DMM Revision: Domestic Competitive Products Pricing and Mailing Standards Changes

Effective January 26, 2014, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), to reflect changes to prices and mailing standards for the following Competitive Products:

- Priority Mail Express™.
- Priority Mail®.
- First-Class Package Service™.
- Parcel Select®.
- Standard Post®.
- Extra Services.
- Return Services.
- Mailer Services.
- Recipient Services.

This article describes new prices and product features for Competitive Products, by class of mail, established by the Governors of the United States Postal Service®. New prices are available on the Postal Explorer® website at <http://pe.usps.com>.

Competitive Products changes are identified by product as follows:

Priority Mail Express

Delivery and Availability Times for Priority Mail Express

The Postal Service will eliminate the 12 P.M. delivery time of items to an addressee within the delivery area of the destination facility for Priority Mail Express Next Day and Second Day delivery. The default time for delivery of items to an addressee for Next Day and Second Day delivery will be 3:00 P.M. The Postal Service is announcing a new optional 10:30 A.M. delivery time for a fee of \$5.00 for PO Box™ and street delivery service where available based on the origin and destination ZIP Code™ pairs.

The Postal Service will also revise the Hold For Pickup service times for Priority Mail Express Next Day and Second Day delivery items. The current 10:00 A.M., 12:00 P.M., and 3:00 P.M. pickup times will change to 10:30 A.M. and 3:00 P.M. There is no fee for the 10:30 pickup time.

PME Package Simplification Updates

As part of the Package Simplification efforts which began on July 28, 2013, the Postal Service is continuing to streamline offerings to eliminate unnecessary items. The expansion of transportation networks for expedited products and

enhancements in scanning technology has resulted in no detectable difference for handling and delivery of the two primary Priority Mail Express services available today. As a result, we will update DMM language as follows: Priority Mail Express Post Office to Addressee will be referred to as simply Priority Mail Express, and Priority Mail Express Custom Designed service will be discontinued.

Additionally, the Postal Service will update the January 26, 2014, DMM to globally change Priority Mail Express Next Day Delivery and Priority Mail Express Second Day Delivery to Priority Mail Express 1-Day Delivery and Priority Mail Express 2-Day Delivery.

Priority Mail

Commercial Plus Volume Threshold

For consistency, the Postal Service will reduce the Commercial Plus volume threshold of 75,000 total pieces in the previous calendar year (except Priority Mail Open and Distribute) to 50,000 total pieces in the previous calendar year (except Priority Mail Open and Distribute). The 5,000 letter-size and flat-size pieces (including Flat Rate Envelopes, but not the Padded Flat Rate Envelope) cumulative account volume threshold will remain the same.

Commercial Plus Cubic

The Postal Service will reduce the Commercial Plus cubic volume threshold from exceeding 150,000 pieces in the previous calendar year to exceeding 50,000 pieces in the previous calendar year, to make cubic pricing more accessible to a larger group of customers.

Priority Mail Open and Distribute

The Postal Service will revise DMM section 423.1.1 to clarify that only tray boxes entered at Priority Mail Commercial Plus prices are not based on weight, but are charged based on the tray box and zone to which it is sent. Tray boxes not entered at Priority Mail Commercial Plus prices are priced as Priority Mail by weight and zone.

First-Class Package Service

There are no product changes scheduled for First-Class Package Service.

Parcel Select

There are no product changes scheduled for Parcel Select.

Standard Post

Eligibility Criteria for Standard Post

The Postal Service moved Standard Post to the competitive product listing effective January 27, 2013. This included aligning the costs with Priority Mail Zone 1 through 4, 1 through 15 pound price combinations.

To further simplify our shipping options, the Postal Service will limit the Standard Post Zone 1 through 4, 1 through 70 pound price combinations to shipments of mailable hazardous materials, live animals, or other items required by standard to be shipped by ground transportation only. Standard Post will still be available for all mailable items shipped to Zones 5 through 8, up to 70 pounds.

Extra Services

There are no product changes scheduled for Extra Services Competitive Products.

Return Services

There are no product changes scheduled for Return Services Competitive Products.

Mailer Services

Premium Forwarding Service Fees

The enrollment fee for Retail or online applications for Premium Forwarding Service[®] (PFS) will now vary between Retail and online requests. The enrollment fee paid at the Retail Counter will be \$17 per application. The enrollment fee paid online will be \$16 per application.

Premium Forwarding Service — Commercial

The Postal Service provides this advance notice of the redesign of commercial Priority Mail Express (PME) Reshipment and Priority Mail (PM) Reshipment service offerings. Once final systems implementation is completed, anticipated for July 2014, the DMM standards will be revised accordingly. As background, the Postal Service currently offers residential and commercial customers options for reshipment of mail from one delivery location to another. For retail customers, Premium Forwarding Service[®] (PFS[®]) is available for up to one year and shipments are sent weekly. For commercial customers, PME Reshipment service (established with a USPS Corporate Account) and PM Reshipment service (established with a Merchandise Return Service (MRS) permit account) are available for a specific period of time and frequency.

Under the new commercial reshipment service, our PFS offerings will be expanded. Premium Forwarding Service[®] Commercial (PFS[®] Commercial) will replace commercial PME Reshipment and PM Reshipment service, and will be available to business customers who pay an annual enrollment fee and postage online. Customers will have the ability to determine the frequency and locations where

reshipment service is desired, and will choose if the shipments will be sent by either PME or PM. Shipping containers used for PFS Commercial will be restricted to sacks, tray boxes, and for minimal amounts of mail, Flat Rate envelopes. Additionally, customers will no longer be required to provide MRS or PME labels for reshipments or to pay daily Pickup on Demand fees where currently applicable.

Effective in July 2014, enrollment for PFS Commercial will be available through the Business Customer Gateway at <https://gateway.usps.com/bcg/login.htm>.

USPS Package Intercept Automated Retail Requests

Currently, retail customers may request to have their package intercepted and redirected to sender by submitting PS Form 1509, *Sender's Request for USPS Package Intercept Service (previously Sender's Application for Recall of Mail)*. Commercial customers may request to have their package redirected to sender, to a new postal delivery address, or to a Post Office as Hold For Pickup service through the Business Customer Gateway at <https://gateway.usps.com/bcg/login.htm>.

The Postal Service will introduce an additional phase of Package Intercept service which will automate the retail requests and related payments for Package Intercept service online at www.usps.com. As a result of the retail online implementation, manual requests will no longer be necessary and PS Form 1509 will be retired.

Additionally, the Postal Service is revising various sections of DMM 507.5.0, Package Intercept, for clarification.

Pickup on Demand Service Online Enhancements

The Postal Service will retire PS Form 5541, *Pickup Service Statement — Priority Mail Express, Global Express Guaranteed, Priority Mail, or Standard Post*, as a result of online enhancements that automate the payment method for all package pickup services, including Pickup On Demand. Online options, including the request for recurring pickups through the online Package Pickup program, are located at www.usps.com.

Recipient Services

Post Office Box Service

There are no product changes scheduled for Competitive Post Office Box services.

Other

New Zone 9 Added to Zone Priced Products

The Postal Service will extend zone pricing to add a "Zone 9" for domestic mail service products provided to the Freely Associated States (FAS). Costs associated with these destinations are unique and significant compared to other origin and destination pairs currently covered by

Zone 8. The FAS are three independent countries with eight ZIP Codes included in the 969 3-Digit ZIP Code area assigned to these locations as follows:

- Republic of Palau (PW) — 96939, 96940.
- Federated States of Micronesia (FM) — 96941, 96942, 96943, 96944.
- Republic of the Marshall Islands (MH) — 96960, 96970.

Pricing for the remaining 5-Digit ZIP Codes in the 969 area will not be affected by this pricing change.

Palau Postage Refunds Guaranteed for Loss Only

As set forth in the terms of the Compact of Free Association between the United States Government and the government of the Republic of Palau pending ratification, Palau is added to the list of countries where guaranteed postage is not refunded other than for loss.

Non-Compliant IMpb Barcode Surcharge

The Postal Service will implement a \$0.20 per piece price for IMpb noncompliant pieces. The surcharge will apply to all competitive product pieces entered at commercial prices. Pieces failing to meet the January 26, 2014 standards for IMpb use and falling outside the established thresholds will be subject to this new surcharge.

Information regarding the details on the application of the surcharge can be found in the November 2013, final rule *Federal Register* notice, *New Standards to Enhance Package Visibility*.

Permit Imprint Application Fee Waiver for eVS

The Postal Service will revise the DMM to waive the permit imprint application fee for mailer's using an Electronic Manifest Mailing System (eVS).

Packaging of Live Animals

The Postal Service will revise DMM standards to clarify that USPS-produced packaging, including Flat Rate containers, is not eligible for shipping live animals.

2.2 Waiver of Signature

[Revise the first sentence of 2.2 to read as follows:]

For editions of Priority Mail Express Label 11-B or Label 11-F printed before January 2012, a mailer sending a Priority Mail Express item may instruct the USPS to deliver a Priority Mail Express Next Day Delivery or Priority Mail Express Second Day Delivery item without obtaining the signature of the addressee or the addressee's agent by checking and

signing the waiver of signature on Label 11-B or Label 11-F, or indicating waiver of signature is requested on single-ply commercial label.***

2.3 Signature Required

***A mailer must select signature service for Priority Mail Express COD, or Priority Mail Express with additional insurance.

Standard Post prices are calculated based on the zone to which the parcel is addressed and the weight of the parcel. Standard Post prices are available as follows:

- a. Except for items mailed under 1.1b, Standard Post prices are only available for mailable items sent to Zones 5 through 8.

The Commercial Base price and Commercial Plus price for customers who prepare and pay for First-Class Package International Service items via permit imprint, online at <http://usps.com>, or as registered end-users using an authorized PC Postage vendor will remain a variable discount (based on the item's weight and price group) of up to 13 percent below the retail price for Commercial Base price and up to 19 percent below the retail price for Commercial Plus price. In addition, we are changing the following product features and classifications:

- To provide additional value, customers who prepare their First-Class Package International Service combined shipping and customs label using Click-N-Ship for Business and pay for postage using their meter will be eligible to receive the applicable Commercial Base postage price. - The Postal Service will decrease the maximum weight for flat-size items from 4 pounds to 17.6 ounces, increase the maximum weight limit for package-size items from 4 pounds to 4.4 pounds, and for IPA M-bag contents, increase the combined weight of each printed matter mailpiece and the related articles from 4 pounds to 4.4 pounds. First-Class Mail International service and First Class Package International Service remains available for sending letter-post items to these destinations.

International Surface Air Lift

International Surface Air Lift[®] (ISAL[®]) service, including ISAL M-bag service, is a commercial service that provides mailers with dispatch and transportation of volume mailings of all First-Class Mail International postcards, letters, and large envelopes (flats) and First-Class Package International Service packages (small packets). Overall, prices for ISAL will decrease by 2.9 percent. In addition, we are changing the following product features and classifications:

- The Postal Service clarifies that not all ISAL mail is flown to the destination country. For example, the Postal Service may use surface transportation for ISAL mail destined to Canada or Mexico.
- The Postal Service will increase the number of price groups from 16 to 20 (including for worldwide non-presort mail).
- Price groups 1–14 will have shaped-based pricing and will require separate containers (i.e., letter trays for postcards and letter-size pieces, flat trays for flat-size pieces, and sacks for package-size pieces).
- The Postal Service will decrease the maximum weight for flat-size items from 4 pounds to 17.6 ounces, increase the maximum weight limit for package-size items from 4 pounds to 4.4 pounds, and for ISAL M-bag contents, increase the combined weight of each printed matter mailpiece and related articles from 4 pounds to 4.4 pounds. The maximum weight for letter-size pieces remains unchanged at 3.5 ounces.
- To help mailers more easily qualify for the direct country price tier, the Postal Service will decrease the minimum qualifying weight for a direct country container from 3 pounds to 2 pounds.

First-Class Mail International service and First Class Package International Service remains available for sending letter-post items to these destinations.

Direct Sacks of Printed Matter to One Addressee (M-bags)

Airmail M-bags are direct sacks of printed matter sent to a single foreign addressee at a single address. The price increase for Airmail M-bags averages 2.9 percent.

International Extra Services, Pickup on Demand Service, and International Money Transfer Services

Depending on country destination and mail type, customers may add a variety of extra services to their outbound shipments. We are changing international competitive extra services, Pickup on Demand service, and international money transfer services as follows:

- Certificate of Mailing: The prices for Certificate of Mailing services will increase.
- Customs Clearance and Delivery: The price for customs clearance and delivery will increase.
- Registered Mail: The price for Registered Mail™ service will increase.
- Return Receipt: The price for Return Receipt service will increase.
- Pickup on Demand: Although there is no change to the price for Pickup on Demand service, we will offer this service for First-Class Package International Service.
- International Money Transfer Services: Although there is no change to the prices for international money transfer services — which include international postal money orders, money order inquiry fee, and Sure Money® (DineroSeguro®) service — we will permanently limit the Sure Money maximum purchase amount, refund amount, and change of payee amount to \$1,500. (Previously, as announced on December 1, 2012, we had temporarily limited these amounts to \$1,500.)

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Note: Mail order catalogs are prohibited as SAM or PAL mail.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals in their raw, unmanufactured state are prohibited. Official shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airman," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.

A2. APO/FPO/DPO addresses shall not include a city and/or country name.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration (PS Form 2976 or, if the customer prefers, PS Form 2976-A) is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

C1. Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as official mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in DMM 601.12.1.1. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in DMM 601.12.1.1h and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

F1. Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

F2. Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot.22 caliber rifle per individual.

G. Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

I1. This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

I2. This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

J. Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

L. All official mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

N. Registered mail is prohibited.

O. Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

P. APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under DMM 601.12.7, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

T. Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

U. Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

U2. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

U3. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.

V. Express Mail Military Service (EMMS) not available from any origin.

V1. USPS Tracking is not available.

W. Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. 292.46 Presort Mailings: Direct Country – Price Groups 1 through 14

292.461 General

Price groups 1 through 14 may be prepared in direct country containers (full-service price and ISC drop shipment price). Each direct country container must contain at least 2 pounds of mail. The mailer must separately containerize items bearing customs forms from items not bearing customs forms and must prepare letter-size, flat-size, and package-size items in separate containers as defined in 292.462a through 292.462c. Smaller quantities qualify only for a mixed country price (price groups 9 through 14 only) under 292.47, or for the worldwide nonpresort price under 292.49. The maximum container weight is 66 pounds.

292.462 Preparation

The mailer must prepare direct country containers of presorted IPA mail (full-service price and ISC drop shipment price) as follows:

- a. *Letter-Size and Flat-Size Mail.* For each direct country tray of letter-size or flat-size mail, the mailer must do the following:
 1. *Mail Preparation.* Prepare letter-size items in letter trays, either 1-foot or 2-foot, depending on volume. Prepare flat-size items in flat trays/tubs. Do

not prepare the content of trays in bundles. Face all letter-size items and flat-size items in the same direction. Ensure that all trays are full enough to keep the mail from mixing during transportation. Cover (i.e., sleeve or lid) all letter-size and flat-size trays and secure them with strapping.

2. *Container Tags.* Complete the front side of PS Tag 115, *International Priority Airmail*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. Check the appropriate box to indicate if the tray contains items *with* or *without* customs forms, identify the destination country, and enter the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit number, the foreign office of exchange code as listed in Exhibit 292.45a or Exhibit 292.45b, and the price group as listed in Exhibit 292.45a. To the front side of the tag, apply a barcode that indicates the mailer's permit number, the product code, the service type code, the container type code, the mail contents shape type code, the foreign office of exchange code, and the serial number of the container. (To request technical specifications for the barcode, send an email to globalbusiness-sales@usps.gov.) Finally, tape PS Tag 115 to the tray cover.

b. *Packages.* For each direct country sack of package-size items, the mailer must do the following:

1. *Mail Preparation.* Prepare package-size items by placing them loose in sacks.
2. *Container Tags.* Complete the front side of PS Tag 115, *International Priority Airmail*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. Check the appropriate box to indicate if the container contains items *with* or *without* customs forms, identify the destination country, and enter the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit number, the foreign office of exchange code as listed in Exhibit 292.45a OR Exhibit 292.45b, and the price group as listed in Exhibit 292.45a. To the front side of the tag, apply a barcode that indicates the mailer's permit number, the product code, the service type code, the container type code, the shape type code, the foreign office of exchange code, and the serial number of the container. (To request technical specifications for the barcode, send an email to globalbusiness-sales@usps.gov). Finally, attach PS Tag 115 to the neck of the sack.

292.47 Presort Mailings: Mixed Country — Price Groups 9 through 14

292.471 General

The mailer may prepare price groups 9 through 14 in mixed country containers (ISC drop shipment price) only after all possible direct country containers have been prepared. Each mixed country price group must contain at least 5 pounds of mail that is destined within the same price group. The mailer must separately containerize items bearing customs forms from items not bearing customs forms and must prepare letter-size, flat-size, and package-size items in separate containers as defined in 292.472a and 292.472b. Smaller quantities qualify only for the worldwide nonpresort price under 292.49. The maximum container weight is 66 pounds.

292.472 Preparation

The mailer must prepare mixed country containers of presorted IPA mail (ISC drop shipment price) as follows:

- a. *Letter-Size and Flat-Size Mail.* For each mixed country tray of letter-size or flat-size mail, the mailer must do the following:

1. *Mail Preparation.* Prepare letter-size items in letter trays, either 1-foot or 2-foot, depending on volume. Prepare flat-size items in flat trays/tubs. Bundle letter-size and flat-size pieces as defined in 292.44, and bundle each country separately. Face all letter-size items and flat-size items in the same direction and apply a label (facing slip) to the top item as defined in 292.473. Cover (i.e., sleeve or lid) all letter-size trays and flat-size trays/tubs and secure them with strapping.
2. *Container Tags.* Complete the front side of PS Tag 115, *International Priority Airmail*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. Identify the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit

number, and the price group as listed in Exhibit 292.45a followed by the word “Mixed” (e.g., “14–Mixed”). Finally, tape PS Tag 115 to the tray cover.

b. *Packages*. For each mixed country container of package-size items, the mailer must do the following:

1. *Mail Preparation*. Prepare package-size items by placing them loose in sacks.
2. *Container Tags*. Complete the front side of PS Tag 115, *International Priority Airmail*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. Identify the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit number, and the price group as listed in Exhibit 292.45a followed by the word “Mixed” (e.g., “14–Mixed”). Finally, attach PS Tag 115 to the neck of the sack.

292.473 Direct Country Bundle Label for Mixed Country Containers

Only letter-size and flat-size direct country bundles prepared for mixed country containers require a label (facing slip). The mailer must complete the label and place it on the address side of the top item of each bundle in such a manner that it will not become separated from the bundle. The pressure-sensitive labels and optional endorsement lines used domestically for presort mail are prohibited for IPA service. Bundle labels must contain the following information:

Line 1: Foreign Office of Exchange Code. (See Exhibit 292.45a or Exhibit 292.45b.)

Line 2: Country Labeling Name. (See Exhibit 292.45a.)

Line 3: Mailer, Mailer Location (City and State).

292.48 Presort Mailings – Price Groups 15 through 19

292.481 General

Mailers must prepare price groups 15 through 19 in direct country containers (full-service price and ISC drop shipment price) or mixed country containers (ISC drop shipment price). Each direct country container must contain at least 2 pounds of mail. Each mixed country container must contain at least 5 pounds of mail. Smaller quantities qualify only for the worldwide nonpresort price under 292.49. The mailer must separately containerize items bearing customs forms from items not bearing customs forms. The maximum container weight is 66 pounds.

292.482 Preparation

The mailer has two options to prepare direct country or mixed country containers of presorted IPA mail, as follows:

1. Prepare mail as described in 292.46 and 292.47, including using letter-size trays for letter-size items, flat-size trays/tubs for flat-size items, and sacks for package-size items.
2. Prepare mail in sacks for all processing categories as defined in 292.483 and 292.484.

292.483 Direct Country – Optional Sack Preparation

The mailer may optionally prepare direct country sacks or mixed country sacks of presorted IPA mail when sacks are used for all processing categories as follows:

a. *Full-Service and ISC Drop Shipment – Direct Country Sacks*.

1. *Preparation*. Mail (letter-size, flat-size, and package-size) that is addressed to an individual country and that contains 2 pounds or more must be sorted into direct country sacks. Mail that cannot be made up into direct country sacks must be prepared and entered as mixed country sacks or as worldwide nonpresort sacks. The mailer must bundle letter-size and flat-size items as defined in 292.44. The mailer must bundle letter-size items and flat-size items separately, although nonidentical items may be commingled within each of these categories. Face all letter-size items and flat-size items in the same direction and apply a label (facing slip) to the top item as defined in 292.472. Place package-size items loose in the sack provided that items bearing customs forms are separated from items not bearing customs forms.

2. *Container Tags*. The mailer must complete the front side of PS Tag 115, *International Priority Airmail*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. The mailer must check the appropriate box to indicate if the sack contains items *with* or *without* customs forms, identify the destination country, and enter the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit number, the foreign office of exchange code as listed in Exhibits 292.45a and 292.45b, and the price group as listed in Exhibits 292.45a and 292.45b. The mailer must apply a barcode to the front side of the tag that indicates the mailer’s permit number, the product code, the service type code, the container type, the shape type, the foreign office of exchange code, and the serial number of the sack. (To request technical specifications for the barcode, send an email to globalbusiness-sales@usps.gov). Finally, the mailer must attach PS Tag 115 to the neck of the sack.

3. *Direct Country Container Label*. A mailer who claims the ISC drop shipment price and enters the mail at an authorized drop shipment location under 292.532 is

not required to prepare container labels. A mailer who claims the full-service price must complete 2-inch container labels (and insert them into the applicable container label holder) as follows (see Exhibit 292.483 for the list of U.S. Exchange Offices):

Line 1: Appropriate U.S. Exchange Office and Routing Code

Line 2: Contents — DRX COUNTRY

Line 3: Mailer, Mailer Location

b. *ISC Drop Shipment* — Mixed Country Sacks.

1. *Preparation.* Mixed country sacks can be prepared only after all possible direct country sacks have been prepared. The mailer must prepare mixed country sacks for items that contain 5 pounds or more and that are destined within the same price group. Mail that ultimately cannot be made up into direct country sacks or mixed country sacks must be prepared and entered at the worldwide nonpresort price. The mailer must bundle letter-size and flat-size items as defined in 292.44. The mailer must bundle letter-size and flat-size items separately, although nonidentical items may be commingled within each of these categories. Face all letter-size items and flat-size items in the same direction and apply a label (facing slip) to the top item as defined in 292.484. Place package-size items that cannot be bundled

because of their physical characteristics loose in the sack provided that items bearing customs forms are separated from items not bearing customs forms.

2. *Container Tags.* The mailer must complete the front side of PS Tag 115, *International Priority Air-mail*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. On the front of the tag, the mailer must identify the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit number, and the price group as listed in Exhibit 292.45a followed by the word “Mixed” (e.g., “15–Mixed”). Finally, the mailer must attach PS Tag 115 to the neck of the sack.

292.484 Presorted Mail — Direct Country Bundle Label

Only letter-size and flat-size direct country bundles prepared for mixed country sacks require a label (facing slip). The mailer must complete the label and place it on the address side of the top item of each bundle in such a manner that it will not become separated from the bundle. The pressure-sensitive labels and optional endorsement lines used domestically for presort mail are prohibited for IPA service. Bundle labels must contain the following information:

Line 1: Foreign Office of Exchange Code. (See Exhibit 292.45a and Exhibit 292.45b.)

Line 2: Country Labeling Name. (See Exhibit 292.45a.)

Line 3: Mailer, Mailer Location (City and State).

292.49 Worldwide Nonpresort Preparation

The following standards apply when the mailer prepares worldwide nonpresort IPA mail (full-service price and ISC drop shipment price):

- a. *General.* A mailer claiming any mail at the direct country or mixed country price cannot enclose the mail in worldwide nonpresort sacks. The mailer must bundle letter-size and flat-size mail. All types of mail, including letter-size bundles, flat-size bundles, and loose items, can be commingled in the same sack. Labels (facing slips) are not required on any bundles. Containers other than sacks are not authorized unless other equipment is specified by the acceptance office — for example, the mailer may present nonpresorted letter-size mail in trays if authorized by the acceptance office. mail at an authorized drop shipment location under 292.532 is not required to prepare container labels. A mailer who claims the full-service price must complete 2-inch container labels (and insert them into the applicable container label holder) as follows (see Exhibit 292.483 for the list of U.S. Exchange Offices):

293 International Surface Air Lift (ISAL) Service

293.1 Description

293.11 General

[Revise 293.11 to read as follows:]

International Surface Air Lift (ISAL) service, including ISAL M-bags, is a commercial service designed for volume mailings of all First-Class Mail International postcards, letters, and large envelopes (flats), and for volume mailings of First-Class Package International Service packages (small packets). The sender must prepare mailpieces in accordance with the requirements of this subchapter and with the shape-based requirements of the applicable service — see 240 for First-Class Mail International items, and see 250 for First-Class Package International Service items. ISAL shipments are typically flown to the foreign destinations (exceptions apply to Canada and Mexico) and are then entered into that country’s surface nonpriority mail system for delivery. Separate prices are provided for International Service Center (ISC) drop shipments, presorted mail, and nonpresort mail. Volume incentives are available through customized agreements.

293.2 Eligibility

293.21 Qualifying Mailpieces

The mailer must separately containerize items bearing customs forms from items not bearing customs forms and must prepare letter-size, flat-size, and package-size items in separate containers as defined in 293.462a through 293.462c. Smaller quantities qualify only for a mixed country price (price groups 9 through 14 only) under 293.47, or for the worldwide nonpresort price under 293.49. The maximum container weight is 66 pounds.

293.462 Preparation

The mailer must prepare direct country containers of presorted ISAL mail (full-service price and ISC drop shipment price) as follows:

- a. *Letter-Size and Flat-Size Mail.* For each direct country tray of letter-size or flat-size mail, the mailer must do the following:
 1. *Mail Preparation.* Prepare letter-size items in letter trays, either 1-foot or 2-foot, depending on vol-

ume. Prepare flat-size items in flat trays/tubs. Do not prepare the content of trays in bundles. Face all letter-size items and flat-size items in the same direction. Ensure that all trays are full enough to keep the mail from mixing during transportation. Cover (i.e., sleeve or lid) all letter-size and flat-size trays and secure them with strapping.

2. *Container Tags.* Complete the front side of PS Tag 155, *International Surface Air Lift*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. Check the appropriate box to indicate if the tray contains items *with* or *without* customs forms, identify the destination country, and enter the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit number, the foreign office of exchange code as listed in Exhibit 293.45a or Exhibit 293.45b, and the price group as listed in Exhibit 293.45a. To the front side of the tag, apply a barcode that indicates the mailer's permit number, the product code, the service type code, the container type code, the mail contents shape type code, the foreign office of exchange code, and the serial number of the container. (To request technical specifications for the barcode, send an email to globalbusiness-sales@usps.gov.) Finally, tape the PS Tag 155 to the tray cover.

b. *Packages.* For each direct country sack of package-size items, the mailer must do the following:

1. *Mail Preparation.* Prepare package-size items by placing them loose in sacks.
2. *Container Tags.* Complete the front side of PS Tag 155, *International Surface Air Lift*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. Check the appropriate box to indicate if the container contains items *with* or *without* customs forms, identify the destination country, and enter the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit number, the foreign office of exchange code as listed in Exhibit 293.45a or Exhibit 293.45b, and the price group as listed in Exhibit 293.45a. To the front side of the tag, apply a barcode that indicates the mailer's permit number, the product code, the service type code, the container type code, the shape type code, the foreign office of exchange code, and the serial number of the container. (To request technical specifications for the barcode, send an email to globalbusiness-sales@usps.gov.) Finally, attach PS Tag 155 to the neck of the sack.

293.47 Presort Mailings: Mixed Country — Price Groups 9 through 14

293.471 General

The mailer may prepare price groups 9 through 14 in mixed country containers (ISC drop shipment price) only after all possible direct country containers have been prepared. Each mixed country price group must contain at least 5 pounds of mail that is destined within the same price group. The mailer must separately containerize items bearing customs forms from items not bearing customs forms and must prepare letter-size, flat-size, and package-size items in separate containers as defined in 293.472a and 293.472b. Smaller quantities qualify only for the worldwide nonpresort price under 293.49. The maximum container weight is 66 pounds.

293.472 Preparation

The mailer must prepare mixed country containers of presorted ISAL mail (ISC drop shipment price) as follows:

a. *Letter-Size and Flat-Size Mail.* For each mixed country tray of letter-size or flat-size mail, the mailer must do the following:

1. *Mail Preparation.* Prepare letter-size items in letter trays, either 1-foot or 2-foot, depending on volume. Prepare flat-size items in flat trays/tubs. Bundle letter-size and flat-size pieces as defined in 293.44, and bundle each country separately. Face all letter-size items and flat-size items in the same direction and apply a label (facing slip) to the top item as defined in 293.473. Cover (i.e., sleeve or lid) all letter-size trays and flat-size trays/tubs and secure them with strapping.

2. **Container Tags.** Complete the front side of PS Tag 155, *International Surface Air Lift*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. Identify the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit number, and the price group as listed in Exhibit 293.45a followed by the word “Mixed” (e.g., “14–Mixed”). Finally, tape PS Tag 155 to the tray cover.
- b. **Packages.** For each mixed country container of package-size items, the mailer must do the following:
 1. **Mail Preparation.** Prepare package-size items by placing them loose in sacks.
 2. **Container Tags.** Complete the front side of PS Tag 155, *International Surface Air Lift*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. Identify the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit number, and the price group as listed in Exhibit 293.45a followed by the word “Mixed” (e.g., “14–Mixed”). Finally, attach PS Tag 155 to the neck of the sack.

293.473 Direct Country Bundle Label for Mixed Country Containers

Only letter-size and flat-size direct country bundles prepared for mixed country containers require a label (facing slip). The mailer must complete the label and place it on the address side of the top item of each bundle in such a manner that it will not become separated from the bundle. The pressure-sensitive labels and optional endorsement lines used domestically for presort mail are prohibited for ISAL service. Bundle labels must contain the following information:

Line 1: Foreign Office of Exchange Code. (See Exhibit 293.45a or Exhibit 293.45b.)

Line 2: Country Labeling Name. (See Exhibit 293.45a.)

Line 3: Mailer, Mailer Location (City and State).

293.481 General

Mailers must prepare price groups 15 through 19 in direct country containers (full-service price and ISC drop shipment price) or mixed country containers (ISC drop shipment price). Each direct country container must contain at least 2 pounds of mail. Each mixed country container must contain at least 5 pounds of mail. Smaller quantities qualify only for the worldwide nonpresort price under 293.49. The mailer must separately containerize items bearing customs

forms from items not bearing customs forms. The maximum container weight is 66 pounds.

293.482 Preparation

The mailer has two options to prepare direct country or mixed country containers of presorted ISAL mail, as follows:

1. Prepare mail as described in 293.46 and 293.47, including using letter-size trays for letter-size items, flat-size trays/tubs for flat-size items, and sacks for package-size items.
2. Prepare mail in sacks for all processing categories as defined in 293.483 and 293.484.

293.483 Direct Country – Optional Sack Preparation

The mailer may optionally prepare direct country sacks or mixed country sacks of presorted ISAL mail when sacks are used for all processing categories as follows:

a. Full-Service and ISC Drop Shipment – Direct Country Sacks.

1. **Preparation.** Mail (letter-size, flat-size, and package-size) that is addressed to an individual country and that contains 2 pounds or more must be sorted into direct country sacks. Mail that cannot be made up into direct country sacks must be prepared and entered as mixed country sacks or as worldwide nonpresort sacks. The mailer must bundle letter-size and flat-size items as defined in 293.44. The mailer must bundle letter-size items and flat-size items separately, although nonidentical items may be commingled within each of these categories. Face all letter-size items and flat-size items in the same direction and apply a label (facing slip) to the top item as defined in 293.473. Place package-size items loose in the sack provided that items bearing customs forms are separated from items not bearing customs forms.

2. **Container Tags.** The mailer must complete the front side of PS Tag 155, *International Surface Air Lift*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. The mailer must check the appropriate box to indicate if the sack contains items *with* or *without* customs forms, identify the destination country, and enter the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit number, the foreign office of exchange code as listed in Exhibit 293.45a or Exhibit 293.45b, and the price group as listed in Exhibit 293.45a. To the front side of the tag, the mailer must apply a barcode that indicates the mailer’s permit number, the product code, the service type code, the container type, the shape

type, the foreign office of exchange code, and the serial number of the sack. (To request technical specifications for the barcode, send an email to globalbusiness-sales@usps.gov.) Finally, the mailer must attach PS Tag 155 to the neck of the sack.

3. **Direct Country Container Label.** A mailer who claims the ISC drop shipment price and enters the mail at an authorized drop shipment location under 293.532 is not required to prepare container labels. A mailer who claims the full-service price must complete 2-inch container labels (and insert them into the applicable container label holder) as follows (see Exhibit 293.483 for the list of U.S. Exchange Offices):

Line 1: Appropriate U.S. Exchange Office and Routing Code
 Line 2: Contents — DRX COUNTRY
 Line 3: Mailer, Mailer Location

b. *ISC Drop Shipment* — Mixed Country Sacks.

1. Mixed country sacks can be prepared only after all possible direct country sacks have been prepared. The mailer must prepare mixed country sacks for items that contain 5 pounds or more and that are destined within the same price group. Mail that ultimately cannot be made up into direct country sacks or mixed country sacks must be prepared and entered at the worldwide nonpre-

sort price. The mailer must bundle letter-size and flat-size items as defined in 293.44. The mailer must bundle letter-size and flat-size items separately, although nonidentical items may be commingled within each of these categories. Face all letter-size items and flat-size items in the same direction and apply a label (facing slip) to the top item as defined in 293.483. Place package-size items that cannot be bundled because of their physical characteristics loose in the sack provided that items bearing customs forms are separated from items not bearing customs forms.

2. **Container Tags.** The mailer must complete the front side of PS Tag 155, *International Surface Air Lift*, which identifies the mail to ensure it receives priority handling. On the front of the tag, the mailer must identify the date of mailing, the 10-digit permit number, and the price group as listed in Exhibit 293.45a followed by the word “Mixed” (e.g., “15–Mixed”). Finally, the mailer must attach PS Tag 155 to the neck of the sack.

293.484 Direct Country Bundle Label

Only letter-size and flat-size direct country bundles prepared for mixed country sacks require a label (facing slip). The mailer must complete the label and place it on the address side of the top item of each bundle in such a manner that it will not become separated from the bundle. The pressure-sensitive labels and optional endorsement lines used domestically for presort mail are prohibited for ISAL service. Bundle labels must contain the following information:

- Line 1: Foreign Office of Exchange Code. (See Exhibit 293.45a or Exhibit 293.45b.)
- Line 2: Country Labeling Name. (See Exhibit 293.45a.)
- Line 3: Mailer, Mailer Location (City and State).

293.49 Worldwide Nonpresort Preparation

The following standards apply when the mailer prepares worldwide nonpresort ISAL mail (full-service price and ISC drop shipment price):

- a. **General.** A mailer claiming any mail at the direct country or mixed country price cannot enclose the mail in worldwide nonpresort sacks. The mailer must bundle letter-size and flat-size mail. All types of mail, including letter-size bundles, flat-size bundles, and loose items, can be commingled in the same sack. Labels (facing slips) are not required on any bundles. Containers other than sacks are not authorized un-

less other equipment is specified by the acceptance office — for example, the mailer may present nonpresorted letter-size mail in trays if authorized by the acceptance office. The maximum weight of any container is 66 pounds.

- b. *Worldwide Nonpresort Container Label.* A mailer who claims the ISC drop shipment price and enters the mail at an authorized drop shipment location under 293.532 is not required to prepare container labels. A mailer who claims the full-service price must complete 2-inch container labels (and insert them into the applicable container label holder) as follows (see Exhibit 293.483 for the list of U.S. Exchange Offices):

IMM Correction: Return Receipt Service Available for Various Countries

In the edition of *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) published November 15, 2012, and in subsequent editions of the IMM through November 2013, many of the Individual Country Listings (ICLs) inadvertently contained incorrect information about the availability of Return Receipt service — many ICLs noted that Return Receipt service was “Available for Registered Mail only,” although for those countries,

Return Receipt service is actually “Available for Registered Mail and insured Priority Mail International parcels only.”

Accordingly, effective with the IMM to be published on January 26, 2014, we are correcting the ICLs for the following countries to note that Return Receipt service is “Available for Registered Mail and insured Priority Mail International parcels only”:

IMM Revision: Electronic Transmission of Customs Declaration Information

Effective January 26, 2014, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, International Mail Manual (IMM®)* in various locations to clarify that a mailer who uses a privately printed customs form must electronically transmit the customs declaration information to the Postal Service before tendering the mailpieces to the acceptance office. This required information is essential in order to comply with specific Foreign Trade Regulations for items sent internationally. Non-compliance might result in refusal at acceptance, delay in processing, and/or return of mailpieces to the sender.

In addition, in section 123.3, we have updated the address for the website where mailers can obtain information for privately printed customs forms.

123.32 Required Electronic Transmission of Customs Declaration Information

For an item bearing a privately printed customs form under 123.31, a mailer must electronically transmit customs declaration information by using USPS-produced Global Shipping Software (GSS) or other USPS-approved software. Failure to provide electronically transmitted customs declaration information before tendering the mailing may result in refusal at acceptance, delay in processing, and/or return of mail to the sender.

Effective January 26, 2014, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) to reflect changes to the Individual Country Listing (ICL) for Ecuador.

We are revising Ecuador’s Prohibitions and Restrictions as a result of a formal request made through the Universal Postal Union (UPU) via International Bureau Circular (IBC) 188, dated October 14, 2013, when Ecuador prohibited mobile telephones and restricted perfumes, creams, and used clothing.

New General Ledger Account 52414 for Alarm Services and Fees

Effective December 12, 2013, all units must use the newly created General Ledger Account (GLA) 52414, *Alarm Services and Fees*, to pay for invoices related to alarm services and fees. The purpose of this new GLA is to track costs associated with these services and identify ways to reduce costs, especially those costs related to services provided by law enforcement for non-emergency alarms.

Please provide a refresher service talk to all employees who activate or deactivate the alarms. If there is a problem with their alarm code or if the alarm keypad does not

appear to be functioning properly, employees must contact the Inspection Service National Law Enforcement Communications Center (NLECC) at 877-696-5322. The NLECC is staffed 24/7 and should be contacted immediately. The NLECC will ask the employee for their name, title, last four digits of their Social Security Number, and name of Postmaster, Station Manager, or Supervisor as a way of verifying their identity.

If the unit receives an invoice related to alarm services or fees, the invoice must be paid via eBuy2 using

GLA 52414. GLA 52414 can be added in eBuy2 using the following steps:

1. Prior to checking out, click the magnifying glass icon next to the blank GL Code box.
2. Type in a description of the GL (i.e. alarm) or the specific GL Code in the filter box.
3. Click *Apply Filter*.

4. Highlight the appropriate GL Code from the list of possible GL Codes.
5. Click “*Select*” to populate the GL Code in the box.

2014 Social Security and Medicare Tax Withholding Rates and Limits

For 2014, the maximum limit on earnings for withholding of Social Security (Old-Age, Survivors, and Disability Insurance) Tax is \$117,000.00. The maximum limit is changed from last year. The Social Security Tax Rate remains at 6.2 percent. The resulting maximum Social Security Tax for 2014 is \$7,254.00.

There is no limit on the amount of earnings subject to Medicare (Hospital Insurance) Tax. The Medicare Tax Rate applies to all taxable wages and remains at 1.45 percent with the exception of an “additional Medicare tax” assessed against all taxable wages paid in excess of the applicable threshold (see note). The FICA Tax Rate, which is the combined Social Security rate of 6.2 percent and the Medicare rate of 1.45 percent, remains 7.65 percent for 2014 (or 8.55 percent for taxable wages paid in excess of the applicable threshold).

The information in the following table shows the changes in Social Security and Medicare withholding limits from 2013 to 2014. The new limits are effective January 1, 2014.

Note: *The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act* signed into law March 23, 2010, created the “additional Medicare tax” that changes Medicare withholding computations effective January 1, 2013. All wages, self-employment income, and other compensation that are subject to regular Medicare tax and paid in excess of the applicable threshold are subject to the additional Medicare tax. Employers are required to withhold the additional Medicare tax at a 0.9% rate on wages and other compensation it pays to an employee in excess of \$200,000 in a calendar year. There is no employer match for the additional Medicare tax.

Holiday Safety: Protecting Credit Card Information



With the holiday season approaching, the Corporate Information Security Office recommends employees follow these tips to protect their credit card information:

- Protect your information while shopping or banking online. Only use sites whose Web addresses begin with *HTTPS://*.
- Close your browser after you have been on a site that asks for credit card information. Clear your login name and passwords, if using a public computer. Change passwords monthly and use different login IDs and passwords for each website.
- When possible, use a credit card instead of a debit card. Federal laws provide consumers with more protection for credit cards.
- Keep track of bank and credit card statements, as well as retail purchase receipts, to more quickly identify unauthorized transactions.
- Be wary of emails that ask for credit card information. In most cases, these emails are either a phishing attack or spam to collect credit card information. If

you're unsure whether the email is legitimate, go directly to the company's website. Don't use links in emails.

- Take advantage of free annual credit reports available from the three credit bureaus (Equifax, Experian, and TransUnion). Go directly to their websites, since there are many sites that charge for this service.

- Shred outdated credit card or bill statements.

If you think you are a victim of credit card theft or fraud, contact your financial institution immediately.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.





How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at www.usps.com/shop.

Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first-day-of-issue city. The first-day-of-issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as “laser safe.” The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum

size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first-day-of-issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.
