

Cover Story

Regulations for Proper Flag Display

Regulations for the proper display of flags are in part 47 of the *Administrative Support Manual* (ASM). We have reprinted these sections of the ASM so Postmasters can ensure that the American flag, the Postal Service™ flag, and the MIA-POW f47 flag are properly displayed. 47 Flags

471 Flags at Postal Facilities

471.1 Which May Be Displayed

Except as governed by host facilities as noted in 472.21, the only flags to be displayed at postal facilities are the flag of the United States of America, the Postal Service flag, the POW-MIA flag, and, when authorized by the vice president of Corporate Relations, flags directly related to the programs, missions, and activities of the United States Postal Service. Flags of states, commonwealths, or local governments must not be displayed.

471.2 Relative Placement

471.21 When Displayed on Flagstaffs

Other flags are flown below the U.S. flag if displayed on the same flagstaff and at the same level or lower if displayed on a separate flagstaff. When the U.S. flag is flown at half-staff, all other flags are to be at half-staff.

471.22 When Displayed on Speaker's Platform

When the United States flag and the Postal Service flag are displayed on a speaker's platform in an auditorium, the United States flag must occupy the position of honor and be placed at the speaker's right as the speaker faces the audience, with the Postal Service flag at the speaker's left.

472 U.S. Flag Display

472.1 Regulations for Proper Display

472.11 Placement

If the flag of the United States is not flown from a vertical flagstaff, the following regulations apply:

- a. When the flag is displayed from a staff projecting horizontally or at an angle from the window sill, balcony, or front of a building, the union of the flag (blue field

and stars) must be placed at the peak of the staff unless the flag is at half-staff.

- b. When the flag is suspended over a sidewalk from a rope extending from a building to a pole at the edge of the sidewalk, the flag must be hoisted out, union first, from the building.
- c. When the flag is displayed otherwise than by being flown from a staff, it must be displayed flat, whether indoors or out, or so suspended that its folds fall as free as though the flag were staffed.

472.12 Respect

No disrespect may be shown to the flag of the United States of America. It must never:

- a. Be dipped to any person or thing.
- b. Be displayed with the union down save as a signal of dire distress.
- c. Be used as drapery of any sort whatsoever; never festooned, drawn back, nor up in folds, but always allowed to fall free.
- d. Touch anything beneath it, such as the ground, the floor, water, or merchandise.
- e. Be fastened, displayed, used, or stored in such a manner as will permit it to be easily torn, soiled, or damaged in any way.
- f. Be used as a covering for a ceiling.
- g. Have placed upon it, nor on any part of it, nor attached to it any mark, insignia, letter, word, figure, design, picture, or drawing of any nature.
- h. Be used as a receptacle for receiving, holding, carrying, or delivering anything.

472.13 Raising and Lowering

472.131 Full Staff

As soon after sunrise as practicable, the flag must be hoisted briskly to the peak of the staff. Care must be taken that it not touch the ground. The flag must always be displayed with the union (blue field) at the peak of the staff (unless the flag is at half-staff). No later than sunset, the flag must be lowered ceremoniously and not allowed to touch the ground. It must be folded or rolled carefully and stored where it will not be soiled or otherwise damaged. If the flag is wet when taken down, it must be carefully spread out and allowed to dry thoroughly before being stored.

472.132 Half-Staff

Displaying the flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff. The flag must first be hoisted to the peak of the staff and then slowly lowered to half-staff. When the flag is lowered for the day, it must be raised again to the peak and then lowered slowly before being stored for the night. When the flag is displayed at half-staff during a period of mourning, it must be so displayed on all days included in such period.

472.14 Bad Weather

During severe weather when it is probable that the flag will be damaged, it should not be flown.

472.2 Postal Display

472.21 Where Displayed

The flag of the United States must be displayed on stationary flagstaffs at all Post Offices, branches, stations, terminals, garages, and postal facilities, including leased and rented premises. If the Post Office unit is located in a facility operated by the General Services Administration, that agency's regulations on the display of the flag govern. If the Post Office unit is located on a military reservation, the military regulations on the display of the flag on the reservation govern.

472.22 When Displayed

When employees are on duty in a postal facility, the flag must be displayed except in severe weather as noted in

472.14. It is raised as soon after sunrise as practicable and lowered at the time of closing or no later than sunset.

472.23 When Displayed Half-Staff

472.231 Specific Days

When the flag is being displayed, it must be flown at half-staff (see 472.132) on the following dates:

May 15	Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below)
Last Monday in May	Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below)
December 7	National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day

Note 1: When May 15, which is the date for Peace Officers Memorial Day, falls on the third Saturday in May, which is the date for Armed Forces Day, the Postal Service follows the regulations in the United States Code (36 U.S.C. 175) and flies the U.S. flag in the full-staff position, *not* at half-staff.

Note 2: On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, the flag must be flown at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which it is raised, until 12 noon, and then hoisted to the peak of the staff, where it must be flown until the time of closing or no later than sunset.

472.232 Deaths of Prominent Persons

When the flag is being displayed, it must be flown at half-staff on the death of any person as indicated in Exhibit 472.232.

Exhibit 472.232 Half-Staff Display on Death of a Prominent Person

On Death Of:	Flag Displayed Half-Staff:	On All Federal Buildings In:
President or former President	For 30 days from date of death.	District of Columbia; throughout the U.S., and its territories and possessions
Vice President, U.S. Chief Justice or retired Chief Justice, or Speaker of the House of Representatives	For 10 days from date of death..	
Associate Justice of Supreme Court, Cabinet member, Former Vice President, President Pro Tempore of the Senate, Majority Leader of House, Minority Leader of House,	From date of death until interment..	
U.S. Senator, U.S. Representative, or Delegate	On date of death and following day..	Metropolitan area of District of Columbia; the state, congressional district, territory, or commonwealth .
Resident Commissioner from Commonwealth of Puerto Rico	From date of death until interment..	Commonwealth of Puerto Rico
Governor of a state, territory, or possession	From date of death until interment..	The state, territory, or possession
Prominent local citizen	From date of death until immediately after funeral..	Locally
Other official, former official, or foreign dignitary	The flag is displayed half-staff under orders or instructions issued by or at the direction of the President, or according to recognized customs or practices not inconsistent with law..	

472.233 Other Occasions

Other occasions on which the flag may be displayed at half-staff include the following:

- a. On days proclaimed by the president of the United States.
- b. The heads of government departments and agencies may direct that the flag be flown at half-staff on buildings, grounds, etc., under their jurisdiction on occasions other than those specified which they consider proper. The vice president of Corporate Relations notifies area, district, and plant managers by either broadcast fax or electronic mail of such an order. They, in turn, notify the heads of all postal facilities reporting to them.
- c. The flag may be displayed at half-staff on days when funerals of returned war dead are being held locally, when the flags on municipal, county, or state buildings and business establishments generally are being displayed in that manner.

* * * *

475 Postal Service Flag Display**475.1 Authorized Use**

The Postal Service flag is authorized for use as follows:

- a. On or in front of Postal Service installations.
- b. At Postal Service ceremonies.
- c. At conferences in which the Postal Service is participating (including display in Postal Service conference rooms).
- d. At governmental or public appearances of Postal Service officers and/or executives.
- e. In the offices of Postal Service officers.
- f. By all Postal Service vice presidents of Area Operations, district managers, and all field units reporting directly to Headquarters.
- g. On the approval of a vice president, when judged to be in the best interest of the Postal Service.
- h. As otherwise authorized by the Postmaster General or designee.

475.2 Display Regulations

The Postal Service flag is displayed only in conjunction with the United States flag. The same regulations for proper display of the United States flag described in 471 and 472 must also be followed when displaying the Postal Service flag.

* * * * *

476 POW-MIA Flag Display**476.1 Policy**

The Defense Authorization Act, Public Law 105-85, section 1082, requires that postal facilities display the POW-MIA flag on six specified days each year:

Armed Forces Day	Third Saturday in May
Memorial Day	Last Monday in May
Flag Day	June 14
Independence Day	July 4
National POW-MIA Recognition Day	Third Friday in September
Veterans Day	November 11

Note: If any of these days fall on a non-business day, postal facilities are required to display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.

476.2 Display**476.21 Description**

The POW-MIA flag that may be flown at postal facilities is the National League of Families POW-MIA flag that is recognized officially and designated by Public Law 101-355, section 2.

476.22 Regulations

The POW-MIA flag must be displayed in a manner designed to ensure visibility to the public.

476.23 Placement with the United States Flag

No other flag should be placed above or, if on the same level, to the right of United States flag.



Postmasters' Publicity Kit: Total Eclipse of the Sun Forever Stamp

Tens of millions of people in the United States hope to view this once-in-a-lifetime event — the August 21, 2017, total solar eclipse.



The approximately 70-mile-wide “path of totality” of the Moon’s shadow will cross portions of 14 states from Oregon to South Carolina (svs.gsfc.nasa.gov/4515). This is the first total solar eclipse to cross the entire country since 1918. The last eclipse seen on the U.S. mainland was in 1979.



To commemorate the event, the U.S. Postal Service® will release the *Total Eclipse of the Sun* Forever® stamps on June 20, 2017. This first-of-its-kind stamp (for the U.S.) transforms into an image of the Moon from the heat of a finger. For illustrative purposes, two stamp images are featured throughout this kit to show how the stamp image transforms. The Postal Service™ is offering this single design issuance in a pane of 16 stamps.

Retired NASA Astrophysicist Fred Espanak (mreclipse.com/MrEclipse.html) of Portal, AZ, photographed the eclipse and Moon images. The back of the stamp pane provides a map of the eclipse path and the times it will appear in some locations. For more details, visit NASA's website at eclipse.gsfc.nasa.gov/SEgoogle/SEgoogle2001/SE2017Aug21Tgoogle.html. The public may share news on social media using the hashtag #EclipseStamps.

Postmasters may conduct special dedication ceremonies after June 20. Postmasters can maximize media attention by hosting their events on August 21, the day of the eclipse, to add that “local news angle” to a national story. **Note:** Special dedications **cannot** take place on the same day as a national first-day-of-issue stamp dedication.

First-of-its-Kind Stamp

The *Total Eclipse of the Sun* Forever stamp uses thermochromic ink to reveal a second image using the body heat of your thumb or fingers. Just rub the eclipse image with your fingers to see an underlying image of the Moon. The image reverts back to the eclipse once it cools.

Total Eclipse of the Sun Special Pictorial Postmark



Stamp Services designed this special pictorial postmark for the *Total Eclipse of the Sun* stamp. Postmasters also have the ability to design their own postmarks in accordance with Handbook PO-230, *Pictorial Postmarks*. Send all Pictorial Postmarks requests for the *Total Eclipse of the Sun* stamp to *PictorialPostmarks@usps.gov* within the 4-week timeframe before the event. **Note:** This is an exception to the normal rule of 8–10 weeks.

Stamp Services will not accept requests after the 4-week timeframe before the event. You must complete the requested information for all pictorials including the one shown here. Please include a completed PS Form 413, *Pictorial Postmark Announcement/Report*, with your request.

Promotion Materials

The Postmasters' Publicity Kit at blue.usps.gov/corp-comm/national-events/postmaster-kits/pm-promotion-kits.htm includes all of the elements you need to conduct a successful special stamp dedication ceremony

Note: The term “second day ceremony” is no longer used as it incorrectly implies that local Post Office™ events may only occur on the day following the first-day-of-issue. Special dedication ceremonies may occur any time after the first-day-of-issue date, but not on the same date as another stamp first-day-of-issue.

The kit contains:

- Stamp enlargement information;
- Information on sharing your event date;
- A sample Media Advisory;
- A sample News Release;
- A sample Speech;
- A list of eclipse-related organizations such as planetariums, science centers, NASA, and astronomy organizations that can provide public speakers or a venue to conduct your event;
- Government Relations contacts (if you have a need to contact elected officials); and
- Corporate Communications Field Manager contacts for support while promoting your event through the media.

Obtaining Stamp Enlargements

It is recommended that Postmasters order one blow-up containing the overlapped eclipse and Moon image as shown here.



If Postmasters also wish to display the map depicted on the back of the stamp pane, they must order the map as a separate blow-up for easier viewing during the event. The normal size for blow-ups used for unveilings is 48" by 48".

Share Your Event Date

At least 15 days before your event, please submit special dedication event location and date information by visiting Blue at uspsonlinesolutions.wufoo.com/forms/district-stamp-ceremonies/.

Ordering First-Day-of-Issue Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office, at usps.com/shop, or by calling 800-782-6724. They must affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes to themselves or others, and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark up to a quantity of 50. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. All orders must be postmarked by August 20, 2017.

Ordering First-Day Covers

The Postal Service also offers first-day covers for new stamp issues and Postal Service stationery items postmarked with the official first-day-of-issue cancellation. DMM Revision: Parcel Select Lightweight Dimensional Criteria

Effective July 10, 2017, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), subsections 201.7.6 and 201.8.5.3, to clarify the dimensional criteria of Parcel Select Lightweight® (PSLW) parcels.

The DMM states that PSLW prices are only available for eligible machinable, machinable lightweight, or irregular parcels. The DMM further states that a parcel exceeding the maximum dimensional criteria for a machinable parcel is considered a nonmachinable parcel and, therefore, is not eligible for PSLW prices. The Postal Service will revise subsection 201.7.6, Irregular Parcel, to note that a parcel exceeding the maximum machinable parcel dimensional criteria is a nonmachinable parcel. The Postal Service will also revise subsection 201.8.5.3, Parcel Select Lightweight, to state that a parcel exceeding the maximum dimensional criteria for a machinable parcel is not eligible for PSLW prices. This revision clarifies that a parcel exceeding the maximum machinable parcel dimensional criteria is a nonmachinable parcel, and that a PSLW parcel cannot exceed the maximum machinable parcel dimensional criteria.

Although we will not publish these revisions in the DMM until August 7, 2017, the standards are effective immediately.

7.6 Irregular Parcel

An irregular parcel is a parcel not meeting the dimensional criteria for machinable parcels in 7.5.1 or lightweight machinable parcels in 7.5.2 (a parcel that exceeds the maximum dimensional criteria in 7.5.1 is a nonmachinable parcel under 7.7).***

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS®" repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changed.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service® Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals, including in their raw, unmanufactured state, are prohibited. Official Mail shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Reserved for future use.

A2. Reserved for future use.

B. Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration (PS Form 2976, PS Form 2976-A, or PS Form 2976-B) is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from this ZIP Code. All PMEMS mailpieces (regardless of mail contents or weight) addressed to or from this ZIP Code must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-B. The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-duty letters or printed matter, except for Priority Mail Express, which requires a customs form for all contents and weights. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an MPO except for those MPOs to which restriction "B2" applies and except for Priority Mail Express, which requires a customs form from all mailers.
- If mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this MPO or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products, including tobacco leaves, chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, and cigars are prohibited, including those that are authorized in Publication 52 under PACT.

C1. Obscene and horror articles, images, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, comic books, etc., are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as Official Mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Mailers are responsible to ensure that all medicines and vaccines conform to host nation laws.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic, or sexual items are prohibited. Non-authorized political materials are prohibited. Religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, but individual items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless/cellular telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited, except firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed from this MPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms do not require an ATF form.

F1. Weapons of any type are prohibited.

F2. Mailing firearms to or from this MPO ZIP Code is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

F3. Replica weapons and inert explosive devices (such as grenades) and weapons parts are prohibited.

G. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hooved animals, and wool samples whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Reserved for future use.

I1. Reserved for future use.

I2. Reserved for future use.

I3. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 27 inches.
- Maximum width 14 inches.
- Maximum height 14 inches.

J. Standard Post and Parcel Select parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Reserved for future use.

L. All Official Mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, live animals, and live plants are prohibited.

N. Registered Mail service is prohibited.

O. Reserved for future use.

P. Official Mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under Publication 52, Part 421, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Synthetic cannabinoids used to stimulate the central nervous system commonly known as "synthetic marijuana," "K2," or "Spice" are prohibited.

T. Mailings of household shipments and case lots of food to or from an MPO require military transportation office approval prior to mailing. Mailings to or from a DPO require pre-approval from the Diplomatic Pouch and Mail Director.

U. Mail addressed to Retirees (Box R) is limited to 16 ounces and up to a 90-day supply of TRICARE medications. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail items, including audio and video media, weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to Official Mail.

U2. Retirees (Box R) are not authorized mail service.

U3. Reserved for future use.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 lbs.

V. PMEMS is not available.

V1. Electronic Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on *USPS.com*. Manual record of delivery may be available upon request.

W. Hermetically sealed packages of meat products bearing USDA certification, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed. 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Cremated remains are prohibited.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail and Priority Mail items only. This restriction also applies to Official Mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Displaying the U.S. Flag and the POW-MIA Flag

U.S. Flag at Half-Staff

How to Display

Displaying the U.S. flag at *half-staff* means lowering the flag to half the distance between the top and bottom of the staff.

Specific Dates

Display the U.S. flag at half-staff on the following days each year:

- May 15: Peace Officers Memorial Day (see note 1 below).
- Last Monday in May: Memorial Day Observed (see note 2 below).
- December 7: National Pearl Harbor Remembrance Day.



Note 1: When May 15, which is the date for Peace Officers Memorial Day, falls on the third Saturday in May, which is the date for Armed Forces Day, display the U.S. flag in the full-staff position, *not* at half-staff.

Note 2: On the last Monday in May, when Memorial Day is observed, display the flag at half-staff from sunrise, or the hour at which you raise it, until noon, and then hoist it to the peak of the staff, until the time of closing or no later than sunset.

POW-MIA Flag

How to Display

In relation to the U.S. flag, display the POW-MIA flag (and any other flag) as follows:

- If displayed on the same flagstaff, place it below the U.S. flag.
- If displayed on a separate flagstaff, place it at the same level or lower. If displayed at the same level, place it on the U.S. flag's left.

When flying the U.S. flag at half-staff, fly the POW-MIA flag (and any other flags) at half-staff also.



Specific Dates

Display the POW-MIA flag on the following days each year:

- Armed Forces Day: Third Saturday in May.
- Memorial Day: Last Monday in May.
- Flag Day: June 14.
- Independence Day: July 4.
- National POW-MIA Recognition Day: Third Friday in September.
- Veterans Day: November 11.

If any of these days fall on a nonbusiness day, display the POW-MIA flag on the last business day before the designated day.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. See the *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan* for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks. The monthly returns of the TSP Funds represent net earnings for the month after deduction of accrued administrative expenses and, except for the G Fund, after deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees as well. Reminder: Fiscal Year 2017 Bank Secrecy Act/Anti-Money Laundering Training

The Fiscal Year (FY) 2017 Bank Secrecy Act/Anti-Money Laundering (BSA/AML) mandatory training course is available online through the Learning Management System (LMS). All Postal Service™ employees who sell U.S. Postal Service® financial instruments (postal money orders, Sure Money®, and gift cards) and supervisors must complete 2017 Bank Secrecy Act: The Perfect Form (course number 10025922).

Note: This course is one of the FY 2017 **mandatory** strategic training initiatives. Employees must complete the mandatory BSA training by June 30, 2017.

Background

To combat money laundering in the United States, Congress enacted a series of laws collectively known as the Bank Secrecy Act. The Act specifically names the Postal Service as a seller of money orders, and we must comply with all of the legal requirements. One of the requirements under the Act is to report suspicious transactions involving Postal Service financial instruments.

Training focuses on the latest information regarding anti-money laundering policies, procedures, and suspicious activity trends, and highlights upcoming changes to PS Form 8105-A, *Funds Transaction Report*.

Training Methods

The preferred method for taking the course is online through LMS. Employees who work at offices with a slow Internet connection may take the course via a DVD. If you are unable to complete the web-based version of the course through LMS because of a low bandwidth connection, you can order a training DVD directly through the Topeka Material Distribution Center using PSN # 6910180002065 or through eBuy2 using PSIN # 10025922. Document completion of training via the DVD in the After-The-Fact (ATF) Training Entry Portal. Do not book the web-based course if you are using the DVD.

Instructions for Training Completion: Bargaining Unit and EAS Non-Exempt Employees

All employees associated with occupational codes required to take this training will see this course automatically populate in their LMS screens. To find the course, follow these basic steps:

1. Log into the LMS. Under "Essential Links" on the *Blue* home page, click "Learning Management System."
2. Enter your ACE ID and Password. Once you are logged in, click the Learning Portal icon.

3. Navigate to the Messages and Notes section.
 - a. Click the "Mandatory Courses" tab. You will see the course listed as "Bank Secrecy Act: The Perfect Form course number 10025922."
 - b. Click the course; the course information populates on the right.
4. Click "Book this Course."
5. Once the course is booked, click "Start Now."
6. Once you complete the course, your training history will show this training as completed.

Instructions for Training Completion: EAS-Exempt Employees

All employees not associated with occupational codes required to take this training will need to search for the course in LMS. To find the course, follow these basic steps:

1. Log into the LMS. Under "Essential Links" on the *Blue* home page, click "Learning Management System."
2. Enter your ACE ID and Password. Once you are logged in, click the Learning Portal icon.
3. Enter the course number, 10025922, into the Search Term box on the left, then click "Find."
4. The course information automatically populates on the right.
5. Scroll to the bottom of the page, then click "Book this Course."
6. Wait for the screen confirming your enrollment.
7. Click "Start Now" to begin the course.

Web-based Training Completion

1. After you complete the web-based training, click "Log Off."
2. Wait for the Learning Portal to refresh.
3. Once the course description page refreshes, you will see a note at the top of the course information page that reads "You have already completed and passed this course."
4. The course is now listed in the "Completed Courses" section.

DVD Version – For Offices with Low Connectivity

Follow these steps to receive course credit after you have completed the course:

1. Launch the ATF Training Entry Portal.
2. Enter course number 10025922 or course title "Bank Secrecy Act: The Perfect Form," then click "Find."

3. The Search results will appear with the course number and title.
4. Click "Add."
5. Click "Create Roster."
6. Enter "Start Date" and "End Date."
7. Click "Participants" tab.
8. In "Participant Search," use the drop-down menu to choose "Personnel Number (EID)." Enter the EID and click "Find."
9. Click the "Add Course Participant" box.

10. Select "Course Passed," then click "Submit."
11. The course is added to your training record.

Limited ACE System Access for Contractors Beginning with Courses Due June 30, 2017

The first annual deadline for CyberSafe courses is June 30, 2017.

If you are a contractor, complete all CyberSafe courses by the completion deadlines to avoid limited ACE system access.

Technical Support Scams: A Brief History

Technical support scams have become increasingly popular. Such scams often involve tricking victims into thinking their device is infected, which enables hackers to steal information by persuading individuals to take certain actions to “fix” the problem. On average, such scams cost victims nearly \$300 to solve a problem that never existed in the first place.¹

Just last year, the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) shut down a fraudulent tech support call center in Florida. In this scheme, hackers caused fake security pop-ups to appear on users’ devices, which warned of potential malware. The hackers then offered to help by fraudulently claiming to be representatives of major technology companies.²

Similarly, in 2015, the FTC closed a tech support scam in Pennsylvania and Connecticut. Collectively, hackers stole over \$17 million from victims. Again, hackers posed as representatives from major technology companies and convinced victims that their devices required tech support services.³

In both cases, hackers targeted victims who were afraid to damage their device or lose important files. If you fall victim to a tech support scam, take the following actions:

- **Notify the impersonated company.** Let the company know that scammers are taking advantage of their brand. Before reaching out, make sure you have the correct contact information. Look it up yourself; don’t use the information provided to you.⁴

- **Contact your bank.** You may need to request a freeze on your account if you provided sensitive information, such as your credit card number. Alert your bank or credit card company to protect yourself from further damage.
- **Change your passwords.** Any websites that require you to log in with a username and password may be compromised. Reset passwords for such accounts, especially those containing sensitive information.⁵
- **Contact the FTC.** The FTC provides help to scam victims. If you’ve become a victim of fraudulent tech support, call the FTC at 877-FTC-HELP.

If you suspect your USPS® device has been compromised, report it immediately to the CyberSecurity Operations Center (CSOC) at cbersafe@usps.gov.

Stamp Announcement 17-30: Sharks Stamps

On July 26, 2017, in Newport, KY, the U.S. Postal Service® will issue the **Sharks** stamps (Forever® priced at 49 cents), in five designs, in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 474500). **The Sharks \$9.80 pane of 20 stamps may not be split, and the stamps may not be sold individually.** The stamps will go on sale nationwide July 26, 2017.

This issuance celebrates the wonder of sharks with a pane of 20 stamps featuring realistic images of five species that inhabit American waters:

- The mako shark, represented here by a shortfin mako (*Isurus oxyrinchus*);
- The whale shark (*Rhincodon typus*);
- The thresher shark, here a pelagic thresher (*Alopias pelagicus*);
- The hammerhead shark, this one a scalloped hammerhead (*Sphyrna lewini*); and
- The great white shark (*Carcharodon carcharias*).

On the selvage, the stamp image of the great white shark is repeated at the top of the pane. The background blue color deepens in shade as one looks down the pane, evoking inky ocean waters barely penetrated by sunlight. Art director Derry Noyes designed the stamp pane with original artwork by Sam Weber.

Stamp Fulfillment Services will make an automatic push distribution to Post Offices™ of a quantity to cover approximately 30 days of sales. Distribution quantities for the automatic push distribution are available by logging on to SFS Web at sfsweb.usps.gov. Post Offices may begin ordering stamps on the first-day-of-issue through SFS Web; offices must also check the amount they will receive on their automatic push distribution.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Postmark

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office, at The Postal Store® website at usps.com/shop, or by calling 800-782-6724. They should affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service™ will return the envelopes through the mail. There is no charge for the postmark up to a quantity of 50. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. All orders must be postmarked by September 26, 2017.

Stamp Announcement 17-31: Protect Pollinators Stamps



© 2016

On August 3, 2017, in Richmond, VA, the U.S. Postal Service® will issue the *Protect Pollinators* stamps (Forever® priced at 49 cents), in five designs, in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 475200). **The *Protect Pollinators* \$9.80 pane of 20 stamps may not be split, and the stamps may not be sold individually.** The stamps will go on sale nationwide August 3, 2017.

The U.S. Postal Service pays tribute to the beauty and importance of pollinators with stamps depicting two of our continent's most iconic: the monarch butterfly (*Danaus plexippus*) and the western honeybee (*Apis mellifera*), each shown industriously pollinating a variety of plants native to North America.

The stamps feature:

- A monarch and a coneflower (photo by Karen Mayford);
- A western honeybee and a golden ragwort (photo by George D. Lepp);
- A monarch and a zinnia (photo by Bonnie Sue Rauch);
- A western honeybee and a New England aster (photo by Michael Durham); and
- A monarch and goldenrod (photo by Justin Fowler).

The remainder of the stamps in this pane recur in a scattered arrangement reminiscent of a field of wildflowers. The selvage photograph features a monarch and a goldenrod — a different view of the same two species depicted on one of the stamps (photo by Justin Fowler). These particular species exemplify the ecological service provided by all pollinators, which include other insects, birds, and bats. Trending declines in their populations alert us that pollinators now need mindful human intervention in order to thrive. Individuals can help butterflies, bees, and other pollinators by planting pollinator gardens that include native flowers or heirloom varieties of fruits and vegetables. Art director Derry Noyes designed this stamp pane with existing photographs.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears below. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*


All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark must affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed below.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. Each cover must have sufficient postage to meet First-Class Mail® requirements. Customers may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-782-6724, or at The Postal Store® website at usps.com/shop.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service™ recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16 inches side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2 inches high by 4 inches long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers must submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.
