### Fredonia, NY, artwork gets a facelift

It's been nearly 70 years since artist Arnold Blanch painted the mural *Harvest Scene* above the customer service door at the Fredonia, NY, Post Office. Commissioned in 1937 by President Roosevelt, *Harvest Scene* was one of more than 1,500 pieces of art created through Roosevelt's New Deal arts program.

Thanks to the work of painting conservators Elizabeth Kendall and Peter Schoenmann, who spent a week cleaning and restoring the mural, it's been returned to its original pristine condition.

Western New York District has 19 offices exhibiting New Deal art works.

### USPS environmental performance improves

USPS environmental performance as measured by our compliance to environmental standards has improved by 38 percent in the last two years.

That's according to the *Environmental Compliance Review Trending Report* released by USPS Environmental Management Policy. Results are reported from independent audits of more than 700 facilities, including processing and distribution centers, vehicle maintenance facilities and other large postal operations.

Changes are good not only for the environment — they're also good for the Postal Service. Improvements have helped reduce training and recordkeeping costs, and have lowered the risk of service disruptions if a facility is found to be in noncompliance with an environmental regulation.

All USPS areas showed improvements, led by the Western area with a 55 percent performance increase since 2004.

### Making good on our commitments in the Lower 9th

With two delivery routes opening in the Lower 9th Ward recently, the Postal Service is making good on its commitment to re-establish mail delivery to every part of New Orleans — including those areas hit hardest by Hurricane Katrina.

Letter Carrier Wayne Treaudo delivered one of the two routes. "It's a positive sign for the Lower 9th," said resident Roosevelt Johnson as Treaudo handed him mail. "I feel great about it — things are looking better."

"It felt good to help build back the community," says Treaudo, who is living with his family in a FEMA trailer. After a temporary assignment in Beaumont, TX, he returned to



New Orleans in January, working from temporary postal trailers while restoration work was completed at Bywater Station, which opened July 10.

### Customer Connect increasing postal revenue

Customer Connect is helping to increase USPS revenue — thanks to the coordinated efforts of every employee who makes the program a success.

Carrier participation has reached more than 41 percent since the program started. Customer Connect reported more than \$2.4 million in projected annualized revenue for the second week of July.

Behind all that revenue are employees keeping their eyes and ears open for leads. Congratulations to Long Island District Letter Carrier Martin Kielawa for submitting a lead card that resulted in \$1 million in annualized revenue. Lakeland District Letter Carrier Al Severin submitted a lead for \$125,000 annualized revenue, and Northern Virginia Letter Carrier Jit-Ur Taupradistha turned in a lead for \$107,900 annualized revenue.

Total year-to-date projected annualized revenue through mid-July is \$83 million. So how much revenue has the program been responsible for since it began? \$192,705,998 total projected annualized revenue. Keep those cards and leads coming!

Mickey Mantle, Roy Campanella, Hank Greenberg and Mel Ott were immortalized on postage at home plate as Postmaster General Jack Potter, joined by the Hall of Famers' family members, dedicated the commemorative stamps and stamped postal cards.

Designs for the stamps are based on historic photographs adapted to resemble old-fashioned baseball cards. The 39-cent *Baseball Sluggers* stamps are available in sheets of 20 (four designs). The 24-cent *Baseball Sluggers* stamped postal cards are available in booklet sets of 20 (four designs). Both are on sale nationwide.

### Labeling List Changes

Effective August 3, 2006, we are revising Labeling Lists L001, L002, L004, L005, L007, L011, L201, L606, and L801 of the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) to reflect changes in mail processing operations. Mailers are encouraged to label according to these revised lists immediately, but *must* comply with these changes no later than October 15, 2006.

## DMM REVISION

**Permit Reply Mail**

We offer mailers three choices for providing a reply envelope to customers: Courtesy Reply Mail™, which requires the customers to pay for their own postage; Business Reply Mail®, paid by the mailer; and Meter Reply Mail, which allows mailers to affix postage when they are confident the recipient will return the reply envelope back through the U.S. mail.

Effective August 3, 2006, we are revising section 507.9.0 of *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)* to add a fourth option, Permit Reply Mail (PRM). PRM allows mailers to prepay reply postage using a permit imprint account at the time of mailing. This option makes it easier for mailers who have permit imprint accounts to pay in advance for reply mailpieces.

**9.0 Permit Reply Mail****9.1 General Information****9.1.1 Description**

Permit Reply Mail (PRM) enables a permit imprint permit holder to receive First-Class Mail and Priority Mail back from customers by prepaying postage for reply pieces at the time of mailing. Mailers must distribute PRM pieces as part of a discount First-Class Mail mailing and may not distribute them through any other means.

**9.1.2 Services**

No extra services (certified, insured, registered, and so forth) are permitted with PRM.

**9.1.3 Address**

The delivery address on a PRM mailpiece may not be altered to redirect it to any address other than the one preprinted on the piece.

**9.1.4 Permit Holder Intentions**

PRM may not be used for any purpose other than the purpose intended by the permit holder, even when postage is affixed.

**9.2 Authorization and Revocation****9.2.1 Authorization**

PRM customers must apply for authorization through the district manager, Business Mail Entry at the office where the permit imprint account is held.

**9.2.2 Samples**

Permit holders must submit preproduction samples of PRM pieces to the Postal Service for approval prior to distribution.

**9.2.3 Error Notification**

If the Postal Service discovers a PRM format error, the permit holder or authorized agent will receive a written notification of the error. The permit holder must correct the error and ensure that all future PRM pieces meet appropriate specifications. The Postal Service may revoke a PRM authorization if a mailer repeatedly distributes PRM with format errors (see 9.2.4).

**9.2.4 Revocation of Authorization**

The Postal Service may revoke a PRM authorization because of format errors or misuse. If the authorization is revoked due to format errors, the format errors must be corrected before reauthorization.

**9.3 Format Elements****9.3.1 General**

All pieces of PRM must include the format elements shown in Exhibit 9.3.1.

### Exhibit 9.3.1 Permit Reply Mail Format Elements



#### 9.3.2 Printing and Print Reflectance

All legible forms of printing are permitted. Mailers may not use handwriting, typewriting, or handstamping to prepare PRM.

#### 9.3.3 “No Postage Necessary” Imprint

The imprint, “NO POSTAGE NECESSARY IF MAILED IN THE UNITED STATES,” must be printed in the upper right corner of the address side of the piece. The imprint must not extend more than 1-3/4 inches from the right edge of the piece.

#### 9.3.4 Permit Reply Mail Legend

The legend, “PERMIT REPLY MAIL,” must appear on all pieces. The legend must appear above the address in capital letters at least 3/16 inch high. At the permit holder’s discretion, the permit reply mail legend may be surrounded by a rule or border.

#### 9.3.5 Permit Number and Postage Endorsement

Directly below the permit reply mail legend, the words, “FIRST-CLASS MAIL PERMIT NO. [NO., CITY, STATE]” (representing the permit holder’s number and the Post Office that issued the permit) must appear in capital letters. The permit holder may replace the permit number and the Post Office with a company permit as described in 9.5. Directly below that, the endorsement, “POSTAGE HAS BEEN PREPAID BY ADDRESSEE,” must appear in capital letters. At the permit holder’s discretion, the permit number and postage endorsement may be surrounded by a rule or border.

#### 9.3.6 Delivery Address

The complete address (including the permit holder’s name, delivery address, city, state, ZIP+4 code, and corresponding delivery point barcode) must be printed directly on the piece.

#### 9.3.7 Facing Identification Mark

A facing identification mark (FIM) C must be printed on all letter-size PRM. The FIM C must meet the physical standards in 708.9.0.

#### 9.3.8 Company Logo

A company logo is permitted as follows:

- On letter-size PRM, if the logo is placed no lower than 5/8 inch from the bottom edge of the piece.
- On any piece, if the logo does not interfere with any required format element.

### 9.4 Permit Imprint Account

Mailers may distribute PRM as part of the contents of an outgoing mailing only by using a valid permit imprint account. The standards for using permit imprints are located in 604.5.0.

### 9.5 Company Permit Reply Mail Imprint

A company permit reply mail imprint is one in which the exact name of the company holding the permit is shown in the permit reply mail indicia in place of the city, state, and permit number.

#### 9.5.1 Use

A customer may use a company permit reply mail imprint if, for 1 year from the date of mailing, the permit holder or its agent keeps records for each mailing paid with a company permit reply mail imprint and makes them available for USPS review on request. These records include the weight of a single piece, the total number of pieces mailed, the total postage and the date(s) and Post Office(s) of mailing. A complete sample mailpiece must be included for each mailing.

#### 9.5.2 Format

To create a company permit reply mail imprint, replace the words “PERMIT No. [NO., CITY, STATE]” (representing the permit holder’s number and the Post Office that issued the permit), with “PERMIT PAID BY [COMPANY NAME]” (representing the name of the company as stated in the delivery address of the mailpiece) in capital letters.

## DMM REVISION

**New Interim Temporary Mail Forwarding Policy**

Effective August 3, 2006, we are revising 507.2.1.3 of the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) to change the mail forwarding standards for temporary change-of-address orders. We are changing the minimum duration of a temporary change-of-address order from 1 day to 2 weeks. Also, we are changing the maximum duration for an *initial* temporary order from 12 months to 6 months. Customers who wish to have their mail forwarded for a longer period can submit an additional order to extend the forwarding period up to the maximum allowable 12-month period.

When a customer has already received temporary forwarding service for a continuous 12-month period for any same old and new address combination, the Postal Service™ will not accept additional temporary change-of-address orders from that customer for those same old and new address combinations.

The Postal Service recommends that customers who will be temporarily away from their residence for less than 2 weeks submit a request to hold their mail. Hold requests can be submitted in person or by mail to their Post Office™, electronically through [www.usps.com](http://www.usps.com), or by telephone through 800-ASK-USPS. Customers may ask that held mail be delivered upon their return or request to pick up the mail at their Post Office.

**2.1.3 Temporary Forwarding**

*[Revise 2.1.3 to clarify minimum and maximum periods of temporary change-of-address orders as follows:]*

A customer temporarily moving away may have mail forwarded for a specific time, not to exceed 12 months total duration. The Postal Service provides temporary forwarding services in periods from 2 weeks to 6 months in duration, based upon customer requests. Customers may request temporary forwarding in excess of 6 months up to a maximum of 12 months by submitting a second temporary change-of-address order that will begin on the first day of the second 6-month period and expire on the desired date up to and including the last day of the second 6-month period. The customer must show beginning and ending dates in the change-of-address order.

## REMINDER

**Political Campaign Mail**

One of the most important public policy functions of the Postal Service™ is serving as a trusted partner in our nation's electoral process. The general election on November 7, 2006, will determine the makeup of the U.S. Congress, state executive and legislative branches, and local governments.

This is a reminder of the standards relative to political campaign mailings. These standards are contained in the *Postal Operations Manual (POM)*, Part 492, Political Campaign Mail, and in the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), 703.1, Nonprofit Standard Mail.

### POM REVISION

## Political Campaign Mail Processing Procedures

Effective August 3, 2006, we are revising *Postal Operations Manual* (POM) 492.72 to revise references to PS Forms 3602; Publication 417, *Nonprofit Standard Mail Eligibility*; and the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®).

We are also reprinting the rest of 492, Political Campaign Mail, as a reminder of the requirements for handling political campaign mail.

The American electorate votes on numerous political offices and issues. Citizens cast ballots every 4 years for President, every 2 years for one-third of the U.S. senators

and all members of the House of Representatives, and at varying frequencies for governorships and other state, county, and local offices and referenda measures. During the period preceding local, state, and national primaries, special elections, and general elections, the Postal Service accepts and delivers many political campaign mailings, frequently in large quantities. These mailings are made up by individual candidates and their campaign organizations, as well as by local, state, and national committees of political parties.

### 492.12 Postal Service Responsibility

The Postal Service is responsible for providing information to assist in the knowledgeable preparation and deposit of political campaign mailings, as well as for the proper acceptance, processing, delivery, and recording of these mailings.

### 492.13 Nonprofit Standard Mail Rates

Section 3626(e) of Title 39, U.S. Code, as enacted by Public Law 95-593, permits certain Standard Mail matter to be mailed by a “qualified political committee” at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates prescribed for qualified nonprofit organizations (see DMM 703.1.0). Also see 492.23 for a definition of “qualified political committee” and 492.73 for the

standards on what mail may be sent at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates by qualified political committees.

## **492.2 Definitions**

### **492.21 Political Campaign Mailings**

Any material accepted for mailing at First-Class Mail or Standard Mail postage rates that is mailed for political campaign purposes by a registered political candidate, campaign committee, or committee of a political party is classified as a political campaign mailing. This type of mailing normally uses the address of a candidate's campaign committee or the committee of a political party as the return address. Do not confuse political campaign mailings with official mailings by members of Congress under congressional franking privileges. See 491 for a discussion of congressional mail.

### **492.22 Registered Political Candidate or Party**

An individual or organization recognized as such by the appropriate governmental election control authority is considered to be a registered political candidate or party.

### **492.23 Qualified Political Committee**

Section 3626(e)(2) of Title 39, U.S.C., defines a qualified political committee for the purpose of eligibility for Nonprofit Standard Mail rates as follows:

- a. The term qualified political committee means:
  - (1) A national committee of a political party.
  - (2) A state committee of a political party.
  - (3) The Democratic Congressional Campaign Committee.
  - (4) The Democratic Senatorial Campaign Committee.
  - (5) The National Republican Congressional Committee.
  - (6) The National Republican Senatorial Committee.
- b. The term national committee means the organization that, by virtue of the bylaws of a political party, is responsible for the day-to-day operation of that political party at the national level.
- c. The term state committee means the organization that, by virtue of the bylaws of a political party, is responsible for the day-to-day operation of that political party at the state level.

## **492.3 Premailing Assistance**

### **492.31 General**

Experience has shown that there will be no cause for criticism if all mailers of political campaign material are fully informed of postal requirements for prompt delivery and are assured of proper and equal handling of their mailings.

### **492.32 Responsibilities**

Managers, Marketing, Customer Service districts, are responsible for ensuring proper premailing assistance to all committees of political parties, candidates for political office, and/or the candidates' campaign committees within their jurisdictions. Individuals designated by managers, Marketing, as directly responsible for contacting the committees of political parties, political candidates, and campaign organizations must follow the requirements in 492.36.

### **492.33 Identification of Candidates**

Managers, Marketing, Customer Service districts, or their designees, must identify all candidates for election to political office who will be campaigning within their district's jurisdiction, as follows:

- a. *Presidential Candidates.* Contact state campaign headquarters. Determine locations of mailings and notify appropriate Postal Service personnel for necessary follow-up.
- b. *Congressional Candidates.* Identify all candidates for election to the Senate and House of Representatives and their principal campaign offices and notify appropriate Postal Service personnel for necessary follow-up.
- c. *State Candidates.* In statewide elections, identify gubernatorial and other candidates and their principal campaign offices and notify appropriate Postal Service personnel for necessary follow-up.
- d. *Local Candidates.* Coordinate efforts with postmasters to identify all candidates and/or campaign organizations in those areas holding local elections for county, city, township, borough, parish, and other local offices, and ensure necessary followup.

### **492.34 Political Campaign Information Sources**

State and local boards of election and offices of secretaries of state and county clerks generally can provide information on the names and headquarters of committees of political parties; candidates for federal, state, and local offices; and their campaign organizations.

### **492.35 Equal Assistance**

Equal assistance must be provided to all committees of political parties, candidates, and candidates' campaign committees, including those that do not represent major parties.

### **492.36 Premailing Contact Requirements**

Make contact with the committees of political parties, candidates, and the candidates' campaign organizations at the



earliest opportunity to provide information on mail preparation requirements, mail handling procedures, and other matters discussed in 492.37. On-site assistance can be helpful, particularly with campaign volunteers, to identify problems in mail preparation and sack or tray labeling before deposit of the mailings. Emphasize the need to deposit the mailings at the earliest possible date before election day, particularly to candidates or organizations planning to avail themselves of the destination bulk mail center drop shipment rates. Keep records of all contacts, including a general summary statement covering the information provided to the candidates and campaign organizations.

#### **492.37 Mail Preparation and Handling Information**

At a minimum, provide committees of political parties, candidates, and the candidates' campaign organizations with information on the following:

- a. Rates and fees, including automation and destination entry drop shipment rates.
- b. Mailing permits and authorizations. See applicable sections of the DMM for instructions on obtaining permits and authorizations for mailing at various rates. National and state political committees may be given instructions on filing for Nonprofit Standard Mail rates as a qualified political committee, as found in DMM 703.1.0 and Publication 417, *Nonprofit Standard Mail Eligibility*, section 3-1. Instructions on obtaining authorization to mail at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates at additional offices are also found in DMM 703.1.0 and Publication 417 section 3-2.
- c. Restrictions on what may be mailed at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates for state and national political committees (see 492.73). See also Publication 417 section 5-4, and chapter 6.
- d. Preparation, makeup, and handling of mailings, including an explanation of ancillary service endorsements and address information products and services.
- e. Availability and use of mailing supplies and equipment.
- f. Business reply mail.
- g. Disposition of undeliverable pieces.
- h. Time frames for depositing mailings.

#### **492.4 Processing and Delivery**

##### **492.41 General**

All managers involved in processing and delivering political campaign mailings must ensure that each mailing is handled promptly and with equal care and attention.

##### **492.42 Area Political Campaign Mail Coordinators**

Area Vice Presidents must appoint an Area Political Campaign Mail Coordinator and provide the name, address, and phone number of the individual assigned that is responsible to each district manager under their jurisdiction and to the Vice President, Delivery and Retail, at Headquarters.

##### **492.43 Late Deposit**

Inform mailers attempting to deposit political campaign mailings that may be too late for delivery by the election date under Postal Service delivery objectives of the potential for late delivery. Document and maintain this advice. See 492.5.

##### **492.44 Reports of Delays**

Give immediate attention to any reported delay in processing or delivering political campaign mailings and fully document inquiries made and subsequent action taken (see 492.53).

##### **492.45 Handling of Undeliverable As Addressed Mail**

If a significant amount of a campaign mailing is received that is undeliverable as addressed, postmasters must inform the applicable campaign office before any action to dispose of such mail. Postmasters should also coordinate any such situations with their Area Political Campaign Mail Coordinator.

#### **492.5 Recordkeeping**

##### **492.51 General**

Detailed records provide the basis for a documented and factual explanation of any complaints alleging improper handling of political campaign mailings. Maintain premailing assistance and processing and delivery records for a period of 6 months.

##### **492.52 Premailing Assistance Records**

Individuals designated to provide premailing assistance to committees of political parties, candidates, and the candidates' campaign organizations must keep records of all contacts, including a summary statement concerning the information provided to such mailers.

*Note:* PS Tag 57, *Political Campaign Mailing*, identifies campaign mailings during processing and distribution. PS Tag 57 is available from the Material Distribution Center and is reusable. If mail is trayed and strapped, mailers should affix PS Tag 57 to the strap on the end of the tray near the tray label with a wire twist tie. If local postal instructions permit trays to be tendered without strapping, then PS Tag 57 should be affixed to the tray with a rubber band double looped through the handhold of the tray on the end near the tray label. Care should be taken to remove the tags from the trays after the campaign mail has been processed.

**492.53 Processing and Delivery Records**

Managers, Business Mail Entry, and postmasters must keep documented records of all political campaign mailings that are deposited or received at their offices, with particular attention to those deposited or received too late for timely delivery.

At a minimum, these documented records must include the following:

- a. The name of the mailer.
- b. A sample, photocopy, or description of the mailing.
- c. The date and time the mailing was received for dispatch or delivery.
- d. The election day deadline and, if applicable, the date of requested delivery.
- e. If applicable, the approximate number of pieces not delivered before the election day deadline and/or the date of requested delivery and the reasons why delivery was not timely.
- f. The approximate volume of any Standard Mail consigned to waste upon instruction by the mailer.

**492.6 Answering Requests for Information****492.61 General**

Answer requests for information concerning political campaign mailings as provided in regulations implementing the Freedom of Information Act (see Handbook AS-353, *Guide to Privacy and the Freedom of Information Act*). Do not compile information not regularly compiled for Postal Service use to respond to requests.

**492.62 Field Managing Counsel Assistance**

If uncertain regarding the disclosure of information concerning political campaign mailings, consult the Field Managing Counsel.

**492.63 Questionable Requests**

Promptly report to the Postal Inspection Service any questionable attempts to obtain information concerning political campaign mailings not properly subject to disclosure.

**492.7 Revenue Protection****492.71 Nonprofit Standard Mail Rates**

Qualified political committees may mail qualifying matter at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates of postage. See 492.23 for definitions of qualified political committees. See also DMM 703.1.0 and Publication 417 for general information on how to apply for authorization to mail at these rates and the matter that is eligible for them.

**492.72 Mailings Ineligible for Nonprofit Standard Mail Rates**

Individual candidates and their campaign committees do not qualify to mail at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates. Also, qualified political committees may mail only their own matter at these rates. Qualified political committees may not make cooperative mailings at the nonprofit rates involving matter on behalf of, or produced for, individual candidates or political organizations that do not qualify for Nonprofit Standard Mail rates. Such cooperative mailings must be paid at the applicable Regular or Enhanced Carrier Route Standard Mail rates. See PS Form 3602-EZ, PS Form 3602-N, PS Form 3602-NZ, PS Form 3602-R, and PS Form 3602-C, for the certifications required of Nonprofit Standard Mail mailers. Also see Publication 417 sections 5-3 and 5-4.

**492.73 Application of the Cooperative Mail Rules****492.731 General**

Qualified political committees are subject to the cooperative mailing requirements. However, unlike cases involving cooperative mailings between an authorized nonprofit organization and a commercial organization, there is often an ongoing relationship between the qualified political committee and the committee's candidate. A political candidate may be connected to the authorized political committee mailer by being a member of and/or financial contributor to the political party represented by the committee. The committee is, of course, interested in promoting, encouraging, and supporting the candidate's election. Postal laws and regulations do not prohibit the candidate from contributing to the committee or the committee from supporting the candidate. The concern under postal laws and regulations is whether the political candidate's financial contribution to the authorized political committee is in return for the mailing or mailings that support the candidate.

**Example — Proper use of contributed funds**

Politician A is a member of the qualified political committee. The qualified political committee plans to include in a mail-piece information supporting politician A's candidacy for office and has asked the candidate for a biographical sketch. The candidate provides the information and makes a contribution to the qualified political committee. The qualified political committee will retain authority to accept or reject information provided by the candidate, and the contribution by the candidate is not a contribution to pay for the mailing. This is not considered to be a cooperative mailing since the qualified political committee retained discretion over the decision to mail and the contents of the mailing.

#### 492.732 Maintaining Committee Control

The following rules must be followed to ensure that the authorized political committee maintains control:

- a. *Mailings.* An authorized political committee may mail election-related materials, including but not limited to candidate endorsements and sample ballots, at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates if the materials are exclusively those of the authorized political committee. An authorized political committee may make political mailings in support of its candidates, provided that no monies contributed by the candidate to the qualified committee shall be specifically earmarked for use in making the political mailing or in return for the political mailing.

##### Example — Committee discretion retained

Politician B, a candidate for a statewide political office, mails a check to authorized political committee C, the state committee for his party. Politician B encloses a note with the check that says: "This check is for my pro rata share of a sample ballot." Committee C has mailed a sample ballot to state residents for the past five elections. However, committee C makes the decision on whether to send sample ballots on an election-by-election basis. Committee C has not had any discussions with politician B on this subject, nor has it reached an understanding with politician B that sample ballots will be produced and mailed. Committee C deposits politician B's check into its general fund to be used for committee expenses. Committee C will not return the check even if it decides not to mail sample ballots. Committee C later decides to mail sample ballots for the election in which politician B is a candidate. Notwithstanding politician B's contribution, this is not considered to be a cooperative mailing because committee C retained discretion whether or not to mail the sample ballots.

- b. *Contributions.* A candidate may make or solicit contributions to a qualified political committee, provided that the committee retains absolute discretion over how the funds are spent. If the candidate or other nonqualified entity pays the preparation, printing, or postage costs for the mailing in return for the qualified political committee's agreement to make the mailing, that mail matter is not eligible for the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates.
- c. *Mailing Support.* A political candidate may provide suggested copy, pictures, biographical information, or similar assistance requested by a qualified political committee that is preparing a mailing in support of the candidate. The qualified political committee may also

ask a candidate to review a proposed mailpiece for accuracy. However, the qualified political committee must have final authority over the decision to mail the political matter and the contents of that matter.

##### Example — Improper candidate funding

Authorized political committee D announces the creation of a "Candidate's Coordinated Mailing Fund." Contributions to the fund will be used exclusively for mailings supporting candidates. Candidates E, F, G, and H contribute to the fund, and committee D makes a multi-candidate endorsement for candidates E, F, G, H, and I. This would be considered a cooperative mailing. It would not be a cooperative mailing if (a) the fund created is not announced as one that will be used exclusively for mailings, and (b) committee D retained absolute discretion about whether to make the mailings at all.

#### 492.733 Endorsements on Mail

Mailings by qualified political committees often bear endorsements such as "Paid for by [committee] and authorized by [candidate]." These endorsements are often required by federal or state law. The presence of these endorsements alone does not disqualify the mailing from being sent at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates. The presence of factors discussed in the preceding sections of this chapter is required to find the mailing ineligible for the special rates.

#### 492.74 Identification

The name and return address of the qualifying organization must appear either on the outside of the mailpiece or in a prominent location on the material being mailed at the Nonprofit Standard Mail rates.

- **Security.** Your mail is protected, under lock and key as well as by federal statute.
- **Accessibility.** With a Post Office box, your mail is usually available before 10:00 A.M. You can pick up your mail at your convenience — early, late, any time the Post Office lobby is open. Since most Post Offices are located near other businesses, you may want to get a jump on the day by receiving your mail at a Post Office box near where you work.
- **Anonymity.** Post Office box service lets you receive important mail that is for your eyes only, keeping your personal or business mail private. Only you have the key.
- **Stability.** If you move often or travel frequently and need to establish one place where you receive your mail, then a Post Office box is the answer. Your mail is there when you return.<sup>7</sup>

- **Flexibility.** Expand your company without opening new offices. Apply for Post Office box service in cities where you do business, and pick up your mail as you travel. You don't have to live in a community to get a Post Office box there.
- **Affordability.** Post Office boxes come in five different sizes, from 3 inches × 5-1/2 inches to 22-1/2 inches × 12 inches. Check with your local Post Office to see what sizes are available. You'll find the price to be reasonable, too. Based on a customer's eligibility for carrier delivery service, a no-fee Post Office box may be available. Otherwise, the semiannual fees range from \$9 to \$348, depending on the box size and the Post Office.

## HANDBOOK EL-312 REVISION

### Changes to Employment Programs

Effective August 3, 2006, Handbook EL-312, *Employment and Placement*, is revised to reflect changes to employment programs.

#### Summary of Changes to Handbook EL-312

**232.3, Definitions Applicable to Recruitment**, clarifies that a separation from active duty in the military is a discharge or release from active duty as specified in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2006 Defense Authorization Act.

**233.11, Examination Requirements**, adds new text for examination "470 (Group 1), and 470 (Group 2)" to the list of obsolete examinations. Adds new text for "bidding on or applying for a bargaining position" to clarify that the obsolete examinations rule only applies to career employees. Deletes the text dealing with continuous service and the former implementation date for examination 470. Employees already qualified on battery examination 470 are qualified on battery examination 473 for positions covered by battery examination 470.

**313, Duration of Results**, adds new text to clarify how long written examination or rated application is valid for purposes of noncompetitive external recruitment. Clarifies the duration of a performance entrance examination. Divides the text into five new parts.

**322.71, Delayed Application**, adds text to clarify that applicants or temporary employees who are not entitled to 10-point veterans' preference must meet all of the conditions for one of the delayed authorities in order to be permitted to take an examination not open to the public. Adds text stating that only preference eligibles can apply for examinations covering positions restricted to applicants entitled to veterans' preference. Subsumes text under 322.711, 322.712, and 322.713 into one heading: 322.711. Renumbers remaining sections. Adds text to 322.712 and 322.713 explaining that an examination for one register may be taken only once. Adds new sections for transitional employees (TEs) represented by the American Postal Workers Union and National Association of Letter Carriers based on the original implementation instructions. Clarifies which applicants may sign up for an entrance examination when that examination is not open to the public. Revises 322.711 to be consistent with 5 CFR 332.312(b). New text for delayed testing opportunities for TEs is taken from 1993 instructions and Memorandums of Understanding for testing TEs. Deletes 322.716.

**322.711, Persons Unable to Apply During an Open Examination Because of Military Service**, is updated by adding "Federal Employee" to the beginning of the title of c and adding "who is a federal employee" so that the Postal Service policy is aligned with 5 CFR 332.312(b).

**413, Restricted Records**, adds new text that describes precisely how to prepare *Hiring Worksheets* in order to provide a copy to a collective bargaining agent.

**422.3, Resolving Duplicate Ratings**, adds new text stating that the appropriate rule for dealing with duplicate ratings applies to both delayed and reopened applications. Adds text addressing how to resolve a situation in which an applicant's new rating is lower than his or her existing rating.

**483.1, 5-Point Preference**, clarifies that a separation from active duty in the military is a discharge or release from active duty. Adds a new category of veterans who are entitled to 5-point preference: served on active duty for more than 180 consecutive days, any part of which occurred during the period beginning on September 11, 2001. These changes are specified in the FY 2006 Defense Authorization Act.

**483.21, Disabled Veterans**, clarifies that a separation from active duty in the military is a discharge or release from active duty as specified in the FY 2006 Defense Authorization Act.

**483.221, Spouses of Disabled Veterans**, clarifies that a separation from active duty in the military is a discharge or release from active duty as specified in the FY 2006 Defense Authorization Act.

**513.5, Citizenship Policy**, clarifies that permanent resident aliens are known as lawful permanent resident aliens.

**551, Determining Eligibility at Screening Stage**, clarifies that permanent resident aliens are known as lawful permanent resident aliens. Adds descriptions of applicants who are ineligible for Postal Service employment because they are not lawful permanent resident aliens.

**552, Determining Eligibility After Job Offer**, clarifies that permanent resident aliens are known as lawful permanent resident aliens. Adds descriptions of applicants who are ineligible for Postal Service employment because they are not lawful permanent resident aliens.



**743.17, Posting a Vacancy Announcement**, adds text clarifying where to find instructions for typing and driving requirements.

#### 233.11 Examination Requirements

*[Revise 233.11a to read as follows:]*

- a. *Obsolete examinations*. Examinations 400, 440, 450, 710 (when it was given for Markup Clerk, Automated only), 470 (Group 1), and 470 (Group 2) are obsolete. However, a career employee bidding on or applying for a bargaining position who qualified on an old examination is permanently qualified for the *position(s)* covered by that examination.

### 313 Duration of Results

*[Revise 313 to read as follows:]*

The time period examination results are valid is based on the type of examination and situation in which qualification is required.

#### 313.1 Written Examination or Rated Application Entrance Rating

An entrance rating of “eligible” (on either the written examination or rated application) is valid for a minimum period

of 2 years and may be extended by the applicant for a third year and for additional years by hiring officials.

#### 313.2 Performance Examination Entrance Rating

An entrance rating of “eligible” on a performance examination is valid for 2 years.

#### 313.3 Noncompetitive Ratings for Reinstatement, Transfer from Another Agency, or Veterans Recruitment Appointment

An entrance rating of “eligible” (on either the written examination or rated application) is used in place of the equivalent noncompetitive examination — even if the rating on the register has expired — as long as the examination or rating guide specification has not changed. When an examination or rating guide is replaced, once entrance results for the new examination or rating guide for a specific area are available from the first entrance announcement to the public, an eligible rating from the new examination or rating guide is required to make one of these noncompetitive actions.

#### 313.4 Written Examination or Rated Application Ratings for Inservice Placement

A rating of “eligible” for the inservice examination (on either the written examination or rated application) is valid indefinitely, unless the examination or rating guide specification is changed. An entrance rating of “eligible” (on either the written examination or rated application) is used in place of the equivalent inservice examination — even if the rating on the register has expired — as long as the examination or rating guide specification has not changed. See 233.11, Examination Requirements, for situations in which it is permitted to substitute an examination.

#### 313.5 Performance Examination Results for Inservice Placement

An inservice performance test (including a dictation test) rating of “eligible” is valid for a maximum period of 2 years. The rating can be extended if the employee holds a position requiring regular use of the skill or ability tested (e.g., typing), in which case the result is valid as long as the employee holds the position.

### 322.7 Delayed and Reopened Examinations

\* \* \* \* \*

**322.71 Delayed Application**

*[Revise 322.71 to read as follows:]*

This section contains special conditions that allow for the acceptance of applications on a delayed basis due to military service and other situations. Except for applicants entitled to 10-point veterans' preference, applicants or temporary employees are allowed to take an entrance examination when it is not open to the general public only under circumstances described in this section. To take an examination under one of these authorities, the applicant or temporary employee must meet all the requirements for that authority.

**Special Note:** Certain examinations are used to fill positions restricted to applicants who are entitled to veterans' preference (see 232.52). Only applicants entitled to veterans' preference can file a delayed application for these examinations.

**322.711 Persons Unable to Apply During an Open Examination Because of Military Service**

- a. **Persons on Active Military Duty** — Persons who were unable to file while an examination was open because of active military service or because of hospitalization continuing for not more than 1 year following discharge from military service may file a *delayed* application if all of the following conditions are met:
  1. The application is filed within 120 days after discharge from the military or the hospital.
  2. Active applicants still exist from the missed examination.
  3. The applicant was discharged under honorable conditions.
- b. **Persons Filing Early Applications Before Military Discharge** — A person who is currently serving in the Armed Forces may file an application before discharge from active duty for any examination that was open while he or she was in the military. Such a person may file within 120 days before discharge under honorable conditions.
- c. **Federal Employee Reservists Filing Applications While on Active Duty** — An application will be accepted from a member of a reserve unit of the Armed Forces who is a federal employee and who was unable to file an application or appear for the written test because of active duty (even if designated for training purposes). Acceptance of the application is subject to the following conditions:
  1. The active duty must have been for a period of more than 15 days.
  2. The examination for which the applicant wishes to file must have been open to the public anytime during the period of active duty.

3. The examination ratings that resulted from the examination are still active.
4. The applicant may file the application while on active duty, but must file no later than 120 days after release from such duty.

**322.712 Postmaster Relief/Leave Replacement**

Postmaster Relief/Leave Replacements (PMR/LRs) may take two competitive entrance examinations on a delayed basis for entrance registers in the district where they work as a PMR/LR. They cannot take an examination under this authority for the same register more than once. To be eligible, PMR/LRs must be currently employed and have been a PMR/LR continuously for at least 1 year in their present period of employment. Service as a temporary postmaster or officer in charge (OIC) is counted the same as PMR/LR employment for the purpose of eligibility for the two competitive entrance examination opportunities. PMR/LR employees are limited to a maximum of two opportunities regardless of any separate employment periods they may have had in the past or will have in the future. Once PMR/LRs use their two examination opportunities, they cannot request additional administrations under this authority.

**322.713 Casual Employees**

Casuals may take two competitive entrance examinations on a delayed basis for entrance registers in the district where they work as a casual. They cannot take an examination under this authority for the same register more than once. To be eligible, casuals must have completed a minimum of 180 days of employment as a casual and continue to be actively employed as a casual on the date of application. The 180-day minimum service does not have to be continuous, but it must have occurred during the 2-year period before the date of application. Casual employees are limited to a maximum of two entrance examination opportunities. Once casuals use their two examination opportunities, they cannot request additional administrations under this authority.

**322.714 APWU Transitional Employees**

A transitional employee (TE) represented by the American Postal Workers Union (APWU) may take two competitive entrance examinations for positions represented by the APWU on a delayed basis for entrance registers that serve the installation where the TE is currently employed. An eligible TE can take two different entrance examinations or the same entrance examination twice. An APWU TE is allowed to take an examination only for APWU-represented positions and may be considered only for such positions under this authority. To be eligible, a TE must have completed a minimum of 180 days of employment as an APWU TE and continue to be actively employed as such on the date of application. Once APWU TEs use their two

examination opportunities, they cannot request additional administrations under this authority.

### 322.715 NALC Transitional Employees

A TE represented by the National Association of Letter Carriers (NALC) may take one competitive entrance examination on a delayed basis for the carrier entrance register that serves the installation where he or she is currently employed. A NALC TE is allowed to take an examination only for carrier and be considered only for a carrier position under this authority. To be eligible, a TE must have completed a minimum of 180 days of employment as a TE and continue to be actively employed as such on the date of application. Once NALC TEs use their one examination opportunity, they cannot request an additional administration under this authority.

### 413 Restricted Records

[Revise 413 to read as follows:]

The Postal Service restricts access to registers, *Hiring Worksheets*, and preemployment investigation files. Postal Service employees must protect these records from unauthorized persons and the records should not be in view of applicants. Authorized persons (e.g., hiring practices review team members, higher-level managers, or EEO counselors and investigators) may review registers and *Hiring Worksheets* on a need-to-know basis.

Except for management review of hiring practices, Postal Service employees may not make copies of register records or *Hiring Worksheets*, unless they depersonalize the copies by obliterating applicant names, addresses, Social Security numbers and other applicant data.

Information about individual employees may be released to collective bargaining agents if the employees are members of the collective bargaining unit represented by the collective bargaining agent. For positions filled under the Maintenance Selection System (MSS), see Handbook EL-304 for instructions pertaining to release of records associated with MSS. A collective bargaining agent may request a copy of a *Hiring Worksheet* where he or she represents the employees hired from the *Hiring Worksheet*. Identifying information (applicant name, address, Social Security number, and other applicant data) for applicants not hired must be obliterated from a copy of a *Hiring Worksheet* before being provided to a collective bargaining

agent. The information for applicants hired from a *Hiring Worksheet* is not obliterated.

### 422 Merge Process

#### 422.3 Resolving Duplicate Ratings

[Revise 422.3 to read as follows:]

Duplicate ratings can result if an applicant already has an active eligibility on a register and competes in an examination for the same register as an open announcement, delayed, or reopened applicant (see 322.7, Delayed and Reopened Examinations).

#### 422.31 One Application for an Examination Announcement

An applicant is allowed to file only one application for each examination announcement. If the applicant is examined more than once, the first examination score processed stands. Subsequent eligible scores are canceled, even if the first rating processed is an ineligible rating.

#### 422.32 Delayed and Reopened Ratings

If a new rating is a result of a *delayed* or *reopened* opportunity and the applicant did not qualify to justify the filing, the rating is canceled. If a new rating is a result of a *delayed* or *reopened* filing and the applicant was eligible to file, his or her existing eligibility is terminated if the new rating is the same as or higher than the existing eligibility. If the new rating is lower than the existing rating and the applicant was eligible for an APWU or NALC TE filing (see 322.714 or 322.715), then the applicant must be notified and allowed to choose between the following options:

- a. Keeping the existing rating with a shorter eligibility period and a higher score. If the applicant chooses this option, the new rating is canceled.
- b. Accepting the new rating with a longer eligibility period and a lower score. If the applicant chooses this option, the existing rating is terminated.

## 483 Kinds of Veterans' Preference

### 483.1 5-Point Preference

[Revise 483.1 to read as follows:]

For 5-point preference purposes, an individual must have been discharged or released from active duty service in the Armed Forces under honorable conditions (see 232.3h), and served in one of the following ways:

- a. During a war.
- b. During the period April 28, 1952, through July 1, 1955.
- c. For more than 180 consecutive days, other than for training, any part of which occurred after January 31, 1955, and before October 15, 1976.
- d. During the Gulf War from August 2, 1990, through January 2, 1992.
- e. For more than 180 consecutive days, other than for training, any part of which occurred during the period beginning September 11, 2001, and ending on the date prescribed by Presidential proclamation or by law as the last day of Operation Iraqi Freedom.
- f. In a campaign or expedition for which a campaign medal has been authorized.

### 483.2 10-Point Preference

#### 483.21 Disabled Veterans

[Revise the introductory sentence in 483.21 to read as follows:]

A veteran discharged or released from active duty under honorable conditions who served on active duty in the Armed Forces at any time may be assigned 10-point preference, provided the veteran meets the criteria in one of the following categories:

#### 483.22 10-Point Derived Preference (XP)

- a. The veteran served on active duty in the Armed Forces at any time and was discharged or released from active duty under honorable conditions.

## 513 Eligibility Requirements

\* \* \* \*

### 513.5 Citizenship Policy

[Revise 513.5 to read as follows:]

To be eligible for career or noncareer Postal Service employment, an applicant must be a United States citizen, a lawful permanent resident alien (one who possesses a "green card"), or a citizen of American Samoa or other territory owing permanent allegiance to the United States. Individuals granted only asylum status, refugee status, or conditional permanent resident status are not eligible for Postal Service employment. The Immigration Reform and Control Act of 1986 makes it unlawful to hire unauthorized aliens, and it requires employers to verify and document the employment eligibility of all new employees. Refer to 55, Eligibility to Work in the Postal Service, to determine eligibility during screening and after a job offer has been made.

Noncitizens of the United States who have been granted lawful permanent resident alien status in the United States are eligible for appointment to all Postal Service positions, levels EAS-19 and below. Appointment of noncitizens to positions in levels EAS-20 and above can be made only with the prior approval of the area vice president.

## 55 Eligibility to Work in the Postal Service

### 551 Determining Eligibility at the Screening Stage

[Revise the text of 551 to read as follows:]

To be eligible for career or noncareer Postal Service employment, an applicant must be a United States citizen, a lawful permanent resident alien (one who possesses a "green card"), or a citizen of American Samoa or other territory owing permanent allegiance to the United States. This requirement is addressed at the application screening stage by reviewing the applicant's answer to Item E1, PS Form 2591, *Application for Employment*. Citizenship documents are not reviewed at this stage.

On PS Form 2591, if the applicant responds that he or she

- a. Is not a U.S. citizen, a lawful permanent resident alien, or a citizen of American Samoa or other territory owing permanent allegiance to the United States, the applicant is not eligible for employment.
- b. Is a U.S. citizen, a lawful permanent resident alien, or a citizen of American Samoa or other territory owing permanent allegiance to the United States, then the applicant continues in the hiring process.

**552 Determining Eligibility After a Job Offer**

*[Revise the text of 552 to read as follows:]*

Hiring officials ensure completion of OMB Form I-9, *Employment Eligibility Verification*, review supporting documents, and verify the applicant's status only after extending a bona fide job offer for a career or noncareer position. The review of documents and determination of status must be conducted in the same way for a United States citizen, a lawful permanent resident alien (one who possesses a "green card"), and a citizen of American Samoa or other territory owing permanent allegiance to the United States. Individuals granted only asylum status, refugee status, or conditional permanent resident status are not eligible for Postal Service employment.

The process of determining that a selectee meets the basic eligibility requirements to work in this country begins with completion of OMB Form I-9 and recording of the documents presented by selectees. After the selectee completes OMB Form I-9 satisfactorily, the hiring official reviews the evidence presented by the selectee to determine if he or she is a U.S. citizen, lawful permanent resident alien, or a citizen of American Samoa or other territory owing permanent allegiance to the United States.

**552.1 Completing OMB Form I-9**

After receiving a job offer, every Postal Service selectee (career or noncareer) must complete Section 1 of OMB Form I-9, used by all American employers in the federal and private sectors. Documents acceptable to establish identity and employment eligibility are listed on the reverse of OMB Form I-9. Hiring officials must complete Section 2 of OMB Form I-9 by examining evidence of identity and employment eligibility presented by the selectee. Hiring officials may not ask for specific documents from a selectee, nor refuse employment on the basis of a future expiration date shown on a document. Any person — whether a U.S. citizen, a lawful permanent resident alien (one who possesses a "green card"), or a citizen of American Samoa or other territory owing permanent allegiance to the United States — may satisfy the requirement to verify eligibility for employment by producing either one document from List A, or one document from List B and one from List C. Original documents are presented and recorded on OMB Form I-9, and the form is completed even though the documents may not demonstrate that the person meets the eligibility requirement. Hiring officials must complete the certification after recording the documents offered.

**552.2 Reviewing Evidence to Determine U.S. Citizen, Lawful Permanent Resident Alien, or Citizen of Territory Status**

After OMB Form I-9 is completed, a determination is made that the selectee meets the Postal Service requirement for

status of U.S. citizen, lawful permanent resident alien (one who possesses a "green card"), or citizen of American Samoa or other territory owing permanent allegiance to the United States. A document that is acceptable for completion of OMB Form I-9 is not necessarily evidence that the selectee meets the Postal Service's status requirement. The following documents (or receipts for documents) do not demonstrate that the person meets the Postal Service's requirement for status of U.S. citizen, lawful permanent resident alien, or a citizen of American Samoa or other territory owing permanent allegiance to the United States:

- Employment Authorization Card (Form I-688A).
- Employment Authorization Document issued by Department of Homeland Security (DHS), (Form I-688B).
- Employment Authorization Document (Form I-766).
- Foreign passport containing a temporary I-551 stamp.
- Foreign passport with machine-readable immigrant visa (MRIV) and temporary I-551 stamp.
- Foreign passport with the new MRIV containing temporary I-551 language and endorsed with a DHS admission stamp.
- Foreign passport, with attached Form I-94.
- Temporary Resident Card (Form I-688).
- U.S. Social Security card issued by the Social Security Administration with the notation "VALID FOR WORK ONLY WITH DHS AUTHORIZATION."

A receipt to replace a stolen or lost document that is evidence that the selectee is a U.S. citizen, a lawful permanent resident alien (one who possesses a "green card"), or a citizen of American Samoa or other territory owing permanent allegiance to the United States is acceptable. The selectee has 30 days to acquire a replacement document that indicates the status.

If a selectee does not possess evidence to document status of U.S. citizen, lawful permanent resident alien, or a citizen of American Samoa or other territory owing permanent allegiance to the United States, then the selectee cannot be allowed to work in the Postal Service. Individuals granted only asylum status, refugee status, or conditional permanent resident status are not eligible for Postal Service employment. OMB Forms I-9 completed by applicants found ineligible are filed in the preemployment investigation file.

## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
  - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
  - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.

- There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**A1.** Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

**B.** PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

**B1.** PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

**B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

Length	
42" .....	72" length and girth combined
over 42" to 44" .....	24" girth
over 44" to 46" .....	20" girth
over 46" to 48" .....	16" girth
Maximum length	48"

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

**I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

**J.** Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Personal mail addressed to vessels using this number is limited to unregistered First-Class Mail items and certified mail. Other classes of mail are prohibited.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**V.** Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

**Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

**Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No 0817E or 0818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

### REVISED FORM

#### Revised PS Form 1902, Justification for Billing Accounts Receivable

Effective August 2006 Post Offices™, postal retail units, and postal administrative offices must begin using the July 2006 edition of PS Form 1902, *Justification for Billing Accounts Receivable*. The September 1994 edition is obsolete and must be disposed of properly. Use the revised PS Form 1902 to initiate an accounts receivable to an employee or non-Postal Service™ debtor.

For employee financial indebtedness, the unit management must monitor and pursue collection of the debt while adhering to the national agreement and the *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM), Part 460, Collection of Postal Debts from Bargaining Unit Employees, and Part 450, Collection of Postal Debts from Nonbargaining Unit Employees.

Use PS Form 1902, *Justification for Billing Accounts Receivable*, (July 2006 version), as follows:

#### Section A — Installation Information:

- Enter postal installation name and full address.
- Enter the 6-digit finance number.
- Enter the 4-digit unit ID.
- Enter the date the form was prepared.
- Enter the postal installation's telephone number.

#### Section B — Debt/Debtor Information:

- Enter the debtor's name and full address.
- Record the debt amount.

- Check the appropriate box if the debtor is a Postal Service employee or not.
- Enter the employee's Social Security Number (SSN) or Tax Identification Number (TIN).

**Section C — Circumstances of Debt (check one box only):**

- If the debt is a Postal Service employee suspense or unit expense, check the box under item 1, then:
  1. Enter account identifier code (AIC) 636 in the unit's PS Form 1412 (attach PS Form 3544, *USPS Receipt for Money or Services*) and
  2. Enter the offset AIC number in the unit's PS Form 1412.

**Note:** PS Form 1902 will be returned if PS Form 3544 is not attached as supporting documentation for the AIC 636 entry.
- For other debts, check the appropriate box under item 2:
  - a. Inspection Service. Enter the Investigative Memorandum (IM) number.
  - b. Other Property Damages, etc. (Identify if the debt is employee-related or nonemployee-related). Additional information is required.

**Section D — Description:**

The Postal Service™ will issue 39-cent *Quilts of Gee's Bend* commemorative stamps in 10 designs in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) double-sided booklet of 20 stamps (Item 674500) on August 24, 2006, in Des Plaines, Illinois (APS Stamp Show). The stamps, designed by Derry Noyes of Washington, DC, go on sale nationwide on August 25, 2006.

These stamps are the sixth in the *American Treasures* series that showcases beautiful works of American fine art and crafts.

Art director Derry Noyes chose photographs of ten quilts created, between circa 1940 and 2001, by African-American women in Gee's Bend, Alabama. Created for the practical purpose of keeping warm, the quilts of Gee's Bend are noted for their unexpected color combinations, bold patterns, and improvised designs. The variety of materials with which they are made — including old dresses and worn-out work clothes — also demonstrate great ingenuity.

SDOs will make a subsequent automatic distribution to Post Offices of one-quarter their standard automatic booklet distribution quantity using PS Form 17, *Stamp Requisition/Stamp Return*. SDOs must not distribute these booklets to Post Offices before August 18, 2006.

### Philatelic Requirement

SDOs will not receive a separate quantity of Item 674500 for their authorized philatelic centers. The philatelic centers must be supplied their quantities from the initial automatic distribution made to the SDOs.

## Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those postmarks that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the postmark, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POSTMARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.
