Background

The 2018 primary season is here and the Postal Service™ is preparing for the November 2018 general election. There will be several congressional, gubernatorial, state, and local races. Thus, proper handling of Election Mail and Political Mail is critical.

Concerns have been raised about how long it takes for Election Mail and Political Mail to reach voters. The Postal Service takes these concerns very seriously. Coast to coast, plans are in place to ensure the timely receipt, processing, and delivery of Election Mail and Political Mail.

Generally, citizens use one of the following three methods to cast their votes:

- A traditional polling place via electronic or paper ballot.
- An absentee paper ballot, or
- Early in-person voting.

Although traditional poll voting is still the preferred method, voting by mail is increasing in popularity across broad segments of the American electorate. In the 2014 midterm federal election, 25 percent of voters cast ballots by mail — an increase of 9.5 percent over the 2010 midterm election.

Key Dates

- Primaries began March 6 in Texas and will continue through November.
- General Election November 6.

Key Elections

- General Election November 6.
- A total of 470 seats in the U.S. Congress are up for election:
 - 35 Senate seats AZ, CA, CT, DE, FL, HI, IN, MA, MD, ME, MI, MN (2), MO, MS (2), MT, ND, NE, NJ, NM, NV, NY, OH, PA, RI, TN, TX, UT, VA, VT, WA, WI, WV, and WY.

Election Mail and Political Mail Overview What is Election Mail?

Election Mail is any item mailed to or from authorized election officials that enables citizens to participate in the voting process, such as balloting materials, voter registration cards, absentee applications, and polling place notifications.

What is Political Mail?

Political Mail includes Political Campaign Mail and Political Message Mail.

- Political Campaign Mail is any material mailed at First-Class Mail® or USPS Marketing Mail® prices for political campaign purposes by a registered political candidate, a campaign committee (federal, state, or local), or a committee of a political party (e.g., Democratic National Committee or Republican Congressional Campaign Committee) to promote political candidates, referendums, or political campaigns.
- Political Message Mail is any material mailed at First-Class Mail or USPS Marketing Mail prices by a political action committee (PAC), super-PAC, or other organization engaging in issue advocacy or voter mobilization.

Political Mail may be sent for any public election — partisan or nonpartisan — for which there is a ballot. Political Mail is identified using red Tag 57, *Political Campaign Mailing*.

Plan Objectives

- Educate and inform the public on proper mail handling, key dates, and general tips for Election Mail and Political Mail.
- Reinforce the message that the Postal Service takes its job of delivering ballots and other Election Mail and Political Mail very seriously.
- Ensure the correct use of Tag 57, Political Campaign Mailing. Political Message Mail (mailings from certain groups about issue advocacy or voter mobilization) and Political Campaign Mail (mailings from certain groups or individuals related to a candidate, campaign, or referendum) both use Tag 57.
- Ensure the correct use of Tag 191, Domestic and International Mail-In Ballots. Postal Service employees must correctly identify and promptly process this mail
- Ensure the correct use of the official Election Mail logo. It may be used on all Election Mail, including ballots
- Inform election officials that ballots will be handled correctly. Educate them on service standards so they can ensure ballots are mailed and returned by the deadline.

 Ensure Postal Service employees know that they must always promptly and efficiently handle Election Mail or Political Mail with equal care and attention.

New for the 2018 Election Cycle

The Postal Service has improved ballot mail visibility by developing new Service Type Identifiers (STIDs) specifically for ballots. These STIDs were developed to identify ballots on-hand and improve ballot tracking in the mailstream. The benefits of using the new STIDs include:

- Increased visibility of outbound and returning ballot mail within the automation environment,
- Passive identification and tracking of ballot mail, and
- The potential to increase public confidence in voting by mail.

The new process leverages Intelligent Mail[®] barcode scan data that is available via Informed Visibility[®] reports. Now, unique 9-digit ZIP Code[™] numbers registered to local election offices can be used for return ballots, which enables individual mail holdouts on mail processing equipment and expedites the sorting and delivery of marked ballots. Tag 191, Domestic and International Mail-In Ballots, is a green container tag used by election officials to identify trays and sacks of ballot mail destined for either domestic or international addresses. Additionally, the Postal Service updated the interactive Election and Political Mail map, which provides election officials with contact information for Election and Political Mail coordinators. The interactive map now includes business mail entry unit addresses and phone numbers, as well as a new ZIP Code search feature to streamline the resource identification process. Key Messages

- U.S. Mail[®] services are an important part of the U.S. election process. The Postal Service will ensure the dependable and timely delivery of Election Mail and Political Mail.
- Customers can trust the Postal Service to deliver Vote-By-Mail ballots in a timely manner.
- The Postal Service offers a state-by-state outreach program to ensure election boards, political candidates, and mailers are aware of the deadlines for Election Mail and Political Mail.

- The Postal Service takes pride in the popularity of U.S. Mail as an efficient and effective means for citizens to participate in the voting process.
- The Postal Service expects to handle millions of ballots this election cycle proof that mail is a dependable and protected way to cast a vote. Voter communication ensures that ballots have sufficient time to be processed, delivered, and counted.
- The Postal Service suggests that election officials include a voter notification in the ballot material packet to ensure the timely delivery of ballots. Return by mail dates are based on state and local laws, but the Postal Service recommends the following:
 - Domestic non-military voters are advised to mail ballots at least one week before the due date to account for any unforeseen events or weather issues.
 - Military personnel serving overseas, such as Army Post Office/Fleet Post Office (APO/FPO) voters, must follow the return by mail date for their location (see usps.com/electionmail).

Key Voter Message — Return Ballots

Customers who opt to vote through U.S. Mail service must understand their local jurisdiction's requirements for timely submission of absentee ballots, including postmarking requirements. Voters must contact their local election officials for questions about local deadlines. The Postal Service recommends that voters mail their ballots at least 1 week before the due date to account for any unforeseen events or weather issues.

Key Election Official Message — Ballots

Whether using First-Class Mail or USPS Marketing Mail service, customers are encouraged to work closely with local Postal Service Election Mail coordinators to determine delivery times for the mailings. For coordinator contact information, visit usps.com/electionmail.

Election Mail

Absentee Ballots

Not all voters can get to the polling place on Election Day. An absentee ballot is the printed ballot marked by an absent voter, sealed in a special envelope, and given or mailed to the municipal clerk.

Each election cycle presents a different set of parameters for ballot creation and for the size and weight of the return mailpiece. As a result, many voters do not know the correct amount of postage required to return their ballots by mail. Election officials must consult with Postal Service officials to determine the proper postage required for mailing ballots to voters and for voters mailing ballots to election officials.

Absentee and Early Voting

Most states have a method for eligible voters to cast ballots before Election Day, either during the early voting period or by requesting an absentee ballot. In 13 states, early voting is not available, and in 20 states, a reason is required to request an absentee ballot. States typically offer three ways for voters to cast a ballot before Election Day:

- 1. Early Voting. In 37 states (including three that mail ballots to all voters for every election) and the District of Columbia, any qualified voter may cast a ballot in person during a designated period before Election Day. No excuse or justification is required.
- 2. Absentee Voting. All states will mail an absentee ballot to qualified voters who request one. The voter may return the ballot by mail or in person. In 20 states, a reason is required, while 27 states and the District of Columbia permit any qualified voter to vote absentee without offering a justification. Some states offer a permanent absentee ballot list. Once a voter asks to be added to the list, he or she will automatically receive an absentee ballot for all future elections.
- 3. Mail Voting. A ballot is automatically mailed to every eligible voter (no request or application is necessary). In-person voting sites may also be available. Three states mail ballots to all eligible voters for every election. Other states may provide this option for some types of elections.

Vote-By-Mail

According to the National Conference of State Legislatures, 22 states have provisions allowing certain elections to be conducted entirely by mail. For these elections, all registered voters receive a ballot in the mail. Typically, the voter marks the ballot, puts it in a secrecy envelope or sleeve, places it into a separate mailing envelope, signs an affidavit on the exterior of the mailing envelope, and returns the package via mail or by dropping it off.

Ballots are mailed in advance of Election Day so voters have an "election period" instead of a single day to vote. All-mail elections, known as "Vote-By-Mail" can be seen as absentee voting for everyone.

As of January 2017, three of the 22 states — Oregon (2000), Washington (2011), and Colorado (2013) — hold all elections entirely by mail. California (2016) will begin holding all-mail elections in 2018. Traditional in-person voting precincts are not available in these three states. Instead, voters return ballots by mail, in a drop-off location, and in some cases vote in-person at voter centers. Other states permit all-mail elections in certain circumstances, such as for special districts, municipal elections, when candidates run unopposed, or at the discretion of the county clerk.

Generally, states begin providing all-mail elections only in certain circumstances, and then add additional opportunities as citizens become familiar with procedures. For more information, visit ncsl.org/research/elections-and-campaigns/all-mail-elections.aspx.

The National Conference of State Legislatures also reports that at least 17 states and the District of Columbia allow some form of permanent absentee voting. In some states, this system is called "permanent mail-in voting." Permanent absentee voting operates in a similar manner to all-mail elections. Voters in these states can sign up to have a ballot automatically mailed for every election where the voter is eligible.

Military — APO/FPO/DPO

Key Messages

- Even in times of war, the Postal Service has delivered the most fundamental symbol of democracy a ballot. The Postal Service is honored to provide the brave men and woman serving abroad in the military with the opportunity to vote.
- Any American voter living overseas can mail his or her completed ballot back to the United States free of charge at the nearest American embassy, consulate, or Diplomatic Post Office (DPO). If the voter has authorized access to a military base, he or she can mail a ballot free of charge at the nearest Army Post Office (APO) or Fleet Post Office (FPO).
- For the 2018 midterm election, special procedures for APO/FPO/DPO absentee ballots are in effect between September 1 and November 6. During this time, the Postal Service will provide special handling for dispatch via the International Service Centers (ISCs).
- The Postal Service recommends that voters return ballots by these mailing dates (see <u>usps.com/elec-tionmail</u>).

Military - APO/FPO/DPO Absentee Ballots

The Postal Service and the Military Postal Service have joined forces to provide special handling of absentee ballots to overseas military personnel. The Postal Service is committed to ensuring that everyone who votes by mail experiences an efficient process.

Here is a summary of special procedures for APO/FPO/DPO absentee ballots:

- Election officials must mail absentee ballots at least
 45 days before the November 6 election.
- All military absentee ballots mailed by election officials from September 1 through November 6 will be subject to special handling procedures.
- Local election offices must segregate military absentee ballots to the Chicago ISC and the Miami ISC gateways. At ISCs, absentee ballots receive special

- handling including accelerated sortation, special tray identification, and priority transportation.
- APO/FPO absentee ballots will be sent from local Post Office™ locations to the nearest Processing and Distribution Center for further handling. Postal service employees may identify trays or containers of absentee ballot mail using Tag 191, *Domestic and International Mail-in Ballots*, and present them to the Post Office facility.

Military — APO/FPO/DPO Returning Absentee Ballots

Military personnel with APO/FPO/DPO addresses can return absentee ballots via Priority Mail Express[®] using Label 11-DOD, *DOD Express Mail Label Absentee Ballot.* The label includes "Waiver of Signature" and "Guaranteed by End of Day" endorsements, so ballots can be delivered the day they arrive at the destination Post Office.

Label 11-DOD




- The Military Postal Service distributes Label 11-DOD overseas and pays for the postage.
- The Priority Mail Express ballot label is only for absentee ballots mailed from Military Post Office facilities overseas.
- Voters may use the label on any size ballot envelope and must always affix it in the upper right corner.
- Voters keep part of the label to use the tracking number to track their ballots.
- At ISCs, absentee ballots receive special handling including accelerated sortation, special tray identification, and priority transportation.
- Overseas U.S. military and civilian citizens must return their absentee ballots via APO/FPO/DPO locations.
- The ballots arrive by international transportation at one of the Postal Service gateway offices for Customs clearance and initial processing at select designated offices.
- At these facilities, the mail is processed by postal automation equipment in an initial domestic primary sort for distribution throughout the United States.

Tag 191

Tag 191, Domestic and International Mail-In Ballots, is a green container tag used by election officials to identify trays and sacks of ballot mail destined for either domestic or international addresses. The tag (shown right) provides greater visibility to ballot mail during Postal Service handling. Election officials can order Tag 191 online at usps.com/electionmail.

Political Mail

Objectives

- Ensure the correct use of Tag 57, Political Campaign Mailing.
- Ensure Postal Service employees know that they must always promptly and efficiently process and deliver Political Mail. Mail entry personnel must ensure that all qualifying mail is documented as Political Mail.

Key Messages

- U.S. Mail services are an important part of the U.S. election process. The Postal Service considers the dependable and timely delivery of Political Mail promoting candidates and social causes essential to the success of the election mailing season.
- The best campaign is a multi-channel campaign. For candidates, Political Campaign Mail can help them reach constituents directly.
- Use Tag 57, Political Campaign Mailing, for the following mailings:
 - Any political campaign mailing by a registered political candidate, campaign committee, and committee of a political party; or
 - Political message mailing by a PAC, super-PAC, or other organization engaging in issue advocacy or voter mobilization.

Why Political Mail?

- Mail can reach 100 percent of targeted voters.
- Mail prompts action, often through other channels.
- Mail has been tested and is proven effective.

Political Mail Tools

- The Political Mail website (see *deliverthewin.com*) provides information on key contacts and other valuable resources, and serves as an online platform to promote direct mail through the following materials:
 - Educational articles,
 - White papers,
 - Case studies, and
 - Videos.
- Connections to digital content, such as augmented reality, emphasize the link between digital and hard copy content as a means to extend and increase the effectiveness of political messaging. Augmented reality mailpieces promote campaign messages in a way that engages voters.
- Postal Service webinars highlight key political industry topics.
- The Postal Service has sponsorship agreements with the American Association of Political Consultants and Campaigns and Elections to help promote the use of mail early and often in the political arena. Activities include:
 - Attending events and co-sponsored webinars,
 - Advertising and white paper development and placement, and

Tag 57

Tag 57, *Political Campaign Mailing,* is a red container tag used to identify Political Mail while it's in the mailstream. Tag 57 can be used in the following ways:

- In a Political Campaign Mailing by a registered political candidate, campaign committee, and committee of a political party; or
- In a Political Message Mailing by a PAC, super-PAC, or other organization engaging in issue advocacy or voter mobilization.

According to *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM[®]), a *registered political candidate or party* is defined as an individual or organization recognized by a government election control authority (national, state, or local).

FAQs

1. What is Election Mail?

Election Mail is any item mailed to or from authorized election officials that enables citizens to participate in the voting process, such as balloting materials, voter registration cards, absentee applications, and polling place notifications.

2. What is Political Mail?

Political Mail includes Political Campaign Mail and Political Message Mail.

- Political Campaign Mail is any material mailed at First-Class Mail or USPS Marketing Mail prices for political campaign purposes by a registered political candidate, a campaign committee (federal, state, or local), or a committee of a political party (e.g., Democratic National Committee or Republican Congressional Campaign Committee) to promote political candidates, referendums, or political campaigns.
- Political Message Mail is any material mailed at First-Class Mail or USPS Marketing Mail prices by a PAC, super-PAC, or other organization engaging in issue advocacy or voter mobilization.

Political Mail may be sent for any public election — partisan or nonpartisan — for which there is a ballot. Political Mail is identified using red Tag 57, *Political Campaign Mailing*.

3. What is Vote-By-Mail?

A ballot is automatically mailed to every registered voter in advance of Election Day. Traditional in-person voting precincts are not available, but there are multiple ways and locations for voters to return mail ballots.

4. What is No Excuse Absentee Voting?

All states will mail an absentee ballot to certain voters who request one. The voter must return the ballot by mail or in person. According to the National Conference of State Legislatures, 20 states require a voter to provide an excuse, while 27 states and the District of Columbia permit any qualified voter to vote absentee without offering an excuse. Some states offer a

permanent absentee ballot list. Once a voter asks to be added to the list, and is added by the election jurisdiction, he or she will automatically receive an absentee ballot for all future elections.

5. What are Absentee Ballots?

An absentee ballot is completed and typically mailed in advance of an election by a voter who is unable to be present at the polls.

6. What is Franked Mail?

Franked Mail is official mail sent by members and members-elect of Congress, the Vice-President, and other authorized individuals. Mail must relate to the mailer's official business, activities, and duties. Franked Mail has a written or facsimile signature of an authorized user in the upper right corner of the envelope or a franked label, followed by approved markings such as "M.C." (member of Congress) or "U.S.S." (U.S. Senate). A Franked Mail label is required for items larger than a flat-sized envelope. Franked Mail must not be returned for postage or delivered to the recipient as "postage due." Members of Congress are banned from sending Franked Mail mass mailings within a certain period of time (90 days for the House of Representatives and 60 days for the Senate) before a primary or general election in which the member is a candidate. Mass mailings contain 500 pieces or more that are substantially similar, subject to certain exceptions.

Franked Mailings (identified by Tag 11, *Congressional Mail*) are **NOT** eligible to use the red Tag 57. Franked Mail must be dispatched and delivered as addressed, and must not be detained, except for mail security.

7. How many states use Vote-By-Mail?

According to the National Conference of State Legislatures:

THIS TAG TO BE REUSED

- Twenty-seven states and the District of Columbia permit any qualified voter to vote absentee without offering an excuse.
- Oregon, Washington, and Colorado hold all elections by mail.
- In addition to Oregon, Washington, and Colorado, 19 states allow "certain types of elections" to be held entirely by mail.

8. What is the projected number of ballots the Postal Service will deliver for this year's elections?

The Postal Service handled more than 20 million return ballots (not including military ballots) in the last midterm election, and more ballots are expected this year.

9. In the 2016 general election, how many ballots were delivered to troops around the world?

Between September 1 and December 10, 2016, the Military Postal Service postmarked and dispatched 51,531 voted absentee ballots to local election offices using Priority Mail Express Military® Service. Local election officials reported receiving a total of 27,504 non-voted absentee ballots. The average transit time for voted ballots returning to election offices was 4.3 working days or 4.9 calendar days.

10. Is the Postal Service ready for the increased volume?

Yes. U.S. Mail services are an important part of the U.S. election process. The Postal Service is confident in its ability to offer dependable and timely delivery of Election Mail and Political Mail.

11. What is the Hatch Act?

The Hatch Act (5 U.S.C. §§ 7321–7326) limits certain political activities for most executive branch employees. For example, the law prohibits employees from engaging in political activity while on duty or in the Federal workplace. The Hatch Act also prohibits executive branch employees from soliciting or receiving political contributions. Employees who violate the Hatch Act are subject to a range of disciplinary actions, including the following:

- Removal from federal service,
- Reduction in grade,
- Debarment from federal employment for a period not to exceed 5 years, and
- Suspension, reprimand, or a civil penalty not to exceed \$1,000.

12. How does the Hatch Act affect the Postal Service and its employees?

The Postal Service is non-political, which means the organization cannot and does not support any political party or affiliation over another. The continued effectiveness of this organization depends on delivering all political mailings without giving the perception that the views of one candidate, political party, or political viewpoint are endorsed over another.

It is the responsibility of all Postal Service employees to know and obey Hatch Act restrictions. This means that employees may not display political buttons while on Postal Service property or place bumper stickers on a Postal Service vehicle that indicate a preference for a specific candidate, party, or political position. Employees are also urged not to participate in any political discussions where customers are present.

This brief summary does not address all of the Hatch Act prohibitions. For more information about the Hatch Act:

13. Does the Postal Service process mail less frequently now than it used to?

No. Mail is processed daily.

14. Do the return ballots need to be postmarked by a certain date?

That varies on a state-by-state basis. There are currently 14 states that will accept postmarked ballots post-election in certain circumstances: AK, AR, CA, IA, IL, MD, NC, ND, NY, OH, TX, UT, WA, and WV. Some states, like Alabama, require a valid postmark for a ballot to be counted. Go to your state's election website for specific information.

15. Do the return ballots need to be postmarked even if there is a meter?

It depends on the location. Go to your state's election website for specific information.

DMM Revision: Changes to Validations for Intelligent Mail Package Barcode

Effective September 27, 2018, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), sections 204.2.1, 213.3.2, 223.3.2, 253.3.3, 283.3.4, and 608.8.1, to add new Intelligent Mail® package barcode (IMpb®) validations for evaluating compliance with IMpb requirements for all mailers who enter commercial parcels. Specifically, to update IMpb Compliance Quality Threshold Validations for Address Quality, Shipping Services File Manifest Quality, and Barcode Quality. These validations would allow the Postal Service to improve service, tracking, and visibility, and promote positive customer experiences as well as improved identification of noncompliant mailpieces.

These changes were published in a *Federal Register* notice on September 21, 2018 (83 FR 47839). Clarification appears necessary for manifest quality specifications in the following USPS[®] response to mailer comments:

USPS Response: The Postal Service clarifies the two issues raised regarding manifest quality specifications:

- Timing for the receipt of the Shipping Services file for eVS mailers; and
- 2. Element validation for manifest quality.

To clarify the first issue regarding timing for the receipt of the Shipping Services file, eVS mailers are required to transmit the Shipping Services file before the Arrival at Postal Office (07) scan event, unless the address information was provided in the Shipping Partner Event file before the Arrival at Post Office (07) scan event. If the address information is provided in the Shipping Partner Event file before the Arrival at Post Office (07) scan event, then the mailer must transmit the Shipping Services file before 23:59 P.M. local time on the date of the Arrival at Post Office (07) scan event. Mailpieces that do not have a Shipping Services file record or have an untimely record would be noncompliant and receive a Manifest Quality validation noncompliant code.

For the second issue involving manifest quality validation elements, the manifest file provides essential package level detail information about the product to enable efficiencies and enhance package visibility.

Although the Postal Service will publish these revisions in the DMM at a later date, the standards are effective immediately.

This list must contain the employee's name and picture. The armored car service company is responsible for providing updated information on all authorized couriers assigned to pick up Postal Service remittances.

Under no circumstances can Registered Mail articles be provided to unauthorized and unconfirmed couriers. Once authorization has been confirmed, the Registered Mail deposits can be released.

h. The clerk-in-charge will also sign the armored courier's paperwork as proof of transfer of deposits from the USPS to the courier. The armored car service company will provide details and examples of its paperwork upon contract award and before commencement of service. If there are any changes to their paperwork requirements, the armored car service company will provide detailed information in advance of the USPS signing this new documentation. If the banking P&DC/F does not have the required or updated paperwork, the manager, Distribution Operations will contact his or her district finance manager.

4-7.3 Armored Courier Service Delivery to the Bank

f. ***If there are any discrepancies, the bank must immediately notify Corporate Treasury-Banking and Eagan. All efforts will be made to resolve the discrepancies so that the bank does not need to return any item to USPS. Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service ${}^{\text{TM}}$ money order:

- Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international Postal Service money orders.
- 2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word "USPS" repeated.
 - When there is discoloration around the dollar amounts, this might indicate the amounts were changed.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at *usps.com/shop/money-orders.htm*.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

- **B.** Other than for PMEMS and the exceptions listed below, a customs declaration PS Form 2976 or PS Form 2976-A is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, and for all items (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from this ZIP Code. Other than the exceptions listed below, all PMEMS mailpieces (regardless of mail contents or weight) addressed to or from this ZIP Code must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-B. The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply to known mailers, who for this purpose are defined as follows:
 - Business mailers who enter volume mailings through business mail entry units or other bulk mail acceptance locations, pay postage through advance deposit accounts, use permit imprints for postage payment, and submit completed postage statements at the time of entry that certify that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations. Such business mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters and printed matter.
 - All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail." Such agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation, except for any items addressed to an MPO or DPO to which restriction "B2" applies.
- **B2.** All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this MPO or DPO.
- **C.** Cigarettes and other tobacco products, including tobacco leaves, chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, and cigars are prohibited, including those that are authorized in Publication 52 under PACT.
- **C1.** Obscene and horror articles, images, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, comic books, etc., are prohibited.
- **C2.** E-cigarettes and related products (e.g., nicotine liquids, e-liquids, parts, or supplies) are prohibited.

Religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, but individual items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

- **E3.** Radio transceivers, cordless/cellular telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited
- **F.** Firearms of any type are prohibited, except firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed from this MPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms do not require an ATF form.
 - **F1.** Weapons of any type are prohibited.
- **F2.** Mailing firearms to or from this MPO ZIP Code is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.
- **F3.** Replica weapons and inert explosive devices (such as grenades) and weapons parts are prohibited.
 - G. Parcels of any class are prohibited.
- **H.** Meats, including preserved meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, and wool samples whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. See the Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan for detailed information about the funds and their investment risks. The monthly returns of the TSP Funds represent net earnings for the month after deduction of accrued administrative expenses and, except for the G Fund, after deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees as well. The returns for the four indexes shown do not include any of these deductions.

2018 Combined Federal Campaign Season Underway

This year's Combined Federal Campaign (CFC), the world's largest annual charity drive, began Monday, September 10, 2018, and runs through Friday, January 11, 2019. Equipment Maintenance Allowance Schedule for Rural Routes

Rural Carriers

In accordance with the provisions of Article 9, section 2.J.3 of Handbook EL-902, *Agreement Between the United States Postal Service and the National Rural Letter Carriers' Association*, effective September 29, 2018 (pay period 21-18), the equipment maintenance allowance (EMA) will remain unchanged at 74.0 cents per mile. The EMA is 74.0 cents per mile or a minimum of \$29.60 per day, whichever is greater.

Auxiliary Rural Carriers, Rural Carrier Reliefs, Rural Carrier Associates, Rural Carrier Part-Time Flexibles, and Auxiliary Assistance

Employees providing auxiliary assistance or serving auxiliary routes under the provisions of Article 9, section 2.J.5, receive an EMA of 74.0 cents per mile or \$8.00 per hour, whichever is greater. This EMA must not exceed the amount provided in the special equipment maintenance allowance for the route stops and miles.

Fire Prevention Week is October 7-13, 2018

Fire can spread quickly through your home or facility, leaving you little time to safely escape. Fire evacuation plans, smoke detectors, and properly maintained fire extinguishers can help save lives.

Evacuation plans must include a map of your facility or home showing two exits (windows or doors) and a path to the outside from each exit. Practice fire drills twice a year, at different times and using different exits. At home, teach children how to escape on their own in the event an adult is unable to help them. When evacuating a burning building, close doors behind you as you leave — this may slow the spread of smoke, heat, and fire. Once you get outside, stay outside. Never go back inside a burning building.

Nearly 2,500 people die in home fires every year in the United States. Most of these people live in homes that do not have working smoke alarms. Approximately 60 percent of home fire deaths result from fires in which smoke alarms were not present or didn't work. To find out how old your smoke detector is, remove it from the wall or ceiling and look at the manufacture date on the back of the alarm. Smoke detectors must be replaced every 10 years.

Place smoke alarms on every level of your home, outside each sleeping area, and inside every bedroom. There are many brands of smoke alarms on the market, including alarms for people who are deaf or blind. These alarms may have strobe lights that flash or vibrate to alert those who are unable to hear standard smoke alarms when they

sound. For the best protection, make sure all alarms are interconnected — when one sounds, they all sound.

Have you checked your smoke alarm to make sure it's still working? A smoke alarm with a dead or missing battery is the same as having no smoke alarm at all. Test the alarm monthly and replace the batteries at least once a year. A smoke alarm only works when you properly install and regularly test it. Some fire departments will install battery-operated alarms in your home for free. Contact your local fire department's non-emergency number for more information.

Fire extinguishers must be easy to identify and mounted so that they are readily accessible. There are four types of fire extinguishers — select the proper one for the type of fire you may have to put out. Portable fire extinguishers must be fully charged and kept in designated locations at all times. The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requires employers to inspect, maintain, and test all portable extinguishers in the workplace. Every fire extinguisher must receive a monthly visual inspection, an annual inspection, and maintenance conducted by trained professionals. Record monthly fire extinguisher inspections by dating and initialing PS Form 4705, *Fire Inspection Tag.* Annual maintenance must be recorded on a separate tag provided by service professionals.

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears on the following pages. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.


All requests must include a stamped envelope or post-card bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail[®] postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserviced.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark must affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4 $^{\circledR}$ Code, as listed next to the postmark.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.





How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 120 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. Each cover must have sufficient postage to meet First-Class Mail[®] requirements. Customers may purchase new stamps at their local Post OfficeTM, by phone at 800-782-6724, or on The Postal Store[®] website at usps.com/shop.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service™ recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16-inch side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2 inches high by 4 inches long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers must submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.


