DMM Revision: Waiver of Signature Delivery Process

The Postal Service™ is revising the Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) to update the standards regarding delivery of Express Mail® items with waiver of signature requested and return receipt for merchandise items with waiver of signature requested into the September online update. Delivery employees deliver these items to the addressee's mail receptacle or other secure location without first attempting to obtain a signature from the addressee.

Waiver of signature authorizes delivery to be made without obtaining the signature of the addressee or addressee's agent as long as the delivery employee establishes the article can be left in the addressee's mail receptacle or other secure location. By requesting waiver of signature, the sender agrees to accept the delivery time and date scan information as valid record of delivery.

When Express Mail items with waiver of signature requested and return receipt for merchandise items with waiver of signature requested are delivered, the delivery employee signs the PS Form 3849, Sorry We Missed You, without attempting to obtain a signature from the addressee. After signing the PS Form 3849, the delivery employee delivers the item to the addressee's mail receptacle or other secure location. This process expedites delivery time because the delivery employee is not required to try to obtain a signature from the addressee or addressee's agent when a waiver of signature is authorized.

Completion of the waiver of signature authorizes the delivery employee to sign upon delivery. The item is delivered to the addressee's mail receptacle or other secure location. To request waiver of signature, detach both parts of the gummed sections of label 3804 and attach to the mailpiece.

DMM Revision: Address Facing Standards for Presort Bundles on Pallets

Effective September 11, 2008, the Postal Service™ will require mailers to place presort bundles on pallets with the addresses facing up. This placement is needed for efficient processing in today's processing environment and, eventually, for the automated preparation and induction for the Flats Sequencing System (FSS) in the future. This new standard will aid in verifying that the contents are on the correct pallet and will enhance manual distribution of the bundles.

The Postal Service is progressing in the deployment of the FSS to automate delivery sequencing for flat-size mail. We plan to use automated preparation stations to support the FSS. These stations will require bundles to lie flat on pallets to be operationally effective.

We first published notice of this revision in *Postal Bulletin* 22235 (6-19-08, pages 30-31).

Handbook PO-603 Revision: Rural Route Evaluation Worksheet

Effective with the guarantee year, October 25, 2008, Handbook PO-603, *Rural Carrier Duties and Responsibilities*, is revised to update Exhibit 531.3 with the creation of a separate fixed allowance entry for the IMD scanner. All future rural route evaluations, effective with the resulting evaluation from the Special Mail Count being conducted September 17–30, 2008, will reflect this change. The 6-minute weekly allowance for IMD scanner setup and return will now be an automatic allowance and will not require counters to enter this number in Column R, Other Suitable Allowance, during a mail count. A revised PS Form 4241-M, *Rural Route Evaluation Worksheet*, which reflects the revision, is given on page 6 of this *Postal Bulletin*.

All other types of live, day-old poultry are nonmailable. Day-old poultry vaccinated with Newcastle disease (live virus) also is nonmailable.

Publication 75 Revision: Mover's Guide News — September 2008 Mover's Guide Is on Its Way!

The September 2008 issue of Publication 75, *Mover's Guide*, will be available before the end of August. As of September 1, you must display the new issue and recycle all expired versions.

Important Mover's Guide Information

- Mover's Guide is printed and distributed three times per year — December (for January use), April (for May use), and August (for September use).
- Post OfficesTM must recycle old versions of the Mover's Guide, as these contain expired forms, information, and coupons that cannot be used by the postal consumer.
- In an effort to reduce waste and still provide each postal facility with the proper quantity of *Mover's Guide*, call 800-816-6837 if you receive too many or too few copies of *Mover's Guide* or if you have questions about your quantity.

- To find out when shipments will arrive, contact the MDC directly at 800-273-1509.
- If your facility receives an entire pallet of Mover's Guide copies, please break down the pallet! It may contain boxes that need to be shipped to other facilities, and this will ensure all facilities receive their needed supply.

Management Instructions

New Management Instruction: Assessing and Collecting Deficiencies in Postage or Fees

Effective June 1, 2008, Management Instruction (MI) DM-140-2008-1, Assessing and Collecting Deficiencies in Postage or Fees, was posted on the Postal Service™ PolicyNet Web site at http://blue.usps.gov. This management instruction establishes the policies and procedures for assessing and collecting deficiencies of postage and/or fees, which are generally assessed by the postmaster or manager of a Business Mail Entry Unit (MBME). The MI may not be accessible to our customers, mailer, or agents, therefore the following is an excerpt of the MI related to the Assessment Criteria, Appealing Revenue Deficiencies, and Deficiency Payments.

Assessment Criteria

Time Limits

When a postage or fee underpayment warrants assessing a revenue deficiency, the Postal Service may review previous mailings and fee payments to calculate the assessment and may look back no more than 12 months before the date the deficiency was discovered (date of the revenue deficiency report).

Minimum Threshold

When a revenue deficiency is discovered for an amount of \$500 or more, follow this MI for reporting, processing, and collecting the revenue deficiency. When a revenue deficiency is discovered for an amount *less than \$500*, report each deficiency to the MBME and the district finance manager (DFM), or the postmaster and the DFM for review and followup.

Prerequisite Notice

Notice to a customer of a content-based deficiency (when contents of the mailing are not eligible for the class of mail or prices claimed) must be provided prior to formal issuance of a deficiency assessment. The requisite notice must reference the applicable DMM standard(s) and any subsequent violations of that standard.

Exceptions: The previously mentioned criteria do not apply if one of the following is found:

- Fraud or misrepresentation is reasonably suspected.
 This includes concealment of a different opinion or ruling received from a Postal Service employee before or at the time of mailing.
- 2. No postage or fees were paid for the service rendered, or there is a misstatement of the amount of postage affixed to the mailpiece.
- 3. Mailing history discloses evidence of repeated noncompliance with mailing standards.

Note: In cases where one or more of the assessment criteria are not met, and none of the exceptions apply, the Postal Service issues a written notification sent by certified First-Class Mail[®] to the customer, mailer, or agent describing the noncompliance with Postal Service mailing standard(s). A copy must be recorded and filed indefinitely at the DFM's office together with the revenue deficiency report. Any subsequent mailing violation of the same DMM standard from this customer, mailer, or agent may result in the assessment of another revenue deficiency.

Reporting

The Postal Service employee who finds a discrepancy or is assigned to investigate a revenue deficiency must do the following:

- 1. Promptly prepare a full report of the circumstances along with supporting documentation.
- 2. Submit his or her report to the postmaster at the Post Office™ of mailing or to the MBME.
- Without delay, forward a copy to the office of the DFM.

Appealing Revenue Deficiencies

A customer, mailer, or agent may appeal a revenue deficiency assessment by sending a written appeal within 30 days of receipt of the notification. Mailers must send appeals as follows:

In all cases, the customer, mailer, or agent may be asked to provide additional information and documentation to support the appeal. Failure to submit a written appeal within 30 days of the request is grounds for denying an appeal, and collection efforts are resumed.

Deficiency Payments

After the appeal process is exhausted, proceed to collect the amount due based on one of the following three scenarios:

■ Full Payment — The customer, mailer, or agent agrees to immediately pay the appealed deficiency amount in full.

- Installment Payment The customer, mailer, or agent agrees to payment of the appealed deficiency amount, but requests periodic payments rather than a lump sum.
- Settlement Payment The customer, mailer, or agent proposes a partial payment, and documentation that warrants justification of partial payment must be submitted.

Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

U.S. Flag at Half-Staff

How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.

Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.

Note 1: When May 15, which is the date for Peace Officers Memorial Day, falls on the third Saturday in May, which is the date for Armed Forces Day, display the U.S. flag in the full-staff position, not at half-staff.

Note 2: On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.



How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.

When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.



Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.

Household Diary Study

The Postal Service's Household Diary Study (HDS), conducted since 1987, provides information about the contents of the mail sent and received by U.S. households. The Postal Service™ uses this information to help understand why and how customers use the mail. The results are used to:

- Forecast mail volume.
- Plan marketing strategies.
- Provide information for rate-setting purposes.

The HDS is administered at Headquarters by the Office of Demand Forecasting and Analysis, Finance. NuStats, the HDS survey research firm contractor since July 1999, conducts the interviews and collects and analyzes the HDS data throughout the year.

HDS is a two-stage survey. Stage 1 is the Household Interview. NuStats sends an advance letter, signed by the postmaster general, to a representative sample of U.S. households. This letter emphasizes the importance of the HDS and asks for participation. These sample households are contacted either by telephone or in person and asked about the mail they send and receive, their adoption and use of various communications' technologies, their attitudes about mail service in general, and information relating to their household and personal demographics. Those respondent households are recruited to participate in HDS Stage 2.

Stage 2 is the Mail Diary. NuStats asks households that agree to participate in Stage 2 to record information about the mail they send and receive for a 7-day period from Monday to Sunday. Information recorded includes number of mailpieces received and sent, industry mail source, mail characteristics, and attitudes regarding mail received. As an incentive for HDS Stage 2 participation, households are offered the options of receiving \$30 or a roll of 100 First-Class Mail[®] stamps.

Customers who participate in Stage 2 of the HDS can expect to receive their incentive about 2 months after they return the diary packet to NuStats.

Data gathered in both HDS stages is available in a final report, *The Household Diary Study — Mail Use and Attitudes*. The report is published in hard copy and a free electronic file. Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service ${}^{\text{TM}}$ money order:

- Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
- 2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail. **A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Com-

mander," "Commanding Officer," etc. **B.** PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO or FPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO or FPO, except for those APOs/FPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO or FPO weighing 16 ounces or more.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.2c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

 ${f H}.$ Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

- I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.
- $\ensuremath{\mathbf{I2.}}$ This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.
 - $\mbox{\bf J.}$ Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.
- **K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

- M. Fruits, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
- N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- **R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.8.0, are prohibited
- **R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
- **T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
- **U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."
- **U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.
- $\mbox{\bf U2.}$ Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.
- **U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
 - V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.
 - V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.
- **W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- **X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- **Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.





New Travel Card Program Takes Effect November 19

Effective immediately, the Postal Service[™] has awarded a task order for the new travel charge card program to Citibank. The Postal Service has received permission to begin the new travel charge card program prior to the end of the General Services Administration (GSA) SmartPay 1 contract expiration. The new travel charge card will be active on November 19. Employees who currently have a Citibank travel charge card should expect to receive their new travel charge cards by October 31. Employees must call the number on the front of the new card to verify receipt of the card as soon as they receive it. Any cards for which receipt is not verified will not be activated on November 19.

The card will continue to be a VISA-brand card. This task order has been issued under the provision of the GSA SmartPay 2 Program and will be in effect for 10 years beginning November 30, 2008. Citibank has served as the Postal Service's travel charge card provider since 1998 under the current GSA SmartPay 1 contract that expires on November 29, 2008.

The new GSA SmartPay 2 contract is in the best interest of the Postal Service and will meet all of our business travel

needs going forward. The GSA SmartPay 2 travel charge card program provides numerous benefits to the Postal Service including:

- New products and services.
- Enhanced customer service.
- Security of systems and data.

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. If available, the sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of those postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but

who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or post-card bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail[®] postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: PICTORIAL POST-MARKS, followed by the NAME OF THE STATION, ADDRESS, CITY, STATE, ZIP+4® CODE, exactly as listed

below (using all capitals and no punctuation, except the hyphen in the ZIP+4 code).

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® Web site at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of non-specified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, P.O. Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.
