# Cover Story

## Energy Action Month 2015 — Actions Speak Louder than Words

The U.S. Postal Service® has been committed to saving energy and reducing our impact on the environment for a long time now. We have a rich history of setting goals to reduce our impact. We know that our goals can't be achieved in a day, but will take years of concentrated effort. Additionally, goals cannot be simply words on paper — they must be taken to heart and turned into action.

Our current sustainability goals, which were formulated in the early 2000s, are an example of that long-term thinking. Included in these goals is our energy reduction goal. The target was 30 percent reduction by 2015. Through the hard work of our employees, the U.S. Postal Service reduced facility energy usage 31.4 percent from 2003 to 2014. This means that we achieved our goal one year early and exceeded the target.

Our other goals include greenhouse gas reduction targets — the objective is to reduce emissions 20 percent by 2020. To date, we have achieved a 13.3 percent reduction and are well on our way to realizing this goal.

This coming year is a time we will examine our successes and identify areas of opportunity to formulate new goals for the next decade. We are embarking on a process to update not just our energy-related goals, but our sustainability goals. Additionally, to better align our organization to our federal peers, we've decided to readjust our goals this year to reflect a new timeframe.

We will purchase new vehicles for both mail delivery and non-mail hauling transport in the coming years. We will also invest in updates to our facility lighting and HVAC systems. As we make these changes, the electric grid in the U.S. will become cleaner, advancing us further in pursuit of our goals.

Look for more information about our revised goals in the coming months.

I would also encourage our employees and customers to make goals to reduce energy consumption at home. Whether you decide to reduce your family's water use or decrease your home's heating impact this winter, there are a number of affordable ways to take action.

Thank you for taking the time to commit to saving energy this Energy Action Month.

# Policies, Procedures, and Forms Updates

## Manuals

### ELM Revision: Employee Relations

Effective September 17, 2015, the Postal Service™ is revising the *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM) subchapter 630 to update current policy regarding the Ideas Program.

##### **631 Policy**

[Revise the text of 631 to read as follows:]

The Postal Service encourages its employees to contribute innovative ideas that will improve customer satisfaction, generate revenue, improve safety, increase productivity, reduce costs, and increase its viability in the marketplace. Evaluators must evaluate ideas promptly and act upon all suggestions in a timely and appropriate manner. (See 636, Processing Steps, for more information.)

##### **633.33 Postmasters, Plant Managers, and Installation Heads**

##### **633.34 Managers and Supervisors**

[Revise the text of 633.34 to read as follows:]

Managers, including but not limited to, managers of distribution operations, managers of customer service operations, district department heads, and supervisors at all levels, are responsible for (a) implementing and administering the Ideas Program within their operations, departments, units, or sections; and (b) promptly performing evaluations and taking subsequent actions on any ideas submitted, assigned, or escalated to them or their staff via eIDEAS (see Exhibit 636).

#### **633.35 Program Coordinators**

[Revise the text of 633.35 to read as follows:]

Program coordinators are non-bargaining unit employees designated by a vice president, executive, manager of human resources, or equivalent, who assist management with the administration of the Ideas Program in their functional area, area of operations, district, performance cluster, installation, department, or office.

Duties of an Ideas Program Coordinator include:

- a. Monitoring the progress of ideas within their scope, through the evaluation process.
- b. Ensuring all suggestions submitted by employees within the eIDEAS application are evaluated and acted upon in a timely and appropriate manner, including those assigned or escalated directly to the Ideas Program Coordinator.
- c. Reassigning ideas to new evaluators when necessary.
- d. Closing ideas that are ineligible, frivolous, or should otherwise be closed. (See 634.12 for a list of ineligible ideas.)
- e. Reviewing available status reports from eIDEAS and keeping managers informed of their Ideas Program performance and areas for improvement.
- f. Assisting employees by:
  - (1) Answering their questions about the program.
  - (2) Following up with evaluators.
  - (3) Entering ideas into eIDEAS on their behalf when access to a computer or some other impediment prevents them from doing so.

#### **634.2 Engineering Criteria**

[Delete the text of 634.2 in its entirety.]

[Add new 634.21 and 634.22 to read as follows:]

##### **634.21 eIDEAS Submission**

The following special requirements apply to eIDEAS affecting controlled equipment:

- a. Suggested changes to new equipment will not be accepted until one year after the Last Production Unit Deployed (LPUG).

- b. All ideas affecting controlled equipment must be installed and tested on one piece of equipment, with local management approval.
- (1) The local site's personnel conduct the testing, which consists of a comparison of the modified equipment to the unmodified one.
- (2) The local site may not have the capability to install the modification, which would be the case with many software or electronic changes. In these cases, local management may contact the Design Cognizant Organization (DCO) to provide support. The DCO will decide at that time if the Postal Service should support the effort.
- (c) You must remove all modifications within an eight-hour period after the test is completed or you've received disapproval of the submission.
- (d) No changes can be made that could affect the warranty of the equipment or any part of the equipment.

**Note:** Bring safety-related issues directly to the attention of local site maintenance and elevate as required through that organization.

#### **634.22 eIDEAS Implementation**

eIDEAS affecting controlled equipment will be forwarded to the appropriate DCO for evaluation. The DCO will generate a Change Request (CR), if the evaluation warrants it. The Postal Service Change Board (PSCB) must approve a CR before you may implement the change. If approved, the DCO will then determine the appropriate method of implementation. If the PSCB rejects the CR, then the local site must return the modified piece of equipment to its original

condition. This procedure maintains configuration control of deployed equipment.

There are several methods of implementing a CR. It may be included with other changes, produced as a field retrofit, or included only in newly manufactured machines. Changes may not be made in the same form as originally submitted, especially when combined with other modifications.

Effective September 17, 2015, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, International Mail Manual (IMM®) Exhibits 292.45a and 293.45a to update the foreign office of exchange codes for International Priority Airmail® (IPA®) and International Surface Air Lift® (ISAL®) items sent to Brazil.

Periodically, the Postal Service receives such requests from foreign posts to facilitate operational needs. The foreign post in this case requested that these updates be implemented as soon as possible, in accordance with the *Universal Postal Union (UPU) International Bureau Circular (IBC)* 180, October 13, 2014. However, in order to provide mailers the time needed to make necessary logistical and software changes, we are not requiring this change from mailers until December 6, 2015. Nonetheless, in order to expedite delivery, mailers are encouraged to implement these changes immediately.

  - Delivery and Signature Confirmation for import PMEI, and Delivery Confirmation for import PMI.

As International Posts upgrade, they will be added to the list of countries providing tracking and delivery information for import Registered Mail items sent to the United States.

## Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
  - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
  - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
  - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changes.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

**A1.** Mail addressed to "Any Servicemember," or similar wording such as "Any Soldier," "Sailor," "Airmen," or "Marine"; "Military Mail"; etc., is prohibited. Mail must be addressed to an individual or job title such as "Commander," "Commanding Officer," etc.  
**A2.** APO/FPO/DPO addresses shall not include a city and/or country name.  
**B.** Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration (i.e., PS Form 2976, PS Form 2976-A, or PS Form 2976-B) is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from an APO, FPO, or DPO ZIP Code. If mailed using Priority Mail Express service, mailpieces requiring a customs form that are addressed to or from an APO, FPO, or DPO location must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-B. No customs form is required for items weighing less than 16 ounces when the contents are not potentially dutiable (e.g., documents). The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-duty letters or printed matter. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an APO, FPO, or DPO except for those APOs/FPOs/DPOs to which restriction "B2" applies.
- Prepaid mail from military contractors is exempt, providing the mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

- B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this APO, FPO, or DPO.

- C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products are prohibited.

- C1.** Obscene articles, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, etc., and horror comics and matrices are prohibited.

- D.** Coffee is prohibited.

- E.** Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as official mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

- E1.** Medicines or vaccines not conforming to French laws are prohibited.

- E2.** Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic or sexual items, or nonauthorized political materials is prohibited. Although religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

- E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

- F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited in all classes of mail. See definitions of firearms in PUB 52, Sec. 431. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. The restriction for mail to this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code does not apply to firearms mailed from this APO/FPO/DPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms are a separate category defined in PUB 52, Sec. 431.3 and ATF regulations; they do not require an ATF form.

- F1.** Privately owned weapons addressed to an individual are prohibited in any class of mail.

- F2.** Importation of firearms is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

- G.** Only letters, flats, and Periodicals are authorized. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

- H.** Meats, including preserved meats, whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

- H1.** Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

- I.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 20 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 12 inches.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 68 inches.

This restriction does not apply to registered mail and official government mail marked MOM.

- I1.** This restriction does not apply to registered mail.

- I2.** This restriction does not apply to official government mail marked MOM.

- I3.** Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 27 inches.
- Maximum width 14 inches.
- Maximum height 14 inches.

- J.** Parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

- K.** Mail that includes in the address the words, "Dependent Mail Section," may consist only of letter mail, newspapers, magazines, and books. No parcel of any class containing any other matter may be mailed to the Dependent Mail section. This restriction does not apply if the address does not include the words "Dependent Mail Section."

- L.** All official mail is prohibited.

- M.** Fruits, vegetables, animals, and living plants are prohibited.

- N.** Registered mail is prohibited.

- O.** Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on USPS.com.

- P.** APO is used for the receipt and dispatch of official mail only.

- Q.** Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

- R.** All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under PUB 52, Sec. 421, are prohibited.

- R1.** Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling materials, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

- S.** Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions and weight:

- Maximum length 12 inches.
- Maximum width 12 inches.
- Maximum height 5 1/2 inches.
- Maximum weight 25 pounds.

The maximum length and girth combined may not exceed 47 inches.

- T.** Mailings of case lots of food and supplemental household shipments must be approved by the sender's parent agency prior to mailing.

- U.** Parcels must weigh less than 16 ounces when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

- U1.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail weighing 13 ounces or less when addressed to Box R. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped." Videotapes are prohibited when addressed to Box R, regardless of weight.

- U2.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail letters only when addressed to Box R.

- U3.** Mail is limited to First-Class Mail correspondence (including voice and video cassettes), newspapers, magazines, photographs, not exceeding 16 ounces, when addressed to Box R.

- U4.** Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 pounds, regardless of class.

- V.** Priority Mail Express Military Service (PMEMS) not available from any origin.

- V1.** USPS Tracking is not available.

- W.** Meat products, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed, provided they remain in their original, hermetically sealed packages and bear USDA certification. Other meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hooved animals, wool samples, tobacco leaves, including chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, cigars, and cigarettes, or obscene material, including obscene drawings, photographs, films, and carvings, are prohibited. Exception: 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

- X.** Personal mail is limited to First-Class Mail items (to include audio cassettes and voice tapes) weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to official mail.

- Y.** Mail is limited to First-Class and Priority Mail items only. All Periodicals, Standard Mail items, and Package Services items (including SAM and PAL) are not authorized. This restriction also applies to official mail.

- Z.** No outside pieces (OSPs).

- Z1.** The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

## Freely Associated States (FAS) Restrictions

Effective March 19, 2015, the mailing restrictions for Freely Associated States will be listed in the Pull-Out section of the *Postal Bulletin* and updated periodically.

### Freely Associated States

Mail addressed to freely associated states is subject to certain conditions or restrictions of mailing regarding content, preparation, and handling. The FAS table below outlines these conditions as listed by each affected FAS ZIP Code™ through the use of footnoted mailing restrictions codes (see the [Restrictions](#) following the table). For additional information on available extra services for FAS destinations, see *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)*, part 503.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. ## Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark should affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

## How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-STAMP-24, or at The Postal Store® website at [www.usps.com/shop](http://www.usps.com/shop).

### Traditional Postmarks

Customers should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address them to themselves or others, or provide a self-addressed return envelope with sufficient postage large enough to accommodate the canceled item. Mail the request to the corresponding city of issuance. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment. After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.

All postmark requests should go to the first-day-of-issue city. The first-day-of-issue city Post Office will then forward in bulk all postmark requests to Cancellation Services, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992 by respective Post Offices.

### Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16" side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2" high x 4" long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers should submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers should affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their can-

celed items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of their postmarked items. Mail the request for a first-day-of-issue digital color postmark to the corresponding city of issuance. Post Offices will then forward all customer requests for digital color postmarks to Cancellation Ser-

vices, Stamp Fulfillment Services, PO Box 449992, Kansas City, MO 64144-9992.

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail.






