, for racial justice in 1963, and Martin Luther King, Jr., delivered his historic "I Have a Dream" speech from the steps of the Lincoln Memorial. *March on Washington,* painted in 1964 by Alma Thomas, commemorates the great demonstration.



### Selma March

In the spring of 1965, demonstrators demanding an end to discrimination gathered in Selma, AL, to march to the state capital 50 miles away. This is represented by *Selma March*, a 1991 acrylic painting by Bernice Sims.



### Brown v. Board of Education

A unanimous ruling of the United States Supreme Court in the case of *Brown v. Board of Education* (1954) declared that separate educational facilities for black and white children are inherently unequal. The landmark ruling is suggested by Romare Bearden's lithograph, *The Lamp* (1984).



### **Freedom Riders**

To test a ruling that outlawed segregation of bus stations and terminals serving interstate travelers, biracial groups of men and women volunteered to take bus rides through the South, using the "wrong" facilities at stops. Several Freedom Riders were injured because of mob violence instigated by segregationists, eliciting an outpouring of support and concern. A gouache by May Stevens called *Freedom Riders* (1963) honors the Freedom Riders.



### **Little Rock Nine**

After the Supreme Court declared segregated schools unconstitutional in *Brown v. Board of Education,* many public school systems were slow to adapt to the new legal reality. In 1957, nine courageous students became the first African Americans to attend Central High School in Little Rock, AR, where they endured virulent harassment and received the protection of federal troops. George Hunt's painting, *America Cares*, (1997) remembers the nine courageous students.



### **Voting Rights Act of 1965**

With leaders of the Civil Rights Movement standing by, President Johnson signed the Voting Rights Act into law, strengthening the federal government's ability to prevent state and local governments from denying citizens the right to vote because of their race. The Voting Rights Act of 1965 is suggested by Bruce Davidson's photograph, *Youths on the Selma March* (1965).

### **Participation of Public Officials**

The issuance of the *To Form A More Perfect Union* commemorative stamp offers a perfect opportunity to involve public officials in an important and positive local event. They are likely to have a keen interest in the event, as it provides a chance to interact with constituents in a friendly civic setting with secured media coverage.

It's a good idea to check with your Postal Service Government Relations representative before inviting federal, state, and local officials to your event. Following are simple guidelines, a suggested invitation list, and the names and telephone numbers of your Government Relations contacts.

#### Before the Event

Coordinate with your Government Relations representative before sending a written invitation to your two U.S. senators, your congressional representatives, or the governor of your state. When making your invitation list, be sure to include the mayor or any other local officials you deem appropriate. The local postmaster should sign the invitations.

Follow up the written invitation with a telephone call to the official's scheduler within a week if you have not received a reply. You may need to call more than once.

Keep in touch with all officials who respond. If asked, provide updated information to the official's staff as it becomes available (e.g., who else is participating, where and when to meet, what his or her role will be, etc.). Stress that remarks should be brief and limited to the dedication of the *To Form A More Perfect Union* commemorative stamps.

Include the names of all participating officials on the official program as honored guests scheduled to appear, and mention them in all media advisories, if applicable.

Provide a courtesy copy of the program to the officials in advance.

#### After the Event

Send a written thank you to all public officials who participated in the ceremony, expressing your appreciation.

Provide copies of any newspaper articles about the event to their offices. Even though they likely will see those articles on their own, you can take the opportunity to remind them of the press coverage the event received.

Provide a supply of extra cachets with the special postmark (if applicable) to public officials, even to those who could not attend. These make great giveaways and serve as a positive reminder of the event. As a reminder, pictorial postmarks have not been produced on a national level, but feel free to design and produce your own version.

Obtain and frame a photo of the public official posing beside the stamp image and make an appointment to present it in person, if possible. A matted, well-framed photograph stands a good chance of being hung on the wall of the official's office, again serving as a positive reminder of the event.

Please note: while this is an out-of-schedule label list change article, the "must comply" date is the same as the one that will be associated with the next regularly scheduled labeling list changes article. Mailers are encouraged to label according to this revised list immediately, but *must* comply with these changes no later than October 16, 2005.

#### **DMM REVISION**

#### **Pallet Labels**

Effective July 7, 2005, we are revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM<sup>®</sup>) 705.8.6.3 to let mailers use a minimum of 12-point type when printing origin office information on barcoded pallet labels. The Postal Service ™ needs to know the office of origin when mail preparation problems occur. This information must be legible, but it is not necessary to use a type size as large as that needed for the destination line and contents line. By reducing the required type size of the origin entry line, we allow mailers more space on pallet labels for printing barcodes and other information.

The Postal Service publishes and updates requirements for pallet label barcodes on the Rapid Information Bulletin Board System (RIBBS) Web site. Mailers can access the latest specifications at <a href="http://ribbs.usps.gov">http://ribbs.usps.gov</a>. Under "RIBBS Links" in the left-hand column, click on FAST/Surface Visibility, then Click Here for Additional Information in the Document Repository. The document repository link provides updated information under the selection Mailer Placard Spec.

Lettering for required information on pallet labels must be at least 1/2 inch high (or at least 48-point type). *Exception*: When customers apply postal-specified pallet barcodes to pallet labels, the lettering for the required information on line 3 (origin line) must be at least 1/8 inch high (or at least 12-point type).

#### **DMM REVISION**

# **Preparation of Bundles on BMC Pallets**

Effective July 7, 2005, we are revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 705.8.5.11 to give mailers the option to secure bundles with two or more bands when placed on bulk mail center (BMC) pallets.

This alternative to shrinkwrapping is possible because bundles on BMC pallets are now almost entirely processed on the Small Parcel and Bundle Sorter (SPBS) and Automated Package Processing System (APPS). This revision benefits mailers and the Postal Service by moving more bundles onto pallets.

We will incorporate this revision into the next printed version of the DMM and into the monthly update of the online DMM available on Postal Explorer® at pe.usps.com.

In addition to 8.5.7 through 8.5.10, bundles on pallets must meet the following standards:

[Revise items a and b to read as follows:]

a. Except as noted in 8.5.11b, mailers must secure bundles up to 1 inch in height (thickness) with shrink-

- wrap or with banding placed at least once around the girth.
- b. All bundles placed on BMC pallets must be secured with at least two bands, with shrinkwrap, or with shrinkwrap plus one or more bands.

#### **Fact Sheet**

#### Introduction

Premium Forwarding Service (PFS) offers customers an alternative to hold-mail service and traditional temporary change-of-address service provided through the Computerized Forwarding System (CFS). PFS is designed for residential customers (retirees, seasonal travelers, etc.) who wish to receive *all* of their mail at a temporary address for a specified period of time of not less than 2 weeks and not more than 1 year. The Postal Service reships the mail on a weekly basis to the temporary address during the specified period of service.

PFS replaces all informal forwarding arrangements commonly referred to as "Snowbird Service" offered by some Post Offices. A benefit of PFS is that it provides a nationwide consistent service offering to all customers at a uniform price.

#### Facts About PFS

- PFS is available as follows:
  - Available to residential delivery customers beginning August 7, 2005, as part of a 2-year experiment.
  - Available from and to domestic addresses only.
  - Available to, but not from, APOs, FPOs, and commercial mail receiving agencies (CMRAs).

- Not available to customers who have on file an active Change-of-Address Order (PS Form 3575).
   PFS mail is not processed through CFS.
- PFS provides weekly reshipments (on Wednesday) of most of a customer's mail for a period of not less than 2 weeks and not more than 1 year. Some exceptions apply (see the "Disposition of Mail Chart (Post Office Copy)" on page 73 in this issue of the *Postal Bulletin*).
- PFS provides reshipment of mail to a temporary address for an entire household or an individual addressee.
- Enrollment requires completion of PS Form 8176, Premium Forwarding Service Application (see pages 43–45 in this issue of the Postal Bulletin for images of pages 1, 2, and 8 of PS Form 8176); payment of a \$10 enrollment fee; and \$10 for each week of the designated service period. Full payment is due at the time of enrollment.
- Customers must enroll in person at the Post Office (including any of its stations and branches) serving their primary delivery address.
- Customers may extend, shorten, or cancel their enrollment by contacting the primary Post Office prior to the end of the service period and paying for any additional time period, if applicable.
- Items sent outside the weekly PFS shipment are readdressed by the Post Office serving the customer's primary address and rerouted to the customer's temporary address (see the "Disposition of Mail Chart (Post Office Copy)" on page 73 in this issue of the Postal Bulletin).
- Priority Mail® parcels too large for the weekly PFS shipment are rerouted individually (outside the PFS Priority Mail shipment) to the temporary address at no additional charge.
- Standard Mail® and Package Services parcels too large for the weekly PFS Priority Mail shipment are rerouted to the temporary address "postage due" at the applicable Priority Mail rate. Parcel Post oversized items are rerouted to the temporary address "postage due" at Parcel Post oversized rates.

#### **Terms and Conditions**

This document identifies the Terms and Conditions under which the United States Postal Service<sup>®</sup> makes this service available to you. By signing the application, you are stating that you have read and understand this document, and you agree to be bound by its terms and conditions. Applications for this service can only be accepted and processed at the Post Office<sup>™</sup>, including its stations, or branches, that serves your primary mailing address.

#### SERVICE DEFINITION

USPS® Premium Forwarding Service (PFS) is a personalized service for reshipping mail from a primary residential address to a temporary address using a Priority Mail® shipment. Some mail pieces, such as those requiring a delivery scan or signature and Express Mail® are rerouted piece by piece.

#### Service Rules for Retail Signup

- 1. PFS is available only from domestic addresses; PFS is available to, but not from APOs and FPOs.
- 2. A formal temporary or permanent Change of Address Order (PS Form 3575) cannot be active simultaneously with PFS.
- 3. This service reships mail for an entire household or for an individual addressee to a temporary address. Business addressees and centralized delivery points are generally ineligible.
- Customers can have all their mail delivered to a temporary address for a minimum of two weeks to a maximum of one year. All mail is reshipped regardless of mailpiece endorsements.
- Shipments are mailed once a week on Wednesday. PFS is not a guaranteed service; no refunds are allowed for delayed shipments.
- The cost is \$10.00 to enroll (nonrefundable) and \$10.00 for each weekly shipment. Customers must pay for the entire period of service at the time of application. The customer may pay for the service with cash, check, credit card or debit card.
- When applying, customers must provide two types of identification; one must contain a photo. Customers must provide evidence of residency at the primary address.
- The start date is the first day the customer wants the Postal Service™ to hold the mail for reshipment. The end date is
  the last day the customer will accept mail delivered to the temporary address.
- Mail requiring a scan, signature or additional postage at delivery will be rerouted separately (see Disposition of Mail Chart). Examples of such mail include Express Mail, mail bearing Delivery Confirmation™ or Return Receipt; Postage Due Mail and Numbered Insured Mail.
- 10. Some packages rerouted separately from the weekly shipment to the temporary address will arrive at the temporary address postage due at Priority Mail rates (see Disposition of Mail Chart):
  - Express Mail Express Mail articles will not be included in the PFS package. Express Mail articles are rerouted immediately to the temporary address. No additional charges will apply (see Disposition of Mail Chart).
  - Priority Mail Priority Mail articles are NOT held for reshipment in the PFS package, unless doing so WOULD NOT delay its delivery to the temporary address. No additional charges will apply (see Disposition of Mail Chart).
  - c. First-Class Mail® Packages If First-Class Mail packages do not fit in the weekly shipment, each will be rerouted separately at no additional charge (see Disposition of Mail Chart).
  - d. Standard Mail and Package Services Mail Articles and packages mailed at the Standard Mail Parcel Post®, Bound Printed Matter, Media Mail®, and Library Mail rates will be included in the PFS package if they fit inside the package (after letters, flats or large envelopes, and magazines are inserted). Otherwise, they will be shipped postage due at the Priority Mail rate regardless of the initial postage rate. The appropriate postage due fees will be collected at the point of delivery.

**Note:** To avoid additional charges, customers should have the sender of Standard Mail and Package Services Mail send this mail directly to the temporary addresses (see Disposition of Mail Chart).

#### Service Modifications (Extend, Shorten or Cancel Service)

- Customers must notify their primary address Post Office™ of the new end date if there is a change.
- 2. To extend service, the customer must pay for all additional weeks of service before the extension is processed.
- If the customer terminates the service early, an appropriate refund can, upon request, be provided, for the weeks not used. Refunds are issued by the primary address Post Office.

#### Instructions for completing PFS Application form:

- 1. Indicate if this application is for a single individual or the entire household. Check the appropriate box.
- 2. Fill-in the last name, first name, and middle initial of PFS applicant.
- 3. Provide an email address where PFS applicant can be reached. This information is optional.
- 4 & 4a. Provide the primary address from where the mail will be reshipped. Follow specific instructions for Puerto Rico.
- 5 & 5a. Provide the temporary address to where the mail will be shipped. Follow specific instructions for Puerto Rico.

- Sign and date the application. Your signature confirms your acceptance of the terms and conditions printed on the reverse of the customer copy.
- Indicate when the service starts. The start date is the first day you want the Postal Service to hold the mail for reshipment through PFS.
- 16. Indicate when the service ends. The end date is the last day you want to receive mail at the temporary address
- 17. Provide the date to resume mail delivery. This date must not exceed two weeks past the end date of the service.
- 18. For Official Use Only Postal Service personnel calculates the last shipment date based on the customer's start and end dates and enters it here. PFS Priority Mail shipments are mailed on Wednesdays.
- 19. For Official Use Only Postal Service personnel provides the name and address of the office accepting the application.
- For Official Use Only Postal Service personnel writes in the type of identification used to verify the customer's identity and primary address match.
- 21. For Official Use Only Postal Service personnel initials here to indicate acceptance of customer application, and verification of the customer's identity and address match. Postal Service personnel verifies that payment and enrollment fee have been received.
- 22. Customer completes optional enrollment questions on the front of the form. (Answering these questions is optional.)
- Customer reads privacy statement.

#### Field Information Kit

- Any mail requiring a "scan" (e.g., Delivery Confirmation™ service, Certified Mail™) is individually rerouted to the temporary address outside the weekly PFS Priority Mail shipment. Express Mail®, Priority Mail, and First-Class Mail® items are rerouted at no additional charge. Standard Mail and Package Services parcels are rerouted "postage due" at the applicable Priority Mail rates.
- Two or more PFS Priority Mail packages may be used for one customer if the volume of letters, flats, or large envelopes and magazines requires additional containers to reship the customer's weekly accumulation of mail. The \$10 weekly Priority Mail shipment cost includes all PFS shipments of applicable mail in a given week.
- Label 85, *Premium Forwarding Service Penalty Label* (G-400), must be affixed to each weekly PFS Priority Mail shipment.



Label 85 is not affixed to the items rerouted individually to the temporary address outside the PFS Priority Mail shipment.

#### Priority Mail Packaging

Postal Service personnel should select the Priority Mail containers (envelopes and boxes) used for PFS shipments based on the cubic volume of letters and flats shipped each week. Postal Service personnel may use other suitable mailing containers (e.g., padded mailing bags, etc.) provided they also affix Label 85 to the containers and clearly label the containers using Priority Mail stickers or Priority Mail tape.

 Do not use Priority Mail Flat Rate Boxes and Priority Mail Flat Rate Envelopes for PFS shipments.  Do not use "ReadyPost" shipping materials for PFS shipments.

#### Tips to Give to Customers

- Prior to enrolling, ensure that customers have read the "terms and conditions" outlined on the reverse of the application (PS Form 8176).
- Remind customers to advise senders of large parcel items to address these items directly to their temporary address to avoid incurring postage-due charges.

# **Frequently Asked Questions**

1. What is Premium Forwarding Service (PFS)?

PFS is a 2-year experiment of a new service that gives residential customers the option to have *all* of their mail reshipped to a temporary address while they are away from home. For a minimal charge, the Postal Service will package all of the customer's mail weekly and send it by Priority Mail to the temporary address. (Some exceptions apply.) PFS can be used for a minimum of 2 weeks up to a maximum of 1 year. It provides customers an additional option to the current piece-by-piece temporary forwarding and holdmail services.

2. When does this new service start?

PFS will be offered nationwide at all Postal Service retail locations beginning August 7, 2005.

3. How much does it cost?

The cost for PFS is \$10 to enroll and \$10 for each week of the designated service period.

4. How do customers enroll?

Customers must complete and submit PS Form 8176, *Premium Forwarding Service Application*, in person at the Post Office (including any of its stations and branches) serving their primary address (see pages 43–45 in this issue of the *Postal Bulletin* for images of pages 1, 2, and 8 of PS Form 8176). The customer presents two types of valid identification (one with photo) along with proof of residency with the PFS application. Both the enrollment fee and the payment for each weekly shipment covering the period specified by the customer are due at the time of application.

5. Can customers enroll in PFS via phone and Internet?

Phone and Internet enrollment are not available at this time. However, future enhancements to the service are planned. 6. Do customers who use the service more than one time a year have to pay the \$10 enrollment fee with each subsequent PFS application?

Yes. The \$10 enrollment fee is due with each PFS application filed.

- 7. Can customers who have a COA on file enroll in PFS?
- No. Customers with an active COA on file are not eligible to participate in PFS.
- 8. With PFS, do customers have the option to have their mail shipped to their temporary address weekly by a service other than Priority Mail service?

No.

- Can the temporary address be a P.O. Box address?Yes.
- 10. Can customers have their mail shipped to a mailbox at a UPS Store or MailBoxes. Etc. location?

Yes. The temporary address can be a commercial mail receiving agency (CMRA), but the primary address cannot be a CMRA or any other central delivery point (except for a Postal Service neighborhood delivery and collection box unit (NDCBU)).

- 11. Are there limits to the number of PFS applications that can be on file at one time from a single address?
- No. There can be different PFS applications on file for multiple "individuals" from one primary address. However, there can be only one PFS application on file for *an entire household* from a primary address to a single temporary address during a service period.
- 12. Can PFS customers elect to have their mail shipped to their temporary address more than once per week?
- 13. Can customers extend the service or cancel or shorten the length of the service?

Yes. Prior to the original end date designated on their PFS application, PFS customers can extend (up to 1 year), cancel, or shorten the service. To request a service modification, they must contact their primary Post Office (where the PFS application is on file) by phone or in writing prior to the end date noted on their application. For service extensions, customers must make payments for the additional weeks *prior* to the new service period. With requests to shorten or cancel the service, customers must apply for a refund for any unused shipments by completing PS Form 3533, *Application and Voucher for Refund of Postage and Fees*, and submitting it to the primary Post Office. The enrollment fee is non-refundable.

14. With PFS, can a customer specify what mail (or what class of mail) they want forwarded to their temporary address?

No. PFS provides shipment *of all mail*, regardless of class or subclass, from a primary address to a temporary address as designated by the customer.

15. What are the restrictions for PFS?

PFS is available only to customers with domestic primary addresses.

Customers whose primary address is a business address are generally not eligible to participate in PFS.

Customers whose primary address is a P.O. Box size 3, 4, or 5 are not eligible to use PFS.

Customers whose primary address is a centralized delivery point to which the Postal Service provides delivery in bulk to a third party (e.g., CMRAs) are not eligible to use PFS.

Customers whose primary address is an APO or FPO address are not eligible to use PFS. However, the temporary address may be an APO or FPO address.

- 16. Do mailer endorsements affect reshipment through PFS?
- No. Mail for PFS customers is reshipped or rerouted regardless of any mailpiece endorsements.
- 17. How does PFS differ from a temporary Change-of-Address request?

A Change-of-Address (COA) Order, either temporary or permanent, provides for "piece-by-piece" forwarding of primarily First-Class Mail for a specified period of time. PFS provides a single weekly shipment of all mail (with some exceptions) via Priority Mail. PFS mail is not processed through the Computerized Forwarding System (CFS).

- 18. Can individual offices elect not to offer PFS and continue to offer their informal temporary forwarding arrangements to customers?
- No. PFS replaces *all* informal arrangements offered at some Post Offices to accommodate customers' temporary address changes. PFS will be available to customers at all retail locations beginning August 7, 2005.
- 19. What about items too large to fit into the weekly PFS Priority Mail shipment?

Priority Mail, First-Class Mail, and Periodicals mailpieces too large to fit are rerouted individually to the temporary address at no additional cost. Standard Mail and Package Services parcels too large to fit are rerouted "postage due" at the applicable Priority Mail rate.

#### Field Information Kit

20. If there is a large weekly volume of mail for a PFS customer, will the Postal Service prepare and send more than one weekly PFS Priority Mail package to the customer's temporary address?

Yes. The Postal Service will prepare and send two or more PFS Priority Mail packages for one customer if the volume of letters, flats, large envelopes, and magazines requires additional packages.

21. Will PFS provide a guaranteed time of delivery service?

No. PFS does not include a guaranteed time of delivery.

PFS shipments are sent each Wednesday via Priority Mail service.

22. How are Delivery Confirmation and other accountable mail handled with PFS?

Delivery Confirmation, accountable mail, Express Mail, and other mailpieces that require a scan will not be included within the weekly Priority Mail shipment. These items will be individually readdressed to the temporary address, scanned as "forwarded," and immediately rerouted to the temporary address. Express Mail and Priority Mail items are immediately rerouted at no additional charge. Standard Mail and Package Services mailpieces requiring a scan are immediately rerouted to the temporary address "postage due" at the applicable Priority Mail rate of postage, except that Parcel Post oversized items are rerouted "postage due" at Parcel Post oversized rates.

23. What about items arriving at the primary address "postage due"?

The Postal Service does not include items arriving "postage due" at the primary address Post Office for a PFS customer in the weekly Priority Mail shipment. These pieces are rerouted individually as follows:

- Postage-due First-Class Mail and Priority Mail items are rerouted to the temporary address "postage due."
- Postage-due Standard Mail and Package Services parcels (other than oversized Parcel Post) are rerouted to the temporary address "postage due" at the applicable Priority Mail rate.\*
- Postage-due oversized Parcel Post items are rerouted to the temporary address at the applicable oversized Parcel Post rate.\*
- \* The total "postage due" is the sum of the "postage due" at the time of receipt at the primary Post Office and the "postage due" for rerouting the item from the primary address Post Office.

24. With regards to PFS, what are the responsibilities of the Post Office serving the customer's primary address?

The primary address Post Office accepting the PFS application (PS Form 8176) is responsible for ensuring that the customer presents two types of valid identification (one with photo) along with proof of residency with the PFS application. The primary address Post Office prepares and sends the Priority Mail shipments each Wednesday, affixing Label 85, Premium Forwarding Service Penalty Label (G-400), to each PFS Priority Mail shipment, (See page 46) in this issue of the *Postal Bulletin* for an image of Label 85.) For items that are rerouted as "outsides," the primary address Post Office is responsible for readdressing the items to the temporary address on the day received. For Delivery Confirmation and other accountable items, the primary address Post Office is responsible for scanning the pieces as "forwarded" and readdressing the pieces to the temporary address. The primary address Post Office does not use Label 85 for mailpieces sent as "outsides." The primary address Post Office is also responsible for ensuring that PFS shipments stop on the original (or revised) end date specified on the PFS application and that delivery resumes to the customer's primary address.

#### **Postmaster Checklist**

- On or after July 7, 2005, see Postal Bulletin 22158 (7-7-05) and keep it for future reference. The Postal Bulletin is available online at http://usps.com/cpim/ ftp/bulletin/pb.htm.
- ☐ Between July 7 and July 16, 2005, use the Field Information Kit from Postal Bulletin 22158 as follows:
  - Give the appropriate employee stand-up talk(s).
  - Disseminate the Fact Sheet and the "Disposition of Mail Chart (Post Office Copy)" to all appropriate employees. (In *Postal Bulletin* 22158, the Fact Sheet is available on page 42, and the "Disposition of Mail Chart (Post Office Copy)" is available on page 73.)
- ☐ By late July, ensure the following:
  - The automatic shipment of PS Form 8176, Premium Forwarding Service Application, has been received.
  - The shipment of Label 85, Premium Forwarding Service Penalty Label (G-400), has been received.

- There is an adequate supply of Priority Mail packaging materials (including boxes and tape).
- The "Disposition of Mail Chart (Customer Copy)" has been received.
- Copies of the "Disposition of Mail Chart (Customer Copy)" are available to provide to customers completing a PFS application.
- Employees responsible for accepting PFS applications at the retail unit, tracking customer enrollments, preparing the PFS mail for reshipment, and shipping PFS mail receive instruction on the program's operations and a copy of the PFS Guidelines.
- On or about August 5, 2005, remind delivery unit employees (including casuals and substitutes) that mail to be included in weekly PFS shipments is held and bundled by the designated delivery unit employee for reshipment to the customer's temporary address on Wednesdays.
- □ By August 7, 2005, ensure that an automatic shipment of PFS promotional materials, including a lobby poster and easel-back countercards with "take-one" handouts, has been received. Ensure that the lobby poster is displayed and the POP countercards with the "take-one" handouts inserted in the pocket are placed in the lobby.
- ☐ Before opening for business on August 7, 2005, ensure that there is on hand an adequate supply of PFS applications (PS Form 8176), Label 85, and the "Disposition of Mail Chart (Customer Copy)."

#### ☐ After August 8, 2005:

- Monitor supplies of Priority Mail packaging materials, PFS applications (PS Form 8176), Label 85, the "Disposition of Mail Chart (Customer Copy)" and countercards with "take-one" promotional materials.
- Order additional supplies from the MDC based on demand.

# Stand-Up Talk for All Employees at Districts and Plants

#### Introduction

The new Premium Forwarding Service (PFS) is an option for customers locating to a temporary address for not less than 2 weeks and not more than 1 year.

#### What's new?

Beginning August 7, 2005, the Postal Service will offer PFS, a 2-year experiment approved by the Board of Governors of the Postal Service in May. PFS offers customers an option to have *all* their mail, regardless of class or subclass, shipped weekly via Priority Mail service from their primary address to a temporary address. Some exceptions apply. To enroll, customers complete and submit PS Form 8176, *Premium Forwarding Service Application*, at the Post Office (including any of its stations and branches) serving their primary address. The cost for PFS includes a \$10 enrollment fee and \$10 for each week of the designated service period.

PFS replaces all informal mail forwarding arrangements, commonly referred to as "Snowbird Service," offered at some Post Offices to accommodate customers' temporary address changes.

#### Why?

PFS is a great value. It provides a nationwide consistent service offering to all customers at a uniform price.

#### What stays the same?

PFS is a convenient alternative to temporary or permanent (piece-by-piece) forwarding and hold-mail services. These services will continue to be offered free of charge. However, customers with an active Change-of-Address (COA) Order on file are not eligible to enroll in PFS.

#### What's next?

Postmasters will be provided with a sample letter that can be used to craft a personal message to former "Snowbird" customers to introduce the service. PFS Guidelines, which include the sample letter, will be available prior to launch. Promotional materials, PFS applications, and PFS labels will be provided to retail locations nationwide prior to the August 7 implementation date.

# Stand-Up Talk for All Employees at Associate Offices, Stations, and Branches

#### Introduction

The new Premium Forwarding Service (PFS) is an option for customers locating to a temporary address for not less than 2 weeks and not more than 1 year.

#### Field Information Kit

#### What's new?

- Beginning August 7, 2005, the Postal Service will offer PFS, a 2-year experiment approved by the Board of Governors of the Postal Service in May. It offers customers an option to have all their mail, regardless of class or subclass, shipped weekly via Priority Mail service from their primary address to a temporary address. Some exceptions apply.
- PFS replaces all informal forwarding arrangements, commonly referred to as "Snowbird Service," offered by some Post Offices to accommodate customers' temporary address changes. As of August 7, 2005, these informal arrangements will no longer be available to customers.
- To enroll, customers visit the Post Office (including any of its stations and branches) serving their primary address and complete and submit PS Form 8176, Premium Forwarding Service Application. Two forms of valid identification (one with photo) are required along with proof of residency at the primary address.
- The cost for PFS includes a \$10 enrollment fee and \$10 for each week of the designated service period. Payment is due at the time of enrollment.
- PFS mail should be bundled and kept with hold-mail.
   Preparation and shipping of PFS mail will be handled similarly to existing hold-mail operations at the primary address Post Office.
- The primary address Post Office will prepare and ship the PFS customer's mail to the temporary address by Priority Mail each Wednesday. A Label 85 (G-400) is affixed to the PFS shipment.

■ Pieces that are too large to fit in the PFS shipment are readdressed and rerouted to the temporary address as "outsides." For details, see the "Disposition of Mail Chart (Post Office Copy)" on page 73 in Postal Bulletin 22158. Do not affix Label 85 to items shipped outside the weekly PFS Shipment.

#### Why?

PFS is a great value. It provides a nationwide consistent service offering to all customers at a uniform price.

#### What stays the same?

PFS is a convenient alternative to temporary or permanent piece-by-piece forwarding and hold-mail services, which will continue to be offered free of charge.

#### What's next?

Postmasters and managers will be provided a sample letter that can be used to craft a personal message to former "Snowbird" customers to introduce the service. PFS Guidelines, which include the sample letter, will be available prior to launch. Postmasters must ensure that employees responsible for accepting PFS applications at the retail unit, tracking customer enrollments, preparing the PFS mail for reshipment, and shipping PFS mail receive instruction on the program's operations and a copy of the PFS Guidelines.

# **Updated Promotion Charts Now Available for Electronic Technicians**

Effective July 7, 2005, *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM) 421 and 422 are revised to reflect negotiations that provided a 2-year labor contract extension between the American Postal Workers Union (APWU) and the Postal Service<sup>™</sup>.

As a result of the negotiations, a new level 12 was created for Electronic Technicians (ETs) and certain employees received an upgrade. Effective November 29, 2003, Electronic Technicians (ETs) levels 10 and 11 were upgraded one grade level, to levels 11 and 12, respectively.

With the addition of the new level 12, five areas within the ELM are revised:

- Exhibit 421.7, Rate Schedule Summary and References.
- 422.111, Salary Schedules.
- Exhibit 422.123a, Promotion Chart PS Schedule 1 to PS Schedule 2.
- Exhibit 422.123b, Promotion Chart PS Schedule 2 to PS Schedule 2.
- Exhibit 422.13, Bargaining Unit Step Increase Waiting Period.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

**B.** PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

**B1.** PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
  - **C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
  - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- **E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.
- E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM C024.1.1C. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM C024.2.0 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.
- F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.
- $\textbf{G.}\,$  Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.
- **H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.
  - H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
- $\mbox{\bf I.}$  Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

 72" length and girth combined

 42"
 24" girth

 over 42" to 44"
 24" girth

 over 44" to 46"
 20" girth

 over 46" to 48"
 16" girth

 Maximum length 48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

- I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.
- **I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.
  - J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.
- **K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
  - L. All official mail is prohibited.
  - M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
  - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.
  - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- ${\bf R.}\,$  All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM C021, are prohibited.
- R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
- **T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
- U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."
- **U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.
- $\mbox{\bf U2.}$  Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.
- **U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
  - V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.
- W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
  - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

What is an endorsement? When Postal Service employees provide favorable comments - in writing, on video, or as conference speakers - about the services or products of a company with whom they have postal business interactions, their comments can be used by the company in its promotional efforts.

# **ENDORSEMENTS**

Why shouldn't you "endorse" companies? Because it violates federal ethics regulations. Under the standards of ethical conduct, a postal employee may not use, or permit the use of, his/her position, title, or any authority associated with his position, to endorse non-postal products, services, or enterprises.



#### Postal Police Officers Step Increase Waiting Period Schedule

Effective July 7, 2005, *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM) Exhibit 422.13, Bargaining Unit Step Increase Waiting Periods, is changed to reflect an agreement dated November 18, 2004, between the Fraternal Order of Police, National Labor Council, USPS No. 2, and the Postal Service™.

Selecting officials or designees evaluate and determine applicants' overall or personal suitability for Postal Service employment by taking into account, but not limiting themselves to, the following factors:

- a. Prior employment history.
- b. Military service.
- c. Criminal conviction history.

Selecting officials also make determinations regarding eligibility factors such as the following:

- d. Minimum age.
- e. Selective Service System status (if required).
- f. Driving history (if required).

Human Resources inactivates applicants found unsuitable or ineligible for employment and notifies these applicants in a letter of this decision. Applicants who are unsuitable are also told that they may request reconsideration. Applicants who are ineligible because they did not register with the Selective Service System or do not meet safe driving requirements (if driving is required) are informed that they may request reconsideration. If an unsuitable or ineligible decision is reversed after a review of a request for reconsideration, the applicant is reactivated.

#### 512.23 Interview

The interview is an essential element in the screening process and its purpose is to predict the likely job performance of the applicant if selected. The interview process contains three components:

- c. Collecting additional job-relevant information to ensure the applicant is eligible and suitable for Postal Service employment.

#### **Equipment Maintenance Allowance Schedule for Rural Routes**

In accordance with provisions of article 9, section 2.J.3 of the Rural Carrier National Agreement, effective July 9, 2005 (pay period 15-05), the equipment maintenance allowance (EMA) will increase from 45.5 cents per mile to 47.5 cents per mile. The EMA is 47.5 cents per mile, or a minimum of \$19.00 per day, whichever is greater.

### Auxiliary Rural Carriers, Rural Carrier Reliefs, Rural Carrier Associates, Rural Carrier Part-Time Flexibles, and Auxiliary Assistance

Employees providing auxiliary assistance or serving auxiliary routes under provisions of article 9, section 2.J.5, receive an EMA of 47.5 cents per mile or \$5.35 per hour,

whichever is greater. This EMA should not exceed the amount provided in the special equipment maintenance allowance for the route stops and miles.

#### **EMA Rate Schedule**

The EMA rate schedule on pages 84–85 supersedes all previously published EMA schedules for employees receiving EMA.

**NEW MANAGEMENT INSTRUCTION** 

#### **Electronic Messaging (e-mail)**

Management Instruction (MI) AS-870-2005-2, *Electronic Messaging (e-mail)*, is now available.

This MI, which replaces MI AS-840-2004-2 of the same name, updates Postal Service<sup>™</sup> policy, standards, and guidelines regarding use of Postal Service e-mail.

The Postal Service manages its electronic messaging environment in a manner consistent with best industry practices to facilitate communication within the Postal Service community and with its customers and suppliers, to ensure the security and integrity of that environment, to comply with all e-mail policies, and to streamline the development and support of electronic messaging applications throughout the organization.

This MI applies to all Postal Service employees, contractors, and third parties authorized to access Postal Service information resources. For the purpose of this MI, third parties are persons or organizations not contracted to the Postal Service that have an approved requirement for access to Postal Service information resources.

This instruction applies to computers, office automation systems, software, and hardware installed or used in the

Postal Service to support the electronic messaging environment and to any related administrative activities. It also applies to all e-mail-enabled applications and stand-alone hand-held devices.

Those customers who already have a *PostalOne!* account and also need access to FAST must register by calling the *PostalOne!* Customer Care Center at 800-522-9085. Detailed instructions on the *FAST/PostalOne!* registration process are available on RIBBS.

#### Customer ID Activation

All FAST customer IDs were activated on July 5. Customers must log on to FAST between July 5 and July 12 to change their passwords. FAST IDs that are not utilized within 7 days of issue will become inactive and require a call to the *PostalOne!* help desk for activation. For those customers who register after July 5, IDs must be utilized within 7 days of issue as described above.

#### Recurring Appointment Submission

All drop shippers who currently have recurring appointments *must* reapply using PS Form 6241, *Recurring Appointment Request*, available at *http://www.usps.com/forms/allforms.htm;* click on *PS Form 6241 (PDF)*. # Distribution: Item 458200, 37-cent *Presidential Libraries* Commemorative Stamp

Stamp distribution offices (SDOs) will receive approximately one-third of their standard automatic distribution quantity for a PSA sheet stamp. Distributions are rounded up to the nearest master carton size (40,000 stamps).

#### **Initial Supply to Post Offices**

SDOs will make a subsequent automatic distribution to Post Offices of one-fourth their standard automatic distribution quantity using PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return.* SDOs must not distribute stamps to Post Offices before July 29, 2005.

#### **Philatelic Requirement**

Stamp distribution offices will not receive a separate quantity Item 458200 for their authorized philatelic centers. Philatelic centers must be supplied their quantities from the initial automatic distribution made to SDOs.

#### **Additional Supply**

Post Offices requiring additional stamps must requisition Item 458200 from their designated SDO using PS Form 17. SDOs requiring additional stamps must order them from the appropriate accountable paper depository (APD) using PS Form 17.

For fulfilling supplemental orders from SDOs, the New York, Chicago, Memphis, and San Francisco APDs will each receive 800,000 additional stamps; and the Denver APD will receive 200,000 additional stamps.

#### **Sales Policy**

All Post Offices must acquire and maintain a supply of each new commemorative stamp as long as customer demand exists, until inventory is depleted, or until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. If supplies run low, Post Offices must reorder additional quantities using their normal ordering procedures.

HANDBOOK PO-603 REVISION

### Updated PS Form 4241-A, U.S. Postal Service Rural Route Evaluation

Effective immediately, Handbook PO-603, *Rural Carrier Duties and Responsibilities*, is revised to include an updated PS Form 4241-A, *Rural Route Evaluation*, that includes a new field on line number 4, Reload/Unload (Route Time). This line displays the standard time allowance provided to each rural route that was introduced with the extension of the 2000–2004 Agreement between the United States Postal Service and the National Rural Letter Carriers' Association. In addition, the text at the bottom of the form was changed to clarify that line items are included in office and route time, respectively.

The revised PS Form 4241-A will be incorporated into the next printed version of Handbook PO-603.




