DMM Correction: Labeling List Changes

The article "DMM Revision: Labeling List Changes" in *Postal Bulletin* 22278 (2-11-10, pages 43-45) announced an incorrect date for mandatory compliance. The sentence is given again below with the corrected date in bold.

Mailers are encouraged to label according to these revised lists immediately, but must use these lists starting April **15**, 2010.

DMM Revision: General Delivery Service Restrictions

Effective March 14, 2010, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 508.6 to permit the postmaster of a Post Office™ with multiple facilities to designate more than one facility as an office that can provide general delivery service in accordance with customer and operational needs.

Currently, general delivery service is available at only one facility when under the administration of a multifacility Post Office. Prior to initiating service, customers should contact the destination Post Office to determine the authorized facility or facilities and applicable ZIPTM Code(s).

This revision also clarifies the 30-day time limit for how long an individual general delivery mailpiece is held.

6.2 Service Restrictions

[Revise the text of 6.2 as follows:]

General delivery is normally available at only one facility under the administration of a Post Office with multiple facilities. A postmaster may authorize more than one facility to offer general delivery service in accordance with customer and operational needs. A customer may use only one such location. A postmaster may refuse or restrict general delivery:

- To a customer who is unable to present suitable identification.
- To a customer whose mail volume or service level (e.g., mail accumulation) cannot reasonably be accommodated.

6.3 Delivery to Addressee

[Add a new last sentence to 6.3 to read as follows:]

*** Prior to mailing, customers should contact the destination Post Office to determine the authorized facility or facilities and their applicable ZIP Code(s).

6.4 Holding Mail

[Revise text of 6.4 to read as follows:]

Each general delivery mailpiece is held for no more than 30 days, although a shorter time period may be requested by the sender.

DMM Revision: New Options for Pallet Placards Bearing Intelligent Mail Container Barcodes

Effective March 14, 2010, the Postal Service™ is revising Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 705.8.6.2 and 708.6.6 to provide a new option for Periodicals mailers preparing pallets or other approved containers bearing Intelligent Mail® container placards. We also provide additional options for mailers that prepare Intelligent Mail container placards smaller than the 8-inch by 11-inch format, under DMM 708.6.6.6; and make minor revisions to DMM 708.6.6.2 to clarify our current standards requiring Intelligent Mail container placards to be affixed to the outside of shrinkwrap or plastic.

Current standards require that placards on pallets containing Periodicals mail and bearing Intelligent Mail container barcodes must be pink. Optionally, placards may be white with a pink, left-justified, vertical 1/2-inch wide identification bar, when prepared in the optional format under DMM 708.6.6.6.

This revision will provide a third option (which may only be used with pallets bearing Intelligent Mail container placards) for mailers to identify Periodicals mail on pallets by allowing the Intelligent Mail container placard to be all white, when used in conjunction with a pink designator label under the following conditions:

- Pink designator labels must be printed in landscape orientation and must not include any print or graphics other than USPS[®]-required elements.
- Designator labels must meet or exceed both the horizontal and vertical dimensions of the accompanying Intelligent Mail container placard and must bear only a "PERIODICALS" or "NEWS" marking at least 1/2-inch high (or at least 48-point type).
- Designator labels may be affixed on the outside, or be placed beneath any shrinkwrap or plastic, but must be immediately adjacent to the Intelligent Mail container placard.
- When using this option, each Intelligent Mail container placard must be accompanied by an adjacent designator label.

Current standards allow only a single line of text in the mailer/acceptance unit area, for Intelligent Mail container placards prepared in the optional smaller format under DMM 708.6.6, without regard to size. With this revision, for smaller format placards *larger* than the 4 inches by 7 inches minimum, we define the top 3.75 inches of the placard as the area that must be retained for USPS-required elements. This change will allow mailers preparing Intelligent Mail container placards measuring more than 4 inches high by 7 inches long in both (or either) dimensions to use all of the available area (below the top 3.75 inches for mailer/acceptance unit purposes), provided there is no mailer-use routing information that conflicts with the USPS destination line (line 1). Mailers preparing Intelligent Mail container placards

in the minimum size of 4 inches high by 7 inches long will continue to be allowed a single line of text in the restricted mailer/acceptance unit area.

*** Placards, affixed to pallets containing Periodicals, bearing an Intelligent Mail container barcode and prepared in the optional smaller format under 708.6.6.6, may be white instead of pink, when a vertical pink 1/2-inch wide identification bar is included along the left-hand side of the placard; or may be white when used in conjunction with an adjacent pink designator label, under 708.6.6.5.

6.6.5 Placard Requirements

[Revise the introductory paragraph and items a and b of 6.6.5 as follows:]

Mailers may use placards bearing Intelligent Mail container barcodes only under the following conditions:

- a. Two placards must be placed on each pallet, one on each adjacent side. Placards must be affixed by selfadhesive or other adhesive means that will not obscure any required element of the placard and will remain secure throughout USPS processing.
- b. One placard must be placed in the designated area on other USPS containers.

[Add new items c through e to 6.6.5 as follows:]

- c. Placards affixed to pallets containing Periodicals mail must be pink, except under 6.6.5d or 6.6.5e.
- d. Placards prepared in the optional smaller format under 6.6 may be white, but must include a vertical pink 1/2-inch wide identification bar along the left-hand side of the placard, unless prepared under 6.6.5e.
- e. Placards containing Periodicals may be all white when used in conjunction with a pink designator label meeting the following criteria:
 - 1. Designator labels must be printed in landscape orientation and must not include any print or graphics other than the required marking in 6.6.5e2.
 - Designator labels must meet or exceed both the horizontal and vertical dimensions of the accompanying Intelligent Mail container placard and must bear only a "PERIODICALS" or "NEWS" marking at least 1/2-inch high (or at least 48-point type).
 - Designator labels may be affixed on the outside of, or be placed beneath, any shrinkwrap or plastic, but must be immediately adjacent to the Intelligent Mail container placard.
 - When using this option, each Intelligent Mail container placard must be accompanied by an adjacent designator label.

6.6.6 Optional Smaller Placard Format

[Revise the introductory paragraph of 6.6.6 as follows:]

Mailers may prepare placards bearing Intelligent Mail container barcodes (see Exhibit 6.6.6) in a smaller alternate format as follows:

[Reletter items b through g as new c through h, and add a new item b as follows:]

b. Placards must measure no less than 4 inches high by 7 inches long.

[Revise new item c as follows:]

c. Placards prepared in the minimum size of 4 inches high by 7 inches long may include a restricted mailer/ acceptance unit area that cannot exceed one line of text or contain print no larger than 12 points. Text in the restricted mailer/acceptance unit area must be restricted to the bottom line of the placard (below the lower barcode identification bar).

[Reletter new items d through h as new e through i, and add a new d as follows:]

d. Intelligent Mail container placards prepared in the optional smaller format, but measuring more than 4 inches high by 7 inches long in both (or either) dimensions, must preserve the top 3.75 inches of the placard, or the area including and above the lower barcode identification bar (whichever is greater), for USPS-required elements. The remainder of the placard is available for restricted mailer/acceptance unit use. Text in the restricted mailer/acceptance unit area, when used, must contain print no larger than 12 points.

[Delete relettered item h in its entirety, and reletter new item i as new item h.]

DMM Revision: Nomenclature Change Relating to the Network Distribution Center Transition

Effective March 14, 2010, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) pursuant to the ongoing transition of USPS® bulk mail centers (BMC) to network distribution centers (NDC), by replacing all text references to "BMC" with "NDC." We are similarly revising other related manuals and publications in addition to our regulations in the *Code of Federal Regulations* to reflect the "BMC" to "NDC" terminology change.

The BMC network was established in the 1970s to process Parcel Post[®], Bound Printed Matter, Media Mail[®], Standard Mail[®] and Periodicals. Fluctuations in volume and changes in the mailing habits of the public and large mailers have necessitated changes to the USPS business model relative to BMC processing and transportation. To fully utilize our existing BMC facilities and consolidate transportation, we are changing our mail flow processes through the new NDC network.

As part of this change, we are converting BMCs to NDCs. We began implementation of the NDC concept in May 2009, and this transition continues to date.

This revision will be limited to the change in nomenclature only. There will be no changes to mailing standards, service standards, or USPS processes resulting from this action. The Postal Service expects to be proposing changes to the standards for the preparation, entry, and deposit of mailpieces pursuant to final implementation of the NDC concept. Any such changes will be announced through future Federal Register notices, Postal Bulletin articles, and other channels of communication.

With this action, the Postal Service will be revising the text of the DMM, including all applicable Publication 95, *Quick Service Guide*, and Notice 123, *Price List*, references as follows:

As a reminder, on August 3, 2009, the Postal Service changed all of its applicable labeling lists to effect the name change from "BMC" to "NDC." At that time, mailers were provided a 73-day transitional period to make the changes to their software applications. Mailers are now urged to review their operations to ensure that these software changes have been made.

This revision will update the description of the "BMC Presort" (or "BMC PRSRT") and "OBMC Presort" (or "OBMC PRSRT") price markings, for Parcel Select® mailpieces, in DMM 402.2.5.2. Mailers will be required to change these markings to "NDC Presort" (or "NDC PRSRT") and "ONDC Presort" (or "ONDC PRSRT") respectively. Mailers will also be required to make changes to the human-readable content line, corresponding to the content identifier number (CIN), of those sack and tray labels bearing a BMC reference, as displayed in DMM Exhibit 708.6.2.4, 3-Digit Content Identifier Numbers. Similar to the period allowed for changes to labeling lists, mailers will be provided a 73-day transitional period to make changes to their software applications. Mailers will therefore have until May 26, 2010, to make the applicable changes resulting from this action.

DMM Revision: Clarification of Nonregulated Patient Specimen Packaging Standards

Effective March 14, 2010, The Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) Exhibit 601.10.17.3 to provide the proper packaging standards for nonregulated patient specimens.

With this revision, patient specimens that fall under the nonregulated material category must be properly packaged when presented for mailing and are subject to packaging standards in DMM 601.10.17.8 and Publication 52,

Hazardous, Restricted, and Perishable Mail, section 346.325

DMM Revision: Updated Size and Weight Limits for Items Mailed to Department of State Addresses

At the request of the Department of State, we have updated the size and weight limits for items mailed specifically to Department of State addresses.

Handbook F-101 Revision: Assigned Cash and Stamp Credit Count Frequencies

The following is a clarification of accounting policies related to count frequencies for assigned cash retained credits, stamp stock credits, and cash and stamp stock credits. To comply with the National Bargaining Agreement and Postal Service™ accounting policies and procedures outlined in Handbook F-101, *Field Accounting Procedures*, cash and/or stamp credits assigned to employees must be counted within a designated timeframe. Clarification of the designated count frequencies is as follows:

A	B
Count Frequency	Description
At least once each month	Counts must be conducted any day within the month.
At least once every 4 months	Counts must be conducted no less frequently than once every 4 months from the month of the last count.
	Example: A count performed on January 2nd is scheduled to be counted again, at the latest, any day within the month of May.
	Jan 2nd: Month of January, therefore latest Due Month is May

Publication 52 Revision: Clarification of Lithium Batteries Packaging Instructions

Effective March 14, 2010, the Postal Service™ Publication 52, *Hazardous, Restricted and Perishable Mail*, is revised to provide the proper packaging standards for lithium batteries.

Proper packaging standards must be followed as outlined in Publication 52 Appendix A, Hazardous Materials Table, for lithium batteries to be permitted in domestic air and surface transportation. Lithium batteries are also subject to the "9D" (Lithium and Lithium-ion Cells and Batteries) packaging instructions in Appendix C, USPS Packaging Instructions for Mailable Hazardous Materials, of Publication 52.

Revenue and mail volume projections point to continuing and dramatic losses in the billions. If the Postal Service[™] takes no action, it could face a cumulative \$238 billion shortfall by the year 2020.

On March 2, 2010, to meet these challenges over the next decade and beyond, the Postal Service presented its action plan — "Ensuring a Viable Postal Service for America" — to adapt to America's changing mailing habits and preferences.

The plan, presented by Postmaster General John E. Potter and senior USPS[®] executives to an audience of congressional and mailing industry stakeholders, calls for the Postal Service to focus on several main areas where change is needed to become a flexible, agile agency able to respond to change.

- Restructure retiree health benefits prefunding to "pay-as-you-go," comparable to what is used by the rest of the federal government and the private sector.
- Adjust delivery frequency to better reflect current mail volumes and customer habits.
- Expand access to postal products and services through self-service kiosks, partnerships with other retail outlets, and a world-class website *usps.com*[®].
- Workforce flexibility that allows USPS to put the right people at the right place and at the right time.
- Ensure pricing of Market Dominant mailing products is based on demand for each individual product and its costs, rather than capping prices for every class at the rate of inflation.
- Expand products and services by allowing USPS to evaluate and introduce more new products consistent with its mission and compete more effectively in the marketplace.

FACT SHEET

Overview

Revenue and mail volume projections point to continuing and dramatic losses in the billions. If the Postal Service takes no action, it could face a cumulative \$238 billion shortfall by the year 2020. "Ensuring a Viable Postal Service for America," the Postal Service action plan for the next decade, describes a flexible, agile Postal Service that can adapt to America's changing mailing habits and preferences. The Postal Service understands that to best serve the American people in 2020 and beyond, it must be leaner and more able to quickly respond to customer mailing needs. There are seven main areas where change is needed:

Retiree Health Benefits Prefunding: Restructure retiree health benefits payments to "pay-as-you-go," comparable to what is used by the rest of the federal government and the majority of the private sector. This equates to an average of \$5.6 billion in cash flow every year through 2016. Address overpayments to the Postal Service Civil Service Retirement System pension fund.

Delivery Frequency: Adjust delivery days to better reflect current mail volumes and customer habits. Survey data show that the public favors 5-day deliver over using taxpayer funds and other alternatives.

Expand Access: Continue to modernize customer access by providing services more convenient to customers — grocery stores, pharmacies, retail centers, office supply stores. Increase and enhance customer access through partnerships, self-service kiosks and a world-class website, usps.com, while reducing costs.

Workforce: Establish a more flexible workforce that is better positioned to respond to changing demand patterns, as more than 300,000 employees become eligible to retire in the coming decade.

Pricing: Ensure that prices of Market Dominant mailing products are based on demand for each individual product and its costs, rather than capping prices for every class at the rate of inflation. Pursue a moderate exigent price increase effective in 2011.

Expand Products and Services: Permit the Postal Service to evaluate and introduce more new products consistent with its mission, allowing it to better respond to changing customer needs and compete more effectively in the marketplace.

Oversight: Reinforce these changes with more clearly defined, appropriate oversight roles and more streamlined processes to provide for greater speed and flexibility of decision-making. Changes to legislative and regulatory requirements are needed.

An ambitious, aggressive plan, certainly. This is a path to the future, a future where the Postal Service remains a vital driver of the American economy, an integral part of every American community and continues to deliver the greatest value of any comparable post in the world. If given the flexibility to respond to an evolving marketplace, the Postal Service will continue to be an integral part of the fabric of American life.



Pricing

"Ensuring a Viable Postal Service for America," the Postal Service action plan for the next decade, describes a flexible, agile Postal Service that can adapt to America's changing mailing habits and preferences. The Postal Service understands that to best serve the American people in 2020 and beyond, it must be leaner and more able to quickly respond to customer mailing needs.

The Postal Service lacks the flexibility to adjust pricing to better reflect market dynamics and offset future volume and revenue declines. While nothing seems to have a greater impact on customers than pricing, it is only one part of a comprehensive strategy that includes legislative and regulatory changes, the flexibility to make necessary business decisions in a timely manner and greater control over determining how to recover real costs of products and services.

- Prices for mailing products (Market Dominant) should be based on demand for individual products and their costs, rather than capping each class of mail at the rate of inflation. The Consumer Price Index should apply to the entire group of products, rather than each individual mail class.
- Address the fact that certain mail, such as nonprofit mail, Media Mail, Library Mail and Periodicals, does not
 presently cover costs. No business can survive selling products below costs.
- Workshare discounts will continue. These discounts provide the flexibility necessary to meet a number of customer needs and maintain value in the mail.
- Regulatory and legal restrictions need to be removed to provide greater flexibility and use of Negotiated Service Agreements (NSAs). NSAs provide mailers the opportunity to increase volume at a reasonable price.
- An exigent price increase is unavoidable. Any possible price increase would not occur before January 2011 next year. The price of a stamp remains 44 cents.
- The Postal Service is not seeking an appropriation of taxpayer funds from Congress at this time and does not support increasing the debt ceiling as a solution to the projected 2020 deficit.

Expanded Access and Products

"Ensuring a Viable Postal Service for America," the Postal Service action plan for the next decade, describes a flexible, agile Postal Service that can adapt to America's changing mailing habits and preferences. The Postal Service understands that to best serve the American people in 2020 and beyond, it must be leaner and more able to quickly respond to customer mailing and shipping needs.

Don't look at the Postal Service and see only brick and mortar Post Offices. Look online at usps.com. Look at mobile devices. Look for Postal Service products at other retail outlets, grocery stores and pharmacies. Look for letter carriers to pick up packages at homes and offices. The Postal Service of the future will be different, but it will continue to drive commerce, serve communities and deliver value.

- Complete development of a world-class website that provides state-of-the-art technology, interactive
 communications tools, easier navigation and additional products and services to create the best consumer
 experience on the market.
- Expand existing applications on mobile devices for customer convenience and 24/7 access.
- Continue to modernize customer access by providing services at locations more convenient to customers grocery stores, pharmacy, retail centers, office supply stores.
- Double the number of self-service kiosks, using the Postal Service's own Automated Postal Centers and new, innovative technologies through partnerships with private companies. Place kiosks in retail stores and popular consumer sites to increase convenience and expand access.
- Expand the number of places customers can access products and services beyond the 50,000 that exist today through partnerships.
- Complete current market tests with private companies to increase the availability of shipping and package services at retail centers and office supply stores popular with small business owners.
- Minimize costs by reducing redundant retail facilities to reflect customer behavior that is shifting away from visiting local Post Offices.
- Add a suite of hybrid mail products to better meet the changing needs of its customers that combines trusted and secure Postal Service addressing and delivery — whether in physical or electronic form.
- Continue to market and expand Priority Mail Flat Rate Box offerings, Parcel Select and Parcel Return services
 that provide a strong consumer and business suite of services.
- Establish strong presence and large market share in the rapidly growing area of shipping recycled electronics and small appliances through the mail. Create new opportunities and pricing incentives to grow volume while retaining a fair return for First-Class Mail offerings.
- Secure flexibility in setting prices for all mailing products (Market Dominant) to ensure prices can be based on associated costs and demand for individual products, rather than capping each class of mail at the rate of inflation.
- Make the necessary legislative and regulatory changes to create the flexibility to introduce new products that reflect changing customer needs, generate needed revenue and allow the Postal Service to compete more aggressively and fairly in the marketplace.

Workforce

"Ensuring a Viable Postal Service for America," the Postal Service action plan for the next decade, describes a flexible, agile Postal Service that can adapt to America's changing mailing habits and preferences. The Postal Service understands that to best serve the American people in 2020 and beyond, it must be leaner and better able to quickly respond to customer mailing needs.

The Postal Service has been named the Most Trusted Government Agency for five consecutive years. This annual survey of Americans found that the ranking is tied directly to the trust customers place in their letter carriers. But the changing face of the Postal Service makes workforce changes inevitable.

- A smaller, leaner workforce, better aligned with changing customer needs, will be achieved through attrition and working with labor unions and management associations to optimize the workforce.
- Annually through 2020, about 5 percent of Postal Service employees will be eligible and expected to retire. That represents approximately 300,000 employees, about half of the current workforce.
- The large number of expected retirements, coupled with upcoming labor negotiations, presents a unique opportunity to establish a more flexible workforce.
- The financial health of the Postal Service should be taken into consideration by an interest arbitrator in the collective bargaining process.
- To be able to meet customer needs at affordable prices, it will be necessary to have more flexibility in the workforce.
- Customer service, on-time delivery and efficiency remain critical to the success of the Postal Service. Providing
 the Postal Service with increased workforce flexibility will help it maintain service levels while reducing costs.
- The Postal Service has been and will continue to address the cost of employee benefits through the collective bargaining process. For example, the Postal Service has reduced the employer contributions to health benefits by 1 percent per year for the life of the last collective bargaining agreement.



Domestic Mail

Information-Based Indicia Postage Meter Requirements for Commercial Base Prices

In January 2009, the Postal Service™ revised *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM[®]) and *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM[®]) to offer Commercial Base prices to mailers who meet specific requirements and ship to domestic and international destinations.

Commercial Base prices are available with the following services: Express Mail[®], Priority Mail[®], Global Express Guaranteed[®] (GXG[®]), Express Mail International[®], and Priority Mail International[®].

These prices are available to mailers using several postage payment methods as defined in the DMM and IMM. This update clarifies the requirements for mailers who pay postage using information-based indicia (IBI) postage meters, which are approved by USPS[®].

Mailpieces that bear postage that is paid using USPSapproved IBI postage meters must reflect the appropriate Commercial Base price marking, and employees must review the associated pricing and distribute accordingly. Commercial Base prices result in postage that is lower than retail postage prices. Such pieces should not be returned as shortpaid or postage due, except when the postage paid is not sufficient for Commercial Base prices according to the respective class of mail or the piece is not identified with the appropriate price marking "Commercial Base Price," "Commercial Base Pricing," or "ComBasPrice."

Since offering these prices to mailers using USPS-approved IBI postage meters, there have been several inquiries regarding what type of meters qualify. To clarify which meters qualify for Commercial Base prices, we have provided four diagrams below (and a poster on page 22).

- Both of the top two postage meters are USPSapproved IBI postage meters, and they DO qualify for Commercial Base prices. Note: The IBI postage meters bear a two-dimensional barcode.
- The bottom two postage meters are non-IBI postage meters, and they DO NOT qualify for Commercial Base prices.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service $^{\text{TM}}$ money order:

- Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
- 2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. PS Form 2976-A is required for all mail weighing 16 ounces or more, with exceptions noted below. In addition, mailers must properly complete required customs documentation when mailing any potentially dutiable mail addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO regardless of weight. The following are exceptions to the requirement for customs documentation on nondutiable mail that weighs 16 ounces or more:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters, and printed matter weighing 16 ounces or more. (A known mailer is anyone who legally applies a permit imprint to a mailpiece. Mail with meter postage is not considered to be from a known mailer.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation on mail addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPO/DPOs to which restriction B2 applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B1. PS Form 2976 or 2976-A is required. Articles are liable for customs duty and/or purchase tax unless they are bona fide gifts intended for use by military personnel or their dependents. When the contents of a parcel meet these requirements, the mailer must endorse the customs form, "Certified to be a bona fide gift, personal effects, or items for personal use of military personnel and dependents," under the heading, Description of Contents. **Exceptions:** All other exceptions listed in restriction B above are applicable to this restriction.

- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO weighing 16 ounces or more.
 - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - D. Coffee is prohibited.
 - **E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.
- **E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.1c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.
- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.
- **G.** Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.
- **H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

- H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
- I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:
 - Maximum length 20 inches.
 - Maximum width 12 inches.
 - Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

- I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.
- 12. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM
 - J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.
- **K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
 - L. All official mail is prohibited.
 - M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
 - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- **R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.11.7, are prohibited.
- **R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
- **S.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:
 - Maximum length 12 inches.
 - Maximum width 12 inches.
 - Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
 - Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

- **T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
- **U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."
- **U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.
- $\mbox{\bf U2.}$ Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.
- **U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
 - V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.
 - V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.
- **W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- **X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- **Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Post Offices, classified stations, branches, and contract postal units may display this poster at their option. If the poster is displayed, it should be placed on the community bulletin board located in the Post Office™ box lobby and not in the main retail (full service) lobby. Alternatively, Missing Children posters can be maintained in a binder behind the counter to be used as a reference guide. The posters also may be posted in a prominent location where letter carriers will be able to see them before or after they go out on their routes. Making this information available to letter carriers is consistent with the NALC/USPS Child Alert Program to facilitate identification of missing children.

Companion posters, authorized for display on bulletin boards maintained by employee organizations, appear periodically in *The Postal Record*, a publication for members of the National Association of Letter Carriers.

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In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information periodically. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators via e-mail addresses provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of an e-mailed Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all Postal Service™ facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed as noted above for 30 days unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The e-mail network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service[®] only as described above. If Postal Service employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 800-843-5678.

Labels

Commercial Base prices are available when paying postage with USPS-approved IBI postage meters in conjunction with Post Office-supplied shipping labels (addressing may be typed or handwritten), i.e., Express Mail, Label 11-B and Priority Mail, Label 228. Commercial Base prices are also available when paying postage with USPS-approved IBI postage meters in conjunction with USPS-approved online shipping labels from Click-n-Ship® and Shipping Assistant, and labels from USPS-approved PC Postage® providers.

Mailing Standards

Listed below are domestic and international mailing standards relative to postage paid using USPS-approved IBI postage meters only.

Domestic Mailings Standards

Price markings are required on domestic mailpieces. The respective markings must be printed by the mailer — or produced as part of the meter imprint. For pieces paid at the Commercial Base prices, one of the following markings must be reflected: "Commercial Base Price," "Commercial Base Pricing," or "ComBasPrice." The appropriate marking must appear directly above, directly below, or to the left of the postage meter.

The outlined standards are specific to mailers using IBI postage meters.

Express Mail Commercial Base prices are available for:

- Customers who pay postage using USPS-approved IBI postage meters when using an Express Mail shipping label.
- Customers using USPS-approved IBI postage meters that print the IBI with the appropriate price marking ("Commercial Base Price," "Commercial Base Pricing," or "ComBasPrice") and who electron-

ically transmit transactional data to USPS and use an approved Express Mail shipping label, DMM 413.1.3.

Priority Mail Commercial Base prices are available for:

- Customers who pay postage using USPS-approved IBI postage meters in conjunction with an approved shipping label that bears a confirmation services barcode with a postal routing code (see DMM 708.5.0).
- Customers using USPS-approved IBI postage meters that print the IBI with the appropriate price marking "Commercial Base Price," "Commercial Base Pricing," or "ComBasPrice" and electronically transmit transactional data to USPS, DMM 423.1.2.

International Mailings Standards

The outlined standards are specific to mailers using IBI postage meters.

Global Express Guaranteed Commercial Base Prices are available for:

 A USPS-approved IBI postage meter used by the end-user customer, IMM 213.71.

Express Mail International Commercial Base Prices are available for:

 A USPS-approved IBI postage meter used by the end-user customer, provided the meter electronically transmits customs forms, IMM 223.241.

Priority Mail International Commercial Base Prices are available for:

 A USPS-approved IBI postage meter used by the end-user customer, provided the meter electronically transmits customs forms, IMM 233.231.

Free Mail Program for U.S. Armed Forces

Under the provisions of Title 39 of the United States Code (U.S.C.) 3401(a)(1) and pursuant to Executive Order 12556, dated April 16, 1986, the Secretary of Defense may authorize or terminate free mail privileges for members of the U.S. Armed Forces and designated civilians directly supporting military operations in designated international locations.

Accordingly, the Secretary of Defense has authorized free mail privileges for members of the U.S. Armed Forces and designated civilians deployed to Haiti in support of Operation Unified Response through July 31, 2010.

The following list includes the current locations for which the Secretary of Defense has authorized free mail privileges for members of the U.S. Armed Forces and designated civilians directly supporting military operations. In accordance with 39 U.S.C. 3401(a)(1)(B), free mail privileges will also be extended to individuals hospitalized for disease or injury in a facility under the jurisdiction of the Armed Forces as a result of service in these designated areas.

Personnel who are authorized this privilege may mail — without postage — letters, postcards, and sound recordings (audio or video recordings) having the character of personal correspondence to any place in the United States, to any U.S. possession or territory, or to any military post office (APO/FPO).

Free mail originating from the above overseas locations should have a complete APO or FPO return address, the word "Free" in the upper right corner, and a complete delivery address. In most cases, the mailpiece will also exhibit an APO or FPO postmark. Free mail receives First-Class Mail[®] service; however, it may not be registered, insured, or certified.

All employees who handle and deliver mail should be made aware of this free mail privilege. Do not collect postage upon delivery; do not return this mail to the sender for postage. Mail having the appearance of free mail under this program should never be returned to sender. Information Technology

Protecting Hardcopy Information

During a recent payment card industry audit, payment card receipts were found in several Post Office™ facilities. The Corporate Information Security Office (CISO) reminds everyone to properly handle and control all Postal Service™ hardcopy information, as stated below.

Special consideration must be given to sensitive and critical information. The level of protection is based on the information's sensitivity and criticality.

Hardcopy information must be protected against damage, unauthorized access, and theft, both in the Postal Service environment and when removed from this secure environment.

Postal Service information security policies for protecting hardcopy information include the following:

- 1. Labeling.
- 2. Controlling access.
- 3. Retention and storage.
- 4. Removal from Postal Service premises.
- 5. Release.
- 6. Disposal and destruction.
- 7. Contracts.

1. Labeling

Sensitive-enhanced or sensitive hardcopy information (e.g., credit card receipts, printouts, screen prints, photocopies, architecture drawings, and engineering layouts) must be legibly and durably labeled as "RESTRICTED INFORMATION."

2. Controlling Access

Access to hardcopy information must be restricted as follows:

- a. Sensitive-enhanced and sensitive information must be protected from unauthorized access and disclosure. Access must be restricted to authorized personnel with a need to know.
- b. Critical information must be protected from unauthorized access and destruction.
- To prevent unauthorized access to hardcopy information, any of the following controls may be employed:
 - 1. A locked desk or file cabinet.
 - 2. A room with a key, combination, or electronic lock.
 - 3. An approved storage area, or an area behind a guard.

3. Retention and Storage

The retention and storage of information must be controlled as follows:

 a. All Postal Service hardcopy information must be retained in accordance with legal retention require-

- ments established by law (e.g., legal holds), and also with operational retention requirements established by the Postal Service Records Office (see Handbook AS-353, Guide to Privacy, Freedom of Information Act, and Records Management).
- b. When the retention period or legal hold has expired, information must be properly destroyed (see item 6 below). The process of removing expired information can be automated or manual.
- Sensitive-enhanced, sensitive, and critical information must be stored in a controlled area or a locked cabinet.
- d. Postal Service information not available to the public must be isolated and stored separately from non– Postal Service information (e.g., business partner and vendor information) unless required by law or regulation. Postal Service information not available to the public and non–Postal Service information must be stored separately at Postal Service facilities, non– Postal Service facilities, and at backup sites, unless otherwise required by law or regulation.

4. Removal From Postal Service Premises

The requirements for taking sensitive-enhanced and sensitive Postal Service hardcopy information off-site (i.e., non–Postal Service premises) including Postal Service data processed by business partners are as follows:

- a. The removal and storage of sensitive-enhanced and sensitive Postal Service information from Postal Service premises must be approved in writing by the functional vice president (data steward), chief privacy officer, and the chief information officer (CIO) or their designee. Complete PS Form 1357-D, Data Accountability, to initiate the process.
- b. Only authorized personnel are allowed to pick up, receive, transfer, or deliver Postal Service sensitive-enhanced and sensitive information.
- c. All Postal Service hardcopy information containing sensitive-enhanced and sensitive information must be secured against theft and unauthorized access (e.g., controlled area, safe, and locked cabinet).
- d. There must be accountability in the life cycle management of any sensitive-enhanced and sensitive information removed off Postal Service premises. This data must be formally tracked (e.g., logbook) from creation to destruction.

5. Release

The release of information must be accomplished in accordance with Postal Service policies and procedures (see Handbook AS-353).

Sensitive-enhanced and sensitive information must be protected from unauthorized disclosure through observation and conversations. Control must also be exercised over copies and facsimiles.

6. Disposal and Destruction

Hardcopy information designated as sensitiveenhanced or sensitive must be destroyed by shredding, pulping, or burning when no longer needed if the information is not subject to a legal hold and the retention period has expired.

Disposal contractors must have appropriate personnel clearances, physical security of the facility, and procedures

to store and handle the hardcopy information containing sensitive-enhanced or sensitive information before and during disposal.

7. Contracts

Information security requirements must be included in contracts involving services for handling sensitive-enhanced, sensitive, or critical information for the Postal Service.

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On April 16, 2010, in New York, New York, at the Mega Stamp Show, the Postal Service[™] will issue the 44-cent definitive stamps *Flags of Our Nation* in ten designs, in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) coil of 50 (Item 787600). Designed by Howard E. Paine of Delaplane, Virginia, the stamps go on sale nationwide April 16, 2010.

The U.S. Postal Service[®] continues its *Flags of Our Nation* series with ten more stamp designs. These stamps will feature the Stars and Stripes stamp that depicts the "purple mountain majesties" inspired by the opening lines of "America the Beautiful" by Katharine Lee Bates (1859–1929), plus the states of Montana through North Dakota. Artist Tom Engeman, Bethany Beach, Delaware, created the highly detailed flag portraits on the stamps, reproducing as accurately as possible such complex elements as intricate state seals and coats of arms. Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or post-card bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail[®] postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.





How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office $^{\text{TM}}$, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge

for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal ServiceTM will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

Customers may purchase new stamps or postal stationery items at their Post Office, from the *USA Philatelic Catalog*, by calling 800-STAMP-24, or online at *www. usps.com* by clicking *Buy Stamps & Shop*. Then they should prepare their own covers by affixing new stamps to the upper-right corner of envelopes or postcards of their

choice, and address those envelopes, postcards, or postal stationery items to themselves or others. (Postage must equal the current First-Class Mail[®] rate.) For sturdiness, include a card of postcard thickness in each cover (envelopes only) submitted, and tuck in the flap. Place the cover in a larger envelope addressed to:

Covers submitted for first day of issue postmarks may include additional uncanceled stamps only if the uncanceled stamps were issued before the first day of issue of the new stamps or postal stationery items.
