Ritt explained that My


Desktop Post Office is easily downloaded from USPS.com onto personal computers. There's no application fee or monthly service charge, and registered users are sent automatic updates.

There also are links so customers can create and send their own direct mail and design post cards, greeting cards and brochures from their computers.

- Do not let your badge fall into the wrong hands. Report lost badges.
- Return your badge when your employment at USPS ends.
- Return temporary badges daily.

Current Use of Automated Forms

Due to fluctuations with various companies and their form products, not all Postal Service™ PCs are configured with the correct forms software and templates. Information Policies and Procedures has made provisions for the most up-to-date forms to be easily accessible on the Postal Service Web site. The current Postal Service standard for fillable forms is Adobe Form Client Filler version 5.0. If you do not have access to this application, call your IT department.

To access forms, go to http://blue.usps.gov; under "Essential Links" click on Forms and select the form number by range. To access the fillable forms, click on the green icon in the FC column for the specific form.

Make sure to access the Web every time to use the most current automated form template when filling out your forms. Once inside the form template, to access previously saved data, select File/Open or Form/Open Data.

In the future, we will have a single format for accessing automated and static forms using Adobe Reader to create fillable PDF files.

DMM REVISION

New 4-State Customer Barcode

Effective September 1, 2006, we are revising 202, 233, 243, 503, 507, 707, and 708 of the *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), to allow mailers to use a new barcode on automation rate letters. The Postal Service–developed "4-State Customer Barcode" is a new barcode that mailers may use to encode routing and tracking information.

Automation-rate letters must have a valid delivery point barcode (DPBC). As of September 1, 2006, mailers who are Confirm® service subscribers or Address Change Service (ACS™) participants may use either a 4-State Customer Barcode or a DPBC on automation-rate letters. While neither Confirm nor ACS services are new, mailers will be able to access these services by using the new 4-State Customer Barcode.

OneCode ACS™ users must use 4-State Customer Barcodes on First-Class Mail® letters to access the "Address Service Requested" ancillary service. For ACS mail, the 4-State Customer Barcode will include a numeric Business Entity Identifier in place of the ACS participant code as well as a unique numeric mailpiece identifier instead of the mailer keyline. Complete specifications for 4-State Customer Barcodes are defined in the Postal Service publication *USPS-B-3200*, which is available at *http://ribbs.usps.gov/OneCodeSOLUTION*.

Revised standards in DMM 503 will allow mailers to use a 4-State Customer Barcode instead of a PLANET Code® barcode for OneCode Confirm™ service. Mailers accessing OneCode Confirm and OneCode ACS also will be able to use 4-State Customer Barcodes instead of DPBCs for automation rate eligibility. As our technology evolves, we will accommodate additional mail classes, processing categories, and endorsements. We also revise DMM 708 to provide an overview for 4-State Customer Barcodes.

[Revise the first sentence in item a to add the option of a 4-State Customer Barcode as follows:]

a. Automation Letter. Non-carrier route First-Class Mail and Standard Mail letters do not require an "AUTO" marking if they bear a DPBC or a 4-State Customer Barcode with a delivery point routing code in the address block or on an insert visible through a window.***

5.0 Barcode Placement

5.1 Barcode Clear Zone

[Revise the first sentence in 5.1 to add the option of a 4-State Customer Barcode as follows:]

Each letter-size piece in an automation rate mailing or claimed at an Enhanced Carrier Route saturation or high density rate must have a barcode clear zone unless the piece bears a DPBC or a 4-State Customer Barcode with a delivery point routing code (see 708.4.3) in the address block.***

5.2 General Barcode Placement for Letters

[Revise 5.2 as follows:]

Automation rate pieces and pieces claimed at an Enhanced Carrier Route saturation or high density rate that weigh 3 ounces or less may bear a DPBC or (for pieces that are part of a OneCode Confirm mailing under 503.13.0 or a OneCode ACS mailing under 507.3.2) a 4-State Customer Barcode with a delivery point routing code. Mailers must print the barcode either in the address block or in the barcode clear zone, except that pieces in a OneCode ACS mailing and pieces that weigh more than 3 ounces must bear the barcode in the address block. A 4-State Customer Barcode placed in the address block, when used with

OneCode ACS (see 507.3.2), must appear above the address information according to standards in 5.7.

5.4 5-Digit and ZIP+4 Barcode Permissibility

[Revise the first sentence in 5.4 by breaking it into two sentences and adding reference to 4-State Customer Barcodes as follows:]

An automation rate letter-size piece may not bear a 5-digit or ZIP+4 barcode in the lower right corner (barcode clear zone). The piece may bear a 5-digit or ZIP+4 barcode in the address block only if a DPBC or a 4-State Customer Barcode (for pieces that are part of a OneCode Confirm mailing) with a delivery point routing code appears in the lower right corner.***

6.4 High Density Enhanced Carrier Route Standards

6.4.1 Basic Eligibility Standards for High Density Rates

[Revise 6.4.1 as follows:]

High density rates apply to each piece that is automation-compatible according to 201.3.0, *Physical Standards for Automation Letters and Cards*, and has an accurate delivery point barcode or 4-State Customer Barcode (for pieces that are part of a OneCode Confirm mailing under 503.13.0) under 202.5.0, *Barcode Placement*, and 708.4.0, *Barcoding Standards for Letters and Flats*. High density rates also apply under these additional conditions:

- Mailpieces must be in a full carrier route tray or in a carrier route bundle of 10 or more pieces placed in a 5-digit carrier routes or 3-digit carrier routes tray.
- Pieces that are not automation-compatible or not barcoded are mailable at the high density rate for flatsize pieces.
- c. Pieces bearing a simplified address do not need to meet the standards in 201.3.0, *Physical Standards* for Automation Letters and Cards, and are not required to have a barcode to qualify for letter rates.

6.5 Saturation ECR Standards

6.5.1 Basic Eligibility Standards for Saturation Rates

[Revise 6.5.1 as follows:]

Saturation rates apply to each piece that is automation-compatible according to 201.3.0, *Physical Standards for Automation Letters and Cards*, and has an accurate delivery point barcode or 4-State Customer Barcode (for pieces that are part of a OneCode Confirm mailing under 503.13.0) under 202.5.0, *Barcode Placement*, and 708.4.0,

Barcoding Standards for Letters and Flats. Saturation rates also apply under these additional conditions:

- Mailpieces must be in a full carrier route tray or in a carrier route bundle of 10 or more pieces placed in a 5-digit carrier routes or 3-digit carrier routes tray.
- Pieces that are not automation-compatible or not barcoded are mailable at the saturation rate for flat-size pieces.
- c. Pieces bearing a simplified address do not need to meet the standards in 201.3.0, *Physical Standards* for Automation Letters and Cards, and are not required to have a barcode to qualify for letter rates.

13.2.3 Authorization

[Revise 13.2.3 as follows:]

Participation in Confirm service requires USPS authorization after mailers pay applicable fees and meet technical requirements. As part of the application process, a mailer must submit mailpieces with the appropriate PLANET Code barcodes, POSTNET barcodes, or 4-State Customer Barcodes for evaluation and approval to the National Customer Support Center (see 608.8.0 for address). The application process also includes, if applicable, evaluating and approving of the electronic format and uploading the Advance Shipping Notice (ASN) file and the associated shipment identification barcode printed on required documentation accompanying mailings. Mailers may use Confirm service only after receiving authorization. Information generated from the service is provided only to mailers meeting the standards for participation.

13.3 Barcodes

13.3.1 General Barcode Requirement

[Revise 13.3.1 as follows:]

At the time of mailing, each piece in a mailing that is intended to generate Confirm service information must bear a customer-applied PLANET Code barcode under 13.3.4 or (for letter-size mail only) a 4-State Customer Barcode under 13.3.2. Mailers must apply barcodes that meet the applicable specifications in 708.4.0 and the following standards:

- a. Origin Confirm pieces:
 - For business reply mail, the piece must bear a PLANET Code barcode and a POSTNET barcode that corresponds to the subscriber's business reply mail ZIP+4 codes assigned by the USPS under 507.8.0.
 - For all other letter-size reply mail, the piece must bear either a 4-State Customer Barcode or both a PLANET Code barcode and a POSTNET barcode at the time of mailing. The 4-State Customer Barcode or POSTNET barcode must correctly correspond to the delivery address.
 - 3. For all other flat-size reply mail, the piece must bear both a PLANET Code barcode and a

POSTNET barcode that correctly corresponds to the delivery address.

- b. Destination Confirm pieces must bear either a 4-State Customer Barcode (for letter-size mail only) or a PLANET Code barcode. If required by the rate claimed at the time of mailing, 4-State Customer Barcodes must correctly correspond to the delivery address. Mailers not using a 4-State Customer Barcode for Destination Confirm must use PLANET Code and POSTNET barcodes under these conditions:
 - If required by the rate claimed at the time of mailing, Destination Confirm pieces with a PLANET Code barcode also must bear an appropriate POSTNET barcode that correctly corresponds to the delivery address.
 - If a POSTNET barcode is not required by the rate claimed, the mailer has the option to apply the POSTNET barcode to such pieces for optimal Confirm service information if the barcode correctly corresponds to the delivery address.

[Renumber current 13.3.2 through 13.3.7 as new 13.3.3 through 13.3.8. Add new 13.3.2 as follows:]

13.3.2 4-State Customer Barcode

Customers participating in OneCode Confirm may apply 4-State Customer Barcodes on letter-size pieces mailed at automation letter rates. Automation-compatible letter-size pieces (see 201.3.0) mailed at presorted and carrier-route rates also may participate in OneCode Confirm when they bear correct 4-State Customer Barcodes. Do not apply a PLANET Code barcode to any mailpiece with a 4-State Customer Barcode Only one 4-State Customer Barcode may appear on each piece, according to the standards below.

- a. 4-State Customer Barcodes meeting all applicable standards may be used in lieu of POSTNET barcodes. When using a 4-State Customer Barcode for rate eligibility and OneCode Confirm, place the barcode in any position permitted in 202.5.0.
- b. When using a 4-State Customer Barcode only for OneCode Confirm, place the barcode according to 202.5.0 or directly above the address block with the top of the each bar less than 4 inches from the bottom of the mailpiece.
- c. Mailers must generate 4-State Customer Barcodes by the same method used to receive USPS barcode certification during the application process in 13.2.3.
- d. 4-State Customer Barcodes must meet the barcode and format standards in 708.4.0 and in

3.2.3 Participant Code

[Revise 3.2.3 by converting existing text to item a and adding the 4-State Customer Barcode option for ACS in new item b as follows:]

The following options are available to identify Address Change Service (ACS) mailpiece participant codes:

- a. ACS human-readable participant codes are provided to authorized mailers by the National Customer Support Center (NCSC) (see 608.8.0 for address). This participant code consists of seven alpha characters, aligned left, and must be preceded by a single pound sign (#) delimiter. Additional information for using the human-readable option is available in Publication 8, Address Change Service.
- b. When using 4-State Customer Barcodes, mailers are participating in the OneCode ACS option of ACS. See 3.2.6 for restrictions. The NCSC provides the numeric OneCode ACS participant code to authorized mailers using the 4-State Customer Barcode (see 708.4.2). As part of the application process, a Business Entity Identifier (BEI) is assigned to identify the participant, or a mailer can choose to register one or more of their existing BEIs for use with OneCode ACS. Mailers must incorporate the BEI code in the Customer Identifier field, the unique mailpiece identifier in the Sequence Number field, and the appropriate Service Type Identifier field of the 4-State Customer Barcode according to Specification USPS B-3200. Customers can access the 4-State Customer Barcode specification at http://ribbs.usps.gov/ OneCodeSOLUTION.

b. When using an address label, maintain a clearance between the top line of the address block and the top edge of the address label of at least 1/25 inch.

3.2.5 Additional Standards — When Using Human-Readable ACS Participant Codes

Mailers must use human-readable ACS participant codes according to the following specifications:

- a. Print and place the ancillary service endorsement according to the requirements in 102.4 and 507.1.5.
- Print the ancillary service endorsement and the participant code in a non-narrow variant of Helvetica or Arial sans serif font in the range of 10 to 12 points.
- c. Use equal line spacing in the address block, including the participant code line and mailer keyline.
- d. When placing the participant code in an optional endorsement line (OEL), the participant code must occupy the first eight positions in the left part of the OEL and be formatted as indicated in 708.7.2.3.
- e. When placing the participant code in the address block, place it on the top line. The address block information may be on an insert in a window, on an address label, or preprinted on the mailpiece.
- f. Mailers preprinting the participant code on an envelope (rather than printing it in the address block or on a label) must meet the conditions in 3.2.4 in addition to the following:
 - The participant code must be left-justified with the address block, with a tolerance of 1/4 inch left or right. Place the participant code not more than two line spaces above the top line of the address block (using the same line spacing size as used in the address block).
 - When using a mailer keyline, place it in the top line of the address block (but below the preprinted participant code).
 - 3. OELs are prohibited when a mailer keyline is used.
- g. If using delivery point barcodes in the address block, mailers must place them in one of the following positions:
 - 1. When using a mailer keyline, place the barcode between the top line of the address information and the mailer keyline.
 - 2. When not using a mailer keyline, place the barcode between the top line of the address information and the participant code.

- 3. Below the City-State-ZIP Code line.
- 4. Above the participant code and OEL, except when placing the participant code under 3.2.5f.

3.2.6 Additional Standards — 4-State Customer Barcodes

Mailers can access OneCode ACS using 4-State Customer Barcodes, which are capable of encoding a numeric Business Entity Identifier (the equivalent of a participant code) as well as a unique numeric mailpiece identifier (keyline). Only "Address Service Requested" ancillary service is available when using the 4-State Customer Barcode; however, no endorsement is required. Mailpieces must meet the following specifications:

- a. The mailpieces must be letter-size and automationcompatible.
- The mailpieces must be mailed at First-Class Mail rates.
- c. The 4-State Customer Barcode must appear at the top of or above the address block and must contain the correct delivery point routing code that corresponds to the delivery address.
- d. If using a window envelope, maintain a clearance between the leftmost and rightmost bars and any printing or window edge of at least 1/8 inch, and maintain a clearance between the 4-State Customer Barcode and the top and bottom window edges of at least 1/25 inch. These clearances must be maintained during the insert's range of movement in the envelope.
- e. The 4-State Customer Barcode must meet the technical specifications described in 708.4.2 and USPS publication *Specification USPS-B-3200*.

- d. Bear an accurate barcode meeting the standards in 708.4.0, under these conditions:
 - 1. If a letter, the mailer may use a DPBC.

4.3 4-State Customer Barcodes

4.3.1 Definition

A 4-State Customer Barcode is the USPS-developed barcode that mailers use to encode routing and tracking information on mail that can be read by automated mail processing equipment to sort mail and to provide tracking information to the mailers. A 4-State Customer Barcode consists of 65 vertical bars, each representing one of four

possible states: full bar, ascender, tracker, and descender. These 65 bars encode a string of 31 digits, divided into two parts: a 20-digit tracking code, and an 11-digit routing code. The 11-digit routing code may contain a ZIP Code, a ZIP+4 code, or a delivery-point code. When used on letters for automation-rate eligibility purposes, the routing code must contain a delivery-point code that accurately matches the delivery address. The 20-digit tracking code consists of several components:

- a. A 2-digit Barcode Identifier that defines the barcode type.
- A 3-digit Service Type Identifier that identifies the extra services requested by the mailer.
- c. A 6-digit Customer Identifier, including a USPSassigned Business Entity Identifier, to identify the mailer.
- d. A 9-digit Sequence Number assigned by the mailer to uniquely identify individual mailpieces.

4.3.2 Specifications

Complete specifications for 4-State Customer Barcodes are defined in USPS publication *USPS-B-3200*, which is available at http://ribbs.usps.gov/OneCodeSOLUTION. This publication also provides details on how to encode the routing code and tracking code into a 4-State Customer Barcode, barcode dimensions and spacing, clear zone, skew and rotation tolerance, and print characteristics. The assignment of a Barcode Identifier, Service Type Identifier, and Business Entity Identifier are described by the respective publications of each extra service. The assessment identifies the individual's medical restrictions or limitations, and it may suggest job modifications or accommodations to allow safe performance of essential job functions.

Note: Medical personnel are responsible for the medical assessment, but the hiring official is responsible for the final medical-suitability determination and the hiring decision.

New Account Identifier Codes for Postal Lobby Copy Machine Revenue

Effective September 1, 2006, we will activate two new account identifier codes (AIC) for Post Offices™ and postal retail units to record postal lobby copy machine activities:

- Use AIC 248, Copy Machine Revenue, to record funds received from postal lobby copy machines.
- Use AIC 548, Copy Machine Refunds, to record the amounts refunded to the copy machine servicing company.

Post Offices and postal retail units that have not modified contracts with their postal lobby copy machine vendors must record postal lobby copy machine activities as follows:

 Collect funds from lobby copy machines and record the funds in AIC 248, Copy Machine Revenue, and deposit the funds.

- 2. Upon receipt of an invoice from the vendor, the Post Office or postal retail unit will process the payment as follows:
 - Complete PS Form 3533, Application and Voucher for Refund of Postage, Fees, and Services.
 - Ensure that the supervisor has printed his or her name on and signed the PS Form 3533 to authorize the payment.
 - Record the amount into AIC 548, Copy Machine Refunds, and AIC 280, Disbursement Sent to ASC.
 - Attach the system-generated receipt for the AIC 548 amount to the completed PS Form 3533 and submit to the following address:

Fiscal Year 2006 Closing Guidance

Message from the Controller

I ask that each of you continue your efforts to control expenses. It is important that we carry this effort through to the end of the fiscal year. We must also control discretionary activity. This does not mean curtailing business, but it does mean making prudent choices by deferring or eliminating non-critical activity, and purchasing goods or services throughout the year, rather than at the end of the fiscal year, simply because there are available budget funds. I ask that you encourage your contractors to bill us in a timely manner for goods received and services rendered so we can recognize the expense prior to the close of the fiscal year. Additionally, I ask that you process accruals for goods received and services rendered, but not invoiced, as of September 30. Please note the minimum expense accrual is \$20,000.

The following instructions will assist you, when appropriate, in helping the Postal Service close its financial books in a timely and efficient manner.

I. Instructions for Fiscal Year 2006 Closing

All organizations are requested to limit their expenditures to essential spending. Accordingly, all vice presidents should review discretionary spending to ensure the Postal Service™ attains its financial target for this fiscal year (FY).

The instructions and reporting dates in this *Postal Bulletin* supplement procedures followed during the normal monthly or quarterly reporting schedule.

II. Fiscal Year

The Postal Service prepares its annual reports on a government FY basis that comprises 365 days (366 in leap years), always ending on September 30.

III. Capital and Expense Commitment or Accrual Activities

A. Capital/Expense

Supply Management will not accept capital and expense requisitions and requests for contract modifications after September 8, unless work is currently under way on advance requirements or the buying manager grants an exception. Supply Management will accept capital purchase card transactions through September 15. Also, organizations should limit capital commitments, particularly Postal Service support equipment, to essential

needs. The schedule for Supply Management processing is as follows:

- For requisitions received on or before September 8, Supply Management will attempt to issue the required contract/modification in time for the San Mateo Accounting Service Center (ASC) to process against FY2006 funds.
- Requisitions received on or after October 1 will be processed against FY2007 funds.

Organizations must forward hardcopy paper commitment documents to reach the San Mateo ASC no later than September 20. Electronic files received for commitments through September 20 will be processed for FY2006.

Appropriate receiving reports or certified invoices for goods and services received by September 30 must be forwarded to the San Mateo ASC for receipt no later than October 2. Please expedite processing of receiving reports and certified invoices as these documents are used to charge expense to the proper FY. Additionally, review contracts to ensure sufficient funds are available by September 20 to process invoices and PS Form 8163, Request for Fiscal Year Expense Accrual.

Supply Management will process all requisitions for the issuance of contracts against FY2006 funds according to the following priorities:

Priority 1 — Capital commitment requisitions.

Priority 2 — Expense commitment requisitions.

B. Unpaid Expenses or Accruals for Goods and Services Received on or Before September 30 (expense accrual minimum for FY2006 is \$20,000)

If it is impossible to furnish a receiving report or certified invoice for goods received or services rendered through September 30 in time to reach the San Mateo ASC by October 2, and the expense per contract sequence number or miscellaneous (noncommitment) purchase or service is \$20,000 or more, the expense must be accrued.

Complete PS Form 8163, a copy of which is found on page 20 of this *Postal Bulletin*. You can also obtain the form at *http://blue.usps.gov;* under "Essential Links," select *Forms*. Attach supporting documentation to the form (see PS Form 8163 for examples of proper vendor documentation). Documents received at the San Mateo ASC pertaining to activities occurring October 1 and later will be recorded in FY2007.

IV. Liquidation of Accruals

When submitting an actual certified invoice to liquidate an accrual, include the statement "Accrued to FY2006" on the face of the document. Do **not** mail to the Scanning and Imaging Center. Mail these invoices directly to:

Liquidate accruals as soon as possible. Offices must monitor their accruals and invoices to ensure that the accruals are properly liquidated. All FY2006 accruals processed by the San Mateo ASC that are not liquidated by the close of November 2006 (FY2007) will be reversed to a service-wide finance number as a prior-year credit. Subsequent invoices will be charged to the appropriate budget finance number as an FY2007 expense.

V. Submission Schedules

Please use the following schedules relating to FY2006 closing:

Schedule I — Accrual Processing Information (see item A below)

Schedule II —Submission Processing (see item B on page 21)

A. Schedule I — Accrual Processing Information

The following are examples of instances when items may be accrued using PS Form 8163 if goods or services have been received on or before September 30:

- You have not received a receiving report.
- The dollar amount **must** be \$20,000 or more.
- You will not get an invoice to certify for payment by September 30.

Document calculation of accrual on PS Form 8163 or on a copy of a previous month's invoice. You may also use an adding machine tape as proof of the accrual calculation.

Service Maintenance Contract — Copier

Review the last invoice processed to determine the amount to accrue from the service ending date through September 30.

To estimate the accrual amount, perform the following:

 Calculate the number of days to accrue (count from the first day of the next billing cycle through September 30).

For example:

Billing period last invoice = 8/19–9/17

Number of days to accrue = 13 (9/18-9/30)

2. Calculate the daily rate.

Divide the last invoice amount by the number of days in the billing period to determine a daily rate.

For example:

Invoice amount = \$60,000

Billing period = 30 days (8/19-9/17)

Daily rate = \$2,000 (\$60,000 for 30 days)

3. Calculate the accrual amount.

Multiply the daily rate calculated by the number of days that will be accrued.

For example:

Accrual amount = $$2,000 \times 13 = $26,000$

Note: No service maintenance accruals should be made unless there are less than 12 monthly (or the equivalent of 1 year) invoices processed for the current FY. If there are less than 12 invoices processed (or the equivalent of 1 year), you should accrue for the missing invoices.

Utility Billing Accrual — Natural Gas/Electricity

Use the accrual amount calculation for service maintenance as shown above.

Note: No utility accruals should be made unless there are less than 12 monthly (or the equivalent of 1 year) invoices processed for the current FY. If there are less than 12 invoices processed (or the equivalent of 1 year), accrue for the missing invoices.

Other Goods or Services Accrual — Consultant Contract

Calculate the accrual amount.

Check with the vendor to validate the cost of goods or services received during the unbilled period ending September 30 and obtain the necessary supporting documentation.

Note: Do not accrue if the amount is less than \$20,000. The following items may not be accrued on PS Form 8163:

- Basic pricing agreements (BPA).
- Bulk fuel deliveries, oil purchases, and vehicle parts.
- Capital.
- Carrier drive-outs.
- Credit card purchases*.
- Direct vendor delivery (DVD) and eBuy purchases.
- FEDSTRIPs*.
- Gasoline credit card (fleet card) purchases.
- Government Printing Office (GPO) printings.
- Government travel accounts (GTAs).
- Imprest funds.
- Incentive awards.
- Inventory.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service $\mbox{}^{\mbox{}^{\mbox{}}}$ money order:

- Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
- Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.

There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm.

 If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

The APO/FPO table below outlines these conditions by APO/FPO ZIP Codes™ through the use of footnoted mailing restrictions codes (see the Restrictions page following the table).

Acceptance clerks should use the table with the integrated retail terminal (IRT) or POS ONE terminal to determine which APO/FPO ZIP Codes are active and which conditions of mailing apply. Acceptance clerks may contact the Military Postal Service Agency with any

questions regarding APO/FPO ZIP Codes, toll free, at 800-810-6098, Monday-Friday, 0730-1630 ET.

For Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) availability, all acceptance clerks must refer to the local hardcopy EMMS directory.

Effective Saturday, August 19, 2006, two changes to the military restriction list will take effect:

- Restriction "O" has been changed to "Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com."
- Restriction "V1" has been added to the table stating "Delivery Confirmation service is not available."

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
 - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - D. Coffee is prohibited.
- E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.
- E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.
- **G.** Only First-Class Mail letters, Periodicals, and Standard Mail items are authorized.
- **H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.
 - H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
- $\mbox{\bf I.}$ Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
 - L. All official mail is prohibited.
 - M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
 - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- $\ensuremath{\mathbf{0}}.$ Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- **R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0. are prohibited.
- R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
- **T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
- U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handisenand"
- **U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.
- $\mbox{\bf U2.}$ Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.
- **U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
 - V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.
 - V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.
- W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty
- X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Changes to Canada Post Money Order Form

Beginning with serial number 816,504,001, Canada Post is introducing a new security feature on its postal money order. Money orders with serial numbers lower than 816,504,001 may still be sold and cashed after the enhanced money order is introduced. The new version began appearing in late July and outlets will receive them as part of their normal money order replenishment process.

Changes to Front of Money Order


The front of the new money order will have a "verification box." The pink color in the box reacts to heat and disappears either when you hold the box area between your thumb and forefinger, when you breathe directly on the box itself, or when you rub it with your finger to create friction. The pink re-appears after 1 minute.

All other security features of the money order are still present and some are described on the reverse of the money order.

Changes to Back of Money Order

The changes to the back of the money order are the result of new banking guidelines. The back of the enhanced money order will contain a box for the teller stamp, which is used when being cashed at a bank, and a black endorsement line. The words "Back/Endos" have also been added.



Southern Florida Wetland Stamps

The Postal Service™ will issue a commemorative sheet of the 39-cent *Southern Florida Wetland* stamps in 10 designs (Item 567400) on October 4, 2006, at the Naples Zoo and Caribbean Gardens in Naples, Florida.

The stamps designed by Ethel Kessler of Bethesda, Maryland, and illustrated by John D. Dawson of Hilo, Hawaii, go on sale nationwide on October 5, 2006. This \$3.90 commemorative sheet may not be split, and the stamps may not be sold individually.

A \$7.95 stamped postal cards set of 10 in 10 designs (Item 885300), will also be available.

The Southern Florida Wetland stamps are the eighth in the Nature of America series designed to promote appreciation of major plant and animal communities in the United States. The previous issuances in the series were Northeast Deciduous Forest (2005), Pacific Coral Reef (2004), Arctic Tundra (2003), Longleaf Pine Forest (2002), Great Plains Prairie (2001), Pacific Coast Rain Forest (2000), and Sonoran Desert (1999).

The subtropical wetlands of southern Florida are remnants of a great wilderness that stretched, unbroken, for hundreds of miles until about a century ago. They still include some of the most extensive saw grass marshes and mangrove swamps in the world — wetlands that support a remarkable number of species.

In southern Florida, plants and animals are well adapted to water-level changes that correspond to alternating wet and dry seasons. Although some species require freshwater habitats, others are more salt tolerant. This stamp pane depicts a wetland community where freshwater mingles with salt water along the coast, and thus the art includes both freshwater and coastal species.

Philatelic Requirement

SDOs will not receive a separate quantity Item 567400 for their authorized philatelic centers. Philatelic centers must be supplied their quantities from the initial automatic distribution made to SDOs.

Additional Supply

Post Offices requiring additional quantities of Item 567400 must requisition them from their designated SDO using PS Form 17. SDOs requiring additional commemorative sheets must order them from the appropriate accountable paper depository (APD) using PS Form 17.

For fulfilling supplemental orders from SDOs, the Memphis APD will receive 100,000 additional commemorative sheets; the New York, San Francisco, and Chicago APDs will each receive 80,000 additional commemorative sheets; and the Denver APD will receive 28,000 additional commemorative sheets.

Sales Policy

All Post Offices must acquire and maintain a supply of each new commemorative stamp as long as customer demand exists, until inventory is depleted, or until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. Handbook PO-230, Pictorial Postmarks

We have revised Handbook PO-230, *Pictorial Post-marks*. A summary of changes to the 2006 edition of the handbook are listed below. The handbook will not be distributed and mailed. Instructions for viewing the handbook online or ordering printed copies appear after the summary of changes.

Summary of Changes

- The term pictorial postmark replaces the term pictorial cancellation.
- The February 2005 edition of PS Form 413, *Pictorial Postmark Announcement/Report*, replaces the January 2000 edition. PS Form 413 is for use nationwide and use must comply with the 2006 edition of Handbook PO-230. PS Form 413 is available on the Postal Service Intranet at http://blue.usps.gov/formmgmt/forms.htm.

- Special die hub postmarks are different from pictorial postmarks. Requests for special die hub postmarks must be sent to Mailing Standards, Headquarters.
- The new digital color postmarks are not part of the Pictorial Postmark Program, and postmasters are prohibited from using them. Digital color postmarks are an exclusive product of Stamp Services.
- Postmasters approve or disapprove pictorial postmarks from the general public. Offices should maintain letters of disapproval in a permanent file for up to 3 years if challenged.
- Postmasters cannot waive a temporary station requirement without approval from Stamp Services.
- Stamp Services must approve the use of more then one pictorial postmark design for multiple day events.
- Postmasters who need pictorial postmark assistance for large volumes should call Stamp Fulfillment

- Services at 816-545-1250 or send an e-mail message to stampfulfillment.services@usps.gov.
- Field managers can forward unsettled claims for damaged or replacement philatelic covers to Headquarters Consumer Advocate for final claim disposition.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided, as space permits, are illustrations of those postmarks that were reproducible and available at press time.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office $^{\text{TM}}$ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event, but who wish to obtain the postmark, may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POST-MARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

International Reply Coupons

The International Reply Coupon (IRC), Item 330600, currently sold by the Postal Service™ expires December 31, 2006. Consequently, the cut-off date for sale by the Postal Service is August 31, 2006. Images of the front and back of the expiring IRC are shown below.

The Postal Service has ordered new IRCs from the Universal Postal Union (UPU). These IRCs, Item 330700, bear a denominated price of \$1.85. They will go on sale nationwide on August 17, 2006. There will be no automatic distribution of this item. Post Offices ™, stations, and branches may request this item from their local Stamp Distribution Office (SDO) or Stamp Services Center (SSC). Images of the front and the back of the new IRC are shown on page 63.

Under no circumstances should an expiring IRC be sold on or after September 1, 2006. All Post Offices, stations, and branches in possession of unsold expiring U.S.-issued IRCs must return these to their servicing SDO or SSC no later than September 15, 2006. SDOs and SSCs must mail all received expiring IRCs to the address below before October 13, 2006:



The Eagan ASC Finance Branch, in conjunction with the International Accounting Branch staff at the St. Louis ASC, will prepare the expiring IRCs for shipment to the UPU International Bureau so that the Postal Service may receive credit for unsold U.S.-origin IRCs.

All new IRCs sold by Post Offices, stations, and branches will no longer require the addition of the 10-cent stamp at time of sale as these IRCs are properly denominated at the \$1.85 sales price.

Foreign-origin IRCs, as well as returned U.S.-issued IRCs remain redeemable by customers at Post Offices, stations, and branches under existing procedures until the December 31, 2006, expiration date.

IRC Being Withdrawn From Sale (Item 330600)




