A U.S. Passport is Your Key to International Travel

The U.S. Department of State's Passport Services Directorate issues U.S. passports to traveling Americans. Passports are a request to foreign governments to permit you to travel, and also allow you to re-enter the United States.

A passport book or card is proof of identity and U.S. citizenship. U.S. citizens can use each as follows:

- The passport book for all international travel by air, land, or sea.
- The passport card to enter the United States from Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean, and Bermuda, and at land border crossings or sea ports-of-entry. U.S. citizens cannot use the passport card for international air travel. The wallet-size passport card is convenient and less expensive than the passport book.

Whether you plan to apply for a first-time passport book, passport card, or both, submitting your passport application is easy. The United States Postal Service® makes it convenient to apply for a passport with the Retail Customer Appointment Scheduler (RCAS) tool. Customers now have the opportunity to self-schedule a first-time passport application appointment through a variety of options:

- Online or on a mobile device at usps.com/scheduler.
- At any one of the 2700 Self-Service Kiosks (SSKs).
- At the Retail counter of more than 17,000 select Post Offices.

The RCAS tool guides you through the appointment process in four easy steps:

1. Choose a service.
2. Find available appointments.
3. Select your appointment time.
4. Provide contact information.

The RCAS tool will display available appointment times for participating Post Office™ locations that offer passport appointment services within the selected radius. Users will

receive notifications of their scheduled appointment via email or text.

If you are renewing your passport, you do not need to make an appointment for the renewal. Simply take your documents and payment to the nearest Post Office and mail everything to the U.S. Department of State using Priority Mail® or Priority Mail Express® service. You may also be able to renew online at travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/passports.html.

For best results, follow these passport and international travel tips:

- Apply for your passport book or card early.
- Check the expiration date of your current passport. U.S. passports are issued to adults for 10 years and children under the age of 16 for 5 years.
- Visit the Department of State website (travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/passports.html) for the following information:
 - Find out how to apply for or renew your passport.
 - Get passport fees and forms.
 - Track your application.
 - Report your passport lost or stolen.
- Enroll in the Smart Traveler Enrollment Program at step.state.gov/step. U.S. citizens and nationals who travel and live abroad can use this free service to register their trip with the nearest U.S. Embassy or Consulate.

DMM Correction: Bulk Insured Claims

In the article titled “DMM Revision: Bulk Insured Claims,” in *Postal Bulletin* 22615 (1-12-23, page 5), the Postal Service™ published revisions to *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service*, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®), section 609.1.2, to reflect updates in the standards for filing bulk insured claims.

The article stated that the revisions will publish in the April 3, 2023, DMM edition. That edition is canceled. The revisions will publish in the July 9, 2023, DMM edition.

1.2 Bulk Insured Claims

1.2.1 General

Large-volume mailers or commercial mailers with Negotiated Service Agreements (NSAs) who file a large number of claims frequently may be allowed to use the Bulk Indemnity Claims feature available on the Business Customer Gateway (BCG) portal if approved by Headquarters Revenue and Field Accounting (RAFA) under 1.2.3.

1.2.2 Eligibility

Eligibility for mailers to submit claims using the Bulk Indemnity Claims feature is based on the following:

- Revenue trends.
- IMpb compliance history.

- Prior claim history.
- Customer-reimbursement policy.
- Absence of third-party shipping insurance.
- If applicable, NSA agreement status.
- Any other criteria the Postal Service determines for eligibility to use the Bulk Indemnity Claims feature.

1.2.3 Requesting Bulk Indemnity Claims Access

To request access to the Bulk Indemnity Claims feature in BCG, mailers must contact their Business Service Network or sales account representative. The request will be reviewed by RAFA for eligibility and, if the mailer is eligible for access, approved in writing. Upon approval, the mailer will be required to attend an onboarding meeting and will be provided the following:

- Information regarding access to the Bulk Indemnity Claims feature in BCG.
- Bulk claim-submission requirements.
- Upload process and instructions to comply with USPS review of supporting documentation to substantiate claims.

1.2.4 Documentation

The mailer must retain all supporting documentation related to claims (which unless otherwise specified includes all documentation otherwise required for a claim under 609, including proof of filing by the underlying customer) for one year from the submission date and must provide it to USPS upon request.

DMM Revision: Removal of Sacks — USPS Marketing Mail and Periodicals Flats

Effective January 26, 2023, the Postal Service™ is revising *Mailing Standards of the United States Postal Service, Domestic Mail Manual (DMM®)*, in various sections, to remove references to sacks as a handling unit for USPS Marketing Mail® and Periodicals flats. Mailers of carrier route, 5-digit scheme carrier routes, and 5-digit carrier routes USPS Marketing Mail and Periodicals flat mail will continue to be allowed to use sacks as a handling unit for acceptance and entry.

Sections 243.6.3.4, 243.6.5.3, 243.6.5.4, 243.6.7.3, and 705.8.10.3f are being revised to clarify price separations eligible for the carrier route (CR) bundle/container discount and the sectional center facility (SCF) pallet discount.

In addition, the Postal Service will update Quick Service Guides (QSG) 207d, “Periodicals Nonbarcoded Flats”; 207f, “Periodicals Barcoded (Automation) Flats”; 240e, “Commercial — USPS Marketing Mail Nonautomation Flats”; 240f, “Commercial — USPS Marketing Mail Automation Flats”; 240g, “Commercial — USPS Marketing Mail Carrier Route Flats”; and 705a, “Pallets,” to remove references to sacks as a handling unit for USPS Marketing Mail and Periodicals flats.

These standards, which the Postal Service will publish in the delayed January 22, 2023, DMM edition, are effective immediately.

- f. Barcoded tray labels under 204.3.0 must be used to label flat trays.

9.2.3 Bundles with Fewer Than Six Pieces

- a. A carrier route mailing must be part of the mailing job, unless cobundled under 11.0 using 5-digit scheme (L007) or 3-digit scheme (L008) bundle preparation, and trayed under 10.1.4.

If sortation under this section is performed, merged 5-digit flat trays or pallets must be prepared for all 5-digit ZIP Codes with an "A" or "C" indicator in the City State Product that permits such preparation when there is enough volume for the 5-digit ZIP Code to prepare such a flat tray under 10.1.4 or such a pallet under 10.1.5. In addition, all possible merged 5-digit scheme flat trays must be prepared under

10.1.4, or all possible merged 5-digit scheme and 5-digit scheme pallets must be prepared under 10.1.5.

- g. For mailings prepared in flat trays, mailers may not combine firm bundles and 5-digit scheme pieces in 5-digit scheme bundles or in 5-digit scheme flat trays. Firm bundles must be placed in a separate individual 5-digit flat tray under 10.1.4g to maintain 5-digit price eligibility. Mailers may combine firm bundles with 5-digit scheme, 3-digit scheme, and other presort destination bundles in carrier route, 5-digit, 3-digit, SCF, ADC, and mixed ADC flat trays. Only an In-County firm bundle can contribute toward the 6-piece minimum for price eligibility.
- h. The bundles from each separated mailing must be sorted together into flat trays (cotrayed) under 10.1.4 or on pallets (copalletized) under 10.1.5 using presort software that is PAVE-certified.
- i. A complete, signed postage statement(s), on the correct USPS form or an approved facsimile, must accompany each mailing job prepared under these procedures. In addition to the postage statement(s), documentation prepared by PAVE-certified software must be submitted with each cotrayed or copalletized mailing job that describes for each flat-tray sortation level and flat tray, or each pallet sortation level and pallet, the number of pieces qualifying for each applicable price.
- j. Barcoded tray labels under 204.3.0 must be used to label flat trays.

If a mailing job does not contain barcoded price pieces and the carrier route pieces and the nonbarcoded pieces are irregular-parcel shaped, use "IRREG" for the processing category on the contents line of the label. Mailers must prepare sacks/flat trays containing carrier route and 5-digit bundles from the carrier route, barcoded, and nonbarcoded mailings in the mailing job in the following manner and sequence:

10.2.1 Basic Standards

For trayed mailings, the prices for pieces in the carrier route mailing are based on the criteria in 243.6.0, the prices for pieces in the automation price mailing are applied based on the number of pieces in the bundle and the level of bundle to which they are sorted under 243.7.0, and the prices for pieces in the Presorted price mailing are based on the number of pieces in the bundle and the level of flat tray to which they are sorted under 243.5.0.

For a 5-digit ZIP Code(s) in a scheme with a “B” or “D” indicator in the City State Product, prepare flat tray(s) for the automation price and Presorted price bundles under 10.2.4g and 10.2.4h. For 5-digit ZIP Codes not included in a scheme, prepare flat trays under 10.2.4d through 10.2.4h. Labeling:

To comply with the new environmental legislation in the Walloon Region, bpost (the designated postal operator of Belgium) recommends that the sender use paper to wrap such items mailed to these areas. Plastic wrap is permitted for merchandise, newspapers, and magazines subject to paid subscriptions to all addresses. Window envelopes are still permitted, provided that plastic is not the main component of the wrapping. Parcels are not affected by this restriction.

Environmental Management

Waste Management: Damaged, Leaking, and Nonmailable Parcels

Damaged or leaking parcels and parcels containing nonmailable hazardous materials are not permitted in the mailstream. Hazardous items that are disposed of locally could be regulated by environmental laws and require proper waste management. Failure to properly dispose of regulated items could result in a regulatory agency notice of violation.

Potentially regulated materials include:

- Aerosol cans.
- Batteries.
- Cleaning supplies and other chemicals, including bleach, hand sanitizer, and nail polish remover.
- Compressed gases.
- Drugs and pharmaceuticals.
- Fertilizers and fuels, including lighter fluid.
- Lamps.
- Oils, paints, perfumes, and pesticides.
- Solvents and thinners.

Use the following guidance when handling damaged, leaking, or nonmailable parcels:

- Once identified, bring damaged or leaking parcels (or parcels containing nonmailable hazardous materials) to a designated re-wrap or hazardous material mail staging area for assessment.

- If parcels contain waste, inventory and document the classification and quantity of each parcel. Common waste classifications are non-hazardous, hazardous, universal, state-regulated, and medical or infectious waste.
- Store hazardous materials and other regulated wastes in a container that is structurally sound, liquid-tight, closed, and clearly labeled. Do not mix incompatible materials.
- Using eBay+, arrange for pick-up and disposal of hazardous and regulated waste parcels using the appropriate USPS® National Waste Management Service Contractors.
- Maintain waste classification and off-site shipment and disposal records.

2022 Tax Information: Form W-2 Wage and Tax Statement; Form 1099

General Form W-2 Information

If an employee has earnings from more than one state or locality, a separate Form W-2 will be issued for each.

The Postal Service™ will mail the 2022 Form W-2, *Wage and Tax Statement*, to all employees, except those employees who elected not to receive mailed copies of Forms W-2 (through the *PostalEASE* W-2 module) in lieu of official, electronic Forms W-2. The *PostalEASE* W-2 module makes online viewing and printing of Forms W-2 available to all employees for the last 7 years.

The format of the 2022 Form W-2 remains unchanged from the 2021 version. However, to protect sensitive information, the first five digits of the Social Security number will

be masked on the mailed copy provided to employees. The mailed copy will include a randomly generated 12-digit Control Number displayed in Box d. This Control Number has no significance to the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) and is used by the employer as an aid in processing and tracking. Your W-2 control number may not remain the same year after year.

An employee may be able to take the Earned Income Credit (EIC) for 2022, if he or she meets qualifying requirements. Details are printed in the “Notice to Employee” section of the Form W-2. An employee may also qualify for a state EIC credit. Employees must visit applicable state taxing authority websites to determine eligibility.

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act created the “Additional Medicare Tax” effective January 1, 2013. All wages and other compensation that are subject to regular Medicare tax in excess of \$200,000 are subject to an additional Medicare tax of 0.9 percent. All Medicare tax withheld is reported in Box 6 of the Form W-2.

General Questions

Source of Reported Wages

The Wages and Other Compensation amount reported in Box 1 of Form W-2 is derived from year-to-date totals reflected on the employee’s Pay Period 26-2022 (or the last pay period in pay status 2022) Earnings Statement, plus several other totals from the Form W-2. The employee’s Earnings Statement year-to-date amounts and the Reconciliation Formula calculation specific to the employee are printed on the employee’s Form W-2 (top left section of the page). In addition, employees can access this information via the *PostalEASE* W-2 module.

Flexible Spending Accounts (FSAs): Dependent Care (DC) and Health Care (HC)

Employee contributions to an FSA for dependent care are pre-tax and are reported in Box 10 (Dependent Care Benefits). Per the Reconciliation Formula, FSA contributions are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

Employee contributions to an FSA for health care are pre-tax and are not reported separately in any box on the Form W-2. Per the Reconciliation Formula, FSA contributions are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). See your Pay Period 26-2022 (or the last pay period in pay status 2022) Earnings Statement year-to-date amount to determine your total Health Care FSA contributions made in 2022.

Thrift Savings Plan (TSP)

Employee TSP traditional (pre-tax) contributions are reported in Box 12 (letter code “D”).

Per the Reconciliation Formula, traditional TSP contributions (Box 12, letter code “D”) are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

TSP Roth (post-tax) contributions are reported in Box 12 (letter code “AA”). TSP Roth contributions do not reduce gross pay; they are included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). Roth contributions (letter code “AA”) are reported for your information only.

Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB)

FEHB premiums are considered pre-tax unless the employee declined the pre-tax benefit. Payroll deductions for pre-tax FEHB premium payments are no longer reported separately in any box on the Form W-2. Per the Reconciliation Formula, payroll deductions for pre-tax FEHB premiums are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). See your Pay Period 26-2022 (or the last pay period in pay status 2022) Earnings Statement year-to-date amount to determine your total pre-tax FEHB premium payments made in 2022.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international Postal Service money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - When held to the light, a watermark of Benjamin Franklin is repeated from top to bottom on the left side.
 - When held to the light, a dark line (security thread) runs from top to bottom with the word “USPS” repeated.
 - When there is discoloration around the dollar amounts, this might indicate the amounts were changed.

These appear in Postal Service Notice 299, *U.S. Postal Money Order Reference Card*, or online at usps.com/shop/money-orders.htm.

3. If the money order seems suspicious, call the U.S. Postal Service Money Order Verification System at 866-459-7822.

Provide this information to local banks and retailers, as they also receive Postal Service money orders for cashing.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals, including in their raw, unmanufactured state, are prohibited. Official Mail shipments are exempt from this restriction.

B. Other than for PMEMS and the exceptions listed below, a customs declaration PS Form 2976 or PS Form 2976-A is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, and for all items (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from this ZIP Code. Other than the exceptions listed below, all PMEMS mailpieces (regardless of mail contents or weight) addressed to or from this ZIP Code must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-B. The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable customs declaration. The following exceptions apply to known mailers, who for this purpose are defined as follows:

- Business mailers who enter volume mailings through business mail entry units or other bulk mail acceptance locations, pay postage through advance deposit accounts, use permit imprints for postage payment, and submit completed postage statements at the time of entry that certify that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations. Such business mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters and printed matter.
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail." Such agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation, except for any items addressed to an MPO or DPO to which restriction "B2" applies.

B2. All federal, state, and local government agencies must complete customs documentation when sending potentially dutiable mail addressed to or from this MPO or DPO.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products, including tobacco leaves, chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, and cigars are prohibited, including those that are authorized in Publication 52 under PACT.

C1. Obscene and horror articles, images, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, comic books, etc., are prohibited.

C2. E-cigarettes and related products (e.g., nicotine liquids, e-liquids, parts, or supplies) are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as Official Mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Mailers are responsible to ensure that all medicines and vaccines conform to host nation laws.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic, or sexual items are prohibited. Non-authorized political materials are prohibited. Religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, but individual items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless/cellular telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited, except firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed from this MPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms do not require an ATF form.

F1. Weapons of any type are prohibited.

F2. Mailing firearms to or from this MPO ZIP Code is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

F3. Replica weapons and inert explosive devices (such as grenades) and weapons parts are prohibited.

G. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, and wool samples whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Reserved for future use.

I3. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail items, including audio and video media, weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to Official Mail.

U2. Retirees (Box R) are not authorized mail service.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 lbs.

The G Fund is managed internally by the Federal Retirement Thrift Investment Board. Assets of the F, C, S, and I Funds are managed externally. The Board currently has contracts with BlackRock Institutional Trust Company, N.A., to manage the F, C, S, and I Fund assets. The F, C, S, and I Funds invest in commingled trust funds, in which the assets of tax-deferred employee benefit plans are combined and invested together. The F, C, S, and I Funds and the BlackRock funds are passively managed index funds.

Future performance of the funds will vary and may be significantly different from the returns shown above. See the *Summary of the Thrift Savings Plan* for detailed information about the funds and

their investment risks. The monthly returns of the TSP Funds represent net earnings for the month after deduction of accrued administrative expenses and, except for the G Fund, after deduction of trading costs and accrued investment management fees as well. The Cost of Employer-Sponsored Health Coverage (employer cost plus employee pre-tax or post-tax cost) is reported in Box 12 (letter code “DD”). Reporting is required by the Affordable Care Act but is reported for informational purposes only.

Health Savings Accounts (HSAs)

Employee HSA contributions are pre-tax and are reported in Box 12 (letter code “W”). Per the Reconciliation Formula, employee HSA contributions (Box 12) are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP)

FEDVIP premiums are considered pre-tax. Per the Reconciliation Formula, payroll deductions for FEDVIP premiums are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). See your Pay Period 26-2022 (or the last pay period in pay status 2022) Earnings Statement year-to-date amount to determine your total pre-tax FEDVIP premium payments made in 2022.

USPS Health Benefits (HB)

USPS® HB premiums are considered post-tax, unless the employee opts for pre-tax deductions. Post-tax premiums are included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

For those employees who elected pre-tax premiums, the pre-tax premium payments are not reported separately in any box on the Form W-2. Per the Reconciliation Formula, payroll deductions for pre-tax USPS HB premiums are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). See your Pay Period 26-2022 (or the last pay period in pay status 2022) Earnings Statement year-to-date amount to determine your total pre-tax USPS HB premium payments made in 2022.

The Cost of Employer-Sponsored Health Coverage, (employer share plus employee pre-tax or post-tax share), is reported in Box 12 (letter code “DD”). Reporting is required by the Affordable Care Act, but such reporting is for informational purposes only.

Commuter Program

Employee contributions for the Commuter Program are considered pre-tax for 2022 up to the IRS \$280 monthly limit for public transportation and the IRS \$280 monthly limit for parking. Per the Reconciliation Formula, employee pre-tax commuter contributions are subtracted from gross pay and are not included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). See your Pay Period 26-2022 (or the last pay period in pay status 2022) Earnings Statement year-to-date amount to determine your total Commuter Program contributions made in 2022. Any commuting contributions elected over the IRS limits are considered post-tax. Post-tax contributions do not reduce gross pay; they are included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

Relocation Payments

The Tax Cuts and Jobs Act (TCJA) of 2017 eliminated the federal exclusion for relocation expenses. As a result, moving expenses incurred on or after January 1, 2018, and reimbursed to an employee or vendor on the employee’s behalf, are reportable income (included in Boxes 1, 3, and 5, and considered subject to federal tax withholding).

Most states have conformed to TCJA and relocation expenses will be included in box 16 (State Wages) and box 18 (Local Wages), if applicable. The states that did not conform to TCJA as of December 2022, and continue to exclude certain relocation expenses from state taxable wages (and local, if applicable) are Arkansas, California, Hawaii, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, and Pennsylvania.

For more information, see the statements issued by the Postal Service’s Relocation Management firm (Sterling Lexicon).

Employee Business Expense (EBE)

Equipment maintenance allowance (EMA), carrier drive-out, vehicle hire, and supervisor vehicle usage are considered employee expenses paid by the U.S. Postal Service®. The nontaxable (not the total) EBE amount is reported in Box 12 (letter code “L”). If there is a taxable amount, it is reported in Box 14 (Other). Per the Reconciliation Formula, taxable vehicle (Box 14) is added to gross pay and is included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

Imputed Life Insurance

Imputed Income Life Insurance is reported in Box 12 (letter code “C”). The IRS requires employers to report as income the employer cost of Group Term Life Insurance in excess of \$50,000.

Per the Reconciliation Formula, Imputed Income Life Insurance (Box 12) is added to gross pay and is included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

Locality Pay, LEAP, AUO

Per the Reconciliation Formula, Locality Pay, LEAP (Law Enforcement Availability Pay), and AUO (Administratively Uncontrollable Overtime) are added to gross pay and are included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

Geographic (GEO) Pay

Per the Reconciliation Formula, GEO Pay is added to gross pay and is included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).

Military Differential Payments

Military Differential Payments are reported in Box 14 (Other) and are included in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation). Differential payments made to an individual while on active duty for more than 30 days are not subject to Social Security and Medicare taxes. Differential payments made to an individual while on active duty for 30 days or less are subject to Social Security and Medicare taxes.

Oregon Statewide Transit Tax

Oregon Statewide Transit Tax (ORSTT) is reported in Box 14 (Other).

State/Territory Reportable Wages

The amount in Box 16 (State wages, tips, etc.) will equal Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation) with the following exceptions:

- Hawaii includes territorial cost-of-living allowance (TCOLA) in Box 16 (State wages, tips, etc.).
- California does not allow income deferral for HSAs.
- Mississippi does not allow income deferral for commuter program public transportation and parking.
- New Jersey allows no income deferral. Therefore, there is no income deferral for TSP, FSA DC, FSA HC, HB, HSA, FEDVIP, or a commuter program (public transportation and parking).
- Pennsylvania does not allow income deferral for TSP, FSA Dependent Care, or a commuter program (public transportation and parking); however, Pennsylvania does not require the addition of Imputed Income Life Insurance to state gross pay.
- Puerto Rico does not allow income deferral for employee FSA DC, FSA HC, HB, HSA, FEDVIP, or a commuter program (public transportation and parking) contributions.
- Arkansas, California, Massachusetts, New Jersey, New York, and Pennsylvania still have exclusions for certain relocation expenses. See section on “Relocation Payments.”

Local Reportable Wages

The following statements do not take into account taxable wage limits that exist for certain localities. For those localities, amounts in Box 18 (Local wages, tips, etc.) will not exceed local taxable wage limits.

The amount in Box 18 (Local wages, tips, etc.) will equal gross pay with the following exceptions:

- New York City, NY; St. Louis, MO; and MI Locals (Battle Creek, Detroit, Flint, Grand Rapids, Lansing, Pontiac, and Saginaw): Local taxable wages are the same as the federal taxable wages reported in Box 1 (Wages, tips, other compensation).
- Kansas City, MO: Local taxable wages equals federal taxable wages plus HSA.
- OH Locals (Akron, Brecksville, Brook Park, Canton, Cincinnati, Cleveland, Columbus, Dayton, Fairview Park, Heath, Kettering, Mansfield, Newark, Oberlin, Sharonville, Springfield, Toledo, Whitehall, and Youngstown): Local taxable wages equals federal taxable wages plus TSP and minus Life Insurance Imputed Income.

- With the exception of Philadelphia and Pittsburgh, PA Locals (Bethlehem, Erie, Greene, Hanover, Harrisburg, Horsham, Lancaster, Middletown, Reading, Scranton, South Park, Sunbury/Gregg, Tinicum, Warminster, Wilkes-Barre, and York) are the same as the PA taxable wages reported in Box 16 (State wages, tips, etc.).
- New York and Pennsylvania still have exclusions for certain relocation expenses. See section on “Relocation Payments.”

Obtaining Duplicate Forms W-2 for Tax Years 2016 to the Present

PostalEASE

Employees may use the *PostalEASE* W-2 module to view and print official, electronic copies of their Forms W-2 for any of the last 7 years, including the most recent W-2 year.

Except for an approximate 6-week period (mid-December through late January), an employee may also exercise the option to have reprinted copies of any of the seven most recent Tax Year Form(s) W-2 mailed to his or her home address. Requests are processed weekly (daily during March and April). Employees must allow 2 weeks to receive the W-2 reprint(s) by mail to the address of record. In mid to late January 2023, Tax Year 2022 will be loaded to the *PostalEASE* W-2 module. At the same time, Tax Year 2015 will be removed from the W-2 module.

PostalEASE Interactive Voice Response (IVR)

USPS Employees now have the option to request a duplicate Form W-2 reprint by telephone using the *PostalEASE* automated Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system.

Access *PostalEASE* at 877-477-3273 through the following steps:

1. For *PostalEASE*, press or say “1.”
2. Press or say 8-digit “Employee Identification Number.”
3. Press or say 4-digit “USPS Pin.”
4. For payroll options, press 2.
5. For W-2 reprints, press 3.

Information Security

Keep Your USPS-issued Devices Compliant

When it comes to cybersecurity, your responsibility as a USPS® employee or contractor is to keep your USPS-issued devices compliant. You can do this by using knowledge base (KB) training to identify and report if your enterprise assets are missing security updates. Once you have identified the need for security updates, you can use the following KBs to ensure that your USPS-issued devices remain compliant:

1. KB0098997: What is Software Center — System Center Configuration Manager (SCCM)

This KB allows logged-in users to install optional software on windows workstations. Pop-ups and dialog boxes are commonly seen in this program.

Additionally, users are encouraged to restart their USPS-issued devices at the end of each workday or shift. Laptops should be logged in past the SecureDoc screen so you can continue to get updates. The benefits of restarting your devices include:

- The computer no longer has any programs open.
- The computer can optimally download updates.
- Updates can be applied to completion.

- You will be more likely to see a notification of available updates and install them when convenient for you.

2. KB009524: How To — Prevent and Troubleshoot Workstation Quarantine

For best results, follow the steps listed in KB009524:

- Connect to the Postal Service™ network.
- Install required updates.
- Open the software center.
- Check for updates under the Updates header and install any available.

Multifactor Authentication Required for Access to LiteBlue

Cyber criminals pose a threat to Postal Service™ employees by creating fake websites that closely resemble *LiteBlue*. These bad actors use fraudulent websites to capture employee identification numbers and passwords, so they can access employees' personal information in *PostalEASE*, including direct deposit and other payroll information. These fake websites feature an address ("URL") that resembles the actual address, such as "Light-Blue," "LiteBlu," or "LiteBlue.org."

Over the last few weeks, USPS® has taken steps to warn employees about the threats that cyber criminals pose, showed employees how to protect themselves, and implemented enhancements to existing security protocols. These steps included a targeted awareness communication campaign, which involved a letter sent to all employees' address of record and the distribution of two required stand-up talks. Additionally, USPS implemented a system of email notifications (when changes are made to employees' net-to-bank and allotment accounts), and provided instructions on setting up this functionality.

Considered one of the most powerful tools available for preventing cyber-attacks, multifactor authentication (MFA) offers significant additional protection of personal information to our employees. MFA is a verification method that

requires users to provide their username and password, as well as an additional factor (i.e., authenticator app or one-time passcode) before gaining access to an application.

On January 15, 2023, USPS deployed the MFA solution for *LiteBlue* to enhance the security of employees' IDs, passwords, and other personal data, while preventing unauthorized access and misuse of their accounts. At this time, you are required to sign up for MFA to access *LiteBlue*.

As part of MFA implementation, complete these steps:

- Reset your Self-Service Profile (SSP) password.
- Verify answers to security questions.
- Verify the last four digits of your Social Security Number (new security enhancement).
- Establish your MFA preferences.

As part of our plan to mitigate the risk of continued attacks, transactions of net-to-bank and allotments were temporarily disabled for all employees. As MFA is successfully deployed, this functionality will be reactivated.

Stamp Announcement 23-10: \$10 Floral Geometry Stamp



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On February 24, 2023, in San Diego, CA, the United States Postal Service® will issue the \$10 *Floral Geometry* definitive stamp in one design, in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of four stamps (Item 122600). This stamp will go on sale nationwide February 24, 2023, and must not be sold or canceled before the first-day-of-issue.

In 2023, a new *Floral Geometry* stamp denominated at \$10 will be available for purchase, complementing the similarly designed \$2 and \$5 stamps issued in 2022. The design of these high denomination stamps lends an elegant and contemporary appearance to packages, large envelopes, and other mailings. The stamp art features a series of overlapping geometric shapes that mimic the symmetry of floral patterns found in nature. As the stamp denominations rise (\$2 to \$10), the designs become more complex. The water-color backgrounds and foil-stamped designs and typography create a sophisticated look. The stamps were designed and created by the firm Spaeth Hill. Antonio Alcalá was the art director.

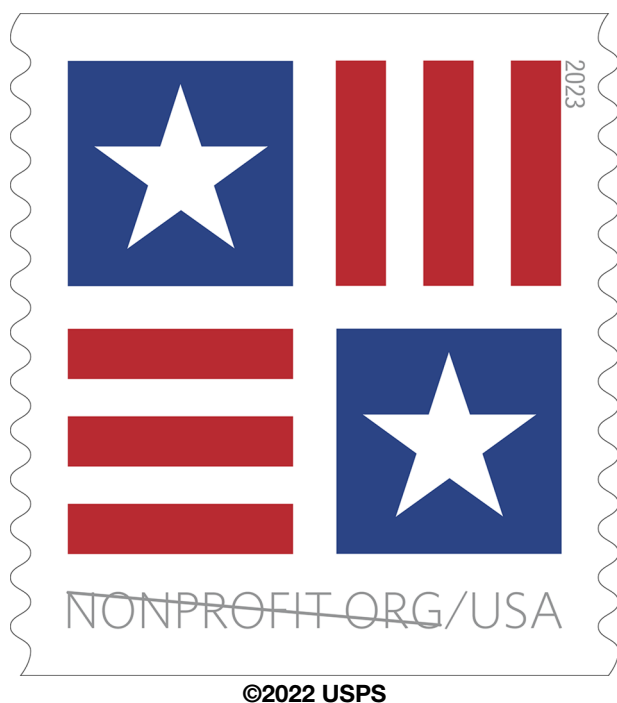

Stamp Announcement 23-11: Patriotic Block Stamp



On March 1, 2023, in Liberty, NY, the United States Postal Service® will issue the *Patriotic Block* stamp (Non-denominated, priced at the Nonprofit Organization rate of 5 cents) in one design, in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) coil of 3,000 stamps (Item 751400) and a PSA coil of 10,000 stamps (Item 761600). This stamp will go on sale nationwide March 1, 2023, and must not be sold or canceled before the first-day-of-issue.

In 2023, the Postal Service™ will issue *Patriotic Block*, a new nondenominated, nonprofit-price stamp intended for bulk mailings by authorized nonprofit organizations and sold in self-adhesive coils of 3,000 and 10,000. Stamp Announcement 23-12: Toni Morrison Stamp



On March 7, 2023, in Princeton, NJ, the United States Postal Service® will issue the *Toni Morrison* stamp (Forever® priced at the First-Class Mail® rate) in one design, in a pressure-sensitive adhesive (PSA) pane of 20 stamps (Item 483100). This stamp will go on sale nationwide March 7, 2023, and must not be sold or canceled before the first-day-of-issue.

This stamp celebrates Toni Morrison (1931–2019), whose artfully crafted novels explored the diverse voices and multifaceted experiences of African Americans. Known for such books as *The Bluest Eye*, *Song of Solomon*, and *Beloved*, Morrison was the rare author who achieved both bestseller status and critical success. In 1993, she made history as the first African-American woman to win the Nobel Prize in Literature. The stamp features a photograph of Morrison taken in 2000. Art director Ethel Kessler designed the stamp with photography by Deborah Feingold.

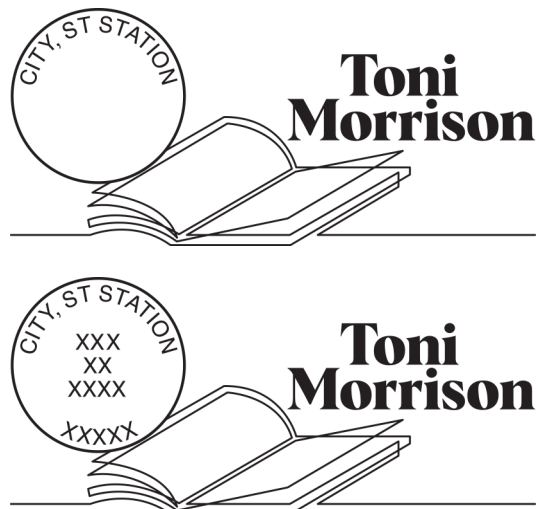

Special Dedication Postmarks

Only the following pictorial postmark is permitted for the *Toni Morrison* stamp. The word “Station” or the abbreviation “STA” is required somewhere in the design because it will be a temporary station. Use of any image other than the following special pictorial image is prohibited.

Guidelines for Finalizing Toni Morrison Stamp Pictorial Postmark Art



To finalize the *Toni Morrison* stamp pictorial postmark art, insert the date, city, state, and ZIP Code™ of the physical location of your event adjacent to the stamp image. Overall dimensions of the pictorial postmark must not exceed 4 inches (horizontally) by 2 inches (vertically). Collectors prefer the dimensions 3-1/2 inches by 1 inch.

The Postal Service™ must make all special postmarks known to collectors through advance publicity in the Postal Bulletin. Therefore, all special dedication cancellations must be reported to Stamp Services 4 weeks before the event using PS Form 413, Pictorial Postmark Announcement/Report. To get a copy of the form, go to blue.usps.gov/formmgmt/forms/ps413.pdf.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Postmark

Customers have 120 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmark by mail. They may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™ or at The Postal Store® website at store.usps.com/store/home. They must affix the stamps to envelopes of their choice, address the envelopes (to themselves or others), and place them in a larger envelope addressed to:

The Postal Service also offers first-day covers for new stamp issues and Postal Service stationery items postmarked with the official first-day-of-issue cancellation. Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears on the following pages. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may obtain the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to obtain the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days following the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers wishing to obtain a postmark must affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed next to the postmark.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 120 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. Each cover must have sufficient postage to meet First-Class Mail® requirements. Customers may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by phone at 844-737-7826, or on The Postal Store® website at usps.com/shop.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service™ recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16-inch side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2 inches (vertically) by 4 inches (horizontally). Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a minimum of 10 envelopes at 50 cents per postmark required at the time of servicing. Customers must submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers must affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of
