

Cover Story

Voice of the Employee — Your Opinion Matters

The Voice of the Employee (VOE) survey is a mechanism to measure employee engagement. Why measure employee engagement? Because engaged employees feel valued by the organization, have a sense of ownership, understand how they contribute to the organization's success, and share in improving the work environment.

Analyses of VOE survey data conducted over the past year have consistently shown significant relationships between employee engagement and the performance of the Postal Service[™]. Districts with higher VOE index scores tend to have better performance on several National Performance Assessment (NPA) indicators including Express Mail[®], First-Class[™] Overnight, First-Class 2-day, and First-Class 3–5 day service. More engaged districts also have lower rates of motor vehicle accidents, injuries, and illnesses.

The Fiscal Year 2011, Quarter 2 results for the VOE survey have been compiled. More than 79,000 employees — 56 percent of those surveyed — responded. Of those who responded to the survey, 65 percent replied favorably. The majority of our employees understand the Postal Service's strategic direction and how their work affects the organization's success. Seventy-five percent of employees say they are proud to work for the Postal Service. Seventy-nine percent believe that they have been properly trained to do their job, and 78 percent feel personally responsible for helping the Postal Service succeed.

ASM Revision: Identification of Excess Building Space

Effective immediately, (ASM) Administrative Support Manual 13, Chapter 517, Real Property Management, is revised to reflect organizational changes for identification of useable excess space in the building inventory. Sections 517.11 and 517.12 are revised as follows:

517.11 Inventory Review

[Revise text to read as follows:]

Identification and tracking of useable excess space in the USPS building inventory is the responsibility of the following organizations:

- Useable excess space in mail processing facilities will be identified by HQ Network Operations and the information provided to Facilities.
- Useable excess space in Customer Service facilities will be identified by the Facilities organization.

 The Facilities organization is responsible for tracking useable excess space in the USPS inventory. All building information including useable excess space will be tracked in the Facilities eFMS system.

517.12 Procedure for Disposal

517.121 Approval and Recommendation

[Revise text to read as follows:]

The Facilities Organization is responsible for coordinating with the local District and Area office for the disposal of excess property.

DMM Revision: New Customs Declarations Label Requirements

Effective June 6, 2011, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 608.2.4 to require mailpieces containing goods that enter the Customs Territory of the United States (CTUS), from outside the CTUS, to bear a customs declaration label. In addition, this standard would apply to items weighing 16 ounces or more when sent to, from, between, and, in some circumstances, within certain U.S. territories, possessions, and Freely Associated States.

On February 17, 2011, the Postal Service published a final rule *Federal Register* article (76 FR 9231–9233) to implement the specific requirements consistent with the *Code of Federal Regulations*, Title 19, Part 145 — U.S. Customs and Border Protection, Department of Homeland

Security, which requires that all mailpieces containing goods that enter the CTUS, from outside the CTUS, to bear a customs declaration label.

In addition, to ensure compliance with safety and security requirements of the United States Postal Inspection Service[®] and other federal agencies, we are updating our standards for items weighing 16 ounces or more (regardless of contents) when sent to, from, between, and, in some circumstances, within American Samoa, Guam, Palau, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, the Marshall Islands, and the U.S. Virgin Islands.

2.4 Customs Forms Required

[Revise the title and text of 2.4.1 as follows:]

2.4.1 Items Weighing 16 Ounces or More

Except for items sent via Express Mail, or Priority Mail combined with Registered Mail service, any mailpiece (regard-

less of contents) weighing 16 ounces or more must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976, *Customs Declaration CN 22*, or, if the customer prefers, a PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note — CP 72*, when the item is:

- a. Sent from the United States, Puerto Rico, or the U.S.
 Virgin Islands to the ZIP Code destinations listed in the table below.
- b. Sent from the ZIP Code destinations listed in the table below to the United States, Puerto Rico, or the U.S. Virgin Islands.
- c. Sent between two different destinations listed in the "Territory, Possession, or Freely Associated States" column in the table below.
- d. Sent within American Samoa, the Federated States of Micronesia, the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, or the Republic of the Marshall Islands. This standard does not apply to items sent within Guam or Palau.

2.4.2 Items Containing Goods

Regardless of mail class or weight, items containing goods (i.e., contents other than documents; see IMM 123.63 for "document" eligibility) must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976, *Customs Declaration CN 22*, or, if the customer prefers, a PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note — CP 72*, when the items are sent to the United States or Puerto Rico from the ZIP Code destinations listed in the table in 2.4.1, or from the U.S. Virgin Islands.

2.4.3 Improperly Prepared Items

Mailpieces deposited without a properly completed customs form under 2.4.1 and 2.4.2 will be returned to the sender.

2.4.4 Overseas Military Mail

For determining customs declarations' required usage when mailing to or from APO, FPO, or DPO addresses, see 703.2.3.6 through 703.2.3.8.

DMM Revision: Revised MLOCR Automation Price Marking Codes

Effective June 6, 2011, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 705.5.3.2a and 2b to provide an updated listing of multiline optical character reader (MLOCR) automation price marking codes. When price and postage markings are applied by an MLOCR, these 2-digit codes must be incorporated into the markings applied to each piece in a mailing in accordance with DMM 705.5.3.2.

The Postal Service is updating this list to provide new codes to differentiate between mailpieces entered at automation prices using a POSTNET™ barcode or the basic Intelligent Mail[®] barcode option (IMb™) from those entered under the full-service IMb automation option. The Postal Service is also eliminating other codes that are unnecessary under the current pricing structure.

These new changes will be reflected in the July 5, 2011, online DMM update, but mailers may begin preparing their mailings in accordance with these new standards immediately.

These revisions provide for consistent handling of unpaid and shortpaid items at USPS® facilities (including the International Service Centers). These revisions reflect updated procedures for the proper disposition of unpaid and shortpaid items for the following categories of mail: Express Mail International®, Priority Mail International®, First-Class Mail International®, and Airmail M-bags.

- b. Shortpaid more than \$3.50: Base the disposition on whether or not the item has a return address, as follows:
 - 1. With a return address: Return the item to the sender. Endorse the item with rubber stamp R-1300-230, Return For...Additional Postage.
 - 2. Without a return address: Forward the item to the Mail Recovery Center for proper disposition.

423.23 Priority Mail International Parcel Items (Other Than Priority Mail International Flat Rate Envelopes and Small Flat Rate Boxes)

423.231 Items Paid With a Permit Imprint or USPS-Produced PVI Label

Regardless of the amount of deficiency, consider as paid in full each shortpaid Priority Mail International parcel item that is paid with a permit imprint or USPS-produced postage validation imprinter (PVI) label, and dispatch it to the appropriate International Service Center (ISC).

423.232 Items Paid With Any Other Postage Payment Method

The disposition of a shortpaid Priority Mail International parcel item paid with a postage payment method other than a permit imprint or USPS-produced PVI label is based on the amount of the deficiency, as follows:

- a. Shortpaid \$3.50 or less: Consider the item paid and dispatch it to the country of destination.
- b. Shortpaid more than \$3.50: Base the disposition on whether or not the item has a return address, as follows:
 - 1. With a return address: Return the item to the sender. Endorse the item with rubber stamp R-1300-230, Return For...Additional Postage.
 - 2. Without a return address: Forward the item to the Mail Recovery Center for proper disposition.

423.24 First-Class Mail International Items (including Postcards), Airmail M-bags, Priority Mail International Flat Rate Envelopes, and Priority Mail International Small Flat Rate Priced Boxes

423.241 Items Paid With a Permit Imprint or USPS-Produced PVI Label

Regardless of the amount of deficiency, consider as paid in full each shortpaid First-Class Mail International item (including a postcard), Airmail M-bag, Priority Mail International Flat Rate Envelope, and Priority Mail International Small Flat Rate Priced Box that is paid with a permit imprint or USPS-produced postage validation imprinter (PVI) label, and dispatch it to the appropriate International Service Center (ISC).

423.242 Items Paid With Any Other Postage Payment Method

The disposition of a shortpaid First-Class Mail International item (including a postcard), Airmail M-bag, Priority Mail International Flat Rate Envelope, and Priority Mail International Small Flat Rate Priced Box that is paid with a postage payment method other than a permit imprint or USPS-produced PVI label is based on the amount of the deficiency, as follows:

- a. Shortpaid \$1.00 or less: Consider the item paid and dispatch it to the appropriate International Service Center (ISC). Endorse the item with a T-stamp in accordance with section 451.4 of Handbook T-5, *International Mail Operations*. If a T-stamp is not available, endorse the item with a *Postage Due* stamp and enter the amount of the deficiency on the mailpiece.
- b. Shortpaid more than \$1.00: Base the disposition on whether or not the item has a return address, as follows:
 - 1. With a return address: Return the item to the sender. Endorse the item with rubber stamp R-1300-230, Return For...Additional Postage.

2. Without a return address: Forward the item to the Mail Recovery Center for proper disposition.

Handbooks

Handbook F-101 Revision: Automated Postal Center

Effective April 7, 2011, with the release of R28 on Automated Postal Center[®] (APC[®]) systems, a system-generated PS Form 3293, *APC Credit Examination*, along with system-generated count sheets have replaced the requirement to use a manual hard copy PS Form 3294-APC Draft and PS Form 3294, *Cash and Stamp Stock Count and Summary*, to perform and document the APC credit examination. The system will automatically print PS Form 3293 with the electronic signatures of the supervisor and the servicing employee after both have accepted the results of the count.

The upgrade also includes the following changes to the credit examination process:

- The frequency for APC counts has been changed from once every 3 months to once a postal quarter (PQ). (PQ1: October 1 to December 31; PQ2: January 1 to March 31; PQ3: April 1 to June 30; PQ4: July 1 to September 30)
- Servicing employees must enter their login ID and password to start the credit exam and re-enter their password to accept the final results of the exam.
- A new reminder screen has been added to ensure that the semi-annual examination of PS Form 3977, Duplicate Key, Combination, and Password Envelope, and the annual examination of keys and locks are performed as required. APC units must continue to maintain the hard copy PS Form 3902, Form 3977 Log and Lock Examination, to document the key and lock examination.

Subchapters 5-5 and 13-1 of Handbook F-101 are updated to reflect the changes to the APC system. Additionally, subchapter 21-5 of Handbook F-101 is revised to clarify the process for APC exchanges and refunds. An exchange of stamps does not require PS Form 3533; the exchange must be entered into the POS system, which will record both the stamp item that was returned and the

equivalent item(s) that were provided to the customer. A refund should only be allowed for APC postage labels that were purchased for Express Mail[®] service and validated as service failure.

- c. Monitors expenses issued by Accounting Services via AIC 247/647. To view expenses, use the FPR Net Financial Differences (AIC 247/647) — Line Detail report in the ADM (Accounting>Shared Reports>SA-FR>Store Expense Reports.)
- d. Schedules appropriate SE coverage for servicing the kiosk.
- e. Provides back-up service support for the APC in the event the designated service employee is not available.
- f. Provides kiosk opening procedure support as needed.
- g. Updates changes to the site contact information.

- g. Give a copy of the PS Form 3533 to the APC servicing employee.

The APC servicing employee files the copy of PS Form 3533 in the APC refund document file.

 This folder allows managers to easily analyze APC exchange activity.
- (2) Keep this file folder separate from all other daily documents.

The policy for refunding postage labels purchased through an APC for a domestic Express Mail package is as follows:

- A customer must present an original Label 11-B or the receipt from the APC if no Label 11-B was used.
- c. The refund request must be made within 90 days after the date of mailing, as shown in the 'Date In' box on Label 11-B, or on the receipt from the APC if no Label 11-B was used.
- d. When the Postal Service can determine the mailer is entitled to a refund, USPS refunds the postage immediately in cash or with a no-fee money order.

To complete an Express Mail refund, the RA must do the following:

- a. Use an original Express Mail receipt to validate claim.
- b. When applicable, annotate on the Express Mail receipt: 'Refund given' and initial.
- c. Ensure PS Form 3533 is properly completed and includes all required signatures and dates.
- d. Report the refund in AIC 676, Express Mail Refunds.
- e. Give the customer cash or no-fee money order for the same total value.

- f. Make a copy of the PS Form 3533 and Express Mail receipt.
- g. Submit the original PS Form 3533, Label 11-B or Express Mail receipt, and proof of service failure as supporting documentation for PS Form 1412 accounting entries.
- h. Hand the copy of PS Form 3533 and all supporting documentation to an SE to file in the APC Refund Document folder.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

- Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
- 2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

- A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.
- **B.** Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration form is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise) addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. PS Form 2976 is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces, and PS Form 2976-A is required for items weighing 16 ounces or more. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). When the surface area of the address side of the mailpiece is not large enough to contain a PS Form 2976-A, the smaller PS Form 2976 may be substituted (e.g., the Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box). The following exceptions apply:
 - Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
 - All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
 - Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."
- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.
 - C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.
- **C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.
 - **D.** Coffee is prohibited.
 - E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.
- **E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.
- E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.1c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.
- **F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.
- **F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.
- **G.** Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.
- **H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.
 - **H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

- I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:
 - Maximum length 20 inches.
 - Maximum width 12 inches.
 - Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."
 - L. All official mail is prohibited.
 - M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.
 - N. Registered mail is prohibited.
- Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.
 - P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.
- **Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.
- **R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.11.7, are prohibited.
- R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.
- **S.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:
 - Maximum length 12 inches.
 - Maximum width 12 inches.
 - Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
 - Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

- **T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.
- **U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."
- **U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.
- $\mbox{\bf U2.}$ Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.
- **U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.
 - V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.
 - V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.
- **W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.
- **X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.
- **Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.
 - Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).
- **Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

U.S. Flag at Half-Staff


How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.

Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.



Note 2: On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.



How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.

When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.

Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.



If Postal Service employees are contacted by individuals or local agencies about displaying a sign or poster of a missing child in local Post Offices, the individual or agency should be politely informed that the U.S. Postal Service displays only those posters provided by NCMEC, because it has been designated by the U.S. Department of Justice to be the national clearinghouse and resource center for missing and exploited children. The individual or agency should then be referred to NCMEC at 800-843-5678.

Publication 75, Mover's Guide, News

Effective April 1, 2011, the cover of the Publication 75, *Mover's Guide*, envelope now includes color-coded up/down arrows along with the in-market dates to convey its effective quarter.

The corresponding color codes of the up/down arrows are as follows:

- 1. December (for January-March use): Black
- 2. March (for April-June use): Green
- 3. June (for July-September use): Purple
- 4. September (for October-December use): Orange

The April 2011 issue of *Mover's Guide*, has been shipped to all Post Office[™] facilities. As of April 1, 2011, recycle all expired versions.

Mover's Guide Information

- Offices will receive copies of Mover's Guide in one or two shipments. The first shipments arrived in mid-March. The second shipments will arrive 3 to 5 weeks later. Shipments are sent in quantities of 25, 100, and 300.
- Your facility may receive copies of Mover's Guide addressed to other offices. Check the labels and forward the guides as necessary. Remember to scan delivery confirmations affixed to each box.

Behind the Counter Program

Below are a few points about program compliance:

- Copies of Mover's Guide must be kept behind the counter. No copies of Mover's Guide should be placed in the inner or outer lobby or on the clerk counters. Postal carriers are encouraged to distribute Internet change-of-address (ICOA) Message Cards in lieu of copies of Mover's Guide on postal routes.
- Retail associates should encourage their customers requesting change-of-address information to go online at www.usps.com. ICOA transactions provide customers with the most convenient, safe, and secure way to change their address. Furthermore, ICOA transactions reduce processing time, improve address accuracy, and generate significant revenue for the Postal Service.
- Advise customers to take an ICOA Message Card to reinforce an online change-of-address message.

 Customers unwilling or unable to submit their change of address at www.usps.com should be given a complete, unopened copy of Mover's Guide.

Note: The Mover's Guide Behind the Counter Program is part of the ad-hoc section of the 2010 Retail Customer Experience Program, so it is critical that your Post Office be compliant with the program throughout the year by keeping copies of *Mover's Guide* out of Post Office lobbies.

ICOA Message Card Information

- If your Post Office has an ICOA Message Card display, do not throw it away. Expect to receive Message Card replenishment boxes labeled with red text with your shipments of Mover's Guide. Inside you will find more ICOA Message Cards and an updated banner for your display.
- If your Post Office does not have an ICOA Message Card display, you must call the replenishment phone number below for ICOA Message Card replenishment.
- If any Post Office runs out of ICOA Message Cards between shipments, call Imagitas at 800-816-6837 for replenishment.
- All Post Offices must have ICOA Message Cards in their lobbies for customer reference.

Global Express Guaranteed Service Restored for Japan

Effective May 2, 2011, the Postal Service $^{\text{TM}}$ will restore Global Express Guaranteed $^{\text{(GXG}^{\text{(B)})}}$ service to all destinations in Japan.

Postal Service employees should disregard the notice of the suspension of GXG service to certain destinations that was announced in the article titled "Update on Mail Service to Japan" published in *Postal Bulletin* 22307 (3-24-11, pages 71–73). However, even with this restored GXG service, mailers are still advised to expect delays for other classes of mail addressed to northern Japan, including Sapporo, Sendai, Hokkaido, Aomori, Akita, Iwate, Miyagi, Yamagata, Fukushima, and Ibaraki.

Stop Sending Copies of PS Form 8176, Premium Forwarding Service Application, to Headquarters

Offices are no longer required to send a copy of PS Form 8176, Premium Forwarding Service® (PFS®) Application, to Headquarters (HQ). This requirement ended in 2007 when the application was revised and page 4 (HQ copy) was removed. In 2005, the PFS program office at HQ required a copy of page 4 when PFS was an experiment.

However, the experiment ended in 2007 when PFS became an official product offering. Offices that still send copies to HQ are wasting workhours and money — especially some offices that send them by Express Mail[®], Registered Mail[®], and Priority Mail[®] service.

On May 20, 2011, in Indianapolis, Indiana, the Postal Service™ will issue an *Indianapolis 500* commemorative stamp (Forever® priced at 44 cents), in one design in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 467200). With this stamp, the U.S. Postal Service® commemorates the centennial of the Indianapolis 500 race. The *Indianapolis 500* stamp depicts Ray Harroun driving #32, the Marmom "Wasp," the customized yellow-and-black car in which Harroun won the first Indianapolis 500 in 1911. The stamp was designed by Art Director, Phil Jordan, Falls Church, Virginia, and features stylized artwork by San Francisco, California, illustrator, John Mattos. Mattos is known for his art deco posters and was the artist and designer of the 2009 *Seabiscuit* stamped envelope.

The stamp will go on sale nationwide May 20, 2011.

The Postal Service must make all special postmarks known to collectors through advance publicity in the *Postal Bulletin*. Therefore, all special dedication cancellations must be reported to Stamp Services 2 weeks before the events using PS Form 413, *Pictorial Postmark Announcement/Report*. Price Reduction on all Photostamps Kits

All prices for PhotoStamp Kits, either from the old Official Licensed Retail Products (OLRP) program or the new Featured Products program, will be reduced on April 29, 2011. Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.

All requests must include a stamped envelope or post-card bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail[®] postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.




