## Publicity Kit: The Holidays Made Simple



As “The Official Shipper” of the holidays, the United States Postal Service® plans to do what we do best — deliver joy! In fact, we will make it our priority. Between

Thanksgiving and Christmas, the Postal Service™ will deliver 16.5 billion cards, letters, and packages across the country and around the world.

This holiday season, the U.S. Postal Service® is encouraging customers to wrap up the holidays from home by going online to *USPS.com* to order Priority Mail Flat Rate Boxes, print shipping labels with postage using Click-N-Ship® service, and schedule free Package Pickup. Customers who skip the trip and take advantage of *USPS.com* this holiday will find all their shipping and mailing needs can be met right from the comfort of home.

Christmas Day falls on a Sunday this year, therefore we expect Monday, December 19 to be the heaviest day for delivery, while the busiest day for mailing cards and letters is expected to be December 20.

- **Peak Mailing Day:** Tuesday, December 20 will be the busiest *mailing* day, with an expected 589 million cards, letters, and packages being processed.
- **Peak Delivery Day:** Monday, December 19 will be the busiest *delivery* day.

To ensure delivery of holiday cards and packages by December 25 to military APO/FPO/DPO and international addresses overseas, we suggest that mail be entered by the recommended mailing dates listed below. Beat the last-minute rush and take your mail to your Post Office™ by these suggested dates. And don't forget you can print postage, labels, and customs forms online 24/7 using Click-N-Ship service at [www.usps.com/clicknship](http://www.usps.com/clicknship).

Remember, all mail addressed to military and diplomatic post offices overseas is subject to certain conditions or restrictions regarding content, preparation, and handling. APO/FPO addresses generally require customs forms. - PAL is a service that provides air transportation for parcels on a space-available basis. It is available for Parcel Post items not exceeding 30 pounds in weight or 60 inches in length and girth combined. The applicable PAL fee must be paid in addition to the regular surface rate of postage for each addressed piece sent by PAL service.
- SAM parcels are paid at Parcel Post postage rate of postage with maximum weight and size limits of 15 pounds and 60 inches in length and girth combined. SAM parcels are first transported domestically by surface and then to overseas destinations by air on a space-available basis.

- Priority Mail Flat Rate Boxes.** Take the guesswork out of shipping with Priority Mail flat-rate items. Whatever fits in the box or envelope ships for one low price anywhere in the United States. There's no weighing or calculating involved if the package weighs less than 70 pounds: The boxes are always free, can be ordered from *USPS.com* at [www.usps.com/shipping/prioritymail.htm](http://www.usps.com/shipping/prioritymail.htm), and will be delivered right to your door.
- Click-N-Ship.** Skip the trip to the Post Office by printing mailing labels with postage right from the convenience of your home or office. Customers get a discount on postage for domestic packages: Express Mail — 5 percent savings; Priority Mail — up to 14 percent savings: [www.usps.com/clicknship/](http://www.usps.com/clicknship/)
- Free Package Pickup.** The Postal Service will pick up packages from homes and offices across the country. The service is free, regardless of the number of packages being sent. Since Priority Mail service supplies are the packaging of choice for families preparing care packages for service members overseas, the Postal Service created a "Military Care Kit" based on the items most frequently requested by military families. The kit is free and each box is emblazoned

with “America Supports You”, sure to remind those away from home of a bit of home.

The kit contains:

- Two Priority Mail APO/FPO Flat Rate Boxes.
- Two Priority Mail Medium Flat Rate Boxes.
- Priority Mail tape.
- Priority Mail address labels.
- Appropriate customs forms.

### Greeting Cards Postmarked From the North Pole

It's easy for customers to have their greeting cards postmarked from the North Pole. Simply place postage stamps on personalized, sealed, and addressed greeting cards and place them into a larger envelope or box addressed to:

The envelope or box containing the greeting cards should be mailed to Anchorage no later than December 10, 2011.

### Letters to Santa/Operation Santa

The Postal Service began receiving letters to Santa Claus more than 100 years ago. However, it was in 1912 that Postmaster General Frank Hitchcock authorized local postmasters to allow postal employees and citizens to respond to the letters in the program that became known as Operation Santa.

In the 1940s, mail volume for Santa increased so much the Postal Service invited charitable organizations and corporations to participate to provide written responses to the letters and small gifts to the children who wrote them.

Over the past 60 years, the program has continued to grow. Cities around the country today have successful programs working with recognized charitable organizations, major corporations, local businesses, and postal employees to help make a difference in the lives of children from coast to coast.

#### *What We Do*

In 2006, national policy guidelines were created regarding the handling and adoption of letters addressed to Santa. These guidelines were designed to protect the children who wrote to Santa, and mandated that individuals wishing to adopt letters must do so in person, present valid photo identification, and fill out a form that includes the list of letters being adopted.

New York City's “Operation Santa” program is the largest in the country. This program is traditionally kicked off the first week of December, and tens of thousands of peo-

ple come in person to adopt letters. More than 500,000 letters are received in this location alone.

The changes to this program were designed to protect the identity of the children.

### Employee Tipping/Gift Receiving Policy

All postal employees, including carriers, must comply with the Standards of Ethical Conduct for Employees of the Executive Branch. Under these federal regulations, carriers are permitted to accept a gift worth \$20 or less from a customer per occasion, such as Christmas. However, cash and cash equivalents, such as checks or gift cards that can be exchanged for cash, must never be accepted in any amount. Furthermore, no employee may accept more than \$50 worth of gifts from any one customer in any one calendar year.

### Suggestions for Promotional Activities

- Host a holiday promotional event in the lobby of the main Post Office or other postal facility to demonstrate packing tips and how much can fit into a Priority Mail Flat Rate Box. Set up a display of shipping products, including Priority Mail Flat Rate Boxes, holiday stamps, and gift items for sale in Retail.
- Host a free “How to Get the Most Out of the Mail” event and walk customers through some mailing and shipping best practices, including using flat-rate products. Employees can show customers the new *Holiday Bubbles* Forever stamps and the other holidays stamps available to celebrate the season. Demonstrate how to send military mail and promote Express Mail service for last-minute gifts. Participants could receive free information and gift bags, which could include news releases relative to postal flat-rate shipping products, holiday mailing tips, international products, holiday fact sheets, 2011 Postal Facts, and perhaps a sample greeting card signed by the local postmaster. This event could be promoted by local communications representatives, and local media could be invited to cover the event.
- Santa, Mrs. Claus, and a team of postal elves can host a lobby event and give information on holiday mailing deadlines and packaging tips, show customers how to use the Self-Service Ship and Mail Center for their holiday mailings, and if an Internet connection and computer are available, show customers how to wrap up the holidays from home by creating shipping labels with postage using Click-N-Ship service on *USPS.com*.
- Pitch a story on “the great package race.” Have a reporter fit as much as he or she can into two Priority Mail Flat Rate Boxes and address both boxes to the same address. Have the reporter mail one package

at a Post Office and the other using the convenience of Click-N-Ship service and free Package Pickup on *USPS.com*. Point out to the reporter how much was saved by going online. The reporter can then report on when the packages arrived in a later news segment for additional coverage.

- Order Military Care Kits to use as display samples for lobby demonstrations. Demonstrate how many holiday gifts can fit in a Priority Mail Flat Rate Box. Promote “If it fits, it ships,” the “Care Kits,” and “\$2 military discount.”
- Postmasters can send letters promoting \$2 military discount for Priority Mail Flat Rate Boxes being sent to APO/FPO addresses, Military Care Kits, and military shipping dates to editors of military association newsletters/officials at local military bases, media (focus on consumer reporters), veterans associations, United Services Organization, American Legion, Disabled American Veterans, Veterans of Foreign Wars, U.S. Navy League, Marine Corps League, U.S. Marines, U.S. Army, U.S. Air Force, U.S. Navy, National Guard, U.S. Coast Guard, local military installations/bases, Federal Executive Boards, etc.
- Wherever possible, have reporters interview APO/FPO military personnel who can share how important it is to receive mail when stationed overseas and

away from home, particularly during the holiday season. Create a “goody box” of promotional materials in a Priority Mail Flat Rate Box to give to each reporter. The box could include all news releases relative to shipping military mail, holiday mailing tips, international products, holiday fact sheets, 2011 Postal Facts, and a holiday card addressed to the media thanking them for all the positive coverage throughout the year. Corporate Communications can help supply the informational materials.

- Contact elementary/junior high students, high school ROTC, Girl Scouts/Boy Scouts, and other community groups to create cards and letters to ship to service men and women overseas. Create a media event, and have students or other participants stuff all items into individual Priority Mail Flat Rate Boxes in the lobby and ship as a group at the retail counter.
- Stack Priority Mail Flat Rate Boxes into the shape of a holiday tree or on a table in the lobby for a photo opportunity. If possible, have several students carry the boxes to a designated sales and service associate (SSA) for mailing. Invite representatives from local veterans associations, and ask them to talk about the importance of receiving mail when stationed overseas during the holidays.



## Postal Service Holiday Stamp Program

The United States Post Office Department issued its first Christmas stamp in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, on November 1, 1962. Customers had requested such a stamp for years, Postmaster General J. Edward Day said during the stamp dedication ceremony, adding that the stamp would be the first in a series of Christmas stamps.

Anticipating a huge demand for the new Christmas stamp, the Department ordered 350 million printed — the largest number produced for a special stamp until that time. The green and red 4-cent stamps featured a wreath, two candles, and the words “Christmas 1962.” The initial supply sold out quickly, and the Bureau of Engraving and Printing began working around the clock to print more. By the end of 1962, 1 billion of the stamps had been printed and distributed.

The decision to print a Christmas stamp encountered some controversy, especially from groups concerned about maintaining the separation of church and state. Legal actions to bar the stamps were not successful.

The Postal Service recognized additional holidays when it issued the *Hanukkah* stamp in 1996, followed in 1997 by the *Kwanzaa* stamp, and in 2001 by the *Eid* stamp.

Each year, the Postal Service receives thousands of suggestions for new postage stamps. The Citizens’ Stamp Advisory Committee was established in 1957 to review the suggestions and recommend new stamp designs to the postmaster general. In choosing new stamp subjects, the Committee established specific criteria, such as national appeal and historical perspective. The ultimate goal is to create an annual stamp program that reflects America — from the events and people that bind the nation together to the diversity of cultures that forms its foundation.

The Postal Service is proud of a stamp program that celebrates the rich diversity of American culture, and we recognize that some individuals may disagree with our selections on occasion. A wide variety of stamps are available so that postal customers always have options.

Each year the Postal Service issues a Holiday Contemporary and Holiday Traditional postage stamp. This year, the Holiday Contemporary is the *Holiday Baubles* Forever stamp and the Holiday Traditional is the *Madonna and Child* Forever stamp.

In 1996, the Postal Service paid tribute to Hanukkah, the Jewish Festival of Lights, by issuing the first *Hanukkah* stamp, which featured a stylized illustration of a menorah. A design featuring an ornate dreidel followed in 2004.

In 1997, the Postal Service paid tribute to Kwanzaa, the celebration of family, community, and culture, by issuing the first *Kwanzaa* stamp, which featured a colorful portrait of an African-American family, a “symbol of family and togetherness.” A design featuring seven figures in colorful robes followed in 2004.

In 2001, the Postal Service paid tribute to Eid, by issuing the *Eid* stamp, which features the phrase “Eid Mubarak” — meaning “blessed festival” — in gold Arabic script on a blue background. The stamp commemorates the two most important festivals on the Islamic calendar: Eid al-Fitr and Eid al-Adha. The stamp has been reissued in the original design to reflect current stamp prices.



## 2011 Holiday Numbers Fact Sheet

Q: When will be the “busiest mail day”?

A: December 20 (letters and cards).

Q: What is the “busiest holiday package delivery day”?

A: December 19.

- The Postal Service will deliver 16.5 billion cards, letters, and packages during the holidays, from Thanksgiving to New Year’s Eve.
- On average, the Postal Service processes 551 million pieces of mail every day.
- During the holidays, that volume will increase to 589 million pieces of mail.

### Holidays by the Numbers

- 16.5 billion — Number of cards, letters, and packages projected to be delivered during the holidays.
- 551 million — Average number of pieces of mail projected to be processed daily.
- 589 million — Average number of pieces of mail projected to be processed daily during the holidays.
- 30 million — In pounds, the amount of mail the Postal Service will process for overseas military installations, including Afghanistan and Iraq.
- 155,000 — Number of vehicles used to transport holiday mail, includes half-ton trucks.



### Frequently Asked Questions

*Q. Why was the website redesigned?*

A. The website was redesigned in July to help customers do business with us more easily. There is a transactional site — *USPS.com*, and a Corporate site — *About.usps.com* — where customers can easily find information about the Postal Service. The redesign also included improved navigation that helps customers take action — whether they want to ship, send mail, manage their mail, or shop. “Quick Tools” appear on every page of the transactional site to keep the most popular functions on *USPS.com* at customers’ fingertips. There’s also an updated look and feel and a streamlined account signup.

*Q. What are “Quick Tools?”*

A. “Quick Tools” are the most frequently used applications on *USPS.com*, which allow you to perform specific tasks such as Track and Confirm, Find a Post Office, Calculate a Price, and Look Up ZIP Code.

### Multilingual Option

*Q. What additional languages are offered on USPS.com?*

A. *USPS.com* now has an option to view pages in Spanish and Simplified Chinese. More languages will be offered in the future.

*Q. How do I select a language?*

A. To select a language, hover over the drop-down language selection in the grey header in the top far left of the page. Each time you visit *USPS.com*, the drop-down selection in the header will default to “English”. Select your preferred language to see the page displayed in that language. You can change your language for that page and USPS browsing session by performing the same action.

*Q. What pages of the USPS.com website are available to be viewed in Spanish and Chinese?*

A. All Product/Service description pages as well as all FAQs, many advertisements, and applications like Look Up a ZIP Code and Track and Confirm are available in Spanish and Chinese. Other applications and content will be translated in future releases.

### Enhanced “My Account”?

*Q. What is the enhanced “My Account”?*

A. *USPS.com* is using a new eCommerce platform that will improve the customer’s online experience. It provides customers the ability to view their global activity history.

### Hold Mail Redesign

*Q. Were there any changes made to the Hold Mail application?*

A. The main change to Hold Mail is the ability for customers to submit their request up to 30 days prior to the “start” date instead of the current 14 days. Also, the Hold Mail application will be integrated with Address Book and Activity History making the process easier to complete through pre-population of fields.

### Redelivery Application Redesign

*Q. What is new for Redelivery?*

A. The Redelivery application was redesigned and is integrated with Customer Registration, Activity History, and the Product Tracking System to simplify the request process for customers by pre-populating fields.

### Carrier Pickup Application Redesign

*Q. What changes were made to Carrier Pickup?*

A. The Carrier Pickup application was redesigned and is now integrated with Address Book and Activity History. This will simplify the process for customers by pre-population of fields.

### PO Locator Redesign

*Q. What changed about the PO Locator?*

A. The application is now in-house instead of being offered by a third-party. Also, PO Locator offers search capability to numerous location types and to more services.

### New Premium Forwarding Service (Coming Soon)

*Q. What is Premium Forwarding Service?*

A. Premium Forwarding Service is a service where customers request their local Post Office collect their mail and reship it to another location once a week using the convenience of Priority Mail.

*Q. Will customers be able to enroll online for Premium Forwarding Service?*

- A. Yes. Customers will soon be able to complete Premium Forwarding Service enrollment online — without going to the Post Office. Customers will also be able to modify or cancel their request from their desktop.

*The Postal Store/Personalized Stamped Envelopes Redesign (Coming Soon)*

*Q. What is changing about The Postal Store?*

- A. The Postal Store will be redesigned with a new “look and feel” to improve the customer experience. The new store will offer the ability for cross-selling and upselling and will lay the groundwork for future enhancements.

*Q. What are the planned changes for Personalized Stamped Envelopes?*

# Policies, Procedures, and Forms Updates

## Manuals

### DMM Revision: Intelligent Mail Package Barcode Implementation for Commercial Parcels

Effective January 22, 2012, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) throughout various sections to provide new standards for the use of Intelligent Mail® package barcodes (IMpb). Once all of these standards are fully implemented, tracking data, which includes acceptance, enroute, and delivery status data, will be available to commercial mailers who use extra services on their packages.

The Postal Service first provided notice of these new standards via an advance notice of proposed rulemaking in the *Federal Register* (75 FR 56922–56923) on September 17, 2010. IMpb optional-use standards were announced in the article “DMM Revision: Optional Use of the Intelligent Mail Package Barcode” in *Postal Bulletin* 22297 (11-4-10, pages 4–10) and incorporated into the DMM on November 1, 2010. The Postal Service published a proposed rule in the *Federal Register* (75 FR 23749–23755) on April 28, 2011, and the final rule in *Federal Register* (76 FR 59504–59512) on September 27, 2011.

Mailers using IMpb will receive piece-level visibility throughout USPS® processing and delivery operations. New IMpb enhancements include:

- Incorporation of a routing code to facilitate the processing of packages on automated sorting equipment.
- Use of a channel-specific Application Identifier (AI) that associates the barcode to the payment method, supporting revenue assurance.
- A 3-digit service type code, which will identify the mail class and extra service combination and eliminate the need for multiple barcodes on a package.
- The use of either a 6-digit or 9-digit numeric Mailer ID (MID) to accommodate all mailers.
- Inclusion of specific “mail class only” service type codes that may be used for packages without extra services.

To promote the use of IMpb or other unique tracking barcodes, effective January 22, 2012, the Postal Service will provide end-to-end tracking, including confirmation of delivery, at no additional charge, on all commercial parcels (except Standard Mail® and Package Services parcels). Merchandise Return Service (MRS) parcels and Business Reply Mail® (BRM) parcels may also qualify for end-to-end tracking, including confirmation of delivery, at no extra charge.

Also effective January 22, 2012, the Postal Service will require the use of a unique tracking barcode on all commercial parcels, except Standard Mail parcels, claiming presort or destination entry pricing; and will require all parcels

shipped using PC Postage® systems to bear an IMpb and to use version 1.6 of the electronic shipping services manifest files. The PC Postage requirement does not extend to users of PC Postage stamp products. The Postal Service considers these postage imprints to be in the same category as the imprints generated by postage meter systems.

To allow commercial parcel and PC Postage mailers sufficient time to effect the necessary changes to their software and systems, the Postal Service will provide a transitional period, until July 2, 2012, during which the failure to comply with these new standards will not be penalized.

On January 7, 2013, the Postal Service finalizes the implementation by requiring an IMpb for all commercial mailpieces that include a tracking or extra services barcode and on all parcels (except Standard Mail parcels) claiming presort or destination entry pricing. The January 7, 2013, date also applies to all domestic Express Mail® pieces, except those paying postage through an Express Mail corporate account (EMCA). In addition, the Postal Service will require the use of version 1.6 electronic shipping services manifest files and require that these files include each destination ZIP + 4® code, or each destination delivery address by January 7, 2013. This new file format will also require a new version of the customer extract file.

The Postal Service recognizes that some mailers may have difficulty preparing their systems and processes in time to meet January 22, 2012, implementation (required after July 2, 2012), and further recognizes that some mailers may be unable to meet the January 7, 2013, deadline for use of IMpb and the version 1.6 electronic manifest file. Therefore the Postal Service will provide limited exceptions for those mailers who may require additional time to finalize their transition to the use of unique tracking barcodes or IMpb. Mailers requiring an exception may direct their request to vice president, Product Information, USPS Headquarters, Room 3667, 475 L’Enfant Plaza SW, Washington, DC 20260-5626.

The Postal Service will provide no charge end-to-end tracking, including confirmation of delivery, for all Parcel Select mailpieces (including the Parcel Select barcoded nonpresort category). Since all nondestination entry and nonpresorted Parcel Select mailpieces are currently required to bear barcodes, this Parcel Select category will also be required to bear a unique tracking barcode no later than July 2, 2012, and will be required to bear an IMpb and to use version 1.6 of the electronic shipping services manifest files no later than January 7, 2013.

To support future sorting efficiencies, USPS strongly encourages mailers to place a ZIP+4 code or destination address in the electronic files for each mailpiece as soon as possible. Mailers using the IMpb are also encouraged to include the additional two-digit delivery point code in the electronic file.

These new standards also require a postal routing code on all parcels and all Express Mail pieces (except for EMCA mailers), preferably as a concatenated IMpb or extra services barcode. When a concatenated IMpb or extra services barcode is not used, a separate postal routing barcode must be included in addition to the IMpb. Flat-shaped or letter-shaped Priority Mail<sup>®</sup> or Critical Mail<sup>™</sup> pieces may use an Intelligent Mail barcode (IMb<sup>™</sup>) or POSTNET<sup>™</sup> code for the postal routing barcode. Otherwise, an IMb will not be permitted in lieu of the IMpb.

Mailers of commercial parcels, who claim presort or destination entry pricing, but who do not purchase a trackable extra service, or make use of the no-fee end-to-end tracking, must use a “mail-class only” IMpb service type code that represents the class or subclass of the mailpiece that is being shipped.

Beginning January 22, 2012, the Postal Service requires the use of new generic human-readable service banner text formats when printing an IMpb. Current standards require a different human-readable service banner text for each extra service selected by the mailer. The Postal Service will provide two generic text options for service banners, when used with an IMpb, for most of the extra services selected. Mailers must use a “USPS TRACKING #” human-readable service banner text above the barcode on packages not requiring a signature at delivery, and a “USPS SIGNATURE TRACKING #” service banner text above the barcode on packages where a signature is required at delivery. These new service banner texts will not be used with Certified Mail<sup>®</sup>, Registered Mail<sup>™</sup>, Adult Signature service, Parcel Return Service, or Express Mail or Priority Mail Open and Distribute services. With these exceptions, mailers may also optionally use the new service banner texts in conjunction with all current USPS-approved extra services barcodes. These new texts will simplify IMpb use for mailers and will more accurately describe future processing and tracking capabilities inherent to the IMpb.

The Postal Service is also providing an exception process, for mailers of small First-Class Mail<sup>®</sup> and Standard Mail parcels lacking sufficient label space to apply an IMpb or extra services barcode meeting the 3/4-inch height requirement, to submit barcodes of at least 1/2 inch in height for USPS testing and approval. These exceptions will be administered by the National Customer Service Center (NCSC), as part of the normal barcode approval process.

## Descriptions of IMpb and Electronic Documentation

For the purposes of these standards, the term “commercially shipped package” is generally used to describe all domestic mailpieces meeting parcel characteristics, all Express Mail and Priority Mail mailpieces, regardless of shape, including commercially shipped flat-rate items. It does not include EMCA pieces, Critical Mail pieces, some Priority Mail flat-size pieces prepared by high-volume mailers, or Package Service parcels mailed at USPS retail counters. The term “commercially shipped package” will also encompass Parcel Post<sup>®</sup> pieces, within the Package Services category, bearing a permit imprint.

Piece-level information will allow the Postal Service to improve its competitiveness within the commercial package shipping industry and to create a more comprehensive service performance measurement tool. Barcodes are not currently required on commercially shipped packages, except those entered under an Electronic Verification System (eVS<sup>®</sup>); and many barcodes now being used are unable to incorporate the data necessary to meet the future needs of the Postal Service. At present, commercially shipped packages can bear barcodes that are designed to provide delivery status information only, and do not always include a routing code (a barcode that represents the destination ZIP Code<sup>™</sup>). These barcodes allow limited integration of multiple extra services and have limited revenue protection capabilities, due to the absence of information associating the piece with its specific payment method.

The IMpb provides unique piece-level data to enable the Postal Service to increase efficiency, enhance package visibility and tracking capabilities, and provide a means to measure service performance. The IMpb is a width-modulated barcode containing up to 34 digits, which generally follows the specifications of the GS1-128 symbology. GS1-128 barcodes are a special type of Code 128 barcodes that make use of Application Identifiers (AIs) to define the encoded data and their use. The IMpb leverages features of the GS1-128 symbology to allow for the unique identification and tracking of domestic packages from induction to delivery. The GS1-128 barcode symbology is already a requirement for users of electronic confirmation services and eVS. Customers participating in these programs will not need to change the symbology of the barcode; however the elements within the barcode and layout will change.

There are several IMpb barcode variations for commercial and retail use that provide sufficient flexibility to accommodate the diverse mailing needs of customers. To improve routing, tracking, and service capabilities, mailers will be required to include the correct 5-digit routing code in the barcode on each commercially shipped package, either incorporated into a single concatenated barcode or as a separate postal routing barcode. The Postal Service will also require mailers to transmit the ZIP + 4 code information to USPS via an electronic file. As an alternative,

mailers may include the destination address in the electronic file instead of the ZIP + 4 code.

Mailers who generate their own barcoded labels will benefit from the enhancements to the electronic files, allowing the support of the additional features incorporated into the IMpb. The new version 1.6 electronic file format includes expanded package identification code fields to accommodate up to a 34-digit barcode string, and requires fewer file types to support various combinations of products and services. With the full implementation of these standards, mailers will be required to include the destination ZIP + 4 code (or destination address) in the electronic file for all records. This additional ZIP Code information will assist in the routing and tracking of our package products. An optional field for the delivery point code of the destination address has been added to the electronic file to provide additional information to improve service. A listing of electronic file formats is located in Publication 91 *Addendum for Intelligent Mail™ Package Barcode (IMpb) and 3-digit Service Type Code* available on the RIBBS® website at [https://ribbs.usps.gov/intelligentmail\\_package/documents/tech\\_guides/pub91.pdf](https://ribbs.usps.gov/intelligentmail_package/documents/tech_guides/pub91.pdf). File formats are also provided in the newly released Publication 199, *Implementation Guide to Intelligent Mail Package Barcode (IMpb) for Confirmation Services and Electronic Verification System (eVS) Mailers*. Publication 199 is also available on the RIBBS website, and includes all information in the Publication 91 Addendum, but is more comprehensive. The Postal Service currently provides IMpb technical specifications in both publications, but expects to eliminate the Publication 91 Addendum at some point in the near future.

The data construct of the IMpb barcode differs from that of the current Confirmation Services barcode. The IMpb uses unique 3-digit service type codes to identify the exact product and extra services combinations, eliminating the need for separate barcodes and enabling more efficient package handling and delivery. Detailed specifications for IMpb barcodes are available in the “Barcode Data” section of the specification document, *Barcode, Package, Intelligent Mail (USPS2000508)* on RIBBS. A list of the 3-digit service type codes is available in Publication 199 and the addendum to Publication 91. Technical specifications may be modified using an alternative approval process authorized by the vice president, Product Information.

Mailers using IMpb can optionally increase package visibility by associating each package with the appropriate sack, or an approved equivalent container, which bears an accurately encoded Intelligent Mail tray label. Each sack or approved alternate container may then be electronically associated to a pallet (or equivalent container) that bears an accurately encoded Intelligent Mail container placard.

The Postal Service also plans to assist MRS and BRM parcel mailers in developing processes capable of generat-

ing unique tracking barcodes for their labels, and to replace the nonbarcoded labels many currently use. The use of unique tracking barcodes will be optional for these mailers, but, when used, these mailpieces will qualify for end-to-end tracking, including confirmation of delivery, at no additional charge.

The Postal Service has proposed creating two products from its existing Standard Mail parcels/Not Flat-Machinable (NFM) product. The two products proposed would be Standard Mail fulfillment parcels and Standard Mail marketing parcels. The Postal Service has also proposed to transfer all of its Standard Mail fulfillment parcels (except nonprofit) to its competitive product line, where they would become a subcategory of the Parcel Select product. The Postal Service has obtained approval for this transfer, conditional on the January 22, 2012, price change. Those parcels transferring to the Parcel Select product line will become eligible for end-to-end tracking, including confirmation of delivery, at no cost, would be required to bear a unique tracking barcode no later than July 2, 2012, and would be required to bear an IMpb and to use version 1.6 of the electronic shipping services manifest files no later than January 7, 2013.

which must be recycled. Acceptance clerks must not accept Express Mail® shipments bearing an invalid EMCA number in the “Payment by Account” or “Agreement Number” section of the Express Mail label or form.

**Note:** The first 6 digits of a 9-digit Custom Designed Service and Next Day Pickup Agreement make up the Corporate Account Number.

## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
  - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
  - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
  - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at [www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm](http://www.usps.com/missingmoneyorders/security.htm).

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Acceptance clerks should use the table with the integrated retail terminal (IRT) or POS ONE terminal to determine which APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Codes are active and

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

**A.** Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

**A1.** Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

**B.** Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration form is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise) addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. PS Form 2976 is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces, and PS Form 2976-A is required for items weighing 16 ounces or more. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). When the surface area of the address side of the mailpiece is not large enough to contain a PS Form 2976-A, the smaller PS Form 2976 may be substituted (e.g., the Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box). The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

**B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

**C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

**C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

**D.** Coffee is prohibited.

**E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

**E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

**E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

**F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.1c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

**F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

**F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

**G.** Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

**H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

**H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

**I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

**I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

**I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

**J.** Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

**K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

**L.** All official mail is prohibited.

**M.** Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

**N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

**O.** Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

**P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

**Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

**R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.11.7, are prohibited.

**R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

**S.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

**T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

**U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

**U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

**U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

**U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

**V.** Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

**V1.** Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

**W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

**X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

**Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

**Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

**Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

# Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

## U.S. Flag at Half-Staff

### How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.

### Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.



*Note 1:* When May 15, which is the date for Peace Officers Memorial Day, falls on the third Saturday in May, which is the date for Armed Forces Day, display the U.S. flag in the full-staff position, *not* at half-staff.

*Note 2:* On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.

## POW-MIA Flag

### How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.

When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.

### Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. ## Finance

### IRS Reporting Requirements of Attorney Fees, Back Pay, or Wages

The purpose of this notice is to ensure that employees are aware of the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) income reporting requirements when attorney fees are awarded.

In 2005, the IRS issued regulations that changed the manner in which attorney fee awards are to be treated for tax reporting purposes, based upon the Supreme Court’s decision in *Commissioner v. Banks*, 125 S. Ct. 826 (2005). Previously, when payment of attorney fees was made directly to the attorney, only the payment to the attorney was reported to the IRS on Form 1099-MISC, *Miscellaneous Income*. In *Commissioner v. Banks*, the Supreme Court concluded that attorney fees awarded as part of a plaintiff’s settlement are gross income to the plaintiff just like any other economic gain. Thus, pursuant to Internal Revenue Code Section 6041(a) and 6045(f), these fees cannot be excluded from the plaintiff’s gross income for tax purposes by assigning the gain in advance to another party, such as the plaintiff’s attorney.

Following are a number of different situations requiring variations in the reporting requirements:

#### Separate Attorney Fees

Accounting Services will report any payment of attorney fees as income to the employee on the employee’s Form 1099-MISC. Further, Accounting Services also will report any payment of attorney fees made directly to an attorney on the attorney’s Form 1099-MISC.

#### Back Pay or Wages

Where the payment to the employee constitutes back pay or wages, the entire amount (including any amount that the employee may subsequently pay to his or her attorney from the back pay or wages) will be reported on the employee’s Form W-2 (and will be subject to employment tax withholding). Where the employee alone is to receive a check from the Postal Service™ (and the employee is required to pay his or her attorney from that amount), Accounting Services will not issue a Form 1099-MISC to the employee’s attorney.

#### Payment Jointly to Employee and Attorney

If the payment is issued to both the employee and the attorney, then Accounting Services must report the entire amount of the payment (assuming that the payment is not for back pay or wages due the employee) on Form 1099-MISC for the employee. In addition, Accounting Services will report the entire amount of the payment (less any withholding) to the attorney on Form 1099-MISC.

*The Postal Service makes no representation regarding the taxability of these payments. Potential tax liability resulting from any of these payments is the employee’s responsibility. The IRS makes the determination on whether taxes must be paid. The Postal Service does not provide tax advice, and any tax reporting questions should be directed to the IRS, or a qualified tax attorney or accountant.*

## Federal Taxation Percentages for Supplemental Wages

USPS® employees are reminded that the percentages used to tax supplemental wages are different from the normal taxation percentages. Supplemental wages may include, but are not limited to, annual leave exchange, awards, back-pay awards, prizes, severance pay, and reimbursements for moving expenses. The American Jobs Creation Act of 2004 and Section 31.3402(g)-1 of IRS regulations created a two-tiered taxation rate for supplemental wages, effective January 1, 2005. These regulations apply to all supplemental payments received by USPS employees in the United States, as well as the U.S. territories.

These regulations provide for taxation of supplemental wages up to a total of 1 million dollars within a calendar year at a *mandatory* withholding rate of 25 percent. They also provide for a *mandatory* withholding rate of 35 percent for any supplemental wages paid in excess of 1 million dollars within a calendar year. These rates will remain in effect until taxation percentages are changed by Congress and the IRS.

## Salary Overpayment Indebtedness — Year End Tax Treatment

When a postal employee is overpaid, USPS® establishes an account receivable for the overpayment and initiates the collection of the debt from the employee through the process described in either ELM 450, *Collection of Postal Debts from Nonbargaining Unit Employees*, or ELM 460, *Collection of Postal Debts from Bargaining Unit Employees*. USPS initially bills the employee for the net value of the overpayment, meaning federal, state, and FICA/Medicare taxes are not part of the bill.

However, IRS regulations require that if an employee has not fully repaid the overpayment by the end of the tax year (December 31) in which the overpayment was made, the employer must report the unreturned value of the over-

payment as taxable income on the employee's W-2. Additionally, the employee and employer must pay appropriate federal, state, and FICA/Medicare taxes on the remaining value of the debt.

To administrate this IRS regulation, USPS establishes an additional account receivable at the close of the tax year for the value of the taxes the employee owes related to the unpaid debt. The debt collection processes in ELM 450 and ELM 460 are utilized to collect the additional tax-related debt.

## 2012 Social Security and Medicare Tax Withholding Limits

For 2012, the maximum limit on earnings for withholding of Social Security (Old-Age, Survivors and Disability Insurance) Tax is \$110,100.00. The maximum limit is changed from last year. The Social Security Tax Rate is 6.2 percent. The tax rate is also changed from last year. The resulting maximum Social Security Tax for 2012 is \$6,826.20.

There is still no limit on the amount of earnings subject to Medicare (Hospital Insurance) Tax. The Medicare Tax Rate applies to all taxable wages and remains at 1.45 percent. The FICA Tax Rate, which is the combined Social Security rate of 6.2 percent and the Medicare rate of 1.45 percent, increases to 7.65 percent for 2012.

The information in the following table shows the changes in Social Security and Medicare withholding limits from 2011 to 2012. The new limits are effective January 1, 2012.

### Stop Sending Copies of PS Form 8176, Premium Forwarding Service Application, to Headquarters

Offices are no longer required to send a copy of PS Form 8176, *Premium Forwarding Service*® (PFS®) Application, to Headquarters (HQ). In 2005, the application was a four-part form and “Distribution: Copy 3 — HQ” was sent to Headquarters. The form has been revised multiple times and “Distribution: Copy 3 — HQ” has not been a part of the application for several years, but we continue to get copies of the application. Many offices continue to use the 2005 or 2006 edition of the form, and others are making copies of “Distribution: Copy 1 — Post Office” and sending it to HQ.

**Please use the most current, January 2011, edition of the form.** It has a new format and the Terms and Conditions have been updated. You can order the current edition of the form from the Material Distribution Center and use touch-tone order entry (TTOE). Call 800-273-1509.

**Note:** You must be registered to use TTOE. To register, call 800-332-0317, option 1, extension 2925, and follow the

prompts to leave a message. (Wait 48 hours after registering before placing your first order.)

### Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears here. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

## How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at [www.usps.com/shop](http://www.usps.com/shop).

### Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

### Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.


