Now, there are even more great reasons to ship with Priority Mail® service.

“By adding insurance and delivery day predictability, we’re making Priority Mail better than ever,” said Nagisa Manabe, chief marketing and sales officer, about the changes coming to the expedited product lineup. “It’s simply the right choice for America’s shipping, bar none.”

Effective July 28, 2013, insurance will be included with most domestic Priority Mail shipments. Depending on the postage payment method used, customers will receive up to \$50 or \$100 of insurance coverage against loss, damage, or missing contents. Customers will also receive day-specific delivery estimates that are based on their packages’ destinations. Labels, retail receipts, and the Track & Confirm site at usps.com will let customers know if their packages are scheduled to reach their destinations in one, two, or three days.

“Customers want to know how long it will take for their packages to get there, and now we’ll give them the specifics,” said Manabe.

Express Mail is getting a new name — Priority Mail Express® — and still includes the same money-back service guarantee and insurance up to \$100. Express Mail International will be renamed Priority Mail Express Interna-

tional® and the Express Mail Corporate Account will be called USPS Corporate Account.

And, of course, when customers ship with Priority Mail Express and Priority Mail, they also get USPS Tracking and free Package Pickup, as well as Flat Rate and online postage payment options.

“All these features add up to great value in shipping, which is why we’re reminding customers about the benefits of shipping with the Postal Service right on redesigned boxes and envelopes,” said Manabe. “The choice is simple for our customers — pick Priority Mail Express and Priority Mail.”

New packaging will be introduced on July 28, although postal locations will deplete current supplies before switching to the redesigned versions.

“We’re meeting customer needs and staying competitive in the shipping marketplace,” said Manabe. “We want to be America’s shipper of choice. These steps will help us achieve that goal.”

DMM Revision: Expansion of the Mailability of Live Adult Birds

Effective September 3, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) 601.9.3.4 to expand the mailability of adult birds to include any disease-free live adult bird, weighing no more than 25 pounds, if the mailer and the mailing is compliant with all applicable governmental laws and regulations.

The DMM provides a list of the types of disease-free adult birds that can be mailed domestically. That list is currently restricted to adult chickens, turkeys, guinea fowl, doves, pigeons, pheasants, partridges, quail, ducks, geese, and swans.

With this revision, the Postal Service expands its mailing standards to allow for the shipment of any disease-free live adult bird, weighing no more than 25 pounds, which can be legally transported. Mailers will be required to be aware of, and comply with, all applicable governmental laws and regulations, including the Lacey Act, the Endangered Species Act (ESA), and regulations of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and any state, municipal, or local ordinances. Mailings must also be compliant with the guidelines provided in USPS Publication 14, *Prohibitions and Restrictions on Mailing Animals, Plants, and Related Matter*, Chapter 5.

This revision was first announced in the April 24, 2013 proposed rule, *Federal Register* notice (78 FR 24132-24134), titled *New Mailing Standards for Live Animals and Special Handling*. In addition to the expanded mailability of live birds, the proposed rule also included new requirements for the use of Special Handling service with shipments of certain live animals, new barcoding requirements for Special Handling service, and a restriction on the mail classes that can be used with mailings of live reptiles and amphibians.

The Postal Service received numerous comments in response to its April 24, 2013 proposed rule. As a result of these comments, the Postal Service has decided to proceed only with the expanded mailability of adult birds, and not to continue with the other proposals at this time. However, the Postal Service may reconsider these proposals at a future date.

9.3.4 Adult Birds

Disease-free adult birds, weighing no more than 25 pounds, may be mailed domestically. Mailers must comply with all applicable governmental laws and regulations, including the Lacey Act, the Endangered Species Act (ESA), and regulations of the U.S. Department of Agriculture, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, and any state, municipal, or local ordinances. Mailings must also be compliant with the guidelines provided in USPS Publication 14, *Prohibitions and Restrictions on Mailing Animals, Plants, and Related Matter*, Chapter 5. In addition, each container or package must be marked as required by U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service under 50 CFR 14. Adult birds are mailable as follows:

- a. The mailer must send adult birds by Priority Mail Express in secure containers approved by the manager, Product Classification (see 608.8.0 for address).

[Revise the text of 9.3.5 as follows:]

9.3.5 Warm-Blooded Animals

Warm-blooded animals, except for adult birds and specified day-old birds under the specific conditions in this section, are not mailable (e.g., hamsters, mice, rats, guinea pigs, rabbits, cats, dogs, and squirrels).

DMM Revision: Customs Declaration Forms — Authorized Editions

Effective September 3, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®) sections 608.2.5.6 and 2.5.8 to codify the authorized USPS®-produced customs declarations forms that may be used when an export license or other electronic filing notice is required through the U.S. Census Bureau’s Automated Export System when sending certain goods to, from, and between U.S. territories, possessions, and Freely Associated States.

If no customs declaration form is required (e.g., items sent between the United States, Puerto Rico, and the U.S. Virgin

Islands), no other action for recording the ITN or AES Downtime Citation on the package is required. However, when a shipment requires an ITN, or AES Downtime Citation, or AES Exemption, and a PS Form 2976-A is used under 2.4, it is the customer’s responsibility to legibly write one ITN, AES Downtime Citation, or applicable AES Exemption in block 10 of PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note — CP 72*. The only authorized editions for this form are September 2012 and July 2013.

2.5.8 When an Export License Is Required

[Revise 2.5.8 in its entirety to read as follows:]

When an export license is required under 2.5.7, a PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note — CP 72*, is always required. The only authorized editions for this form are September 2012 and July 2013. The electronically generated License Number must appear in Block 16, and an ITN or AES Downtime Citation (see 520) must appear in block 10 of the form. See IMM 520 and 530 for complete requirements. In addition, it is the mailer’s responsibility to comply with the U.S. Census Bureau’s requirements for filing electronic export information, as described in 2.5.1 and 2.5.2.

IMM Revision: International Mailpieces Refused by Air Carriers

Effective September 3, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) by adding a new subchapter to establish what actions the Postal Service will take when an air carrier refuses an international mailpiece.

4 Treatment of Outbound Mail

[Redesignate 440 as 450, and insert new 440 to read as follows:]

440 Mailpiece Refused by an Air Carrier

441 Item Containing Nonmailable, Hazardous, or Perishable Material

When an air carrier refuses a mailpiece containing nonmailable, hazardous, or perishable material, Postal Service employees will follow the standards in section 727.2 or

742.3 of Publication 52, *Hazardous, Restricted, and Perishable Mail*. In such an instance, the customer may be eligible for refund of postage consistent with IMM 941, IMM 942, and DMM 604.9.

442 Mailable Item

For all mail classes with the exception of Global Express Guaranteed service, when an air carrier refuses a properly prepared and labeled mailable international mailpiece, the Postal Service will attempt to find a suitable alternative air carrier. However, if it cannot identify another air carrier, the Postal Service will file an incident report and return the item to the sender using Label 180, *Air Carrier Rejected Mail*. In such an instance, the customer may apply for refund of postage consistent with IMM 941, IMM 942, and DMM 604.9.

Note: For a refused mailable item, the mailer may have the option to send the item using Global Express Guaranteed (GXG) service, which uses a unique transportation network.

The item must be otherwise mailable using GXG service (see 210), GXG service must be available to the destination country (see 213.5), and the mailer must enter the item through a Post Office facility that accepts GXG items (see 215.1). In addition, the mailer must apply a new shipping label (see 214.1) with new postage (based on the item's weight and the destination country's GXG price group), and must obliterate any markings or labels (e.g., Label 180) indicating the item was previously returned.

IMM Revision: Updates to Various Individual Country Listings

Effective September 3, 2013, the Postal Service[™] will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM[®]) to reflect changes in the Individual Country Listings (ICLs) for various countries.

The following ICL changes are a result of formal requests made by the destination country through the Universal Postal Union (UPU) via International Bureau Circulars, and through the 2012 UPU 25th Congress at Doha:

- **Azerbaijan:** As indicated at the UPU Doha Congress Proposal 23.7.2, Azerbaijan has modified its list of prohibited articles.
- **Belgium:** As indicated in UPU International Bureau Circular 12, dated January 14, 2013, Belgium has withdrawn its previous prohibition on empty ink cartridges or empty laser toner cartridges.
- **Bhutan:** As indicated in UPU International Bureau Circular 37, dated March 4, 2013, Bhutan has requested that merchandise items sent to individuals from businesses and all commercial items be accompanied by a corresponding invoice.
- **Brazil:** As indicated at the UPU Doha Congress Proposal 23.12.1, Brazil reserves the right to collect from customers a “presentation-to-Customs charge” for any item submitted to customs control.
- **Great Britain and Northern Ireland:** As indicated in UPU International Bureau Circular 42, dated March 11, 2013, Great Britain and Northern Ireland revises and updates its listing of prohibited and restricted items.
- **Greece:** As indicated at the UPU Doha Congress Proposal 23.12.2, Greece reserves the right to collect from customers a “presentation-to-Customs charge” for any item submitted to customs control.
- **Iran:** As indicated at the UPU Doha Congress Proposal 23.7.3, Iran has modified its list of prohibited articles.
- **Mexico:** As indicated in UPU International Bureau Circular 63, dated May 6, 2013, Mexico no longer accepts electronic cigarettes. Additionally, at the request of Correos de Mexico (the designated operator that provides postal services in Mexico), we are clarifying a prohibition on bearer checks, an observation regarding the import of merchandise, and an observation regarding the inclusion of commercial invoices.
- **Peru:** As indicated in UPU International Bureau Circular 23, dated January 21, 2013, Peru no longer accepts vitamins. In addition, telecommunications equipment (including mobile phones) requires a license from the Ministry of Transportation and Communications before mailing.
- **Turkey:** As indicated in UPU International Bureau Circular 24, dated January 21, 2013, Turkey has advised that mailable tobacco products and mobile phones may not be indicated as a “gift” on customs declarations, irrespective of whether they are subject to or exempt from Turkish customs duties. Additionally, we are moving two items (playing cards and tea) from the list of Restrictions to the list of Prohibitions.

- **Ukraine:** As indicated in UPU International Bureau Circular 54, dated March 25, 2013, Ukraine has modified its list of restricted “foodstuffs” to include dietary supplements, foods for special dietary consumption, and functional foods.
- **Uzbekistan:** As indicated in UPU International Bureau Circular 47, dated March 18, 2013, Uzbekistan has modified its list of prohibited articles.

In order to facilitate customs clearance and delivery of postal items containing merchandise of any kind, all items sent to private individuals in Bhutan from businesses abroad, and all commercial items, should be accompanied by the relevant invoice(s). Items that are not accompanied by the corresponding invoice could be delayed, so it is recommended that the mailer include on the invoice the phone

number of the sender and the phone number and email address of the addressee.

[Insert a new item 1 to read as follows (redesignating existing items 1 through 5 as 2 through 6):]

Country Conditions for Mailing

Prohibitions

[Revise the Prohibitions section in its entirety to read as follows:]

- Aerosols.
- Ammunition, except lead pellets.
- Animals, live (including reptiles).
- Arms and parts of arms, or any component classified as munitions of war; imitations and antiques; paint-ball or toy guns; taser guns; air rifles, air pistols, components of firearms, and all other items similar to or resembling the foregoing.
- Articles, goods infringing British trademarks or copyright laws.
- Asbestos items of any kind.
- Christmas crackers (holiday popper).
- Clinical and medical waste (e.g., contaminated dressings, bandages, and needles).
- Coins; platinum, gold, or silver (manufactured or not); precious stones; jewels; and other valuable articles.
- Counterfeit currency, bank notes, and postage stamps.
- Dies and equipment for making imitations, etc., of any current postage stamp for denoting any rate of postage.
- Fish, live.
- Frozen food.
- Frozen water (including bags of ice).
- Goods made in foreign prisons, except those imported for a noncommercial purpose or of a kind not manufactured in the United Kingdom.
- Human and animal cremated remains (ashes).

Indecent and obscene prints, paintings, books, cards, lithographs, and other engravings, films, video tapes, or any other indecent or obscene articles.

Lead acid batteries (e.g., car batteries) and sealed lead acid batteries.

Lottery tickets and related advertisements for illegal lotteries.

Medicines classified as flammable or toxic.

Radioactive materials and samples that are classified as radioactive using Table 2-12 of the latest edition of the International Civil Aviation organization's Technical Instructions — e.g., fissile material (uranium 235, etc.), radioactive waste material, thorium, or uranium ores and luminous dials from aircraft.

Soil.

Soiled clothes and rags.

Stun gun, electric.

Switchblade knives (also known as flick knives) and gravity knives.

Waste, dirt, filth, or refuse, including household waste or rubbish.

A consignment of live bees must contain only queen bees and their attendant workers; colonies are not permitted. Each consignment must be accompanied by an import license issued by the Dept. of Agriculture (DEFRA) and a health certificate issued by the country of origin.

Caterpillars, cockroaches, crickets, destroyers of noxious pests, earthworms, fish fry and eggs, flies of the family Drosophilidae, leeches, lugworms, maggots, mealworms, pupae and chrysalides, rag worms, silkworms, spiders, and stick insects are admissible only for biomedical research (see license requirement for bees).

Medicines and drugs when sent for scientific purposes must be sent by a practitioner, registered dental practitioner, veterinary surgeon, registered nurse, or recognized laboratory or institution.

Plants and parts of plants require an import permit issued by the appropriate Agricultural Department in the United Kingdom.

Vaccines may be sent only by, or at the specific request of, a qualified medical practitioner, registered dental practitioner, veterinary surgeon, registered nurse, or recognized laboratory or institution.

IMM Revision: Customs Declaration Forms — Authorized Editions

Effective September 3, 2013, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) parts 123 and 527 and section 533.3 to codify that the only authorized USPS®-produced customs declarations forms (PS Form 2976, *Customs Declaration CN 22 — Sender’s Declaration*, and PS Form 2976-A, *Customs Declaration and Dispatch Note — CP 72*) are the editions dated September 2012 and July 2013.

Postmasters are encouraged to convey this information to mailers who may possess editions of PS Forms 2976 and 2976-A dated before September 2012, and to encourage them to start using the authorized editions as soon as possible, but no later than the effective date of September 3, 2013.

Post Office™ facilities that have editions of PS Forms 2976 and 2976-A dated before September 2012 must remove them from lobbies **no later than September 3,**

2013, and must recycle or discard them appropriately as soon as possible.

In addition, the only authorized edition of the USPS-produced PS Form 2976-B, *Priority Mail Express International Shipping Label and Customs Form*, is dated July 2013. Handbook F-101 Revision: Unit Cash Reserve Policy Update

Effective July 25, 2013, Handbook F-101, *Field Accounting Procedures*, is revised to reflect the change in the unit cash reserve policy. The current policy to calculate the unit cash reserve based on stamp sales can no longer be applied due to the steady decline in stamp sales. As a result, the unit cash reserve authorized will now be based on the Cost Ascertainment Group (CAG) associated with the postal retail unit (PRU).

Handbook F-101 will be updated to include the maximum amount of unit cash reserve each CAG can maintain and the approval process to increase the amount, if necessary.

A PRU with a unit cash reserve less than the new maximum amount should maintain their current level. A PRU with a unit cash reserve that exceeds the maximum amount for their CAG must reduce their reserve down to the new authorized "maximum amount".

Due to the policy change, the "Authorized Cash" field in the Finance Number Control Master system (FNCM) will be renamed "Authorized Unit Cash Reserve," and a one-time program will update this field for all PRUs. Additionally, the Excess Cash Retained Report in the Accounting Data Mart (ADM) will be modified to calculate the excess cash amount based on the number of Sales and Service Associates (SSAs) with cash credits and the Unit Cash Reserve amount in FNCM. Also, a new Narrowcast Report has been created to assist the District Finance Managers (DFMs) with the annual review for those units that are granted an exception to increase the unit cash reserve amount.

Note: Headquarters and area personnel will monitor the unit cash reserve levels.

When circumstances warrant, the unit cash reserve custodian may reassign all or part of the unit cash reserve using PS Form 3369.

Any reassigned funds must be kept separate from other accountable credits assigned to the employee.

The unit cash reserve must be reported in AIC 753 on the unit's PS Form 1412. When performing a count of the unit cash reserve, there is no authorized tolerance applied.

Note: CPUs and SDAs are not authorized to have a unit cash reserve.

13-7.1.2 Changes to Unit Cash Reserves

Example: If a unit is in CAG A and currently has the maximum allowable limit of \$700, then that unit can only request an increase of up to \$2,300, since \$3,000 is the cap amount for a CAG A office.

To request an increase to the unit cash reserve, PRU supervisors must do the following:

- a. Complete FNCM Unit Finance Number Request with header information and the current and new requested amount for Authorized Unit Cash Reserve.
- b. Scan and submit the request via email to the District Finance Manager (DFM) for approval. The email must include "Request to Increase Unit Cash Reserve" in the subject line and justification for the request in the body of the email. File a copy locally of completed form and email request.
- c. Upon receipt of the request, the DFM does one of the following:
 - Send an email to the unit with decision of approval and submit the completed FNCM form along with approval email to FNCM FSB to update the unit cash reserve amount in FNCM; or
 - Send an email to the unit with decision of disapproval.
- d. For requests approved by the DFM, the PRU supervisor must do the following:
 - Update PS Form 3369 to reflect the amount authorized by the DFM.

- Update the unit cash reserve amount as needed on PS Form 1412 (See 13-7.4)
- Maintain copies of email as supporting documentation.

Note: If the DFM determines that a unit cash amount, considering the requested increase, is excessive, he or she can disapprove the requested increase and determine the appropriate cash level.

Once every fiscal year, the DFM must review the amount of the unit cash reserve for those units that have been authorized as an exception to validate that the need still exists for the increased amount.

In an effort to reduce waste and account for more customers submitting change-of-address orders online, fewer *Mover’s Guide* copies are being printed. There are several things you can do to conserve as well:

- Make sure customers are aware that USPS.com® is the most convenient, safe, and secure way for customers to submit a change-of-address order.
- Encourage carriers to take ICOA message cards on their routes instead of *Mover’s Guide* copies.
- Give *Mover’s Guide* copies out to *moving* customers only.

Important Reminders

- Copies of *Mover’s Guide* must be kept behind the counter *ONLY*, not in inner or outer lobbies or on clerk counters.
- Customers unwilling or unable to submit their change of address at www.usps.com should be given a complete, *unopened* copy of *Mover’s Guide*.
- Provide *no more than three* copies of *Mover’s Guide* to each customer.
- *Mover’s Guide* is printed and distributed four times a year.

Offices will continue to receive copies of *Mover’s Guide* in one or two shipments. The first shipments should have

arrived by the end of June. The second shipments will arrive 3 to 5 weeks later.

- Boxes with BLUE stickers are the first shipment for this print run.
- Boxes with YELLOW stickers are the second and final shipment for this print run.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at <https://www.usps.com/shop/accepting-money-orders.htm>.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

A2. APO/FPO/DPO addresses shall not include a city and/or country name.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration (PS Form 2976 or, if the customer prefers, PS Form 2976-A) is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as official mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.12.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.12.1.1h and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.12.7, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. Delivery Confirmation service is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

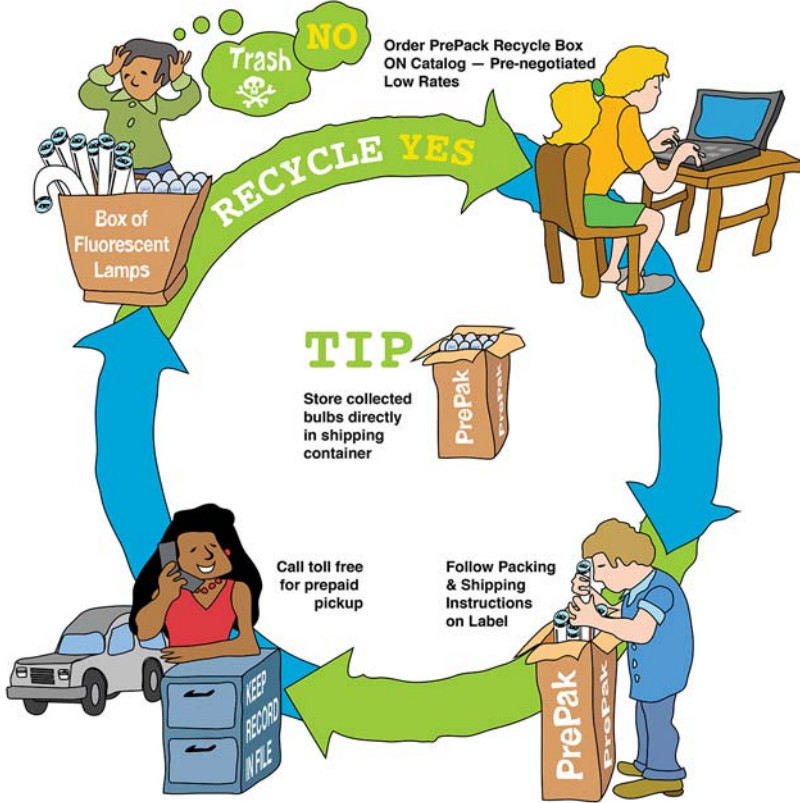

Fiscal Year 2013 Closing Guidance: Message From the Controller

Thanks to all of you for your efforts to control expenses during FY 2013. It is important that we carry this effort through to the end of the fiscal year by controlling discretionary activity. This does not mean curtailing business, but it does mean making prudent choices by deferring or eliminating noncritical activity, and purchasing goods or services throughout the year, rather than at the end of the fiscal year, simply because there are available budget funds. Please encourage your contractors to bill us in a timely manner for goods received and services rendered, so we can recognize the expense before the end of the fiscal year.

The following instructions will assist you, when appropriate, in helping the Postal Service™ close its financial books in a timely and efficient manner.

I. Instructions for Fiscal Year 2013 Closing

All organizations are requested to limit their expenditures to essential spending. Accordingly, all vice presidents should review discretionary spending to ensure the Postal Service attains its financial target for this fiscal year (FY).

The instruction and reporting dates in this *Postal Bulletin* supplement procedures followed during the normal monthly or quarterly reporting schedule.

II. Fiscal Year

The Postal Service prepares its annual reports on a government FY basis, which comprises 365 days (366 in leap years), always ending on September 30.

III. End of Year Processing Activities and Timelines, Contract Modifications, and Requisitions

Expense requisitions and requests for contract modifications for FY13 will not be accepted by Supply Management after August 31. Capital purchases will be accepted by Supply Management through September 13.

Note: Capital credit card transactions must be processed by the vendor before the Visa monthly cut-off date of September 19; otherwise, the transaction will not be processed.

Also, organizations should limit capital commitments, particularly for Postal Service support equipment, to essential needs. The schedule for Supply Management processing is as follows:

For requisitions received...	Funds are processed as follows...
On or before August 31, 2013	Supply Management will issue the required contract or modification for Accounting Services, San Mateo to process against FY 2013 funds.
On or after September 1, 2013	Supply Management will issue the required contract or modification for Accounting Services, San Mateo to process against FY 2014 funds.

Requisitions for Contract Actions

FY 2013, Capital and Expense requisitions and requests for contract action will not be accepted by Supply Management after August 31.

Requisitions for IT Hardware, Services, Software, and Telecom (Exception):

For FY 2013, Capital and Expense requisition requests for contract actions will not be accepted by Supply Management after August 1, 2013. Any requests received after this date will not be guaranteed for award and delivery by September 30, 2013.

For FY 2014, Capital and Expense requisition requests for contract actions that require a start date of October 1, 2013, will not be accepted by Supply Management after August 1, 2013. Any requests received after this date will not be guaranteed for award by October 1, 2013.

Hardcopy paper commitment documents must be forwarded to Accounting Services, San Mateo no later than Friday, September 20. Electronic files must be transmitted to Accounting Services as follows:

Send electronic files for...	To...	No later than...
Contract Authoring and Management System (CAMS)	San Mateo	September 30, 2013
Facilities capital commitments and expense payments	St. Louis	September 30, 2013

Appropriate receiving reports or certified invoices for goods and services received by September 30 must be received by Accounting Services, San Mateo no later than Tuesday, October 1.

1. Expedite processing of receiving reports and certified invoices, as these documents are used to charge expense to the proper FY.

2. Additionally, review contracts to ensure sufficient funds are available by Friday, August 30 to process invoices.

3. Supply Management will process all requisitions for the issuance of contracts against FY 2013 funds according to the following priorities:

Priority 1 – Capital commitment requisitions.

Priority 2 – Expense commitment requisitions.

IV. Accruals

Year-end closing, FY 2013:

1. There will be no "special" end-of-year accruals for HQ expenses. Monthly accruals for HQ expenses will be processed as normal and as communicated to the Executive Leadership Team (ELT) budget coordinators.
NOTE: Any unusual/non-monthly expense should be communicated to the ELT as a possible adjustment to the normal ELT accrual.

2. All HQ accruals will be accrued at the ELT finance level.
3. All invoices for San Mateo goods and services received in the month of September must be mailed to San Mateo no later than September 27 for processing by September 30, 2013. All invoices not received by San Mateo by October 1, 2013 will be processed in October 2013 and charged to FY 2014.

Information Security

Prime Targets — No Vacation from Crime



When you vacation, your credit cards and electronic devices can be prime targets for identity or physical theft. Use the following tips from the Computer Incident Response Team to protect yourself:

- Tell credit card vendors when and where you will be traveling, so your purchases can be vetted for fraudulent transactions. Also, let the vendor know when you are making large purchases, so your card won't be frozen.
- When you swipe your card, cover the numbers on the front with your hand, so no one can observe the numbers or take a picture of the numbers with a phone.

- Ensure no one observes you typing in your Personal Identification Number (PIN).
- Use ATM devices in areas that are well-monitored, preferably inside stores when personnel are present. This will reduce the likelihood of encountering a phony swipe device (skimmer) to capture card and PIN information.
- While still at the checkout, review the receipt to ensure that an unintentional or accidental "cash advance" has not been added to your bill.
- Keep all receipts, and carefully compare purchases against your bill to make sure you are not charged for something you did not buy.
- Review the personal information on devices such as computers, smart phones, and tablets. Consider if the loss of this information could result in possible fraudulent crimes or personal danger, if the device is lost or stolen.
- Never leave these devices unattended. Devices should always be secured if you are not able to keep them in your possession.
- When available, enable computer disk encryption.

On August 8, 2013, in Washington, DC, the Postal Service™ will issue *Made in America ~ Building a Nation* (Forever® priced at 46 cents) First-Class mail® commemorative stamps in 12 designs in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 12 stamps (Item 471500). **The pane of 12 stamps (\$5.52) may not be split and sold individually.**

The stamps will go on sale nationwide August 8, 2013.

The *Made in America ~ Building a Nation* issuance honors the workers who were essential to the growth of the modern United States. There are five different panes. Each one contains the same 12 stamps, but is anchored by a different selva photograph. In the top row are an airplane maker, a derrick man on the Empire State Building, a millinery apprentice, and a man on a hoisting ball on the Empire State Building. In the middle row are a linotyper in a publishing house, welder on the Empire State Building, a coal miner, and riveters on the Empire State Building. In the bottom row are a powerhouse mechanic, a railroad track walker, a textile worker, and a man guiding a beam on the Empire State Building. Eleven of the 12 stamp images were taken by photographer Lewis Hine, a chronicler of early 20th century industry. The coal miner image is from the Kansas State Historical Society. Three of the selva photos were taken by Hine. They include two Empire State Building iron workers and a General Electric worker measuring the bearings in a casting. The fourth selva photograph is the same image of the coal miner that appears in the stamp pane. The final selva photograph, taken by Margaret Bourke-White, depicts a female welder. Art director Derry Noyes designed the stamp panes.

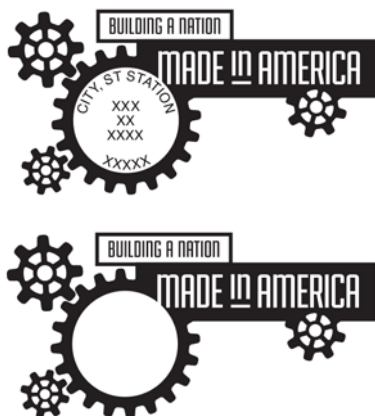

If pilot sites need additional stock to meet unexpected demand, they must first check the website at: <http://topkkssgsh.usps.gov/sites/SDCReports/Web/default.htm> to see if a SEAM replenishment order has already been placed before placing an expedited order in eBuy2. Post Offices should not sell the stamp prior to first-day-of-issue.

Sales Policy

All Post Offices should maintain a sufficient inventory level of this item until the stamp is officially withdrawn from sale. If supplies run low, Post Offices must reorder additional quantities using their normal ordering procedures.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Postmark

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office, at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop, or by calling 800-STAMP-24. They should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

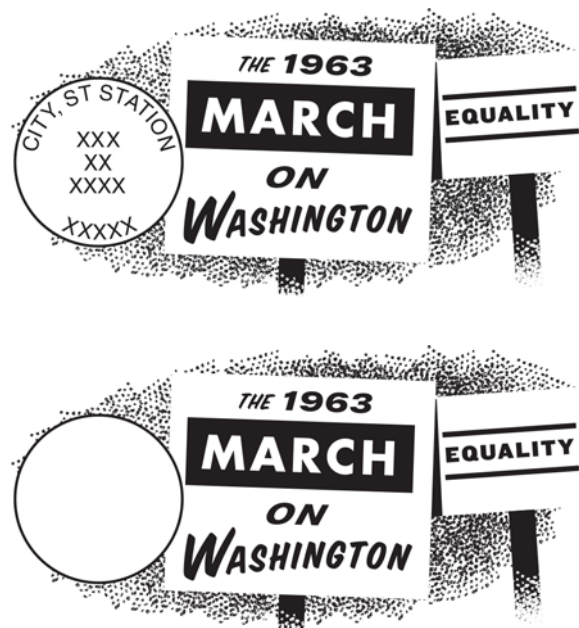

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark up to a quantity of 50. For more than 50, customers have to pay five cents each. All orders must be postmarked by October 23, 2013.

Special Dedication Postmarks

Only the following pictorial postmark is permitted for the *March on Washington* stamp. The word "Station" or the abbreviation "STA" is required somewhere in the design, because it will be a temporary station.

Guidelines for Finalizing March on Washington Stamp Pictorial Postmark Art



To finalize *March on Washington* stamp pictorial postmark art, insert the date, city, state and ZIP™ Code of the physical location of your event adjacent to the stamp image. Overall dimensions of the pictorial postmark must not exceed 4 inches horizontally by 2 inches vertically. Collectors prefer the dimensions 3 1/2 inches by 1.

The Postal Service must make all special postmarks known to collectors through advance publicity in the *Postal Bulletin*. Therefore, all special dedication cancellations must be reported to Stamp Services four weeks before the events using PS Form 413, *Pictorial Postmark Announcement/Report*. Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

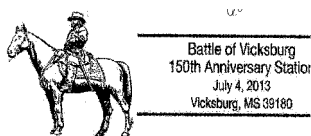
All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal

Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first-day-of-issue city. The first-day-of-issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the

postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first-day-of-issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

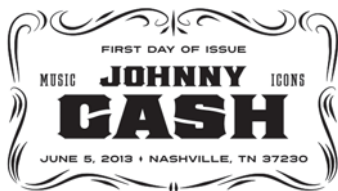

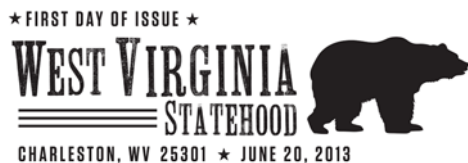

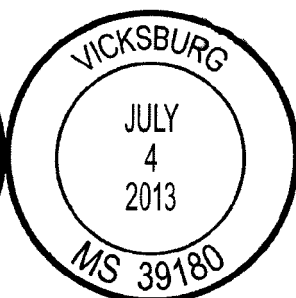

The next Semi-Annual Capital Property Review is scheduled to begin on August 5, 2013; the completion deadline is August 19, 2013. The list of items to be verified by the selected finance numbers will be sent by National Materials Customer Service from the "NMCS Autoreply" email account during the week of August 5, 2013.

The Semi-Annual Capital Property Reviews are a Sarbanes-Oxley (SOX) requirement. A list of finance numbers that receive a Semi-Annual Capital Property Certification Report, but do not submit the report on time, will be sent to senior management.

The Asset Accountability Service Centers (AASCs) will contact Headquarters, area, district, and local manage-

ment, as needed, to verify the points of contact for the upcoming August 2013 Semi-Annual Capital Property Review. Instructions on completion of the Semi-Annual Capital Property Review will be available via a web link included in the email from NMCS Autoreply. The AASCs are also available to provide support and training upon request. Handbook AS-701, *Material Management*, is under revision; instructions and guidelines provided by the AASCs supersede Handbook AS-701, where there are conflicts.

Got Old Fluorescent Bulbs?

We have a solution for you. Keep that pile of bulbs in regulatory compliance and keep mercury out of the environment by raising employee awareness of recycling mercury-containing lamps. Download the 8-1/2" by 11" color poster (see pg. 49) from the Office of Sustainability website at http://blue.usps.gov/sustainability/_pdf/bulb-poster-508.pdf and encourage employees to use the prepaid shipping approach for recycling fluorescent bulbs. Fluorescent bulbs are classified as universal waste and regulated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

This special poster was created to assist Post Offices™ with the regulatory issues connected with properly recycling fluorescent lamps. It should be posted in convenient workroom areas where custodians, maintenance workers, and other staff can routinely access this information.

The poster supports a mailing strategy for returning used lamps to a recycler. This approach is especially useful

for suburban and rural Post Offices without access to direct pickup lamp recycling services. The poster also reinforces the fluorescent lamp Standard Operating Procedure (SOP) published on page 53 of *Postal Bulletin 223561* (April 18, 2013). That SOP provides instructions on ordering a pre-Pack recycling box from eBuy2, shipping procedures, and paperwork requirements; the procedures are simple, easy, and keep the Postal Service™ compliant.

Please remember old fluorescent bulbs *must* be recycled within one year to comply with universal waste storage time regulations. If you have any questions about lamp recycling or the use of the poster, contact the Office of Sustainability at sustainability@usps.gov.
