Publicity Kit: Celebrate Scouting Stamp



The Girl Scouts of the USA celebrated its 100th anniversary February 8, 2012, and the Postal Service™ will celebrate this milestone by issuing the *Celebrate Scouting* 45-cent First-Class Mail® Forever® stamp Saturday, June 9. The first-day-of-issue dedication ceremony takes place during the Girl Scouts Rock the Mall event in Washington, DC.

Postmasters are encouraged to coordinate with local Girl Scout troops and elected officials that day to conduct first-day-of-sale ceremonies. If that's not convenient, special dedication ceremonies can take place anytime after

that. (The term "second-day-of-issue dedication ceremony" is no longer used.)

Included in this kit are the following elements that can be used to conduct and promote an event:

- Background information on scouting.
- Sample media advisory (for distribution no later than 3 days prior).
- Sample news release.
- Sample stamp dedication speech.
- Information on ordering stamp images.
- Government Relations contacts for assistance in contacting elected officials.
- Corporate Communications managers for assistance with event publicity.

DMM Revision: Post Office Box Fee Refunds

Effective June 24, 2012, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 508.4 to incorporate reference to the Post Office Box™ fee refund policy for 3-month service periods.

On January, 22, 2012, the Postal Service expanded Post Office Box offerings to allow a 3-month service period for customers using the automatic renewal option. Previously, the refund policy for customers wishing to discontinue service after choosing a 3-month service period could only be viewed online at www.usps.com.

This revision incorporates the existing Post Office Box fee refunds for a 3-month service period into the DMM and also modifies the terminology for a 12-month service period as consisting of two 6-month (semi-annual) periods.

Post Office Box service is available in 3-, 6- or two 6-month (semi-annual) prepaid periods.***

All fees for Post Office Box service are for 3-, 6- or two 6-month (semi-annual) prepaid periods, except as noted under 4.5.6, 4.5.7, and 4.5.10.***

4.7 Fee Refund

4.7.1 Calculation

[Revise 4.7.1 in its entirety as follows:]

When Post Office Box service is terminated or surrendered by the customer, the unused portion of the fee may be refunded as follows:

- If service is discontinued at any time within the first 3 months of the 6-month (semi-annual) service period, then one-half of the fee is refunded.
- If service is discontinued after the beginning of the fourth month of the 6-month (semi-annual) service period, then none of the fee is refunded.
- If service is discontinued and the customer has prepaid for the next 6-month (semi-annual) service period, then the entire fee for that next period is refunded.
- If customers using the Automatic Renewal option choose a 3-month service period and service is discontinued anytime during that period, no refund is provided.

[Revise 4.7.2 by deleting the third sentence.]

DMM Revision: Periodicals — Endorsements, Supplements to Bound and Unbound Publications

In response to customer needs, effective May 31, 2012, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 707.3.3.5 to modify the marking standards for supplements to bound publications. Supplements prepared with bound publications that are enclosed in a complete wrapper, polybag, or envelope may be mailed without the endorsement “Supplement to...” followed either by the title of the publication, the name of the publisher, or by “Periodicals Publication.” This change will unify bound and unbound supplement endorsement requirements and simplify preparation of preprinted advertising in bound publications.

3.3.5 Supplement

[Revise the introductory text of 3.3.5 as follows:]

A supplement is one or more pages (subject to 3.3.1) formed by one or more printed sheets that are not bound into a publication. A supplement may be devoted to a single topic and may contain material different from that in the host publication. A supplement may not be mailed at Peri-

odicals prices by itself. The length and height of a supplement may not exceed those of the host publication except when the host publication and the supplement are contained in an envelope, polybag, or other complete wrapper or under 3.3d. Supplements are subject to these conditions as applicable:

[Delete current items a and b in their entirety, and add new items a through d as follows:]

- If a supplement to a bound publication is formed of more than one sheet, all sheets making up the supplement must be bound together.
- A bound publication mailed with one or more supplements must be enclosed in a wrapper.
- A supplement to an unbound publication that is not prepared in a wrapper, polybag, or envelope must be combined with and inserted within the publication under 3.5.4.
- A wrapper is not required when a loose addressed supplement is included within the same mailing as the host publication, bears a proper delivery address, contains at least 25% nonadvertising material, and includes on the front/cover page the endorsement “Periodicals Supplement to” followed by the exact title and issue date of the host publication. The external dimensions of such supplements may exceed those of the host publication provided they are of the same processing category as the host publication.

Effective June 24, 2012, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 234, 244, 334, 344, 374, 434, 444, 474, and 604 to expand the use of PC Postage® for the payment of postage for First-Class Mail®, Standard Mail®, Media Mail®, and Library Mail, and First-Class Package Service™ (except for commercial plus) commercial mailings. This includes permitting the use of PC Postage for the payment of additional postage and surcharges, according to standard, on an accompanying postage statement when exact postage is not affixed to each mailpiece in a mailing.

Previously, DMM standards allowed postage meter imprints as the only acceptable postage evidencing system method for use on mailpieces in presorted mailings. These revisions expand the options for customers using postage evidencing systems for more types of commercial mailings to include both postage meter imprints and PC Postage indicia.

Under this alternative, the mailer must provide a postage statement for each payment method and mark each piece "Pound Price Pd via Permit," in the postage evidencing system indicium or ad plate or other means that ensures a legible endorsement. For mailings of nonidentical-weight pieces, "nonidentical" must be shown in place of the weight of a single piece on the applicable postage statement.

2.3 Combined Price

[Revise the first sentence of 2.3 as follows:]

Postage evidencing system indicia may be used for combined price mailings containing both pieces subject to pound prices and pieces subject to minimum per piece charges.***

3.0 Postage Payment for Automation Letters

3.1 All Pieces

[Revise the text of 3.1 as follows:]

Unless authorized by the USPS under 705.2.0 through 705.5.0, when precanceled postage stamps or postage evidencing system indicia are used, only one payment method may be used in a mailing, and each piece must bear the correct numerical value of postage at the price claimed based on its eligibility. For mailings of nonidentical-weight pieces subject to the piece/pound prices, the mailer may affix the applicable per piece price to each piece and pay the pound price for the mailing by a permit imprint advance deposit account. All pieces prepared this way in a mailing must be subject to the same pound price. A postage statement must be submitted for each payment

method, and each piece must be marked “Pound Price Paid via Permit” in the postage evidencing system indicium or ad plate or other means that ensure a legible endorsement. “Nonidentical” must be shown in place of the weight of a single piece on the postage statement.

3.2 Affixing Postage for Automation Standard Mail Letters

[Revise the text of 3.2 as follows:]

In a mailing bearing postage evidencing system indicia or precanceled stamp postage, each piece must bear either:

- a. A precanceled stamp, under 604.3.0; postage documentation under 4.0 is required. Additional postage must be paid at the time of mailing with an advance deposit account or with a postage evidencing system indicium affixed to the postage statement.
- b. Exact numerical value of postage on pieces bearing postage evidencing system indicia, or at the lowest price applicable to the mailing job. ***The total additional postage must be paid either by advance deposit account or by a postage evidencing system indicium affixed to the postage statement.

"Non-identical" must be shown in place of the weight of a single piece on the postage statement.

3.2 Affixing Postage for Automation Standard Mail Flats

[Revise 3.2 as follows:]

In a postage evidencing system indicia or precanceled stamp mailing, each piece must bear either:

- a. A precanceled stamp, under 604.3.0; postage documentation under 4.0 is required. Additional postage must be paid at the time of mailing with an advance deposit account or with a postage evidencing system indicium affixed to the postage statement.
- b. Exact postage on pieces bearing postage evidencing system indicia pieces or postage at the lowest price applicable to the mailing job. Additional postage must be paid at the time of mailing with an advance deposit account or with a postage evidencing system indicium affixed to the postage statement.

3.3 Mixed Price Mailing Documentation

[Revise 3.3 as follows:]

Where it is not practicable for the mailer to affix either the exact numerical value of postage or the lowest postage price to each piece in the mailing, the mailer may compute postage for the mailing as if the lowest numerical price affixed to any piece in the mailing were affixed to all pieces. Additional postage is computed based on the difference between the lowest numerical price affixed to any piece in the mailing and the price for each price level in the mailing. This computation must be documented to meet the basic standards in 4.0. No refund is paid for any piece where postage is affixed at a price higher than the lowest price claimed for or affixed to any piece. The total additional postage must be paid either by advance deposit account or by a postage evidencing system indicium affixed to the postage statement.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at www.usps.com/shop/accepting-money-orders.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration form is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise) addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. PS Form 2976 is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces, and PS Form 2976-A is required for items weighing 16 ounces or more. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). When the surface area of the address side of the mailpiece is not large enough to contain a PS Form 2976-A, the smaller PS Form 2976 may be substituted (e.g., the Priority Mail Small Flat Rate Box). The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.11.1.1c. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.11.2 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.11.7, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

U.S. Flag at Half-Staff

How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.

Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.



Note 1: When May 15, which is the date for Peace Officers Memorial Day, falls on the third Saturday in May, which is the date for Armed Forces Day, display the U.S. flag in the full-staff position, *not* at half-staff.

Note 2: On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.

POW-MIA Flag

How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.

When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.

Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.

Security is erroneously shown to be 4.2 percent, instead of the 6.2 percent the Postal Service actually contributed. The employee contribution is correctly shown as 4.2 percent.

Automated Retreat Rights on eJob Bidding

In support of our Delivering Results, Innovation, Value, and Efficiency (DRIVE) initiatives, USPS® has developed another online application designed to reduce the existing field Human Resources (HR) workload and improve self-service options for our employees. On June 1, the Automated Retreat Rights Application will be ready for national implementation — just in time for the consolidation efforts of mail processing operations, which may increase instances of employees being involuntarily assigned.

Employees can click *eJob Bidding* in the Employee Apps — Quick Links, then the *Retreat Rights* link on Lite-Blue at <https://liteblue.usps.gov>. Available 24/7, eJob Bidding is the quickest and most reliable method for

involuntarily reassigned employees to accept, track, and manage their retreat rights. (Employees will need their 8-digit Employee ID (EID) and USPS PIN to log into the system.)

Clerks, city letter carriers, and mail handlers should use eJob Bidding to accept retreat rights regardless of whether they work at a manual or automated bid site. Any of these excessed employees can accept retreat rights using eJob Bidding. When retreat rights are accepted, they will be eligible for retreat rights to the first eligible vacancy in their former installation.

One of the main features of this new technology allows employees who have been excessed from automated bid

clusters the capability of submitting preferences/bids for eligible postings at their former installation.

Employees excessed from manual bid sites should continue to follow their local policies and procedures for submitting their preferences/bids back to their former bid clusters.

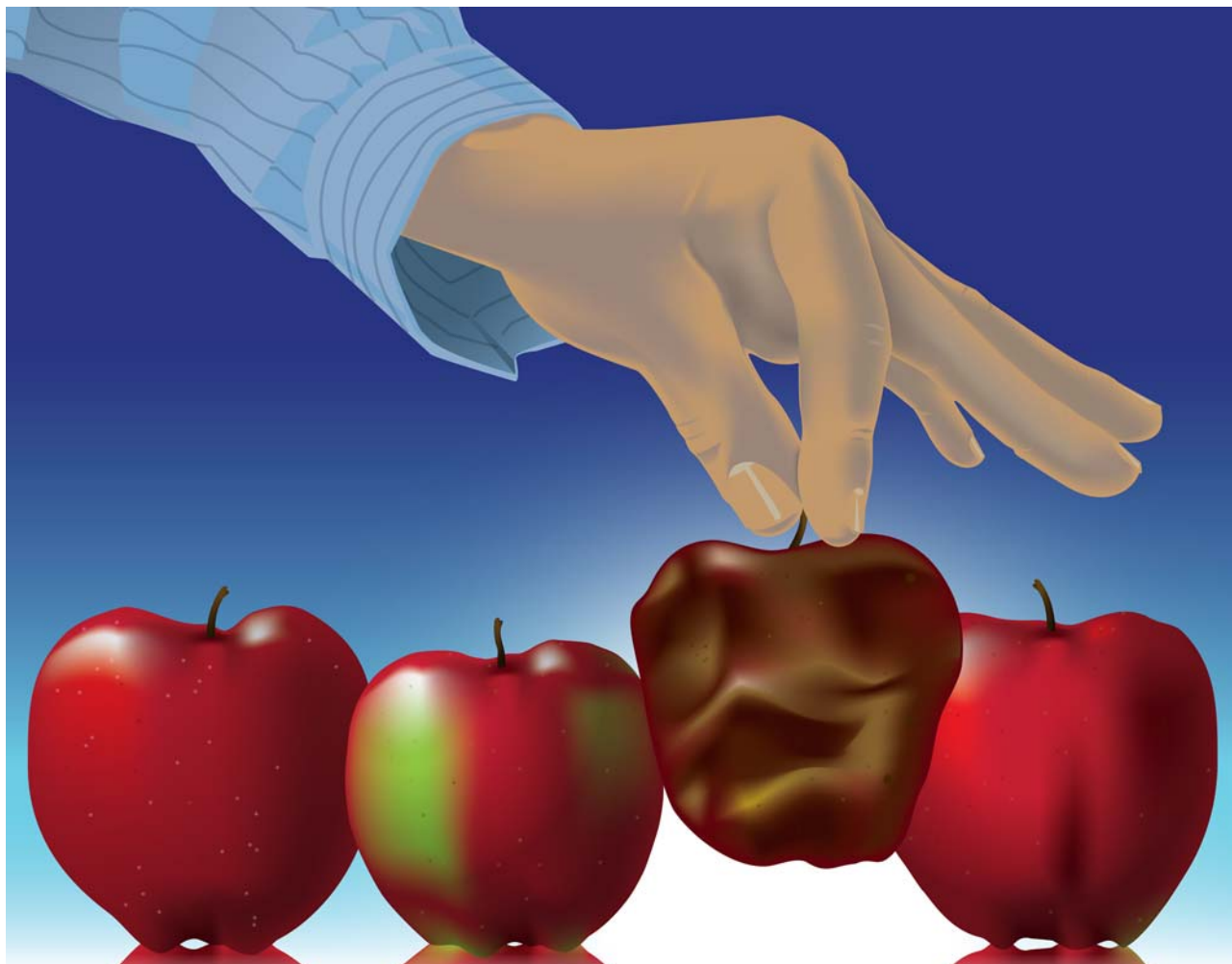

On June 29 2012, in Hampton, Virginia, at the Bass Pro Shops, the U.S. Department of the Interior will issue the \$15 *Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation* stamp for the 2012–2013 waterfowl hunting season. The stamp will go on sale nationwide June 29, 2012, and is valid through June 30, 2013.

The *Migratory Bird Hunting and Conservation* stamp, produced in the water-activated gum format, will only be automatically distributed to Stamp Fulfillment Services (SFS) in Kansas City, Missouri, and by consignment via the Amplex Corporation.

Stamp Distribution Offices and Stamp Distribution Centers. SDOs and SDCs will receive an automatic distribution of Item 334700. Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in *italics* under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

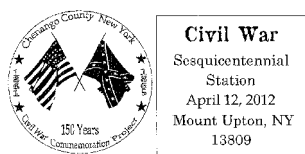
All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First Day of Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first day of issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first day of issue city. The first day of issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first day of issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first day of issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.
