Open Season is here! This is your once-a-year opportunity to make changes to your Postal Service™ benefits. Open Season begins on November 10, 2025, and ends on December 8, 2025.

In this packet you will find:

- All the resources you need to help you navigate the changes and learn about your options for the 2026 benefits year.
- An explanation of various benefits-related terms.
- Quick reference guides for the Postal Service Health Benefits (PSHB) enrollment platform, flexible spending accounts, dental and vision plan options, and tools such as the CHECKBOOK's Guide to PSHB Plans for USPS® Employees and Annuitants. The CHECKBOOK is a free online tool that allows you to compare available health, dental, and vision plans in your area to determine the best option for you and your family.

Family Member Verification Annual Notice

This annual notification from the United States Office of Personnel Management (OPM) and the Postal Service requires you to review eligibility rules and verify that your family members are eligible to be covered under your Postal Service Health Benefits (PSHB) plan.

Please carefully review the following eligibility information, which is also available in the FEHB Program Handbook under “Family Members” at opm.gov.

The Postal Service may request documentation of eligibility at any time. Documentation is required if you make a change to your PSHB enrollment outside of Open Season. It is your responsibility to verify that covered family members are eligible. You must work with the Human Resource Shared Services Center (HRSSC) or your PSHB carrier to remove any family members who become ineligible. In most cases, ineligible family members will not be removed automatically.

Covered Family Members

- Your current spouse.
- Children under the age of 26 are eligible for PSHB coverage if they are your:
 - Biological children.
 - Legally adopted children.
 - Stepchildren.
- Foster children for whom you are the primary source of financial support and with whom you have a par-

ent-child relationship. (You cannot add a foster child without approval from the Human Resource Shared Services Center.)

Noneligible Family Members

- Your former spouse once your divorce is finalized.
- Your children upon turning age 26 (unless determined to be incapable of self-support).
- Your parents.
- Grandchildren, unless they meet the requirements to be considered a foster child as determined by the Human Resource Shared Services Center.
- Domestic partners.

You must notify the Human Resource Shared Services Center within 60 days of a family member becoming ineligible at:

- 1-877-477-3273, select option 5; or
- 1-800-877-8339 (TTY).

The Human Resource Shared Services Center will inform your family member of their option to enroll in PSHB for themselves under temporary continuation of coverage or as a former spouse. In addition, you may also change your plan or enrollment type. You can find more detail about how to verify family member eligibility in the “Family Members” section of the FEHB Program Handbook at opm.gov.

How Your Benefits Fit Together

Postal Service Health Benefits (PSHB) Comprehensive Medical Insurance

Dental and vision benefits may be included.

Health Care Flexible Spending Account (FSA)

You can set aside pretax dollars every year to pay for eligible health care services and products for you and your family that are not paid by your health, dental, or vision insurance.

Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP)

Supplemental dental and vision insurance.

PSHB and FSA

Save money on eligible out-of-pocket expenses. When you have PSHB and FSA, you can use money in your FSA to pay your eligible PSHB out-of-pocket expenses such as copayments and coinsurance, qualified medical costs, and healthcare costs that your PSHB plan may not cover.

PSHB and FEDVIP

Lower your out-of-pocket costs on dental and vision expenses with FEDVIP coverage in addition to PSHB coverage. Your PSHB plan will be the first payer for any dental and vision benefit payments.

FEDVIP and FSAs

When you have an FEDVIP and an FSA, you can use money in your FSA to pay for your eligible FEDVIP out-of-pocket expenses such as copayments and coinsurance, and eligible expenses that your FEDVIP plan may not cover.

PSHB, FEDVIP, and FSA

Save money on eligible out-of-pocket medical, dental and vision expenses. You can use your FSA to pay for any eligible out-of-pocket expenses not covered by your PSHB and FEDVIP plan.

Understanding Healthcare Terms and Plans

Knowing common terminology can help you evaluate different types of health benefits plans:

- A provider is a physician, health care professional, or healthcare facility.
- A premium is the amount you pay for insurance.
- In-network treatment means receiving treatment from doctors, clinics, health centers, hospitals, medical practices, and other providers with whom your plan has an agreement.
- A deductible is the amount you pay before your plan begins to pay.
- Coinsurance is the percentage of the cost of services you pay once you've met your deductible.
- Copayment is the amount you pay up front for your visit.

- Allowed amount is the maximum amount on which payment is based for covered health care services.
- Out-of-pocket limit is the most you pay during a policy period before your health plan will pay 100 percent of allowed amount.
- Balance billing is when the provider bills you for the difference between the provider's charge and the allowed amount.

PSHB Program plans offer you a choice of coverage with three enrollment types. You can choose Self Only coverage just for you, Self Plus One for you and one other eligible family member, or Self and Family coverage for you and two or more eligible dependents. The PSHB Program also provides you with the option of choosing from various types of plans, in the table below.

Plan	Features	Trade-Off
Fee-for-Service (FFS) Plans	You can choose your physicians, hospitals, and other providers.	You may incur higher out-of-pocket expenses than other plan types.
Health Maintenance Organization (HMO) Plans	You receive care through a network of physicians or hospitals within a particular geographic or service area.	You generally must use in-network providers and need a referral to see a different provider.
Consumer-Driven Health Plans (CDHPs) and High-Deductible Health Plans (HDHPs)	Gives you freedom in spending health care dollars and offers a Health Savings Account (HSA) or Health Reimbursement Arrangement (HRAs) to pay for certain up-front medical costs.	You have a higher deductible than other plan types.
Limited Purpose Flexible Spending Account (LPFSA)	A limited-purpose flexible spending account (LPFSA) is specifically for dental and vision expenses. You can contribute to an LPFSA while being enrolled in a high deductible health plan and having an HSA at the same time. You can use the LPFSA for things like prescription eyeglasses, contacts, dental visits and orthodontia.	To be eligible for an LPFSA, you must be an active career employee enrolled in an HDHP and have an HSA. Plans eligible for LPFSA are marked in CHECKBOOK.

Postal Service Health Benefits (PSHB) Program

The PSHB Program is a separate program within the Federal Employees Health Benefits (FEHB) Program, which provides health insurance to eligible Postal Service employees, Postal Service annuitants, and their eligible family members.

Postal Service enrollees always have the right to choose their PSHB plan during the Federal Benefits Open Season. This year, Open Season will run from November 10, 2025, through December 8, 2025.

Accessing Your Account

Log in to your account with login.gov to view and compare plans and enroll. For additional help or questions, please call (833) 712-7742.

- To start, navigate to the PSHB enrollment site landing page by going to health-benefits.opm.gov/pshb.

- From the home page, select “Sign In,” which directs you to login.gov.

If you already have a login.gov account:

- Enter your credentials to “Sign In” and you will be taken to the authentication page. You will be prompted to upload identity documentation.

If you cannot remember the login information to your existing account:

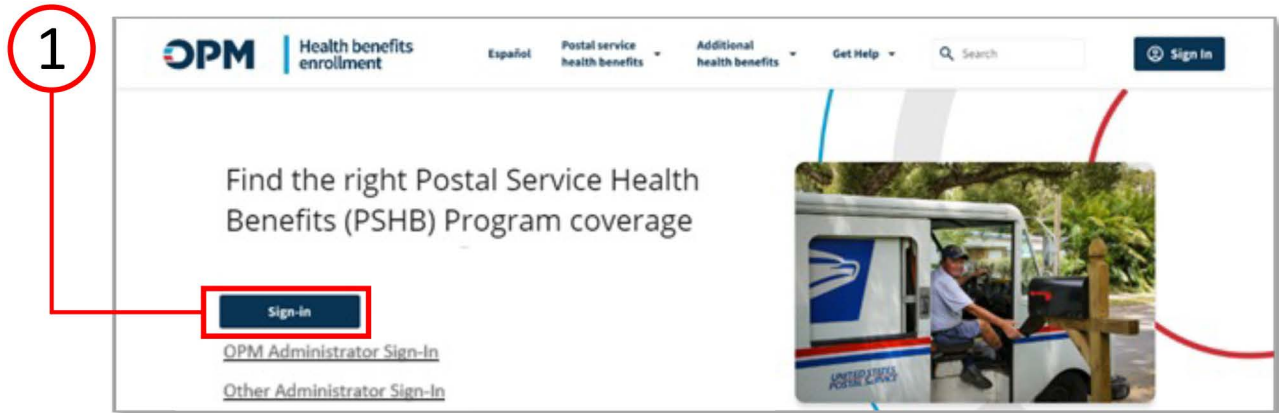
- Follow the instructions to reset your password or register with a different email address.

To change your login.gov email address:

- Follow instructions at login.gov/help/manage-your-account/change-your-email-address.
- First-time users must select “Create an account” and follow the prompts.

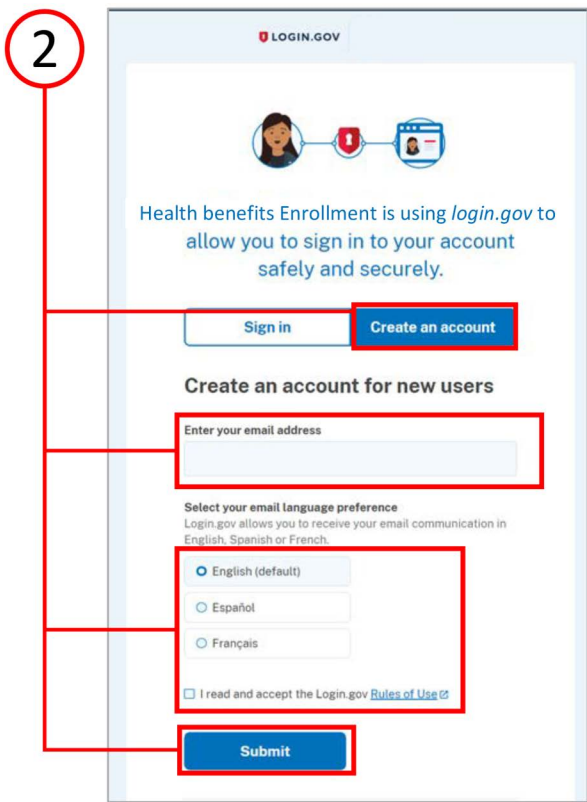
Initial PSHBS Account Setup via Login.gov

- Set up an enrollee account with login.gov, view plans, compare, and enroll.
- For annuitants who require additional help or assistance, please refer them to the PSHB Help Line.



Step 1: Navigating to Enrollment Site and login.gov

- To start, navigate to the *Postal Services Health Benefits (PSHB)* enrollment site landing page by going to health-benefits.opm.gov/ps hb.
- From the home page, select the “Sign-In” button which directs you to the login.gov site.



Step 2: Creating an Account

- Click the “Create an account” button.
- Enter your personal email address (one that you will always be able to access) and not your work email address. Select your preferred language.
- Read the Rules of Use and click the checkbox.
- Click the “Submit” button.

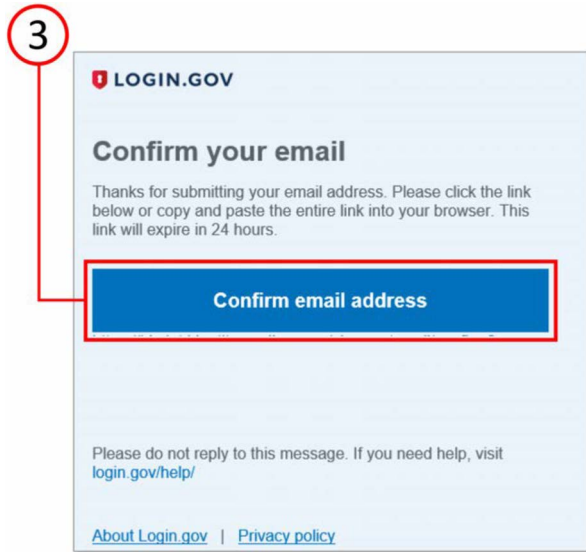
If you already have a login.gov account:

- Enter your credentials to “Sign In,” and you will be taken to the authentication page. You will be prompted to upload identity documentation, if you have not done so, as shown in steps 6-8.

If you cannot remember the login information to your existing account:

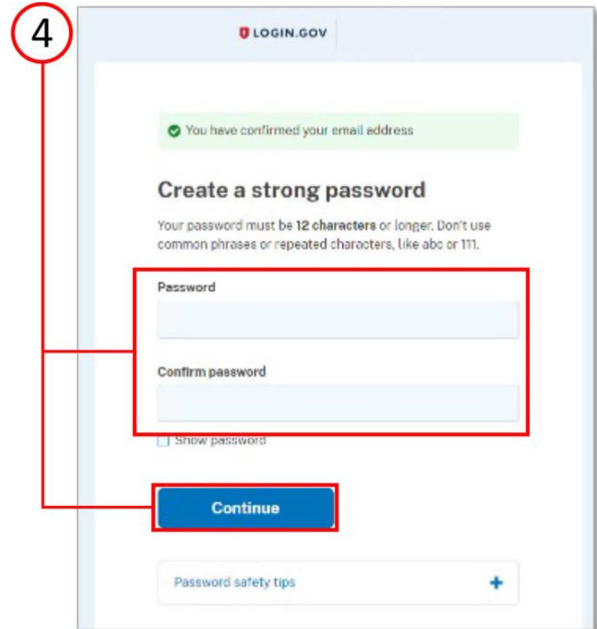
- Follow the instructions to reset password or register with a different email address.

To change your login.gov email address, follow instructions at login.gov/help/manage-your-account/change-your-email-address.



Step 3: Confirming Your Email Address

- Check your email for a message from login.gov.
- Click the “Confirm email address” button in the email message to confirm and be sent back to the login.gov site.



Step 4: Creating a Password

- Create your **login.gov** password.
Your password must have 12 or more characters and avoid combinations such as:
 - Common phrases or repeated characters, like ABC or 111.
 - Parts of your email address or personal dates, like your birthday.
- Click “Continue” button.

Note: Passwords will need to reach a strength threshold designated by login.gov.

Authentication method setup

Add an additional layer of protection to your Login.gov account by selecting a multi-factor authentication method.

We recommend you select at least two different options in case you lose one of your methods.

- ☐ **Authentication application**
Download or use an authentication app of your choice to generate secure codes.
- ☐ **Text or voice message**
Receive a secure code by (SMS) text or phone call.
- ☐ **Backup codes**
A list of 10 codes you can print or save to your device. When you use the last code, we will generate a new list. Keep in mind backup codes are easy to lose.
- ☐ **Security key**
Connect your physical security key to your device. You won't need to enter a code.
- ☐ **Government employee ID**
PIV/CAC cards for government and military employees. Desktop only.

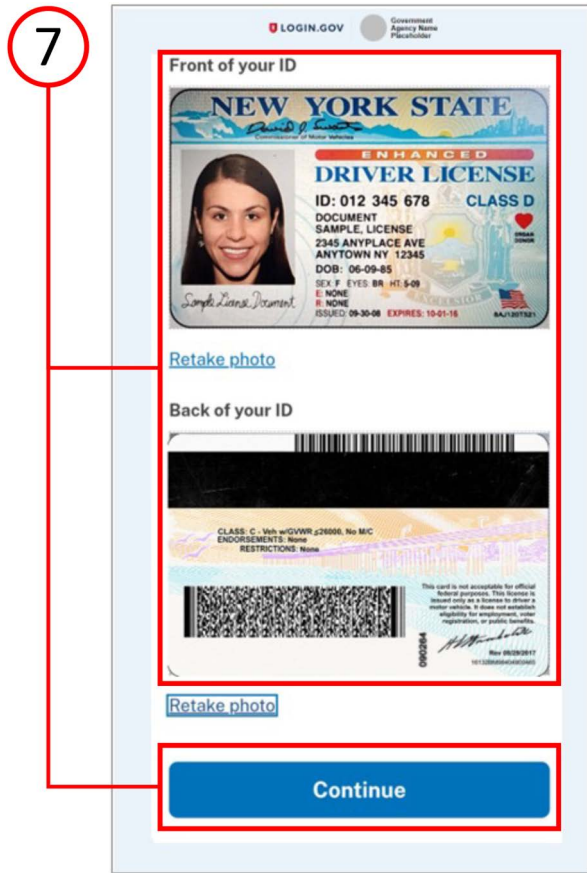

Step 6: Verifying Your ID

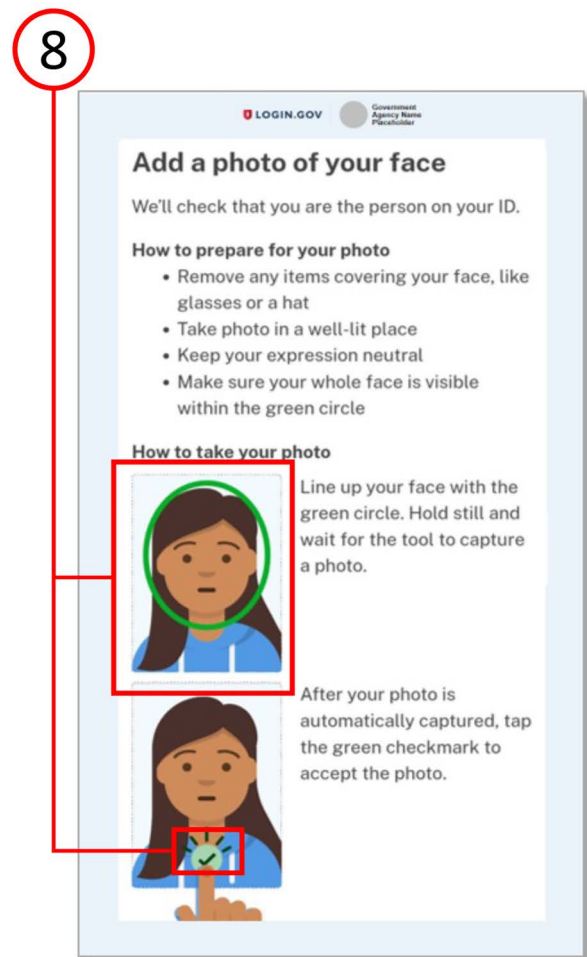
- Enter your phone number to switch from your computer to your mobile.
- Click the “Send link” button to start the process.

Note: Your mobile must have a camera and web browser to complete this process.



Step 7: Verifying Your ID, continued

- On your smartphone, you will add photos of your driver's license or state ID card in a well-lit place, avoiding glares or shadows.
- Take a photo of the front of your ID, then the back of your ID, retaking if necessary.
- Click the "Continue" button.



Step 8: Verifying Your ID, continued

- You will now be prompted to take a photo of your face. Select "Take Photo" and remove any items covering your face and take the photo in a well-lit area.
- Keeping a neutral expression, line up your face with the green circle and wait for the tool to capture a photo.
- Tap the green checkmark to accept the photo.
- On the next screen, you will be prompted to switch back to your computer to finish verifying your identity.

Note: If you are seeing the error messages "Allow access to your camera to take photos for login.gov" or "Your camera is blocked" while taking a photo of your face, please select the "Take Photo" button to continue.

Step 10: Verifying Phone Number and Re-entering Password

- Enter your phone number.
- Select to receive a code via text or phone call; click the “Send code” button.
- Enter the one-time code; click the “Submit” button.
- Re-enter your password; click the “Continue” button.

Flexible Spending Accounts (FSA)

Flexible Spending Account Program

You have flexibility in how you pay for your out-of-pocket expenses:

- Pay with an FSA debit card.
- Pay yourself back with funds from your FSA when you use cash, check, or personal credit card.
- Pay your provider directly from your account.

Smart spending for life's expenses

When you contribute to an FSA, the money is deducted from your pay on a pretax basis. This means your contribution comes out of your paycheck before federal, Social Security and, in some cases, state taxes are deducted from your pay. Generally, federal taxes range from 15 percent to 28 percent. Social Security tax is currently 7.65 percent of your pay. So, you could save about 30 cents on every dollar you spend on eligible expenses.

For example, if an employee has an annual salary of \$60,000 and they decide to contribute \$2,500 to a health care flexible spending account (HCFSA) and \$2,000 to a dependent care flexible spending account (DCFSA), they could save about \$1,350 on health care spending with their pretax FSA contributions.

Let's go over the basics

Your Inspira HCFSA lets you put pretax money aside for eligible health care expenses such as contact lenses, allergy, and pain relief medications, hearing aids and

prescription eyeglasses. Your Inspira DCFSA also lets you use pretax money for eligible expenses to care for your loved ones such as day care or in-home care.

INSPIRA HCFSA: Fund your Inspira HCFSA by simply setting your election amount each year during Open Season. The contribution amount you choose is deducted evenly out of each paycheck throughout the year. Your HCFSA isn't just for the big medical expenses, it's also for the little things you might use every day. Eligible health care expenses include copays, coinsurance, deductibles, dental, and vision expenses, prescriptions, and over-the-counter health care supplies from select retailers. You may be surprised that things like sunscreen (SPF 30+) and contact solution are covered.

INSPIRA LPFSA: A limited-purpose flexible spending account (LPFSA) is similar to an HCFSA but is specifically for dental and vision expenses. Unlike the HCFSA, you can contribute to an LPFSA while being enrolled in a high-deductible health plan and having an HSA at the same time. You can use the LPFSA for things like prescription eyeglasses, contacts, dental visits, and orthodontia.

INSPIRA DCFSA: When an eligible family member needs care, but you still have to work, a dependent care account is a smart and convenient way to save, pay and budget for dependent care-related expenses. Funds can be used for your dependent(s) age 12 or younger, a spouse, or adult dependent(s) incapable of self-care.



How to enroll

- Go to liteblue.usps.gov, select "Sign In."
- Enter your employee ID and enter your password.
- Verify your identity with a security method. Enter your security code.
- Select the flexible spending account icon from the LiteBlue® employee applications page.
- You will be redirected to the dedicated Inspira Financial page to complete your enrollment.
- The FSA enrollment application can also be accessed at myhr.usps.gov/pay_benefits/benefits/flexible_spending_accounts/enrollment.

After You Enroll

Activate your debit card.

You will receive an Inspira debit card for the new plan year a few weeks after Open Season ends. When you use your Inspira debit card, your expenses are automatically paid from your reimbursement account. It is important that you save your receipts and Explanations of Benefits in case you need to validate a purchase.

Create your online account.

An online account is a fast and easy way to check your balance, pay yourself back, manage your account, and sign up for alerts. Setting up and accessing your account is easy:

- Go to liteblue.usps.gov, select “Sign In,” enter your employee ID and enter your password.
- Verify your identity with a security method. Enter your security code.
- Select the flexible spending account icon from the LiteBlue® employee applications page.

How to File a Claim

You can pay yourself back for eligible out-of-pocket health care expenses, or you can pay your health care provider directly from your online account as follows:

- After logging in through liteblue.usps.gov, click “File a claim” on the homepage, under “Account Actions.”
- Enter your claim details and select how you want to send documents to Inspira.

- You can complete a manual claim form on the FSA MyHR page to submit by mail or fax.

FSA Carryover

For 2025, the FSA carryover limit is \$660. This allows you to carry over unused funds from your Health Care FSA into the next plan year. In order to carry over funds, you must enroll for the 2026 plan year.

The carryover feature allows you to avoid forfeiting unused funds.

*If you separate from employment during the benefit year due to resignation, separation or retirement, you will have 30 days from your separation date to submit claims.

USPS Health Benefits Plan

The United States Postal Service is committed to providing quality health care options for precareer employees. CareFirst Blue Cross Blue Shield is the administrator of the USPS Health Benefits Plan.

- The USPS Health Benefits Plan is available to eligible precareer employees. If you are an assistant rural carrier or a holiday-term employee, you are not eligible for the plan.
- Each pay period, employees receive a Postal Service contribution toward their premiums. This reduces the cost that employees pay for their health coverage. You are eligible for the plan if you are a precareer employee. For rate information go to myhr.usps.gov/pay_benefits/benefits/usps_health_benefits/eligibility.
- You can enroll:
 - During Open Season, November 10 – December 8.
 - Within 60 days of hire.
 - When you have a qualifying life event such as a marriage, divorce, death of a spouse or dependent, birth, adoption, or foster a child.

To enroll in the USPS Health Benefits Plan:

- Use PostalEASE® (ewss.usps.gov); or
- Call the Human Resource Shared Services Center (HRSSC) at 1-877-477-3273, option 1.

You may also contact the HRSSC for other benefits questions.

You can explore other health insurance options as a precareer employee. Visit CHECKBOOK's Guide to PSHB Plans for USPS Employees and Annuitants through MyHR. You can compare plans and costs side by side for a full view of your health insurance options.

Eligible precareer employees can enroll in FEDVIP, which includes supplemental dental and vision benefits for self, self plus one, and self and family coverage.

CHECKBOOK Guide to PSHB Plans

CHECKBOOK's online Guide to PSHB Plans for USPS Employees and Annuitants is available to all Postal Service employees and retirees at no cost.

CHECKBOOK will help you:

- See plans ranked by estimates of actual out-of-pocket costs.
- Compare basic levels of plans or get more detailed plan information.
- Evaluate FEDVIP plans available to you.

To find the right plan that meets your health care needs:

1. Go to myhr.usps.gov/pay_benefits/benefits/open_season_enrollment or scan the code at right, then click.
 - The link for Consumers' CHECKBOOK: Guide to PSHB Plans for USPS Employees and Annuitants.
2. On the Open Season Enrollment page, scroll down to Checkbook Service link, then select:
 - The ZIP Code™ where you will primarily be receiving health care services.
 - Your enrollment category — bargaining, nonbargaining or precareer.
 - The number of people in your family that you want to cover with your health insurance for 2026.
 - Your age as of January 1, 2026.
 - Whether you consider your health care costs to be low, average, or high. If you aren't sure, select average.
3. Health care plans available to you are sorted:
 - Automatically based on the yearly cost estimate (for families like yours).
 - By most you could pay in a year or the annual published premium (the amount you pay out of your paycheck to be in the plan).
 - Compare up to four plans by checking the box next to each plan and selecting "Compare."
4. Identify the plan that's best for you and your family. Write down the plan name and plan code. You will need this to make your Open Season election.
5. Enroll!
 - Career employees must enroll through the Postal Service Health Benefits System (PSHBS) for PSHB.
 - Eligible precareer employees must enroll in the USPS Health Benefits Plan through PostalEASE®.

Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program

Federal Employees Dental and Vision Insurance Program (FEDVIP) is a supplemental dental and vision insurance program for eligible federal employees and annuitants. BENEFEDS administers the program, which includes enrollment, plan changes and premium payment processes. FEDVIP offers self only, self plus one, and self and family plan options. To compare plans, go to benefeds.gov.

Enrolling in FEDVIP

You can enroll in FEDVIP every year during Open Season. This year Open Season begins November 10, and ends December 8. Outside of Open Season, if you experience a qualifying life event (QLE) such as a birth or adoption, marriage, divorce, or death of a family member, you can enroll within 60 days of the QLE. Annual Leave Exchange (ALE) and Annual Leave Carryover Limits

The Annual Leave Exchange (ALE) carryover limits for 2026 are:

- 640 hours for career nonbargaining employees.
- Career bargaining employees must refer to their respective collective bargaining agreements.

The ALE program provides an option for eligible career employees to receive a lump sum payment in exchange for a portion of the annual leave that would otherwise be advanced at the beginning of the leave year.

- If you are eligible, you will receive an ALE eligibility notification letter in the mail. Please read your eligibility letter in its entirety. You may meet eligibility requirements when the letters are generated and lose eligibility if you do not continue to meet all requirements through the last day of the leave year.
- If you do not receive an eligibility letter and believe that you may be eligible, you can make an ALE request via PostalEASE®. Employees who make elections and do not meet ALE eligibility requirements as of the last day of the leave year will receive a notification that the payment will not be made.
- You will see your ALE payout in the first full pay period in 2026.

Note: ALE payments are considered supplemental wages by the IRS, and taxes will be withheld at a 22 percent rate. To receive a lump sum payment for Leave Year 2026, you must go to PostalEASE® during Open Season 2025 and make a request.

Verifying U.S. Postal Service Money Orders

Follow these steps to cash a Postal Service™ money order:

1. Check that the amount does not exceed the legal limit: \$1,000 for domestic, and \$700 for international Postal money orders.
2. Check that the proper security features are present:
 - For the legacy, green Postal Service money orders:
 - a. Green coloring at the top and bottom.
 - b. A U.S. Mail eagle logo in the center.
 - c. A left-side watermark of Benjamin Franklin repeating top to bottom that is only visible when held up to a light source.
 - d. On the right of the Benjamin Franklin watermark, a vertical, multicolored security thread with the letters “USPS®” weaves in and out of the paper.
 - e. Discoloration around the dollar amounts might indicate the amounts were changed.
 - For the new red and blue Postal Service money orders:
 - a. Red and blue ink with subtle design features of an eagle head and an American flag.
 - b. Two watermarks that are only visible when held up to a light source:
 1. A watermark of a Pony Express® rider.
 2. A watermark that reads “United States Postal Service” in a rectangular box.

- c. A security thread that runs from the top to the bottom of the Postal Service money order, just to the right of the Pony Express rider watermark. When held to the light, the thread reveals the letters “USPS” alternating right side up and upside down throughout the thread.
- d. A Quick Response (QR) code that directs users to the USPS website to verify the status of money orders using three pieces of information.
- e. Discoloration around the dollar amounts might indicate the amounts were changed.

If you or a customer suspects fraud, follow the guidance from the U.S. Postal Inspection Service:

- If you question the validity of a Postal Money Order, use the Money Order Verification System at 1-866-459-7822.
- You can also check the money order status at usps.com/shop/money-orders.htm. Go to “Check Money Order Status” and input the information.
- If you suspect fraud or criminal activity, call the Inspection Service at 1-877-876-2455 at your earliest convenience.

The legacy, green Postal Service money order will stay in circulation until all existing stock is depleted. As of October 1, 2024, USPS no longer sells international money orders. USPS will no longer cash international money orders after September 30, 2025.

A. Securities, currency, or precious metals, including in their raw, unmanufactured state, are prohibited. Official Mail shipments are exempt from this restriction.

A1. Reserved for future use.

A2. Reserved for future use.

B. A customs declaration PS Form 2976 or PS Form 2976-A is required for all items weighing 16 ounces or more, and for all items (regardless of weight) containing potentially dutiable mail contents (e.g., merchandise or goods) addressed to or from this ZIP Code. All PMEMS mailpieces (regardless of mail content or weight) addressed to or from this ZIP Code must bear a properly completed PS Form 2976-B. The surface area of the address side of the mailpiece must be large enough to contain the applicable electronic customs declaration.

- Business mailers who enter volume mailings through business mail entry units or other bulk mail acceptance locations, pay postage through advance deposit accounts, use permit imprints for postage payment, and submit completed postage statements at the time of entry that certify that the mailpieces contain no dangerous materials that are prohibited by postal regulations. Such business mailers are exempt from providing customs documentation on non-dutiable letters and printed matter.
- All federal, state, and local government agencies whose mailings are regarded as "Official Mail." Such agencies are exempt from providing customs documentation, except for any items addressed to an MPO or DPO to which restriction "B2" applies.

B2. Reserved for future use.

C. Cigarettes and other tobacco products, including tobacco leaves, chewing and pipe tobacco, snuff, and cigars are prohibited, including those that are authorized in Publication 52 under PACT.

C1. Obscene and horror articles, images, prints, paintings, cards, films, videotapes, comic books, etc., are prohibited.

C2. E-cigarettes and related products (e.g., nicotine liquids, e-liquids, parts, or supplies) are prohibited.

D. Coffee is prohibited.

E. Medicines (prescription, over-the-counter, vitamins, and supplements) are prohibited when mailed to individuals for human or animal use. This prohibition does not apply when medicines are sent as Official Mail only between specifically designated agencies such as pharmaceutical distributors, hospitals, clinics, and pharmacies.

E1. Mailers are responsible to ensure that all medicines and vaccines conform to host nation laws.

E2. Any matter depicting nude or seminude persons, pornographic, or sexual items are prohibited. Non-authorized political materials are prohibited. Religious materials contrary to the Islamic faith are prohibited in bulk quantities, but individual items for the personal use of the addressee are permissible.

E3. Radio transceivers, cordless/cellular telephones, global positioning systems, scanners, base stations, and handheld transmitters are prohibited.

F. Firearms of any type are prohibited, except firearms mailed to or by official U.S. government agencies. This restriction does not apply to firearms mailed from this MPO ZIP Code, provided ATF and USPS regulations are met. Antique firearms do not require an ATF form.

F1. Weapons of any type are prohibited.

F2. Mailing firearms to or from this MPO ZIP Code is restricted to one shotgun and one single shot .22 caliber rifle per individual.

F3. Replica weapons and inert explosive devices (such as grenades) and weapons parts are prohibited.

G. Parcels of any class are prohibited.

H. Meats, including preserved meats, bones, skin, hair, feathers, horns or hoofs of hoofed animals, and wool samples whether hermetically sealed or not, are prohibited.

H1. Pork or pork by-products are prohibited.

I. Reserved for future use.

I1. Lithium cells and batteries — including items containing lithium cells and batteries under 135.6.

I2. Liquids of any type.

I3. Mail of all classes must fit in a mail sack. Mail may not exceed the following dimensions:

- Maximum length 27 inches.
- Maximum width 14 inches.
- Maximum height 14 inches.

J. Standard Post and Parcel Select parcels may not exceed 108 inches in length and girth combined.

K. Reserved for future use.

L. All Official Mail is prohibited.

M. Fruits, vegetables, live animals, and live plants are prohibited.

N. Registered Mail service is prohibited.

O. Reserved for future use.

P. Official Mail only.

Q. Mail may not exceed 66 pounds, and size is limited to 42 inches maximum length and 72 inches maximum length and girth combined.

R. All alcoholic beverages, including those mailable under Publication 52, Part 421, are prohibited.

R1. Materials used in the production of alcoholic beverages (i.e., distilling material, hops, malts, yeast, etc.) are prohibited.

S. Synthetic cannabinoids used to stimulate the central nervous system commonly known as "synthetic marijuana," "K2," or "Spice" are prohibited.

T. Mailings of household shipments and case lots of food to or from an MPO require military transportation office approval prior to mailing. Mailings to or from a DPO require pre-approval from the Diplomatic Pouch and Mail Director.

U. Mail addressed to Retirees (Box R) is limited to 16 ounces and up to a 90-day supply of TRICARE medications. This restriction does not apply to mail endorsed "Free Matter for the Blind or Handicapped."

U1. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail items, including audio and video media, weighing 13 ounces or less. This limitation does not apply to Official Mail.

U2. Retirees (Box R) are not authorized mail service.

U3. Reserved for future use.

U4. Mail addressed to Box C is limited to 2 lbs.

V. PMEMS is not available.

V1. Electronic Delivery status information for Extra Services is not available on *USPS.com*. Manual record of delivery may be available upon request.

W. Hermetically sealed packages of meat products bearing USDA certification, such as dried beef, salami, and sausage, may be mailed. 200 grams of tobacco per parcel are permitted duty free.

X. Cremated remains are prohibited.

Y. Mail is limited to First-Class Mail and Priority Mail items only. This restriction also applies to Official Mail.

Z. No outside pieces (OSPs).

Z1. The following restriction is applicable only to International Service Centers (ISC)/Exchange Offices. An Anti-Pilferage Seal (Item No 0817E or 0818A) is required on all pouches and sacks.

Environmental Management

Spill Reporting: Release of Hazardous and Regulated Substances to the Environment

Hazardous and regulated material spills released into the environment must be reported to a manager or supervisor to initiate reporting and cleanup activities by properly trained responders. Installation heads should maintain and reference any facility-specific spill, emergency response, or contingency planning documents. Additionally, Postal Service™ policy requires the completion of PS Form 8187, *Hazardous and Regulated Substance Release Notification*, to internally report the release of these materials.

Common reportable materials used at USPS® sites that may prompt additional reporting requirements to the United States Environmental Protection Agency, state, or local regulatory agencies, depending on the quantity released into the environment include the following:

In general, spills to the environment must be reported if they reach:

- Stormwater drains or ponds
- Dry wells or catch basins

- Septic system
- Sanitary sewer
- Surface water
- Soil
- Groundwater
- Waterways

As soon as any known release to the environment has occurred, Postal Service employees must immediately contact the site installation head, manager, or supervisor, who must do the following:

- After taking action to protect human health and safety, refer to facility-specific spill or emergency response documents and follow the prescribed requirements.
- Immediately report spills to your designated USPS Environmental Specialist (blue.usps.gov/sustainability/regional-environmental-compliance-all.htm) and the designated safety specialist for the site.
- Complete and submit PS Form 8187, *Hazardous and Regulated Substance Release Notification* (blue.usps.gov/formmgmt/forms/LiveCycle/psform8187_042016_lc.pdf).
- Consult your designated USPS Environmental Specialist to make the appropriate federal, state, and local environmental agency notifications. The applicable reporting requirements vary depending on location and the type and quantity of the material released.

Christmas Pay Procedures for Rural Carriers

The 2025 Christmas period for rural carriers begins Saturday, December 6, 2025 (Week 2, Pay Period (PP) 26-2025), and ends Friday, December 26, 2025 (Week 2, Pay Period 01-2026). During this period, certain timekeeping and pay rules apply. Timekeepers, including postmasters, supervisors, and other employees responsible for rural carrier time and attendance recording, must become familiar with Article 9.2.H., Christmas Allowances and Procedures, of Handbook EL-902, *Agreement between the United States Postal Service and the National Rural Letter Carriers' Association, 2021–2024*.

This article describes:

- Types of compensation that rural carriers are entitled during the Christmas period.
- Related timekeeping procedures and regulations for the Christmas period.
- Special rules that begin with the start of the Guarantee Year (October 4, 2025) and continue through the end of the Christmas period (December 26, 2025).

The preferred method of timekeeping data entry is through the Rural Management Support System (RMSS) web application. The following information provides USPS® guidelines for Rural Carrier compensation during the designated Christmas period. These instructions are designed for Manual Timekeeping and TACS data entry.

Types of Overtime

During the Christmas period, regular rural carriers are eligible for the following two types of overtime:

- a. FLSA overtime; and
- b. Christmas overtime.

FLSA Overtime

FLSA overtime is paid at all times of the year, not just during the Christmas period. Regular rural carriers are paid FLSA overtime under two circumstances:

- a. Hours worked in excess of 12 hours in a day. If a carrier works more than 12 hours in a day, the amount over 12 is entered in the Daily Overtime block on PS Form 1314.
- b. Hours worked in excess of 56 in a week. These hours are calculated automatically when the total weekly work hours are greater than 56. No separate entries are required.

Christmas Overtime

Christmas Overtime is paid only during the designated Christmas period. Regular rural carriers are paid Christmas overtime under two circumstances:

- a. Christmas Assistance — This is assistance provided by the regular carrier on his or her relief day. Christmas assistance work hours are entered in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block on PS Form 1314.
- b. Hours worked in excess of the route's evaluation is based on the total actual work hours for the week, not on individual days. For example, if a route has a daily evaluation of 9 hours and the regular carrier works 10 hours on 2 days, and 8 hours on the other 3 days, no overtime would be paid. Even though the carrier exceeded the daily evaluation on 2 days of the week, they did not exceed the *weekly* evaluation. The weekly

evaluation is 45 hours; the carrier worked 44 hours. (See Handbook F-21, Section 567, for overtime calculation when leave days are taken during the week and for routes with an evaluation of less than 40 hours.) These hours are calculated automatically, so no separate entries or calculations are required.

Overtime Rate

The overtime rate paid to regular (FLSA Code B) carriers is 150 percent of the carrier's regular rate. The regular rate is determined by dividing the total compensation received for hours actually worked by the carrier since the beginning of the Guarantee Year (not including overtime), by the total number of hours worked since the beginning of the Guarantee Year (not including overtime). This overtime rate is used for both FLSA overtime and Christmas overtime.

Replacement Carriers

Replacement Carriers (Designations 70, 73, 74, 75, 76, 77, 78, and 79) are only entitled to FLSA overtime. For these employees, FLSA overtime is paid for hours worked in excess of 40 in a week.

Regular Carriers (Des 71) — FLSA A

Regular carriers whose FLSA code is A are paid for actual hours worked, not evaluated hours. They are paid overtime for hours in excess of 8 in a day or 40 in a week. For FLSA Code A carriers, enter hours in excess of 8 in a day to the Daily Overtime block on PS Form 1314. Hours in excess of 40 in a week are calculated automatically by the system.

Auxiliary Route Carriers

Carriers serving any auxiliary route are compensated at the hourly rate for actual hours worked during week 2 of PP 26-2025 and both weeks of PP 01-2026. During this period, carriers are not paid the evaluation of the route. Overtime is paid only when the carrier exceeds 40 hours for the week.

Christmas Assistance

Christmas assistance is additional service provided on a rural route during the Christmas period. For regular carriers, Christmas assistance applies only to assistance given by the carrier, on his or her relief day, while a replacement carrier is assigned to work the full route. For replacement carriers, it applies to any assistance provided on a regular or auxiliary route during the Christmas period. Christmas assistance is reported in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block on PS Form 1314 (for regular carriers) or PS Form 1314-A (for replacement carriers).

Regular carriers can perform Christmas assistance only on their relief day. Therefore, only regular carriers assigned to J or K routes may report Christmas assistance. Regular carriers assigned to route types H or M cannot perform Christmas assistance because these route types do not have a relief day. **Note:** In accordance with an Agreement between the parties, regular rural carriers may perform service on Sunday or provide auxiliary assistance on other routes in the office. This is considered FLSA (daily OT), not Christmas assistance.

These **ARE** examples of Christmas assistance:

- A regular carrier comes in on his or her relief day and helps the replacement carrier case the route.
- A regular carrier comes in on his or her relief day and carries part of his or her regular route. (List the replacement carrier on PS Form 1314.)
- A replacement carrier carries part of a regular route due to heavy Christmas volume.

These **ARE NOT** examples of Christmas assistance:

- A regular carrier comes in on their relief day, and cases and carries their regular route.
- A regular carrier works 2 hours beyond the daily evaluation of their regular route.
- A regular carrier performs any work while assigned to an H or M route.

1. Daily Overtime — For FLSA B carriers, this block is used **ONLY** to record when the carrier works more than 12.00 hours in a single day. (See Exhibit 5 for use of this block for FLSA Code A regular carriers. This block is not used for FLSA Code P.) Record the total amount of work hours in excess of 12 per day in this box. *Include the amount of daily overtime in the Actual Weekly Hours block.* For example, if the carrier works 10.00 hours each day, Monday through Wednesday, and works 12.50 on Thursday and 13.00 on Friday, the amount entered into the Daily Overtime block is 1.50 and the amount entered into the Actual Weekly Hours block is 55.50. Do not enter a decimal point when entering work hours.

The Daily Overtime block is **NOT** used to record:

- Hours worked in excess of 56 in a week.
- Hours worked in excess of the route's evaluation.
- Hours worked when the carrier works his or her relief day.
- Additional hours worked by the carrier after completing his or her route (except for those that are over 12 hours for the day).

2. Xmas Assist Work Hours — For FLSA Code B regular carriers, this block is used **ONLY** when the carrier comes in on his or her relief day to *provide assistance*, not to serve the full route. A relief carrier must be listed on PS Form 1314 as the replacement carrier for that day. Do **NOT** include the amount of Xmas Assist Work Hours in the Actual Weekly Hours block.

The Xmas Assist Work Hours block is **NOT** used to record:

- Hours worked in excess of 56 in a week.
- Hours worked in excess of the route's evaluation.
- Hours worked when the carrier works his or her relief day and hours code 037, 038, or 064 is entered on the PS Form 1314.
- Additional hours worked by the carrier after completing their route.

2. Xmas Assist Work Hours — This block is used whenever a replacement carrier provides Christmas assistance. ***Do not include the amount of Xmas Assist Work Hours in the Actual Weekly Hours block.***

Work on Relief Days and Use of X Days

During the period from the beginning of the Guarantee Year (October 4, 2025), through the last day of the Christmas period (December 26, 2025) — which includes pay periods 22-2025 23-2025 24-2025, 25-2025, 26-2025, and 01-2026 — record relief days worked by regular rural carriers on PS Form 1314, as described below:

1. Carriers who work a relief day during this period and who are entitled to a future day off (X day) must be given that X day in the same pay period. Record hours code 038 or 064 on PS Form 1314 for the relief day that is worked, and hours code 087 on the day that is taken off. The Rural Time and Attendance Collection System (RTACS) will not accept any PS Form 1314 that contains hours code 038 or 064 without a corresponding hours code 087.
2. Record hours code 037 on PS Form 1314 for the relief day that is worked if an X day is not taken in the same pay period that the relief day is worked or if the carrier is on the relief day work list and selects the option for

150 percent compensation. When hours code 037 is entered, the carrier does not receive an X day.

3. Carriers may not use any X days that were earned in previous pay periods during this period. RTACS will not accept any PS Form 1314 that contains hours code 087 without a corresponding hours code 038 or 064.
4. Carriers must have a sufficient balance of X days available in order to use an X day. Carriers with a negative X day balance cannot use any X days until the negative balance is erased.

Christmas Period Timekeeping Instructions

A. FLSA B Regular Rural Carriers

1. Work on Relief Day — Only regular carriers on J or K routes have an assigned relief day. Any work performed by a regular on his or her relief day must be reported in one of the following ways:
 - a. Regular carries entire route — If the carrier reports on the relief day and cases and carries

the assigned route (as is done on a scheduled day), enter hours code 037, 038, or 064 (as appropriate) on PS Form 1314 for that day. If the carrier is due an X day for working the relief day (e.g., hours code 038 or 064 is entered), this X day must be granted in the same pay period. If the X day is not granted within the same pay period, hours code 037 must be entered on PS Form 1314.

- b. Christmas assistance — If a relief carrier serves the assigned route and the regular carrier provides assistance on the relief day, record the hours worked by the regular as Xmas Assist Work Hours. If additional Equipment Maintenance Allowance (EMA) is due for work performed on the relief day, enter the mileage traveled in whole miles in the Route Deviation block for the appropriate week. Do **NOT** include these hours in the Actual Weekly Hours block. Enter hours code 100 in the appropriate block on PS Form 1314 if the replacement carrier worked a full day on the route.

B. FLSA Code A Regular Carriers

Regular carriers (FLSA Code A) are paid at the regular rate for all hours worked up to 8 per day and 40 per week, and at the overtime rate for all hours worked in excess of 8 per day or 40 per week. FLSA Code A employees are not entitled to any X days as they are paid for working the relief day (064):

1. Report total hours worked for the week in the Actual Weekly Hours block.
2. If the carrier worked more than 8.00 hours in a day, enter total hours worked in excess of 8 for that day in the Daily Overtime block.
3. If the carrier worked on a scheduled relief day, enter 064 on the day the carrier worked the relief day and include the hours worked in the Actual Weekly Hours block. The employee is **NOT** entitled to a future X Day.

C. Auxiliary Route Carriers

Carriers serving any auxiliary route are compensated at the hourly rate for actual hours worked during week 2 of PP 26-2025 and all of PP 01-2026. During this period, carriers are not paid the evaluation of the route (this includes newly hired RCAs in the first five pay periods of training). The only changes to standard timekeeping procedures for auxiliary routes are when a Designation (Des) 79 provides Christmas assistance on the assigned auxiliary route. (See section E, item 2).

D. Replacement Carriers Assigned to Vacant Regular Routes (Designations 72/74)

1. Designation 72

- a. FLSA B — Procedures are the same as for Des 71 (Regular Carrier), FLSA B.
- b. FLSA A — Procedures are the same as for Des 71 (Regular Carrier), FLSA A.

2. Designation 74

Work on relief day

- a. Carrier worked scheduled relief day:

- (1) Enter 064 on the day the carrier worked the relief day.
- (2) Include the hours worked in the Actual Weekly Hours block. The employee is **NOT** entitled to a future X Day.

- b. Carrier provided Christmas assistance on relief day:

- (1) Enter the Christmas auxiliary assistance time on PS Form 1314 in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block.
- (2) Do **NOT** include these hours in the Actual Weekly Hours block.
- (3) Enter hours code 100 in the appropriate block on PS Form 1314 if the replacement carrier worked a full day on the route.

E. Replacement Rural Carriers Serving as Christmas Auxiliary Assistants

All replacement carriers serving as Christmas auxiliary assistants are compensated at their regular rate for actual hours worked up to 40 per week, and at the FLSA overtime rate for actual hours worked in excess of 40.

1. Christmas assistance on a regular route:

- a. Manually prepare PS Form 1314-A for each carrier that provides Christmas assistance.
- b. Do **NOT** enter more than one carrier on each PS Form 1314-A.
- c. Submit a separate certificate for each regular route on which the carrier provides assistance.
- d. Report the Christmas assistance hours in the appropriate Week 1 or Week 2 Xmas Assist Work Hours block only.
- e. Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles in the appropriate Week 1 or Week 2 EMA blocks.

2. Christmas assistance on an auxiliary route:

- a. Assigned carrier (Des 79) provided Christmas assistance on assigned auxiliary route:

- (1) Enter 076 in the appropriate block in the No Service section of the carrier's PS Form 1314-A for the assigned route.
 - (2) Record hours worked in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block. Only enter Christmas assistance when the Des 79 assists the replacement carrier working the 076 day.
 - (3) Include EMA hours and miles (not trips) in the total for the appropriate week. Trips may not exceed the number of days worked in the No Service blocks.
 - (4) A replacement carrier is required to cross-foot the card.
- b. Replacement carrier (Designations 70, 73, 74, 75, 76, and 78) provided Christmas assistance on auxiliary route:
- (1) Manually prepare PS Form 1314-A. Enter route number A997. Use this route type and number for overburdened service or Christmas assistance on auxiliary routes only.
 - (2) Report the Christmas assistance hours in the appropriate Week 1 or Week 2 Xmas Assist Work Hours block.
 - (3) Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles (if applicable) in the appropriate Week 1 and/or Week 2 EMA blocks.
 - (4) If Christmas assistance is performed on two or more auxiliary routes in the same pay period, combine all work hours and EMA data on one manually prepared PS Form 1314-A.
- F. *Postal Employees (Other Than Rural) Serving as Christmas Auxiliary Assistants*
- Postal Service employees (other than Des 7X) who provide Christmas assistance on rural routes are compensated at their regular rate of pay for actual time worked. Include all work hours using their normal Time and Attendance System (manual timecards or TACS). Nonrural employees are entitled to EMA payment if a personal vehicle is used. Prepare PS Form 1314-A as

follows (Do **NOT** prepare PS Form 1314-A if a government vehicle is provided):

1. Report the hours worked on the rural routes on PS Form 1230-C, *Time Card*.
2. Manually prepare PS Form 1314-A for EMA compensation. Complete indicative data at the top of the certificate. Use Des/Act 99-0, actual route type and number, FLSA code P, and correct employee and pay period information.
3. Enter EMA hours, trips, and miles in the appropriate Week 1 or Week 2 EMA blocks.

Important Items to Remember: Rural Carrier Christmas Pay Procedures

- Hours entered in the Daily Overtime block are **ALWAYS** included in Actual Weekly Hours.
- Hours entered in the Xmas Assist Work Hours block are **NEVER** included in the Actual Weekly Hours block.
- Carriers on auxiliary routes are paid for actual hours worked, not the route's evaluation, during the Christmas period.
- During the period from the beginning of the Guarantee Year (October 4, 2025) through the last day of the Christmas period (December 26, 2025):
 - Hours code 087 cannot be entered on a timecard unless there is a corresponding hours code 038 or 064 in the same pay period and the carrier's X day balance is zero or greater.
 - Hours code 038 and 064 require a code 087 to be used in the same pay period.
- If Actual Weekly Hours exceed 56 hours in a week, a hours code 037 must be used. Hours code 038 and 064 are not allowed.
- If a regular carrier works his or her relief day and serves his or her assigned route, this is **NOT** reported as Christmas assistance.
- Second trip is not allowed during the Christmas period.

Stamp Services

Pictorial Postmarks Announcement

As a community service, the Postal Service™ offers pictorial postmarks to commemorate local events celebrated in communities throughout the nation. A list of events for which pictorial postmarks are authorized appears on the following pages. The sponsor of the pictorial postmark appears in italics under the date. Also provided are illustrations of these postmarks.

People attending these local events may get the postmark in person at the temporary Post Office™ station established there. Those who cannot attend the event but who wish to get the postmark may submit a mail order request. Pictorial postmarks are available only for the dates indicated, and *requests must be postmarked no later than 30 days after the requested pictorial postmark date.*

All requests must include a stamped envelope or postcard bearing at least the minimum First-Class Mail® postage. Items submitted for postmark may not include

postage issued after the date of the requested postmark. Such items will be returned unserved.

Customers who want a postmark must affix stamps to any envelope or postcard of their choice, address the envelope or postcard to themselves or others, insert a card of postcard thickness in envelopes for sturdiness, and tuck in the flap. Place the envelope or postcard in a larger envelope and address it to: Pictorial Postmarks, followed by the Name of the Station, Address, City, State, ZIP+4® Code, as listed next to the postmark.

Customers can also send stamped envelopes and postcards without addresses for postmark, as long as they supply a larger envelope with adequate postage and their return address. After applying the pictorial postmark, the Postal Service returns the items (with or without addresses) under addressed protective cover.

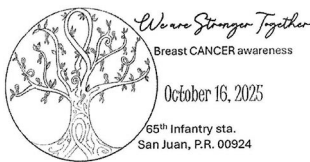

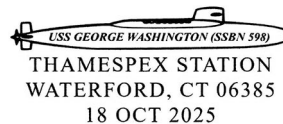

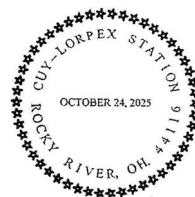

How to Order the First-Day-of-Issue Digital Color or Traditional Postmarks

Customers have 120 days to obtain the first-day-of-issue postmarks by mail. Each cover must have sufficient postage to meet First-Class Mail® requirements. Customers may purchase new stamps at their local Post Office™, by phone at 844-737-7826, or on The Postal Store® website at usps.com/shop.

Digital Color Postmarks

Only select stamp issues offer a digital color postmark. Customers may submit #6 or #10 envelopes constructed of paper rated as "laser safe." The Postal Service™ recommends envelopes of 80-pound Accent Opaque, acid-free, 9/16-inch side seams with no glue on the flap. The maximum size of all digital color postmarks is 2 inches (vertically) by 4 inches (horizontally). Allow sufficient space on the envelope to accommodate the postmark. Do not use self-adhesive labels for addresses on the envelope. Two test envelopes must be included. There is a 50-cent charge per postmark at the time of servicing. Customers must submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

The Postal Service reserves the right to not accept hand-painted and other cachet envelopes that are not compatible with our digital color postmark equipment. The Postal Service also reserves the right to substitute traditional black rubber postmarks if use of nonspecified envelopes results in poor image quality or damage to equipment.

Customers must affix the stamps to the envelopes and address them to themselves or others for return through the mail. Or, they may include an additional self-addressed return envelope, large enough to accommodate their canceled items, with sufficient postage affixed for return of

After applying the first-day-of-issue postmark, the Postal Service will return the envelopes to the customer by U.S. Mail. There is no charge for the first 50 postmarks. There is a 5-cent charge for each additional postmark over 50. Customers must submit a check, money order, or credit card for payment.

Locally produced items are not authorized. Only merchandise that has been approved and assigned an item number by Headquarters Retail Marketing may be produced and sold.
