Cover Story

A U.S. Passport is Your Key to International Travel

The Department of State's Passport Services Directorate issues U.S. passports to traveling Americans. Passports are a request to foreign governments to permit you to travel, and also allow you to re-enter the United States.

A passport book or card is proof of identity and U.S. citizenship. U.S. citizens can use each as follows:

- The passport book for all international travel by air, land, or sea.
- The passport card to enter the United States from Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean, and Bermuda; and at land border crossings or sea ports-of-entry. U.S. citizens cannot use the passport card for international air travel. However, the wallet size passport card is convenient and less expensive than the passport book.

Whether you plan to apply for a first-time passport book, passport card, or both, submitting your passport application is easy. The U.S. Postal Service® makes it convenient to apply for your passport with the Retail Customer Appointment Scheduler (RCAS) tool. Customers now have the opportunity to self-schedule a first-time passport application appointment online or on a mobile device at usps.com/scheduler.

The RCAS tool guides you through the appointment process in four easy steps:

1. Choose a day,
2. Choose a location,
3. Choose a time, and
4. Provide your details.

The RCAS tool will display available appointment times for participating Post Office™ locations that offer passport appointment services within the selected radius. Users will receive notifications of their scheduled appointment.

Note: If you are renewing your passport, you must do so by mail; you do not need to make an appointment. Simply take your documents and payment to the nearest Post Office and mail everything to the Department of State using Priority Mail® or Priority Mail Express® service.

For best results, follow these passport and international travel tips:

- Apply for your passport book or card early.
- Check the expiration date of your current passport. U.S. passports are issued to adults for 10 years and children under the age of 16 for 5 years.
- Visit the Department of State website (travel.state.gov/content/travel.html) for the following information:
 - How to apply for or renew your passport.
 - Find passport fees and forms.
 - Track your application.
 - Report your passport lost or stolen.
- Enroll in the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program (STEP) at step.state.gov/step/. U.S. citizens and nationals who travel and live abroad can use this free service to register their trip with the nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate.

DMM Revision: Barcode Clear Zone

Effective March 5, 2018, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)*, section 202.5.1, to clarify that only an Intelligent Mail® barcode (IMb) with the correct delivery point routing code or a ZIP+4® Intelligent Mail barcode (for Business Reply Mail) may appear in the barcode clear zone.

On May 3, 2012, the Postal Service published a *Federal Register* final rule (77 FR 26185–26191) to revise the DMM in various sections to discontinue price eligibility based on the use of POSTNET™ barcodes. At that time, we also revised the DMM to state that only an IMb with the correct delivery point routing code may appear in the barcode clear zone. The Postal Service will revise section 202.5.1 to delete residual text and provide clarity.

Although we will not publish these revisions in the DMM until March 5, 2018, the standards are effective immediately.

DMM Revision: USPS Marketing Mail (Standard Mail) Markings Update

Effective March 5, 2018, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)*, in various sections, to clarify the use of USPS Marketing Mail® markings.

The Postal Service published an article titled “DMM Revision: USPS Marketing Mail Markings,” in *Postal Bulletin* 22463 (3-16-17, page 8), that provided additional information about the rebranding of Standard Mail® as USPS Marketing Mail. The article stated that the Postal Service and mailing industry would continue to collaborate on an implementation timeline for the required use of new postage markings, permit imprint indicia, and sack, tray, and pallet labels. The Postal Service and the mailing industry have come to a consensus to allow the use of either “USPS Marketing Mail” or “Standard Mail” markings for postage markings and for permit imprint indicia, and to continue with the use of “Standard Mail” markings only on sack, tray, and pallet labels.

The Postal Service continues to work with the industry on this change and we estimate a transition date in January 2019. In the meantime, we will continue with the transition to USPS Marketing Mail. Additionally, the Postal Service will revise Quick Service Guides (QSG) 240a through 240k to include these revisions.

Although we will not publish these revisions in the DMM until March 5, 2018, the standards are effective immediately.

DMM Revision: Ineligible Flat-size Mailpiece Clarification

Effective March 5, 2018, the Postal Service™ will revise *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)*, in various sections, to clarify the processing category of certain ineligible flat-sized pieces.

The DMM currently states that mailers whose retail or commercial flat-sized pieces do not meet the flexibility or uniform thickness standards must pay the applicable parcel prices. Also, mailers whose flat-sized pieces do not meet polywrap covering standards must pay the applicable parcel prices. Mailers must prepare these ineligible flat-sized pieces as parcels.

The Postal Service will revise the following:

- Sections 101.2.5, 201.4.7, and 201.5.0 to clarify that the above ineligible flat-sized pieces are considered parcels.
- Sections 233.4.0, 243.4.0, and 263.1.0 to remove redundant text. These revisions will provide clarity and consistency in the standards.
- Quick Service Guides (QSG) 201c, 207d, 207f, 230d, 240e, and 260a, to include the aforementioned revisions.
- QSG 270a to remove outdated flat-sized pieces text.

Although we will not publish these revisions in the DMM until March 5, 2018, the standards are effective immediately.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international Postal Service money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - There should be no discoloration around the dollar amounts, which might indicate the amounts were changed.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at usps.com/shop/money-orders.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Please provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

Regardless of mail class, a customs declaration (PS Form 2976, PS Form 2976-A, or PS Form 2976-B) is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more or any item (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from this ZIP Code. All PMEMS mailpieces (regardless of mail contents or weight) addressed to or from this ZIP Code must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-B. The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply:

- Known mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters or printed matter, except for Priority Mail Express, which requires a customs form for all contents and weights. (A known mailer is a business mailer who enters volume mailings through a business mail entry unit (BMEU) or other bulk mail acceptance location, pays postage through an advance deposit account, uses a permit imprint for postage payment, and submits a completed postage statement at the time of entry that certifies that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations.)
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail" are exempt from providing customs documentation on any item addressed to an MPO except for those MPOs to which restriction "B2" applies and except for Priority Mail Express, which requires a customs form from all mailers.
- If mailpiece is endorsed "Contents for Official Use — Exempt from Customs Requirements."

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this MPO or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products, including tobacco leaves, chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, and cigars are prohibited, including those that are authorized in Publication 52 under PACT.

C1. Obscene and horror articles, images, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, comic books, etc., are prohibited.

C2. E-cigarettes and related products (e.g., nicotine liquids, e-liquids, parts, or supplies) are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as Official Mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Mailers are responsible to ensure that all medicines and vaccines conform to host nation laws.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic, or sexual items are prohibited. Non-authorized political materials are prohibited. Religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, but individual items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless/cellular telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited, except firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed from this MPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms do not require an ATF form.

F1. Weapons of any type are prohibited.

F2. Mailing firearms to or from this MPO ZIP Code is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

F3. Replica weapons and inert explosive devices (such as grenades) and weapons parts are prohibited.

G. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, and wool samples whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Reserved for future use.

I1. Reserved for future use.

I2. Reserved for future use.

I3. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 27 inches.
- Maximum width 14 inches.
- Maximum height 14 inches.

J. Standard Post and Parcel Select parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Reserved for future use.

L. All Official Mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, live animals, and live plants are prohibited.

N. Registered Mail service is prohibited.

O. Reserved for future use.

P. Official Mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under Publication 52, Part 421, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Synthetic cannabinoids used to stimulate the central nervous system commonly known as "synthetic marijuana," "K2," or "Spice" are prohibited.

T. Mailings of household shipments and case lots of food to or from an MPO require military transportation office approval prior to mailing. Mailings to or from a DPO require pre-approval from the Diplomatic Pouch and Mail Director.

U. Mail addressed to Retirees (Box R) is limited to 16 ounces and up to a 90-day supply of TRICARE medications. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail items, including audio and video media, weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to Official Mail.

U2. Retirees (Box R) are not authorized mail service.

U3. Reserved for future use.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 lbs.

V. PMEMS is not available.

V1. Electronic Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on *USPS.com*. Manual record of delivery may be available upon request.

W. Hermetically sealed packages of meat products bearing USDA certification, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed. 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Cremated remains are prohibited.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail and Priority Mail items only. This restriction also applies to Official Mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No O817E or O818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Federal Taxation Percentages for Supplemental Wages

This is a reminder to USPS® employees that the percentages used to tax supplemental wages are different from the normal taxation percentages. Supplemental wages may include but are not limited to the following:

- Annual leave exchange,
- Awards,
- Back-pay awards,
- Prizes,

- Severance pay, and
- Reimbursements for nondeductible moving expenses.

Effective January 1, 2005, the American Jobs Creation Act of 2004 and section 31.3402(g)-1 of Internal Revenue Service (IRS) regulations created a 2-tiered taxation rate for supplemental wages. These regulations apply to all supplemental payments received by USPS employees in the United States and U.S. territories.

The passage of the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017 (H.R.1. – 115th Congress) amended the Internal Revenue Code (IRC) to reduce supplemental rates and modify policies; the income tax rate for supplemental wages decreased on or after January 1, 2018.

Current regulations include the following:

- Taxation of supplemental wages up to a total of \$1 million within a calendar year at a *mandatory* withholding rate of 22 percent.

- A *mandatory* withholding rate of 37 percent (or the highest rate of income tax for the year) for any supplemental wages paid in excess of \$1 million within a calendar year.

These regulations remain in effect until Congress and the IRS once again change taxation percentages.

Federal Income Tax Withholding

Effective Pay Period 04-2018, payroll checks will reflect changes in the withholding of federal taxes. All information in this article is based on Internal Revenue Service (IRS) Notice 1036, revised January 2018. The Early Release Copies of the Percentage Method Tables for Income Tax Withholding will appear in IRS Publication 15 (Circular E), *Employer's Tax Guide*.

The biweekly personal exemption value for each federal tax allowance changed to \$159.60 per allowance. The dollar amounts for the withholding tables and withholding rates (10%, 12%, 22%, 24%, 32%, 35%, and 37%) have also changed (see Federal Income Tax Withholding table).

* Wages are determined after subtracting withholding allowances, CPP, FEDVIP, FEHB, (USPS HB, if pre-tax in place), FSA, HSA, and TSP contributions from your gross earnings.

Employee contributions to the following are treated as pre-tax monies for federal tax computations:

- Commuter Program (CPP) up to the transit and parking pre-tax limits.
- Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP).
- Health Benefits (HP):
 - Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB), unless employee declined the pre-tax benefit.
 - USPS Health Benefits (USPS HB), only if employee opted for pre-tax contributions.
- Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA).
- Health Savings Account (HSA).
- Traditional Thrift Savings Plan (TSP).

When calculating your federal taxes, you must subtract the following from your gross earnings to determine your federal taxable wage amount:

- Your withholding allowance amount.
- Your pre-tax contribution amounts.

Upon submission of your federal tax return, review your federal tax withholdings, particularly if you owed a significant amount of money or were due a large refund. If necessary, update your Federal Form W-4 (Employee's Withholding Allowance Certificate).

To determine the amount of withholding, follow steps 1 through 11:

1. Determine the biweekly gross wages from your earnings statement.
2. Determine the biweekly Traditional TSP employee contribution from your earnings statement.
3. Determine the biweekly FSA contribution from your earnings statement. If applicable, add up the sub-account contributions for the FSA Dependent Child (FSADC) and the FSA Health Care (FSAHC) to determine your total FSA contribution amount.
4. Determine the biweekly FEHB pre-tax employee contribution from your earnings statement (abbreviated as HP).
5. Determine the biweekly USPS HB pre-tax employee contribution from your earnings statement.

Note: Generally USPS HB contributions are treated as post-tax monies.

6. Determine the biweekly CPP employee contribution from your earnings statement.
7. Determine the biweekly FEDVIP employee contribution from your earnings statement.
8. Determine the biweekly HSA contribution from your earnings statement.
9. Multiply the number of exemptions claimed by the biweekly exemption value of \$159.60 (withholding allowance). The federal tax line on your earnings statement shows the number of exemptions you have claimed (e.g., S1 = single with one exemption, M3 = married with three exemptions).
10. Subtract the amounts in step 2 (Traditional TSP), step 3 (FSA), step 4 (FEHB), step 5 (USPS HB, only if pre-tax), step 6 (CPP), step 7 (FEDVIP), step 8 (HSA) and step 9 (exemptions) from step 1 (biweekly gross wages). The balance is the amount subject to withholding.
11. Use the Federal Income Tax Withholding table to determine which range your withholding amount falls within; follow the instructions listed in the table.

The following is an example of how to compute federal income taxes for a Federal Employee Retirement System (FERS) employee who claims married with three exemptions, and makes pre-tax contributions to the TSP, FSA, FEHB, CPP, and FEDVIP.

A FERS employee receives \$3,826.35 as biweekly gross wages. The employee makes the following contributions:

- 11 percent of basic earnings (for this example, all of the gross \$ is basic; basic X .11 = \$420.90) per pay period (PP) to TSP;
- \$65 per PP to FSADC;
- \$95 per PP to FSAHC;

- \$148.46 per PP to FEHB;
- \$105 for this PP to the CPP; and
- \$57.23 per PP to a PPO High Option Dental Premium.

The employee claims “married” with three exemptions (M3 on the federal tax line of the earnings statement). Using the information provided in the Federal Income Tax Withholding table in this article, federal taxes are computed as follows:

To complete the computation, refer to the Married segment of the Federal Income Tax Withholding table. The amount of wages subject to withholding (\$2,455.96) falls within the “over \$1,177 but not over \$3,421” range. Using the information provided within that range, the final computation is as follows:

Subtract \$1,177 from \$2,455.96	1,278.96
Multiply \$1,278.96 by .12 (12%)	153.48
Add from the table	73.30
Add \$153.48 and \$73.30	226.78
Total federal income tax* that should be withheld from this employee’s biweekly check	\$226.78

Effective February 23, 2018, the Postal Service™ will eliminate the “No Postage” label option from the Web Tools Label Application Interface (API) for Shipping Labels: Domestic and International. Web Tools Label API will continue to offer customers the option to print domestic and international postage paid labels.

Removal of the “No Postage” label option within Web Tools Label API will support the following initiatives:

- Stop customers from sending packages without proof of postage payment,
- Provide revenue assurance, and

- Prevent the printing of millions of potentially fraudulent labels.

Customers will still be able to print postage paid labels without compromising customer experience or revenue assurance. The U.S. Postal Service® has several alternatives for generating Intelligent Mail® package barcode (IMpb®) labels (including postage paid).

Statutory Requirement to Review and Post OSHA Form 300A Summary for Calendar Year 2017

The Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) requires all Postal Service™ installation and establishment heads to complete and post the OSHA Form 300A, *Summary of Work-Related Injuries and Illnesses*, for calendar year (CY) 2017, in accordance with 29 CFR 1904 and the *Employee and Labor Relations Manual* (ELM), part 821, Actions in the Event of Accident, Injury, or Illness.

From February 1 through April 30, 2018, installations must post a copy of the OSHA Form 300A for CY 2017 in a conspicuous place at every establishment where employees work or report to work.

When reviewing the OSHA 300 Log, installation heads must pay close attention to the following columns:

- Column F, which includes:
 - A description of the injury or illness,
 - The parts of the body affected (including which side of the body), and
 - The object or substance that directly injured or made the person ill (e.g., Second degree burns on right forearm from acetylene torch).
- Columns K and L. If an injury is identified as “days away from work” in column K or “on the job transfer or restriction” in column L, installation heads must ensure that the number of days entered is accurate.

For every entry on the OSHA 300 Log, the installation head must ensure that there is a corresponding Accident Report Form 1769/301 in the Employee Health and Safety application, which populates the OSHA Form 301, *Injury and Illness Incident Report*.

The left side of OSHA Form 300A contains sets of information data points with a letter, such as the letter “K,” that corresponds to each data point. The data points come from the OSHA 300 Log summary columns with the same letter.

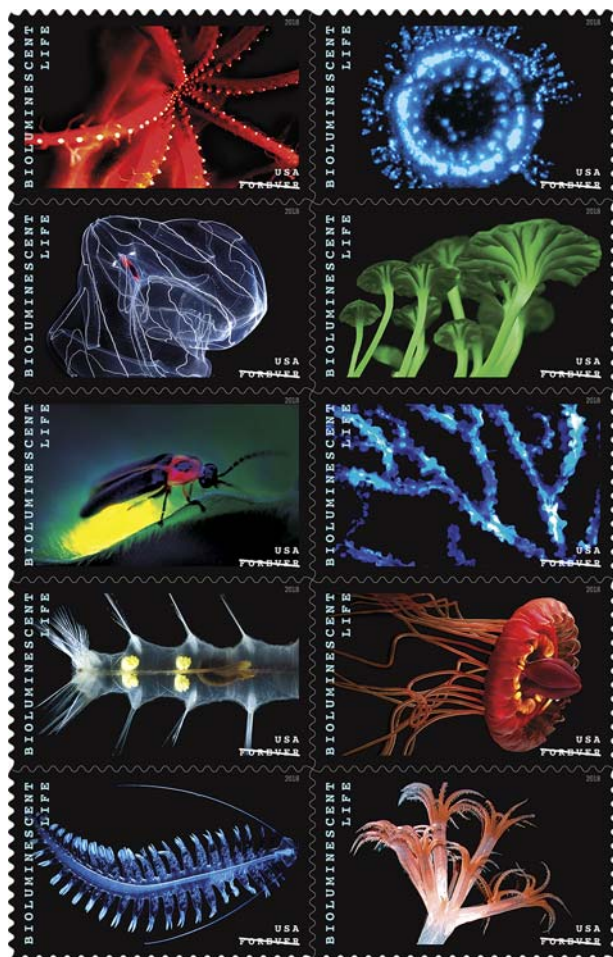
The right side of the OSHA Form 300A is self-explanatory. The North American Industrial Classification code is 49110 for all Postal Service establishments.

Before posting and signing the OSHA Form 300A, the installation or establishment heads must review the OSHA 300 Log and the OSHA 300A Summary Reports. When they sign the OSHA Form 300A, they affirm that they have reviewed both OSHA forms for accuracy and completeness, whether they used manual or automated versions of the forms.

On February 22, 2018, in Fort Pierce, FL, the U.S. Postal Service® will issue the *Bioluminescent Life* First-Class Mail® stamps (Forever® priced at 50 cents) in 10 designs, in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 475700). The stamps will go on sale nationwide February 22, 2018. **The *Bioluminescent Life* \$10.00 pane of 20 stamps may not be split and the stamps may not be sold individually.**

Bioluminescent Life stamps celebrate the phenomenon of bioluminescence — the ability of some species to glow — with a pane of 20 stamps featuring 10 life-forms that create their own light. The stamp images represent the work of some of the top explorers of the bioluminescent ocean realm as well as two terrestrial bioluminescent life-forms:

- Row 1: deep-ocean octopus and midwater jellyfish, photos by Edith Widder.

- Row 2: deep-sea comb jelly, photo by Edith Widder; mushroom, photo by Taylor F. Lockwood.
- Row 3: firefly, photo by Gail Shumway; bamboo coral, photo by Edith Widder.
- Row 4: marine worm and crown jellyfish, photos by Edith Widder.
- Row 5: marine worm, photo by Steve Haddock; sea pen, photo by Edith Widder.

On each row of stamps, the third and fourth stamps repeat the first two designs. The selvage also features the transparent deep-sea comb jelly (photo by Gregory G. Dimijian) and the firefly squid (photo by Danté Fenolio). Art director Derry Noyes designed the stamps and selvage from existing photographs.

Stamp Announcement 18-09: Illinois Statehood Stamp

On March 5, 2018, in Springfield, IL, the U.S. Postal Service® will issue the *Illinois Statehood* First-Class Mail® stamp (Forever® priced at 50 cents) in one design, in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 477100). The stamp will go on sale nationwide March 5, 2018.

This stamp celebrates the 200th anniversary of Illinois statehood. Known as the Prairie State, Illinois became the 21st state of the Union on December 3, 1818. The stamp art features an outline of the state map with a series of yellow beams radiating upward like the rays of a rising sun.

The colors on the map begin at the bottom with a deep yellow. The color fades upward to pale yellow and then into pale blue, with increasingly deeper blues rising to the top of the map; the yellows and blues symbolize the dawning of a new day as the state joins the Union. Stars, representing the first 20 states, grace the top of the stamp. The rising sun symbolizes the 21st star. Illinois artist Michael

Konetzka designed the stamp and created the artwork. Antonio Alcalá was the art director.

Guidelines for Finalizing Illinois Statehood Stamp Pictorial Postmark Art



To finalize the *Illinois Statehood* stamp pictorial postmark art, insert the date, city, state, and ZIP Code™ of the physical location of your event adjacent to the stamp image. Overall dimensions of the pictorial postmark must not exceed 4 inches horizontally by 2 inches vertically. Collectors prefer the dimensions 3-1/2 inches by 1.

The Postal Service™ must make all special postmarks known to collectors through advance publicity in the Postal Bulletin. Therefore, all special dedication cancellations must be reported to Stamp Services 4 weeks before the event using PS Form 413, Pictorial Postmark Announcement/Report. Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears on the following pages. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark must affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed next to the postmark.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

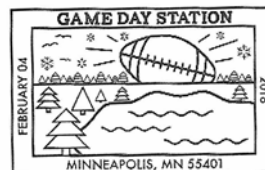

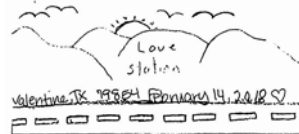

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 60 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. Each cover must have sufficient postage to meet First-Class Mail® requirements. Customers may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by telephone at 800-782-6724, or at The Postal Store® website at usps.com/shop.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service™ recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16-inch side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2 inches high by 4 inches long. Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers must submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers must affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through

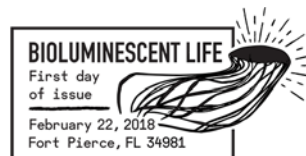

Federal Reporting Requirements for Hazardous and Toxic Chemicals

Postal Service™ policy requires all USPS® facilities to comply with the reporting requirements of the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act (EPCRA). Postal Service sites that store certain quantities of hazardous and toxic chemicals must complete and submit the EPCRA Tier II Form by March 1 every year.

Reporting requirements apply to any location that stores threshold quantities of EPCRA-regulated hazardous and toxic chemicals.

Applicable Chemicals

Commonly reported chemicals and thresholds for USPS facilities include the following:

- **Lead-acid batteries.** USPS facilities that meet the 500-pound threshold for sulfuric acid by having more than six tow motor batteries or more than two forklift batteries, or a combination of these batteries, onsite. Estimate the percent weight of sulfuric acid in each battery by multiplying the battery weight by 18 percent.
- **Gasoline, diesel, or heating fuel.** The 10,000 pound threshold for these fuels is equivalent to 1,639 gallons of gasoline (6.1 pounds/gallon) or 1,351 gallons of diesel/heating fuel (7.4 pounds/gallon).
- **Ice melt or anti-skid products.** Rock salt, calcium magnesium acetate, and sand have a 10,000 pound threshold. The threshold applies whether the materials are stored by bulk in one location or dispersed in bags and on pallets throughout the site.

Reporting Process

By March 1, 2018, USPS installation heads must submit the emergency and hazardous chemical inventory reporting form, known as the EPCRA Tier II Form, to the following organizations:

- The State Emergency Response Commission (SERC);
- The Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC); and

- The local Fire Department that would respond to an emergency at your facility.

States require report submission through the following ways:

- Submittal of the hard copy Tier II Form,
- Electronic reporting through the EPA Tier2 Submit software program, or
- Reporting through state-specific software programs or websites.

For states that require report submission through the EPA Tier2 Submit 2017 software, USPS facilities can request a download of the Tier2 Submit 2017 software through eAccess. If other state electronic reporting software or website applications are not accessible or authorized on your USPS ACE computer system, you must submit the Tier II Form in a hard copy format. To find the individual reporting requirements, procedures, and forms for each state, visit epa.gov/epcra-tier-i-and-tier-ii-reporting.

Note: USPS facilities are not required to pay any fees associated with reporting (including electronic reporting user and registration fees).
