DMM Revision: Scheduled Pickup on Demand

Effective May 3, 2010, the Postal Service™ is revising Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 507.6 to standardize the process for scheduled Pickup on Demand® service by providing a new service agreement form. Additionally, we revise 507.6.3.4 that authorizes PC Postage™ as an approved method to pay for Pickup on Demand.

The new PS Form 5542, Scheduled Pickup on Demand Service Agreement, is shown on page 11 of this Postal Bulletin. It is designed to be used by customers who are requesting Pickup on Demand service, and it now aligns with our mailing standards.

6.3.2 **Fee Charged**

[Revise introductory sentence and item a of 6.3.2 as follows:] Pickup on Demand fees are listed in Notice 123, Price List. The customer is charged the required fee:

a. Every time Pickup on Demand service is provided, regardless of the number of pieces or combination of classes of mail. See 6.3.3 for when fee is not charged.

6.3.3 Fee Not Charged

[Revise introductory sentence of 6.3.3 as follows:] The customer is not charged for:

[Revise item c of 6.3.3 as follows:]

c. A pickup that occurs as part of a regularly scheduled delivery or collection stop.

[Delete item e of 6.3.3 in its entirety.]

Fee Payment Method 6.3.4

The Pickup on Demand fee must be paid by one of these

[Revise item a of 6.3.4 by adding PC Postage as follows:]

a. Meter, PC Postage, precanceled, or adhesive stamps affixed to Form 5541, Pickup Service Statement.

6.4 **On-Call Service**

6.4.2 **Requesting Pickup on Demand Service**

[Combine the current second and third sentences of 6.4.2 into one sentence as follows:]

Pickups are made within 2 hours of the requested pickup time unless the customer and the serving Post Office agree and service is not adversely affected.

6.5 **Scheduled Service**

Service Agreement

[Revise text in 6.5.2 as follows:]

A customer requesting scheduled Pickup on Demand service must enter into a service agreement as follows:

- a. Use PS Form 5542, Scheduled Pickup on Demand Service Agreement, to specify the time, place, day or date, frequency of service, and approximate volume per pickup.
- b. The terms of the service agreement may be amended with the consent and approval of both parties.

6.5.3 **Service Hours**

[Revise second sentence in 6.5.3 as follows:]

***Scheduled Pickup on Demand service begins the day after the service agreement is finalized and continues until the service agreement's stated end date or termination.

6.5.4 Customer Changes

[Revise 6.5.4 by deleting item a in its entirety and incorporating item b into the introductory text as follows:]

The customer must notify the serving Post Office at least 24 hours before a scheduled pickup if the pickup is to be canceled or the volume of mail to be picked up is more than 20% higher than the volume specified in the service agreement. The customer may terminate scheduled Pickup on Demand service, effective 24 hours after the USPS receives the customer's written notice of termination at the serving Post Office. The customer must pay all fees for Pickup on Demand service provided before termination of service.

6.5.5 USPS Changes

[Revise 6.5.5 by deleting item a in its entirety and incorporating item b into the introductory text as follows:]

The USPS may terminate scheduled Pickup on Demand service, effective 24 hours after the customer receives writ-

ten notice of termination from the serving Post Office. Termination is based upon the customer's failure to pay postage and fees or to meet the standards for Pickup on Demand service in 6.0. The customer may appeal this termination of services to the manager, Post Office Operations, but must pay for all fees for Pickup on Demand service provided during the appeal period.

Effective immediately, Handbook AS-701, *Material Management*, Part 646, Proprietary Items Requiring Special Processing, and Part 647, Methods and Priority, are revised to include changes to policy covering the disposal of USPS® collection boxes.

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646.5 Post Office Boxes

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646.53 Donations

[Revise text to read as follows:]

Postal Service managers must not grant approval to donate Post Office box units or collection boxes in response to requests from federal or state agencies, academic institutions, nonprofit organizations, or a public body. All actions concerning the above items must be conducted in accordance with the procedures outlined in 647.26.

646.8 Collection Boxes

646.81 Policy

[Revise text to read as follows:]

Collection boxes, including post type, street collection, and relay storage boxes must not be sold to the public. They must be destroyed by the owning Postal Service entity and sold as scrap. Collection boxes designated for sale as scrap must be recycled. Contact a USPS environmental specialist for information concerning federal, state, and local scrap metal recycling requirements. (See 647.271). Collection boxes, including post type, street collection, and relay storage boxes, must not be loaned to organizations or agencies, including federal agencies, except as provided in 646.82.

646.82 Loans

[Revise text to read as follows:]

With approval from the manager of Public Affairs, Corporate Communications, surplus collection boxes may be loaned to a federal agency such as a museum, for exhibit purposes only. There is no requirement to change the color or remove the indicia, although the lock must be removed and an audit trail established and maintained until the item is returned. A written license agreement must also be exe-

cuted to keep the use of the collection box under Postal Service control. The Postal Service must use PS Form 1590 signed by both parties and a signed license agreement acknowledging the Postal Service rights to monitor all collection box loans.

A loan of a collection box for use in a motion picture, on broadcast or cable television, and/or in advertising agencies is executed under a licensing agreement for a fee or no fee. Go to http://www.usps.com/rightsandpermissions/ for an overview of the rights and permissions program and for more detailed information. Rights and Permissions, Chief Counsel, Corporate Law, must maintain a copy of the license agreement when a collection box is licensed by a third party for use in the entertainment industry or for any other purposes. All requests must be approved by the manager of Public Affairs, Corporate Communications.

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647 Methods and Priority

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647.2 Methods

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[Revise title to read as follows:]

647.26 Donation to a Federal or State Agency, an Academic Institution, a Nonprofit Organization, or a Public Body

647.261 Policy

[Revise text to read as follows:]

The Postal Service defines a public body as any state, territory, or possession of the United States, any political subdivision thereof, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, or any American Indian tribe. Collection boxes and Post Office boxes that are designated surplus to Postal Service needs must not be donated to federal or state agencies, academic institutions, nonprofit organizations, or a public body, but shall be recycled or destroyed and scrapped. Surplus material that is unmarketable, excluding collection boxes and Post Office boxes, may be donated to state agencies, academic institutions, nonprofit organizations, or a public body. Materials classified other than collection boxes that are designated surplus, nonsensitive, expendable, or obsolete are referenced in 647.262 and may be dealt with accordingly.

* * * * * *

647.264 Donation to Foreign Government

[Revise text to read as follows:]

Consideration may be given by the installation head or the assigned designee on a case-by-case basis to donate surplus equipment, other than collection boxes and Post Office boxes, to a foreign government. Requests for specific equipment will normally be received from International Postal Affairs. Approval to donate any equipment will be granted by the manager of Asset Management and Asset Management Performance & Accountability (AMPA). Surplus equipment located in the field will be processed for shipment through AMPA and the Asset Accountability Service Centers.

647.27 Destruction and Landfill Disposal

647.271 Policy

[Revise text to read as follows:]

Postal Service facilities, offices, departments, and entities must not use landfills to dispose of collection boxes. Postal Service entities that designate collection boxes for destruction must destroy by scrapping out the equipment followed by metal recycling. Methodologies used to process recyclables normally generate residual (waste) that cannot be sold, reprocessed, or reused. The processes noted above are the only authorized methods of destruction or disposal for collection boxes. The methods above comply with the Environmental Protection Agency, federal, state, and local environmental laws, and Postal Service regulations concerning the destruction, disposal, or recycling of metal objects.

Effective immediately, section 14-2.3 of Handbook F-101, Field Accounting Procedures, is revised to reference the report in the Accounting Data Mart (ADM) titled "Excess Retail Floor Stock (SPLY Qtr)". This report is used to provide POS offices with authorized 2-week floor stock levels based on prior year sales. For compliance purposes, the report also provides a comparison of daily retail floor stock inventory with authorized levels for a selected period.

New PS Form 5542, Scheduled Pickup on Demand Service Agreement

PS Form 5542, Scheduled Pickup on Demand Service Agreement, has been created to standardize all new Scheduled Pickup on Demand[®] service agreements between business customers and the Postal Service[™]. PS Form 5542 documents and defines the conditions for recurring pickups at a specified address at predetermined frequencies and times. A pickup fee is required each time Pickup on Demand service is provided, unless the pickup occurs as part of a regularly scheduled delivery or collection stop, in accordance with DMM 507.6.3.3.

Retirement of POSTNET and PLANET Code Barcodes

In a final rule published in the Federal Register (73FR 49333–46348) on August 21, 2008, the Postal Service™ provided advance notice that commercial letters and flats with POSTNET™ barcodes will not be eligible for automation prices as of May 2011.

Mailers requesting Confirm[®] service for their automation letters or flats currently use either an Intelligent Mail[®] barcode or a PLANET Code[®] barcode, in combination with a POSTNET barcode. Therefore, when POSTNET barcodes

are retired in May 2011, Confirm subscribers who continue to use the POSTNET and PLANET Code barcode combination will no longer be eligible to claim automation prices for their mailings. They will, however, be able to participate in Confirm for nonautomation mailings of letters and flats.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service $^{\text{TM}}$ money order:

- Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
- 2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration form is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise) addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. PS Form 2976 is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces, and PS Form 2976-A is required for items weighing 16 ounces or more. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). When the surface area of the address side of the mailpiece is not large enough to contain a PS Form 2976-A, the smaller PS Form 2976 may be substituted (e.g., the Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box). The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."
- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.
 - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - **D.** Coffee is prohibited.
 - E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.
- E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.1c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.
- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.
- **G.** Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.
- **H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

- H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.
- I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:
 - Maximum length 20 inches.
 - Maximum width 12 inches.
 - Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

- I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.
- 12. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM
 - J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.
- **K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
 - L. All official mail is prohibited.
 - M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
 - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- **R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.11.7, are prohibited.
- **R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
- **S.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:
 - Maximum length 12 inches.
 - Maximum width 12 inches.
 - Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
 - Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

- **T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
- **U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."
- **U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.
- $\mbox{\bf U2.}$ Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.
- **U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
 - V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.
 - V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.
- **W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- **X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Missing Children Poster Display Instructions

Post Offices, classified stations, branches, and contract postal units may display this poster at their option. If the poster is displayed, it should be placed on the community bulletin board located in the Post Office™ box lobby and not in the main retail (full service) lobby. Alternatively, Missing Children posters can be maintained in a binder behind the counter to be used as a reference guide. The posters also may be posted in a prominent location where letter carriers will be able to see them before or after they go out on their routes. Making this information available to letter carriers is consistent with the NALC/USPS Child Alert Program to facilitate identification of missing children.

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In addition to *Postal Bulletin* updates, NCMEC distributes information periodically. Notification of newly reported missing children is sent to designated district "Missing Children" coordinators via e-mail addresses provided by district managers. Within 24 hours of receipt of an e-mailed Missing Children poster, district coordinators should distribute copies to all Postal Service™ facilities in their districts. Missing Children posters are to be displayed as noted above for 30 days unless notification is received (from NCMEC) to remove a particular poster sooner. The e-mail network is used to distribute posters and information in only the most urgent cases of missing children. This system supplements, but does not replace, the missing children information in this *Postal Bulletin*.

Missing Children posters are available to the U.S. Postal Service[®] only as described above. If Postal Service employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 800-843-5678.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, S, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. See the *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan* for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks. The monthly returns of the TSP Funds represent net earnings for the month after deduction of accrued administrative expenses and, except for the G Fund, after deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees as well. Proper Disposal of USPS Collection Boxes

Do not sell, loan, or donate collection boxes!

Collection boxes must be disposed of in accordance with Handbook AS-701, *Material Management*. Refer to Chapter 6, Asset Recovery: Redistribution, Recycling, and Disposal. Compliance with this policy will be rigorously enforced. Any release of a collection box to an unauthorized party will be referred for investigation.

Collection boxes, including post type, street collection, and relay storage boxes, *must not be sold* to the public. They must be destroyed by the owning Postal Service[™] entity and sold as scrap. Collection boxes designated for sale as scrap must be recycled. Contact a USPS[®] environmental specialist for information concerning federal, state, and local scrap metal recycling requirements.

USPS receives requests from time to time from various sources to purchase, donate, or loan out surplus collection boxes. Collection boxes, including post type, street collection, and relay storage boxes, are considered postal intellectual property and *must not be loaned* to organizations, agencies, or a public body except as provided in section 646.82 in Handbook AS-701. The Postal Service defines a public body as any state, territory, or possession of the United States, any political subdivision thereof, the District of Columbia, the Commonwealth of Puerto Rico, or any American Indian tribe. All requests for collection box loans must be approved by the manager, Public Affairs, Corporate Communications.

A loan of a collection box for use in a motion picture, on broadcast or cable television, and/or in advertising agencies is executed under a licensing agreement for a fee or no fee. Go to http://www.usps.com/rightsandpermissions/ for an overview of the rights and permissions program and more detailed information. Rights and Permissions, Chief Counsel, Corporate Law, must maintain a copy of the license agreement when a collection box is licensed by a third party for use in the entertainment industry or for any other purposes.

With approval from the manager, Public Affairs, Corporate Communications, surplus collection boxes may be loaned to a federal agency, such as a museum, for exhibit purposes only. There is no requirement to change the color or remove the indicia, although the lock must be removed, and an audit trail established and maintained by the installation head until the item is returned. A written license agreement must also be executed to keep the use of the collection box under Postal Service control. The Postal Service must use PS Form 1590, *Supplies and Equipment Receipt*, signed by both parties, along with a signed license agreement acknowledging the Postal Service rights to monitor all collection box loans.

Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

U.S. Flag at Half-Staff


How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.

Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.



Note 2: On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.



How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.

When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.

Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.

For sturdiness, include a card of postcard thickness in each cover (envelopes only) submitted, and tuck in the flap. Place the cover in a larger envelope addressed to:

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or post-card bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail[®] postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+ $4^{\$}$ Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.







How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.



Stop Sending Copies of PS Form 8176, Premium Forwarding Service Application, to Headquarters

Offices are no longer required to send a copy of PS Form 8176, *Premium Forwarding Service* (*PFS*) *Application*, to Headquarters (HQ). This requirement ended in 2007 when the application was revised and page 4 (HQ copy) was removed. In 2005, the PFS program office at HQ required a copy of page 4 when PFS was an experiment. However, the experiment ended in 2007 when PFS became an official product offering. Offices that still send copies to

HQ are wasting workhours and money — especially some offices that send them by Express ${\rm Mail}^{\rm @},$ Registered ${\rm Mail}^{\rm @},$ and ${\rm Priority}$ ${\rm Mail}^{\rm @}$ service.

As the world celebrates 40 years of Earth Day, USPS[®] employees can take pride in more than 230 years of promoting a greener lifestyle. Throughout our history, we've championed new forms of transportation while keeping an eye on ways to minimize our environmental impact.

And with the largest fleet of civilian vehicles in the world — 217,000 — it's important to our business, our communities, and our customers that we do just that.

It helps that we have the largest fleet of alternative-fuel capable delivery vehicles in the world as well. More than 44,000 of our four-wheeled vehicles can run on electricity, compressed natural gas, biodiesel, or E-85.

And let's not forget our three-wheeled electric vehicles. T3s deliver mail in Texas, Florida, and California and cost only 2 cents a mile to operate.

Two wheels may seem old school to some, but they're helping the Postal Service™ stay on the leading edge of green delivery. With more than 70 bicycles routes in Florida and Arizona, it's estimated that USPS saves more than 15,000 gallons of gasoline each year and eliminates 50,000 pounds of carbon dioxide emissions annually through bicycle deliveries.

But the greenest of the green? Our more than 9,000 carrier routes that are delivered on foot. Our fleet of feet are among the smallest carbon footprints in their communities.

Of course, the Postal Service is doing more to lower its carbon footprint than just upgrading its fleet. In 2008, we began an aggressive campaign to lower petroleum-based fuel use 20 percent by 2015.

That's in line with the timeline established by President Obama's Executive Order 13514 for government agencies to reach that same reduction percentage. The Postal Service, as an independent federal agency, doesn't come under the recent Executive Order but is voluntarily participating anyway.

In 2009, USPS reduced its petroleum fuel use by 4.5 percent while adding nearly one million delivery points to its network and continuing its record-setting delivery performance. Early 2010 indicators suggest we'll remain on that trend.

Concern for the environment didn't begin with Earth Day — it led to Earth Day. There were always Americans who cared enough about the earth to want to preserve it for future generations. Many of them were — and still are — USPS employees!
